SHACK IS BACK

Following a four-hour trip from Churchill Downs in Louisville, Kentucky, **Shackleford** (Forestry) arrived at Saratoga Race Course Thursday morning ahead of a tilt at Saturday's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. Last season's GI Preakness S. hero won the GI Metropolitan H. May 28 at Belmont Park before returning to Kentucky in the interim. "He left Churchill at 6:05 a.m. and got in at 11 a.m.," confirmed trainer Dale Romans. "He went into Lexington and was last on the plane and first off. He gets the rock star treatment from everybody." Shortly after his arrival, the chestnut was feeling full of himself during a

sponge bath and showed his flare for acrobatics moments after. "He's ready to go," said Romans. "I think this is the time of year the older horses' division shakes itself out and the 3-year-olds merge. I think Game on Dude [Awesome Again] is on top and 'Shack' ranks among the best of them."

Romans said Shackleford would gallop on the main track in the days leading up to the six-furlong Vanderbilt as well as school in the paddock and starting gate.

While weakening late to be third last time out in the seven-panel GIII Bed O' Roses H. July 1, the Eric Fein-owned and Rick Dutrow Jr.-trained mare should appreciate the cut back in trip this time. Once again armed and dangerous, trainer Todd Pletcher offers the front-running **Maple Forest** (Forestry), who comes into this off a pair of stakes scores at Monmouth Park, including her latest in the Blue Sparkler S. at this distance July 1. However, she will likely have to strut her stuff early with the presence of **Roman Treasure** (Roman Ruler), who went wire-to-wire in her latest in the restricted July 8 Chadlea S. at Belmont. Looking to pick up the pieces late in is speed-laden field is **Island Bound** (Speightstown), who came from off the pace to win the six-furlong GIII Winning Colors S. at Churchill Downs June 2. Faltering to finish fifth most recently in the Bed O' Roses, the Ian Wilkes trainee has hit the board in five of six prior attempts at this distance and gets the chance to redeem herself here. **Field cont. p7**

Saddler's Rock justified favoritism in this meeting's prestigious Cup race to make up for a third-place effort in the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 21. Still

relatively unexposed, the bay met with a setback prior to that outing, but arrived here on the back of an untroubled run. Settled in a clear third early by Johnny Murtagh as Chiberta King (GB) (King's Best) and Electrolyser (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}) set off to make it a true test, he strode past the

latter with a quarter-mile remaining and always looked in control thereafter as Askar Tau closed out of the pack along with the one-paced Gold Cup hero Colour Vision.

"We had a big year planned and it didn't start great, but he's redeemed himself now," Murtagh commented. "He's got a turn of foot, especially on this fast ground and although he's not very big, he's all heart, is very straightforward and is improving all the time. The Ascot race was a total farce for the first mile and a half, as we hacked and he was fresh and I couldn't get him settled. I should have sent him on five out there, as he was not beaten far but he came out of that race really well. He doesn't do a lot when he hits the front, but stays well and is a good bit better than those horses." Saddler's

Rock, who emerged on the big stage in this division when taking advantage of a sizeable weight-for-age swing with Opinion Poll (Ire) (Halling) and beating last year's Goodwood Cup winner in the G2 Doncaster Cup in September, is set for a return to that race Sept. 14, with a possible trip to York for the Aug. 25 G2 Lonsdale Cup in the interim. "The Gold Cup was a disaster all-round, but it was easy to watch today and I was confident all the way," trainer John Oxx explained. "He's still an inexperienced horse who has had very little racing--that was his first proper race since the Doncaster Cup--so the Ascot race was the tough race that he needed. Provided he bounces out of this well, I'd hope to go for the Lonsdale Cup and then the Doncaster Cup, which comes up quick enough after. Then it could be the G1 Prix du Cadran [at Longchamp Oct. 7] and G3 British Champions Long Distance Cup [at Ascot Oct. 20]." Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford said of Colour Vision, "Frankie said Colour Vision didn't really handle the track, but the horse tried his best and put up a good effort. Frankie felt between the five-furlong pole and three-furlong pole that the others just got away from him. If he doesn't go to York, he will go to Doncaster but we will see."

closer than ninth after meeting trouble in running in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19.

Subsequently last of seven on soft ground in the G2 July S. at Newmarket July 12, the bay bounced

back on this far livelier surface to battle to a first black-type success. Always

in the front rank, he took the lead passing halfway and gamely held off the Richard Hannon trainee Master of War in the run to the line. "He battled very well and always does," jockey Joe Fanning said. "He traveled well today and I just sat on him. He seemed better for a lead and is very game." Trainer Mark Johnston added, "He's seen the trip out well today, and clearly he wasn't right last time. He just hasn't been seeing his races out, and that's been the story over the last month to six weeks for us. Whether it's deserved or not, our horses have a reputation for finishing their races and always running on at the end, but they haven't been doing that. We've had a lot of infections and respiratory disease, which is probably related to the weather we've had, and once it gets in there it spreads like wildfire around the yard." Connections are considering a tilt at the G2 Gimcrack S. at York Aug. 24, where he could renew rivalry with the runner-up.

Now with Niels Petersen, he was a creditable third in a seven-furlong handicap won by African Story (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) on Meydan's Tapeta Jan. 26 and runner-up to Premio Loco (Prized) in the May 15 G3 Pramms Memorial over an extended mile at Jagersro before running second again in this track's Listed Polar Mile Cup June 14. Taken to Taby for the July 14 Listed Swedish Open Mile, he recorded his first Scandinavian black-type success and followed up at the expense of last year's winner Giant Sandman. Towards the fore early trapped wide, he was committed on the front end approaching the final quarter mile and his stamina was employed to maximum effect by Per-Anders Graberg to ward off the challenge of the favorite on this testing ground.

THE GOING'S GOOD

For the first time since she turned up in Britain, **Ortensia (Aus)** (Testa Rossa {Aus}) has reasonable ground conditions, and that could be the key as she lines up for Goodwood's G2 King George S. today. Compromised by rain-deadened ground when ninth in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 19, the dual Group 1 winner had to endure an extremely testing surface when a creditable fourth in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket 20 days ago. In a wide-open renewal, Clipper Logistics' **Beyond Desire (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) enters the reckoning based on her all-the-way win in Longchamp's G3 Prix de Saint-Georges over this trip May 13. She beat only one rival in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene on her next start at Chantilly June 3, but trainer Roger Varian is hoping she can regain the form which saw her finish a close fourth in this 12 months ago. "She has had a short break since her last run and has been training nicely," he said. "A sharp five furlongs on quick ground are her optimum conditions, and we are hoping for a good run."

Bryan Smart has two high-profile contenders in last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp hero **Tangerine Trees (GB)** (Mind Games {GB}) and the 3-year-old filly **Excelette (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). The latter beat **Spirit Quartz (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the Listed Achilles S. over this trip at Haydock June 1 before finishing third under a subsequent penalty behind **Angels Will Fall (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) in the Listed Land O'Burns Fillies' S. at Ayr June 23. "Tangerine Trees is in good form, and it has just taken a while to get his fitness right this year, as he's a big, stuffy horse now," Smart told *PA Sport*. "He seems in good form with himself and I'm happy with him at home, so fingers crossed, he runs very well. Excelette will like the ground and she's in good order. I think she deserves to take her chance in a race like this. Neither of them have been to Goodwood before, and we all know it's a funny track. We'll have to see whether they handle it, and we won't know until we give it a go."

A PRINCELY AIR

Godolphin have always placed high hopes in **Dubai Prince (Ire)** (Shamardal), and he has yet to deliver since his transfer from the Dermot Weld stable, but today's G3 Glorious S. at Goodwood offers a further chance for him to revisit his juvenile form. Having looked smart when winning conditions events at Newbury in September and at York when last seen July 13, his last three starts in pattern company have failed to yield even a respectable effort. Racing Manager Simon Crisford said, "Dubai Prince is an interesting horse. He has been very fragile mentally, and he tends to get very nervous when the race is building up. He looks like an absolute king in four-runner conditions races, but he can get a bit shy when there are more runners--we found that in the Champion S. last year and in subsequent races. He is rated 116, which sets the benchmark for a race like this, but it is difficult to find races that suit him. The jury is still out with him--he is a very nice horse who has got plenty of talent." George Strawbridge and OTI Racing's **Gatewood (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) is on a roll after winning his last three starts, including Royal Ascot's Listed Wolferton H. over 10 furlongs June 22, and trainer John Gosden believes the stretch out to this distance will play to his strengths. "Stepping up to a mile and a half is long overdue for him," he said.

BACK IN BLUE

Last year's G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner **Gamilati (GB)** (Bernardini) makes her returns to the races in today's G3 Oak Tree S., her first appearance since sustaining an injury after winning the Feb. 3 Listed UAE 1000 Guineas. Having taken to Meydan's Tapeta surface like a duck to water, she has to transfer back to the turf, and Racing Manager Simon Crisford is being realistic about her chances. "Gamilati looked fantastic when winning in Dubai, but, to be honest, she was running against some fairly inferior fillies," he explained. "Sadly, she had a small flake in an ankle, which we had to remove before she came back to England, so she did not run in the 1000 Guineas. She has had a good time out--she is fresh and well and seven furlongs will be right up her street. She will go there with a bit of chance, as she runs well when fresh." Also in the royal blue is last year's G1 Myer Classic third **Dysphonia (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}), who has yet to win a stakes race in this country despite a respectable third in the G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. over this trip at Lingfield three runs back May 12. "Dysphonia has looked a better mare this year, and she has improved physically compared to previously," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "I think that seven furlongs is a nice trip for her."

A THOROUGHBRED GALA

One of the few upgrades in Britain's black-type program this year, Goodwood's G3 Thoroughbred S. has drawn a cast of proven performers and potential stars to reward the decision by the European Pattern Committee. One who fits the first category is Princess Haya of Jordan's **Gregorian (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}), who takes a class drop after finishing third in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 19 and runner-up in Chantilly's G1 Prix Jean Prat July 1. He meets John Manley's impressive Apr. 19 G3 Craven S. scorer and May 5 G1 2000 Guineas fourth **Trumpet Major (Ire)** (Arakan), who is back after a break, having disappointed when last of 10 in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh three weeks later. "Trumpet Major would have a big chance on his Guineas fourth and, while he did not fire when we took him to Ireland, we have freshened him up and he has worked well since," trainer Richard Hannon commented. "He has that penalty to shoulder, but Olympic Glory did it, so we have to be hopeful and we have a decent draw. We also run **Coupe de Ville (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}), who also ran a stormer [when fifth] in our Guineas. He has since run well twice in France, so he, too, could be in the mix." Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Aljamaaheer (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) beat the ill-fated The Nile (GB) (Three Valleys) in the Listed King Charles II S. over seven furlongs at Newmarket May 19 before finishing strongly to be third in the G3 Jersey S. over that trip at Royal Ascot June 20. "We were keen to try Aljamaaheer over a mile following his good run in the Jersey," conditioner Roger Varian explained. "His homework has been good since and, hopefully, he can run well in what is a competitive race." **Cont. p10**

MOULIN OPTION FOR FRANKEL

Sir Henry Cecil has suggested that the Sept. 16 G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp could fit into the schedule for **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) as he plans the remainder of the unbeaten colt's campaign. Following the easy six-length victory of Khalid Abdullah's homebred in Wednesday's G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, he is on target for a first run over middle distances in the Aug. 22 G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. After that outing, he could revert to a mile for the Longchamp race before ending his career in either Ascot's G1 Champion S. or G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Oct. 20. "I was delighted with Frankel on Wednesday. He has grown up a lot mentally and took it all like a true professional," Cecil said. "The idea was to be as easy as we could with him, as it was a warm-up to the Juddmonte International at York. He seems to have come out of yesterday's race really well and is on course for the Knavesmire. He will finish off his racing career at Ascot on Champions Day in the Champion S. or Queen Elizabeth II S. Whether, with the gap between York and Ascot, he contests the Prix du Moulin is questionable. Maybe it will be beneficial leading up to Ascot, but we will see. Frankel will tell me what course I should take."

MONARCH HAS IRISH CHAMPION AIM

★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Imperial Monarch (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) is being aimed at the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, trainer Aidan O'Brien announced. Successful in the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp, Susan Magnier's colorbearer is likely to be dropped back to 10 furlongs for the Sept. 8 highlight. "He had a little break after France, but he's just back going again," his conditioner explained. "He's been left in the G2 Great Voltigeur and the G1 Juddmonte International, but it's very possible he might turn up in the Irish Champion S. or something like that. He was a bit babyish [at Longchamp], but he was brave--that was his first run over a mile and a half and showed he got it well. He's a lovely horse who has progressed and he has class. He is a great traveller who came home very well in France--he is versatile and he's a horse to look forward to." O'Brien also revealed that **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) and **Power (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) were Deauville-bound. "Excelebration has two more pieces of work to do and we're looking at the [Aug. 12] G1 Prix Jacques le Marois," he added. "He had a little break after the last day. Power is in that, and we'll be having a look at the same race for him as Excelebration, but obviously we wouldn't want to run them both."

HAY LIST RECOVERING FROM INJURY

Hay List (Aus) (Statue of Liberty), the world's second highest rated sprinter behind fellow Australian Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), is recovering well from an April knee injury and may see the racetrack again, trainer John McNair told Sydney's *Sky Sports Radio* Wednesday. A 7-year-old gelding out of the Is It True mare Sing Hallelujah (Aus), Hay List has compiled an impressive record throughout a career that has been plagued by illness and injury. The winner of three Group 1 races in Australia, he has become best known as the bridesmaid of Black Caviar, finishing second to the highest-ever rated sprinter in four Group 1 races. Their most recent meeting came in the G1 Lightning S. at Flemington Mar. 23, and Hay List returned a week after that effort to annex the G1 Newmarket H. at the same venue under top weight. A foot abscess nearly kept him out of his most recent start, the G1 William Reid S. at Moonee Valley, but he recovered in time for the race, finishing second to Foxwedge (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). Just weeks later, Hay List underwent emergency colic surgery, and suffered a serious injury to his knee while recovering from anaesthesia. Connections feared the gelding had run his last race, but McNair issued a positive update earlier this week. "He had another operation last Wednesday and a very large piece of bone was taken out of the back of the knee, about the size of a macadamia nut," McNair told *Sky Sports Radio*. "He has recovered extremely well from the operation, a bit too well. We're trying to keep him as quiet as possible, which isn't easy to do." McNair added that Hay List would have his knee arthroscopically examined in October or November, and if he continues to progress well, he could resume training around Christmas time or early next year. "He is the reason I'm still training," said McNair. "I'll be satisfied once he gets back and wins another Group 1 race, then I'll feel like I've done my job right."

FASTNET ROCK'S DAM TO UNCLE MO

Piccadilly Circus (Aus) (Royal Academy--Gatana {Aus}, by Marauding {NZ}), the dam of Australia's 2011-2012 leading general sire Fastnet Rock (Aus) (Danahill), will visit 2010 champion 2-year-old **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie--Playa Maya, by Arch) for the 2012 breeding season, Coolmore Australia announced Wednesday. The 17-year-old Piccadilly Circus, a Group 3 winner in Australia, has been a hard-luck producer, yielding just five named foals including Fastnet Rock, a two-time Group 1 winner in his native country. She is also the dam of multiple stakes-placed Cirque du Soleil (Danahill). Uncle Mo will be shuttling for the first time this season. He will stand at Coolmore Australia for a fee of A\$24,200.

Since its launch in 2002, Hidden Brook Farm has not only become a regular on the domestic sales scene, but also well known for churning out top-class racehorses.

At the forefront of the 600-acre Paris, Kentucky operation are five men well known in the Thoroughbred industry: Jack Brothers, Sergio de Sousa, Mark Roberts, Dan Hall and Danny Vella. So far this summer, the full-service sales and breeding operation has been represented by Hidden Brook acquisitions Street Life (Street Sense), winner of last Friday's Curlin S. at Saratoga, in addition to leading handicap horse Game on Dude (Awesome Again), victorious in the July 7 GI Hollywood Gold Cup. Winner of the GI Santa Anita H. and GI Goodwood S. last term, the Bob Baffert trainee also finished runner up in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and was a finalist for the 2011 Horse of the Year title.

Other recent stars purchased or raised by Hidden Brook include Grade I winners Awesome Maria (Maria's Mon), a divisional finalist in 2011; 2010 champion juvenile filly Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course), who romped in this winter's Sunshine Millions Distaff; and Grade I winner Drill (Lawyer Ron), who took the May 12 GIII Laz Barerra Memorial in his most recent outing.

With only a few years under its belt, the operation achieved one of the sport's most sought-after treasures with Big Brown (Boundary), who was secured on behalf of Paul Pompa Jr. as a juvenile for \$190,000 at the 2007 KEEAPR sale. The bay won the GI Florida Derby in style before taking the 2008 installment of the GI Kentucky Derby. He added wins in the GI Preakness S. and GI Haskell Invitational S. Fast forward to the 2011 renewal of the Saratoga sale, a Hidden Brook-raised and consigned colt by Big Brown out of Cool Ghoul (Silver Ghost) sold for \$220,000 to IEAH, who partnered with Pompa during that big bay's championship season. Underlining the quality of its product, the Hidden Brook graduate was re-offered at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale this past winter, where he realized a final price of \$1.3 million.

Street Smarts...

Hidden Brook has eight yearlings slated for this year's Saratoga Select sale, including a draft of five offerings courtesy of Rabbah Bloodstock. Included among them are the only two fillies by Street Cry (Ire) in the catalog.

"When you have those types of horses by proven stallions, you go over there feeling very good about it because you feel pretty confident that, if they are nice individuals, they will sell well," said de Sousa. "If you go to Saratoga with younger stallions, you sometimes worry whether they will hit, but when the stallion is a proven sire, you don't have to worry about that part of the equation."

The first offering by Street Cry is [Hip 157](#), who is out of Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed Cloud Castle (GB) (In the Wings {GB}). Cloud Castle, winner of the G3 Nell Gwyn S. and third in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille, is the dam of Group 3 winner Queen's Best (GB) (King's Best), who was a 310,000gns TATOCT purchase herself; and listed winner and group-placed Reverie Solitaire (Ire) (Nashwan). The English-bred mare is also a half-sibling to two-time German highweight older horse and dual G1 Coronation Cup hero Warrsan (Ire) (Caerleon).

"That whole family doesn't tend to throw very physically impressive individuals, but they are all runners," explained de Sousa. "But if you are familiar with this family, this filly is exactly what the family tends to throw. I think she might appeal more to European buyers, because they are very familiar with the family. A horse like this definitely offers residual value, so we felt we wanted to showcase a filly like this, not only to the top American buyers, but to also the top Europeans as well."

The second filly of Street Cry on offer this year is [Hip 170](#), who is out of the lightly raced Desert Song (Unbridled's Song).

The 6-year-old mare is a daughter of multiple-stakes winner and graded-stakes placed Justenuffheart (Broad Brush) and is a half-sister to champion juvenile filly and GI Breeders' Cup heroine Dreaming of Anna (Rahy), Grade II winners Lewis Michael (Rahy) and Justenuffhumor (Distorted Humor). The Feb. 19 filly is from the extended family of champion turf horse and dual Grade I winner Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}).

"She is very impressive, well balanced and a nice-moving filly," said de Sousa. "She is a physically more impressive individual [than the other Street Cry filly], but she also looks a lot more like what she is bred to look like. This filly can really go anywhere, because this is a very deep family. I think this is really an appropriate horse for a boutique sale."

And how do the two Street Cry fillies compare?

"I really think you also need to read in between the 'blood'lines, because they both really are what they are supposed to be," explained de Sousa. "Hopefully, both fillies will present themselves well to potential buyers."

Also included among the Rabbah offerings is [Hip 123](#), a filly by GI Preakness S. hero Bernardini (A.P. Indy), out of Zanoobia (Our Emblem). The Jan. 24 foal is from the family of GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Concern (Broad Brush).

"The Bernardini is a very nice filly," said de Sousa. "He is a hot sire right now and the fact that she is [at Saratoga] shows that she is an athlete."

Hidden Brook also offers a pair of fillies on behalf of the Spruce Lane partnership, spearheaded by Mike McMahon. [Hip 19](#), a \$120,000

KEENOV weanling purchase, is by first-crop sire Colonel John (Tiznow); and [Hip 122](#), a daughter of Candy Ride (Arg). The Mar. 15 foal was a \$75,000 Keeneland November buy.

"She's very attractive, well balanced and there is a lot of substance to her," said de Sousa of the daughter of 2008 GI Travers S. and GI Santa Anita Derby hero Colonel John. "You never really know from the market how these young sires will be received, but if you look at the [F-T] July sale, the Colonel Johns did sell well."

Northern Exposure...

While other members of Hidden Brook team might be considered the face of a clock, it can be said that Sergio de Sousa is its central operating unit. A native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, de Souza was introduced to horses at a young age by several family members, including his grandfather and uncles, whose farms consisted of predominantly show jumpers and pleasure horses, with a sprinkling of retired racehorses.

"We bought horses from the horses in training sales, which were mainly older geldings and, we made them into jumpers," explained de Sousa. "That was just for pleasure, we never aspired to compete with them."

As for his introduction to horse racing, de Sousa recalled, "One of my uncles did have racehorses, so I followed the sport through him. When I was 15, I worked at a bloodstock agency in Brazil. I worked in the research department and used to prepare the catalogs for the sales and most of the sales were held at the racetrack in Sao Paulo. In those days, there weren't computers and you pretty much had to type out and take them to the printers. I also worked as a bid spotter at the sales, and through those jobs, it seemed like it was something I wanted to pursue. I liked to follow the races because I lived close to the track, but I never thought it was going to be where I am today with horses. Things just fell into place."

In 1987, de Sousa came to America and worked as a groom at Margaux Farm for 18 months before returning back to his native Brazil. After traveling the world and serving apprenticeships at major studs in England, Ireland (Kildangan Stud) and New Zealand (Waikato Stud), he returned to the United States in 1991 and to Margaux Stud.

"Horses took me all over the world, but it was never a mapped out plan," said de Sousa. "The horse industry is pretty small, in a sense, and when one job was finished, I moved on to the next one with the help of people I knew."

The Margaux Farm property was purchased by Adena Springs in the mid-90s, and de Sousa stayed on with the expanding Frank Stronach operation. During his early years with Adena, de Sousa was fortunate enough to be involved in the breaking and rearing of a slew of future stars, including GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Awesome Again (Deputy Minister), GI Belmont S. hero Touch Gold (Deputy Minister), and dual Grade I winner Wild Rush (Wild Again).

"In the beginning, the pedigrees weren't that fancy but a lot of good racehorses came out of [Adena]," said de Sousa. "But the philosophy was always to pay attention to details and to model our program around the horse and not the other way around. We tried to address their needs and not complicate things too much and try and raise a healthy and strong animal. I think that philosophy was passed on to Hidden Brook--a big part of our success is that we still approach each horse as an individual and will do what each horse needs to put them in the best position to succeed."

It was during his tenure with Adena Springs that de Sousa met his future Hidden Brook partners and, while serving a stint with Indian Creek, de Sousa decided to branch out.

"When Adena retired stallions like Awesome Again, Wild Rush and Touch Gold and really started to focus on the stallion market, they really started referring a lot of mares to other farms and the timing was right for me to try and do something else," explained de Sousa. "We had a few other clients that would come on board with us as well, so we decided to get together and form Hidden Brook. We just wanted to have our own investment in the industry."

The vast majority of Hidden Brook residents are bred, raised and broken on behalf of outside clients, however, de Sousa enjoyed his own success with Musket Man (Yonaguska), whom he bred in partnership Jimmy Nelson from Tulsa, Oklahoma. The dark bay was raised at Hidden Brook and sold for \$15,000 at the Keeneland September sale in 2007. On the racetrack, the dark bay won the 2009 GIII Tampa Bay Derby and GII Illinois Derby before finishing third in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. He also finished runner-up in the 2010 GI Carter H. and GI Met Mile.

Several years and thousands of miles removed from his early days in Sao Paulo, de Sousa's winding, and admittedly, unchartered journey to Kentucky has culminated with gifts beyond the 45-year-old's wildest dreams.


"The reason I came to Kentucky in 1987 was to learn more about the breeding side of the game," said de Sousa. "I always enjoyed the breeding part of the game, and although I am from the city, I always liked to visit the farm. That was the reason I came to America. It was supposed to be for 18 months and I have been here for 26 years."

And when asked what has kept in the game all these years, he stated simply, "There is no satisfaction like when you have a horse that you bred or raised at the farm and you later see them in the winner's circle somewhere. When you experience that, you are hooked for good."--Christina Bossinakis

DiDonato: Thursday - Krissy Kat finished a decent wide-trip third at 7-1, but wasn't quite good enough. At least she wasn't scratched!

Today - Race 6 - Msw, (S), 3yo/up, f/m, 5 1/2fT - #3 Cape Cod Carol (8-1)

Cape Cod Carol has had three rough trips from three turf tries this year, and while the pilot who was aboard for two of those three runs returns, I can't resist giving her one more chance. A distant fourth in the slop here last term, Cape Cod Carol resurfaced at Belmont June 16 for her grass bow. Taken back early after steadying at the start, she was forced to check again in the lane before finding a seam and putting in a nice late run to be fourth, beaten 3/4 of a length. The top two finishers controlled things throughout, so it's not as if the race collapsed. Jose Lezcano then took over from the always-patient Junior Alvarado July 1, and the new rider gunned Cape Cod Carol to the lead through a :21.59 quarter--she dueled with return opponent **Drinksonthehouse** before fading to 9th (that foe checked in seventh, and is a bit interesting here as well). **A.P. Hutchy**, who enjoyed a perfect pocket position in that July 1 affair, figures to be a big favorite here off her dream-trip second-place finish. Back to Cape Cod Carol--Alvarado climbed back aboard July 15, and he again took her very far back. She appeared to have run turning into the stretch, but her rider jammed on the brakes despite what appeared to be plenty of room down on the inside. Alvarado eventually got her going again, however, and Cape Cod Carol put in fastest-of-the-field final furlong in :11.95 to get up for third. The problem here is obvious--Alvarado's tentativeness has gotten Cape Cod Carol beaten twice now, but hopefully he's learned his lesson and will put her into the race a little earlier this time. He generally seems plenty competent. **Play:** \$20 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 8 - \$20 Win on #2 Belle of the Hall. **Alternate 2:** Race 6 - \$10 Win on #6 Drinksonthehouse (Turf Only).

Sherack: Thursday - Smokin' Alice sat a perfect stalking trip behind the speed in fourth, but failed to land a blow in the stretch, reporting home a disappointing fourth as the 2-1 favorite. Back to shopping for value, for now.

Today - Race 6 - Msw, (S), 3yo/up, f/m, 5 1/2fT - #2 Jitney (8-1)

Have some concerns that **Jitney** may fall a bit too far back for her own good over this speed-favoring course, but still think that she could be live at a price here. The Team Millennium homebred ran a *huge* race to finish a close fourth--9-5 morning-line favorite **A.P. Hutchy** was second, beaten a neck, after sitting a perfect trip that day--going six furlongs versus similar in her turf debut at Belmont July 1. Outsprinted in eighth through hot fractions of :21.59 and :44.84, the chestnut zig-zagged her way through the stretch after altering course several times to come within a length of the winner, good for a very respectable 71 Beyer. Stretched out to 1 1/16 miles on the July 20 opening-day program, she showed some early interest to press in second, but clearly wanted no part of the added distance and tired badly to report home ninth. Love that she returns on relatively short notice for this, and the Hertler barn, despite a very quiet year (five winners from 77 starters) so far, is more than capable of delivering upstate. From a five-horse sample at the Spa this summer, the Hertler stable hit the board with Considerate, who placed a decent third at 13-1 to Hessonite in the Irish Linnet S. July 27. Barrel of Love failed to finish in the money, but gave her supporters a good run at 9-1 after leading in the stretch before getting swallowed up late to finish a close fifth. Hertler had his picture taken twice at Saratoga last year, with both wins coming courtesy of Miss Vindictive; he also hit the board with a handful of longshots in 2011 as well. **Play:** \$25 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 7 - \$25 Win (Turf Only) on #7 Never On Time. **Alternate 2:** Race 3 - \$20 Win on #7 Smart Believer.
