### THIS IS HOW WE DO IT

Godolphin's **Do It All** (Distorted Humor) drew in from the also-eligibles and lived up to his name with a front-running victory in the G2 Zabeel Mile Thursday at Meydan. The 5-year-old was coming off a pair of unplaced efforts at the Carnival. "He is a big horse who had needed his two starts badly, and has improved fitness-wise throughout the year," said winning rider Silvestre de Sousa. "I was allowed to dictate my own terms, and then he quickened well." Do It All registered

a personal best when hitting the board in last year's GII San Fernando S. at Santa Anita, but has been largely ineffective since, apart from an optional claiming score on the Del Mar Polytrack Aug. 25. That effort did result in a new track record of 1:35.28 for a flat mile. Off the radar in a Jan. 20 handicap here on seasonal return, he finished

11th behind a quartet of reopposing rivals from the Feb. 16 G2 Al Fahidi Fort over the same mile strip last time. Do It All squeezed into this as a late replacement-courtesy of **Rock Jock (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire})'s late scratching--and seized the opportunity to post a career high in game style. Bounding from the gate to seize immediate control, the bay was stoked up turning for home and required stretch-long driving to stave off **Derbaas** (Seeking the Gold) and **Dux Scholar (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}).

Do It All's dam Stupendous Miss has had an interesting auction history. Originally a 50,000gns Tattersalls yearling, she won twice in France before heading to Wally Dollase in California. The bay captured the 2005 GIII All Along S. as a 4-year-old, an effort that enabled her to achieve \$1.3 million the following year at KEENOV while in foal to Distorted Humor. The resulting colt was Do It All, who in turn was secured by John Ferguson for \$900,000 at FTSAUG in 2008. Two years later, Stupendous Miss failed to get in foal and was snapped up by Ben Walden and the Jayaramans for \$85,000 at KEENOV. However, bred to Summer Bird and reoffered at Keeneland 12 months later, the mare was purchased by Sonia Rogers for \$400,000. Do It All's full-brother Tales of Grimm blossomed from being a \$60,000 yearling at KEESEP in 2010 to achieving 320,000gns at Tattersalls last April. Trained by Sir Michael Stoute for Sir Robert Ogden, he captured his lone appearance at Newbury in August. Stupendous Miss also has a 2-year-old Medaglia d'Oro filly named Solomona.



Fox Hunt, who annexed the Sept. 18 G3 Deutsches St Leger at Dortmund, was a hugely creditable seventh in a stellar renewal of the Nov. 1 G1 Melbourne Cup at Flemington in his 2011 season closer. He opened this campaign with a comfortable score in a course-anddistance handicap last time Feb. 3, and came back to register a second Group 3 success in yet another marathon. The chestnut was positioned fourth under a tight hold for most of the contest. Coaxed along on the home turn, he hit the front at the top of the straight and stayed on resolutely under a final-quarter drive to resist the persistent threat of Opinion Poll in brave fashion. "Race fitness has made the difference, I think, as Opinion Poll is a very good horse in his own right, but I had to choose Fox Hunt as he really impressed me the last time out," said winning rider Frankie Dettori. "He is only a 5-year-old, and can hopefully improve again."

### STREAKING 'GREEK' HEADS WEST

Ron the Greek (Full Mandate--Flambe', by Fortunate Prospect), a strong second to Mucho Macho Man

(Macho Uno) in the \$400,000 Florida Sunshine Millions Classic S. at Gulfstream Park most recently Jan. 28 (video), seeks to continue his upward progression since joining Bill Mott's barn in Saturday's loaded GI Santa Anita H.

The handsome bay failed to live up to the hype after delivering a visually impressive come-frombehind victory for trainer Tom Amoss during his 3-year-old season in the 2010 GIII Lecomte

S. at Fair Grounds (<u>video</u>), but has gotten back on track under new management.

Enter Adam Wachtel.

The asking price was understandably a bit steep when the 49-year-old inquired about Ron the Greek's availability as the road to Triple Crown trail began two seasons ago. However, following an eight-race losing streak--including a quartet of off-the-board finishes against graded company, and a pair of trainer changes to Tom Albertrani and Peter Walder--owner/breeder Jack T. Hammer was willing to renegotiate.

Along with his regular partner Nils Brous, Wachtel ironed out a deal to obtain a two-thirds interest after Ron the Greek placed a respectable third behind subsequent GI Donn H. hero Hymn Book (Arch) and GISW I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even) in Belmont's off-the-turf \$58,000 Three Coins Up S. last May. The duo also currently campaign the classy infielder AI Khali (Medaglia d'Oro), and were co-owners along with Barry K. Schwartz on the fleet sprinter Attila's Storm (Forest Wildcat).

"I'm a 'Sheet' person," Wachtel, a New York native, explained. "I look at Ragozin's figures--that's what I bought Ron the Greek off of. He ran a hell of a race behind Hymn Book and I Want Revenge last spring. It was his best Beyer at 99, but on Ragozin's Sheets, it was a 1 3/4. He ran that number again in the Sunshine Millions--to put that in perspective, that's the best number that any horse has run at 1 1/8 miles or further since the [GII] Pennsylvania Derby [last September]."

Ron the Greek has thrived in the a.m. since his big effort in the rich Florida-bred showcase, firing a pair of five-furlong bullets at Payson Park and an easy four-furlong move in :49 Feb. 27. He made the trip to the Golden State Wednesday.

"What conventional sheet people will worry about is how we react from that," said Wachtel, acknowledging the popular bounce theory. "Not the way he's been training. They fool you sometimes, but he couldn't be doing any better than right now. We're pretty excited for his chances to run out there."

Second to Convocation (Pulpit) in a \$75,000 optional claimer at Saratoga in his first attempt after switching hands, Ron the Greek has come into his own since receiving a little down time under his new Hall of Fame conditioner. Ron the Greek had his way with a small field in his return effort after heavily favored Rail Trip (Jump Start) tossed the jock at the start in Aqueduct's Sunny and Mild S. Nov. 17, then added an impressive front-running tally going 1 3/16 miles over the inner track in the Queens County S. Dec. 10 (video). A wide trip in the Sunshine Millions may be the reason why Ron the Greek isn't heading to the big one riding a three-race winning streak, Wachtel reports.

"I think the post position probably cost us a chance to win the race," he said of Ron the Greek's outside draw in post seven and the dreaded quick run to the clubhouse turn at Gulfstream. "If you look at the speed figures, we actually received a better rating than Mucho Macho Man, but we were wide, and he wasn't."

The Classic distance of the Big 'Cap appears to be right in Ron the Greek's wheelhouse if his 2 1/4-length win in the Queens County is any indication.

"I'm excited for it," Wachtel said of the added real estate. "You never know until they go that far, but I remember talking to Tom Amoss after Ron The Greek won the Lecomte. I was interested in him back then and he told me that they were getting lots of phone calls. Tom thought that Ron the Greek was the real deal and was a Derby kind of horse."

Wachtel caught the racing bug after frequently attending the races with his father as a youngster on the NYRA circuit. His old man, Edwin Wachtel, was a prominent owner/breeder in the Big Apple dating back to the 1970s, campaigning New York-bred standouts Claramount and his homebred son Stalwart Member, as well as 1997 GII Gotham S. hero Smokin Mel.

"My dad bought his first horse when I was probably about 11," said Wachtel, who owns approximately 60 horses, including a broodmare band in New York.

"I started going out to the track with my dad--Saratoga, Belmont, Aqueduct--all through my early teens."

Wachtel studied business and law and earned a pair of degrees from Emory University in Atlanta, but couldn't keep away from the racetrack for long upon his graduation in 1988.

"My dad got more involved in horseracing when I was in college," Wachtel explained. "He sold his company and decided to spend more time with the horses, and began breeding in New York."

He continued, "I was working with my dad on some other things and I started getting more active in the horses, buying little pieces of the ones that my dad was in on, then I started to really spend a lot of time with it. I'm a passive investor in a variety of things, but this is what I spend most of my time doing on a daily basis now."

Through all of Wachtel's success at the racetrack along with his father, and now on his own, there is still one thing that eludes him.

"I'm in my home office right now and I'm surrounded by winner's circle pictures with all kinds of graded stakes races, but I've never won a Grade I," Wachtel said from his Westchester residence earlier this week. "I've been within a length, or on the board 20 times in Grade I's--Stalwart Member got beaten a neck by Langfuhr in the 1997 Carter--and for whatever reason, with all the good horses that we've had, we've just never been able to get that Grade I. It's been so frustrating."

If Ron the Greek continues to move forward the way he has this winter, Wachtel may be shopping for a new picture frame later this weekend.

He hasn't yet pulled him off the Derby trail, but admitted that he didn't run like a Derby horse last weekend." Said Pletcher, "He didn't look like himself Sunday and I don't know why," Pletcher said, "I am puzzled,"



to go long," said trainer Bernie Flint, who entered and put the son of Exchange Rate on a van to Hot Springs Thursday morning for Saturday's \$60,000 Gazebo S. at Oaklawn, "We took our shot, but if you look at him, he definitely looks like a sprinter." The grey colt defeated recent GSW Daddy Nose Best

(Scat Daddy) to break his maiden at second asking at Churchill Downs, then added that track's GIII Bashford Manor S. July 2. He returned from a 5 1/2-month hiatus to score a nose victory in the Dec. 17 Super Bowl S. at the Fair Grounds, but never factored in the Risen Star, finishing better than 15 lengths behind the victorious El Padrino (Pulpit).

NJSEA, HORSEMEN SIGN OFF ON LEASE New Jersey horsemen are one giant step closer to operating Monmouth Park in Oceanport, New Jersey, after the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority signed off on an agreement with the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. The NJSEA owned and operated the Jersey Shore oval through 2011, at which time the facility was leased to businessman and horseman Morris Bailey. However, that deal fell through in late 2011, and there was some question as to whether the track would conduct live racing in 2011. In a release from the NJSEA, the NJTHA will operate a 5year lease initially after which time it reserves the right to renew up to three additional 10-year terms. A fourth 10-year term may be agreed to by both parties. The Horsemen's Association will be granted the right to operate an existing OTB facility in the town of Woodbridge, north of Monmouth Park, and has the right to construct an additional four OTBs. It must contractually break ground on one new facility within 12 months and another within 24 months of the commencement of the ground lease. ### NYRA ANNOUNCES JUVENILE BONUS

The New York Racing Association will offer a \$100,000 bonus to any 2-year-old maiden winner at the upcoming Belmont Park spring meeting who goes on to win a graded stakes at Saratoga, Belmont or Aqueduct in 2012. Offered only once to each eligible horse, the bonus will be written into the conditions of

all of NYRA's graded juvenile races so as to count as part of the horse's official graded earnings.

"The graded stakes bonus that NYRA is offering, along with the enhanced purse structure, underlines that New York is the place for horsemen to run their 2-year-olds," said trainer Rick Violette, president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. "The fact that the \$100,000 bonus is written into the condition of the graded races

is a real enticement for horsemen, as those earnings are very important for getting into races like the Kentucky Derby."

The Belmont spring meeting runs from Apr. 27 through July 15 and will offer open maiden special weight races with purses from \$70,000 to \$75,000 and state-bred maiden special weights with purses of \$55,000 to \$60,000.






Editor's note: We have had a lot of feedback from Bill Oppenheim's Column from the Feb. 29 TDN, Swing And A Miss (click <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a> to download it) regarding the TOBA's decision to delay the ban on raceday medication in two-year-old graded stakes. TOBA's response follows.

Dr. J. David Richardson is the chairman of the American Graded Stakes Committee and Secretary of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association. Dr. Richardson is a thoracic, vascular and general surgeon in Louisville, Ky. and he has owned and bred Thoroughbred horses continuously since 1975.

"To reach a port we must sail, sometimes with the wind and sometimes against it. But we must not drift or lie at anchor." --Oliver Wendell Holmes

On behalf of the American Graded Stakes Committee (AGSC) and the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA), I feel compelled to address the criticism levied at our decision to delay the implementation of a ban on race-day medication in 2-year-old graded stakes races.

The Committee is comprised of some of the world's leading owners and breeders, as well as the most respected racing officials in the United States. The AGSC was founded by TOBA in 1973, primarily at the request of European authorities anxious that North America have a method similar to their Pattern race system that was implemented the previous year. Now in its 39th year, the primary purpose of the AGSC remains the same: to provide owners and breeders of Thoroughbred horses a reliable guide to the relative quality of Thoroughbred bloodstock by identifying those U.S. races whose recent renewals have consistently attracted the highest quality competition. Graded Stakes earnings also contribute to important considerations, such as qualification for the Triple Crown races. The authority of the AGSC is recognized by the Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers, which includes Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton, OBS, Barretts, Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society and their international counterparts. Black type, listed and Graded Stakes races originated through the sales catalog process and its integrity and value has been reflected through both the breeding and racing industry. Hundreds of millions of dollars of bloodstock are traded every year, in reliance on black type and cataloging standards, and it has been the responsibility of TOBA for nearly four decades to uphold the integrity of the system.



The American grading system has been universally received not only by owners and breeders here in the United States, but also worldwide by international racing authorities and buyers of bloodstock when they purchase at U.S. sales, as well as those abroad.

When the AGSC announced last August its plans to implement a ban on race-day medication for two-year-old Graded Stakes races in 2012, we recognized that the opposition would be fierce. The local horsemen's groups have been vocal critics of the proposed ban. It is also noteworthy that these horsemen's groups are, for the most part, led by trainers who are fearful of change to a way of life they have become accustomed to for the last 30 years. The AGSC fully recognizes and appreciates the fact that the rest of the world conducts its racing medication-free and that the United States and Canada are outliers. To suggest that racing in the rest of the world is "inhumane" because they don't race on Salix is both insulting and disingenuous. The sport of Thoroughbred racing is struggling here in the U.S. for a number of reasons and some will point out that our liberal medication policy is part of the problem. While other countries in Europe, Australasia and South America are not immune to struggles, it can be argued that the sport is healthier worldwide than in the U.S.

The AGSC made its decision in good faith, to improve competition in the sport, with the intentions of working closely with racetracks, horsemen's groups and regulators to implement the policy. But the question everyone is asking is, "Why did the AGSC postpone its decision for implementation in 2012?"

First of all, despite our efforts and even with the support from many racetracks and from some individual members of the commissions, none of the state regulators from the primary hosts of two-year-old Graded Stakes races, that being California, Kentucky and New York, had formally introduced a rule that would allow implementation of the policy before their full commissions or subcommittees. The time from the introduction of a proposed regulation to adoption can be six months or longer. With the first two-year-old Graded Stakes race in June, there was simply not enough time, even if we had the full support of the regulators.

That left the AGSC in the position of stripping the grades from 45 2-year-old Graded Stakes races in the U.S. and the implications of such action would have been disastrous. Moving forward, the AGSC plans to synchronize its efforts with regulators and racetracks in the major racing states because of the perpetual fear that one state will have a competitive advantage over other states due to permissive medication policies.



The AGSC is determined to educate the Thoroughbred racing industry on the benefits of clean competition on race-day, and work with others in the industry to implement positive change. The AGSC believes 2-year-old graded stakes races run without race-day medication would be a positive change. Two-year-old graded stakes races comprise a tiny fraction of U.S. racing and in our minds, represent a logical starting point to address the race-day medication debate. We encourage all like-minded owners and industry participants to join us in challenging the state regulators to support a ban of race-day medication in two-year-old Graded Stakes races. We will continue our efforts to implement the policy in order to elevate the standards for Graded Stakes races.

Patience and persistence will be necessary, as at times, progress may appear to be slow, but be assured; we will not rest, not only for the betterment of the sport, but for the good of the horse.

Finally, in response to the comments made by Mr. Oppenheim, I find it ironic that the one of the few groups that decided to do something proactive is now referred to as "gutless" when we chose to be prudent rather than continue to push far ahead of the implementation process. From our initial communication in August, the AGSC has always reiterated the necessity of working with regulatory bodies and racetracks, and as noted above, we will continue to do so.

As chairman, I would be delighted to speak with Mr. Oppenheim in a personal meeting to inform him of the many positive steps members of our committee have taken in an attempt to move this policy forward.







### **Turfway Cutting Overnight Purses:**

Effective Mar. 3, Turfway Park will reduce its overnight purses by 25%. The track's minimum purse will drop from \$6,000 to \$4,500. The minimum maiden special weight purse will drop from \$22,000 to \$19,600, while that for entry-level allowances will drop from \$24,000 to \$21,400. Supplements from the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund are unchanged. "We have actually paid out almost 12% more in purses so far this year compared to 2011," explained Turfway Park President and CEO Robert N. Elliston. "However, most of the overpayment resulted from not having to cancel any race cards this winter, a contingency we take into account, but cannot predict, as the current mild winter proves. Compounding the problem is that wagering both on track and at other outlets is down 6% from where we expected it to be." Elliston added, "Quite frankly, this unfortunate cut in purses for the remainder of this meet won't resolve our overpayment entirely, and further reductions are likely as we move into September and December." Turfway's current meet will run through Apr. 1.

### CAPE SALE GETS UNDERWAY ON FRIDAY

Cape Thoroughbred Sales (CTS) is set to conduct its Cape Premier Yearling Sale--Book Two at Kenilworth Racecourse with two sessions today and Sunday. This auction will take the place of the former Vintage Yearling Sale, which was the Cape's regional sale held by the now defunct Equimark company. It is dominated largely by Western Cape breeders, who have sent a number of high-quality yearlings to the sale. A book of 405 yearlings was originally catalogued, but there have since been 18 withdrawals. The quality remains high, with yearlings on offer by such leading South African sires as Jet Master (SAf), Dynasty (SAf), Captain AI (SAf), Var, Trippi, Western Winter and Silvano (Ger). Additionally, there are first-crop local yearlings by champions such as Jay Peg (SAf) (Camden Park), Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood), Argonaut (SAf) (Western Winter) and Rebel King (SAf) (National Emblem). ### **RUNNING FOR CHARITY**

Beginning Easter Monday Apr. 9, Lance O'Sullivan will lead a group of four in an attempt to run around all 51 Thoroughbred racecourses in New Zealand over the course of six days. The run will raise funds for The CatWalk Spinal Cord Injury Trust (catwalk.org.nz), and will conclude at Ellerslie Apr. 14. O'Sullivan, a Patron of the CatWalk Trust, will be joined by three New Zealand racing administrators who came up with the idea: Simon Cooper, who works for NZ Thoroughbred Racing; Andre Klein from the Otago Racing Club and NZ Jumps Inc; and Jason Fleming from Hawkes Bay Racing. "We recognise the potential dangers our jockeys and track riders face every day and, with the support of all the Race Clubs around the country and a number of generous sponsors, we are keen to put back into the industry we are all passionate about," said O'Sullivan. "In doing this, we want to make sure we get at least a dollar off everyone we meet on the way, by any means possible, and get people to donate [online]." He added, "To our knowledge only the late, great Jack Glengarry has run round all the courses in New Zealand, but he did it in stages--not in six days.
