



CALYX SENSATIONAL IN ROYAL WARM-UP

Long absent and much missed, 'TDN Rising Star' Calyx (GB) (Kingman {GB}) burst back onto the scene in Wednesday's G3 Merriebelle Stable Commonwealth Cup Trial S. over the same six-furlong strip over which he had proven so high-class in last year's G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot. Always travelling with ease on the outer of the small group over two lengths off the pace, the Juddmonte homebred was set alight by Frankie Dettori once finding himself in front with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining. Electric from there, the 1-3 favourite hit the line with four lengths to spare over the highly-regarded Elsworth runner **No Nonsense (GB)** (Acclamation {GB}) in this race registered as the Pavilion S.

"He was amazing," commented a bowled-over Dettori. "He's blessed with so much speed, I think sprinting is his thing. He's a serious horse and there is lots to look forward to."

Prior to the inauguration of the Commonwealth Cup, the likes of Calyx were generally forced into showing up for the 2000 Guineas with a lack of sprinting options available. That Classic was considered after stablemate Too Darn Hot (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) went by the wayside recently, but connections are content they made the right call as Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe explained afterwards.

"It had always been in our minds to go a mile, because the mile races are so important," he said. Cont. p2

BRIDGING THE GAP: CORK TO CHURCHILL

DOWNS By Kelsey Riley

Cork-born trainer Brendan Walsh has been ascending steadily through the U.S. ranks since taking out his license seven years ago, and the 45-year-old will reach the summit of American racing on Saturday when he saddles his first GI Kentucky Derby starter, the G2 UAE Derby winner Plus Que Parfait (Point of Entry).

In 2012, his first full year with a license, Walsh sent out four winners. His tally last month at Keeneland's three-week spring meet alone was six--good for joint fourth by winners. Walsh bagged in excess of \$3-million in both 2017 and 2018, and with \$2.35-million in the bank already in 2019 he is well on his way to a career-best year with a stable of 60 split currently between Keeneland and Churchill Downs.

"From that point of view, we had to find out if he is sprinter or a miler and it is probably better to find out in a race like this rather than get to the six-furlong pole in the 2000 Guineas, have a hard race coming down the hill and then find out he doesn't stay," Grimthorpe added.

After the brave call to avoid Newmarket, the big sprint tests are firmly on the winner's agenda. "It looks like he wants to be a sprinter, I would say, and that is what Frankie thought," Grimthorpe added. "We have always said that he has been training nicely, there is no doubt about that. It was just a question of trying to pick the right race for him after such a long layoff. That was John [Gosden]'s main concern. Calyx has been working with a staying horse and settling well, but I think he is a different animal on the racecourse. He certainly has that zip and, although he settled pretty well in the race, I think the way he quickened there suggests six furlongs is going to be his business."

Gosden was also unequivocal about pointing at the Royal meeting's six-furlong Group 1 contest over the G1 St James's Palace S. "Calyx is bred to be a miler, but he likes to sprint. All being well, we will be back here for the [June 21] Commonwealth Cup," he confirmed. "It is a great race for the 3-year-olds and I think that is clearly the way to go now. I've been training him diligently to be a miler, but when he goes out there he wants to be a sprinter and that's great. I haven't encouraged him to do that, that's just him."

Pedigree Notes

Calyx has done what his G3 Prix d'Aumale-winning dam Helleborine (GB) (Observatory) failed to do and win a group race as a 3-year-old, but that may be harsh on that G1 Prix Marcel Boussac runner-up as she may have run into troubles after her juvenile campaign. She is a full-sister to the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup heroine African Rose (GB), whose daughter Fair Eva (GB) (Frankel {GB}) looked a potential world-beater when capturing the G3 Princess Margaret S. at two before losing her way. The second dam is the G3 Lancashire Oaks third New Orchid (Quest For Fame {GB}), who is a half-sister to the G1 Dewhurst S.winning sire Distant Music (Distant View) who was third in a vintage renewal of the G1 Champion S. at three. Helleborine also has a yearling colt by Muhaarar (GB) and a filly foal by Frankel (GB).

"Six winners at Keeneland is pretty good going for a stable of our size," said Walsh, who also saddles Proctor's Ledge (Ghostzapper) in Churchill's GII Distaff Turf Mile, a race she won

last year, on Saturday. "It's always good to be doing well and having winners like that when you're going into something like the Derby."

Plus Que Parfait, like his trainer, is riding a winning momentum heading into the First Saturday in May. The chestnut, a \$135,000 Keeneland September yearling, will be a longshot when he exits gate nine on Saturday, but Walsh said he has blossomed since his trip to Dubai. Plus Que Parfait has started twice at Churchill Downs, placing both times including a neck second behind fellow Derby starter Signalman (General Quarters) in last November's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S.

Plus Que Parfait failed to fire in the Louisiana prep races over the winter, finishing fifth and 13th, respectively, in the G3 LeComte S. and G2 Risen Star S. He looked a different horse, however, when winning the UAE Derby by 3/4 of a length over Gray Magician (Graydar) after saving ground midpack on the rail, and the 100 Kentucky Derby qualifying points he earned there ensured him a spot in the starting gate. Walsh said Dubai was always in the back of his team's minds because owners Imperial Racing are based in the Emirate over the winter.

"They have some horses with Doug Watson, I believe, out there, and of course they have a few distributed amongst different trainers [in America]," Walsh said. "A lot of it revolves around World Cup night [for Imperial Racing] and I think this is the first time that they managed to pull off a win, so they were really, really pleased, as you could imagine."

"When things didn't quite work out at Fair Grounds, we diverted towards maybe giving Dubai a shot. We sent him down to Florida after the Risen Star because if he was going to Dubai, he was going to fly out of Miami anyway. We said, 'If he's doing really, really well, where we'd be confident he'd run a good race in Dubai, then we'd send him to Dubai."

Walsh, who has "one or two 2-year-olds" on the way to his barn for Imperial Racing, said he laid eyes on Plus Que Parfait for the first time in Ocala about a year ago.

"I loved him from the word go, and he's always been very, very

professional the whole way through," Walsh said. "When we brought him in last year, from day one he was one of those that you just showed him what you wanted him to do, what was required, and he went ahead and did it. He's always been very professional, and he's got a great mind, which I think is his biggest asset. Physically, in the last two months, he's really grown from a boy into a man. He's gotten a lot stronger, physically, which is exactly what you want to see in a 3year-old this time of year."

"He's always handled Churchill well," Walsh added. "He ran twice there last year and ran well both times. He handles the track good. He's always worked well there, too. He's done plenty of work there and he looks this week like he's taken to it like a duck to water."

Plus Que Parfait's apparent affinity for Churchill Downs is not unlike his trainer's compatibility with the American racing scene. It can't hurt that Walsh laid a solid international foundation before striking out on his own. His travels took him from Ireland--where he completed the Irish National Stud course before moving to Darley's Kildangan Stud-to Dubai, where he spent nine winters as a work rider for various stables including

Godolphin, where he had his hands on the likes of Daylami, Street Cry, Fantastic Light and Kayf Tara. His next stop was Newmarket, where he spent 3 1/2 years with trainer Mark Wallace, before taking up an offer to join trainer Eddie Kenneally in Kentucky.

"I came over on vacation at one stage and I bumped into Eddie Kenneally, and he told me, 'If you plan on coming back give me a call," Walsh explained. "I hooked up with Eddie, and did another 3 1/2 or four years with Eddie, which was great. And then I decided I'd take the plunge."

For all his global grounding, however, Walsh's interest was

that places like Cork--home of

"Without a doubt," Walsh responded when asked if growing up in Cork kick-started his career. "I was obsessed with horses from the get-go. Don't ask me where it came from, but we were farmers at home, so you're always around animals, and I think when you've got a natural thing with animals, it translates, no matter whether it's dogs, or horses, or whatever it is.

"I was always very fond of animals, and I think you learn to care for animals, and horses were my thing."

"My dad bought me a pony when I was eight years old, and we just went from there. But it's difficult, when I think about it sometimes, to explain where it really came from, and how I ended up in it."

Having an unwavering familial support system didn't hurt, either.

"My dad bought me a pony, and opened the door for me, and they never stood in my way, and thankfully things worked out," Walsh added. "There were a few bumps along the road, as there is with anybody's career. In the end, it worked out great. I'm doing what I love to do, and there's an awful lot to be said for that."

While he is undoubtedly nostalgic about his native land, it appears as if there was never much doubt

about where Walsh would lay down new roots, and why.

"America is just the land of opportunity," he said. "It's very hard for a young trainer to get started in Europe, unless you have a lot of money behind you, because everything is private.


"So you have to find yourself a yard and gallops, and you have to have the right clientele and the right connections. "It was always going to be very tough for me to get going

there, and I always loved American racing. I always followed it, and it always appealed to me.

There was a bit more opportunity here, so I decided I'd pursue it, and thankfully, it worked out. When I look back on it, it couldn't have worked out any better."

American racing unfortunately rolls into its marquee event this weekend in the shadow of a national crisis that has unraveled following the deaths of 23 horses over the winter at Santa Anita. Progress to regain the public's confidence in racing appears to be making baby steps, most notably with a 20-strong coalition of

racetracks that have pledged to phase out race day medication, but deeply divided opinions, specifically on the topic of Lasix, still stand in the way of true reform.

Walsh was quick to acknowledge the merits of both sides of the argument, but said he thinks a national governing body is necessary for real progress to be made.

"I know I'm stating the obvious, but the main thing that needs to be done, above anything--and I don't know how you'd even go about it--but there needs to be a national governing body in the country," Walsh said. "Any of the major racing countries in the world has a national governing body, and I think that's where American racing gets called out more than anything. And I think if you could do that, and everybody come together and come to an agreement, and not have one bunch saying one thing, and another saying another, I think that's what has to be done. Everybody needs to come together and find a common ground, where everyone is reasonably happy. Hopefully, everybody can find a way to keep the whole thing going, and we don't end up in trouble, and it's not too late."

The rise of high-quality turf racing in the U.S. has been a much more positive talking point over the past year. Plus Que Parfait is by Point of Entry, a beautifully bred son of Dynaformer from a prolific Phipps family that won three Grade Is on the turf and was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Interestingly, this year's Kentucky Derby includes a handful of horses with turfthemed pedigrees: GII Fountain of Youth S. winner Code of Honor is from the first crop of Frankel (GB)'s three-time Group 1-winning full-brother Noble Mission (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), while Omaha Beach–favoured before being scratched late Wednesday--and War of Will are both by War Front. It is well known that the Claiborne stallion raced on dirt himself but has thus far carved out his lofty reputation primarily on the basis of his grass runners, although the axis looks likely to shift this year. While Omaha Beach would not have been a longshot to excel on the dirt, being a grandson of the outstanding dirt Grade I winner and broodmare Take Charge Lady (Dehere) and a half-brother to champion 2-year-old filly Take Charge Brandi (Giant's Causeway), War of Will is a fascinating case, being a half-brother to the Irish champion 2-year-old Pathfork (Distorted Humor) out of the stakes-winning Sadler's Wells mare Visions of Clarity (Ire).

Walsh acknowledged that turf racing is indeed on the rise, but said he hopes that doesn't come at the expense of dirt racing.

"I think there's an awful lot more of turf racing than what there was when I came to this country," he said. "Why, I don't know. Maybe with what's going on at the moment with medication and everything it suits to have more turf type horses than dirt. But the dirt is also a very big part of American racing, and long may it continue. When you watched American racing you always associated it with dirt racing, and it's always been very exciting."

This week, Walsh has a chance to immortalize his name in that great dirt racing history with a Kentucky Derby runner, and a win in America's greatest race and one of its most coveted and historic sporting events would no doubt be the crowning glory of the trainer's career.

"To win it would be unbelievable," he said. "It's like any sport, like the golfing Majors, the Superbowl in football--this is our Superbowl. So for anybody that's involved in a sport, this is the pinnacle of it. To win it would be unbelievable.

"I just want to see the horse run well. I think that would be a great achievement in itself, to show that it can be done, that you can come back from Dubai and run a good race. Hopefully, he comes back out of it good, and he can have a good rest of his career. Because I think he can, I think he can be very good horse, as time goes along, and I don't think we've seen the best of him yet."

PLUMATIC COMES OF AGE IN THE MUGUET

Sent off an insulting 28-1, the Wertheimers' 'TDN Rising Star' **Plumatic (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) made a mockery of those odds when finally delivering on early promise in Wednesday's G2 Prix du Muguet at Saint-Cloud. Held up in last early by Vincent Cheminaud, last year's G3 Sovereign S. winner was still there turning for home as the 2018 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero **Olmedo (Fr)** (Declaration of War) was committed on the front end by Cristian Demuro. Bearing down on him as the line neared, the homebred son of Plumania (GB) (Anabaa)--who had her finest moment here when winning the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud--got the better of that fellow past 'TDN Rising Star' in the last metres for a neck success. The winner's stablemate **Met Et Nuages (Fr)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) was 3/4 of a length back in third, further confirming the excellent current form of the Fabre yard.

Commented the Wertheimers' racing manager Pierre-Yves Bureau, "We had been running him over too far earlier in his career and he still managed to show a lot of quality, but he had spent a very good winter on the farm and looks like he has grown and fully matured."

Plumatic had earned his TDN Rising Star tag on debut over 10 1/2 furlongs here in March 2017, but form-wise had begun to wear the appearance of a flop by last summer even though he had run second in the G3 Prix de Guiche and the G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange in the interim. Tried at this trip for the first time at Chantilly in July, the bay beat stablemate Graphite (Fr) (Shamardal) by three lengths in a conditions race before hinting at a belated ascent to the top in the Sovereign at Salisbury. Fourth when ridden forward in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp in September and in that track's G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein the following month, he was held on to here with his turn of acceleration in mind and it may be that Vincent Cheminaud, who was deputising for Maxime Guyon on the disappointing **Polydream (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), has found the key.

Pierre-Yves Bureau was pondering options for the resurgent homebred afterwards. "We've found his best distance, although he could probably go a little further," he added. "We have to try and make him a Group 1 winner and there are plenty of possibilities, one being the [G1] Prix d'Ispahan [at ParisLongchamp May 26]. He is not entered in the Queen Anne, but we will see nearer the time what M. Fabre wants to do."

Olmedo's trainer Jean-Claude Rouget was delighted with the effort of the runner-up, who had tended to over-race early. "He is definitely coming back to his best," he said. "He'd run well last time, but was much better here and we could possibly run him in the d'Ispahan or Queen Anne now. We'll see how he comes out of this and if he improves."

Plumatic was softening the subsequent blow for connections due to the reversal on the card of his 3-year-old half-brother Starmaniac (GB) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Greffulhe. Also a half to the listed-winning Maniaco (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), Plumatic's dam, the aforementioned Plumania, was also a 'TDN Rising Star' in her day who also took the G2 Prix Corrida as well as the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and was placed in the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille. Her half-sister Balladeuse (Fr) (Singspiel {Ire}) took the G2 Prix de Royallieu before producing the G1 Prix Vermeille heroine and G1 Prix de Diane runner-up Left Hand (GB) by Plumatic's sire Dubawi. The third dam is Featherhill (Fr) (Lyphard), who threw the G1 Prix Lupin-winning Groom Dancer and fellow sires Slew the Slewor and Tagel, while descendants of her daughter Sea Hill (Seattle Slew) include the G2 Prix de Malleret winner Legerete (Rahy), the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains-winning sire Falco and G3 Prix Eclipse scorer Iron Lips (GB) (Iron Mask).

Sea Hill's sister Pieds de Plume (Fr) produced the duo of Group 1 performers Rave Reviews (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Moth (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), while this is also the family of the Japanese champion sprinter Kinshasa No Kiseki (Aus), the G1 Australian Oaks heroine Absolutely (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and G1 Australasian Oaks winner Abbey Marie (Aus) also by Redoute's Choice. Plumania's 2-year-old colt by Frankel (GB) named Castle (Ire) is in training with Christophe Ferland, while she also has a yearling filly by Starmaniac's sire Sea the Stars named Urbania (GB).

LUCKY 13 FOR FABRE IN THE GREFFULHE

Prior to Wednesday, Andre Fabre was boasting a 28% strikerate so far in 2019 and he carried that sensational form into Saint-Cloud's bank holiday fixture with a Group 2 double completed by **Roman Candle (GB)** (Le Havre {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Greffulhe. Already holding the record in this time-honoured Derby prep with a tally of a dozen winners, the king of Chantilly was not stopping there as he supplied the latest Classic candidate via Godolphin's progressive son of France's unstoppable homegrown sire. Third behind Shaman (Ire) (Shamardal) in the nine-furlong G3 Prix la Force at ParisLongchamp Apr. 7, the 11-5 second favourite was expected to play second fiddle to that colt's stablemate **Starmaniac (GB)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) here.

Pushed up by Mickael Barzalona to shadow the leader **Pappalino (Fr)** (Makfi {GB}) soon after the start, he applied the pressure approaching the final furlong and after edging ahead a furlong out stayed on to prevail by a neck. The Wertheimers' 6-5 market-leader Starmaniac was given a lot to do, but failed to make significant inroads from rear and was ultimately a disappointing three lengths further away in third. Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard said of the winner. "He's a sweet horse with a lovely temperament who had run a nice race last time. He fights hard and has a big heart. We believe he can improve more and M. Fabre has just told me he will run straight up in the [G1] Prix du Jockey-Club [at Chantilly June 2]."

Roman Candle, who becomes the eighth individual black-type scorer for his sire so far this season, is the second foal out of the G3 Prix Imprudence runner-up and G3 Prix Miesque third Holy Dazzle (GB) (Sunday Break {Jpn}). She is the leading performer for Belle Alicia (Fr) (Smadoun {Fr}), herself a half-sister to the listed-placed Civil Courts (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}) and also kin to the dam of the G1 Prix Lupin and G1 Grand Prix de Paris hero Chichicastenango (Fr) from a mating with Smadoun. Holy Dazzle also has a 2-year-old filly by Toronado (Ire) named Moisson du Ciel (Ire).

Earning a tilt at black-type with a conditions win over 10 1/2 furlongs at Saint-Cloud Mar. 30, Ecurie Tepper, Ecurie des Charmes and Gerard Augustin-Normand's **Cartiem (Fr)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) went back to that course and distance to justify the faith of connections in Wednesday's G3 Prix Penelope. With the exciting Fabre runner Secret Walk (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) withdrawn, there were just four left to contest this trial for the June 16 G1 Prix de Diane and Christophe Soumillon was quickly dictating moderate fractions on **Phoceene (Fr)** (Olympic Glory {Ire}) with Cartiem free in the hands of Cristian Demuro in second. Left trailing by the front-runner in early straight, the bay who traded as the third-favourite at just over 2-1 managed to rally and cut down that rival in the final metres for a neck success.

Prix Penelope cont.

"Christophe did a good job slowing down the pace and my filly was a little keen in behind as a result," winning trainer Jean-Claude Rouget commented. "I didn't think she could win that, but she showed a very good turn of foot like all good horses have and she had shown that last time too. The Penelope has been put back a little bit in the calendar this year and the timing to the Diane is now perfect for light fillies like her. That's where we are going now and I don't think we've seen the best of her yet, so we have to be hopeful."

Pedigree Notes

Cartiem is the first foal out of Mintaka (Fr) (Zamindar), a member of His Highness the Aga Khan's brigade who was saddled up in the 2014 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches by Alain de Royer-Dupre only to finish well-beaten before being sold for €90,000 at that year's Arqana December Mares Sale. Her dam Minatlya (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) took the G3 Prix de Royaumont before producing the Listed Prix de Thiberville winner Mila (Fr) from a mating with Cartiem's sire Cape Cross. Minatlya is a full-sister to Manighar (Fr), whose three Group 1 victories in Australia include the Tancred S. and Australian Cup, while the fourth dam Mintly (Key To The Mint) is kin to the Selima S. heroine Minstrel's Lassie (The Minstrel). Mintaka's 2-year-old filly by Charm Spirit (Ire) was bought by Rouget for €70,000 at Arqana October and named Paroleetmusique (Ire).

FLYING HIGH

For so long a nearly-horse where it matters over middle distances, Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's **Dee Ex Bee (GB)** (Farhh {GB}) found his metier on Wednesday as he strode out a decisive winner in Ascot's two-mile G3 Longines Sagaro S. Runner-up in the 2018 G1 Epsom Derby, the bay had flattered thereafter despite some solid efforts giving the impression that a stiffer stamina test would bring up the best in him. Finally given that opportunity on this seasonal bow, the 11-8 favourite enjoyed a perfect two from the ultimatelydisappointing **Weekender (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) until taking control in early straight. Galloping on strongly for William Buick, the homebred powered to a 3 1/4-length defeat of **Raymond Tusk (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) to set up a tilt at the June 20 G1 Gold Cup.

Trainer Mark Johnston knows what it takes to win that Royal Ascot showpiece and has complete faith in Dee Ex Bee as a contender for the title. "This is exactly what you need for the Gold Cup, a proper Group 1 horse," he said. "I didn't think he looked that comfortable early in the race, but William said he had gone a mile and five and then the horse started coming underneath him. That is just what we wanted to hear."

Sagaro S. cont.

Dee Ex Bee, who also managed a third in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and fourth in the G1 St Leger, had ensured where his 4year-old campaign was going when signing off with a third in the G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern in November. Johnston took this race twice with his beloved stayer Double Trigger (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}) in 1995 and 1996 and he was comparing the two in the aftermath.

"They were both St Leger horses who did not quite make it in the Leger and were then stayers the next year," he added. "You can't put Dee Ex Bee up there with Double Trigger and [his other G1 Gold Cup hero] Royal Rebel yet, but as I said before, this is a horse who ran in the Derby and the St Leger and for many years during my early days as a trainer those sort of horses weren't being kept for the Gold Cup. Now they are again and that is exactly what you need. I have not had one for a few years and thankfully I have got one again. It is what I have been dreaming of for the last 10 years."

Their respective dam Colorado Dancer (Ire) (Shareef Dancer) did show prowess at around a mile and a half, winning the G2 Prix de Pomone and G3 Prix Minerve and finishing third in the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational and G1 Prix Vermeille. She is a daughter of the outstanding producer Fall Aspen (Pretense), the GI Matron S. heroine who was titled Broodmare of the Year in 1994. Her 10 stakes winners include the GI Preakness S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Timber Country (Woodman), the G1 Grand Prix de Paris victor and leading South African sire Fort Wood (Sadler's Wells), the G1 July Cup scorer Hamas (Danzig), the GI Gamely H. heroine Northern Aspen (Northern Dancer) and the G2 Prix d'Astarte scorer Elle Seule (Exclusive Native). The latter's progeny list is headed by the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Mehthaaf (Nureyev) and the G1 July Cup-winning sire Elnadim (Danzig). MELBOURNE CUP WINNER DUNADEN DIES

Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}–La Marlia {Fr}, by Kaldounevees {Fr}), winner of the G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase in 2011 and the following year's G1 Caulfield Cup, died on Tuesday at Overbury Stud due to complications following a paddock accident.

David Redvers, racing manager for owner Sheikh Fahad, said, "Dunaden was a horse of iron constitution with the most exceptional will to win. He gave Sheikh Fahad some fantastic days and was largely responsible for the wider Qatari family becoming involved in horse racing. He was the most intelligent Thoroughbred I have ever been involved with and we are all incredibly saddened by his death. I would like to thank Simon Sweeting and his team at Overbury Stud for the job they have done with the horse, particularly over the last few days."

Sheikh Fahad said, "Dunaden was a horse of a lifetime. Winning the Melbourne Cup is a day I will never forget. He was pure class--consistent, strong and incredibly competitive. QIPCO's initial increase in investment in racing is largely down to Dunaden's success. It is a terrible loss."

Purchased privately by Sheikh Fahad's Pearl Bloodstock at four, Dunaden would go on to win a pair of handicaps at Longchamp and Lyon Parilly that fall for trainer Richard Gibson, but it was at five for trainer Mikel Delzangles that the chestnut really sprang to life. He won the G3 Prix de Barbeville and shipped to Australia to kick off his winning sequence that saw him take the G3 Geelong Cup before besting Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) by the barest of noses in the first of the latter's three runner-up finishes in the Melbourne Cup. The following spring Dunaden picked up placings in the G2 Jockey Club S., G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly and G2 Hardwicke S. before returning to Australia to capture his third Group 1 in the Caulfield Cup, and in 2013 he strung together an excellent campaign without winning, placing in the G1 Prix Ganay, G1 Coronation Cup, G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and the Hong Kong Vase.

Dunaden cont.

Dunaden was in the midst of his fifth season at Overbury Stud at the time of his death, where he commanded a fee of \pounds 3,000. He has thus far left behind five winners, including the dual winner Ranch Hand (GB).

Simon Sweeting, Manager of Overbury Stud, said, "It was a huge honour to have stood Dunaden at Overbury Stud. I was delighted to have been involved with him and am very sad to have lost him so early."

Australia brings a formidable pair of sprinters in three-time Group 1 placegetter **Zousain (Aus)** (Zoustar {Aus}) and dual Group 3 winner **Houtzen (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}), while **Enzo's Lad (Aus)** (Testa Rossa {Aus}) would become just the second New Zealand-trained runner at the Royal meeting. This saw the return of the 2017 G1 St James's Palace S. hero **Barney Roy (GB)** (Excelebration {Ire}) after he had proven infertile and he put up a solid comeback performance only to encounter another in a long line of Sir Michael Stoute improvers and come off second-best to Zaaki. The winner was not collecting a first black-type success out of turn, having shown smart form at three before being gelded during the winter's break. Third in the G3 Hampton Court S. at Royal Ascot and Haydock's G3 Rose of Lancaster S., the bay was also a short-head runnerup to Communique (Ire) (Casamento {Ire}) attempting to give that useful rival 12 pounds in a 10-furlong handicap at Newmarket's July meeting. Always travelling easily anchored in last on this first run at the trip since last April, he loomed to Barney Roy two furlongs from home and quickly had his measure before comfortably holding him on the run to the line.

"I was not quite sure that Zaaki had come to his peak yet, as he still looked a little bit backward in his coat, so that was encouraging," Stoute said of the winner, who is owned by the Newmarket-based Saudi Arabian trainer Ahmad Alotaibi. "He ran some good races last season before he tapered off, but he has bounced back well this year. If you look at his earlier form, it is pretty smart. We'll stop and think about future plans, but even if he went to Royal Ascot, he would run before then."

Charlie Appleby said of Barney Roy, "William Buick said he potentially travelled into the race too well. The winner followed us through, but we're pleased with the run and it's great to have him back on track. That's his first run for 557 days and we're delighted. Trip-wise, William would be quite happy to keep him to a mile. Whether we run once more before Ascot [in the June 18 G1 Queen Anne S.] we will see and take it from there."

Zaaki's dam Kesara, who also produced the Singapore stakes performer Kirks Ryker, was bred in partnership by Kirsten Rausing and the Niarchos Family who raced her with Pascal Bary. A half to the dual listed scorer and group-placed Persona Grata (GB) (Sir Percy {GB}), she is a granddaughter of the groupplaced Minya (Blushing Groom {Fr}) who produced the dual G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica-winning sire Altieri (GB) (Selkirk). She has a 2-year-old filly by Medicean (GB) named Kesarina (GB) and a yearling colt by Awtaad (Ire) to come.

Still basking in a golden glow following the G1 Golden Slipper heroics of Sidestep (Exceed and Excel), the up-and-coming Queensland operation Telemon Thoroughbreds has added another exciting stallion to its roster.

Telemon teamed up with Darley Australia to move Sidestep to Queensland last year, and his first crop of two-year-olds this season has featured Godolphin's G1 Golden Slipper winner Kiamichi.

Now Telemon, Darley and Godolphin are combining again--this time with the dual-hemisphere Group 1 winner Jungle Cat (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}). He will stand for an introductory fee of \$12,000 (plus GST).

"Darley and Telemon already have a young but successful relationship with Golden Slipper-winning sire Sidestep," said Alastair Pulford, Head of Sales at Darley.

Jungle Cat's sire Iffraaj has been represented by more than 60 stakes winners worldwide, headed by Group 1 winners Ribchester (Ire), Rizeena (Ire), Chriselliam (Ire), Benvenue (Ire) and Wootton Bassett (GB) in the northern hemisphere, the latter being the sire of the multiple Group 1 winner Almanzor (Fr).

From his southern hemisphere shuttles to Haunui Farm in New Zealand, Iffraaj has produced the likes of Gingernuts (NZ), Jon Snow (NZ) and Turn Me Loose (NZ).

The maternal side of Jungle Cat's pedigree is all-American, with his dam Mike's Wildcat (USA) being a stakes-winning daughter of Forest Wildcat (USA).

Jungle Cat was trained by Charlie Appleby to win eight of his 33 starts, placing in another 13 for more than \$2.3 million in prize-money.

"He's a model of consistency at the top level and a straightforward horse to train, good minded and very sound," Appleby said.

Telemon's general manager Joe Heather said Jungle Cat had been on their radar for some time.

"We have been monitoring Jungle Cat as a potential stallion since his win in G1 Al Quoz Sprint. It's a race that we know through the exploits of Buffering.

"Jungle Cat's win there generated a rating that stood alongside the absolute elite Australian sprinters, so it should have come as no surprise that the horse he defeated, Stormy Liberal, returned to America and duly won the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

"Jungle Cat's next start was in Australia where he gave them all weight and a beating in the G1 Sir Rupert Clarke S. at Caulfield.

"To get the attention of our breeders, it was so important he came here and not only showed his quality, but the fact he is made for our conditions. To be a Group 1 winner on Australian soil is a huge positive."

In what proved to be his final start, Jungle Cat finished third behind Santa Ana Lane (Lope de Vega) and In Her Time (Time

Thief) in last November's G1 VRC Sprint Classic at Flemington.

"That run was the clincher for us," said Heather. "Horsemen know how hard it is to travel, so for him to put up a performance like that on foreign shores and coming back in trip is a true testament to his quality. He's top class and it's a privilege for us to stand him."

Jungle Cat will stand at Telemon alongside the previously mentioned Sidestep, whose Golden Slipper win has seen his fee rise from \$7,700 to \$22,000 inc GST.

OMAHA BEACH OUT OF DERBY WITH ENTRAPPED EPIGLOTTIS

Fox Hill Farms's **Omaha Beach** (War Front), the 4-1 favorite for Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve, will be forced to miss the race after it was discovered that he has an entrapped epiglottis.

"After training this morning we noticed him cough a few times," Hall of Fame trainer Richard Mandella said. "It caused us to scope him and we found an entrapped epiglottis. We can't fix it this week, so we'll have to have a procedure done in a few days and probably be out of training for three weeks. We'll have to figure out a whole new game plan."

With the scratch of Omaha Beach, also-eligible **Bodexpress** (Bodemeister), second in the GI Xpressbet Florida Derby at 71-1, draws into the Kentucky Derby starting gate and will break from post 20.

Omaha Beach's "horse to beat" status had come as the wellbred colt rode a three-race win streak towards the first Saturday in May. After breaking through with a nine-length romp in the Santa Anita slop Feb. 2, he stretched back out to defeat champion Game Winner (Candy Ride {Arg}) in a division of the GII Rebel S. and then defeated another formidable Bob Baffert trainee in the form of Improbable (City Zip) in the GI Arkansas Derby.

WEDNESDAY'S TRACKSIDE DERBY REPORT

LOUISVILLE, KY - With the rising sun making its way through partly cloudy skies, well before the stunning late scratch of likely favorite Omaha Beach (War Front) rocked the racing world, the backstretch at Churchill Downs was buzzing on a warm and breezy Wednesday morning ahead of this weekend's 145th GI Kentucky Derby.

Two of Bob Baffert's three Derby-bound **'TDN Rising Stars' Roadster** (Quality Road) and **Improbable** (City Zip) were among the first to step foot on the freshly manicured surface during the special 15-minute training window reserved for Derby/Oaks horses at 7:30 a.m. Champion and fellow **'Rising Star' Game Winner** (Candy Ride {Arg}) galloped during a later Baffert set at 9 a.m.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: KENTUCKY DERBY 145

With the First Saturday in May quickly approaching, *TDN* Senior Editor Steve Sherack caught up with the connections of leading GI Kentucky Derby contenders to get some of their 'First Impressions.' In part two of this series, we check in with Juddmonte Farm's U.S. manager Garrett O'Rourke, Taylor Made's Frank Taylor, Reynolds Bell Jr., advisor to Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stables, and bloodstock agent Josh Stevens. Streaking Juddmonte Farms homebred **Tacitus** (Tapit) topped the 'Road to the Kentucky Derby' leaderboard with 150 points off the strength of impressive come-from-behind wins in the GII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby and GII Wood Memorial S. The handsome gray is the first foal out of Juddmonte's 2014 champion older mare Close Hatches (First Defence).

Last term's GI Los Alamitos Cash Call Futurity S. winner and **'TDN Rising Star' Improbable** (City Zip) was purchased by Taylor Made for \$110,000 as a KEENOV weanling and re-sold for \$200,000 as a KEESEP yearling. The chestnut, owned in partnership by WinStar Farm, China Horse Club and Starlight Racing and trained by Hall of Famer Bob Baffert, was secondbest in the GI Arkansas Derby. **Cont. p5**

Taylor Made's Bloodstock Investments banner also pinhooked GIII Sunland Derby winner **Cutting Humor** (First Samurai), a \$135,000 KEEJAN short yearling turned \$400,000 FTSAUG yearling.

Vekoma (Candy Ride {Arg}), an authoritative winner of the GII Toyota Blue Grass S., was bred in Kentucky by Clay's Alpha Delta Stables. He was a \$135,000 KEESEP yearling graduate. The chestnut's late dam, GI Humana Distaff S. heroine Mona de Momma (Speightstown), was acquired by Bell on Clay's behalf for \$1.55 million while in foal to Malibu Moon at the 2011 FTKNOV Sale. Vekoma is owned by R. A. Hill Stable and Gatsas Stables and trained by George Weaver.

Stevens will have two rooting interests in the Derby. He purchased GII Twinspires.com Louisiana Derby upsetter **By My Standards** (Goldencents) on behalf of Allied Racing Stable for \$150,000 at the OBS April 2-Year-Old Sale after a :10 3/5 breeze. Stevens also selected the Awesome Again mare Belvedera--the dam of Imperial Racing's G2 UAE Derby hero **Plus Que Parfait** (Point of Entry)–for \$20,000 on behalf of breeder Calloway Stables while in foal to Fort Larned at the 2014 KEENOV Sale. Plus Que Parfait brought \$135,000 as a KEESEP yearling.

TACITUS:

"His size was probably the original impression. He's inbred to Unbridled and I think we were expecting either Close Hatches or Tapit's physical type, and I think we got something nearly more along the lines of Unbridled. He stayed in that mold all the way through and I think his style of running even resembles that. I just hope the result on Derby day will be the same as Unbridled as well.

We have a yearling colt by Tapit [out of Close Hatches] and I think that shows the confidence we had in the cross. We were happy enough with what Tacitus looked like to go back to the well and the mare actually was bred the other week back to Tapit for a third time. If you get a mare of her caliber, breeding the best to the best is obviously going to Tapit. **Cont. p6**

Prince Khalid has not won the Derby and would love to win one, and with that goal in sight, Tapit is a very obvious choice of mate for Close Hatches. When you do get a horse to the Derby the first time you try it, it's worth going back to the well again." --Garrett O'Rourke

IMPROBABLE:

"Improbable was always a very well-balanced colt. Mediumsized, real pretty head and just a really nice colt. We liked him from day one and when we bought him, he just continued to get a little better every day. Obviously, he's done everything we hoped he would do.

He always had a good mind--I was kind of surprised when he acted up in that gate [before the Arkansas Derby]. I don't know if it was the [first-time] blinkers, but he was always a pretty smart horse to be around.

We usually buy about 20 weanlings a year with our Bloodstock Investments group for the past six years or so now. Last year we had Flameaway in the Derby and he ran 13th. This year out of that partnership we've got Improbable and Cutting Humor. I think there were 17 yearlings in that group, so we're pretty lucky to have two of them in the Derby." –*Frank Taylor*

Real great, smart head on him and he was always an active foal and yearling at the farm. He didn't vet great coming into the sale. Mr. Clay is a commercial breeder first and races secondly. He particularly sells colts and will keep a filly to race if she doesn't bring what he thinks she needs to bring.

If you've watched Vekoma run his races, he has some pretty wild action on his left front and obviously that was a part of the conformation when you looked at him. From the time we took our first X-rays of him as an early yearling, he had an issue that the vets thought might be a bit compromising at the sale. He would certainly catch your eye when you saw him on the end of a shank, though.

Mr. Clay is thrilled [to breed a horse in the Derby field]. She was a mare that we loved--a Grade I winner from the family of Mr. Greeley and Street Sense--and a real favorite. To see Vekoma show up as the last chance in the way that he has, it's been very special." --*Reynolds Bell Jr.*

BY MY STANDARDS:

"When we were training up to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile with Mr. Money [finished fourth at 41-1], Bret Calhoun let it slip one day that By My Standards might be even better. What a prediction! At the sale [OBS April], I just remember his walk--he was very immature physically and not a 2-year-old sales type, but we were shopping for value. His breeze and his walk along with being out of such a talented mare just drew me in. [Consignor] Dave Scanlon had a lot of confidence in this colt if he was given time to mature and he's had plenty of good ones come through his barn over the years." –Josh Stevens

PLUS QUE PARFAIT:

"I remember from the moment this horse was born and everyday we saw him afterwards that he was just a ball of athleticism. Very cliche, but I conveyed this to the owners in conversation many times. If we ever race a horse out of this mare, it's him. He was different from any other foal we got out of her and never fell out of his athletic frame." –Josh Stevens

The last couple of anticipatory days prior to the GI Kentucky Derby can seem like a longer wait than the entire six-month prep season that preceded it. Here are the final *TDN* rankings, listed in "likeliest winner" order.

[Editor's Note: This list was compiled before the major announcement late Wednesday that likely favorite Omaha Beach--who Thornton had ranked number one--was scratched. Omaha Beach has been removed from the rankings and all other horses have been moved up one slot.]

LANE'S END SALES GRADUATE

'TDN Rising Star' Game Winner will march into Louisville attempting to do something no horse has done before: Win both the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the Kentucky Derby without having won a single start in between. Sure, two horses in 34 years have turned the Juvenile/Derby double. But both Street Sense (2007) and Nyquist (2016) won at least one prep, and this \$110,000 KEESEP Candy Ride (Arg) bay has been second at 1-2 odds in both his 2019 starts. Those runner-up races have to be viewed in the proper context though, because trainer Bob Baffert doesn't over-crank his Derby contenders, instead preferring to prep his top guns for the rigors of the entire Triple Crown series. So that GII Rebel S. stretch duel in which first-off-the-layoff Game Winner finished a nose behind then-upstart Omaha Beach could be excused a bit, and Game Winner did lead between stretch calls in the Santa Anita Derby before galloping out stronger and longer than winning stablemate Roadster. Baffert has often used the word "fighter" when describing Game Winner, and this professional grinder fits that assessment based on his imposing stalk mode and willingness to tough it out in late-race confrontations. A bet on the juvenile champ at 5-1 is essentially a gamble that the wily Baffert has timed his unique brand of Derby training right yet again.

War of Will cont.

A few days ago, my biggest concern about War of Will was that too many pari-mutuel wiseguys were going to climb aboard and depress what I thought would be 12-1 fair-value odds in the Derby. Then the post draw dealt this €250,000 ARQMAY War Front colt the dreaded one hole. While I don't agree that breaking from the rail torpedoes War of Will's chances in the Derby, it certainly does make the task more difficult. But at 20-1, I still see enough upside. As a 2-year-old, War of Will was touted by trainer Mark Casse as a potential Derby winner (not something Casse usually does), then this colt signaled over the course of three transitional turf-to-dirt races that he has the athleticism to create his own opportunities by breaking alertly, settling into high-speed cruise mode, and responding with a nice reserve of power that has yet to be fully unleashed. A misstep at the start of the GII Louisiana Derby tarnished War of Will's form, but three straight bullet works have this colt again building on his early-season prowess. Casse said after the post draw that War of Will could be on the lead in the Derby, and in a race that lacks standout speed, that could be a sensible strategy. War of Will has ample experience racing in crowded fields (none of his eight races have drawn fewer than 11 entrants), and the lone time he drew the rail (in the 13-horse GIII Bourbon S.), he broke fluidly and led until the final call when favored as a maiden against winners. Rain in the forecast? War of Will won his lone slop start by five lengths at Churchill.

The most tantalizing aspect about Tacitus is his aura of untapped potential. This Tapit homebred for Juddmonte out of a distance-loving distaff champion showed a battling spirit when engaging in shoulder-to-shoulder roughhousing through the first turn of the GII Wood Memorial S., and Tacitus was visually intimidating when running down a determined rival in deep stretch over nine furlongs. Prior to that, in the GII Tampa Bay Derby, this first-time-Lasix colt rated willingly, secured a nice midpack stalking spot, and responded to a rousing ride by slipping through an inside path through traffic to win at 8-1 off a four-month layoff. Tacitus is a large-framed horse who sometimes waits on horses when he makes the lead, and while he is responsive to cues form his rider he seems to need active encouragement to stay engaged. Tacitus will get a gut check in terms of class in the Derby, because he's yet to face Grade I competition and his two Derby preps in 2019 both drew fields on the softer side. Sire First Defence was another Juddmonte homebred whose lone Grade I stakes win was at seven furlongs. But First Defence was out of a Seattle Slew mare, providing a Derby connection in Tacitus's not-too-distant bloodlines.

Versatility and athleticism are on 'TDN Rising Star' Improbable's side heading into the Derby. This long-striding, \$200,000 KEESEP City Zip chestnut hasn't won since his big white blaze flashed home first in the GI Los Alamitos Futurity last December, but his pair of second-place efforts in two sophomore preps this season are both better foundation-building races than they might seem on paper. Improbable was four wide on both turns of the GII Rebel S., only beaten a neck, then he came up one length shy of Omaha Beach after a length-of-stretch hookup in which Improbable exhibited better focus (not cocking his head to the grandstand like in previous works and races).

This colt did get hot and bothered pre-race and in the gate prior to his last Oaklawn start, and a check of his temperament in the Churchill paddock and post parade on Derby day is a must before backing him. Note that Improbable's wet-track ability is also better than the second-place try in the Oaklawn slop that appears in his PP cut. On the Breeders' Cup undercard at Churchill last November, he romped by 7 1/4 lengths in the Street Sense S. Although Equibase lists that surface as "fast," the track condition had just been upgraded for that race after a two-inch deluge of rain, and it still held considerable moisture.

The horses ranked Nos. 3, 4 and 6 on this list all have something in common: As 2-year-olds, their trainers all identified them as potential Derby threats. Roadster, though, had quite a detour in his career arc. After breaking his maiden with flair, this \$525,000 KEESEP Quality Road gray ran a non-threatening third in the GI Del Mar Futurity, and it was subsequently revealed he had a breathing issue that required correction by soft palate surgery. He then parlayed an allowance comeback score into a quest-for-qualifying points win over stablemate Game Winner in the Santa Anita Derby, although it's of note that rating from well back was not the stated game plan trainer Bob Baffert had articulated before the race (Baffert had emphasized speed). So what exactly will be Roadster's running style from post 17 on Saturday? Florent Geroux has never ridden him in a race, and Roadster himself is unfamiliar with running in large fields (outside of his 10-horse maiden race, he's raced once in a five-horse and twice in a six-horse field). Roadster is light on his feet and is an athletic mover, and recent history is on his side: Santa Anita Derby winners have won three Kentucky Derbies this decade, in 2012, 2014 and 2018.

If you read between the past performance lines--which in Plus Que Parfait's case means dismissing two poor tries at Fair Grounds because trainer Brendan Walsh said he didn't care for that surface--you can make a case for him being an intriguing overlay at 30-1 in the morning line. In five races over four other surfaces, he has never finished worse than third and has never been more than 3 1/2 lengths behind the winner. The trouble is, the G2 UAE Derby (which Plus Que Parfait won by three-quarters of a length over a field that featured only minor Group 2 and 3 winning/placed horses) is historically not a productive race for Kentucky Derby aspirants. Ten winners of the UAE Derby have gone on to compete in the Kentucky Derby, and the best finish among them was sixth, along with two DNF's and a 20th-place try.

Win Win has hovered within sniffing distance of the top-tier Derby contenders for the better part of four months, and now it's time to see if he lives up to the "under the radar" potential some sharpies have ascribed to him. His 2019 campaign so far includes a seven-furlong track-record stakes win at Tampa, a five-wide third behind Tacitus in the Tampa Derby, and an against-the-grain second when closing into a potent speed bias in the GII Blue Grass S.

After riding the colt in his last two stakes, jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. vacated the Derby mount on this Hat Trick (Jpn)-sired homebred to partner with Improbable instead. So Win Win Win will be reunited with Julien Pimentel, who was aboard for all three of this colt's prior wins at Tampa and Laurel.

Code of Honor's light-bodied, nimble frame has the potential to be an asset in a crowded Derby field, especially considering that his pedigree suggests he'll be a stayer over longer ground. Still, Code of Honor is a May 23 foal who's had trouble putting together back-to-back solid efforts this winter and spring, and this first-crop Noble Mission (GB) homebred needs to outrun his reputation of being an opportunist who capitalizes only under favorable circumstances. But you also have to consider the intentions of the human connections here: Neither owner/breeder W.S. Farish nor trainer Shug McGuaghey are known as gung-ho Derby chasers, so when they keep a colt like Code of Honor pointed on the Classics path, there has to be a stronger reason than what we can see on paper. And passing up 15-1 odds on a two-time Derby winning jockey like John Velazquez is a pari-mutuel risk that you shouldn't consider lightly.

On the plus side, this Take Charge Indy homebred enters the Derby with seven solid races of two-turn experience and some visually impressive efforts in which he remained calm under pressure while in traffic. He also has the benefit of coming from the barn of a trainer who has hit the board four times in the Derby (including twice in the past three years with decent-odds horses). But you have to wonder if Long Range Toddy already ran the race of his life when he outlasted first-off-the-layoff Improbable in the slower division of the Rebel S. Another concern is that this is a colt with no true, well-defined running style, and the Derby is a tough spot to try to figure out what might work best. "I feel like I don't need to push him as hard early as I did in the Arkansas Derby," said jockey Jon Court. "I just need to sit quiet, maintain my position and try to save what I can for the stretch because ultimately that's what's most important."

Tax represents a betting conundrum in the Derby, but 20-1 is square value. This Arch gelding out of a Giant's Causeway mare is bred to excel at 10 furlongs, and visually, his Aqueduct races have been encouraging because he muscles his way to contending positions and doesn't shy away from in-race engagement. Tax will need to employ those heat-of-battle skills in trying to overcome a disadvantageous gate draw in post two, but that's not his only Derby obstacle. Tax's chief liability is that he has yet to mix it up with elite-level competition. He twice ran for maiden-claiming tags before taking a path of lesser resistance (the New York winter preps), and the only A-level horse he's ever had to deal with was Tacitus. He fought resolutely but was worn down by that rival when beaten 1 1/4 lengths in the Wood Memorial. But Tax did gallop out on even terms with Tacitus after the wire, and didn't act discouraged despite the defeat.

The overachieving Vekoma has been proving critics wrong throughout his brief 3-for-4 career and will set out to do so again in the Derby. This \$135,000 KEESEP Candy Ride (Arg) colt is a compact, light-framed speedster who doesn't necessarily need the lead to win, but should be in the hunt early, pace-wise. Even in his lone defeat (third in the Fountain of Youth S.), Vekoma never stopped battling even when passed in deep stretch, signaling his willingness to chip away when others might pack it in. But Vekoma will be regarded as a suspect bet in the Derby for three reasons: 1) His Blue Grass S. win was aided by a speed-friendly Keeneland surface--seven of eight main-track winners that day were first or second at the second call; 2) Vekoma is prone to shifting and drifting through the stretch, and

this lack of late-race focus has surfaced in every one of his races;With 2004 champion sprinter Speightstown as his dam-sire,the bottom of his pedigree doesn't exactly scream "10 furlongs."

If you have deep enough pockets, this is the type of horse you toss into your vertical exotics just for insurance based primarily out of respect for the Bill Mott barn. 'TDN Rising Star' Country House has run second, third, and fourth against graded stakes company in recent starts. But he's a May 8 Lookin At Lucky foal who has been green at times during his stretch runs, so it's tough to make the case that he's zeroing in on a major breakthrough effort from post 20.

14) HAIKAL (c, Daaher--Sablah, by Distorted Humor)

Haikal won the Winkfield S. and the GIII Gotham S. there by capitalizing on gratuitous speed setups, and he shied from both left- and right-handed stick work when roused for the drive in that latter race. In the Wood Memorial, Haikal was a best-of-the-rest third, four lengths behind the top two.

15) MAXIMUM SECURITY (c, New Year's Day--Lil Indy, by Anasheed)

I can wave away the fact that Maximum Security began his career in a \$16,000 maiden-claimer because his trainer, Jason Servis, is pretty shrewd at such moves and this New Year's Day colt subsequently ran up the score by a combined 24 3/4 lengths in a pair of optional claiming/allowance races. But convincing myself that Maximum Security's GI Florida Derby walk-a-thon win is legitimate/repeatable in the Kentucky Derby is a little more difficult. Speed-figure adherents will tell you that back-to-back triple-digit Beyers stamp this colt as the real deal. But Maximum Security has enjoyed pressure-free sailing through the stretch in all four of his starts and wins over a track (Gulfstream) that clearly plays to his running style. The Derby is bound to be a far more challenging go.

This Goldencents colt parlayed a maiden win into a 22-1 Louisiana Derby upset, but that race is widely regarded as a prep whose complexion completely came undone when favorite War of Will slipped leaving the starting gate and was a non-factor. By My Standards was in the right place at the right time to pick up the faltering speedsters, and will likely take back leaving post 3 to attempt another one-run swoop from off the pace. His sire was 17th in the 2013 Derby, but capped his career with back-to-back wins in the 2013 and 2014 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

Master Fencer rallied from last to finish second in his most recent race, the Fukuryu S. Mar. 31 at Nakayama, a course that is considered very sandy and deep.

DEL MAR'S HARPER ISSUES STATEMENT ON SAFETY REFORMS

Del Mar Thoroughbred Club Chief Executive Officer Joe Harper issued a statement Tuesday night in the form of "A Letter to Our Patrons" announcing safety and welfare reforms ahead of the track's 80th summer meet, which begins July 17.

His statement was as follows:

As most of you are aware, horse safety and welfare has been a topic in the news recently. As we draw closer to Del Mar's 80th summer season, we'd like to address our ongoing efforts with industry stakeholders on reforms to ensure a safe environment for racing.

Del Mar is committed to the industry's most progressive safety and welfare protocols and has taken great strides in recent years to implement a number of procedures intended to make racing at Del Mar safer including:

- Reducing race days to allow us more time to prepare our racing surfaces
- Investing \$12 million in state-of-the-art racing facilities and surfaces
- Enhancing pre-race veterinarian inspections
- Adding Mick Peterson, the pre-eminent track surface analyst in the country, to our team
- Reducing the horse population in the stable area to ensure the safest possible training environment
- Adjusting morning training routines to allow for surfaces to be in optimal condition

I'm happy to report those changes contributed to a 70% reduction in catastrophic injuries. We believe there are even more opportunities for continued improvement. Therefore, we will be implementing additional enhanced procedures for the upcoming summer meet including:

- Instituting International Federation of Horseracing Authorities medication standards--the strictest in the world
- Revising training protocols including additional veterinarians to oversee workouts
- Increasing out-of-competition testing
- Enhancing stable security
- Developing a stakeholder advisory committee

We believe these enhancements will make racing at Del Mar even safer for both our equine and human athletes. Opening Day is right around the corner, and our racing team is excited to welcome you back this summer.

THE STRONACH GROUP ADDS ON-SITE MILE-PET SCAN

The Stronach Group has invested \$500,000 to support the purchase of the Longmile Positron Emission Tomography (MILE-PET) Scan machine that provides imaging of the fetlock joint while a Thoroughbred is standing, the organization reported in a release Wednesday.

"The Stronach Group's funding of this ground-breaking technology represents an important investment that will aid in the detection of equine injuries on a microscopic level to flag pre-existing conditions that can contribute to breakdowns," said Dr. Dionne Benson, recently appointed Chief Veterinary Officer for The Stronach Group. "This technology will help to identify the injuries that tend to be the most dangerous and are not detectable using the current technology."

The Stronach Group has partnered with the Dolly Green Research Foundation (DRGF) to secure the purchase of the MILE-PET Scan machine. DGRF, founded in 1984 by Green, a longtime horse owner with a special interest in equine research, is affiliated with the Southern California Equine Foundation.

The newly donated MILE-PET system will first be sent to the Center of Equine Health at the University of California--Davis' School of Veterinary Medicine for validation, research and continued analysis. After completion of the validation period at UC Davis, the MILE-PET will be available for use at Santa Anita this fall.

"The Stronach Group is committed to providing horse owners and trainers with access to state-of-the-art technology that will make a significant difference to the health and safety of our horses and riders," said Belinda Stronach, Chairman and President of TSC. "Our goal is to make every resource available to aid horsemen in determining the fitness of their horses for racing and training. We're excited to be partnering with the Dolly Green Research Foundation and UC Davis to bring the MILE-PET to the equine hospital, located right here at Santa Anita."

Dr. Rick Arthur, Equine Medical Director for the California Horse Racing Board, added, "You cannot overstate how significant an advancement this is in equine diagnostic imaging and it is a natural fit here in California. PET is an advanced nuclear imaging technique and Santa Anita is already the home of the Dolly Green Nuclear Scintigraphy facility, which was the first of its kind when it was installed. We thank everyone involved for making this investment to further the safety of our equine athletes."

THE BIG BEAST FILLY A FRIENDLY AFFAIR

Christina Jelm was already fielding phone calls from prospective buyers just minutes after **Ms Headley** (The Big Beast) crossed the wire first in her debut at Churchill Downs Wednesday, with one particularly memorable text exclaiming, "The Beast has been Unleashed!"

Jelm, more often buying horses for clients than herself, and Washington-based trainer Mike Puhich teamed up to buy the filly from the first crop of 2014 GI King's Bishop S. winner The Big Beast for \$20,000 at the OBS March sale.

"There was a group of us shopping around and I had a short list put together that I had given to some of my clients, including Mike and [trainer] Tom VanBerg," Jelm said. "They loved her. She went up to the ring and we couldn't believe we got her. I expected her to cost a lot more money, but I think a lot of horses flew under the radar at that sale."

The speedy filly was expected to transition swiftly from sales horse to racehorse, according to Jelm.

"We thought she was the type of filly that would be able to move right on," Jelm said. "Our original plan was to go to Keeneland and break her maiden there. It took us just one extra work longer and so we ended up here at Churchill."

The filly is a celebration of old friends and colleagues. She was named after trainer Karen Headley and entrusted to trainer Wesley Ward.

"Mike Puhich and Wesley and Karen and Tom and that whole crew, we've all grown up together and have been in the business a long time," Jelm said. "And they are wonderful horsemen," Jelm continued. "So we just thought it would be special to name a horse after Karen and we thought Wesley would be the perfect trainer to get her out early. And that's what we expected this filly to do based on what she showed us at the sale."

Watching a filly she owns race was a different experience for Jelm.

"I was a nervous wreck," Jelm admitted. "I've owned horses, but it was back in the day. But for the price she was purchased for, I didn't think I could go wrong just going for the ride myself."

As for expectations for Ms Headley's debut, Jelm said, "I expected her to put in a good run. I know she is fast, her pedigree is all speed. Hopefully she'll show us she can stretch out as we move on. She is very level-headed and she is very professional."

Ms Headley debuted in the silks of the late Hall of Fame trainer Jack VanBerg, a mentor to Jelm, but it may be the only start she makes in those colors.

"Money talks and cash screams," Jelm said with a laugh. "Wesley has done a wonderful job with her and we are so thankful and we would love to have her stay with Wesley no matter what happens. But right now, we are just enjoying the day with a whole collection of old friends and great horsemen. It was fun and amazing."


