# WALDGEIST POWERS TO GANAY SUCCESS



Waldgeist was much the best in the Prix Ganay | Scoop Dyga

The build-up to Sunday's G1 Prix Ganay at ParisLongchamp was dominated by Godolphin's up-and-coming force **Ghaiyyath** (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), but in the event it was an already-proven domestic star who took centre stage as 'TDN Rising Star' Waldgeist (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) brushed him aside with rare gusto. Shortened up to the trip over which he had so nearly won the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club two years previously, Gestut Ammerland and Newsells Park Stud's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud hero settled perfectly in third with Pierre-Charles Boudot always happy.

Looking the obvious winner turning for home with the 1-2 favourite Ghaiyyath failing to get away from them, the 17-5 shot swooped on him and **Study of Man (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) with a furlong remaining and from there it was dial-the-distance. Lengthening impressively like a horse who has finally matured into the real deal he promised so early, the chestnut cut an impressive figure as he romped to the line with head thrust forward for an emphatic 4 1/2-length success. Last year's Jockey-Club hero Study of Man was next best behind the foremost older middle-distance horse in France, just edging Ghaiyyath by a short head.

#### **ALLEZ LE FAYE!**

Having tricked connections into believing that she needed extremes of trip, Godolphin's Morgan Le Faye (GB) (Shamardal) confirmed her niche as a quality 10-furlong performer on Sunday when taking the G3 Prix Allez France Longines at ParisLongchamp. Having been shortened up three weeks previously when successful in the 10 1/2-furlong Listed Prix Zarkava here, last year's G1 Prix Royal-Oak and G1 Prix du Cadran third was tackling the shortest trip in her career but Mickael Barzalona was unfazed as he settled the 5-year-old towards the rear early. Making smooth progress down the outer to swamp **Tosen Gift (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) with 150 metres remaining, the 7-10 favourite drew away to score in facile fashion by two lengths. "She is a really sweet filly--she is not very big, but has a lot of heart and is very fluent and now fully mature, so we look forward to the rest of the season," Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard commented. "The horse had done very well during the winter and maybe he's even stronger than last year--he is at least fully mature now as a 5-year-old," trainer Andre Fabre said. "I have him in the [G1] Coronation Cup [at Epsom May 31], but I could also target the [June 30 G1] Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and then the [G1] King George [and Queen Elizabeth S.] at Ascot July 27], so we'll take

time to decide."

In the last 30 years of this time-honoured test, only six horses had dipped under 2:10 when it was staged at this track and Waldgeist is now the seventh. Four of those were Subotica (Fr), Dylan Thomas (Ire), Duke of Marmalade (Ire) and Cracksman (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and it is common knowledge what they went on to achieve. Waldgeist had won a strong renewal of the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud as a juvenile but despite going close in the Chantilly Classic the following

into his own. Even then, his autumn showings suggested he was still a notch under the elite standard but this dynamic display will have connections of the leading fillies Enable (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) and Magical (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) thinking again.

Study of Man had more to prove than the winner and despite being outclassed the Niarchos Family's homebred put up an encouraging effort which satisfied the team. "We are definitely

very pleased--he moved very nicely and had a good action," said Racing Manager Alan Cooper. "He held on well for second at the end and there are various options to consider. We will very seriously consider the [G1] Prix d'Ispahan [back at this track May 26]."

"Today was a test against obviously stronger opposition than last time and he has run a very decent race," he said.

Appleby elaborated further, adding, "Personally, I feel the colt is ready to step up to a mile and a half now. I think that staying is going to be Ghaiyyath's forte and the sooner we get him up to a mile and a half the better. I am not saying we are going to see a better horse, but it is going to put him back in his comfort zone. He had a very soft lead the time before and put a nice bit of distance between himself and the rest of the pack at one stage and therefore they had to work hard to get to him and that probably finished their races off. Today, the opposition has sat close to him and not allowed him a soft lead and we were there to be picked up, which happened in the end."

On a day in which his relatives Winterfuchs (Ger) (Campanologist) and Urwald (GB) (Le Havre {Ire}) were successful in the G3 Dr Busch Memorial over an extended mile and the seven-furlong Listed Prix du Pont Neuf respectively, Waldgeist was proving that this family is not just stamina, stamina, stamina. What defines it is class, with a G1 St Leger hero in Masked Marvel (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and a G1 Deutsches Derby hero in Waldpark (Ger) (Dubawi {Ire}) alongside a sixtimes group-winning sire Wiesenpfad (Fr) (Waky Nao {GB}). The dam, the G3 Prix Penelope scorer Waldlerche (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) who earned 'TDN Rising Star' status herself, is also responsible for last year's G2 Prix de Malleret winner Waldlied (GB) (New Approach (Ire)) and the 3-year-old John Gosdentrained colt Waldstern (GB) (Sea the Stars {Ire}), another 'TDN Rising Star'. She also has a 2-year-old colt by Kingman (GB) named Waldkonig (GB) and an as-yet unnamed yearling full-sister to Waldgeist.

"There will be various options for her, one is to follow the usual path and take in the [G2 Prix] Corrida [at Saint-Cloud May 20], and the aim is to try and win a Group 1. Of course, we'll leave it with M. Fabre to decide where she goes."

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Morgan Le Faye must have been giving Fabre signals that she possessed speed last summer, as she was sent over shy of a mile and a half for the first time when second in the 10 1/2-furlong Listed Prix de la Pepiniere at Maisons-Laffitte in July. She had the misfortune to run into the subsequent G1 Prix Jean Romanet scorer Nonza (Fr) (Zanzibari) there and after a fourth in the G2

Prix de Pomone at Deauville in August was sent back over staying distances. That is no surprise given that she is the first foal out of the 2012 Cadran heroine Molly Malone (Fr) (Lomitas {GB}) descended from a full-sister to Germany's champion and leading sire Monsun (Ger). She is also connected to the G3 Prix Chloe and GIII Matchmaker S. scorer Wekeela (Fr) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), who was also runner-up three times at the highest level, and the G1 Prix du Jockey Club and G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero Brametot (Ire) (Rajsaman {Fr}). #### **HOLDING BACK THE YEARS**

France's new fairytale performer **Holdthasigreen (Fr)** (Hold That Tiger) seems to know no boundaries despite now being an official veteran and produced possibly a career-high at ParisLongchamp on Sunday when taking the G3 Prix de Barbeville. Shouldering a penalty as a result of his win in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak at Chantilly in October, Jean Gilbert and Claude Le Lay's 7-year-old made all under Tony Piccone and fended off his old rival **Called to the Bar (Ire)** (Henrythenavigator) before turning back **Way to Paris (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}) by 1 1/4 lengths.

"I ride this horse every day and he is not an easy sort, but if you manage to do it his way he gives you everything he has," trainer Bruno Audouin explained. "I think he's even stronger than last year and it was a great performance considering he was giving weight away. He has improved and we have it in mind to go to [Royal] Ascot. We made the entry for the [June 20 G1] Gold Cup yesterday and if he's fit and well we'll definitely go, as it's a dream for us."

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Holdthasigreen, who coincidentally had Sunday's G3 Prix Allez France scorer Morgan Le Faye (GB) (Shamardal) back in third in the Royal-Oak, stays the 2 1/2-mile trip of the Gold Cup adequately as he proved when runner-up to Call the Wind (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in last year's G1 Prix du Cadran here. A late developer, as he had only won his first group race in August when beating the classy Marmelo (GB) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Kergorlay at Deauville, it is unsurprising that he has a 3-year-old half-brother by Sri Putra (GB) named Sridedgreen (Fr) who has yet to race. They will be eventually

followed into action by a 2-year-old colt also by Sri Putra named Srifanelogreen (Fr) and a yearling colt by Penny's Picnic (Ire) named Penclaudjeangreen (Fr).

With question marks over the main protagonists for Sunday's G3 Sequence Events Vintage Crop S. at Navan, the only surprise about the win of the unexposed **Master of Reality (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}) were his odds of 33-1 as Lloyd Williams and Joseph O'Brien linked successfully again.

#### **G3 Vintage Crop S. Cont.**

Handled by Pascal Bary at three, the son of L'Ancresse (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) was snapped up by his current owner following a second in the Listed Prix Michel Houyvet over 14 furlongs at Deauville in August. Despite not shining in two outings for his new stable, the bay came alive allowed to dictate here and gave plenty for Wayne Lordan to withstand the determined threat of Mustajeer (GB) (Medicean {GB}) and carve out a neck verdict. Last year's G1 St Leger third Southern France (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was a further 3/4 of a length away in third, faring better than his stablemate and 5-4 favourite Capri (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) who was only fifth and well-beaten.

Joseph O'Brien is thinking of Royal Ascot now. "Wayne kept it nice and simple on him, because he is an uncomplicated horse," he said. "He had two ordinary runs for me last year, but it is hard swapping mid-season from France to here. We gave him time and I'm delighted for Lloyd and Nick [Williams]. They sent him to me with a big reputation and it didn't work out last year and they gave us another chance with him. We'll have to train him for a [June 20 G1] Gold Cup now. He stays and he is going to come on a bit for the run, I'd say. We'll see what happens. He had been working well, but to be honest, I didn't think he was fit enough for his first run--I thought he would come on a bit from it. It is probably testament to his attitude to tough it out."

#### **Pedigree Notes**

The aforementioned L'Ancresse, who was runner-up in the 2003 G1 Irish Oaks and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf for Ballydoyle, had produced the Listed Oyster S. winner Chamonix (Ire) from a mating with Frankel's sire Galileo (Ire) and a daughter of Sadler's Wells named Minkova (Ire). She in turn is the dam of last year's G3 Henry II S.-winning stayer Magic Circle (Ire) (Makfi {GB}), so the portents for marathon trips are strong. L'Ancresse is a full-sister to the G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner and

stakes producer Cerulean Sky (Ire) and a half to the G1 Irish Oaks heroine Moonstone (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) who produced the G3 Chester Vase winner and G1 Epsom Derby runner-up US Army Ranger to a mating with Galileo and the G3 Ballysax S. and G3 Golden Fleece S. winner Nelson (Ire) also by Frankel. Her 3-year-old full-brother to Master of Reality named Eminent Authority (Ire) has yet to see a racecourse, while she also has a 2-year-old and yearling filly by the same sire. The former was bought by Phoenix Thoroughbred and Dermot Farrington for €480,000 at last year's Arqana August Yearling Sale.

#### **FAMILY FORTUNES**

Hot on the heels of the G1 Prix Ganay victory of his relative Waldgeist (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), Gestut Ravensberg's Winterfuchs (Ger) (Campanologist) further enhanced his attractive pedigree when causing an upset in Sunday's G3 Dr Busch Memorial at Krefeld and entering the domestic Classic picture. Off the mark on debut over 7 1/2 furlongs at Baden-Baden at the start of September, the chestnut had finished third in the Listed Preis des Medienhauses DuMont Rheinland at a mile at Cologne later that month but was able to reverse form with that race's runner-up Moonlight Man (Ger) (Reliable Man {GB}) here. #### **G3** Dr Busch Memorial Cont.

Switched off out the back early, the 10-1 shot was delivered up the far rail by Sibylle Vogt to gain the lead with a furlong remaining and despite drifting left held his old rival to prevail by a neck. The 12-5 favourite and G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten winner **Noble Moon (Ger)** (Sea the Moon {Ger}) looked in need of further and stayed on into a non-threatening fifth.

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Winterfuchs is out of the unraced Wunderblume (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}). Her previous best was last year's G1 Preis der Diana third Wonder of Lips (Ger) (Champs Elysees {GB}). The claim to fame of the second dam Wurfbahn (Ger) (Frontal {Fr}) is as the dam of the four-times group-winning champion and excellent producer Wurftaube (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), matriarch of the dynasty headlined by the aforementioned Waldgeist. This is also the family of last year's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud heroine Wonderment (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) and Sunday's Listed Prix du Pont Neuf winner Urwald (GB) (Le Havre {Ire}). Wunderblume's 2-year-old colt by Maxios (GB) is named Wintersturm (Ger), while she also has a yearling colt by Protectionist (Ger) named Winternebel (Ger).

Shifted off the inside 600 metres from home, she bulled her way through a gap and let down strongly inside the final quarter mile. Dehara was only a neck back in third.

After scooping the Italian 1000 Guineas with Fullness of Life (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor (Ire)) earlier on the card, trainer Alduino Botti saddled the first three home in the colts' equivalent, the G3 Premio Parioli Shadwell. Out of Time's 1 1/4length victory over previously undefeated crowd's pick Mission Boy gave his sire his third group winner and second Classic winner after Salford Secret (Ire) saluted in the 2014 edition of this feature. Third choice in the wagering at 5-1, the chestnut found plenty of cover in midpack through the early going. Given a quiet time of it by Andrea Atzeni, Out of Time ground into contention out in the center of the course, took dead aim on Botti stablemates Pensiero D'Amore on the rails and G2 Gran Criterium victor Mission Boy sandwiched between them at the 200-metre pole, and edged away to victory. Mission Boy bested Pensiero D'Amore by a neck, and it was a six-length margin back to Gates Of Horn (Ire) (Morpheus {GB}) in fourth. Out of Time completed the superfecta in the wake of Mission Boy in the Gran Criterium in Milan last October and was second by only a neck in the Listed Premio Criterium di Pisa two months later. He added his first listed win to his resume at Pisa, landing the Premio Pisa on Apr. 7.

Pink Dogwood is yet another formidable arrow in the quiver of Camelot as the already-influential Coolmore sire seeks a first Derby winner to emulate his own achievement in the blue riband. She is a full-sister to last year's G1 Irish Derby hero and G1 Irish St Leger runner-up Latrobe and a half to the G3 Gladness S. scorer Diamond Fields. The listed-placed dam is a half-sister to the G3 Sceptre S. winner and G1 Cheveley Park S. runner-up Sunday Times (GB) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who is in turn responsible for last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf-winning luminary Newspaperofrecord (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}). The third dam Simply Times produced the G2 Hungerford S. and G3 Bentinck S. winner Welsh Emperor (Ire) (Emperor Jones) who was also runner-up in two editions of the G1 Prix de la Foret. Typically professional on his first start as Ger Lyons's better types tend to be, Inverleigh followed a six-furlong Leopardstown win in August with a second in Fairyhouse's Listed Blenheim S. also over that trip the following month. Backing up quickly when third in the Listed Star Appeal S. attempting an extra furlong at Dundalk in October, the bay relished a fast pace over the minimum trip to open his black-type account. Racing in rear as the tempo initially caught him out, he made up ground relentlessly to collar The Irish Rover in the final 150 yards.

"He shows nothing at home and today was about blowing the cobwebs away and seeing where it lands, no expectations. Thankfully he has done it well and it's a nice surprise," Lyons said. "We might have a little go at seven somewhere along the line. It's nice for Donagh [O'Connor]. He rides out for us once a week and has plenty of ability and that's his first stakes win in his second ride in a stakes race."

Inverleigh's dam is the unraced Sommorell who hails from one of the finest families in the stud book. With a 2-year-old filly by Anjaal (GB) and a yearling filly by Footstepsinthesand(GB) to come, she is a half-sister to the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis winner Ransom O'War (Red Ransom) while her second dam Somfas has seven stakes performers to her credit including the G2 Temple S. winner Snaadee (Danzig), his G2 Mill Reef S.-winning full-brother Russian Bond and the G3 Prix de Conde scorer Cristofori (Fappiano). She is also the ancestress of the triple Group 1-winning young sire Charm Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and the recent Rushaway S. winner Onthewaytonevrland (Ire) (No Nay Never). Inverleigh's fourth dam is the high-class Ciboulette (Chop Chop), dam of the

#### **Listed Prix Finlande Cont.**

Fourth on her comeback but beaten less than a length in a mile conditions event here Apr. 14, the chestnut stepped up on that effort to record a first black-type success. Settled behind the leading trio early, she was sent to the front approaching the 300-metre marker and despite being passed soon after by Blanche Doree was back in front 100 metres from the post before asserting.

Trainer Pascal Bary is heading straight to the top level now. "She had shown quality as a juvenile, but had some problems after her last run at two and that is why she had not run in the second part of the season," he explained. "She ran well after such a long break on her return and had shown improvement in the mornings, so this was not a surprise. There is still some room for more and she will most probably run next time here in the [May 26 G1] Prix Saint-Alary."

The dam, who was not asked to run over as much as a mile by Jean-Claude Rouget, is a half-sister to the G3 Prix du Calvados winner Mambia (GB) (Aldebaran) and to the dam of the recent Listed Prix Rose de Mai scorer Phoceene (Fr) (Olympic Glory {Ire}). Despite **TDN Rising Star** and G3 Prix de Fontainebleau runner-up Epic Hero (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) running too free throughout having been unable to find any cover, Andre Fabre still emerged with the winner of this prize as Urwald showed that speed tests are the way forward for him. Last of seven tackling nine furlongs on his seasonal bow in the G3 Prix La Force here three weeks previously, the chestnut, who had won his sole start at two over 7 1/2 furlongs at Saint-Cloud in November, settled kindly for Pierre-Charles Boudot racing with one behind early. Looming alongside the fast-emptying Epic Hero approaching the final furlong, the homebred quickly had the measure of his stablemate and forged on from the progressive Becquagold.

Urwald is the first black-type winner for the G2 Diana-Trial runner-up Waldjagd, who is a daughter of the four-times group winner Wurftaube (Ger) (Acatenango (Ger)) best known for her runaway success in the G2 Deutsches St Leger. She has proven to be an excellent producer, with four black-type performers to her credit headed by the G1 Deutsches Derby hero Waldpark (Ger) (Dubawi {Ire}) and the G2 Falmouth S. runner-up Waldmark (Ger) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}). The latter was responsible for the G1 St Leger hero Masked Marvel (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and G3 Prix Penelope scorer Waldlerche (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) whose G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud-winning son Waldgeist (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) proved his standing with an impressive G1 Prix Ganay victory later in the day. That was supplemented in the same hour by this family's Winterfuchs (Ger) (Campanologist) in the G3 Dr Busch Memorial at Krefeld. # NIFTY NINE FOR RECORD-SETTING 'BEAUTY' AS JAPAN TRIP BECKONS by Alan Carasso

Three of the four Hong Kong-based winners from December's Longines Hong International Races meeting made an appearance on FWD Champions Day Sunday at Sha Tin--only Mr Stunning (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) missed the event owing to injury--but as has been the case for much of the last 12 months, it was **Beauty Generation (NZ)** (Road to Rock {Aus}) who stole all the thunder.

The reigning Horse of the Year won his eighth consecutive race this season, a new record in Hong Kong, and his ninth race in succession overall. In successfully defending his title in the G1 FWD Champions Mile, where it all began in 2018, Beauty Generation surpasses former John Moore stablemate Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}) as the most prolific money spinner in Hong Kong history, with now nearly HK\$87 million in the bank, some HK\$84 million of which has been earned locally.

"Definitely, it's an amazing achievement," said trainer John Moore of Sunday's win, "for the stable and all the staff to be able to keep him up and sustain his fitness level to be able to win these races in such a facile fashion. And thanks to Hong Kong that we've had a champion in our midst and we've still got a champion miler and the whole world knows we've got one hell of a miler over here."

With no foreign competition signed on, only the same pool of horses he'd been beating up on all season long, the task ahead of Beauty Generation was fairly straight-forward. Zac Purton kicked the 6-year-old gelding into the lead and when the opening 400 metres were posted in :25.33, it was the equine equivalent of a six-inch putt. From there, Purton gradually increased the speed on the pacemaker--he covered the next two sectionals in :22.96 and :22.98--and with the race already in safe keeping, took a confident look under his left arm pit at the 200m to see no threat was emerging. While never being asked for an effort, Beauty Generation was home in :22.36 to seal the deal, as Singapore Sling (SAf) (Philanthropist) rallied off a no-cover trip to be second ahead of Simply Brilliant (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in third.

If there was drama to be found post-race, it was the question of whether Beauty Generation could be headed to Japan for the G1 Yasuda Kinen in early June. The trainer is fully on board.

"I'd like to go to Japan but of course it is the owner's call," Moore said. "[Owner] Patrick [Kwok] and his father [Simon] will make the decision in time. As I said, it was a facile win today and I don't think it took much out of him in the sense of it being such a long season and I still think there's a lot left in the tank. Let's go back to the drawing board and have a talk over dinner."

Late Sunday, Purton tweeted that the odds of making the trip had "shortened dramatically...if a few minor details can be arranged" and that "the owner wants it."

Should that overseas trip eventuate, he could meet the likes of Danon Premium (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and, possibly, Horse of the Year Almond Eye (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}). No Hong Kong horse has won the Yasuda Kinen since Bullish Luck (Royal Academy) in 2006.

#### Win Bright Gives Japan Another QE II Cup...

In the 2015 G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup, the unheralded A Shin Hikari (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) stunned the Hong Kong faithful with a front-running 37-1 upset over his compatriot Nuovo Record (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}). Win Bright (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}), similar in colour--and ultimately in starting price--to A Shin Hikari, was given a perfect ground-saving ride from 34-year-old Masami Matsuoka and punched through late to cause a 47-1 boilover. Favoured Exultant (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and Lys Gracieux (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Ire}) finished one ahead of the other, same as they did when running the quinella in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase in December. It was the third QE II win for Japan in the last seven years (Rulership, 2012; Neorealism, 2017) and fourth overall (Eishin Preston, 2002, 2003).

Exiting a successful defense of his title in the G2 Nakayama Kinen, in which he defeated last year's G1 Mile Championship hero Stelvio (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) into third and last year's G1 Hong Kong Cup runner-up **Deirdre (Jpn)** (Harbinger {GB}) into sixth, Win Bright was away well from the inside draw and eventually settled three back the fence as **Time Warp (GB)** (Archipenko) and his full-brother **Glorious Forever (GB)** renewed their sibling rivalry on the engine. The latter allowed Time Warp to stride into the lead with about seven furlongs to race, with defending champ and '**TDN Rising Star' Pakistan Star (Ger)** (Shamardal) enjoying the run of the race from third and

Win Bright in his slipstream a bit further back. Lys Gracieux and Exultant improved with wide runs on the second turn, but back up front, Pakistan Star knifed through between the brothers to lead and it looked to be deja vu all over again. But Win Bright was still traveling in behind, split Hong Kong Derby winner Furore (NZ) (Pierro {Aus}) and Glorious Forever at the 300m, grabbed Pakistan Star inside the furlong and edged clear. Exultant rallied belatedly and just touched Lys Gracieux out of second. The final time established a new course record for the 2000m.

"This is the very best day!" said Matsuoka, who hadn't ridden a Group 1 winner since the 2009 Tenno Sho (Spring). "He didn't have good gate speed this time, but we found a good spot and the horse travelled nicely and that helped him run very well to the finish."

Should all go well, Win Bright is a candidate for the Hong Kong Cup at year's end, according to his connections.

#### **Pedigree Notes**

A May foal, Win Bright is the ninth Group 1 winner for his sire, who took out the 2001 Hong Kong Vase in his career finale and is responsible for the likes of Horse of the Year Orfevre (Jpn) and champion and fan favourite Gold Ship (Jpn). The winner has a 2-year-old half-brother by the aforementioned Orfevre and Summer Eternity was most recently covered by Deep Impact (Jpn) after missing to the Shadai stallion for 2018.

#### Consistent As the Day Is Long...

Beat The Clock (Aus) (Hinchinbrook {Aus}) is that proverbial horse you'd like to have a barn full of and he continued his consistent ways with a tough defeat of the progressive **Rattan** (NZ) (Savabeel {Aus}) in the day's first feature, the G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize. Little Giant (NZ) (Swiss Ace {Aus}) ran a bold race from close up to be third.

The shape of the Chairman's Sprint Prize was always a bit of an open question, and it was Rattan, who defeated Beat The Clock with a five-pound pull in the weights in the G2 Sprint Cup three weeks back, that showed the most early initiative. He was joined by the Japanese mare Nac Venus (Jpn) (Daiwa Major {Jpn}), anointed the most likely leader by many, but only at the first corner, as Little Giant settled on the back of the front-runner and Beat the Clock in the one-by-one slot. Pulled out into the three path turning for home, Beat The Clock sprinted past Nac Venus and had to fight for it, given that he was slightly disadvantaged tactically, but he called upon his considerable class and was home first. The race's tough-luck story was favoured G1 T J Smith S. hero Santa Ana Lane (Aus) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), who closed off in a race-fastest :21.50, but simply did not have the race run to suit and was a brave fourth.

It was a second Group 1 for Beat The Clock and strengthened his case for a season-ending title, but he has run his last race of the year, said trainer John Size, winning his third Chairman's Sprint Prize.

"He is a joy to take to the races, that's for sure, because he's so consistent and such a willing participant," Size said. "He's come strong at five years of age and it should be his best season and he's done that, he's delivered with his two Group 1s."

#### FIEREMENT CONFIRMS CLASS IN TENNO SHO

Fierement (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) confirmed himself as a stayer of the highest class by winning Sunday's G1 Tenno Sho Spring in just his sixth lifetime start, and thus becoming the lightest-raced horse ever to take the Kyoto feature. Fierement was coming off a head second on his seasonal debut in the G2 American Jockey Club S. on Jan. 20, and was winning for the first time since taking the final Japanese colts' Classic, the G1 Kikuka Sho, last October.

Breaking near the back of the pack, Fierement lingered about 15 lengths off the pace into the first bend, but had made up about half that distance by the time they passed the finish line for the first time. Pulling jockey Christophe Lemaire gradually closer on the run down the backstretch, Fierement got his head in front between runners turning for home with Kikuka Sho fifth Glory Vase (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who had shadowed him throughout, on his outside. That pair drew clear from their rivals and tussled for the length of the stretch, with Fierement never being headed and hitting the wire a neck to the good. It was sixth lengths back to the longshot third Perform A Promise (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}).

"It was a tough race to win but Fierement really showed his strength when we were challenged by Keita Tosaki's mount on the outside," said Lemaire. "He was able to relax early on which is important in a long-distance race like this. He wanted to go in the last two corners so I let him go and although the ground got slippery under him at the last corner, he was able to regain his balance and increase his speed at the straight. He's improving with every race and certainly proved he's of Group 1 quality with this win."

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Fierement emulated his sire Deep Impact with a win in the Tenno Sho, the latter having taken it also as a 4-year-old in 2006. Fierement is out of the decorated mare Lune d'Or (Fr) (Green Tune), whose list of accolades includes Italy's G1 Premio Lydia Tesio and France's G2 Prix de Malleret and G2 Prix de Pomone–she was also third in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks. Fierement is her first black-type winner, but she had already been represented in that realm as a second dam, her daughter Learned Friend (Ger) (Seeking the Gold) having supplied the triple French Group 3 winner and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois second Inns of Court (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Fierement's second and third dams were also French listed winners.

# VENDORS MEET THE MARKET IN MELBOURNE



The top-priced colt of the sale, son of Brazen Beau

#### By Bren O'Brien

An excellent clearance rate of 87% highlighted the Melbourne Gold Yearling Sale at Oaklands Junction, with median and average down on the same sale 12 months ago.

#### At a Glance

- Clearance rate of 87% is a huge boost on last year when it was 79%.
- For the first time in three years there wasn't a six-figure lot in the sale, with a filly by Dundeel (NZ) offered by Jazcom Thoroughbreds topping the sale at \$90,000.
- Average was down on last year at \$18,326, compared to \$19,265.
- The median also dropped to \$11,000, down from \$13,000 last year.
- Toronado (Ire), whose Prince of Sussex won the inaugural Vobis Showdown on Saturday, topped the sires list with aggregate sales of \$210,000 across his seven sold lots.

#### Filly a Dundeel for Ottobre

The success of Dundeel (NZ)'s progeny on the track this season has led to increased demand for his progeny at the yearling sales and Tony Ottobre's Cape Schanck Stud went to \$90,000 for Lot 70, his filly out of My Holidaze (Pins) offered by Jazcom Thoroughbreds.

She is a half-sister to the winner Nanita (Not A Single Doubt), with the dam an unraced daughter of the stakes-placed Holidazzle (Flying Spur), while the Group 3 winner Artistry (Shamardal {USA}) also features on the pedigree page.

Ottobre's Cape Schanck Stud have emerged on the buying bench this year and took its 2019 account to eight filly purchases across five sales, for a total just short of \$850,000. This filly will be prepared by David Brideoake at Mornington.

"She is very similar in type to Princess Jenni (High Chaparral {Ire}), who we obviously have a massive opinion of," Ottobre said. "I went through the catalogue looking for Classic horses and am excited to get this filly."

"When she was brought out of her box I could hear her walking out and as soon as I saw her I thought that is exactly the classic walk that a stayer possess."

Bendigo-based trainer Shaun Dwyer went to \$80,000 for Lot 103, a Street Boss (USA) filly offered by Blue Gum Farm. She is out of the city winner Radar (Exceed and Excel), the three-quarter sister to stakes winner Aerobatics who has already produced the handy pair Intuition (Street Cry {Ire}) and Transmitter (Medaglia D'Oro {USA}).

Blue Gum led all vendors at the sale with all 18 of its yearlings which went through the ring sold for a total of \$487,000 and an average of \$28,647, while Jazcom also had a 100% clearance rate for \$279,000 in total sales.

Shane Nichols secured the top priced colt of the sale, paying \$80,000 for Lot 249 by Brazen Beau, offered by Supreme Thoroughbreds. The colt is a half-brother to the Listed winner Cavaloce (Testa Rossa) from a half-sister to Group 1 winner Reactive (Geiger Counter {USA}).

#### Harris picks up quartet

Mornington trainer Kane Harris was a busy buyer on the day picking up four yearlings including Lot 63, a Wandjina colt out of Miffy (Flying Spur) for \$64,000.

Miffy is a sister to Group 1 winning 2-year-old Sleek Chassis from the family which has also produced Group 1 winners Marble Halls and Amphitrite. She has already produced the winner Splitter (Foxwedge) and Moving Target (Testa Rossa).

The colt was offered by Bowness Stud, who had a very busy sale with 19 sold at an aggregate of \$260,000.

Harris also paid \$50,000 for Lot 36, a Smart Missile colt out of La Camille (Peintre Celebre {USA}), the half-brother to stakes placed Goldstone (Shamardal {USA}) as well as four other winners.

He was the sale's biggest buyer with \$132,000 spent, while fellow trainer Matt Laurie spent \$116,000 with his three purchases, while Ciaron Maher paid \$110,000 for his three.

Vietnamese-based Keyhinge was the most prolific buyer, picking up 11 yearlings for a total of \$47,000 and an average of \$4273, while Aintree Park was also busy with seven purchases.

Lindsay Park paid the highest price for a yearling by a first-season sire, going to \$62,000 for Lot 58, a filly by Darley's Kermadec (NZ) out of Magrosso (Magnus), who is the half-sister to Doubting and Special Edition. The famous racing operation also picked up Lot 139 by Lauriston Park's Rock Hero for \$35,000.

There were seven yearlings sold by Swettenham's Toronado and he led Widden Stud's Shamus Award, who sold 10 for a total of \$170,500, in terms of sire aggregate.

Blue Gum's Turffontein led the averages for those stallions who sold more than three with four sold at \$30,875 apiece, ahead of Toronado, Smart Missile and Helmet.

Inglis' Victorian Bloodstock Manager Simon Vivian was thrilled with the results of the sale.

"The level of interest and participation in the sale has been strong which is really pleasing," Vivian said. "We had a significant number of individual buyers including a great cross section of Victorian trainers."

"A lot of the top Victorian trainers were active at today's sale; Lindsay Park, Maher/Eustace, Mick Price and Mike Moroney just to name a few.

"Further, there has been strong international interest in the sale as well with active buyers from Singapore, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Vietnam and Macau."

"With the VOBIS Raceday yesterday and the success of today's sale, it really goes to show the exceptional shape of the Victorian breeding industry."

Say what you want, think what you want about Frank Stronach, but no one can deny that he loves horse racing and wants to see his tracks and the entire sport prosper. It's hard to imagine how difficult it must be for him to be cast to the side while his daughter, Belinda, runs what he created, The Stronach Group (TSG). For most of his life, he has been a powerful man and has been in charge. No more. So far, he's on the losing end of a fight for control of the company and has no say in how it is run.

He wanted to be heard, which is why he rented out a conference room at a local hotel and invited the Southern California racing community to hear what was on his mind. His primary idea was that he wanted to place the TSG tracks in a trust, which would guarantee that the tracks could not be bulldozed and the land developed. It's a very good idea. The problem is, as of now, Stronach has no say whatsoever when it comes to the future of Santa Anita or any of the TSG tracks. That won't change unless he wins the lawsuit he filed against Belinda seeking to regain control of the company. At 86, time is not on his side as the Stronach vs. Stronach lawsuit is likely to drag on in the Canadian courts for years.

Frank strongly implied that Belinda has ulterior motives, one of them being to shut down Santa Anita and to cash in on its immense value as real estate. *Cont. p3*



"Within management, we have forces who do not want to race," he said. "They want to see the tracks developed. I'm totally against that, and for the past few years, I've been outspoken about that."

That was his money quote, and the facts so far seem to prove him to be off base. With all that has happened at Santa Anita since this nightmarish meet began, few could have blamed Belinda if she threw up her hands, said "I want out" and put the for sale sign out in front of the track. With PETA and the media on her back, all the headaches and all the ill will that has been directed her way, why put up with all the aggravation? The easy way out would be to close the track, sell the land to developers and add a large fortune to her bank account. In fact, according to several sources, some prominent owners came to her and offered to purchase the track. She said no.

Instead of bailing on Santa Anita, she has dug her heels in and has vowed, not only to keep it open, but to do everything in her power to make it the safest racetrack in America. You might not like her ideas about Lasix, whips, etc., but her trying to curtail the use of both is her way of trying to get the animal activists to calm down and not put together a drive to put an initiative on the ballot to ban racing in the state. So far, it's working. Better to have racing without Lasix than no racing at all.

Her latest move was to hire the respected vet Dr. Dionne Benson, who has been appointed as the Chief Veterinary Officer for The Stronach Group.


She doesn't seem to want to run away from the problems; she wants to fix them. If not, the wrecking ball would have arrived weeks ago.

Okay, Finley has planted some gardens in neighborhoods near Pimlico, but is that really a qualification for having a seat next to Stronach at a meeting to discuss problems at Santa Anita? And the neighborhood around Santa Anita is hardly a poor area.

# Once Again, It Was Ladies' Day at the Hall of Fame

When it was announced that Royal Delta was the only horse that would be inducted into the Hall of Fame this August, it should have come as no surprise that she is a she. A modernera male race horse has not been inducted since Lava Man in 2015, and he was a gelding. No non-gelded horse has been inducted since Curlin in 2014. In the meantime, six females have gone in and the mare Ashado also went in in 2014.

This could be nothing more than a coincidence, but there's also a plausible reason why it's becoming

harder than ever for males to make the Hall of Fame. If a colt has Hall of Fame ability, they likely won't have had a career that is long enough to convince voters they've done enough to merit induction.

It's very rare these days for a male horse to remain in training if they have any kind of pedigree and have won a Grade I race at two or three. It's a matter of simple economics: they're going to

make more money breeding than racing.

As for the last seven mares to make it into the Hall of Fame, Goldikova and Zenyatta raced until they were six; Royal Delta, Heavenly Prize and Xtra Heat raced until they were five; Ashado and Rachel Alexandra made it through their 4-year-old seasons.

The next male who retired after his 3-year-old year that will make the Hall of Fame is American Pharoah.

Likely, Justify will follow three years later. But that may be what it now takes for a male horse that retires before a 4-year-old season to make the Hall--a Triple Crown victory.

There are a couple of other no-brainers among males that will soon be eligible. California Chrome and Gun Runner are certain Hall of Famers and Arrogate is highly likely to make it. But all three kept going for at least a 4-year-old season.

#### Why Not Havre de Grace?

That females are dominating when it comes to entry into the Hall of Fame makes it all the more surprising that voters have now turned down Havre de Grace two straight years.

In any sport, there are certain milestones that guarantee induction. Unless you are a suspected steroid user, hit .300 and/or have 500 career home runs and you will make it into baseball's Hall of Fame. One would think that the same should apply to any filly or mare that is named Horse of the Year.

Since the Eclipse Awards were initiated in 1971, six fillies have been named Horse of the Year. Five are in the Hall of Fame. Havre de Grace, whose victory over males in the 2011 GI Woodward S. put her over the top in the Horse of the Year race, is the only exception. On this one, the voters whiffed.

#### And Finally...

I'd like to introduce a new feature to weeks when I put together the *TDN*'s Week In Review, "The Worst Named Horse of the Week." The honor (or is it dishonor?) this week goes to The Creep (Twirling Candy), who was fifth in Saturday's California Derby at Golden Gate Fields.

He went in :48.40 this morning, but when Gabe got back to the barn he said he could've went around there again. It was like nothing to them."

Owned by Chester Thomas' Allied Racing Stables, By My Standards worked in fractions of :12.40, :24 and :36.40 before galloping out five furlongs in 1:00.60, six furlongs in 1:12.80 and seven furlongs in 1:26.60, according to Churchill Downs' Clocker John Nichols.

William S. Farish's **Code of Honor** (Noble Mission {GB}) completed his major preparation for next Saturday's Derby with a four-furlong work in :46.80 (2/76) Sunday. With exercise rider Brian Duggan in the irons, he produced fractions of :11.80, :23.20, :35.20 and galloped out five furlongs in :59.40 and six furlongs in 1:13.20.

"I told [Brian] to go in :48, but the track was pretty good this morning," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "I was pleased with the way he handled it and glad I got the kind of track we did today. He had two good works at Keeneland and the last one was on an off track, so we know he can handle an off track and what he was on today is probably what he will see Saturday."

Winner of the GII Fountain of Youth S., Code of Honor is coming off a third-place effort in the Mar. 30 GI Florida Derby.

**Improbable** (City Zip), runner-up in the GII Rebel S. and GI Arkansas Derby, turned in a five-furlong work Sunday in 1:00.60 (9/25).



Improbable's work caused Elliott Walden, president of coowner WinStar Farm, to compare the colt to the operation's 2010 Derby-winning Super Saver (Maria's Mon).

"He's feeling good and I think [trainer] Bob [Baffert] has him right where he wants him," Walden said of Improbable, whom WinStar Farm co-owns along with China Horse Club International and Starlight Racing. "He reminds me of Super Saver when he came in here off Arkansas. The three weeks were a good three weeks."

Under jockey Florent Geroux--who is actually set to ride fellow Baffert trainee **Roadster** (Quality Road) Saturday--Improbable broke off just a couple lengths behind workmate Embolden (The Factor), quickly catching up to that one and moving past his stablemate down the lane as he registered splits of :11.80, :23.60, and :36.40 before galloping out six furlongs in 1:13 and seven furlongs in 1:25.60.

"I don't think he was rank. He was just maybe a little bit keen and feeling good," Geroux said. "He's very easy [to ride] actually. Down the lane he was responding exactly to what I was asking him to. I could have gone faster if I wanted to. I could have gone a touch slower if I wanted to. He was just very cooperative."

Sunday's work was Improbable's second at Churchill Downs. The chestnut colt went four furlongs Apr. 22 in :48.00 (4/80).

"He loves this track. I just love the way he kept on galloping out today," Baffert said. "That's what we wanted to see. He gets over it well. He's not really big, but he jumps a long way. Now I can relax. Now we have to wait for the draw. That's the last of the anxiety, the draw."

One day after arriving from California and joining stablemate Improbable in Churchill Downs' Barn 33, reigning juvenile male champion **Game Winner** (Candy Ride {Arg}) and Grade I winner Roadster went to the Churchill Downs track for the first time in their Kentucky Derby preparations.



"They just jogged. They're not going to do much," Baffert said of the duo.

Baffert added, "All three have different styles. Game Winner he's like the fullback, Roadster he's real light and lean, but he gets over the ground well. I'm just happy to be here with three really nice horses."







"I'd pick Omaha Beach (War Front). To me, he was really impressive when he won the Arkansas Derby. I can see why Mike Smith picked him. He has a little bit of natural speed and that will help him stay out of trouble, and he has a lot of ability. It's a wide-open race and that's what makes it hard when you ask me to pick a horse to ride. There are several nice horse in there and several nice horses coming off of big wins. It's a great betting race, a great race for the fans to bet. There's no clearcut favorite. You can find a 10-1 shot and he might look as good on paper as the 7-2 shot. It's going to be an exciting race."


Mocito Rojo, claimed for \$10,000 by Wayne Davis out of a maiden win at Delta Downs in 2016, became a graded stakes winner Sunday in Texas when he overtook King Abner late to win the GIII Steve Sexton Mile S. by two lengths. The 5-year-old was caught some five wide as favored King Abner took the lead around the first turn. King Abner was taken in hand and settled into a stalking second down the backstretch as Mocito Rojo continued to race three wide around midpack. King Abner regained the lead turning for home, but Mocito Rojo, once again caught five wide on the far turn, was winding up for his run. He found his best stride with a furlong to run, overtook the Southern California invader and powered clear.

"He had run some big races over the wintertime," trainer Shane Wilson said of the winner. "He'd run some 115 and 114 speed figures and we looked around and some of these Grade IIIs are won with 108s and 109s. So you want to take a step and try something like this, but you're always nervous that maybe he can do it against lesser competition, but not against better horses. But he stepped up and did it like we hoped he would. He's just been a dream come true. Everytime we've stepped him up, he's responded and run bigger. Everytime."

Transferred to Joseph Catanese, the mare's best finish from four subsequent Florida starts was a third in the South Beach S. in Hallandale three back. She made her final appearance for Catanese with a fourth in the Sand Springs S. going a mile on grass there Mar. 30, and was debuting for the Ryerson barn Sunday. Taking all the money at the windows in this return to the New York circuit, the Backwards Stable homebred broke on top and carried the field through an opening quarter in :23.26. Left to her own devices as noses pointed toward home, the bay was shaken up at the head of the lane, but her lead shrank with every stride. 
