CAPE BLANCO RETIRED

Multiple Grade I winner Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}--Laurel Delight {GB}, by Presidium {GB}) has been retired from racing after sustaining an injury while winning Saturday's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic

Initially raced in the

colors of Derrick Smith and co-owned by Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor, Cape Blanco captured the 2009 G2 Futurity S. and G3 Tyros S. during an unbeaten 2-year-old campaign. After defeating subsequent Epsom Derby hero Workforce (GB) (King's Best) by 3 1/4 lengths in the G2 Dante S. the following May, he missed the blue riband and was unplaced in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club before annexing the G1 Irish Derby and finishing runner-up in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. He followed an emphatic 5 1/2-length victory in the G1 Irish Champion S. with another unplaced effort on his next visit to France for the Arc. Bought into by Jim and Fitri Hay during the off-season, Cape Blanco ran fourth in the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai World Cup and G1 Prix Ganay Apr. 30 and was sixth in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 14 before being sent on his first Stateside foray. After plundering the July 9 GI Man O'War S., he shipped back to add the Aug. 13 GI Arlington Million to his tally before his gutsy nose defeat of Dean's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) in Saturday's 12-furlong contest. He retires with nine successes from 15 starts and over £2.5 million in prize money.

"Cape Blanco is an extremely talented and courageous horse with a tremendous attitude to his racing, so we will all be very sad to see him leave Ballydoyle," O'Brien said. "The fact that he never once changed leads in the home straight in spite of his injury just goes to prove what a brave horse he is. It is very disappointing for all the partners, especially the Hays, as we were very much looking forward to the Breeders' Cup."

Stud plans for Cape Blanco will be announced at a later date.

AWESOME FEATHER RETURNS TOMORROW

Champion Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course), unraced since running her record to a perfect six-for-six in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill

Downs last November, will make her return in the \$60,000 Le Slew S. at Belmont Park tomorrow. With jockey Jeffrey Sanchez in the irons, she is scheduled to face four rivals in the seven-furlong test. The 3-

year-old filly is 1-5 on the morning line. Bred by Jacks Or Better Farm in Florida, Awesome Feather won her first five starts at Calder while carrying the colors of her breeder. The slight 4-1 favorite in the Breeders' Cup, she scored by 2 1/4 lengths, and upped her bankroll to \$1,495,746. The bay went through the ring at the Fasig-Tipton November sale and was bought by Frank Stronach for \$2.3 million. Sent to trainer Chad Brown, she was forced to the sidelines by a tendon injury, and makes her first appearance for her new connections in the Le Slew. Awesome Feather has been working steadily since the end of August, most recently covering five furlongs in 1:01.09 on the Belmont training track Sept. 25. "In some of her works, you just see how easy she does things," Brown told Daily Racing Form. "It gives you a sneak peek at what's under the hood. What's under the hood is a serious racehorse. It's obvious given her remarkable record, but getting to see it for yourself, you really appreciate it."

Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) remains on course for a fourth straight victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile after her reversal in Sunday's G1 Prix de la Foret. Beaten a head by Dream Ahead (Diktat {GB}) in the sevenfurlong contest on the Arc undercard at Longchamp, the 14-time Group 1 winner was reported to have emerged from that contest with no problems and is set to turn up at Churchill Downs Nov. 5. Pierre-Yves Bureau, racing manager to the Wertheimer brothers, told PA Sport, "She is okay this morning. Goldikova was very brave and still ran very well, so as long as she is okay the plan is still to go to the Breeders' Cup. We know she likes racing in America--the fast ground and the fast pace suits her well, so lets hope she can produce her best on what will be her final race."



RACETRACK Round-Up

Star Added to Dewhurst Field

Connections of the impressive recent maiden winner **Spiritual Star (Ire)** (Soviet Star) have paid a £20,000 supplementary fee to add the colt to Saturday's G1 Dubai Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. Successful by six lengths over the same course and distance Sept. 23, the Andrew Balding trainee races in the colors of Thurloe Thoroughbreds.

"Spiritual Star won very nicely at Newmarket and he looked like a potentially smart horse in the making," Thurloe's syndicate manager James Stafford explained. "We are very thrilled with him, and we are stepping a little bit into the unknown, but Jimmy Fortune said that he deserved a go in a group race. We had the option of going to Newmarket or waiting until the [Oct. 22] G3 Horris Hill S. at Newbury and we thought that we would run him while he is in such good form.

He is an improving horse and he is very straightforward. Touch wood, everything has gone well with him so far, and we need to find out how good he is."

Aidan O'Brien has left a team of six in the seven-furlong highlight, including Michael Tabor's Sept. 10 G1 National S. hero and TTDN Rising Star" TDN Rising Star TDN Rising Sta

"Bronterre would be high up in the pecking order of our 2-year-olds and he deserves a crack at the Dewhurst," Hannon said of the former. "I expect Aidan O'Brien will send a few over for that race, but we have been very happy with our fellow since Goodwood and, while it will be a big jump up in class, he has earned his promotion."

Also in the list is Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **O "TDN Rising Star" O** unbeaten **Ektihaam (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and George Strawbridge's Listed Washington Singer S. winner **Fencing** (Street Cry {Ire}). Charles Wentworth's G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Mill Reef S. winner **Caspar Netscher (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) and the unbeaten G2 Norfolk S. hero **Bapak Chinta** (Speightstown) are notables. Newmarket Racecourses' Director of Racing Michael Prosser was yesterday continuing to water the Rowley Mile ahead of the inaugural Dubai Future Champions' Day.

"It is warm again today in Newmarket, with temperatures likely to peak at around 25 or 26 degrees Celsius," Prosser explained. "The heat will start to drop through the week--which is forecast to be largely dry--and by the end of it temperatures will be around 16 degrees Celsius. Therefore, the course is currently being watered and eight millimetres is being applied. If, as anticipated, we do have a largely dry week, we will again irrigate at the end of it, on either Thursday or Friday. We will be aiming for decent, fast ground--ground that is on the good side of good to firm."

Click for Racing Post chart or brisnet.com catalogue-style pedigree. The Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe represented one of the few low points in the dazzling career of the great Nijinsky II. This brilliant colt arrived at Longchamp unbeaten in 11 starts, having recently become the first colt since 1935 to complete the extremely demanding task of winning the British Triple Crown. Nijinsky had taken the last leg, the St Leger, not long after recovering from a severe bout of ringworm, and in the circumstances the Arc probably came too soon for Vincent O'Brien's star. The end result was a head defeat by Sassafras.

The intervening 40-odd years have seen Nijinsky make amends on several occasions. Suave Dancer, a colt by Nijinsky's son Green Dancer, took the 1991 Arc, and was followed four years later by the unbeaten Lammtarra, a colt sired by Nijinsky at the age of 24. The 2002 Arc went to another of Nijinsky's grandsons, when the Caerleon 5-year-old Marienbard defeated a couple of Derby winners.

Nijinsky's name also appears somewhere in the pedigrees of several other Arc winners, including Sakhee, Rail Link and Zarkava, and his male line was again to the fore two days ago, when Danedream stunned the crowd with her five-length victory. This rapidly improving German filly is by Nijinsky's grandson Lomitas, who was German Horse of the Year back in 1991.

Having charted Nijinsky's influence on the Arc, it wouldn't be fair to overlook the growing impact that German bloodlines have been having on the Longchamp championship in recent years. Lomitas is out of a mare by Surumu, a Deutsches Derby winner who was Germany's champion sire on six occasions and who sired Acatenango, a five-time champion sire. Surumu also sired the dam of Hurricane Run, winner of the Arc in 2005. Incidentally, it was Acatenango who sired the dams of this year's winners of the Kentucky Derby and Deutsches Derby.


King's Best, sire of the 2010 Arc winner Workforce, is out of the German-bred Allegretta, who also ranks as the dam of the 1993 winner Urban Sea, who in turn became the dam of Sea the Stars, the outstanding winner in 2009.

To get back to Lomitas, 1991 was the year this son of Niniski won five of his six starts, his only setback coming at the hands of Temporal in the Deutsches Derby. Lomitas went on to gain his revenge on Temporal to the tune of seven lengths in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden and he also took the G1 Europa-Preis by eight lengths. These efforts earned him an excellent International Classification rating of 131. Lomitas' record in Germany stood at nine wins and two seconds from 12 starts, but unfortunately he became the target of some cloak-and-dagger intrigue in Germany, with poison being administered to him on one occasion. He was consequently sent into exile for his own safety and spent two years in the U.S., where he became an allowance winner over a mile and an eighth at Saratoga and was second in the GII Shoemaker H. at Hollywood Park.

Consequently Lomitas didn't make his debut at stud until he was seven, in 1995. Fortunately he wasted little time in making an impact with his first 3-year-olds, to the extent that by August it was announced that Darley had purchased an interest that would allow it to send seven mares a year to Lomitas, whose book was restricted to 65 mares at Gestut Fahrhof. For the record, that first crop contained Silvano (GI Arlington Million), Sumitas (GII Knickerbocker H.) and Belenus (G1 Deutsches Derby).

Later crops produced two more good winners in the U.S. in Meridiana, an Oaks d'Italia winner who won the GII Orchid H., and Blue Moon, winner of the GII Buena Vista H. The message is that you ignore Danedream at your peril, should she come over to the Breeders' Cup.

Lomitas' bright start ultimately saw him transferred to join the Darley team at Newmarket in 2002, but he returned to Germany after the 2006 season, so Danedream's dam Danedrop was among the first book of mares Lomitas covered after his return to Fahrhof. Interestingly, Lomitas' five years in Britain produced only one Group 1 winner, namely the Aga Khan's Prix de l'Opera winner Shalanaya. He died in 2010, at the age of 22.

As Danedrop's name suggests, she is a daughter of the mighty Danehill. Danehill, of course, enjoyed some of his finest moments as a sire with mares from the Nijinsky line, siring Dansili, Banks Hill, Intercontinental, Cacique, Champs Elysees and Promising Lead from sisters sired by Nijinsky's grandson Kahyasi. He also sired the Prix Ganay winner Indian Danehill from a mare by Green Dancer and the champion Australian sprinter Fastnet Rock from a Royal Academy mare. Fatnet Rock is being given his chance by Coolmore to establish himself in Europe, following his eye-catching start in Australia. *Cont. p6*

Danehill has recently notched up his sixth consecutive broodmare sire championship in Australia and he is currently Sadler's Wells's nearest pursuer on the Anglo-Irish list, thanks largely to the efforts of such as Frankel and Maybe. Needless to say, Danehill's best daughters are highly prized, but Danedrop never made it to the races and she was sold for €17,000 soon after Danedream was weaned. Danedream herself made only €9,000 when sold as a yearling.

That said, it isn't hard to explain why she is as good as she is, or why she has made such impressive improvement during the last few months. She is a May 7 foal, so is allowed to be something of a late developer.

In addition to having a Horse of the Year as her sire and a brilliant stallion as her broodmare sire, Danedream comes from a highly distinguished female line. Her dam is a granddaughter of the outstanding broodmare Lady Berry. This daughter of Violon d'Ingres stayed well enough to defeat the males in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak over a distance of nearly two miles and she proved similarly effective as a broodmare.


Lady Berry's stakes winners featured Indian Rose, winner of the G1 Prix Vermeille, Le Nain Jaune, who took the Grand Prix de Paris during its days over nearly two miles, and Vert Amande, a Prix Ganay winner who was also third in the Arc.

Lady Berry's daughter Featherhill also excelled as a broodmare, notably producing the high-class Groom Dancer. Lady Berry's female descendants are also responsible for such Group 1 winners as Falco, Plumania and Kinshasa No Kiseki, but Danedream now has strong claims to being the best of them.

For what it's worth, Danedream's seventh dam, the Mahmoud mare Geranium, was a half-sister to Esmeralda, a top-class racemare who produced the exceptional Coronation V. This incestuously bred filly rounded off her second season in the 1949 edition of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, winning with similar panache to Danedream.




