TATTS OCTOBER BEGINS TODAY

Park Paddocks was alive with activity on Monday as the clock ticked down to Tattersalls' flagship yearling auction, the October Sale, which starts today in Newmarket at 11 a.m. (BST). Book 1 runs for three days, while Book 2 is from Oct. 15-18 and the one-day Book 3 takes place Oct. 19.

Many vendors reported that they were busy showing horses over the weekend and, with a number of trainers and agents having returned from the Arc weekend at Longchamp, viewings were up again Monday.

One consignor with every right to have a large grin on his face is Ballylinch Stud manager John O'Connor, who witnessed the operation's homebred Wizz Kid (Ire) (Whipper) live up to her name when scorching to victory in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp Sunday. Ballylinch is consigning Wizz Kid's half-brother by one of its resident stallions, Lawman (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who sells as [lot 75](#) today.

"It was great for us, as she's very much a Ballylinch-bred filly," said O'Connor. "Her dam Lidanski and her grandam Lidanna are both still at the stud, as is Soviet Sire, her broodmare sire. Lidanski's colt had been well looked at anyway, as she is an established mare, but yesterday's win just adds an extra little bit of interest. From the reports I've had, everyone has been very busy over the last few days, and that has to be a good sign for the sale."

Wizz Kid is not the only decent update for the Ballylinch draft from the weekend's racing, as O'Connor explained. "Last year at this sale, we sold Victrix Ludorum [Invincible Spirit {Ire}], and she won the valuable Tattersalls Millions sales race at Newmarket on Saturday," he said.

The Richard Hannon-trained Victrix Ludorum is out of the Sunday Silence mare Matikanehamatidori (Jpn), whose Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire) colt is offered by the stud in Book 2 ([lot 764](#)).

There are 56 full- or half-siblings to Classic or Group 1 winners catalogued for Book 1, and one with yet another timely update is [lot 557](#), a Galileo (Ire) three-parts brother to Derby winner Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who also has the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Solemia (Fr) (Poliglote {GB}) under his second dam. **Cont. p3**

NOBLE TUNE STORMS TO PILGRIM WIN

Noble Tune (Unbridled's Song) came flying down the center of the Belmont Park turf course to earn a 2 1/2-length victory in Monday's GIII Pilgrim S. "Wow, breathtaking," exclaimed winning owner Martin Schwartz after watching his charge earn an automatic berth into the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. "I started singing, 'We're going to California.'" Noble Tune was a debut winner at Saratoga for his breeder Dell Ridge Farm and started Monday for Dell Ridge and Schwartz. "I was very lucky I was able to buy into the horse after Saratoga," Schwartz added. "I don't buy colts, so this is a special one. He's got a great pedigree." Noble Tune's third dam is champion Serena's Song. **Cont. p6**



Unsurprisingly, this colt was high on the list of 'must-see' yearlings for agent Tony Nerses, who bought Authorized as a foal at Tattersalls.

"He was one of the first horses I looked at," admitted Nerses, who was at Tattersalls with Authorized's

co-owner Saleh Al Homaizi. "I've seen a lot over the last few days and, at most sales, you can eliminate horses fairly quickly, but here you eliminate a horse only very reluctantly. There are some really nice horses here, and I'm finding it very hard to disregard any of them. This is the strongest catalogue I've seen in a long time."

With such an outstanding pool of yearlings on paper in Book 1, the question would always be whether or not their physical attributes would live up to their pedigrees, but it seems that most potential buyers will be spoilt for choice this week.

Richard Knight, a former employee of Coolmore, Juddmonte and Darley, launched his own bloodstock agency earlier this month, and has been in action at Goffs and Tattersalls so far. "There are some very solid colts and plenty of nice fillies," he said. "It makes it very hard to compile a short-list!"

With regular big-name buyers such as Sheikh Mohammed, Sheikh Hamdan and the Coolmore team in attendance, it will no doubt please Tattersalls to see so many other potential buyers from around the world in Newmarket, including Teruya and Haruya Yoshida, Paul Fudge of Waratah Thoroughbreds, David Ingordo, Nicolas de Watrigant, who buys on behalf of Sheikh Joann Al-Thani, Ibrahim Araci and Mary Slack.

"There seem to be a lot of people we don't know, which is good, and of course plenty of people we do know," commented Michael Swinburn of Genesis Green Stud.

Demand for the few Montjeu's available was particularly keen at Goffs last week, and this February-foaled bay is out of a sister to Vahorimix (Fr), who was awarded both the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois in 2001; and the listed-winning and group-placed Vadalix (Fr). This is Jean-Luc Lagardere's dynasty of Vadsa, which also includes Val Royal (Fr), Valixir (Ire) and recent Listed Flame of Tara S. winner Spinacre (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}).

40, c, Galileo (Ire)--Intrigued (GB), by Darshaan (GB)
Consigned by Denford Stud

Intrigued, who was fourth in the 2004 G1 Prix Marcel Bousac and twice placed at listed level, has already produced this year's G1 St Leger third and listed-winning Michelangelo (GB), a 550,000 guineas purchase here two years ago also by Galileo and who has recently been purchased by Australian interests. This is the family of Last Second (Ire) (Alzao) and a myriad of high-class Kirsten Rausing mares, including this year's G2 King Edward VII S. winner Thomas Chippendale (Ire) (Dansili {GB}).

51, f, Galileo (Ire)--Kasora (Ire), by Darshaan (GB)
Consigned by Oaks Farm Stables

On a day that is effectively a Galileo-fest, this is one of the picks of the bunch as a three-parts sister to High Chaparral (Ire) and that star's G2 Dante S.-winning full-brother Black Bear Island (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Three of Kasora's female progeny, Treasure the Lady (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), Helena Molony (Ire) (Sadler's Wells and Mora Bai (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), can boast six-figure offspring, and the latter is also the dam of last year's G2 Beresford S. winner and G1 National S. third David Livingston (Ire), also by Galileo. Helena Molony's Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt sells as hip **8**.

82, c, Sea the Stars (Ire)--Love Divine (GB), by Diesis (GB)
Consigned by Watership Down Stud

When it's not about Galileo, it's about Sea the Stars, and this is one of the most notable of the baker's dozen catalogued for today's session. Out of the 2000 G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Love Divine, he is therefore a half-brother to the 2007 G1 St Leger hero and sire Sixties Icon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and three-parts sibling of last year's G2 Jockey Club S. runner-up Native Ruler (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who now stands at Louella Stud. Also from this family is the smart Dunboyne Express (Ire) (Shamardal), now named Dan Excel (HK), whose half-brother by Teofilo (Ire) sells two lots later.

76, f, Street Cry (Ire)--Liffey Dancer (Ire), by Sadler's Wells
Consigned by the Castlebridge Consignment

Bill Dwan offers the sole Street Cry in Book 1, and she hails from one of the most prolific families around at present. Her dam is an unraced full-sister to two of Ballydoyle's Group 1 scorers Listen (Ire) and Sequoyah (Ire), the latter of which has subsequently also excelled in the paddocks when producing Henrythenavigator and the group-winning and Classic-placed Queen Cleopatra (Ire) (Kingmambo).

96, c, Invincible Spirit (Ire)--Madeira Mist (Ire), by Grand Lodge
Consigned by Castlemartin Stud

This is a March-foaled half-brother to Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who had the precocity to win the G2 Royal Lodge S. at two and G1 Canadian International at three and the longevity to remain a force to be reckoned with as a 5-year-old when providing updates by winning the G2 Prix Kergorlay and placing third in the G2 Prix Foy. The dam, who was a graded stakes scorer herself, is a descendant of the high-class Niarchos flag-bearer Magic of Life, whose progeny include the dual group-winning Enthused (Seeking the Gold) and the dam of last year's G1 Coronation S. runner-up and recent G3 Premio Sergio Cumani heroine Nova Hawk (GB) (Hawk Wing).

 for an authoritative score. "It was much like his debut,"
 said winning trainer Chad Brown. "I thought he was
 very professional; he did some things you see
 experienced horses do. It's always encouraging to see a
 horse with this much class who has the sense to
 maneuver around, slip inside, slip outside, accelerate,
 and switch off early in the race. If the horse comes out
 of the race OK, we'll be going on to the Breeders' Cup."

Three of them, including Cristoforo Colombo and George Vancouver, also hold entries in the G1 Middle Park S..

RACING FACING MANY CHALLENGES

The Thoroughbred business is showing some signs of revitalization yet faces a challenging set of dynamics related to ongoing global financial pressures that are not likely to cease any time soon, attendees at the 46th International Federation of Horseracing Authorities Conference were told on Oct. 8 in Paris.

Aki Akitani, IFHA deputy secretary general, reported that wagering in the first half of 2012 is up in some key jurisdictions including the United States (2%), France (1.7% through the Pari Mutuel Urbain), Japan (8.1%), Hong Kong (7.1% for its fiscal year) and Turkey (9.5%).

Other significant statistics are not so positive, however.

Foal production continues to decline in many countries, with the world leaders, the U.S. and Australia, down 10.4% and 7.6%, respectively, for 2011 (with figures for the U.S. estimated from early reports). Foal crops in Ireland, Japan, Great Britain and New Zealand also declined, although each less than 1% and thus possibly could be stabilizing after the global economic crisis that began in 2008 and caused virtually worldwide decreases.

Foal production in France declined 8.9% despite purses and breeder and owner premiums that are the best in Europe, while South Africa and Argentina reported gains of 8.2% and 3.8%, respectively.

The number of races run and total betting remain fairly flat overall globally, although countries hit by crises, both natural and economic, plummeted in turnover from 2010 to 2011, including Japan, Greece, Italy, Cyprus and Ireland.

Overall figures show increasing strength in Asia as racing grows in new markets and Japan and Hong Kong continue together to represent more than 40% of global wagering.

“Generally speaking, there is an ongoing trend that Asian countries have been increasing their share in all racing sectors and it clearly reflects the current world economic trend,” Akitani said. “The racing statistics over the last several years suggest that the share of Asia is increasing and on the other hand, shares of Europe and the Americas looked to have come to their maturity.”

As global natural resource and geographic frontiers have been mined to the limit and with world financial markets now strained with debt, racing will be challenged by the new post-market capitalism era, he said. As people, particularly the young, struggle to find jobs and earn money, racing could struggle to attract new fans, and of course there will be less owners willing to pay to play.

In this new world, quality and efficiency will be important for racing to stress over quantity. Racing leaders also must focus on “doing the right things,” such as Thoroughbred aftercare efforts, in order to maintain a positive connection with the public, Akitani said.

“Our role as a racing authority is to safeguard the industry at all cost on the last line, and in this sense, our role would be like a goal keeper, rather than a forward. We need to...understand the forces at work,” Akitani concluded, asserting that racing’s authorities “are the last defense on the line” for the sport.

Medication also was a key subject during the IFHA conference.

Emphasizing that medication reform is the top priority of The Jockey Club in the United States, President James Gagliano reinforced his call for an immediate beginning of a phase-out of furosemide (Lasix or Salix) in the sport.

“It is extremely important to begin now so that we can take appropriate steps and take them with confidence in the future,” Gagliano said.

In addition to the Breeders’ Cup prohibiting Lasix use in the handful of juvenile races it will conduct in November at Santa Anita Park, the American Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association will follow with “similar rules,” Gagliano said.

The Jockey Club has spent significant resources promoting racing over the last year and market developments have included higher television ratings, increasing handle this year and some encouraging signs in bloodstock sales, he noted, while linking marketing and medication.

“The issues of fan development and medication reform are indeed compatible,” Gagliano said. “We are acutely aware that any and all marketing initiatives will be in vain if we don’t take better care of our athletes and offer current and prospective fans a clean game and a level playing field.”

One of the key components of The Jockey Club’s efforts is the proposed Reformed Racing Medication Rules that officials would like to have adopted in all 38 American racing states. A target of those rules is trainers who repeatedly send out horses racing with medication that is not permitted; only 1% of trainers have had five or more infractions of drug rules yet accounted for 24% of all violations, he said.

“It seems with the current penalty structure in place, crime pays,” Gagliano asserted, noting that penalties would be much harsher for repeat offenders under the reformed rules.

“We cannot accept a scenario in which our medication rules are protecting about 1% of the trainer population, the 1% who repeatedly demonstrate utter disregard of the rules,” he declared. “We need to make changes in order to again thrive as a sport in North America. Believe me, we are fully committed to doing that, and sooner rather than later.” **Cont. p14**

International officials continued to urge the U.S. to change its ways on drugs.

In his keynote address, France Galop President Bertrand Belinguier declared, with exclamation points added to a transcript of his comments, "We must keep firm on our commitment: No medication! No medication at all!"

Louis Romanet, IFHA chairman, praised initial efforts in the U.S., including the work by TOBA that resulted in 70 owners pledging this summer not to run juveniles on Lasix.

"The Jockey Club's core belief that horses should compete only when they are free from the influence of medication sounds like very nice music to my ears," Romanet said, adding in remarks addressed to Gagliano that, "I am sure that everybody in that room today is wishing you good luck to win this strategic battle."

Medication reform also is taking place in South America--and indeed at a faster pace than in the U.S.

Dr. Ignacio Pavlovsky Jr., chairman of the technical council of the Organizacion Sudamericana de Fomento del Sangre Pura de Carrera (OSAF), reported that beginning in January, Lasix will be banned in most

black-type races at OSAF-member racetracks, including Palermo, San Isidro and La Plata in Argentina; Gavea and Cidade Jardim in Brazil; Maronas in Uruguay; Hipodromo de las Americas in Mexico; Hipodromo Montericco in Peru; Presidente Remon in Panama, and Hipodromo de Chile, Club Hipico and Valparaiso in Chile.

South Americans will join with Gagliano and other North American leaders in discussions

on Oct. 9 prior to leaving Paris about forming a Pan American Conference that would aim to unify rules and procedures as much as possible, making a more consistent racing product.

The South American Thoroughbred industry has unique challenges and opportunities. While OSAF members offer about 14.25% of the world's races with 21,999 and have about 15.52% of global runners with 29,363 and 16.33% of foals with more than 17,000, purses and (4.74%) and betting (less than 1%) are far lower.

"There is potential for growth, but the task will not be easy," Romanet observed.

In other business at the conference, Romanet made a presentation to Akitani for his service to IFHA while also working for the Japan Racing Association; Akitani will be returning to Japan in March.

As the connections of Camelot were reminded, the Arc can be one race too many at the end of a demanding season, especially when the ground is very testing. The Coolmore camp had been reminded of this as long ago as 1984, when the admirably consistent Sadler's Wells--tackling his seventh consecutive Group 1--could finish only a moderate eighth to Sagace on heavy ground.

The intervening years have seen Sadler's Wells make ample amends for that below-par Arc effort. He supplied two Arc winners in Carnegie and Montjeu, with Montjeu just managing to wear down the gallant Japanese raider El Condor Pasa in an epic 1999 race. Coincidentally, El Condor Pasa was out of a Sadler's Wells mare. Another of Sadler's Wells's daughters, Leggera, had been beaten only a neck in the previous year's Arc.

Sadler's Wells's sons and daughters have kept up the good work. Montjeu sired the 2005 winner Hurricane Run, with this victory being sandwiched between two triumphs for Sadler's Wells's broodmare daughters. Thawakib became the dam of Sakhee, an impressive winner in 2001, and the unraced Soviet Moon helped thwart another bold Japanese bid when her son Workforce edged out Nakayama Festa in 2010.

And now history has repeated itself, with the Japanese champion Orfevre being worn down by Solemia, a courageous daughter of the Sadler's Wells stallion Poliglote. In other words the Sadler's Wells clan has proved a sizeable hindrance to Japan's Arc ambitions, being involved in each of the three occasions when the Japanese have finished a close second.

For the record, Sadler's Wells's brother Fairy King also sired an Arc winner (Helissio in 1996), as did their three-parts brother Nureyev (Peintre Celebre in 1997). And Youmzain, the frustrating character who finished second in three consecutive Arcs, is another out of a Sadler's Wells mare.

Remarkably, it was Solemia's Arc which provided Poliglote with his first Group 1 success as a stallion in the Northern Hemisphere. He has generally slipped under the radar at Haras d'Etream, but his success in several spheres caught my eye sufficiently for me to write about him in the June 2010 issue of *Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder*.

"When one thinks about Sadler's Wells' successful stallion sons," I wrote, "the names of Montjeu, Galileo, El Prado, High Chaparral and Barathea are generally among the first to spring to mind. But spare a thought for Poliglote, who has been plying his trade at Haras d'Etream since 1998.

"Poliglote was bred well enough for anything, his dam being the very successful broodmare Alexandrie. He lived up to his illustrious bloodlines by winning the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud at two and the G2 Grand Prix d'Evry at four, as well as by finishing second in Celtic Swing's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club. However, he started out at only 35,000 francs, having failed to win in his last season on the track, in a career spent principally over the unfashionable distance of a mile and a half."

To paraphrase the rest of the article, I pointed out that Poliglote had been enjoying a variety of success, notably with his French-bred jumpers. He had ended 2009 as France's leading living sire of jumpers and, after the article appeared, he went on to become France's champion sire of jumpers in 2010. We now have the remarkable situation of Poliglote currently holding top place on both the flat and jumping sectors of French racing.

Although Solemia is one of only three Northern Hemisphere-born group winners on the flat for Poliglote, it was a different story when Poliglote was shuttled to Argentina. He sired seven Group 1 winners there, including a very good filly called Kalath Wells, who became his second winner of the Argentine Oaks, the Premio Seleccion. Cacht Wells, one of these Argentine Group 1 winners, became a Grade II winner in the U.S.

Solemia represents another major triumph for the Wertheimer brothers' first-rate breeding operation. It is appropriate that the brothers' first Arc victory should come with a filly, as their father Jacques owed his Arc victories to those outstanding fillies Ivanjica and Gold River. Solemia's victory must have been all the more satisfying because both her parents, Poliglote and the Group 3 winner Brooklyn's Dance, were bred by the Wertheimer family. For good measure, Poliglote's dam Alexandrie was bred by Jacques Wertheimer, as was Brooklyn's Dance's dam Vallee Dansante, a three-parts sister to Nijinsky's Classic-winning son Green Dancer. Vallee Dansante's sire, the excellent Lyphard, also carried the famous blue and white colors, which in 1972 belonged to Mme Pierre Wertheimer, the grandmother of Solemia's owners.

There are a couple of notable features to Solemia's pedigree.

Firstly, she is inbred 4x4 to Val de Loir, an outstanding French stallion who finished a good third in the 1962 Arc, having earlier won the Prix du Jockey-Club. Val de Loir left a string of top performers over a mile and a half or more, including the Classic winners Val de L'Orne, La Lagune and Lagunette, the Arc second Comtesse de Loire and the Grand Prix de Paris winners Tennyson and Chaparral. At the time, it seemed that Val de Loir would have a long-lasting impact but, like so many of the important European stallions, his name quickly faded in the onslaught of North American-bred stallions, led by Northern Dancer. Appropriately, Solemia is also inbred 3x4 to Northern Dancer.

The other notable aspect is that Solemia is yet another top-class representative of the legendary Sadler's Wells-Shirley Heights cross. Sadler's Wells's 112 foals out of Shirley Heights mares contained 12.5% group winners, headed by those outstanding performers In The Wings and Alexandrova. Among their 14 group winners were Brooklyn's Dance's sons Prospect Wells and Prospect Park, who were, respectively, second in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G1 Prix du Jockey-Club.

Of course the nick gained further advocates when Sadler's Wells did so brilliantly well with mares by Shirley Heights' son Darshaan, with this partnership being responsible for 20 group winners, headed by eight Group 1 winners.

This extraordinary record guaranteed that plenty of Sadler's Wells's sons--nearly 50 of them--were also tried with Shirley Heights mares. While they failed to match their sire's spectacular percentages, they have had their moments. Poliglote is the fourth of them to sire a Group 1 winner, his predecessors being Montjeu (Fame and Glory and Montare), Galileo (Sans Frontieres) and Barathea (Magical Romance). Fame and Glory, Montare and Sans Frontieres all won Group 1 races over distances of at least a mile and three-quarters, so it is hardly surprising that Solemia's stamina (and determination) proved the decisive factor at Longchamp.

Montjeu also sired a major winner from Solemia's female line. Mated to Funsie, a half-sister to Brooklyn's Dance, the resultant colt was Authorized, winner of the Derby and Juddmonte International before disappointing as favorite for the 2007 Arc. This outstanding female line, tracing to Sly Pola, has also hit the Group 1 target in recent years with Makfi, Alhaarth, Quijano, Okawango and Porlezza, so it is still very much alive.



IN SEARCH OF A BETTER BUSINESS MODEL

My Op/ed of September 27th (click [here](#)) detailed the fact that breeders lost more than \$100 million in this year's Keeneland September sale. It's even scarier that breeders collectively *lost a half billion dollars* over the last four years.

No matter how spinners spin the spin, when an already struggling industry loses a half billion dollars in "churn" needed to re-supply the overall system, the only word that comes to mind is *crisis*.

On the surface, this is a crisis for breeders who form the headwaters or main tributary for the revenue stream from which many service providers drink. Below the surface, therefore, those who depend on the auction sales revenue stream will feel the pain. This should be obvious, because as the river shrinks, the fiscal health of every other group will be affected downstream. So when a half billion dollars of churn disappears (along with a lot of breeders and mares) *everyone* should pay attention and start talking about how to make things better.

My main purpose in writing this essay, therefore, is to help stimulate a dialogue that can produce an improved business model for breeding. Plain and simple, basic principles of Economics 101 indicate that making things better for breeders also makes things better for stallion owners, boarding farms, sale companies, consignors and agents, vets, feed and supply providers, transporters, farriers, industry magazines, and insurers, etc.

It's time to make some changes. The historic level of losses for breeders who form the foundation of the revenue pyramid means that sustainability of the business as we have known it is in jeopardy.

If you're not convinced that this is true, or still believe that we had a "good" sale in September with a gross of \$219 million, please reflect on the following. In 1999, the gross for September was \$233 million. That total achieved 13 years ago, however, is really \$322 million in today's dollars (when adjusted for inflation using the CPI). This means that Keeneland's September sale gross in 2013 will have to increase 40% from this year's figure to \$326 million in order to be equivalent to where we were in 1999.

What makes today strikingly different from 13 years ago, however, is the magnitude of cumulative losses that breeders have suffered and are carrying forward. Thus, we now rock unsteadily on the edge of a serious tipping point where breeder resiliency may give way to debilitating weakness.

So what to do? In going forward, we basically have only two choices. (1) We can keep on doing the same things we always do. But then, as Stephen Covey, author of *The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People* writes, "If we keep doing what we're doing, we're going to keep getting what we're getting."

Or (2) we can all acknowledge the crisis and respond to the challenges of a changing financial landscape by identifying proactive strategies and then creating new policies and practices accordingly. I favor this option because I believe that Charles Darwin had it right when he wrote, "It is not the strongest of the species that survives, nor the most intelligent, but the one most responsive to change."

Identifying things that could make a difference. So where can we look for changes that might make a difference in growing our breeding and sales business? Unfortunately, there aren't many places to look.

The most talked about topic is stud fees. If the 10 or 12 individuals who control the small number of "commercial" stallions would drop fees significantly to help breeders stay afloat, it would help a lot; even though stud fees are less than half of production costs (a \$20K fee requires a \$70K yearling sale to break-even). Semen sellers are not likely to drop their prices much, however, because many of them overpaid for their stallion corps and are now stuck trying to protect or recoup their investment. Furthermore, they often have fiduciary responsibilities to share holders that create upward pressure on fees.

Various market factors also operate to keep fees high. Fewer and fewer stallions with commercial luster or bling are available, creating a severe "supply and demand" imbalance. Because breeders must have access to the dwindling number of popular stallions if they want some chance of staying in business, it becomes easy and convenient for most stallion owners to see and treat breeders more as momentary cash cows than as valued, long-term customers.

In addition, stallion owners who control stallions perceived to be "commercial" also form a type of monopoly known as oligopoly. They do not operate in a truly "free" market where widespread competition naturally creates downward pressure on fees. (An oligopoly is a market condition that exists when there are fewer sellers. Oligopolies give sellers a great opportunity to inflate the prices of their goods, especially when demand exceeds supply and buyers have to have the product.) Thus, irrespective of long-term consequences, most stallion owners are inclined to set fees as high as they can because they can. It may not be smart business over time to do so (look what it's done for us, *or to us* to this point), but it gives a better short-term result on the bottom line.

Thus, we aren't likely to find much help in the form of a significant reduction in stud fees anytime soon. So where else can we look? The way contracts are written and terms and incentives are devised is a promising area to explore. **Cont. p18**



It's time to change the contracts. Once upon a time, stallion contracts were universally “live foal – stand and nurse, payable September 1st of year bred.” This has morphed into various payment forms, such as “up front, no guarantee,” “live foal – stand and nurse, payable within 15 or 30 days of foaling,” “out of proceeds,” and “out of proceeds with forgiveness.” Stallion owners have created flex in payment terms in order to justify high prices and to compete with one another.

The problem with all of these formats, however, is that the breeder takes virtually all of the risk. Even the “out of proceeds with forgiveness” concept becomes nothing more than cheese in the mousetrap, because it allows the setting of inflated fees, and when the yearling does not bring the contracted fee, the stallion owner takes all the proceeds and the breeder eats the \$40-100K in other production costs.

In addition, the breeders' risk is magnified because breeders and stallion owners do not share the same time-table. Stallion owners operate annually from February 15th to June 15th. Breeders, however, are on a two and a half year calendar from the time they breed their mare to the time they take their yearling to auction. In a world where a lot can happen in a day, having to spin the wheel for two and a half years can be very punitive, especially in a down market.

Furthermore, with the advent of large (sometimes huge) books, mare owners don't know what they're really getting when they sign on the dotted line. Except in rare instances, they don't know how many mares will be bred to the stallion. In the unwelcome instance where stallions are booked to more than 100 mares, the result is usually a depressing situation for breeders at the sales because they face intensified competition from a very large number of yearlings by the same sire. That is, if they get a live foal and get to the sale. When books are allowed to soar past 100 (and incredibly past 200), breeders are additionally slammed by not being able to get to a stallion when the mare is ready, missing a cover, having to accept lesser semen quality from too many covers on the same day or season, and having more late foals or no foals caused by a backed up breeding shed. These greedy practices add great hidden cost to the price of a stud fee.

Thus, contracts should be required to *specify the maximum number of mares that will be serviced* when the contract is signed. In addition, contracts should include some form of spelled out compensation or credit against fees when and if Kentucky stallion owners sell a stallion out of the country or to a regional market, which leaves the breeder holding the bag with the meter running and a foal in the belly, a foal on the ground, a yearling to sell, or all three.

Universally changing contract terms in these ways to produce a proactive model that shares the risk will greatly help the breeder to stay in place and keep coming back. In the short run, stallion farms may experience reduced revenue from making these changes, but in the long run the new policies will help to grow and perhaps save the business as we know it, for everyone.

Sharing the risk. The concept of shared risk is espoused by B. Wayne Hughes of Spendthrift Farm who knows a thing or two about growing a business, having built a \$17 billion dollar company from scratch. He knows better than any of us that “when the customer comes first, the customer will last.” His “Breed Secure Program” takes payment out of proceeds, but only after the yearling seller gets the first \$12,000.

John Phillips of Darby Dan Farm created a similar concept in 2009 called the “Profit Protection Program.” This, too, is a pay from proceeds contract where the first \$5,000 goes to the breeder and any remaining proceeds are split 50/50 until the advertised stud fee has been paid.

Some meaningful variation of these two concepts needs to be universally adopted by stallion farms at this time of industry crisis.

Sharing the rewards and seeing breeders as partners in making a stallion. B. Wayne Hughes is also a pioneer in this regard. Not only was he outspoken about breeders taking almost “all the risk,” but he established an innovative breeding-right program for breeders at Spendthrift called “Share The Upside.” In this concept, mare owners can earn a limited number of non-equity, life-time breeding rights with no maintenance expense in return for buying a fixed number of initial seasons at market price to help the stallion owner get a new stallion off the ground.

This concept gives the breeder some protection if the stallion is a dud in the sales arena, provides a deserved return on stud fee investment if the stallion hits, secures access to the stallion in future years, and develops customer loyalty for the stallion owner.

Not surprisingly, Rick Porter (another highly successful businessman who knows that appreciating customers makes things better for everyone) utilized the same concept with his promising young stallion, Old Fashioned. This concept should be standard practice whenever any new stallion prospect goes into service.

A last point related to "sharing the rewards" is that breeders should be appreciated with a comp season when they breed a Grade 1 or major stakes winner. That breeder has helped to raise the image of the stallion which often leads to a raised stud fee, and should be rewarded accordingly.

Final comment. As I stated at the top of this Op/ed, my main purpose is to help stimulate a dialogue that can produce an improved business model for breeding. Basic principles of Economics 101 indicate that making things better for breeders also makes things better for every industry group in the long run. As mentioned above, some stallion farms have been innovative and proactive, but there is still tremendous room for creativity with the purpose of generating more total sales revenue and improving the breeding business for all participants.





SARATOGA FALL GETS UNDERWAY

Fasig-Tipton's inaugural Saratoga Fall Mixed & Horses of Racing Age Sale gets underway today at 11 a.m. in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, New York. The setting is familiar, but the backdrop of trees in full foliage and the crisp October air--and outdoor heaters--is a bit of a change from the heat of the August evening yearling sales.

"We're very excited," said Dan Pride, the auction house's executive vice president and COO. "We're really



about a year ahead of what we put on the blackboard, if you will. We thought we'd have this sale in 2013, but then we had a good number of clients that told us, 'If you put it on this year, we'll bring horses.' We ended up having to close the sale and turn horses away. We have 254 in the catalogue, and that's really our capacity for this facility, so we couldn't be happier for the demand for the horses in here."

The New York breeding program has seen an influx of stallions and mares in the last 12 months. According to figures on nybreds.com, the number of foals on the ground in the state from January through May this year is 1,011, a sharp increase from the 725 documented for the same period in 2011. More horses means more of a marketplace, though whether this new sale retains its spot on Columbus Day weekend remains to be seen.

"We really need a three-year window to get a good picture of what this ultimately will look like," Pride explained. "I think this should work on the calendar. It's tough for us internally--we've got four sales in five weeks, between Timonium, here, Kentucky yearlings and the November sale. And, of course, you have to fit it in with the racing schedule in New York. It might get moved around a little bit, but, hopefully, this is a good time of year to have buyers and sellers meet up.

"This is uncharted territory for us up here with the weanlings and the breeding stock," added Pride, who flew in Monday from Lexington. "All I can go on is the demand to get horses in here was great. We've had good response so far. There were 10 buyers on the plane with me from Kentucky that were coming to check it out. We were really counting more on the upper Mid-Atlantic/New York market to support it, so to see some Kentucky bloodstock agents coming to check it out was very encouraging."

With two facilities in the Empire State, Vinery is well-represented at this venue. Derek MacKenzie, Vinery's director of public sales, is hopeful that the VLT-fueled purse increases will continue to spur the bloodstock business in New York.

"It's still good," he noted. "Maybe not as good a vibe as last year, with them not knowing what's going to happen with the political environment, but it's probably the best market in North America, pound for pound."

But it's not just about the purses. In the last six weeks, New York-bred sophomores Willy Beamin (Suave) and The Lumber Guy (Grand Slam) captured the GI King's Bishop S. and GI Vosburgh S., respectively.

"It shows that New York-breds can win at the highest level," MacKenzie noted.

Among the stallions standing at Vinery is Posse, whose first New York-bred crop are yearlings. He was recently represented by GI Del Mar Futurity hero Rolling Fog, and last year his Caleb's Posse was an Eclipse Award finalist.

"He's very popular," MacKenzie added. "He's in the upper echelon here, and it's very easy to fill his book."

In addition to 26 weanlings, Vinery's draft includes a pair of broodmares that received very timely updates

over the weekend. Very Classy Gal (Giant's Causeway), a 9-year-old catalogued as [hip 102](#), sells just three days after her second foal Classy Coco (Not for Love) broke her maiden in the Maryland Million Lassie S. at Laurel. She sells in foal to Dublin. Her barnmate Fighting Jo Jo (Distorted Humor), [hip 175](#), is a 5-year-old carrying her second foal by Bluegrass Cat. Fighting Jo Jo's 2-year-old half-sister Dreaming of Sophia (Lewis Michael) captured Calder's Cassidy S. Saturday afternoon.

It was announced in August that the Vinery operation was on the market, but it's still "business as usual," according to MacKenzie.

"From our understanding, there's no dispersal [planned] of any kind," he explained. "They're looking for a buyer to take it all. So we're going forward like everything's normal. The Simons are very patient." --MK
