Breeders' Cup Board of Directors, according to a release from the Breeders' Cup. "Since I began serving on the Breeders' Cup Board in 2006, we have undergone a series of changes and innovations, and I am proud to have played a role in helping chart a new course for the organization," Hughes said. Founder and chairman of Public Storage, Hughes is owner of Spendthrift Farm. "We will miss Wayne's pas-

grateful for his service to the Breeders' Cup," said Breeders' Cup Chairman William S. Farish, Jr. Hughes's term expires in June. The Breeders' Cup Board will choose someone from the Breeders' Cup Members and Trustees to complete the term on Jan. 20.

#### **RECORD PRIZE MONEY FOR ROYAL ASCOT**

Ascot Racecourse yesterday announced that prize money for the 2009 Royal Meeting, which is slated to run June 16 through June 20, has been increased to £4,450,000. Since the Global Sprint Challenge was launched in 2005, prize money for the G1 King's Stand S. and G1 Golden Jubilee S. has increased every year to reflect their growing international significance and in 2009, the Golden Jubilee S. is up a further £75,000 to £450,000 and the King's Stand S. has been increased by £50,000 to £300,000. The G1 Prince of Wales's S. also increases by £75,000 to £450,000 in 2009, to maintain its status as Royal Ascot's joint highest value race. In addition to the King's Stand S., £50,000 has been added to the G1 Queen Anne S., the G1 St James's Palace S., the G1 Gold Cup and the G1 Coronation S., which will all be run for £300,000 in 2009. "These increases in prize money at Royal Ascot come hot on the heels of our announcement that the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. will be run for a record £1-million this year, £150,000 up on 2008," commented Ascot's Chief Executive Charles Barnett. "The Tuesday of Royal Ascot will open once again with a ceremony to introduce the leading jockeys to the crowd prior to the three Group 1 races. This year, there will be over £1-million on offer on the opening day for the first time. We're fully aware, of course, of the current economic climate, but [this] announcement enables us to start 2009 on a positive note."

2008 HANDLE FALLS BELOW \$14 MILLION

Wagering on U.S. races fell 7.16 percent last year as compared to 2007 figures, according to statistics released yesterday by Equibase. Handle on U.S. races, including worldwide commingled wagering on U.S. races and separate pool wagering in Canada on U.S. races totaled \$13,670,196,938 in 2008, compared to \$14,723,993,055 in 2007. U.S. purses fell 1.33 percent to \$1,160,313,672. There were a total of 6,095 race days in 2008, down from 6,168 the previous year. Figures fell precipitiously during December, with wagering on U.S. races falling 20.30 percent to \$820,358,357. U.S. purses fell 13.43 percent to \$1,160,313,672. Purses decreased 13.43 percent to \$60,123,263 with 330 race dates, down from 365 in 2007. "The fourth quarter was an extremely challenging one due in large part to the worldwide economic slowdown and other internal factors," National Thoroughbred Racing Association President and CEO Alex Waldrop said in a statement. "Results in December were strongly compromised by a major drop in racing days brought about at least in part by a calendar that was unusually short on weekend dates. While the overall year-end figures compare favorably in some ways with those of many other sports and industries, it was nevertheless a very difficult 2008 for virtually every segment of the racing industry. There were bright spots, including many spectacular performances on the racetrack and progress on the equine safety and integrity front."



## Another Big Horse in the Making for the 'Big Horse' Sire

TIZFIZ posted an impressive front running victory in the Grade 2 San Gorgonio Handicap at Santa Anita on January 4th becoming Tiznow's Newest Graded Stakes Winner. The previous day, BULLSBAY ran second in the Grade 3 Hal's Hope Handicap at Gulfstream.

In 2008, Champion Sire and Horse of the Year TIZNOW was the sire of 13 Stakes winners, 4 of which were Grade 1 winners, and 21 Stakes Performers with progeny earnings of \$8,729,321.


ADENA SPRINGS TAKES SIXTH LEADING

**BREEDER TITLE** Adena Springs topped the list of leading individual breeders in North America in 2008 year for the sixth consecutive year. According to figures released vesterday by The Jockey Club Information Systems, Inc., Adena Springs bred the winners of 603 races from 3,671 starts. Stonerside Stable, which bred the winners of 98 races from 518 starts for earnings of \$7,433,027 to is second on the list. Adena Springs also heads the breeders' list which includes partnership, with Stonerside second on that list as well. Completing the list of top 10 individual breeders (with earnings): Eugene Melnyk (\$6,410,230); Brereton C Jones (\$6,339,254); WinStar Farm LLC (\$5,460,005); Juddmonte Farms Inc. (\$4,924,494); Sherman Family Thoroughbreds LLC (\$4,839,702); Sez Who Thoroughbreds (\$4,780,068); Padua Stables (\$4,773,351); and Everst Stables Inc. (\$3,966,631). Rounding out the list of top 10 breeders which includes partnerships are: W. S. Farish, Brereton jones, Eugene Melnyk, WinStar Farm, Sherman Family Thoroughbreds, Sez Who Thoroughbreds, Juddmonte Farms and Padua Stables.

In my opinion, "stakes rules" are only smoke and mirrors--if a race does not earn Black Type, Grade I, Grade II, etc. in all catalogs and reports than it should not be used as such.

Keeneland and Fasig Tipton set the benchmark on catalog pages of Thoroughbred offerings and BRIS, along with The Jockey Club, should use the same guidelines as the major sales companies. In fact, all sales companies should. I have purchased horses at smaller companies that were listed as Black Type horses that turned out to be misrepresented--they were stakes horses in name only, not quality.

This industry should have a concrete rule on what is quality and what is not. That is information that should be well-represented to all buyers. Sincerely, Ed Price, Mohns Hill Farm LLC




#### LECOMTE LEGACY LIVES ON

Question. Who was the only horse to defeat the legendary Lexington at the races? Well, for the answer, one need only look to the Saturday feature at Fair Grounds. Lecomte, also a son of Boston, defeated Lexington in the Jockey Club Purse in a match race at Metarie Race Course in New Orleans, and set a record for four miles in winning 11 times in his career. A son of Reel, whose blood can be found in contemporary horses such as Chief's Crown, Winning Colors and Tim Tam, Lecomte was a half-brother to Prioress, Ashland and War Dance. Several of the horses in this weekend's first two-turn graded prep on the road to the Kentucky Derby will be trying to create some history of their own. Trainer Steve Asmussen is in search of a third win and second in a row in the Lecomte, following on the success of Z Fortune (Siphon {Brz}) last year. He also saddled Easyfromthegitgo (Dehere) to take the 2002 renewal, and that colt's co-owner, Bob Zollars, will be represented in this year's race by recent allowance winner Uno Mas (Macho Uno). Asmussen's other entry, **Professor Z** (Grand Slam), is campaigned by Zayat Stables, which also owns Z Fortune. Hard Spun (Danzig) burst onto the scene in the 2006 Lecomte, posting a front-running 6 1/2-length victory for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farms and trainer Larry Jones. The conditioner sends out Friesan Fire (A.P. Indy), runner-up to Uno Mas in their allowance meeting, for Porter and Vinery Stable LLC.

Au Moon (Malibu Moon), a very impressive maiden winner at Churchill Downs in November, pushes on into stakes company for trainer David Carroll, who sent out Fire Slam (Grand Slam) to take the 2004 Lecomte for owner Stan Fulton. Bernie Flint is the other trainer in Saturday's field to have won the Lecomte, having scored a 59-1 upset in 2000 with Noble Ruler (Academy Award). Sovereign Award winner Cash Deposit (Deposit Ticket) struck south of the border for Canada, taking the 1997 race as part of an odds-on entry. That country looks to be wellrepresented this weekend, with Display S. hero Patena (Seeking the Gold) and Dynamic Force (Dance Master) hailing from the strong barns of Josie Carroll and Mark Casse, respectively.

# FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim

#### LEST WE FORGET

In troubled times, conventional wisdom says that breeders turn to proven sires, and the unproven sires, so long the fashion of the moment, begin to fall out of favor. As the market shrinks, the more proven commodity is seen as the safer option. The stud fees for unproven have to drop significantly below those for proven sires of similar standard in order to compensate for the uncertainty as to whether the unproven sire will ever sire anything whose name anybody remembers.

Since conventional wisdom always implies thinking somewhat short of, say, 'cutting edge,' you can be sure this means there will be value to be found among unproven stallions. Just as most of the foals by proven sires are moderate, we may be equally sure that there will be some exceptional racehorses to come by yetunproven stallions; we just don't have a very good idea yet which ones they are.

In a couple of weeks, when we have our new APEX stallion ratings which will cover all North American, major European, and Japanese sires which had 10 or more three-year-old foals of 2008, this column will be focusing on those among the more than 1,000 qualifying sires which merit special comment. By definition, these are sires with runners. So this week, we are listing details of 242 unproven sires, which had, or will have, their first foals born between 2007 and 2010, and which stand for 4,500 + dollars, pounds, or euros. (Table pages 10-14) It's not so much a matter of coming up with a list of recommendations, because your guess is as good as mine. The purpose here is to provide breeders with a list of sires so you can remind yourselves about those horses on which you might want to consider rolling the dice.

We should emphasize that this list is compiled with the best intentions, and we hope, but don't guarantee, that it is 98 percent accurate. Inevitably there will be mistakes and omissions, which we will correct as they are brought to our attention. Our list is compiled from all available sources by ace assistant Brianne and myself, is produced on a best-effort basis, and is in no way official. Prices quoted are 'retail,' as far as we can determine.

#### The Bigger Guns...

Naturally the most expensive sires are those with the best credentials, so we've compiled a separate list of 42 stallions (*p15*) which I would call 'top of the crops.' This list is displayed in two separate tables. The first of these lists them by first-crop commercial sales average within each 'sire crop.' F2007, horses which will have their first two-year-olds in 2009, comes first; then F2008 (first yearlings), etc. We have also included the relevant first-crop commercial information from *Insta-Tistics*.

Detecting 'value' within these listings is very much a matter of opinion. Among F2007 sires, the three Kentucky standouts still at stud (Saint Liam would have been a fourth, but died after siring this crop) are **Ghostzapper, Rock Hard Ten,** and **Afleet Alex.** Relatively speaking, you'd have to say the latter two, with much lower stud fees, sold better than Ghostzapper. However, the history books are littered with examples of top sires whose first crops didn't sell all that well, and it would take a prime fool to forget that Ghostzapper was the best racehorse seen in America in the last 10 years.

All three of those are in 'neutral' camps (Adena Springs, Lane's End, and Gainesway, respectively), but in Europe four of the five top prospects are in one of the two camps of the warring (excuse me, I mean of course 'competing') titans, Coolmore and the Maktoums. Coolmore has **Oratorio** and **Footstepsinthesand**, by 'home' stallions Danehill and Giant's Causeway, respectively. The Maktoum family has **Shamardal**, a European champion two-year-old, also from Giant's Causeway's first crop, and **Dubawi**, surely the best hope of the great Dubai Millennium surviving as a sire line, from his only crop. **Cont. p5** 



The exception is Azamour, a horse that I think deserves support by any breeder who claims to have the betterment of the breed at heart through the advocacy of certain 'virtues.' In Azamour's case, he demonstrated unusual versatility, in that he won in top-class Group 1 company at one mile, 10 furlongs, and a mile and a half. He won the G1 St. James's Palace S. over one mile at Royal Ascot as a three-year-old; scored 10-furlong Group 1 wins in the Irish Champion S. at three and the Prince of Wales's S., back at Royal Ascot, at four; and went on to win the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., the summer's chief Group 1 showpiece at 12 furlongs, a month later. The trouble with Azamour, as a commercial proposition, is that he's by Night Shift, a perfectly useful sire, but hardly known as a top-class sire of sires. Moreover, Azamour didn't look or act in the least like a typical Night Shift. Bred and raced by the Aga Khan, and standing at his Gilltown Stud in Ireland, you'd hope his operation might have a few by him in training, too.

When you get a situation like that you have to have another look at the pedigree, and what hit me in the face is that Azamour is out of a Lear Fan mare--Roberto. I had occasion to watch Azamour run a number of times, and to me what he definitely did look and act like was typical of the high-class Roberto horses. Think of runners by Silver Hawk, Kris S., Dynaformer, and Lear Fan himself. As a physical specimen and as a racehorse, Azamour was absolutely typical of the Roberto line. I don't know how good a bet it is that Azamour will throw this as a sire, but if he does, his 2009 stud fee of  $\in$ 15,000 (40 percent down from his original fee of  $\in$ 25,000) would look very interesting--at least to an owner-breeder.

The top of the crop of sires whose first foals arrived in 2008 would have looked different had 2006 GI Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro survived. As it is, GI Preakness, Travers, and Jockey Club Gold Cup winner Bernardini is this crop's version of Ghostzapper-what used to be called a 'July Sale' sire, but what we now call a (September) 'Book 1' sire. The other top Kentucky stallions of this sire crop have in common that they are all by Storm Cat or one of his sons: Henny Hughes, by Johannesburg's sire, Hennessy. The chestnut won a key 'sire race,' the GI King's Bishop, for three-year-olds at seven furlongs at Saratoga, but then topped that by humbling 'olders' in the six-furlong GI Vosburgh H. Bluegrass Cat, by Storm Cat himself, ran second in the GI Kentucky Derby (to Barbaro), Belmont (to Jazil), and Travers (to Bernardini), and won the GI Haskell. He's a stunning individual, and like Henny Hughes, his first foals averaged around \$150,000 in November. At around the \$100,000 mark for his first weanlings was First Samurai, a triple Grade I winner at two and three from Giant's Causeway's second crop. Bernardini (bred by Darley) and Henny Hughes stand at Darley's Kentucky stallion station, the old Jonabell; Bluegrass Cat is at WinStar, First Samurai is at Claiborne.

# Weekly Sales Ticker by Bill Oppenheim

"The regional yearling and mixed sales have been taking a pounding, but probably half the catalogue at OBS yesterday were the mares which would have sold in the Adena Springs sale they used to have at Fasig Ky. In November. OBS' first session last year averaged \$23,346; Adena Springs' sale in November 2007 averaged \$17,089. Keeneland January will look a whole lot different if Azeri sells than it will look if she doesn't. Book 1 totaled \$48-million last year. The last three years the entire sale has grossed \$72m., \$72m., and \$70-million."

In Europe, the two stallions at the top of the crop are both at Coolmore, namely **Holy Roman Emperor**, pressed into stud service as a three-year-old when illfated superstar George Washington (also by Danehill) proved infertile; and **Hurricane Run**, the 2005 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner from Montjeu's first crop. There may only be six names on the 'top of the crop' F2008 list, but they all have star quality.

Sires which retired in 2008, and will have their first foals this year, will have those foals racing as two- and three-year-olds in 2011-12. That's when we'll see whether Darley's most recent strategy to achieve superiority over Coolmore on the racetrack will be working. Acquiring all of them during or at the end of their racing careers, the Maktoum family retired no fewer than eight top prospects to their studs in Kentucky, England, and Ireland in 2008. Five of them are in Kentucky: Street Sense, the first horse to win the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Kentucky Derby, is especially important as he's the first horse they're standing by their own first superstar sire Street Cry. They also have the awesomely popular Hard Spun (Danzig), whose first mares in-foal actually out-averaged barnmate Street Sense; the rocket Discreet Cat; GI Haskell winner (defeating Hard Spun and Curlin) Any Given Saturday, by Distorted Humor; and Sheikh Hamdan's 2006 Horse of the Year, Invasor, conqueror of Bernardini. In Europe they retired 2007 G1 Epsom Derby winner Authorized (by Coolmore sire Montjeu); the unbeaten 2006 European champion two-year-old Teofilo (by Coolmore sire Galileo); and triple 2007 Group 1 winner Manduro, by the German sire sensation Monsun. It's estimated Sheikh Mohammed spent \$200-million on stallion prospects in 2007, and what he bought himself is a formidable lineup.

Though every one of these prospects boasts strong credentials, the one horse I could see having that elusive charismatic star quality which makes them the darlings of the commercial markets is Hard Spun. He's by Danzig. He's out of a stakes-winning mare by Alydar's son, Turkoman--a great cross. He comes from a long-established Darby Dan family which produced Classic winners and reasonable sires Little Current and Chateaugay. He was second in the GI Kentucky Derby, third in the GI Preakness, and fourth in the GI Belmont and then came back to win the seven-furlong GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga, showing he had the raw speed. When you combine that kind of speed with that kind of class, the market loves that combination. The King's Bishop alone has quite a reputation as a 'sires' race. In 1996, Honour and Glory beat Elusive Quality and Distorted Humor in it, and it was also won by Tale of the Cat, Forestry and More Than Ready. Oh, and Hard Spun was also second to Curlin in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and won two nine-furlong Grade II's the only times he ran on synthetic tracks. Tall, scopey, fast, versatile, well-bred; what can I say, he's got star quality. (Other King's Bishop winners on this list of 242: Pomeroy, Henny Hughes).



# In The Blood

For the third consecutive year, in 2008 Coolmore retired two top-of-the-crop prospects, both to Ireland: Dylan Thomas, one of the soundest, therefore 'virtuous,' top-class horses of recent times; and Excellent Art, a top three-year-old miler in 2007 and an unusual acquisition these days for them, in that they bought him in training, and he is by a non-Coolmore sire, Pivotal. But probably they quite like having a son of Pivotal to stand. Dylan Thomas, of course, is by the great Danehill. Coolmore is standing a top-of-the-crop son of Danehill in every one of these four sire crops: Oratorio, Holy Roman Emperor, Dylan Thomas and Duke of Marmalade. With Danehill Dancer and Rock of Gibraltar already carrying the flag for him, it would be no surprise if one of the four, at least, becomes to Danehill what Montjeu and Galileo became to Sadler's Wells--a world-class sire son.

There's an awful lot of bleating among breeders and breeding journalists about how the old-fashioned virtues of soundness, honesty, and durability need to be reinforced in contemporary pedigrees. Fine: breed to Dylan Thomas. From the time he appeared on the scene, when finishing third to Sir Percy at 25-1 in the 2006 G1 Epsom Derby, Dylan Thomas proved himself over and over again to be a tip-top performer who possessed all these virtues, in spades, that we hear so much about. He was equally effective at 10 or 12 furlongs, as is demonstrated by his having gone on to win both the G1 Irish Derby (12 furlongs) and the G1 Irish Champion S. (10 furlongs) as a three-year-old. Rated 129 by Timeform at three, he was even better at four. In his first eight starts of the year, after a tune-up win in the Alleged S. (L), he finished first (four times) or second (three times) in seven consecutive Group 1 races, winning the Prix Ganay, the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., the Irish Champion S. (for a second time), and capping it off with a win in the 2007 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. His three seconds in that stretch were all at or around 10 furlongs, but so were two of his Group 1 wins. *Timeform* rated him 132 in *Racehorses of* 2007. I defy any pundit to explain to me how this is not exactly the sort of horse they are all telling us breeders should use in order to restore the great virtues to the breed. I agree with them, too, and here's the horse. And remember, Galileo and Montjeu both once stood for  $\in$  35,000, too.

Though Kentucky studmasters other than Darley were knocked out of the picture for most of the top prospects in this sire crop, there were four other stallions retired to Kentucky in 2008 which stood last year for \$25,000-\$40,000, and will stand this year for \$25,000-\$30,000: Corinthian (Gainesway); After Market (Lane's End); English Channel (Hurricane Hall); and Lawyer Ron (Stonewall). Of those, 2007 GI Met Mile and inaugural Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Corinthian, by the potentially emerging sire of sires Pulpit (sire of Sky Mesa and Tapit), was the one who achieved a sixfigure covering sire average in November.

Not that covering-sire average is much of an indicator, but Corinthian did finish third among North American sires, with an average of \$174,928, ahead of both Invasor and Any Given Saturday. The only European top-of-the-crop sire prospect not captured by Coolmore or Darley was Lawman, the 2007 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (10 1/2-furlong 'new' French Derby) winner, by the very good young sire Invincible Spirit. Lawman went to Ballylinch, in Ireland.

I counted 13 top-of-the-crop prospects retiring this year. Four of them are \$20,000 horses standing in Kentucky, of which three are 'neutral:' First Defence (Juddmonte), and the Hill 'n' Dale pair of Heatseeker and dual GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Midnight Lute-he's sure to be extra-popular. Coolmore retired two topof-the-crop prospects to Ashford in Kentucky: the \$20,000 stallion Majestic Warrior, by A.P. Indy and winner of the 2007 GI Hopeful; and Henrythenavigator, a crack miler by Mr. Prospector's important 'neutral' son Kingmambo. Winner of the six-furlong G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot as a two-year-old, 'Henry' came back at three to defeat all comers, including New Approach and Raven's Pass, twice each, in sweeping the three most important Group 1 mile races for three-year-olds in Europe in the spring and early summer: the English and Irish Two Thousand Guineas, and the St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. It says a lot for both New Approach and Raven's Pass, who both finished up running in Princess Haya's colors, that they both came back to accomplish as much as they did. New Approach came back to triumph in the G1 Epsom Derby, then came back again, after missing the Irish Derby and finishing third to Duke of Marmalade in the G1 Juddmonte International, to finish his career with a 10-furlong Group 1 double in winning the Irish Champion S. and the Champion S. at Newmarket. Raven's Pass, of course, came back to beat Henrythenavigator twice, in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S, at Ascot over a mile, then when they ran a famous one-two in the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. There are some credentials among those three.

For his part, Duke of Marmalade, a homebred Coolmore product, probably the last of the great Danehills and out of a Kingmambo mare, won five Group 1 races between April and August last year. Four of them were at 10 to10 1/2 furlongs, including the Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot and the Juddmonte at York, with a win in the 12-furlong King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S, in between. He goes to Coolmore in Ireland, giving them three top-of-the-crop candidates this year instead of their usual two. Also, two of them are in Kentucky, which is a boost for Ashford. Darley retires New Approach and Raven's Pass in Europe, and the dual Grade I-winning sprinter Street Boss, like Street Sense from Street Cry's first crop, to Kentucky. Sheikh Hamdan retires Tamayuz, the top French three-year-old colt at a mile, to Derrinstown in Ireland, giving the Maktoums four top-of-the-crop prospects retiring in all, at least in North America and Europe, in 2009.

Kentucky studmasters did rather better this year than last. Lane's End gets Curlin, the all-time leading money earner outside of Japan, and the first North Americanbased horse to earn over \$10 million; and Three Chimneys gets Big Brown, dual Classic winner and, by miles, the top three-year-old colt of 2007. Lane's End also gets War Pass, the top two-year-old colt of 2007.

When you look at these 42 top-of-the-crop sire prospects as a whole, three things stand out. First, the rise of the Maktoum family as a force in the stallion market; they stand 16 of the 42 stallions on that list, divided equally: eight in Kentucky, eight in Europe. Second, we can see how Coolmore is sticking with the program that got them there: very selective, the highest possible quality only, and mostly by their own, in-house, absolute top-drawer sires. Whereas Darley, in the last four sire crops, leads Coolmore in North America in top-ofthe-crop prospects eight to two, in Europe it is only eight to seven. Darley's biggest growth spurt was in Kentucky, in 2008 retirements.

The third notable point is that, with Coolmore based in Ireland and the Maktoums (Darley plus Shadwell) operating from Dalham Hall and the Nunnery in England, and from Kildangan and Derrinstown in Ireland, there has been very little left over for the 'neutral' stallion farms in Europe, especially in England. Of the 17 top-of-the-crop 'neutral' stallions we've identified, 15 stand in Kentucky, where there is clearly still much more diversity of choice. Only two stand in Ireland, Azamour at the Aga Khan's Gilltown Stud, and Lawman at Ballylinch. None stand in England. Though that is the case, I must emphasize, only with the most expensive stallions. Some of the most successful sires among the 242 we've listed are sure to be among the 200 now standing for less than 'top-of-the-crop' stud fees, but it is notable that the top commercial prospects from these crops in Europe are stationed exclusively in Ireland, or on Maktoum farms in England.

#### Value Pick: Ramonti...

Though I've concentrated on the most expensive prospects from these four crops, there will any number of good buys, at retail or below-retail prices, among the 200 we've listed but didn't mention. One who absolutely jumps off the page is Ramonti, retiring for 2009 to Darley's Irish stud, Kildangan, for just €5,000. He won two Group 1's and two Group 2's in Italy at three and four when trained by the Bottis, and he won four Group 1's for Godolphin as a five-year-old in 2007, three of them in Britain at one mile: the Queen Anne at Royal Ascot; the Sussex at Goodwood; and the Queen Elizabeth II S., back at Ascot in September. He also ran second in two other one-mile Group 1's, the Lockinge and the Prix du Moulin de Longchamp, and closed out the year with a 10-furlong Group 1 win in Hong Kong, with Viva Pataca and Vengeance of Rain behind him. He met Excellent Art twice--in the Sussex and Queen Elizabeth S .-- and beat him twice. Fair enough, Excellent Art is by Pivotal and Ramonti is all Italian-bred, by Marju's son Martino Alonso out of an Italian family-though, at least, his first two dams are by El Gran Senor and Alleged, and his third dam was the Italian champion two-year-old filly and then-Group 3 (now Group 1) Prix de l'Astarte winner Moon Ingraver, by Kalamoun. So it's not a hopeless pedigree. Excellent Art, rated 125 by Timeform in Racehorses of 2007, is down from  $\in$  25,000 last year to  $\in$  17,500 this year. Ramonti, rated 126, retires at €5,000. You can catalogue all the if's and but's you want, but I'd call him an outstanding buy, at  $\in$  5,000 for 2009.

FIGURES FALL AS EXCHANGE RATE COLT TOPS OBS OPENER Noble Exchange (Exchange Rate), a newly turned yearling, topped yesterday's consignor preferred session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale in Florida. The gray, out of Social Scene (Tabasco Cat), is a half to stakes placed Winsome Charm (Silver Charm). Social Scene is a half sister to graded stakes placed Kew Green and Little Hans, as well as Japanese stakes winner Washington Color. Bred by Eddie and Kim James, the yearling was consigned by Janie Roper, Agent IV, and was purchased for \$87,000 by Eisaman Equine. During the lone preferred session of the auction, 168 horses sold for a gross of \$1,450,200. The average plummeted to \$8,632, from \$23,346 a year ago, while the median fell to \$4,100, down from \$16,000 in 2008. The sale's single open session begins today at 11 a.m.

#### MJC Ends 2008 with Figures Down:

During 2008, average wagering figures at Maryland Jockey Club tracks fell 22.5 percent from 2007. Allsources handle totaled \$668.1 million, as compared to \$875.8 million the previous year. With 14 fewer days last year, the daily handle decreased from nearly \$3.8 million to just over \$2.9 million each day. MJC officials are hopeful the passage of a constitutional amendment to allow for the licensing of video lottery terminals in November will lead to increased business in 2009. "The passage of the slots referendum gives us hope that we will be able to turn the table in the near future," said Tom Chuchkas, Maryland Jockey Club president and chief operating officer. "Our goal is to move forward and grow the business. We want to expand the hospitality, with racing as the key ingredient, and get people interested in coming back to the track." Laurel Park is a potential site for 4,750 video lottery terminals to be located in Anne Arundel County.

#### Oaklawn to Ease Louisana Ban Friday:

Oaklawn Park will ease the ban on horses shipping from Fair Grounds, Evangeline and Delta Downs Friday. Horses arriving from southern Louisiana will be accepted on the grounds of the Arkansas track, providing that they have health certificates dated within 48 horses and proof of Equine Herpes Virus vaccination with a period of 14-90 days of arrival. Oaklawn imposed the ban after a horse at Fair Grounds tested positive for Equine Herpes Virus. "We'll continue to communicate with the state veterinarian in Louisiana over the next few days," commented assistant general manager of racing David Longinotti. "Should anything change, we'll readjust our policy as needed. Protecting the health of our racing participants is the most important thing and we applaud our horsemen for cooperating with us throughout this ordeal."

**RAUSING ANNOUNCES PURCHASE OF PACE-**MAKER MAGAZINE Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Chairman Kirsten Rausing yesterday revealed that the TBA and Racehorse Owners' Association had jointly bought the monthly racing and bloodstock magazine Pacemaker. The famous title, with a history stretching back over 40 years, will merge with the joint TBA/ROA publication Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder. Rausing, speaking at the TBA's Annual General Meeting at the Hyatt Regency Churchill Hotel in London, said, "After several months of discussions with Pacemaker's publisher, I am delighted to report that a deal was finalised just before Christmas. Pacemaker has been the pre-eminent racing and bloodstock magazine here and in Ireland for over 40 years. Its reputation and history will strengthen our title and help us to produce an improved publication, not only for the associations' respective members, but for the whole bloodstock industry. To some, this may seem a rather odd time for the TBA and the ROA to be making such an investment but, in fact, the bloodstock market's recent contraction has made this an increasingly logical move. With the economic climate as it is, there is no longer room in this market for two publications of a similar type. Now, it is our belief that one strong racing and bloodstock magazine, published by two responsible racing bodies, will have a long-term future. I stress 'long-term' because publishing a specialist magazine during the next year or two is clearly going to tough and the support of the bloodstock industry will be crucial to our making this work." Rausing told breeders that the recession was of fundamental concern, but might also present investment opportunities for breeders. "I am not going to urge British breeders to cull all their mares, and I am not going to paint a scenario whereby this great industry is lost for future generations, but I am going to urge breeders to take a careful look at their business, and remind the racing authorities that the health of this industry is crucial to the sport of horseracing, for which we all care passionately. Whilst a severe correction will be necessary for some, others should not overlook the opportunities this recession can provide in terms of upgrading their stock, and to share the advice of a wise older statesman that 'in uncertain times keep your savings in a commodity that you know and understand.' The TBA is the one body that has the interests of the horse at its heart, and for that reason alone we must continue to encourage British breeders to do what they do best, but be mindful of the need to take a careful look at the quality of their mares."

#### Brightwells Implements Sales Levy...

Rausing also announced that Brightwells, which holds sales at Ascot and Cheltenham, will join Tattersalls and Doncaster Bloodstock Sales this year in collecting the sales levy that provides funding to the TBA. Additionally, the TBA is now going to be informed which vendors have paid the levy. "We were delighted to be able to persuade Brightwells to join Tattersalls and DBS in collecting sales levy on behalf of the Association with effect from the 2009 sales, and for the first time we will have the identities of those vendors who have paid the levy from the 2008 sales onwards," continued Rausing. "This will help to support the Association's funding as the effects of this downturn are seen in the TBA's accounts, and to address the need to identify and hold individual discussions with some breeders who have previously not contributed to the levy and may welcome the opportunity to discuss their reservations." Rausing also spoke of the TBA's initiative in partnership with the ROA to provide a free lease to owners by vendors of unsold yearlings, with 41 horses already signed up since the scheme was announced. "The ROA and TBA have recently launched the Free Lease Exchange, to provide a platform for putting breeders in touch with owners for the purposes of securing homes for unsold flat yearlings from the 2008 sales, and with the intention of extending this to National Hunt stores and older horses, in due course," she stated.
