GRADE I ON DIRT THE AIM FOR DULLAHAN

Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score) entered this year's Triple Crown fray as one of the highest regarded 3-year-olds of his crop on the merit of a pair of Grade I wins in the Toyota Blue Grass S. and last year's Dixiana Breeders' Futurity S., both over the Keeneland Polytrack. The half-brother to 2009 GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird (Birdstone) justified his stature with a respectable third-place finish at Churchill, but after an unplaced effort as the favorite in the GI Belmont S., trainer Dale Romans is out to prove that Dullahan, who arrived at Monmouth Park late Monday evening, can be effective on the dirt in Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational.

"Even though he was third in the Kentucky Derby, he needs to have a big win on the dirt for his next career in the stud barn," said Romans. "We threw him at the Belmont. It was a little bit different, a heavier type of racetrack, and I don't think he likes that, but I still think on the right dirt track he'll run big. I don't think Monmouth is nearly as deep and cuppy as Belmont. I think it's a little bit more like Churchill, and he handled Churchill well." **Cont. p3**

SALTY BUNCH FOR LAKE GEORGE

This afternoon's GII Lake George S. at Saratoga has drawn a pair of top-rung fillies, hailing from both sides of the Atlantic. **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), victorious in last fall's GI Darley Alcibiades S. and GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Downs, kicked off 2012 with third over the Polytrack in Keeneland's GI Ashland S. Apr. 7, but rebounded to score when returned to the sod for her latest in the Edgewood S. at Churchill May. 4. From across the pond is **Samitar** (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who recorded her biggest victory to date in the May 27 1000 Irish Guineas at The Curragh. Campaigned by Martin Schwartz, the bay finished fourth--beaten 7 1/2 lengths--over the rain-soaked ground in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 22. Trainer Todd Pletcher mounts a two-pronged attack with Twin Creeks Racing's **Dancing Solo** (Giant's Causeway) and Wertheimer et Frere's undefeated **Medolina** (Aragorn {Ire}). The former is fresh off a pair of victories at Monmouth; the May 27 Little Silver S. and the GIII Boiling Springs S. June 23, while the latter comes into this off score in the Tweedside S. at Belmont June 24. **Cont. p3**

Romans pointed out that despite the importance of achieving a Grade I win on the dirt, Sunday's race would likely not affect which surface the colt runs on for the remainder of his career. "I'll leave that up to [Donegal Racing owner and manager Jerry] Crawford," Romans said. "Hopefully, he's around this year and next year, and there's a lot of time to get him a Grade I on the dirt. There's a possibility if he doesn't run well this weekend he could show up in the [GI] Secretariat S. [on the turf, Aug. 18 at Arlington Park] or the [GII] Del Mar Derby [on the turf, Sept. 2 at Del Mar], or one of those bigger races at the end of the year on grass." Despite the retirement of Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) and Belmont winner Union Rags (Dixie Union), Romans still sees strength in the 3-year-old crop, and he considers Belmont runner-up Paynter (Awesome Again) as Dullahan's main threat on Sunday. "I think there's some good horses left out there, like Dullahan and Paynter," Romans said. "I'm a huge Paynter fan, I think he's one of the best 3-year-olds in the crop. I think Paynter's the horse to beat [in the Haskell]."

MEANDRE HAS ARC TARGET

Trainer Andre Fabre yesterday announced that he is looking at the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe for the 4-year-old Meandre (Fr) (Slickly {Fr}). Successful in Sunday's G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin, the Rothschild family's homebred will bid to atone for a sixth placing in the Longchamp feature last term. "I don't think horses improve from three to four ability-wise, they just get stronger," Fabre told *PA Sport*. "We knew Meandre was a good horse last year, he showed us the talent, but he is stronger this year and therefore easier to train. Last year, he started the season very early and I think by the end of the year, he was tired. He was sixth in the Arc last year and we hope he can improve on that this season. I was very happy with his performance [on Sunday] and his next race will probably be his trial for the Arc, the G2 Prix Foy [at Longchamp Sept. 16]. The other option is the [Sept. 2] G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in Germany, it will be one of those races and then the Arc."

GULFSTREAM ANNOUNCES 2012-13 STAKES SCHEDULE Gulfstream Park announced it will offer 61 stakes races—including 33 graded events—worth over \$10.1 million during its 2012-2013 Thoroughbred race meet, which begins Dec. 1. Highlighting its Mar. 30 card is the 62nd running of the \$1-million GI Florida Derby. In addition to the nine-furlong GI Kentucky Derby prep is GII Gulfstream Park Oaks, GIII Rampart S., GIII Orchid S., GIII Skip Away S. and GIII Appleton S. Gulfstream's 90-day winter meet will kick off with the 14th running of the Claiming Crown, an \$850,000 seven-stakes event which features warriors from the claiming ranks. "We believe the stakes schedule for the 2012-13 meeting is the most varied and valuable we have ever offered," said Gulfstream President and General Manager Timothy Ritvo. "Because of the commitment to Thoroughbred racing by our Chairman, Mr. Frank Stronach, we have been able to work with our industry partners to bring the prestigious Eclipse Awards to Gulfstream as well as the popular Claiming Crown. We have made some slight adjustments to our stakes schedule, but we believe our horsemen, who have been incredible partners of ours, will find the changes beneficial and rewarding." Among other highlights during the meet are the \$1.3-million Florida Sunshine Millions (Jan. 19); GIII Holy Bull S. and GII Forward Gal S. (both Jan. 26); GII Fountain of Youth S. and GII Davona Dale S. (both Feb. 23); GI Donn H. and GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. (both Feb. 9); and GIII Swale S. and GIII Palm Beach S. (Mar. 2). ROTHSCHILD OPTION FOR LILAC

Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) may head to Deauville for Sunday's G1 Prix Rothschild, which is the first major race of the track's month-long festival. Disappointing when the unplaced favorite for the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket last time July 17, Gestut Ammerland's homebred triple Group 1 winner could bid to get back on track in the mile contest. "She could run at Deauville this weekend," trainer Andre Fabre told *PA Sport*. "I will look at the forfeits and then make a decision. The other option for her is the G1 Prix Romanet over 10 furlongs [at Deauville Aug. 19], so we will see. She came back from Newmarket fine. She just got worked up before the race and I don't think she really handled the July Course. Hopefully, she can return to her best next time."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

ROMANS ISSUES UPDATE ON STABLE STARS

Tapitsfly (Tapit), winner of the 2009 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, has carved out a reputation as a consistent performer in graded stakes on the turf over the past two years. The 5-year-old recorded a landmark victory last out when she won the June 9 GI Just A Game S. for her first score at the highest level. She will look to make it back-to-back Grade I wins in Saturday's GI Diana S. at Saratoga.

If forecasted weather materializes, Tapitsfly may have to deal with a rain-softened turf course in Saturday's feature. She will also have to deal with the 1 1/8-mile distance of the Diana, at which she is 0-for-2.

Trainer Dale Romans, however, expressed confidence that his filly will handle these obstacles.

"Ideally, I'd like for them to make it a mile on a fast track, but they're not going to do it so we have to play the game they're giving us," said Romans. "She'll handle the distance, she's run longer distances before and run well. I don't think that's going to be a problem and as far as the course goes I think she can handle it, but we'll have to wait and find out."

If Tapitsfly does indeed relish the 1 1/8 miles, Romans noted that it give her many more options for the remainder of the year.

"I think this weekend is going to answer a lot of questions," Romans said. "If she can get a mile and an eighth, it's going to open the door for a few more options. But I haven't really looked past this race, I just want to see if she'll handle the mile and an eighth, and if she does, we'll have a lot more places to look."

Romans also issued upbeat bulletins on last weekend's GI Virginia Derby winner **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver) and Grade I Met Mile winner **Shackleford** (Forestry).

"There were a lot of concerns. I didn't know how he'd handle the soft going, how he'd be going a mile and a quarter," said Romans of Silver Max. "Then the saddle slipped up on [Two Month's Rent's] neck and he was hooked on the backside for the first time, but he handled everything. If they didn't beat him in that race, what will it take to beat him? He's just too much on his game right now."

Regarding Shackleford, who hasn't been seen since his Met Mile win May 28, Romans said the 4-year-old colt is "training super."

"He's doing really well," Romans said. "We aren't going to make the Whitney with him, because he came out of the Met Mile pretty tired, and he'd never been like that before. It took him a little while to get on his feet, but he couldn't be doing better right now. We're pointing towards the [GI] Forego [Sept. 1]."

WILKES: NECK 'N NECK HAS MATURED

Neck 'n Neck (Flower Alley), set to run in Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga, looked far from spectacular competing on the Triple Crown trail this spring. After unplaced efforts in the GIII Sam F. Davis S., the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S., and the GI Florida Derby, the colt was given a two-month layoff. When he returned from the holiday, however, the A. Steven Miles Jr. homebred looked far from ordinary. Neck n' Neck made his reappearance in a May 10 allowance going 1 1/16-miles on the dirt at Churchill Downs, winning by 6 1/2-lengths. He followed up that performance with a dominating 7 1/4-length score in the GIII Matt Winn S. over the same course and distance June 16. Trainer Ian Wilkes said maturity was the key factor in his horse's dramatic improvement.

"The horse is finally maturing and not making mistakes in his races, and he's grown up a little," said Wilkes.

In addressing whether or not the colt has improved enough for yet another step up in class, the trainer added: "He was only four lengths behind [Union Rags {Dixie Union}] in the Fountain of Youth, and five lengths off in the Florida Derby, so the key is has he improved five lengths? I really think he has. I think he belongs and I'm going to learn a lot on Saturday."

Wilkes said he has seen Neck n' Neck continue to mature in his training leading up to the Jim Dandy, and he "couldn't be happier" with the way the colt worked Monday.

"In his work, he worked a little fast, but Julien [Leparoux] said he took a breather around the turn. He didn't ask him to do it, but the horse did it himself then switched leads and went on himself."

Wilkes said he opted for a tilt at the Jim Dandy rather than the GI Haskell Invitational S. to get an idea of where his horse stands for the Aug. 25 GI Travers S.

"You want to run at the track and see if you belong in the Travers," Wilkes said. "The Travers holds a lot of prestige. The Haskell does too, but you're running over this track and I think that's an advantage sometimes to get a race over it."

AMAZOMBIE BACK TO 6F IN BING CROSBY

Last year's sprint champion **Amazombie** (Northern Afleet) will continue on the road to defending his GI Breeders' Cup Sprint title when he lines up in Sunday's GI Bing Crosby S. at Del Mar. Trainer Bill Spawr noted that while the drop back to six furlongs will suit his late-running horse, the expected small field for the Bing Crosby is a concern, especially with the likely presence of speedball **The Factor** (War Front). "It's not a good thing, because there is a lack of speed," said Crosby. "There was absolutely no speed [last year] and we were forced to put our horse in the race a little earlier than we wanted and it didn't work out." Amazombie encountered a similar situation in his most recent start, which resulted in a length defeat to Shackleford (Forestry) in the May 5 GII Churchill Downs S. "We thought there'd be two speed horses and nobody went so we were forced to go [to the lead] and put a little pressure on him, and it sure didn't work out." Spawr noted that while he will not change his tactics with Amazombie, his horse is more prepared for this race than he was last year, when he ran in the GI Triple Bend H. at Hollywood Park four weeks earlier. "Last year our primary goal was the [GI] Ancient Title [Oct. 8 at Santa Anita]. I just wanted to get another race into him because I knew I had over two months between [the Triple Bend] and the Ancient Title. So although we were serious, we weren't fully prepared last year, but this year we are." The Bing Crosby will be Amazombie's first start on a synthetic surface this year, and although the 6-year-old performs over those tracks, Spawr believes he is better on the dirt. "He's OK on it [Polytrack], but he's better on dirt. [Jockey] Mike [Smith] always says he feels different getting over dirt than he does Polytrack, but we're not making any excuses for him and we'll do our best on the Poly."

Spawr said that Amazombie will follow the same path as last year after Sunday's race, targeting the Oct. 6 GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship (formerly the Ancient Title) and a repeat in the Nov. 3 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, both over six furlongs on the Santa Anita dirt.

DANZIG IN AMERICA

Pedigree buffs whose memories extend to the early years of the last decade like to tell the story of how Sadler's Wells was struggling as a sire of sires before Montjeu and Galileo appeared. Ten years ago, when somebody said to you, "who are Sadler's Wells's best sons at stud?" or "what are the prospects for the Sadler's Wells sire line?" the answer was guarded. In The Wings and his son, Singspiel; Baratheia; the beautifully bred Northern Hemisphere group winner Fort Wood had sired Horse Chestnut, in South Africa; and El Prado, who at that time hadn't sired Medaglia d'Oro, Kitten's Joy, and Artie Schiller, and was still regarded as somewhat of a fish out of water--though later we understood he was actually the second-best Kentucky stallion with first foals 1994, after a certain A.P. Indy.

It's been a little bit like that for Danzig in America. In Europe just about anything that isn't Galileo or Montjeu is Danzig-line, primarily through Danehill (in the Coolmore corner, and also the dominant sire line in Australia) or Green Desert (in the Maktoum corner, having been raced by the late Sheikh Maktoum and having stood at his brother, Sheikh Hamdan's, Nunnery Stud in England). Danehill had actually been raced by Prince Khalid Abdullah, and Prince Khalid's Juddmonte Farms stands his top-five European sire son, Dansili, plus of course Danehill is the damsire of Juddmonte's Frankel, one of a remarkable four 2011 Classic winners by Galileo out of Danehill mares.

Some pedigree thinkers argue that Danehill and Green Desert should be regarded as separate branches of Danzig, and ultimately that may prove to be the case, though if it does happen it will show how the categorizations we pedigree historians make can depend on such factors as the undeclared war between Coolmore (Danehill) and the Maktoums (Green Desert). Either way, the influence of Danzig on European (and Australian) racing and breeding is immense. Danehill is the sire of sires Danehill Dancer, Dansili (as mentioned, himself now sire of promising second-crop sire Rail Link), Rock of Gibraltar, Exceed and Excel (a rare Darley Danehill sire, also in Australia), Holy Roman Emperor, current leading European second-crop sire Dylan Thomas, and, also in Australia, probable World Top 12 sires Redoute's Choice and Fastnet Rock, who has his first Northern Hemisphere crop of yearlings (he covered almost exclusively Coolmore mares that first year 'up north', and wasn't even advertised) in the Northern Hemisphere this year. Green Desert is the sire of sires Cape Cross (sire of Sea The Stars), Invincible Spirit (sire of current European second-crop sires number two, Lawman), and Oasis Dream (also a Juddmonte stallion, by the way--they have one of each). It's a Danzig extravaganza--a Danziganza, I guess.

Not so much in North America, where five of the top 10 on the *Blood-Horse's* current North American General Sire List hail from the Mr. Prospector sire line (#3 City Zip, by Carson City; #6 Distorted Humor, by Forty Niner, and his son, #10 Flower Alley; and two sons of Gone West, #4 Speightstown and #7 Proud Citizen), plus the new 2012 number one, Empire Maker (after Royal Delta's win in the GII Delaware H.), is by Unbridled, by Fappiano--the one Mr. Prospector line that I feel sure has branched off to become its own line. Another two of the top 10 are A.P. Indy's son Malibu Moon (#8) and grandson by Pulpit, Tapit (#5). Tiznow, who I wrote about last week, from the In Reality line, is #9, leaving only current #2 Giant's Causeway (two-time Leading Sire), by Storm Cat, as the only representative of the Northern Dancer sire line among America's current top 10.

There are four male lines descending from Northern Dancer which are still producing prominent sires today. Sadler's Wells and Danzig between them rule Europe, and both are expanding now in North America; Storm Cat is still by far the most influential in North America; and Deputy Minister/Vice Regent are still battling away. Though he was always a top sire of racehorses in North America as well as everywhere else, the Danzig line has just never been as strong a sire line in North America as it has been in Europe. In the mid-1990s, Dayjur showed a lot of promise, but ultimately didn't follow through, although he was a very effective broodmare sire. Danzig Connection, Honor Grades, Belong to Me, Boundary, Langfuhr, Concerto, War Chant--some useful sires but, really, nothing earth-shattering.

In the last two years, though, three sons and one grandson of Danzig have more or less suddenly appeared to suggest America can still be Danzig country, like just about every place else is. I say 'more or less' because the first of these, Three Chimneys' Exchange Rate, is 15 years old and has been at stud for 10 years, though his first six crops (2003-2008) were born in Florida, and his first Kentucky crop, sired in 2008, are foals of 2009, so they're 3-year-olds this year. As far as stallions coming up to Kentucky after early successes in Florida, "many are called but few are chosen," I believe is the expression. Yes, Mr. Prospector did it, followed by his son, Fappiano, but many more over the years have tried and failed; they couldn't "stand the raise." Hill 'n' Dale's Stormy Atlantic is one who did; he moved from Florida after his first 2-year-olds had run, for the 2003 breeding season, and that gamble paid off--he is among the top 15 on the North American General Sire List for the seventh consecutive year in 2012 (ranks 12th).

Weekly Sales Ticker

"Last year 7,104 yearlings had sold, by the end of October, 2011, at the sales we cover for the Weekly Sales Ticker; that was almost exactly two-thirds of the 10,667 catalogued, by the way -- a high clearance rate. The gross was \$496.2-million, and the average, for the more than 7,000 sold, was \$69,857 -- call it \$70,000. Last year the Fasig July sale averaged \$69,890 -- almost exactly the same as the average for the whole yearling sales season, through October. This month's Fasig average was \$81,291 -- a 16% gain; could that be a pointer for the yearling sales season? It was last year."

Exchange Rate was a \$1.4-million yearling in 1998, bought by Satish Sanan's Padua Stables and trained by Wayne Lukas. It took a long time to get his money back—he was a useful racehorse, versatile on dirt or turf up to a mile, winning the GII Tom Fool H. (seven furlongs, dirt) at four and earning \$479,803—but ultimately, after proving a successful sire, including two Grade I winners in his first crop (foals of 2003), Exchange Rate was moved to Kentucky for the 2008 covering season. If we published a table of "Sires with first Kentucky crops", he would have ranked third among the sire class with first Kentucky foals 2009, behind only Scat Daddy and Hard Spun. As it was, they were third and fifth, respectively, on the 2011 list of Leading North American Sires of 2-year-olds, and Exchange Rate ranked ninth. This year, with his second Kentucky crop of 2-year-olds, he currently ranks number four on the 2-year-old sire list, thanks to the exploits of his unbeaten G2 Prix Robert Papin and G2 Norfolk S. winner, Reckless Abandon. He also would still rank third on this mythical 'second-crop Kentucky sire' list; so that gives us a bit of perspective as to where Exchange Rate actually stands. He had an APEX A Runner index of 2.18 through the end of 2011 (Stormy Atlantic, by comparison, was 2.12); and he has always been good for 2-year-olds, as is indicated by his 2.15 ABC 2-year-old Index.

But Danzig's resurgence as a sire line in North America is by no means limited to Exchange Rate, because two of Danzig's last sons to go to stud in Kentucky have proven to be very good young sires; one of them you see just above Exchange Rate in the little table; this is, of course, Hard Spun, a seriously high-class speed horse around two turns for owner Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farms, Larry Jones the trainer. His only Grade I win came when they dropped him back to seven furlongs to win the top American race for 3-year-old sprinters, the GI King's Bishop (Beyer 106); but he also set the pace and ran second in the GI Kentucky Derby (to Street Sense, Hard Spun's Beyer 107) and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic (Beyer 112, to Curlin); second to Any Given Saturday in the GI Haskell (106); third to Curlin in the GI Preakness (104); and Hard Spun also won two Grade II nine-furlong races on the Polytrack at Turfway Park, the GII Lane's End S. (101) and the GII Kentucky Cup Classic (109).

Hard Spun was part of Darley's \$200-million 2007 sire spending spree, but, as you can see, as a sire he already has 11 black-type winners and 21 black-type horses, including, of course, the one-two in last weekend's GI CCA Oaks. As Andrew Caulfield noted yesterday, the signs are definitely pointing in the right direction for him.

More of a surprise was War Front, raced by Joe Allen and standing at Claiborne Farm, where his first foals were born in 2008. Trained by Allen Jerkens, War Front's best year was as a 4-year-old in 2006, when he proved, beyond any shadow of a doubt, that he was not a top-class sprinter. That's right, he was not: he went off at odds of 15-1 in that year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs, and the odds were right—he finished seventh. War Front had finished second five times in graded sprints that year; twice in Florida, then, in New York, to Silver Train in the GII Tom Fool; to Pomeroy in the GI Forego; and to Henny Hughes in the GI Vosburgh. In between he won the GII Vanderbilt at Saratoga, as the 7-4 favorite. His Beyers were good, ranging from 102-114, mostly in defeat; but there is no way, based on his form as a racehorse, that you would say he would become one of the top young sires in America.

Yet that is exactly what he is: War Front now has three Grade I winners in his first crop: The Factor (seven furlongs, AW, also a Grade II winner on dirt); the filly Summer Soiree (GI Del Mar Oaks, 9 furlongs, turf), and, this year, Data Link (GI Maker's 46 Mile at Keeneland, turf), as well as Soldat, second in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at two, and winner of the GII Fountain of Youth on the dirt last year, at three. War Front's second crop, now three, includes Summer Front, who just won a one-mile turf stakes at Saratoga over the weekend, having previously won the GIII Hill Prince; he is definitely entitled to be one of the top 3-year-old turf milers in America. One old-timers' definition of a sire of sires is one whose sons are better sires than they were racehorses; War Front, son of Danzig, definitely fits that category.

One other horse deserves a mention in the context of Danzig's American sire resurgence: 2012 freshman sire Magna Graduate, who is by Danzig's moderate sire son, Honor Grades--who just happened to be a graded stakes-placed half-brother to, let's see, A.P. Indy and Summer Squall. No wonder he got a shot at stud. He did sire GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Adoration, and Grade I turf winner Honor Glide. Magna Graduate won the GII Clark H. and six Grade III races among 10 wins from 35 starts, ages two through six; he also ran second in the GI Stephen Foster, to Flashy Bull; and third in the 2007 G1 Dubai World Cup, behind Electrocutonist and Wilko. Total earnings: \$2,582,816, but a \$5,000 stallion at Darby Dan, and not an obvious candidate to sire an early 2-year-old graded stakes winner. He's number four at this early call on the 2012 North American Freshman Sire List, with three winners, including GIII Churchill Downs Debutante S. winner Blueeyesintherein.

Conclusion: Notably, not through Danehill (2004 G1 Epsom Derby winner North Light was tried in Kentucky, is now in Ontario) nor Green Desert, three sons of Danzig--Exchange Rate, War Front, and Hard Spun--are all looking like pretty good news on the sire front. War Front looks a very good grass sire, and Exchange Rate has at least three key runners from his first two Kentucky crops with very good grass form also. Danzig always did great on the grass himself, but, whatever the surface, for the first time in some years, it looks like Danzig could--finally, some might say, considering the Danzig line's powerful influence in Europe and Australia--reemerge as a significant sire line in Kentucky.

My last blog found the 12 of us scattered across the U.S. on our five-week placements; each of us working for different trainers, bloodstock agents, vets and other racing operations. While several trainees ventured further afield to New York, California and Maryland, five of us remained in Kentucky; Ian Thompson with trainer Eddie Kenneally, Stephen Heath at WinStar, Madoka Kamei at Keeneland, Steve O'Connor with bloodstock agent Pete Bradley, and myself with racetrack veterinarian Dr. Nancy Brennan.

Following the others' return to Lexington, our attention began to turn to our next assignment, the impending business conference at Fasig-Tipton. Our task was to prepare a business concept to pitch in front of four members of the 'Bluegrass Angels' (an organisation of local investors) and an audience of industry figures. We'll be based mostly in the Hunter Valley with a few weeks scheduled in Sydney and Melbourne, and we are all excited to get to our next destination.

Finally, I can't end this installment of the blog without saying a very big thank you to everyone who has supported us throughout the last 6 months. To the people who have hosted us, met with us, lectured, and mentored us, we cannot thank you enough. We also wish to thank the Darley staff and management, particularly our coordinator here in the U.S., Tammy Masterson, for their support, encouragement and endless patience. Hopefully it is goodbye, but not farewell to Lexington!

Rudy Rodriguez boasts excellent numbers with his 2-year-old firsters, and **My Happy Face's** pedigree suggests she can win on debut. According to *DRF Formulator*, Rodriguez is 4-for-18 (22%) when unveiling juveniles in dirt sprints, good for a \$4.23 ROI. All four winners came in maiden special weight company, boosting Rodriguez's stats in the relevant category to a downright absurd 4-for-7 (57%) with a \$10.90 ROI. Two of those three non-winners ran second, with one losing by just a head at 15-1. The other one was fourth at 23-1 here. My Happy Face's freshman sire Tiz Wonderful was a super-impressive debut winner here in 2006, and he has done well with his first babies to hit the track. The Spendthrift resident has a 5-1 winner, a 5-2 narrow runner-up and an 18-1 show horse from six progeny to make their first starts. My Happy Face's dam Summer Star (Siberian Summer) didn't win first out, but she had some speed and her first foal, My Boy Jimmy (Teton Forest), broke his maiden for a tag at Pimlico in April, paying \$15. **Play:** \$25 Win. **Alternate 1:** Race 7 - \$10 Win on #14 Seminole County. **Alternate 2:** Race 8 - \$20 Win on #6 Cease.

DiDonato Bankroll: \$900 - Record: 4-0-0-1

Sherack: Monday - My Big Brown firster Aventurine failed to land a blow in the fifth race Monday, but didn't run that terrible either, making up a decent amount of ground to finish sixth, beaten 3 1/2 lengths. Can't complain getting 10-1 on Pletcher and Dominguez, that's for sure. **Today - Race 3 - Md 50000 (50-40), 3yo/up, 1 1/16mT - #4 Knock Rock (20-1)**

We'll be putting up the blue screen for DiDonato at TDN's Red Bank office Wednesday after Knock Rock lights up the tote board here. Yes, Knock Rock has been awful in his last two runs at this level downstate, and is 0-for-14 lifetime. And yes, trainer Scott Schwartz is somehow one-for-53 (hard to believe) this term. But trust me, it gets better. Knock Rock, a \$40K OBSAPR grad, was once thought of so highly by his connections that he contested the GII With Anticipation over this course and GII Pilgrim at Belmont as a maiden last term, and didn't embarrass himself. He finished only 4 1/4 lengths off the mark in the With Anticipation, placing a solid fourth behind State of Play, Optimizer and Dullahan, and was also a decent fifth in the Pilgrim over a soft going. Granted, the son of Corinthian needs to run back to his much more appealing 2011 form to make an impact here--which also includes a couple of solid efforts behind Shkspeare Shaliyah and Liquidity Trap--but based on the horses that will be taking money, he certainly has a chance at a huge price in a pretty bad field. Seems to run better when ridden a bit more aggressively early, and has a favorable inside draw. Watch out if Junior catches a flyer out of the gate. **Play:** \$20 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 7 - \$25 Win on #7 Chief Gaga. **Alternate 2:** Race 4 - \$20 Win on #10 Salvar.

Claiming Crown Alters Nomination Process:

A new nomination process for the Claiming Crown will be implemented for the 2012 season, the Claiming Crown Limited announced yesterday. The nominations, which will be held at Gulfstream Park Dec. 1, will now require both trainer and horse to be appointed for the event. "Rather than having trainers nominating horses this far out from the Claiming Crown, we felt it would be easier to change the nominating process," said Dan Bork, racing secretary at Gulfstream. "Trainers who nominate a horse in August for the event may not have that horse by Dec. 1. We believe this also gives trainers the ability to get a horse for one of the Claiming Crown's seven races or make a horse they currently have eligible for the event. We think this will also continue to create interest in the Claiming Crown." Trainers must pay a \$100 fee before Sept. 1 to be eligible to nominate horses, and the equine nominations must be submitted before Nov. 10. Conditioners who have waived the fee can nominate horses through supplemental nomination held Nov. 28. The Claiming Crown is comprised of seven races with a total of \$850,000 in purses.
