THE BUZZ IS BACK AT TATTERSALLS

A palpably livelier session in bright sunshine brought Tattersalls back to life on Tuesday when Yeomanstown Stud's pinhooked son of Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) (lot 931) rocketed from 32,000gns foal to 245,000gns yearling and topped the second day of Book 2.

Turnover for the day was up by 7% on the equivalent session last year to 9,300,500gns, while the average rose by 13% to 44,714gns. The median also received a boost to 35,000gns, an increase of 17%.

An improved clearance rate from the first day was just a point down from 2011 at 87%.

The session-topping colt, who will be trained by Richard Hannon, was claimed by the sale's leading buyers at the halfway stage, Peter and Ross Doyle, for an unnamed client.

"He is from a tough family and looks tough," said Ross Doyle, who had a busy day on Tuesday and added 12 yearlings to the six bought on the first day for a total expenditure of 1,226,000gns. "He is a lovely moving horse with a pedigree and looks. We thought he was the week's standout."

The Doyles had earlier picked up a Teofilo (Ire) filly (lot 869), whose full-sister What Style won a Leopardstown maiden on debut in August for John Oxx after the catalogue was printed. Bought for 100,000gns, she is on her way to France to be trained by Andre Fabre having been selected for Haras du Mezeray. *Cont. p3*

FIVE PROPOSED FOR NYRA BOARD by Mike Kane

Five current members of the New York Racing Association's Board of Directors, including chairman C. Steven Duncker, have been proposed as members of the new NYRA Reorganization Board. New York Governor Andrew Cuomo signed legislation at the end of September that will allow the state to take control of the beleaguered racing association for three years. The governor will appoint eight members, including the chairperson, and the Senate and Assembly two each. None of the state's directors have been announced.

NYRA selected its nominees during a board meeting Oct. 3 and forwarded the names to state officials.

In addition to Duncker, the NYRA trustees moving to the Reorganization Board are Vice Chairman Stuart Subotnick, Stuart S. Janney III, Barry Ostrager and Charles V. Wait. New York Thoroughbred Horseman's Association president Richard Violette is a member of the NYRA board, but will be an ex officio member of the new board. The NYRA board that is being replaced by the state takeover is made up of 25 members, 14 from NYRA and 11 designated by the government.

Duncker has been the NYRA chairman since 2005. Ostrager, a New York attorney, owns Questroyal Stud and is the president of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, while Wait is the chairman, CEO and president of the Adirondack Trust Company. Janney is a breeder-owner, the chairman of Bessemer Trust Company and Bessemer Securities Corp. and the vice-chairman of The Jockey Club. Subotnick is a New York-based businessman who, with his wife, owns Anstus Stable.



On The Up

Mill Reef's grand-daughter Upend has served Peter Player's Whatton Manor Stud well over the years and one of her descendants was to the fore again on Tuesday when selling for 220,000gns. Tony Nerses prevailed in some lively bidding for the Teofilo colt (lot 919), whose dam Poppets Sweetlove (GB (Foxhound) is half-sister to 'The Budapest Bullet', crack sprinter Overdose (GB) (Starborough {GB}). The family also includes last year's G2 San Clemente H. winner Up In Time (GB) (Noverre), who was bought as a yearling in the same ring three years ago by Richard Knight, one of the unsuccessful bidders on the son of Teofilo along with John Ferguson and Ed Sackville.

Nerses advised that the colt, who purchased on behalf of Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar of Authorized fame, will be sent to the team's Blue Diamond Stud just outside Newmarket while a decision is made on his trainer.

"I was very keen to get him," Nerses said. "He has a great pedigree and is a really nice individual."

Nerses later bought lot 1080, an Acclamation filly out of a Red Ransom half-sister to Group 1 winner Cutlass Bay, for 190,000gns.

Earlier in the session, Player, who is assisted at Whatton Manor by his son Ed, sold Overdose's Royal Applause half-brother to breeze-up pinhooker Con Marnane for 35,000gns. His dam Our Poppet (Ire) (Warning {GB}), is one of five mares on the stud descending from Upend.

"It all started when I bought Upend's dam *Gay Charlotte in the 1970s from Colonel Gray, who was my mentor in this business," Player recalled. "We sent Upend to [trainer] Henry Cecil and, above all other people, he was the one who really got us going when my wife and I were first starting off. He has been so supportive ever since and has bought plenty of horses from us over the years."

While this particular branch of the family boasts a European champion sprinter, another of Gay Charlotte's daughters, High Gait (GB), was the dam of the champion stayer on the flat and champion hurdle winner Royal Gait (GB).

Whatton Manor Stud also sold a Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) colt (lot 603) on the opening day of Book 2, who was one of a number of good pinhooks of the sale. Bought as a foal for €20,000 at Goffs, he sold to Alastair Donald for 90,000gns. **Cont. p5**

"We're absolutely thrilled with the sale so far," said Player. "We feel extremely fortunate to have had a horse like the Teofilo colt. He never put a foot wrong and he had more shows than I can remember any of our horses ever having."

"This game is as much a game of chance as anything else, but I must say Ed has done a great job and has the horses looking absolutely superb."

A Little More Galileo Magic

There was only one Galileo (Ire) yearling in Book 2 and, needless to say, the daughter of G3 Brownstown S. winner Redstone Dancer (Ire) (Namid {GB}) was the most expensive filly sold all day. Knocked down for 205,000gns to Adrian Nicholl of BBA Ireland, she will make her way back across the Irish Sea to race for a partnership.

"I can't tell you yet where she is going," Nicholl said. "She is out of a stakes winner and is a good model, we liked her a lot."

Galileo's stud-mate High Chaparral (Ire) also featured among the 18 six-figure lots on Tuesday when his son out of the Spectrum (Ire) mare Rainbow Queen (Fr) was sold to M.V. Magnier for 125,000gns. The colt was consigned by Voute Sales on behalf of his breeders Bob and Pauline Scott, who raced his dual-winning half-brother Sir Isaac (GB) (Key Of Luck).

Third Time Lucky?

In the unbeaten G2 Champagne S. winner Toronado (Ire) (Hurricane Run ({Ire})) and listed winner Havana Gold (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), owners Fiona Carmichael and Chris Humber have enjoyed a terrific season and they reinvested some of the money earned from selling Havana Gold to Qatar Racing just prior to his win in the G3 Somerville Tattersall S. by paying 160,000gns for lot 989.

Bought by Amanda Skiffington, who also purchased Toronado and Havana Gold, the Royal Applause (GB) colt is out of Rolexa (GB) (Pursuit Of Love {GB}), whose 3-year-old Seveteen Seventy (GB) (Byron {GB}) is unbeaten in two starts this year.

"He's going to [trainer] Richard Hannon," said Skiffington, who had to fight off a determined Angus Gold, acting on behalf of Shadwell. "He's a gorgeous horse and he's by a sire I've had lots of luck with."

The sale represented yet another pinhooking triumph, this time for David Cox and David Myerscough of Baroda & Colbinstown Studs, who bought him as a foal for 45,000gns.

"It's been a fantastic day," said Cox. "It was a bit patchy yesterday and we were worried, but we'd heard that there were some better horses today and things do seem to have picked up. There's plenty of buzz about the place. I really hope he works out well for Mr. Hannon, and we wish him and the owners the best of luck."

Going Dutch

Cheveley Park Stud welcomed their new stallion Mayson (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) to his new home in Newmarket yesterday afternoon and he will have his work cut out to match the great start made by his new stable-mate Dutch Art (GB) (Medicean {GB}), who was leading first-season sire in Europe in 2011 and continues to be popular with purchasers. Cheveley Park's manager Chris Richardson added one of his daughters to the stud's battalions for next season when bidding 100,000gns for [lot 915](#), a March-born filly out of the unraced Cape Cross mare Poldhu, who was another offered by Baroda & Colbinstown Studs. Once again Angus Gold featured as underbidder. The filly was a 30,000gns weanling purchase by Ben McElroy at the Tattersalls December sale.

"Mrs. Thompson is keen to support Dutch Art and this filly moves really well, which is what attracted her to Mrs. Thompson when she saw her yesterday," said Richardson. "It was unfortunate to run into Shadwell."

Dutch Art has had 12 yearlings sell during the first two days of Book 2 for an average of 42,625gns.

Bahamian in Demand Dgain

Like Bushranger (Ire), who is proving to be one of this season's hottest freshman sires, 18-year-old Bahamian Bounty (GB) also won the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. in consecutive outings. Following a good season with the likes of stakes winners Sendmylovetorse (GB), Cay Verde (GB) and Baileys Jubilee (GB), the National Stud resident is enjoying renewed interest in the sales ring, with Shadwell's Angus Gold describing his 150,000gns purchase out of the Rock ff Gibraltar mare Rock Lily (GB) (lot 987) as his "pick of the week."

"I just loved him from the minute I saw him," said Gold of the Kathryn Stud-bred colt who was consigned by Bumble Mitchell. His 2-year-old half-brother Botanic Garden (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) has twice been listed-placed for trainer William Haggas this season.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club also picked up a Bahamian Bounty colt on the first day of Book 2 for 120,000gns, while shrewd breeze-up operative Willie Browne went to 42,000gns for the Trickledown Stud-consigned colt out of Pappas Ruby (Red Ransom).

Bahamian Bounty, who stood for £8,500 last season, has a Book 2 average of 45,727gns for 11 yearlings sold.

Leading Ladies

Late in the session, Hugo Lascelles was pushed to 170,000gns by Charlie Liverton for a daughter of the now-retired Selkirk (Sharpen Up{GB}) from the Cliveden Stud-bred Kingmambo mare Sister Maria (lot 1069).

Having secured the Watership Down Stud-consigned filly for an unnamed English owner/breeder, Lascelles offered, "She's a very good-looking filly, athletic and a good model. She'll be trained in England. She's a good outcross as there's very little Northern Dancer blood [in her pedigree]."

The filly's half-sister Apothecary (GB) Manduro {Ger} has won twice and was fourth in the Listed Ballymacoll Stud S. this season behind subsequent G1 Irish Oaks winner Great Heavens (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

Four lots later, Liverton succeeded in buying a filly by Australian champion sire Fastnet Rock (Aus) (Danehill) for 130,000gns. She will be trained by John Gosden and will run in the colours of Robin Geffen, who co-owns 2010 G1 St Leger winner Arctic Cosmos (North Light {Ire}) with Gosden's wife Rachel Hood.

Also among the top fillies of the session was a Dubawi filly (lot 1012) from Hillwood Stud, consignor of G2 Mill Reef S. winner Moohaajim (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) at Tattersalls' Craven Sale in April. Bought by John Ferguson for 155,000gns, her American-bred dam Saabiq (Grand Slam) was listed-placed and has already produced two winners, Saaboog (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}) and Hajam (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), both of whom are trained in Newmarket by James Tate.

DIALED IN TO DARBY DAN

Dialed In (Mineshaft--Miss Doolittle, by Storm Cat), winner of last year's GI Florida Derby, has been retired and will stand the 2013 breeding season at John Phillips' Darby Dan Farm in Lexington. "This horse will be as bittersweet of a story for me as I'll ever have," said trainer Nick Zito. He was up there with Unbridled's Song, Bellamy Road, Commentator, War Pass, all of them. I am passionate about him." A \$475,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling purchase by Robert LaPenta, Dialed In retires with three wins from seven starts and earnings of \$941,936.

The 4-year-old has been acquired by a group led by Doug Cauthen of Doug Cauthen Thoroughbred Management LLC, and Robert Hammond, General Manager of Darby Dan Farm. "I have a great feeling about Dialed In," said Cauthen. "He's a gorgeous horse who exudes class, and his pedigree is top notch. Throw in his raw talent, as displayed by his acceleration in his graded stakes wins, and it makes him a very exciting stallion prospect. To launch his career at Darby Dan alongside Shackleford in 2013 only adds to the synergy of this deal." LaPenta will maintain an equity position in the stallion, who joins GI Preakness S. winner and first-year sire **Shackleford** (Forestry) next year at the Lexington nursery. "We are actively striving to strengthen our stallions and sales divisions at Darby Dan, and any time you can add a pair of exciting Grade I winners like Dialed In and Shackleford to a growing stallion roster, it plays a key role in that process," said Hammond. "We've assembled a great team here at Darby Dan, and I think we're all energized about what the future holds." A stud fee will be announced at a later date.

MICHAEL HILLS TO RETIRE

Just months after his twin brother Richard relinquished his rider's licence in March, Michael Hills has revealed he will do so too at the end of the current season. Hills, who is stable jockey for brother Charlie, has ridden over 2,000 career winners and steered Just the Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) to victory in Saturday's G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket. Champion apprentice of Britain in 1983, Hills' highlights include the 1995 G1 Irish Champion S. and 1996 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. riding Pentire (GB) (Be My Guest), and the 1996 G1 Epsom Derby aboard Shaamit (Ire) (Mtoto {GB}). "If you can manage to get to your late 40s and still be able to ride group winners, and ride at a good level, I think you have done extremely well, but I'll be 50 in January," explained Hills. "The last thing I wanted was to go on too far, and I'd hate for people to walk off the stand saying that guy should just give up. I'd love to hang around for the filly [Just the Judge] and other horses next year, but when the time's right, I think the time's right. There's nothing like riding and I shall miss the camaraderie of the weighing room. It's a character-building place and those there have become a sort of family."

FRANKEL HALF-BROTHER DEBUTS TODAY

Three days before his illustrious full-brother Frankel (GB) (Galileo [Ire]) bows out at Ascot, half-brother Morpheus (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) makes his debut at Nottingham. Set for the British Stallion Studs Supporting British Racing EBF Maiden S. over an extended mile trip, the Sir Henry Cecil trainee was described as "racier" than Frankel by Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe. "He's a nice, promising colt, no question about that, but they're different types of horse," he said. "They look different. He's not quite as robust--a racier type, if you like, although having said that there isn't much racier than Frankel. Is he going to be Frankel? I hope so, but it's unlikely."




Welfare & Safety of the Racehorse Summit

WELFARE SUMMIT BEGINS IN LEXINGTON

The fourth Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit began its two-day run yesterday in Lexington, Kentucky. A full line-up of industry professionals talked about some of the most pressing issues of the day, including track safety, medication reform and horse welfare. Organized by the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation and The Jockey Club and held at the Keeneland sales pavilion, the Summit is being emceed by Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation President Edward Bowen.

One of the highlights of the day was a presentation by respected veterinarian Larry Bramlage of Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital on the effects of racing and training on a horse's skeleton. Bramlage diagramed the step-by-step process of building strong and durable bones. "Training always does little bits of damage, and the bone is always repairing," said Bramlage. "The skeleton adapts to the work you show it."

Perhaps counter intuitively, it isn't the duration of the work that strengthens bones, but intensity. "Hearts and lungs need *volume* of work, bone trains to the *level* of work," Bramlage said, adding that "short bursts of speed," as little as a furlong, can build optimal bone.

Too much can be too much, however. For young horses, too much speed over too long a distance in young horses can produce bucked shins. "It's a horse's way of saying, 'I can't build skeleton that fast,'" said Bramlage.

Another heavyweight in equine care, Dr. Wayne McIlwraith, presented a lecture titled "Corticosteroids and the Horse in Training." McIlwraith said he is a proponent of corticosteroids, which he described as "potent anti-inflammatory agents used to treat a broad range of medical conditions," but warned that not all are created equal. He said some have shown to be effective without long-term damage to joint cartilage--corticosteroids are often injected into joints and cartilage damage has been a lingering concern--while others can't make that claim. **Cont. p12**

Honest Look at Training...

A trio of respected horse trainers--Kellyn Gorder, Tom Proctor and Phil Sims--touched on several challenges and issues facing modern-day conditioners in a panel moderated by The Jockey Club's Cathy O'Meara.

Much of the talk focused on the use of medication use, including clenbuterol, a bronchodilator believed to have steroidal effects. This year, California made news by lengthening the withdrawal time for clenbuterol from 10 days before a race to 21 days

Asked if they thought the use of the drug was coming under fair criticism, Gorder commented, "In some cases it is misused. If you have a stable of 100 horses and everyone is on it everyday, it's a little sketchy. But it's a therapeutic drug, and if you have a horse who comes back [from a race] and scopes bad, you want to be able to use it."

Proctor said he thought the three-week withdrawal time was too much, saying he thought a five-day withdrawal period was sufficient.

"With 21 days, if you have a horse that has a respiratory issue, you're going to put him on a 14-day program, and then you'd have another 21 days after that," he said.

Team Valor's Barry Irwin later asked Proctor about the durability of the breed.

"I think the breed's fine, but I think of some of the things we put horses through when they're young," he said. "Sometimes horses go through as many as three sales before they have a saddle on their back. I actually prefer horses who didn't sell, or maybe who just went through one sale."

Proctor added that, in general, he isn't a fan of juvenile sales. "I think 2yo-in-training sales ruin a lot of horses," he said. "You'll get some who are good and compete in all the big races, but the rest? I think 80 or 90% are being destroyed."

Track Surface & Safety...

Dr. Mick Peterson, co-founder of the Racing Surfaces Testing Laboratory in Orono, Maine, spoke about the efforts to understand track dynamics as it relates to breakdowns. Established in 2009 following the previous year's Welfare and Safety Summit, the Surfaces Testing Laboratory can perform more than 18 tests on synthetic and dirt racing surfaces, and has thus far conducted tests on over 70 samples from racing and training surfaces in the U.S. and abroad.

Peterson said they've learned much. Races conducted over synthetic surfaces have lower rates of breakdowns than those on turf, which in turn have lower rates of breakdowns than those on dirt.

But Peterson said it's not as simple as that. He noted that safety records at dirt tracks can vary greatly, and that the safest dirt tracks approach the safety levels of synthetic tracks.

Peterson said the amount of moisture in a given surface can be important factor in the safety of tracks, most notably on dirt surfaces, where the risk of a catastrophic distal limb fracture can be increased by as much as 30% over an off track.

But the biggest issue affecting track safety isn't precipitation, said Peterson. It's data, or a lack of it, about the daily maintenance of racetracks. "If we can understand the differences between the best tracks and the tracks still struggling to reducing catastrophic injuries, then we can begin to reduce that margin," he said. "But we need information."

To that end, Peterson talked about the importance of a Racing Surfaces database, and said that tracks including Keeneland and Arlington are already contributing information such as track temperature, weather conditions, etc., providing in some cases by GPS equipment attached to tractors grooming the track.

"Only a small minority of tracks have a systematic approach to maintenance," added Peterson. "We need to understand our best maintenance protocols for climate and track material. We need to be proactive, rather than reactive." **Cont. p13**

The success or failure of a particular track can oftentimes rest on the shoulders of one man or woman--the track superintendent--and a track can be "one retirement away from having a whole different surface," said Peterson.

Peter said the industry can take much from the John Ruskin quote: "Quality is never an accident, it's a result of intelligent effort."

McCarron On Being Whip Smart...

Chris McCarron knows something about whip use...and misuse. "I was fined 12 times and \$3,400 for misuse of the whip," admitted the retired Hall of Fame jockey. "It's not a stat I'm proud of; it's quite embarrassing. [When I was young], I thought my job was to *make* horses run, but as I got older, I learned my job is to *coax* them to run. Not to beat the crap out of them."

McCarron, who won nine Breeders' Cup races and six Triple Crown races, said he'd like to see change in the way some jockeys use the whip. Yesterday, he shared some lessons he learned, lessons that he teaches to his students at the riding school he helped found, the North American Racing Academy.

McCarron said it's not just where a horse is struck with a whip, but during what part of its stride it is being hit.

"When horses is fully extended, the flank area is fully exposed, and that's typically where horses take the most punishment, where they feel the sting most," he said.

McCarron used videos of several races in New York--neither horses nor riders were identified--to show proper whip use. He said the best time to strike with the whip is when the horse's head is up, meaning all four feet are pulled underneath its body.

"I'm not an advocate for banning the stick or limiting the number of strikes," McCarron said. "I rode a lot of horses who had a tendency to pull themselves up after they made the lead, like [Kentucky Derby winner] Alysheba. But stewards and junior officials need to have to understand how the crop should be used."

Rather than a national rule, McCarron said he encourages track stewards to adopt "house rules" at their tracks.

Pre-Race Inspections...

Pre-race inspections help keep horses and jockeys safe, and the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission's Equine Medical Director Dr. Mary Scollay showed why during a post-lunch session yesterday. Scollay, with the help of a few assistants and an equine participant, took a crowd gathered along Keeneland's rear walking ring through some of the procedures used by KHRC veterinarians.

The typical pre-race exam, she explained, would include horse identification, a general assessment of the horse, the palpation and manipulation of forelimbs, and an evaluation of the horse jogging.

Scollay said a study of two Florida tracks--Calder and Gulfstream--from 2000 through 2010 helped underscore the importance of pre-race exams, and the resulting scratching of horses.

During that decade, the study looked at 407 case horses that were scratched prior to a race because he or she failed a pre-race examination. As a control group, the study used 814 horses chosen from "target" races, in this case the races out of which the case horses were scratched.

Of those 407 horses that were scratched, 88 (21.55%) did not start again, suggesting the presence of a serious condition that precluded the horse's continued racing. By way of comparison, only 24 of the 814 control horses (2.9%) did not start again.

Scollay admitted the problem with raceday exam is the "illusion of soundness," and explained how Kentucky has expanded its pre-race inspection protocol to include exercise history (past performances), review of race replays, post-race observations (how a horse cools out, etc.), drug-testing results and "intelligence."

Parkin Reports on EID...

Tim Parkin, a Research Fellow at the University of Glasgow, reported on the most recent analysis of information from the Equine Injury Database (EID). The EID was first proposed at the 2006 Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit and launched by The Jockey Club in July of 2008. Parkin said that analysis revealed that horses in claiming races were 1.8 times more likely to suffer a fatal breakdown than horses in non-claiming races. He added that a number of factors had been identified that could help track officials monitor at-risk horses, including whether a horse was intact (intact males were three times more likely to have a lower-limb fracture than geldings and females); ratio of purse to claiming price (2.4 times more likely if the purse was 1.8 times the size of the claiming price); and class drops (three times more likely if a horse is dropped more than \$12,000 in claiming price vs. those who remain at the same level or are raised).

Synthetic tracks, meanwhile, continue to boast a strong safety record. Over the past three years, horses have suffered catastrophic injuries at a rate of 1.3 per 1,000 starts, compared to 1.6 on turf and 2.0 on dirt, Parkin said. Participants of the database include 89 flat tracks and all National Steeplechase Association tracks, accounting for 93% of all flat-racing days and all steeplechase races.

The second and final day of the Summit gets underway this morning at 8:30 a.m. at the Keeneland sales pavilion. The public is invited to attend.

NY STUDY EXAMINES ECONOMIC IMPACT

New York's equine industry says it had a \$4.2-billion economic impact and generated 33,000 full-time jobs in the state last year.

The figures were in a report commissioned by the New York Horse Racing and Agriculture Industry Alliance that was released Tuesday during a press conference at the State Capitol in Albany. The alliance was formed in December 2011 by Thoroughbred and Standardbred breeding and horsemen's organizations and the New York Farm Bureau.

Commissioned in May, the report was made public 50 weeks after the long-awaited Resorts World New York Casino with video lottery terminals opened at Aqueduct Racetrack in Queens. Legislation was passed in 2001 that permitted VLTs at tracks, but the racino that would produce revenue for the New York Racing Association's three tracks and Thoroughbred breeders was delayed for a decade. Since it opened and revenue began flowing into purses and breeding awards this year, those segments of the business have grown, but there has been criticism that too much money was being spent on the racing industry.

Statistics in the report showed that the equine industry is spread over 1.3 million acres of farm land in every one of the state's 62 counties, includes 157,500 horses and produced \$187 million in state and local taxes.

According to the report, there were 23,100 horses connected to racing in the state in 2011 and that the economic impact per horse was \$92,100. It concluded that there are eight jobs related to every 10 racehorses in the state.

Rick Violette Jr., president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said the equine industry is a very important engine helping to drive the state's economy.

"When you look at the numbers, it's eye-opening," he said. "The study shows, in black and white, that every horse in New York is a potent job creator. The horse should be our state animal. But it comes as no surprise that the equine industry creates tens of thousands of jobs. There is so much that goes into the raising and training of a horse. It is a very labor-intensive business."


Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, said the last study was done in 2005. While he fully expected the report--produced for the alliance by the Innovation Group--to show increases, Cannizzo said he was surprised by one of the major findings.

"That there was a 75% growth figure from where it was in 2005," Cannizzo said. "A lot of it came from the harness industry. Because of the racino structure, which has been in place for Standardbreds for several years, they have grown tremendously. In the last year, a lot of the same things have happened in the Thoroughbred industry."

Over the last decade, the number of Standardbred broodmares in the state has grown 25%, and stud fees for New York's Standardbred stallions has risen 140%.

"I think our growth will trump the harness growth in terms of size and quantity," Cannizzo said. "I think we're growing to grow more quickly."

The report was released 50 weeks after the long-awaited Resorts World New York Casino with video lottery terminals opened at Aqueduct Racetrack in Queens. Legislation was passed in 2001 that permitted VLTs at tracks, but the racino that would produce revenue for the New York Racing Association track and Thoroughbred breeders was delayed for a decade. The state's Thoroughbred breeding industry began to expand immediately after the announcement in September 2010 that the Genting Group of Malaysia had been selected to develop the Aqueduct casino. It was reversal on the course of the previous five years during which 100 of the state's 400 Thoroughbred farms went out of business and the foal crop dropped 34%. The 2012 figures, which were not included in the alliance's report, show that between 550 and 600 broodmares were relocated to New York from other states and a 39% increase in the foal crop was reported in May.

Meanwhile, handle has increased at the meets held at NYRA's tracks.

Cannizzo said a 40% increase in mares bred in the state is the beginning of the growth cycle produced by the opening of Genting's Aqueduct racino.

"And I think it going to happen again," he said. "All of the farms that I've talked to are continuing to grow. A lot of them are actually booked in full and people I've been talking to are buying acreage. **Cont. p2**
