Zayat Stables' Paynter (Awesome Again), a late addition to the nominees for the Secretariat Vox Populi Award, edged out Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) to receive top honors for 2012. After finishing a close second in the GI Belmont S. in June, the TDN Rising Star" captured the GI Haskell S. in July, but then battled through bouts of colitis and laminitis.

I am even more convinced that the industry must continue to diligently fight laminitis. The progress we have made to date clearly benefited Paynter--a beautiful colt with a tremendous spirit."

Throughout the 3-year-

old's hospitalization and rehabilitiation, owner Ahmed Zayat and his son Justin continuously tweeted updates about his condition, signing off with #PowerUpPaynter.

"Go Paynter Go!!!" Ahmed Zayat tweeted after learning that his colt won the Vox Populi. "Thank you, fans!"

Justin Zayat added, "Very thankful for everyone involved with Paynter--vets, grooms, trainers, blacksmiths. Team effort!"

Paynter was recently cleared to return to training, and is expected to rejoin the Bob Baffert string in California Saturday. That afternoon, Chenery will present the custom-made trophy to the colt's connections.

The Vox Populi Award recognizes the horse whose popularity and racing excellence best resounded with the American public and gained recognition for Thoroughbred racing. The inaugural winner was Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}), and Rapid Redux (Pleasantly Perfect) took the award last year.

#10. Beholder - 6f Allowance - Santa Anita Oct. 4

Two-year-old fillies just aren't supposed to run as fast as Beholder (Henny Hughes) did here in her dirt debut,

which proved a springboard to victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and probable Eclipse honors. Coming off a nose defeat at the hooves of Executive privilege in the GI Del Mar Debutante, the bay carved out an opening quarter in :21.50 (nine Moss Pace Figure points above

par) while traveling well within herself. She'd never have to work harder than that as she lengthened her advantage to 11 lengths on the line. 
#9. Questing (GB) - GI Alabama S. - Saratoga Aug. 18

Questing (Hard Spun)'s sophomore season might've ended with a puzzling non-effort in the GI Breeders' Cup

Ladies' Classic, but she was as sharp as could be in the Alabama. Fresh off a commanding victory in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks, the Godolphin colorbearer carved out opening fractions of :22.84 and :46.01 --seemingly suicidal for the 10-furlong contest.



She overcame her early exertions--and some very erratic behavior in the stretch--however, to report home nine lengths clear at the line in what might have been the most impressive run of the entire Saratoga meet. Runner-up In Lingerie, who was eight lengths clear of the third-place finisher that day, returned to annex the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. next out. Click for the brisnet.com chart. #8. Groupie Doll - GI BC F/M Sprint - Santa Anita Nov. 3

Her win in the GI Humana Distaff could also easily have made this list, but a tougher field and trip at Santa

Anita makes Groupie's Doll (Bowman's Band)'s showing at the Breeders' Cup stand out. Made the deserving evenmoney favorite that day, the 4-year-old's biggest obstacle was her outside post. That draw did hurt her as she was hung widest of all in mid-pack, but when rider Rajiv Maragh gave his cue, she quickly

gobbled up the leaders to best Dust and Diamonds by 4 1/2 lengths. According to Trakus data, Groupie Doll traveled 17 feet more than the runner-up (good for about two lengths), who recently took the GIII Sugar Swirl S. after selling at Fasig-Tipton November. #7. Shackleford - GI Metropolitan H. - Belmont May 28

This race has perhaps been forgotten a bit by now, but it may have been the most exciting event of the

year. The field was jam-packed with big names--Shackleford (Forestry) was looking to add another Grade I trophy to the previous year's Preakness title; 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Caleb's Posse was hoping to atone for a pair of tough beats from fellow Met Mile runners Jackson Bend and Caixa Eletronica; favored To Honor and Serve listed the previous season's GI Cigar Mile

H. on his C.V.; and Saginaw was coming in off a four-race win streak. Shackleford set a solid pace while Caleb's Posse bided his time in last early, but they struck the wire only a nose apart. #6. Game On Dude - GI Hollywood Gold Cup - Betfair Hollywood Park July 7

Game On Dude (Awesome Again) sat firmly atop the older male division until his clunker at the Breeders' Cup

thanks to five excellent stateside starts. It's hard to really pick just one from those that stands out, but he probably overcame the most adversity when winning the Hollywood Gold Cup. The 5-year-old was somewhat headstrong as he chased an overmatched longshot through hot splits, and he probably struck the front and opened up too soon when Chantal Sutherland could no longer keep him switched off. Accomplished fellow Bob Baffert trainee (at the

time) Richard's Kid loomed boldly at the head of the lane, but Game On Dude found another gear to check in 1 1/4 lengths clear. Click for the brisnet.com chart or Video, sponsored by Taylor Made Sales.

#5. Dullahan - GI Pacific Classic S. - Del Mar Aug. 26 Dullahan (Even the Score) probably proved himself a bit of a synthetic track specialist this year, but he sure

was impressive in the Pacific Classic. Shipped out to California off a dull fifth in the GI Haskell Invitational S., the Donegal Racing runner bounced right back to turn in the best performance of his career and defeat the top older horse in the country at the time in the process.



Game on Dude was in his own backyard and turned for home with a clear advantage, but he couldn't hold back Dullahan's powerful late surge, settling for second by a half-length. Dullahan's 111 Beyer Speed Figure was the highest earned by a 3-year-old in 2012, and his run was made more impressive by the fact that he covered 18 feet more than the runner-up. #4. Royal Delta - GII Fleur de Lis H. - Churchill Downs June 16

Whether or not Royal Delta (Empire Maker) was still the same horse at four as she was the year before was

unknown coming into the Fleur de Lis. A well-beaten second in her seasonal debut in Gulfstream's GIII Sabin S. in February, the now Besilu representative could do no better than ninth with a bit of trouble in the G1 Dubai World Cup. She left little doubt that her form was still top notch,

however, in this return to one of her favorite venues, snatching command readily on the turn and cruising home to an 11-length drubbing without new pilot Mike Smith moving a muscle. Click for the brisnet.com chart or Video, sponsored by Taylor Made Sales.

#3. Fort Larned - GI BC Classic - Santa Anita Nov. 3

Sure, Fort Larned (E Dubai) and Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) simply ran one-two all the way around the

track without ever facing any resistance from anyone else in the BC Classic, but it's hard to deny that both ran huge, potential bias or not. Fort Larned posted solid early splits of :23.20, :46.50 and 1:10.12 as he got away from Mucho Macho Man down the backside, but the latter seemed poised to blow right on by at the top of the lane. There was no way Fort Larned would relinquish the lead, however, and he dug in determinedly to hold on by a half-length. The winner earned a gaudy

#2. Bodemeister - GI Kentucky Derby (2nd) - Churchill Downs May 5

Bodemeister (Empire Maker) holds the distinction of being the only horse to make it onto this list for a losing

effort, as no serious handicapper could have watched this year's Derby and conclude anything other than that he was much the best. Much was made before the first Saturday in May of the presence of the speedy but questionably spotted Trinniberg (who, of course, took the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at a more realistic distance for him) and how he might impact favored Bodemeister. Rather than rate just

off the fleet-footed longshot as most expected, 'Bode' and Mike Smith opted to seize command early through a kamikaze half in :45.39 (15 points above par on the Moss Pace Figure scale). The Zayat Stables representative busted the race open turning for home to lead by daylight at the head of the lane, but succumbed to I'll Have Another's advances in the final sixteenth to miss by 1 1/2 lengths. He'd drop another tough one to I'll Have Another in the Preakness after setting much more reasonable splits and was subsequently retired. Had the dynamics of the Derby been different, it's quite possible that a different sophomore would have been bidding for a Triple Crown. #1. Wise Dan - GIII Ben Ali S. - Keeneland Apr. 22

Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) turned in nothing but big

performances this season--and that's why he's the favorite to be named Horse of the Year--but no effort was more jaw-dropping than his 2012 debut. Off since a convincing score in Churchill's GI Clark H. the previous November, Wise Dan was about as dominant as a horse can be in the Ben Ali. Pilot John Velazquez tried to rate the Fink homebred early, but he wasn't having any of it as he tugged his way to the front while always out wide. He never showed any signs of slowing after grabbing command down the backstretch, and powered




Hawthorne EHV-1 Update:

Officials at Hawthorne Race Course issued an update yesterday about the equine herpes virus-1 (EHV-1) situation that has kept the track under quarantine since October. "Last week, we had a pair of horses which were in quarantine test negative and return to their original barns," the statement read. "We are expecting test results back on six more horses that are in quarantine today. Should those horses test negative, they may also return to their barn.

"Unfortunately, a horse that was being monitored while in quarantine deceased Dec. 24," the statement continued. "The horse had tested positive for EHV-1 Dec. 12 and has been transported to University of Illinois for a necropsy. No additional horses have been moved to quarantine since Dec. 12, thus leaving that as the day the 'clock' reset for a possible lifting of the quarantine. That leaves the timeframe as of today for a possible removal of quarantine sometime around Jan. 10."

For the second straight year, Santa Anita Park and HRTV will partner on a non-fiction film festival competition entitled "A Day at the Races." The festival is open to filmmakers and film students producing Santa Anita-based films with a maximum running time of five minutes. Entries will again be judged by a panel of racing and entertainment professionals and this year's competition will feature expanded prize money to include the top five entries. First prize will be \$10,000, with second prize at \$5,000, while third through fifth prizes will be \$3,000, \$1,500, and \$500, respectively. An additional \$10,000 first prize will be awarded to the winner through an online poll. Also new this year, those entries judged to be in sixth through 10th places will receive free entry to the 2014 edition of the competition.

(While entries are accepted online, credentials must be picked-up, and payment must be made, at Santa Anita.) The competition will continue through March 24, and all film submissions will be due no later than March 27. Online voting will begin on March 30, and will close on April 10. In addition to the expansion of prize money, this year's general entry fee has been reduced to \$100 and students (with valid student identification) may enter for \$25 by Feb. 1. Those entering after that date may do so for \$150 and \$50, respectively. Also, each entrant will be given two film festival credentials which will allow shooting access to select public areas at Santa Anita, and receive 10 Clubhouse passes good for admission throughout Santa Anita's winter/spring meeting.

"The initial year of this project was very successful and we're very excited to see this year's entries," said Amy J. Zimmerman, executive producer for HRTV. "The entries we received in 2012 highlighted the outstanding talents and creativity of so many quality filmmakers, and we're looking forward to showing the public the 2013 submissions as the entrants offer their take on the beauty, sport and history that makes up 'A Day at the Races' at Santa Anita Park."
