CAMELOT HEADS DERBY ELEVEN

Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Derby hero **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will face a maximum of 10 opponents--five of those from his own stable--in

Sunday's G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby at The Curragh.

During Royal Ascot, trainer Aidan O'Brien gave an update on the colt, who will bid to become the first to complete this particular Classic treble since Nijinsky II in 1970.

"We are taking it one race at a time with Camelot and we are not committing him to anything other than the Irish Derby at the moment," O'Brien said. "So far, everything is going well, and we'll try and keep dreaming."

With the most notable withdrawal at yesterday's six-day stage being Jim Bolger's **Parish Hall (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), Camelot is set to face that G1 Dewhurst S. hero's stable companion and

Apr. 15 G3 Ballysax S. and May 13 G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner **Light Heavy (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), as well as Moyglare Stud's **Speaking of Which (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), so impressive when taking the May 27 G3 Gallinule S. at The Curragh for the Dermot Weld yard. John Oxx could run three, with Christopher Tsui's ⚡ "TDN Rising Star" ⚡ **Born To Sea (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) kept in alongside Jaber Abdullah's **Akeed Mofeed (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and the Neil Jones homebred **Call To Battle (Ire)** (King's Best).

Ballydoyle could also be represented by the Derby third **Astrology (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and ⚡ "TDN Rising Star" ⚡ **Imperial Monarch (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), although final decisions will be made later in the week.

NEHRO SIDELINED

Zayat Stable's multiple Grade I-placed **Nehro** (Mineshaft) exited his sixth-place effort in the June 16 GI Stephen Foster H. with an ankle chip and is expected to undergo surgery this week.

"Nehro has a little ankle chip in his right ankle, just like he did last year after the Belmont S.," confirmed Justin Zayat. "He will have surgery by Dr. [Larry] Bramlage this week and rehab at WinStar Farm. His prognosis is good and we plan to race him as a 5-year-old, as long as his ankles tell us they are ready."

Nehro was second in last year's GII Louisiana Derby, GI Arkansas Derby and GI Kentucky Derby before being sidelined after a fourth-place finish in the Belmont. Since returning to the races with a 7 1/4-length romp in a Feb. 25 allowance at Fair Grounds, the bay colt was sixth in the Apr. 14 GII Oaklawn H. and was a narrowly beaten runner-up in the May 18 GIII Pimlico Special. On the board in six of 11 starts to date, Nehro has won twice and has earnings of \$976,731.



Camelot Heads Irish Derby 11 (*cont. from p1*)

The Curragh's General Manager Paul Hensey is happy with the current conditions and forecast.

"We had a nice, dry day yesterday and again today, and I walked the course this morning and was pleasantly surprised how well the track has taken all the rain we've had recently," Hensey explained. "It's yielding-to-soft at the moment, but I'd expect it to have dried to yielding by the end of the day. We'll be watching the forecast closely for the end of the week. We might have light showers on Wednesday, but the key day is Thursday when there is a band of rain moving across and we'll have to see if we get it. The rest of the forecast for Friday, Saturday and Sunday then looks good."

For the first time, the Derby meeting will take place in the evening, with the feature scheduled for 7:40 p.m.

"We did extensive promotion on pre-sales and corporate hospitality sold out a month ago, so much so that we created some extra facilities," Hensey added. "So it's very positive from that end of things and advanced ticket sales are well up, but we won't know how we do in terms of crowd until the day itself."

CHILEAN SELECT SALE WORTH A LOOK



When we think of wine country in the United States, Napa Valley immediately comes to mind. The innate beauty of Napa Valley evokes a reverence for the land, a dedication to the growing of grapes, the production of high-quality wines, and a devout appreciation for a unique quality of life. Now, think of a Napa Valley about 100 miles wide and 2,700 miles long; bordered by the towering, snow-capped Andes Mountains on one side and the vast Pacific Ocean on the other. This place would be Chile.

Not only is Chile a major producer of quality wines, but because the soils are mineral-rich, the climate is temperate, and the water from the mountains so pure, it is a perfect place to raise most any crop. In addition, as Chile is located in the Southern Hemisphere, those fruits and vegetables, in such abundance, are exported to other countries where seasonal production takes place six months later. Grapes, berries, avocados, cherries, apples, lettuce, tomatoes, potatoes and asparagus--you name it and Chile is shipping huge amounts to the U.S. and other Northern Hemisphere countries, and most recently to China, as well.

I have often thought that Napa Valley would be an ideal place to raise horses, if not for the prevalence of vineyards and the inherent high cost of farm land. In Chile, horses and grapes grow in close proximity, and many of those who raise horses also raise grapes and produce wines; often on the same farm. Again, because of the highly mineralized soils and the purity of the mountain water, the horses raised in Chile have a unique advantage in the production of dense bone and solid feet. Chilean horses race many more times each year than their American counterparts, and have much longer careers.

Recently, I was asked to select a group of quality yearlings from 20 of the most productive Thoroughbred breeding farms in Chile. We went from farm to farm, covering roughly 2,500 miles in nine days. We inspected over 300 yearlings and selected 76 to be sold at the Club Hipico Sales Pavilion, Sunday, July 8.

Club Hipico is one of the loveliest old racetracks in the world. It has the look and the character of Chantilly, and it is located in the heart of Santiago, a safe, modern, and thriving center of business and culture.

Breeding and racing in Chile is serious business. In Santiago, Club Hipico offers a sweeping turf course and races are run clockwise; across town at Hipodromo Chile, the racing is on dirt and races go counter-clockwise. In Vina del Mar, a resort community near the bustling seaport of Valparaiso, the Valparaiso Sporting Club offers turf run counter-clockwise. Purses are not the incentive, but breeders are highly competitive and seek to produce top-quality horses that run fast, often, and over unusually long careers.

With the introduction of shuttle stallions, breeding has been altered to include popular sire lines from Europe and the United States. Whatever your preference, you are likely to find exceptional yearlings by sires such as Dushyantor, a son of Sadler's Wells, standing also in France, who can get 2-year-old speed that stays to Classic distances like Horse of the Year Belle Watling (Chi). Productive sons of Storm Cat, such as Cat Scan, who has already produced two champion 2-year-olds; Hurricane Cat, currently third on the Chile's general sire list; Sir Cat, sire of Chilean Horse of the Year Ascot Prince, who was recently exported to run in the U.S.; and Tumblebrutus, a full-brother to Giant's Causeway who is perennially at the top of the general sire list.

Other seasoned sires include Monthir, sire of several 2- and 3-year-old champions; Ocean Terrace, sire of both 2- and 3-year-old champions, including GIII La Prevoyante H. winner Casablanca Smile (Chi) (ask Shug McGaughey what he thinks of her); and Pyrus, a son of Mr. Prospector, who also stands in France.

First-year sires represented include Footstepsinthesand (GB), Frost Giant, Newfoundland, Scat Daddy, Stevie Wonderboy, and Thunder Gulch. The prospect of finding a "Daddy Long Legs" to race in the Southern Hemisphere should be inducement enough for buyers from Australia. But if it is speed that you want, there are plenty of 2-year-old types in this bunch.

It is notable that, although they have injected a lot of speed into their breed, the Chileans enjoy horses that can run on, stay, and continue to run over many years. They are durable horses and the Chilean trainers are a patient lot, never seeming to drill their horses, but training slowly, introducing ample foundation throughout the campaign.

I can highly recommend a trip to Santiago for the Breeders' Sale, July 8. You will find a beautiful, safe city with snow-capped mountains as a backdrop, a magnificent racecourse at Club Hipico, honorable horsemen who speak the same language as you (in every sense of the phrase), and a lovely gathering of high-quality yearlings with unlimited potential. Flights from the U.S. are direct into Santiago and there is an abundance of excellent hotels and restaurants for your enjoyment. A trip to the resort community Vina del Mar, the Casablanca Valley (where numerous wineries are located), or many of the breeding farms are within an hour's drive of Santiago. There is so much more that Chile has to offer; lakes, glaciers, skiing, fishing, hiking, or hunting--the list goes on and on. It is an extraordinary place with exceptionally warm and friendly people. Recognized as the "Switzerland" of South America, you can rely on business being transacted properly and transparently.

**(Pedigree Insights cont.)**

As the great Italian breeder died nearly 60 years ago, many would no doubt argue that times have changed--that this particular theory of Tesio's is no longer valid in a Thoroughbred industry which now tends to place greater value on speed than stamina.

Admittedly, there have been periods since Tesio's death in 1954 when Derby winner after Derby winner has drifted into obscurity. On the plus side, it was won in successive years in the early 1970s by those greatly influential stallions Nijinsky, Mill Reef and Roberto, and its winners since 1954 also include such as Sea-Bird (sire of 19% black-type winners), The Minstrel and Shirley Heights. I suspect I would also have been able to add the names of Troy and Shergar to the list, had these outstanding Derby winners lived longer.

There is also plenty of more recent evidence to suggest that the Derby is as relevant today as it ever was, as last week's action at Royal Ascot confirmed. Galileo, winner of the 2001 edition, was represented by the incomparable Frankel, who was so stunning in the G1 Queen Anne S. Then High Chaparral, the 2002 Derby winner, was very ably represented by So You Think, the Aussie superstar who recorded his fifth Northern Hemisphere Group 1 success in the Prince of Wales's S.

Then there was New Approach, the gallant 2008 winner. He became the stallion sensation of the week, thanks to an improbable trio of juvenile stakes victories by members of his first crop. Next year will see the first runners by the 2009 Derby hero Sea The Stars. As he was officially rated seven pounds superior to his half-brother Galileo--champion sire in three of the last four years--Sea The Stars is extremely well-qualified to become yet another outstanding stallion on the Derby's roll of honor. *Cont. p8*

To get back to New Approach, I mentioned the rare potential being shown by New Approach two weeks ago in my notes on the bright start being made by Galileo's stallion sons:

"Even though this Derby winner shone over distances of a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half--as his pedigree suggested he would--he had three impressive 2-year-old winners over six furlongs last week," I wrote.

"The most important of the three has to be the unbeaten Dawn Approach, who provided his sire with his first stakes victory, but there was also a lot to like about Tha'ir and the filly Newfangled."

These were the three who supplied the exciting Darley stallion with his exceptional stakes treble, with Dawn Approach and Newfangled landing group races over six furlongs and Tha'ir a listed race over seven.

Although New Approach won the Derby, he was far from a typical mile-and-a-half performer. Indeed, the Derby was the only occasion he was asked to tackle a distance longer than a mile and a quarter. He was also unusual in that he had been the previous year's champion 2-year-old, when he was unbeaten in five starts, all over seven furlongs, beginning on July 15.

In common with Frankel, another of Galileo's champion 2-year-olds, New Approach was very eager to display his considerable talents before eventually learning to relax a little. He was helped by becoming one of the first horses to be ponied to the start in Britain and Ireland.

His astute trainer Jim Bolger attributed some of the colt's quirks and nervousness to the fact that he and his dam Park Express were kept apart from other mares and foals because Park Express was almost blind. "He never got the herd mentality," Bolger once explained. Another quote worth repeating was one Bolger made after his colt's third start:

"I see New Approach as a European version of Secretariat. Like him, he's a chestnut with white legs, and I think his style of racing is the same."

Although both of New Approach's parents shone over a mile and a quarter or more, New Approach's effectiveness over shorter distances no doubt owes something to the presence of some fast horses in the first four generations of his pedigree. Foremost among them must be his broodmare sire Ahonoora, who was blessed with tremendous early pace, thanks to a very speedy female line. Remember, too, that Galileo's broodmare sire is Miswaki, a fast and precocious son of Mr. Prospector. Grey Sovereign, another noted speed stallion, sired New Approach's third dam, the smart Lachine.

Even so, the 7-year-old stallion has done tremendously well to be represented by three juvenile stakes winners as early as June, including two over six furlongs. After all, this is a stallion who has 22 colts from his 90-strong first crop entered in next year's Derby. His Coventry S. winner Dawn Approach isn't one of them, at this stage, but Bolger has entered News At Six and Alpinist. Alpinist, a son of Kirsten Rausing's excellent mare Alouette, ranks alongside Dawn Approach as one of three New Approach colts which Bolger has entered for the G1 Vincent O'Brien S. (National S.) in September.

Eight of New Approach's Derby entries are listed as belonging to Sheikh Mohammed and five to Godolphin. Sheikh Hamdan owns three of the others, so New Approach looks set to play a leading role in the Maktoum family's fortunes.

It is only fair to expect that New Approach received some help from his mares in producing three stakes winners slightly more precocious than himself. Sure enough, Dawn Approach's broodmare sire is Phone Trick. This American sprinter equalled a couple of track records for six furlongs in winning nine of his 10 starts, all over six or seven furlongs. Although Phone Trick never raced at two, he went on to sire an unbeaten champion 2-year-old colt in Favorite Trick and a champion juvenile filly in Phone Chatter, plus sprinters of the caliber of Caller One, Intidab and Mazel Trick. It is going to be fascinating to see whether Phone Trick's speed is going to dominate the stamina shown by Pleasant Colony, Alydar and Sea-Bird, the stallions responsible for Dawn Approach's next three dams. All three stallions won over a mile and a quarter or more, and it was Pleasant Colony who provided Bolger with his Irish Derby and King George winner St Jovite.

Newfangled's dam, the winning miler Scarlet Ibis, is a daughter of the champion 2-year-old Machiavellian. Coincidentally, Machiavellian occupied the same position in the pedigree of Galileo's GI Breeders' Cup Turf and GI Man o'War S. winner Red Rocks. The similarities don't end there, as Red Rocks's second dam was by Fairy King, a 3/4-brother to Nureyev, the sire of Newfangled's second dam Flagbird. Although Newfangled has shown some of her sire's keenness, her pedigree suggests she will stay at least a mile (Flagbird won two important races over a mile and a quarter).

Tha'ir's dam Flashing Green is by the fast and precocious Green Desert, a stallion who was mated to New Approach's dam to produce Shinko Forest, a winner of a local Group 1 over six furlongs in Japan. Flashing Green gained her win in Germany over six furlongs, but her dam Colorsnap--from the same excellent Reprocolor family as the dual Gold Cup winner Kayf Tara--was bred to shine over a mile and a half.

In other words, these three New Approach stakes winners are likely to continue to shine as the distances lengthen.

MORE MONSUN MAGIC *by Christa Riebel*

Last week was a great one for Germany's stellar sire Monsun (Ger) (Konigsstuhl {Ger}--Mosella {Ger}), by Surumu {Ger}), with his tally of individual group winners soaring to 48. On Thursday, Gestut Schlenderhan's resident was the damsire of the G1 Ascot Gold Cup victor Colour Vision (Fr) (Rainbow Quest)--his eighth individual group scorer in this category and second at the highest level--before his son Energizer (Ger) landed the G3 Tercentenary S., while his daughter Estimate (Ire) took the G3 Queen's Vase a day later. Following on from the Royal meeting, Sunday's G2 Prix de Malleret saw his 3-year-old filly Yellow and Green (GB) prevail, while Tertullus (Fr) scored in the Listed Pokallob in Denmark.

Monsun now has six individual group winners to his credit in 2012 headed by the unbeaten G1 Deutches Derby favorite Novellist (Ger), who could become the fourth winner of that Hamburg Classic for his sire on Sunday.

"We were quite hopeful for such a development," said Gebhard Apelt, general manager of Gestut Schlenderhan. "This year's 3-year-olds were conceived in 2008, the year after Manduro became the world's best racehorse. The quality of Monsun's book of mares that year was very high, with many group winners and producers, and the outcome is very pleasing and clearly underlines his quality as a sire."
