#### NO GRADE I STATUS FOR NEW BC RACES

The American Graded Stakes Committee has rejected a request by Breeders' Cup for Grade I status for three

new \$1-million Thoroughbred Championships events, but Breeders' Cup officials believe the decision won't impact the quality of the fields for the races. The graded stakes committee, during an Apr. 17 meeting in Lexington, considered the Breeders' Cup request based on statistics, the existing racing environment, and consistency in the decision-making process, said Andy Schweigardt, sec-

retary of the committee and director of industry relations and development for the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, which oversees the graded stakes committee. The committee didn't grant the request, he said. "The Breeders' Cup requested immediate Grade I status for all three races," Schweigardt said. "The committee answered that specific request." Breeders' Cup only requested Grade I status for all three races, so the committee didn't consider Grade II or Grade III status. The three races, to be run for the first time Oct. 26 at Monmouth Park in New Jersey, are the Filly & Mare Sprint, the Dirt Mile, and the Juvenile Turf. For the complete story, click here.

Scarlet Runner was chasing Sander Camillo's shadow when third in Royal Ascot's G3 Albany S. in June, before returning to that track to win the G3 Princess Margaret S. the following month. There may have been excuses for her subsequent flops when left trailing in York's G2 Lowther S. in August and the Cheveley Park, as there was plenty of cut underfoot on both occasions. Relishing the conditions brought about by the sun-baked British spring, she was forced to make her own running on the far-side rail as Frankie Dettori and Sander Camillo influenced most of her rivals into the center of the track. While that foe had the measure of her group by the eighth pole, Scarlet Runner was proving too strong overall and was always holding her in the final 100 yards. "I wanted to get a bit of cover, but it didn't turn out as I was left on my own," McEvoy added. "I think the others wanted to follow Frankie and I wanted to get her to settle, as it was her first time over seven. She relaxed well and didn't stop at the finish, so the mile [of the Guineas] is worth a try." Both fillies will return for the May 6 Classic.

U.S. sires accounted for six of the top nine lots, with a Johannesburg colt, who made €130,000 at Goffs in October, bringing 310,000gns when reoffered from Con Marnane's Co Tipperary-based Bansha House Stables. Agent Jamie McCalmont, standing with trainer Jeremy Noseda, eventually won a long battle for the colt with Kuwaiti owner Saleh Al Homaizi the underbidder. "He is for a new American client of Jeremy's who we met when we were at the sale in Florida in February," said McCalmont. "He's a lovely horse by a great stallion, who looks the real deal as both a dirt and turf sire." McCalmont signed for another to show a handsome profit, a Hawk Wing colt bought for 40,000gns at Tattersalls in October by locally based consignor Emma O'Gorman. He resold for 190,000gns yesterday. A 230,000gns Dynaformer colt out of Perfect Drift's half-sister Gypsy (Marfa), who was bought for \$160,000 at Keeneland September, is set to remain in Newmarket after selling to agent Amanda Skiffington, buying for trainer James Fanshawe. After a shaky start, the Craven Breeze-Up Sale last night produced a 5,138,000gns turnover, a 74,464gns average, down one percent, and 52,000gns median, down five percent. The clearance rate of 70 percent dropped sharply from the 2006 figure of 84 percent. The sale concludes tonight with a session starting at 5:45 p.m.

The four-yearold, whose previous unbeaten record included his smashing victory in the GI Cigar Mile H. last November, was diagnosed with "an obstructive granulomatous mass within his throat" and swelling as a result of an infection, a posting on the Godolphin website read following his World Cup letdown. Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford told Racing Post that progress is being made, but deemed it "slow" and added that Discreet Cat would not make the Discreet Cat trans-Atlantic journey until next Sherackatthetrack month. "We are not talking a



lengthy delay, just a few weeks...depending on how his condition improves," Crisford told the Post. "Any plans we had for him early on in the campaign have been shelved and that happened straight after the World Cup when we discovered this abscess. It would be unrealistic to assume he will be racing before the second half of the year."

#### ASHKAL WAY INJURED Ashkal Way (Ire)

(Ashkalani {Ire}), one of the country's leading milers in 2006, has suffered an injury to his right front tendon and will be out of training indefinitely. Also owned by Godolphin, the chestnut posted six victories from his eight starts last season, capped by a one-length success in the GI Citation H. at Hollywood Park. Given the winter off, he made a victorious five-year-old debut, taking the Apr. 1 Lure S. at Gulfstream Park. "It is a great shame as we were looking forward to seeing him have another good season in America," Simon Crisford commented. "We will give him all the time he needs to make a full recovery before he resumes training." To date, the gelding has nine wins and five minor placings from 17 starts and earnings of \$798,580.





A dig back into Smart Strike's family reveals another good potential cross with another branch of the Northern Dancer line. Smart Strike's dam is a half-sister to two stakes winners by Northern Dancer son Vice Regent, one of which was Canadian champion two-year-old Regal Classic, and also half-sister to Grade I winner Always A Classic, who was by Vice Regent's most important son, Deputy Minister.

It is a horse bred on the cross of Smart Strike with a Deputy Minister mare which is particularly in the news this week in the shape of the sensational Curlin. A \$57,000 Keeneland September yearling, Curlin debuted in a seven-furlong maiden race at Gulfstream Park, and led throughout to score by nearly 13 lengths. Purchased after that race for a reported \$3,500,000 by a partnership headed by Stonestreet Stables and Padua Stables, he was transferred from the barn of Helen Pitts to Steve Asmussen. Curlin reappeared in the GIII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park, and this time ran fourth or fifth in the early stages, before sweeping past his rivals for a 5 1/4-length score.

In last Saturday's GII Arkansas Derby, Curlin stalked the pace, then burst clear for an impressive 10 1/2length tally, a record margin of victory for the race. As has been widely reported elsewhere, Curlin will now head for the GI Kentucky Derby, where one of his stiffest opponents is history.

He will bid to be the first horse to win the Classic without a juvenile start since Apollo in 1882 and the first to score with just three lifetime previous starts since Regret in 1915.

While Curlin has to overcome history to win the Derby, another potential stumbling block, the distance, should prove to be no problem. He completed his last furlong in the Arkansas Derby in :11.91 seconds, and his pedigree doesn't seem to pose too many problems on the score of stamina. Smart Strike was best at around a mile, but several of his best offspring have won good races at 10 furlongs or more, among them Grade I scorers English Channel, Shadow Cast and Fleetstreet Dancer, and graded winners Tenpins, Shoal Water and Tungsten Strike. Curlin's broodmare sire Deputy Minister was a graded winner at nine furlongs, and second in a photo-finish for the 10-furlong GI Meadowlands Cup. Curlin's granddam Barbarika--who took the GII Johnnie Walker Black Classic H. and GIII Turfway Park Breeders' Cup H. both at 8 1/2 furlongs-is a daughter of Bates Motel, a horse whose most prestigious victory came in the 10-furlong GI Santa Anita H.

Barbarika was the only stakes winner in the first two dams of this pedigree prior to the appearance of Curlin, but her dam, Conniver H. winner War Exchange, was a successful producer and foundation mare. War Exchange's best runner was the Carnivalay filly Lucky Lady Lauren, winner of the GIII Arlington Matron H. Another daughter, the stakes-placed Count On Cathy, was a more important producer, being the dam of two stakes winners, and granddam of champion two-year-old filly Countess Diana and the ill-fated GI Beldame S. and GI Gazelle H. heroine Exogenous.

We mentioned in our introduction that a perusal of Smart Strike's family would have encouraged crossing him with mares by Deputy Minister and his sire Vice Regent. A look at the results he has achieved with Deputy Minister mares paints a particularly striking picture. Smart Strike is the sire of 17 foals out of 15 different Deputy Minister mares, 13 of which have started.

Of those 13, four are stakes winners, with Curlin being joined by millionaire Tenpins; 2007 GIII Providencia S. victress Super Freaky; and listed winner and graded stakes-placed Deputy Strike. This comes out to 24 percent stakes winners, compared with 9 percent stakes winners to foals sired by Smart Strike overall; the four stakes winners to emerge from the 51 foals out of this group of mares when bred to all other stallions. In closing, we can also note that Smart Strike has sired Canadian champion Eye of the Sphynx out of a Vice Regent mare, and two stakes winners, including graded scorer Smart n Classy, out of mares by Vice Regent's son Regal Classic.

## DIXON VOTERS TURN DOWN PROPOSED RACETRACK

Voters in the farm town of Dixon, Calif., turned down Magna Entertainment Corporation's proposed \$250 million horse racing complex by less than 300 votes Apr. 17. The final tally showed the opposition winning with about 53 percent of the 4,913 total ballots cast. There was a 66 percent voter turnout from the town, which has been embroiled in a controversy over the project for the past two years. Voters overturned four separate actions that were approved by the Dixon City Council allowing the racetrack and accompanying development to go forward. A grassroots citizens campaign qualified the opposition measures for the ballot and prevailed with an anti-gambling message. Although the final vote was close, the "no" side led throughout the evening. Busloads of volunteers came from Golden Gate Fields and Bay Meadows to help get out the vote on election day. California Horse Racing Board commissioner John Harris brought his own contingent of horse owners and breeders. "In many ways, this is a referendum on our industry," Harris said while going door-to-door. "If this were to be defeated, it would be a terrible blow." Canada-based MEC bought the property in 2001 and proposed building a 260-acre horse racing track, entertainment complex and retail project in the farming town along Interstate 80 near Sacramento. Supporters said the project would boost the town's economy.


