## CAPE OF GOOD HOPE

The Cape Premier Yearling Sale gets underway today at the Cape Town International Convention Centre. A total of 349 youngsters have been catalogued for the two-day auction, including a full-sister to last year's co-topper, a R2.5-million ( $\$ 317,253$ ) son of Jet Master (SAf)--Laptop Lady (SAf) (AI Mufti), consigned by Klawervlei Stud. They are both, in turn, half-siblings to champion Jay Peg (SAf) (Camden Park), whose first crop is also featured at this sale. Retired to Klawervlei after a glittering career that saw him amass over R40 million, Jay Peg has 14 youngsters slated to go under the hammer over the course of the next two days.
The recently deceased Jet Master has 26 yearlings scheduled to sell from his penultimate crop. Among them is lot 194, a colt produced by Majestic Dancer (SAf) (Joshua Dancer), a half-sister to star sprinter J J the Jet Plane (SAf) (Jet Master). Named The Jet, the bay colt is consigned by Klipdrif Stud, as agent.
The catalogue also features the first South African-bred crop of Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood), who reigned as the country's Horse of the Year in 1999 following wins in the G1 J \& B Met and G1 South African Derby. After racing for the Oppenheimers, Horse Chestnut entered stud at Claiborne Farm, where he sired GISW Lucifer's Stone and GSWs Spanish Chestnut, Duveen, and Smart Enough. He was repatriated in time for the 2009 breeding season, and has six yearlings catalogued here. Cont. p3

## in sharper focus. <br> BONFIRE (GB)

Not seen until late September, Bonfire (GB) (Manduro \{Ger\}) quickly established himself on the international racing scene and, according to the World Rankings, there were ultimately very few better juveniles than him at the end of last term. At the outset of his Classic year, the exciting bay colt who carries the hopes of the famed Highclere Thoroughbred Racing syndicate, will bid to add some more luster to the honor roll at Park House Stables, Kingsclere. That Newbury-based training establishment is now under the care of Andrew Balding, son of lan who orchestrated the career of the great Mill Reef and other luminaries such as Lochsong (GB) and Selkirk.

After a fluent debut win over a mile at Salisbury, the half-brother to last year's G3 Musidora S. winner Joviality (GB) (Cape Cross \{Ire\}) was deemed unlucky to be only third in the G1 Criterium International over that trip at Saint-Cloud on his other outing at the end of October. It was a strong-closing effort in a deep race that offered much hope that 2012 could be a momentous year for all involved. He is already one of the bargain buys of recent times, having cost John Warren just 90,000gns at Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Sale. Highclere supremo Harry Herbert was on hand this week to tell the story so far. "John knew this horse well, as he and my sister Carolyn bred him and he was always a yearling that caught their eye, especially when he was being prepared for the sales," Herbert revealed.

"As you can imagine, I would not buy a Highclere homebred readily for obvious reasons, but this horse was an absolute standout as an individual and we had heard how much John Gosden liked his half-sister, Joviality. I was thrilled to buy him for $90,000 \mathrm{gns}$, although my sister was less than happy at the time, as she expected him to make considerably more!"

Sire Manduro, who earned the ultimate accolade from Andre Fabre, was also responsible for the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner Mandaean (GB) from his first crop and Herbert is firmly on the side of the Kildangan Stud resident.
"I was a huge fan of Manduro when he was racing and it didn't entirely surprise me when Andre Fabre described him as the best horse he had every trained," he said. "He always seemed to travel so well in his races and then produced that devastating turn of foot which marked him out as an exceptional racehorse."
Bonfire is out of Night Frolic (GB) (Night Shift), whose immediate family includes the high-class Karen's Caper (War Chant) and Miss Coronado (Coronado's Quest) and whose yearling colt by Duke of Marmalade (Ire) made a splash in Newmarket in October.
"Night Frolic herself comes from a prolific black-type family and so, on paper, Bonfire has every chance of competing at the highest level. The Duke of Marmalade half-brother sold for 340,000gns at last year's Book 1 Sale at Tattersalls. He was bought by Demi O'Byrne, and as an individual, is another stunning animal who honestly could be anything."

Bonfire's early reputation went before him at two and he proved the vibes were right during his brief but dramatic autumn campaign. Herbert takes up the story again.
"Andrew always liked the horse and it was clear to see from early on in the spring that he was an athletic individual who got to the top of the gallops with the minimum of fuss," he explained. "He has always been quite a lively character at home, which is why Andrew decided to pony him to the start when he made his debut at Salisbury. He was expected to run very well on his debut, but none of us expected him to make such an impressive racecourse debut. He showed a tremendous turn of foot that day and it turned out that his division of the maiden was significantly faster than the other one. The Criterium International was the right sort of event for him, timing-wise, and I am a great believer in having a go at a good race if you think you have got a special horse. We did the same with Motivator after he won his maiden at Newmarket when he went on to win the Racing Post Trophy on his second start. I think that there is no question that he would have won at SaintCloud had he been able to get out of the pocket that he was trapped in. I don't blame Jimmy [Fortune] at all, because if you look at the replay there was no chance at any stage of the race of being able to get into a different position unless he had literally pulled him to the back of the field in order to come around horses, which would have meant losing a tremendous amount of ground."

With that vital experience of top-flight racing behind him, Bonfire's immediate future concerns the Classics and one in particular.

The first Saturday in June is very much on the agenda, according to Herbert. "He had a long holiday at Highclere Stud during the winter and was very relaxed out in his paddock," he continued. "He has made tremendous physical improvement over the past few months and he certainly has the look of a very good horse. He has been back in full training with Andrew for three weeks and has recently been introduced to the equine treadmill. The programme after the Tattersalls Millions 3yo Trophy [over 10 furlongs at Newmarket's Craven meeting in April], depending how he gets on in that race, will most probably be a Derby trial, such as the G3 Chester Vase or the G2 Dante S. I think that he should stay a mile and a half and the Derby will most certainly be his primary objective. His half-sister, Joviality, who won the Musidora last year didn't stay further than a mile and a quarter, but she was by Cape Cross and so, with Manduro adding stamina to the top line, I would be quietly confident that he would get a mile and a half. Personally, I believe that he will go on any ground, as he has such a good action."

Few syndicates get to experience the ultimate thrill of Classic glory, but the Royal Ascot Racing Club lived the dream when Motivator (GB) streaked to success in the 2005 renewal of the blue riband. If Bonfire emulates that dashing individual in the more familiar Highclere livery, it would provide a pinnacle moment for the firm.

Horsephotos and to achieve it in the paleblue silks of Highclere would be every bit as emotional as it was with Motivator winning for the Royal Ascot Racing Club that I manage," he says. "At Highclere, we put these syndicates together with the aim of giving our shareowners the best possible chance of competing at the highest level and over the years we have been fortunate enough to have raced seven European Champions including the World Champion Harbinger, proving that the Classic dream really is within reach. With Bonfire, we just might have another horse who could take us to those amazing heights once again."

Bonfire represents the Pocahontas syndicate within the Highclere set-up and Herbert revealed that the group has something else to excite them and it may be that Epsom's Oaks provides another focus this year.
"The Pocahontas Syndicate is made up of two horses and 20 shareowners at a cost of $£ 12,950$ per share. Vow (GB), the other horse in the syndicate, is a lovely daughter of Motivator and a half-sister to the top-class performers Beaten Up (GB) and Harris Tweed (GB). She was too immature to race as a 2-year-old, but showed plenty of natural ability on the home gallops. Hopefully, she will be seen out in the spring and we will take it one step at a time with her. She is very well liked by William Haggas, as well as his wife Maureen, who rides the filly out each morning. Last year, she also rode Dancing Rain, who won the Oaks, so let's hope that lightning can strike twice!"--Tom Frary

Sweet Orange, who was group placed at two in Ireland, rallied late to triumph over favourite Fay Fay in a thrilling climax to the day's feature contest, the G1 Mercedes-Benz Hong Kong Classic Mile, the 1 st Leg of the 2012 4-Year-Old Series. Trainer David Ferraris, winless at the Group 1 level since stretching back to Vengeance Of Rain's 2007 Dubai Sheema Classic win, broke through here as the 4 -year-old came from off a slow pace to score by a neck under Weichong Marwing. "It feels tremendous because I've had a poor season, particularly so with all the close seconds l've had," said Ferraris. "Sweet Orange has had no luck in his last few races and it's been heartbreaking, but he's a courageous horse that just keeps improving--he's top-class. Importantly, he had the right rider. Weichong galloped the horse on Sunday and he told me he wasn't concerned about what was running because he said I had the horse $100 \%$." According to Ferraris, Sweet Orange may make his next start in either the G1 Mercedes-Benz Hong Kong Derby (3rd Leg of the Four-Year-Old series) or the 1800m G1 Mercedes-Benz Hong Kong Classic Cup (2nd Leg of the Four-Year-Old series) Feb. 19. "The 2000 m will be his absolute game," opined the trainer. "I think he will run in the 1800 m and then go to the Derby. There aren't too many races for him so I think I'll keep him to his own company."


## KENTUCKY GAMING BILL COULD BE INTRODUCED SHORTLY

A constitutional amendment on casino-style gambling in Kentucky could be introduced in the Senate within the next couple of days, it was revealed late Wednesday evening. Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear and Senator Damon Thayer have reached an agreement on the language of the bill.
"We will spend the next few days laying the groundwork for its introduction," Governor Beshear said in a statement. "We are hopeful that our senators will give this bill the full consideration it deserves, since repeated polls show that Kentuckians are demanding an opportunity to vote on this issue."

The Family Foundation of Kentucky, which opposes expanded gambling, issued the following statement following Beshear's announcement.
"They didn't have the votes to begin with, and now what little support they have is deteriorating by the day," Family Foundation spokesman Martin Cothran commented. "In fact, the gambling bill may already be dead.

## SOLIS WINS JOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP IN PERU

Gulfstream Park-based jockey Alex Solis added another international achievement to his impressive resume in winning the sixth annual Robalca International Jockeys Championship-Copa Caliente on Tuesday at Peru's flagship racecourse Hipodromo de Monterrico. The Panamanian native, who ranks fourth in the all-time leading jockey standings by earnings among active jockeys, placed third twice and guided $10-1$ shot Moore's Vision (Pollard's Vision) in the final race to finish with 16 points and win the challenge.
"It is enormously satisfying to win this event with so many prestigious jockeys," said Solis, who earned $\$ 10,000$ for the victory in his visit to Peru. "I take home with me very pleasant memories of Hipodromo de Monterrico and I hope I can be back next year." Defending champion Edgar Prado and NYRA-based jockey Alan Garcia, finished in a tie for second with 14 points each. During celebrations, Peruvian-born trainer Julio Canani received a silver plate from track director Jorge Luis Gonzales in recognition for his outstanding achievements in North American racing. Canani, 73, trained champion 2 -year-old filly Sweet Catomine and Breeders' Cup Mile winners Silic (Fr) and Val Royal (Fr).

## WRITERS UP

RETIRED RACEHORSE TRAINER CHALLENGE: DAY TWO

Day Two of the Retired Racehorse Trainer Challenge at last weekend's Maryland Horse World Expo drew a much larger crowd than the first day. Three


Thoroughbreds were led, tacked up, into the brightly lit Cow Palace Arena. Four X The Trouble regarded the bleachers, food stands, sound system, and running children carefully with a cocked head and bright eyes.

For the benefit of the folks who were not able to attend Friday's evaluation, president Steuart Pittman went over the rules and introduced the participating trainers and horses in the Retired Racehorse Training Program (RRTP) and the Trainer Challenge.
Noticeably absent from Saturday's activities was High Level, the versatile chestnut chosen by trainer Tiffany Catledge. Steuart Pittman announced that High Level had developed a stone bruise. While he heals, Catledge will work with the alternate, Solidify, the tall dark bay gelding from MidAtlantic Horse Rescue.

In order to maintain an authentic training experience, none of the


Catledge and Solidify horses in the Challenge were allowed to be ridden once they retired from the track. With the exception of one brief under-saddle evaluation to check for physical issues, these horses had been turned out since their retirement.

At the Expo, Pittman explained, "I told [the trainers]
 they could sleep in the stalls with the horses if they wanted to, to bond with them, but they couldn't get on them. Tiffany asked, 'Can we just get on them once just to make sure it's OK?' and I said, 'No, I want this to be as real as possible.'"
And real it was. Eric Dierks Blackmer and Four X The Trouble was in the saddle on the dapple grey mare, Brazilian Wedding, before Pittman completed his introduction.

Bitted in a loose ring snaffle with no martingale and wearing brushing boots on her legs, the mare walked around the ring in both directions, with one ear on her rider and one ear on the crowd.

Tiffany Catledge let Solidify feel the weight of a rider by standing in the left stirrup and leaning on the saddle before she swung her right leg over his back. True to his Fonzie-esque attitude, the 6-year-old gelding was just as cool on Saturday as he was on Friday. Catledge settled lightly into the saddle and walked on. Solidify was fitted with a D-ring snaffle, brushing boots, training yoke (minus the martingale attachment), and a smart-looking bridle, generously donated by the folks at Five Star Tack.

Once Kerry Blackmer gently mounted up, Four X


Pittman (left), Dierks (center), Blackmer (right) The Trouble prowled the arena, neck still turned toward the crowd. He sported a baucher bit, polo wraps, and a simple breastplate. Blackmer allowed him to check out his surroundings while she maintained soft contact on the reins.

The riders asked their horses to trot, and the horses responded with sensitivity and intelligence. Brazilian Wedding was the first to relax into a soft, huntery trot. While she was understandably tense through the back and neck, her responsiveness and trust in her rider was impressive. With training and suppling exercises, her gaits will only get better.

Four X The Trouble seemed to improve with work. Once he was given a task, he looked less at the crowd and focused more on his rider. Solidify was tense at the


Dierks and Brazilian Wedding beginning of his trot work, but he lengthened his stride and relaxed his topline a bit after a short amount of time.
The arena was small, less than 60' x 120'. Pittman upped the ante when he asked the trainers to canter their horses. One by one, each horse cantered around the arena. The stereotype that an ex-racehorse is unable to pick up both leads was put to rest by all three of these versatile equine athletes, who each picked up left and right leads on the first attempt.

My favorite part of the session was seeing the grins of the riders and the crowd. With each challenge, the riders beamed at their game horses.

The skill and talent of these riders was inspiring. Each rider struck a delicate balance with hand and leg. Some of the horses were more comfortable with a little more rein contact and leg, and some were happier with less. Blackmer's balance in the saddle helped her with Four X The Trouble's canter. She sat in a half seat, heels flexed, and maintained contact with his mouth for guidance. Catledge used a little more leg on Solidify and let him have a little slack in the rein. Brazilian Wedding struck up a nice rhythm with her canter as Dierks grinned from ear to ear.

The session was a tremendous success for all the horses and trainers. The riders dismounted, gave their horses pats on the necks, and walked them in hand for a few minutes as the judges asked questions about their rides. Trainers, owners, judges, and spectators were all delighted, and I for one can't wait to see the progress these horses will have made in five weeks.
