#### TEPID OPENER TO SARATOGA SALE

Fasig-Tipton officials went into yesterday's opening session of the Saratoga Selected Yearling Sale with guarded optimism, but came out of the night hoping for better things during tonight's finale in Saratoga Springs. Four yearlings on day one of the 2009 auction sold for over a million dollars, but none broke the seven-figure threshold Monday. Yesterday's top price was the \$800,000 bid by John Ferguson for a son of Street Cry (Ire), and the Darley stallion was also responsible for the second highest price of the evening at \$775,000. Gross sales were \$14,120,000, down 45 percent from the 2009 figure of \$26,789,500. The average fell 13.8 percent to \$271,538, while the median rose 8.7 percent to \$250,000. Of the 100 yearlings catalogued for last night's session, 52 sold for a buy-back rate of 35 percent, compared to last year's opening session when 85 of 118 yearlings sold for a buy-back rate of 19.8 percent. "We had more not-solds than you'd like," admitted Fasig-Tipton Chairman Walt Robertson. "Thirtyfive percent is not terrible, but we'd sure like to be better." Robertson added the lack of a break-out yearling had a major impact on the final numbers. "We didn't have any million-dollar horses," he said. "With a small sale like this, a million-dollar horse skews a lot. I think there was a reluctance to spend money. There was kind of a wait-and-see attitude." Cont. p2

#### ESKENDEREYA TO STAND AT TAYLOR MADE

Jess Jackson of Stonestreet Farm and Ahmed Zayat of Zayat Stables have announced Grade I winner **Eskendereya** (Giant's Causeway--Aldebaran Light, by Seattle Slew) will stand at Taylor Made Stallions beginning in 2011. A stud fee has not yet been determined. "Eskendereya was widely considered to be the best of his generation. He has the highest Beyer speed rating [109] and best Rag number for a three-year-old colt," Jackson said. "His pedigree contains many of the top sires of the past 50 years, and is noteworthy for quality, depth and stamina. His female pedigree, top and bottom, is a 6x6x6x6 to Almahmoud, one of the greatest progenitors of standing sires in America. We are

pleased that the Taylor family will partner with us in his stud career." A stakes winner at two, Eskendereya opened 2010 with an allowance win at Gulfstream in January, then put himself atop a number of Kentucky Derby Top 10 lists with a dominating victory in the GII Fountain of Youth S. in February. He stamped himself as

the one to beat in the Derby after rolling home 9 3/4 lengths clear in the GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct Apr. 3, but was injured just days before the "Run for the Roses," and was retired with a record of 6-4-1-0 and \$725,700 in earnings. Eskendereya raced in the colors of Zayat Stables; Stonestreet purchased a share in the horse after he was retired. Duncan Taylor, president of Taylor Made Stallions, said, "The entire Taylor Made team is extremely excited to partner with the Jacksons, the Stonestreet team and Mr. Ahmed Zayat of Zayat Stables for the opportunity to stand such a special horse. After witnessing Eskendereya's incredible performances in the Wood Memorial and Fountain of Youth, we truly believe he is the most talented racehorse to go to stud in years. He possesses a rare blend of speed, stamina and pedigree that you rarely find in today's Thoroughbred. In looking at his pedigree, which traces directly back to the female family of Northern Dancer and Halo, you will find numerous breed-shaping stallions and foundation mares in virtually every position throughout his pedigree."

Bidders weren't the only ones adopting a wait-and-see approach. "I think we have to wait until tomorrow to really assess the way the top of the market is," commented Fasig President Boyd Browning. "I think it would be a little premature to assess it after one night. We've got some nice horses tomorrow, and last year's second session was stronger, too." Browning admitted, even with a strong session Tuesday, matching last year's figures might be tough. "I think that it's realistic that tomorrow will be stronger; whether it's sufficiently strong to recoup the decrease in average, I don't know. We'll see. We were hopeful it might not be workmanlike, but I think it was workmanlike tonight." Bidding gets underway in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion this evening at 7 p.m.-JM

#### Flay Strikes Late...

Late in Monday's session of the Saratoga sale, celeb-

rity chef Bobby Flay, sitting to the left of the auctioneer's stand with his actress wife Stephanie March, went to \$625,000 to bring home hip 99, a filly by A.P. Indy out of Malka (Deputy Minister). Malka is a daughter of Get Lucky (Mr. Prospector), whose offspring include multiple graded

stakes winner Daydreaming (A.P. Indy), and graded stakes winners Girolamo (A.P. Indy) and Accelerator (A.P. Indy). She is also the granddam of Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and Grade I winner Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat). Hip 99 has been earmarked by Flay for his select broodmare band. "The page is ridiculous," Flay said. "A.P. Indy with that giant family--that's what I'm looking for. I want to own her for 20 years." Flay's band currently numbers between eight and 10, but he added, "I'm trying to cull them to families like I just bought." Of the price tag, Flay said, "I actually thought somewhere between \$600,000 and \$850,000, so I was happy." Flay also bought an Awesome Again filly (hip 39) yesterday for \$190,000.-JM

#### Ferguson on the Street...

Before the half-way mark of yesterday's opening session of the Saratoga Select Yearling sale, bloodstock

agent John Ferguson, acting on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, had already signed the tickets on three yearlings, but it was the fourth who vaulted to the top of the sales. Ferguson bid \$800,000 to bring home hip 47, a son of Street Cry (Ire) out of the unraced Don't Tacha Me (A.P. Indy). Ferguson admitted the yearling had been on his radar screen for some time. "He's a very athletic horse," Ferguson


said. "He's been a good horse throughout the year. He's by a sire who has obviously done great things. He's just a very smart colt." The dark bay colt, consigned by

Taylor Made Sales Agency, was bred by Kenny Troutt and Bill Casner's WinStar Farm. Troutt and Casner purchased the yearling's second dam, Tacha, in foal to Seattle Slew, for \$2.2 million at the 2000 Keeneland January sale. The in utero foal became One Cool Cat (Storm Cat), who was a \$3.1-million Keeneland July yearling in 2002, before becoming a multiple Group 1 winner and European champion juvenile. At the

completion of yesterday's session, Ferguson had signed for eight yearlings; a filly by Smart Strike ( $\underline{\text{hip 32}}$ ) for \$400,000; a colt by Elusive Quality ( $\underline{\text{hip 25}}$ ) for \$375,000; a Medaglia d'Oro colt ( $\underline{\text{hip 92}}$ ) for \$350,000; a Street Sense colt ( $\underline{\text{hip 25}}$ ) for \$350,000; a Bernardini colt ( $\underline{\text{hip 84}}$ ) for \$325,000; and a colt by Hard Spun ( $\underline{\text{hip 45}}$ ) for \$325,000. During last year's opening session of the Saratoga sale, Ferguson signed for five yearlings.-JM





#### Mother Knows Best...

It didn't take long for the newly renovated Humphrey S. Finney Sales Pavilion to have its first big sale. The second horse through the ring during yesterday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Year-

ling sale, hip 4, sold for \$775,000. The winning bidder was Helen K. Groves, who was buying out daughters and co-breeders Helen Alexander and D.D. Matz. "I didn't want to sell her, so I'm afraid I bought her," Groves said shortly after signing the ticket on the Street Cry (Ire) filly behind the sales pavilion. "It was probably a dumb thing to do, but I'm 82 going on 83 and I'm still here. How many more fillies like that am I going to be able to get to the races?" Of the price tag for the pretty bay, Groves added, "I thought she was worth \$1 million, and they didn't

think so. My daughters didn't know that I was going to buy her, but I told them I didn't want to sell her for nothing. Helen might be cross with me for buying her, but I think I got a bargain." The yearling is out of Alchemist (A.P. Indy). Her second dam is GISW Aldiza (Storm Cat), and she is a descendent of stellar broodmare Courtly Dee (Never Bend), who Groves recalled purchasing with partners "a long, long time ago." The British Bloodstock Agency, acting on behalf of Groves, Alexander and David Aykroyd, purchased Courtly Dee, in foal to Alydar, for \$900,000 out of the 1980 Keeneland November Sale. The foal she was carrying at the time was champion Althea. "I've been looking at horses for a long time, and I think this filly can be another Courtly Dee," Groves admitted. The filly was consigned by Eaton Sales.-JM

#### Live Oak Active in the Middle...

Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation was an active player in the middle market yesterday, purchasing three yearlings. The first to was <a href="Hip 13">Hip 13</a>, a dark bay colt by Rock Hard Ten that brought \$450,000. A member of the Lane's End consignment, the Apr. 13 foal, who was bred by Kilroy Thoroughbred Partnership, is out of GIII Miss Preakness S. winner Belong to Sea (Belong to Me).

"We thought he was a big, strong horse, the sire is doing very well, and he has a very active page," explained Live Oak's Bruce Hill, who was seated alongside Weber during the evening's proceedings. "He was just a standout--a man among boys, to some degree."

During the opening session, the Lane's End resident stallion had three yearlings sell in addition to Live Oak's purchase. The other two to go through the ring during the evening brought \$325,000 for Sweezey and Partners, and \$210,000 for a colt offered by Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm.

"Rock Hard Ten is certainly off to a good start at stud," said Hill. "He has four stakes winners and a couple of Grade Is, so he's doing well."

Also on Live Oak's wish list yesterday was <u>Hip 23</u>, a \$300,000 colt by Tiznow. Bred by the partnership of Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds and Larry Beyer, the Apr. 11 foal is out of Carsonality (Carson City), who is the dam of graded stakes placed Larrys Revenge (Vindication).

"Tiznow just speaks for himself," said Hill in regard to the GI Breeders' Cup winner and Horse of the Year. "He can get you that really good horse. We're swinging for the fences a little bit, and he can get you that big horse."

Offered yesterday by Eaton Sales, the dark bay is from the family of GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Fran's Valentine (Saros {GB}), who also tasted success as a broodmare,

producing the likes of MGISW With Anticipation (Relaunch); group winner and Group 1 placed With Fascination (Dayjur) and Group 3 placed With Fire (Gulch).

"He was a very attractive colt, and we loved that he is out of a Carson City mare," added Hill.

Rounding out Live Oak's trio yesterday was <u>Hip 34</u>, a filly by First Samurai. Consigned by Gainseway, acting as agent, the bay had been purchased by Brian Graves Stables for \$120,000 at Keeneland in January. Live Oak got her for \$225,000.

"The longer we looked at her, the more she grew on us," admitted Hill.


A Mar. 6 foal, the filly is out of the stakes-winning mare Cool Spell (Grand Slam), who also hit the board in a pair of graded stakes during her racing career. She is from the extended family of MGSW Lucky Spell (Lucky Mel), who is a half-sister to Grade I stakes winner Seattle Song and the dam of Trolley Song. The latter is the dam of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner and leading sire Unbridled's Song (Unbridled).

"First Samurai is off to a good start as a stallion and she has a stakes winning page to go along with it," said Hill.

According to Hill, the trio is destined for Live Oak Stud in Ocala.

A regular in Saratoga for many years, Hill outlined Live Oak's approach to the yearling sales.

"There is no design when we come up here," admitted Hill. "We just look at every horse, find the quality and whether it's colts or fillies, we let them fall wherever the may. Bottom line is that we are looking for quality."-CB



#### Getting Business Done Early...

Shadwell rep Rick Nichols wrapped up business early yesterday. The highest priced yearling bought on behalf of Sheikh Hamdan's international operation was Hip 16, a colt by Pulpit who realized a \$525,000 final bid. Consigned by Gerry Dilger's Dromoland Farm, the Apr. 4 foal had been purchased for \$425,000 by Beaver Creek Farm at Keeneland November last fall.

"We've always liked him--actually I was the underbidder on him as a weanling," explained Nichols.

The bay is out of multiple stakes winner and graded stakes placed Boom Town Girl (Unbridled).

"He's developed well and has grown up into a very nice and athletic looking colt," Nichols said. "He's very correct and has a good walk to him."

Just a few hips earlier in the session, Nichols secured a colt by MGISW Rock Hard Ten out of Appealing Storm (Valid Appeal) for \$325,000. Hip 7 is a half-brother to GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. heroine Vacare (Lear Fan) and Single Solution (Flatter), victorious in the GIII Valley View S.

"I had always admired Rock Hard Ten as a racehorse," said Nichols. "This horse is a nice and correct colt, and he looks very solid. It's the kind of horse you were looking for."

As to where Shadwell's two newest acquisitions might be sent, Nichols said, "When Sheikh Hamdan comes over for Keeneland in September, he will look at them and decide if he wants to give them a try in Europe. He races most of his horses in Europe, but they could stay here."

As for his sentiment regarding the evenings proceedings, Nichols offered a glimmer of hope following a tough opening day, saying, "It's a good group of horses. The average might be a little down tonight, but I think it will bounce up tomorrow."-CB

After buying her back at \$27,000 at KEESEP 2004, Lothenbach raced the filly to a Grade I-winning sophomore campaign that saw her earn \$466,000. He turned around and sold Vacare for \$2.8 million at FTKNOV 2006. The mare also accounted for GSW Single Solution (Flatter), a filly born in 2006 that has carried the Lothenbach colors to four wins while bankrolling \$170,044. Hip 101, colt, A.P. Indy--Maryfield, by Elusive Quality

The second session looks poised to start off with a bang with this bay by Lane's End resident A.P. Indy. The Feb. 3 foal is the first foal out of Maryfield, who collected victories in the GI Ballerina S., GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H. and Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint en route to a sprint filly championship. The nineyear-old mare is also a half-sister to graded stakes placed Quiet (Roar), dam of GSP Quietly Mine (Belong to Me). "It's pretty unusual that a physical will match a pedigree like that," said Meg Levy. "When the stars all collide, I think he ends up being one of the top picks of the sale. He's a great mover, and he has a fantastic temperament." As for the pairing of A.P. Indy and Maryfield, Levy said, "I think it's a great match. He may follow his dam a little bit more with his size and his amount of leg. He's a very balanced colt. Maryfield herself is a very leggy, tall mare. The combination was just about perfect, because she gave him the walk and the leg of his dam."


Already responsible for top class fillies Rachel Alexandra and Gabby's Golden Gal, the Darley stallion produced the second highest priced yearling at this

"He strongly resembles his sire, the top two-year-old and dual Classic winner Afleet Alex, who is now the clear leader of the second-crop sires in the U.S. This colt is a half-brother to two exceptional racehorses in champion Lookin At Lucky and the very useful and talented Kensei (Mr. Greeley), a dual graded stakes winner himself. This colt has great motion. He has great charisma and charm and a wonderful temperament. He's very kind and willing, and I think that will stand him well in the heat of competition, as it did for Alex."



# RACETRACK Round-Up

#### Winslow Homer Injured...

Winslow Homer (Unbridled's Song), runaway winner of the Curlin S. at Saratoga Sunday, came out of the





race with a condylar fracture of the left foreleg. The three-year-old will have surgery to repair the break, and could return for a four-year-old campaign. "We're anticipating he'll come back," said trainer Tony Dutrow. "It's a pretty simple procedure." A \$310,000 KEESEP yearling purchase for Fox Hill Farm, Winslow

Homer broke his maiden at Saratoga last summer in his second start, and was tabbed a TTDN Rising Star" after a 12 1/2-length romp in a Philly Park allowance in November. The grey bested Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil) by 3/4 of a length when taking the GIII Holy Bull S. in January at Gulfstream, but suffered a fracture in his knee and underwent surgery. He returned in the June 26 GIII lowa Derby, finishing a distant third. The lightly raced colt has compiled a record of 6-4-0-2 and earned \$222,825.

#### Rachel Alexandra Breezes at Spa...

Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) turned in an easy five-furlong work yesterday morning over the Oklahoma training track at Saratoga. The fouryear-old filly, who was bucking playfully after stepping onto the track just before 6 a.m., stopped the clock in 1:02.45 under jockey Shaun Bridgmohan. She is preparing for an intended start in the GI Personal Ensign S. at the Spa Aug. 29. "I thought she looked really good," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "Shaun did a good job with her. She obviously was very strong away from the pole, but she looked beautiful. This morning was a little warmer than it has been the past two days. I think the cooler weather this week has had her energy level very high, and we did a little more with her first work back today than we normally do off a race [because] of how she'd been galloping the past few days." It was Rachel Alexandra's first work since posting a professional win in the Lady's Secret S. at Monmouth July 25. She is scheduled to work the next three Mondays for the Personal Ensign, which will be her first start at 1 1/4 miles. Asmussen is optimistic the added ground won't be an issue. "She's always been very impressive; something that everybody has noted is how she gallops out after a race," said Asmussen. "She shows that in her training."



#### Quality Road Schools in Gate...

Quality Road (Elusive Quality), who was scratched from the GI Breeders' Cup Classic last November when he had a meltdown behind the starting gate and refused to load, schooled at the gate at Saratoga Monday. The New York Racing Association set up a special schooling session for the four-year-old, positioning the gate in front of the grandstand, where it will be for the start of Saturday's GI Whitney Invitational H. "It's just a safety net," trainer Todd Pletcher explained. "It's going to be a little different environment starting in front of the grandstand, and we want to cover all bases."





Racetrack Round-Up cont. 'Lucky' Fine After Haskell Win...

Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) was no worse for wear Monday morning, less than 24 hours after leaving himself the undisputed leader of the sophomore divisions with a smashing win in the GI IZOD Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth Park. "He came out of the race great," said Bob Baffert, who was winning his record fourth Haskell. "He looked fine this morning. He's still there [and is] shipping out [Tuesday]." Baffert said future plans hadn't been determined. "I think he's going to be heading west, coming back to California," Baffert said. "I haven't made up my mind yet. I have until tomorrow to figure that out."



## **PEDIGREE INSIGHTS**

#### SPIRITED NOVERRE ENJOYING SUCCESS

"Getting offspring in his own mold: tough, talented, tigerish" ran part of a Darley stallion advertisement for Rahy's accomplished son Noverre. Now "tigerish" isn't an adjective one normally expects to see in such an advert, but the Darley team were evidently trying to put a positive slant on one of Noverre's more notable displays.

That came in the G1 Lockinge S. in 2002. Noverre had been in the lead for a while when the French raider Keltos loomed alongside. Such was Noverre's will to win that he didn't take kindly to being passed, and he attempted to take a bite out of his opponent's quarters as he went by.

Frankie Dettori had first likened Noverre to a ferocious feline after the colt had battled through to triumph in a three-way photo finish to the 2001 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. "He's a real tiger," the Italian rider said. "He's very versatile. For some reason, I couldn't get him off the rail and got boxed in until late on."

Noverre later lost his Classic victory after testing positive for a corticosteroid commonly used for arthritic problems. Fortunately, there were no such problems after Noverre's decisive win in the G1 Sussex S.-- a victory that helped him end the year as the highest-rated three-year-old miler in Europe (admittedly in a non-vintage year).

It is hardly surprising that Noverre possessed a spirited temperament. For a start, he comes from the male line descending from the famously quirky Nasrullah. The Bloodstock Breeders' Review's obituary for this exceptional stallion simply stated, "Like himself, the progeny of Nasrullah are on the whole an unruly lot."

Perhaps the most famous example was his British son Grey Sovereign. His obituary in the same publication reported that "his highly strung temperament caused concern throughout his lifetime. Even as a two-year-old he was frequently ridden in the paddock preliminaries and was often accompanied to the start by the trainer's assistant, whose unenviable task was to help the horse relax by pulling his tongue. However, Grey Sovereign was never inclined to do anything against his will. His stubbornness persisted into old age, when he would sometimes defy all attempts to bring him in from his paddock. If rearing up and striking out failed to have the desired effect, he would charge with teeth bared."



#### Pedigree Insights cont.

Noverre's great-grandsire Red God, another son of Nasrullah, earned the unwanted Timeform squiggle that denotes "a horse who is somewhat ungenerous, faint-hearted or a bit of a coward." This Guggenheim colt had looked very good when he won the Richmond S. on only his second start, but then snatched defeat from the jaws of certain victory in the Champagne S., throwing his head up just before the line.

There are also some other suspect names in Noverre's pedigree. His sire, the admirable Rahy, was out of a mare by Halo. When I went to Stone Farm to see Halo many years ago, he was wearing a muzzle, so I guess he wasn't the easiest horse to handle. Halo's sire Hail To Reason was described by Frank Talmadge Phelps as "a flighty and highly nervous sort" at the start of his arduous two-year-old campaign.

Noverre's own broodmare sire was Northern Dancer. While I have no desire to detract from this magnificent stallion's well-nigh impeccable record, there are a couple of things I should mention. In Bill Munn's stallion biographies in Windfields' Classic Sirelines 1981, he commented that Northern Dancer's dam Natalma "had a lot of ability, but she possessed a very sour disposition." Munn also wrote that "Northern Dancer, the stallion, is still a highstrung animal. He bites and can be rough to handle. Many of his offspring have inherited his temperament."

One son, the short-lived Marinsky, gained notoriety when he savaged the future Derby second Relkino when Relkino tried to push through on Marinsky's inside as they contested the Diomed S. Although Marinsky wore blinkers and a muzzle on both his subsequent starts, they weren't enough to prevent his being demoted for interference after his victory in the 1977 July Cup.

One thing this article highlights is that a tough, aggressive or even ultra-competitive temperament need be no barrier to stallion success, as Nasrullah, Grey Sovereign and Halo all demonstrated. Indeed, I sometimes wonder whether this determination to be the alpha male is a positive virtue, even if it makes life much more difficult for those who have to deal with it on a daily basis.

Storm Cat could probably also be included in this category, judging by a comment Ric Waldman once made to *The Blood-Horse*. He said that Storm Cat is "a much better sire than he was a racehorse, but he did have one ingredient on the racetrack--he was really tough. I've seen that toughness in his foals. They win the nose decisions rather than lose them. That's the difference."

To get back to Noverre, he appeared to have many of the assets one looks for in a potential stallion. As his adverts stressed, he had been tough and talented. Showing similar precocity to his grandsire Blushing Groom, Noverre won his first three starts at two, including the G3 July S.

He later added to his reputation with a win in the G2 Champagne S. and a second in the G1 Dewhurst S. He then progressed so well that he became a top miler, but he had two significant obstacles to overcome when he retired to Kildangan Stud. His three-parts brother Arazi had demonstrated even greater ability at two, only to become a serious disappointment as a stallion (despite the best efforts of his only Grade I winner, Congaree). The lack of a victory among Noverre's seven starts as a four-year-old also took some of the gloss of his earlier achievements, even though his form was still very good.

In the circumstances, it came as no great surprise when Darley decided to sell Noverre to India at the start of 2008, instead of standing him, as advertised, for a fifth season in Ireland, at a reduced fee of  $\le 10,000$ .

Noverre had been represented by two group winners, one from each of his first two crops (the G2 Challenge S. winner Miss Lucifer and the G3 Albany S. winner Nijoom Dubai). Things have looked up considerably since then, with Summit Surge and Cottonmouth boosting the number of group winners in his first crop to three.

More to the point, Noverre's third and fourth crops have so far produced three Group 1 winners, two of

them at Classic level. His son Le Havre took the 2009 Prix du Jockey-Club, having finished second in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains. This crop also contained the quick-maturing Langs Lash, winner of the G2 Queen Mary S at two.

This year has seen his daughter

Music Show defeat a strong field in the G1 Falmouth S. before finishing second to the mighty Goldikova in the Prix Rothschild two days ago. Music Show's fine run at Deauville came just hours before Noverre's daughter Enora finished strongly to take the Preis der Diana, the German Oaks. Enora's win makes her the eighth group winner from Noverre's first four crops, and she is one of six fillies among them.

This upturn in Noverre's record suggests he's going to prove an asset to the breeding industry in India, the natural home of the tiger.


