TACKLING HISTORY

For those who place major stock in statistics, Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) has to defy the trends as he bids to complete the elusive G1 2000 Guineas-Epsom Derby double today. Since 1989, Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Nashwan

(Blushing Groom {Fr}) succeeded in carrying mile Classic speed over this distance, while those to have failed read like a list of racing's who's-who since Nijinsky's great triumph for Ballydoyle in 1970. They include Wollow (Ire), El Gran Senor, Dancing Brave, Rodrigo de Triano, Pennekamp, Entrepreneur (GB), King of Kings (Ire),

Golan (Ire) and Refuse to Bend (Ire), most of whom had excellent credentials going to Epsom, only to come up short. Humbling stuff for the Smiths, the Magniers and Tabors, but it is worth pointing out that only one was trained by Aidan O'Brien, and the horse in question--King of Kings--returned lame when last in the 1998 edition and never raced again. O'Brien has tried to keep his counsel on Camelot and keep the hype to a minimum, but what has escaped in the public sphere so far suggests those closely connected believe this is a colt who steps proudly in the shadows of this race's greats. That may explain why today's likely starting price will be around the 4-6 mark. Despite the manner of his flashy success in Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy in October and his tough display in the May 5 Newmarket Classic, the Triple Crown aspirant is not as far clear of his peers as his odds indicate. Even stable companion Astrology (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who has eight pounds to find on the favorite on official ratings, is a threat if able to build on his impressive 11-length success in the G3 Dee S. over an extended 10-furlong trip on deep ground at Chester May 11. "We are under no illusions with the Derby," Aidan O'Brien said. "We had two very special horses in High Chaparral and Galileo, and have not won it since. The race is a very difficult test of a horse. There cannot be any chink in their armor and everything has to go right

on the day. With Camelot, I suppose it was always one race at a time, and we really hope if we put him to different tests he is able to pass them. He always has been a very special horse from the time he was born and we are very lucky to have him. For the future of the breed, they have to sit the exams and do the big

tests. Everyone said a Montjeu had never won a Guineas and it was a big ask for him with history being very hard to change, but we are very lucky that he sat and passed that exam. History and stats aren't here for no reason and that what makes him very unique--that he went in there and performed."



"He did his last piece of proper work on Saturday, but he's never been flamboyant and doesn't do a whole lot at home," Lanigan said. "We had wanted to go to Chester for the Dee S., but the ground was too soft there and he did everything we were hoping he would do at Lingfield. I know some people would say running on the Polytrack was an unconventional route, but the trials were run on heavier ground than usual and I think all horses run their races on Polytrack. We always thought he'd stay a mile and a half on his home work, and he's strengthened up an awful lot since his 2-year-old career. We've always thought a bit of him, so we'll see now." Cont. p4





Main Sequence will be the first to carry the famed silks to post in this race since Hector Protector was fourth in 1991.

"We have had plenty in training in England over the

years and it's a question of having the right horse," the Niarchos Family's Racing Manager Alan Cooper told PA Sport. "It's not where it's trained, but whether they have the profile to participate in the race. He's a homebred on both sides and he can be traced back to Northern Trick, who won the Prix Diane in 1984 and has been a great blue hen mare. The family have supported David from the moment he left Henry Cecil. He was assistant to Henry when Light Shift won the Oaks and we've been with him from the very start."

Main Sequence will have to end a 14-year wait for a winner of the Lingfield prep to follow up here, with High-Rise (Ire) (High Estate {Ire}) being the last to do so.

Winners of another notable trial, the G3 Chester Vase, have also not excelled here in recent times. Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) did go very close to pulling off the double 12 months ago, and at least stamina is not a question mark after a contender has lasted out the extended 12-furlong trip of that race formerly won by Shergar (Ire).

This year, it was staged on testing ground and Mickdaam (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) proved he had the staying power to beat a smart colt in Model Pupil (GB) (Sinndar {Ire}), with Minimise Risk (GB) (Galileo {Ire})

left trailing in last of the five runners. Previously campaigned in Dubai, Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's Mar. 10 Listed Al Bastakiya scorer and Mar. 31 G2 UAE Derby fourth is attempting to become the first Derby winner to have raced at the Carnival.

"He had a little setback, an infection in his hock, but he's cantered for 11 days now and he's fine," trainer Richard Fahey, who is saddling his first runner in the "Blue Riband," told sportinglife.com. "He's hardly missed anything, so it's been a pretty straightforward preparation and he's grand,

we're happy with him. He's 33-1 and he's got to step up on what he's done, but he'll get the trip and he tries, which always gives you a chance. They will be very different ground conditions at Epsom on Saturday to those that he encountered at a rain-sodden Chester, but I think he'll love it. He's such a good-moving horse, I think it will suit him well."

While her yearling price tag put her on the front page, there had been no fireworks on the track prior to yesterday, and Was arrived here under the radar with just two racecourse starts behind her. Having won on debut over a mile at The Curragh in early August--

where the fourth filly home was Coral Wave (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) who later added substance to the form when taking the G3 C.L. Weld Park S.-she did not reappear until the G3 Blue Wind S. at Naas May 16. Only 2 3/4-lengths third in that 10-furlong prep,

Was had some improvement to find here, but drew on plenty of hidden reserves to prevail under Seamus Heffernan.

Leading from the gates, she was soon positioned in a close-up third as Nayarra (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) was keen under restraint in front. Traveling with ease down the hill to Tattenham Corner, the bay nipped up the fence by the long-time leader as Vow (GB) (Motivator {GB}) was committed out wide. In front passing the quarter pole, she was needing the line as Darryll Holland produced a withering effort from Shirocco Star, and it came in time to continue her stable's quest for a clean sweep of British Classics in 2012. "She has a very good pedigree and was unexposed coming into the race," Heffernan commented. "She had a little setback and came out of Naas pretty well. I had plenty of petrol to take the gap when I needed to and she's decent."

Aidan O'Brien added, "She is progressing all the time and is a filly to look forward to. She could go for the G1 Irish Oaks [at The Curragh July 22], but the lads will speak about that. Maybe (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}'s run maybe petered out a little bit at the end, so she could maybe drop back a bit in trip, and for those coming from the back it was a little bit messy. We were worried about the trip for her and at the end she was going backwards."

He continued, "She has always worked like a miler with loads of speed and she might even go back to that trip for the G1 Coronation S. [at Royal Ascot June 22]." Of the withdrawn Kissed (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), O'Brien offered, "She is a filly who hits the ground a bit and with five other fillies in, we didn't want to risk her. We declared her at the time there was rain forecast and it didn't come. I think she has a lot of possibilities, such as the G1 Prix de Diane [at Chantilly June 17] and Irish Oaks."

Shirocco Star's rider Darryll Holland said, "I don't think she was unlucky--the way the race was run, it was a bit tactical. The winner had the rail and kept outbattling me towards the end. I was pressing the button at the furlong marker, but the other horse just pulled out a bit more. I needed a better gallop and I had to be handier than I wanted to be at an earlier stage." Fortune Does Not Favor The Fugue...

The Fugue could be considered an unlucky loser, as she was interfered with early on as she had been in the 1000 Guineas and lost vital ground before staying on to finish at the fore. Trainer John Gosden told *Racing Post*, "I've never been a sore loser, but it was a messy race--an unnecessarily messy race. She was knocked back and there was no pace, so I don't know how she got as close as she did in the circumstances. She's a very brave filly."

Vow's trainer William Haggas was looking ahead to the Irish Derby with the fourth, who traveled like the winner entering the straight and had no excuses. "I thought she ran a very good race, but was not good enough on the day," he said. "Johnny [Murtagh] gave her every chance, but she didn't pick up and she ran very solid for the third race of her life. She'll be better for it and Johnny felt she didn't really like the track and that The Curragh will suit her better, so we'll go there."

Was's granddam Park Express (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}) captured the G1 Irish Champion S. as a 3-year-old in 1986. She achieved some success early in her career as a broodmare for Lodge Park Stud by producing Shinko

Forest (Ire) (Green Desert), who earned over \$2.7 million while racing in Japan; and Dazzling Park (Ire) (Warning {GB}), a Group 3-winning filly that ran second in the G1 Irish Champion S. and third in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas in 1999. But Park Express saved the best for last with her handsome chestnut Galileo (Ire) colt foaled in 2005. A €430,000 Goffs Orby yearling

purchase by Jim Bolger, New Approach (Ire) became a champion 2-year-old and, campaigned by HRH Princess Haya at three, added victories in the G1 Epsom Derby, G1 Champion S. and G1 Irish Champion S. in 2008. With such high-quality black-type so prominent on her page, Was seemed certain to attract plenty of attention when offered at Tattersalls October as a yearling, and duly was the most expensive European yearling of 2010 at 1.2-million guineas. According to Tattersalls, her yearling full-sister is expected to be part of the Lodge Park consignment later this year.

top gear. "Sir Mark [Prescott] pointed out the instructions and it was straightforward," commented jockey Luke Morris, who like all who ride for the trainer had received a written letter from the master of Heath House outlining his expectations beforehand. "She is a tough and classy filly and I got the perfect sit all the way round. When I loosed her at the two, she picked up well and stayed on all the way to the line." After beating subsequent G2 Prix Hocquart scorer Top Trip (GB) (Dubai Destination) in the Listed Prix Francois Mathet over this trip at Saint-Cloud Apr. 1, Kesampour returned there to inch out the re-opposing Albion (GB) (With Approval) in the 10-furlong G2 Prix Greffulhe May 5. The Apr. 8 G3 Prix la Force hero Saonois (Fr) (Chichicastenango {Fr})

was a 1/2-length away in fourth. "He won well enough last time and I think, on top of that, better ground will help on Sunday," Delzangles told Racing Post. Alongside Kirsten Rausing's progressive Albion, who will have to emulate recent winners Blue Canari (Fr) (Acatenango {Ger}), Shamardal and his son Lope de Vega (Ire) in defying a double-figure stall, Andre Fabre also saddles a runner in the Godolphin France livery in Saint Baudolino (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}). Unlike his stable companion, he has been handed a major advantage exiting from stall three and he looked a colt on the rise when upsetting the Wertheimers' Sofast (Fr) (Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)) despite suffering a troubled passage through in the G3 Prix de Guiche over nine furlongs here last time May 11. Lawman (Fr) took that race en route to glory here five years ago and Fabre's stable jockey Maxime Guyon is on his back. Frankie Dettori, who has steered four colts to success in this Classic, is hardly a negative for Albion, who has to overcome a troublesome draw in 17. He beat Lunayir in a 10-furlong conditions event on soft ground at Longchamp Apr. 19 prior to his narrow Greffulhe defeat, where he looked as if he needed a sterner stamina test.

G1 Coronation Cup. He is back again today, having added a GI Breeders' Cup Turf to his resume in the interim, and is the one to beat, despite two defeats this year when given too much to do off a slow pace in the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and on testing ground in the G3 Mooresbridge S. at The Curragh last time May 7. Among his opponents is

Bjorn Nielsen's 2011 G1 St Leger hero Masked Marvel (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who needs to get back on track after two subsequent unplaced efforts when out of his depth in the Arc and on his return in the G2 Jockey Club S. over this trip at Newmarket May 5. "He's in top order," trainer John Gosden said. "We were a bit silly going for the Arc and his run the other day was just an outing on ground he didn't like. It is about the ground with him and he likes it to be good, good-to-firm. He has such a long stride and when the ground moves under him, he doesn't like it." Brian Haggas's homebred 4-year-old Beaten Up (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) was sixth in the Sheema Classic at Meydan, but that was only his fourth career start and his first major overseas foray, so he deserves another chance. He looked one of the most exciting prospects among the late-maturing 3-year-olds when beating the subsequent impressive Jockey Club S. winner Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) by 4 1/2 lengths in the G3 St Simon S. at Newbury in October, and trainer William Haggas is keeping the faith. "He's a lovely horse and very keen to please all the time in his work," Haggas said. "He's a very genuine, solid horse and I've got nothing to work him with at home. I took him to Epsom the other day [for the 'Breakfast With the Stars' morning] and he moved very well there and had a nice stretch. He's in good form and, while the only time he's run in a Group 1 race he was disappointing, we think he is that class--it was a big step up running him in Dubai, and in hindsight I regret it."

today's one-mile GII Nassau S. in Toronto, and it should be fun watching a field of seven provide some answers. Highweighted at 122 pounds-she gives Inglorious four pounds and Roxy Gap six--is the 9-5 morning-line choice Marketing Mix. The Glen Hill Farm colorbearer is one-for-one on the grass at Woodbine, having captured the third leg of Canada's Triple Tiara series--the

Wonder Where S.--in her turf debut last July. She spent the remainder of the year on grass and added wins in the GIII Pucker Up S. at Arlington in September and the GII Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill in November, with a runner-up performance in the GI Queen Elizabeth II S. at Keeneland in between those starts. Marketing Mix kicked off her season with a win in a one-mile Keeneland allowance Apr. 11, but tired to fifth as the choice in the GII Distaff Mile S. on the Derby undercard at Churchill May 5. Eugene Melnyk's homebred Roxy Gap has been very good in her last two sprinting on the main track. A stakes winner at both two and three at Woodbine, the 4-year-old collected her first graded win in the six-furlong GIII Whimsical S. Apr. 22, then quickly doubled up in the 6 1/2-furlong GII Hendrie S. May 19. While both of those were on the main track, Roxy Gap won an allowance race on the turf here as a juvenile and should be fine making the switch over. Inglorious was Canada's sweetheart after she pulled off the Woodbine Oaks/Queen's Plate double last year. But she was badly beaten in the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga in August and could do no better than third when returned to Woodbine in the GIII Selene S. Sept. 25. Off since, she ran second to Marketing Mix in that Keeneland allowance Apr. 11 under jockey Luis Contreras. "Her first race of this year was very strong," offered Contreras. "She's a very determined filly and you know she will fight right to the end. I'm looking forward to this race."

'NICOLE' & 'PAL' WHEEL BACK IN VAGRANCY

Gem Inc.'s Grade II winner Nicole H (Mr. Greeley) has been such a stalwart in New York the past few years that it seems improbable that she's made just one start at Belmont. But it's true, and now the five-time blacktype winner at Aqueduct will try to remain perfect on Big Sandy in today's 6 1/2-furlong GII Vagrancy H. A 10 3/4-length allowance winner in her lone Belmont try back in September of 2010, Nicole H ran fourth to It's Tricky (Mineshaft) when attempting to defend her title in Aqueduct's GII Distaff H. Apr. 14. She comes into the Vagrancy off a close-up fourth, beaten 3/4 lengths, in the \$150,000 My Juliet S. at Parx May 26, and trainer Mike Hushion said he's confident wheeling her back off a week's rest. "She ran a really good race over there," Hushion said. "I thought there would be a possibility--since she had had a nice rest before the race--that she could run back quickly. When I saw her the next day, and the day after that, with the way she came out of the race, I thought it was the thing to do." Also coming out of the My Juliet is runner-up C C's Pal (Alex's Pal), who is coupled with her Rick Dutrow Jr.trained stablemate Smart Stride (Smart Strike). It will be the fourth straight time C C's Pal and Nicole H have lined up against each other. C C's Pal was third by a neck in the GII Barbara Fritchie H. at Laurel in February (Nicole H was a nose ahead of her in second), and she ran a non-threatening second in the Distaff. Dutrow has reportedly entered Smart Stride as a rabbit to help set things up for C C's Pal, a pressing type, but an excessively fast pace might ultimately benefit She's Cheeky (Black Minnaloushe). The Peter Eurton-trained mare closed to be second behind the streaking Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band) in the GI Madison S. at Keeneland Apr. 12.

recently posting a 1:24 flat work going seven panels at Santa Anita May 27. In his lone start over Hollywood's synthetic, he was beaten a nose by stablemate First Dude (Stephen Got Even) in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last July. Amazingly, trainer Bob Baffert, who also sends out recent GII Mervyn Leroy H. runner-up Prayer For Relief (Jump Start), has never won this race. Morning Line (Tiznow) looked like he was going to be a force in the handicap division last year after concluding his 2010 season in brilliant style, but after registering a career-best in the GI Carter H. in April of '11, the wheels came off. Switched from Nick Zito to trainer John Shirreffs, Morning Line was making his first start in the Mervyn Leroy May 5 since finishing up the track in the GI Whitney H. last August, and made every step a winning one. A victory here could put him right back into the thick of the handicap division.

George Strawbridge's O "TDN Rising Star" O Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) gets her 4-year-old campaign underway in today's G3 Prix du Palais-Royal at Longchamp, in which she was runner-up to Sahpresa (Sahm) 12 months ago. Subsequently successful over this track and trip in the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot in July and G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest over 6 1/2 furlongs at Deauville in August, she was fifth after a troubled trip in Ascot's G2 British Champions Sprint S. over six furlong when last seen in October. Among her opponents is Teruya Yoshida's Nova Hawk (GB) (Hawk Wing), who was fourth in the G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches last May before running second to Immortal Verse (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) in the G1 Coronation S. at Ascot in June. Her form tailed off afterwards, and a return fourth in the Listed Prix de Montretout over a mile here May 3 did not inspire confidence that she can win a race of this nature. Of the 3-year-olds, Guy Pariente's homebred Kendam (Fr) (Kendargent (Fr)) may be able to exploit a potential weight-for-age advantage if she can reproduce her win in the G3 Prix Eclipse over six furlongs at Maisons-Laffitte in October, having failed to stay the mile when down the field in this circuit's May 13 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches.

I'll Have Another Continues to Please O'Neill...

Reddam Racing's I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) continues to please his connections as he galloped and jogged over the spacious Belmont main track Friday morning. The striking chestnut colt came onto the track around 8:30 in the newly created time slot reserved exclusively for Belmont S. contenders. "He went great,"

said trainer Doug O'Neill of the Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner, who is bidding to become racing's 12th Triple Crown winner and first in 34 years. "I'll Have Another ate up everything last night, his legs are looking great and he's got great energy. I loved the way he trained out there. He's maintained his beautiful stride." I'll Have Another's gallop came one day after a near-freakish accident where a horse got loose and streaked by between the dual Classic winner and the outside rail nearing the

clubhouse turn. O'Neill was thrilled by the decision from the New York Racing Association to create the restricted time slot. "Awesome," he said. "That was so cool. We got a chance to see a couple of the other Belmont hopefuls as well. They looked great out there. It was a great experience and I really appreciate Mr. [P.J.] Campo and the rest of The New York Racing [Association] people for letting us have 15 minutes of safe environment." All Belmont starters are required to be on the grounds and stabled in the stakes barn by Wednesday morning, however O'Neill was looking to move I'll Have Another and his stable pony Lava Man as early as Monday, pending permission from the stewards. "They're letting us have Lava Man there, which is great," said O'Neill. "The [horses] are used to being with their buddies. To be in a barn all by yourself ... even though he could handle it, but to have Lava Man in there, that will be cool. That's his little buddy." Busy Weekend Ahead...

An uncertain weather forecast will affect some, but not all of the horses who will train this morning at Big Sandy. Donegal Racing's GI Kentucky Derby third-place finisher Dullahan (Even the Score) will almost certainly breeze this morning at 8:30 regardless of the weather. Javier Castellano, who takes over from Kent Desormeaux, will be in the irons for the first time. The connections of Street Life, Atigun (Istan) and Unstoppable U (Exchange Rate) are all tentatively scheduled to breeze around 8:30 depending on the track conditions. Trainer Chad Brown indicated that Street Life would go out at 8:45, as he trains better when there is activity on the track. Unstoppable U and Atigun, both trained by Ken McPeek, are set to breeze separately, but their workouts could be pushed back to Sunday if there is moisture in the track. Trainer Michael Matz said that Union Rags (Dixie Union) would work Saturday or Sunday at Fair Hill, with the latter the more likely option. John Velazquez will journey to the Maryland facility for the workout.

A 'Live' Longshot...

Deep closers always get some extra looks in the GI Belmont S. Pundits and handicappers tend to assume that the more time a horse has to make up ground, the

better. It's not always the case--like most races, pace dynamics factor heavily--but if a one-run type is going to play spoiler to I'll Have Another this year, it just might be the enigmatic

"TDN Rising Star"
Street Life (Street Sense).

The Chad Brown trainee overcame major greenness to break his maiden from out of the clouds on the stretch-out

at Aqueduct Feb. 15 (<u>video</u>), and took the Big A's Broad Brush S. Mar. 17 (<u>video</u>), again winning despite himself and with no pace set-up to speak of.

Street Life didn't fare as well in the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 17 when he dropped as many as 14 lengths back off the early leaders before coming on to be sixth. Brown added blinkers for Belmont's GII Peter Pan S. May 12, and while Street Life was again off the screen in the opening stanzas, he flew home late to be third.

"This horse is a little sharper since I put the blinkers on," asserted Brown. "He's definitely a horse who comes from off the pace. However, in his first start with blinkers, he had a blistering pace in front of him, so I don't think it really showed how much sharper the blinkers made him since the pace was so fast. I think with an easier pace and the blinkers you're going to see the horse lay a lot closer than he has been. I'm not going to force him, but I think he'll do it naturally."

Street Life has been somewhat of his own worst enemy so far. He has shown flashes of brilliance, but clearly still has some growing up to do. Brown, who plans to give the colt one last work either today or tomorrow before the June 9 "Test of the Champion," sees the light starting to coming on.

"In those early races he switched onto his wrong lead late in the stretch. He got the job done, but he wasn't fully focused," Brown recalled. "I thought in the Peter Pan he switched leads beautifully at the quarter pole--we went back to using [jockey] Jose Lezcano on the horse, which I think was beneficial. And I thought it was his most professional effort from beginning to end."

It'll certainly be no easy task to upend the Derby and Preakness winner, but the Belmont has a history of producing wacky results, and Street Life could be the longshot peaking at the right time.

"I've been impressed with the I'll Have Another's races--as has everybody--and if anyone's going to beat the horse in the Belmont they're definitely going to have to run their 'A' race. There's no question that the horse is for real," said Brown, who will be saddling his first runner in a Triple Crown race. "Street Life certainly needs to move forward to win the Belmont, but from what I've seen in his training, I wouldn't be surprised if he took another big step in the right direction."

Q AND A WITH THE BREEDERS' CUP CANDIDATES

On May 24, Breeders' Cup Ltd. announced the 22



candidates who will stand for election to the Breeders' Cup Board of Members and Trustees. There are 16 openings on the Board and each term is four years. Voting begins June 4. The bios of the 22 candidates are available in documents circulated to the voters--

Lucy Young-Hamilton

I have been involved in Thoroughbred racing as a breeder and owner for 35 years --most of my life. Having served on the Breeders' Cup Board as a Trustee and as a Member since 1997, I am familiar with the organization and its challenges.

Breeders' Cup races, have given me perspective of the sport. Years before my late husband won his three Breeders' Cup races, he demonstrated his belief in the future of international racing by running horses in the old Washington, D. C. International at Laurel. Truly, the Breeders' Cup has been a boon to international racing, but the reality of being a pioneer is that others follow. In today's international landscape, competition

has increased from Hong Kong and Japan, as well as Europe, so leadership, imagination, and innovation are required if the Breeders' Cup is to preserve and enhance its standing.

I lived in Europe for more than two decades, so I understand how the international racing community accepted and supported the Breeders' Cup. I understand the opportunities which exist to continue growing the Breeders' Cup worldwide. I believe personal experience gives me insight into nuances of how the international perspective might differ from ours at home--and how these differences might be bridged.

Like many others on the board, I have also attempted to serve the industry through participation in other organizations. I have been on the board of Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation for 15 years. I have also been a board member of the New York Racing Association, TOBA, National Museum of Racing, and the University of Kentucky's Gluck center. I also am a member of The Jockey Club. I was on the NTRA Horse PAC for six years. Outside of racing, I have served on the boards of the Fine Arts Museum of San Francisco and the American Friends of the Paris Opera and Ballet. These experiences have allowed me to understand how boards work most effectively.

The continued success of Breeders' Cup is critical to the Thoroughbred industry. I would be honored to continue serving as a Breeders' Cup Board Member.

Michael J. McMahon, McMahon & Hill Bloodstock

I have worked in the Thoroughbred industry my entire life. I was raised at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds and worked both the family farm and the backside at the Saratoga Race Course as a



teenager. My business degree from Cornell University served me well during my tenure at EQUIX Biomechanics and over the last 11 years running my own bloodstock agency, McMahon and Hill Bloodstock LLC. My wife Natanya Nieman DVM is the resident veterinarian at Winstar Farm, and we also operate Spruce Lane Farm in

Versailles, KY. We own all or part of 50 horses, including 14 broodmares and 16 race horses. McMahon and Hill Bloodstock (Jamie Hill became a partner in 2011) manages seven pinhooking or racing partnerships. I currently serve on the board of TOBA and in the past I have served on the board of several industry organizations, including the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. as president, and the Belmont Child Care Association, Inc. as vice president.

Improving the public perception of racing is my highest priority. Public perception drives media and we live in a media-saturated culture. We cannot hope to grow racing's fan base, let alone gross annual handle, when public perception is declining.

As we strive to improve the public perception of racing, the Breeders' Cup stands poised to deliver real heroes on the track, while providing much needed leadership to the industry. In 2012, the Breeders' Cup is raising the standards of racing by eliminating all raceday medication in the Juvenile Colts and Fillies races. Setting higher standards influences the public perception of racing positively and influences state racing commissions to raise the bar in their own states.

Trainer Doug O'Neill will send out I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) to a shot at Triple Crown glory in next Saturday's GI Belmont S. over the track they call Big Sandy, but the California-based conditioners will test the waters himself first. O'Neill and several members of his trainer team will compete in tomorrow's inaugural "Belmont Stakes Blue Ribbon 5K Run for Prostate Cancer."
