COOLMORE BUYS INTO VERRAZANO

Coolmore, which purchased a stake in subsequent juvenile champion Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) last fall, has added another GI Kentucky Derby hopeful to its roster, obtaining a stake in Let's Go Stable's **Verrazano** (More Than Ready). "The Coolmore team of Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Mrs. John Magnier have purchased a stake in

Verrazano and will race him in partnership with Let's Go Stable," confirmed Bryan Sullivan, who, along with Kevin Scatuorchio, manages the Let's Go Stable. "We have a long association with Coolmore, as Kevin's father James raced Scat Daddy [Johannesburg], who has made such a great start to his stud career at Ashford." Verrazano was tabbed a **TDN Rising Star** after his 7 3/4-length debut victory at Gulfstream Jan. 1. He solidified his place on the Derby trail with a 16 1/4-length romp in a one-mile allowance in Hallandale Feb. 2. "We started a dialogue before the horse ran last week and we got some terms completed this week and got the deal done," Sullivan added. "They're good at managing horses and they're good partners. If this horse is to go on and be as successful as we hope he can be, this horse has a future in maybe two hemispheres, and I think they can accomodate that as well."

FRANKEL GETS A LITTLE BROTHER

Juddmonte Farms announced that Kind (Ire) (Danehill) produced a full-brother to the peerless Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) Feb. 2 at Banstead Manor Stud. The blaze-faced chestnut colt, described by stud manager as "attractive, with size and scope," is also a sibling to Group 3 winners Noble Mission (GB) (Galileo) and Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells). Philip Mitchell, general manger at Banstead Manor Stud, said, "We are delighted with Kind's latest

foal and she will return to visit Galileo in 2013." Kind's 3-year-old colt Morpheus (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), like Frankel trained by Sir Henry Cecil, was unplaced in his lone outing last season. Now 12, Kind has a 2-year-old Oasis Dream filly. She was barren to Galileo last year.

FASIG-TIPTON ADDS SUMMER RACING AGE SALE

Fasig-Tipton has announced that it will hold a new horses of racing age sale July 15 at its headquarters in Lexington, Kentucky. The single-session sale will immediately follow the July yearling sale, but will have its own identity and catalogue. "In the Thoroughbred world, this auction will feature many changes in the way active racehorses are marketed," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "To now, selling a racehorse has been dominated by private negotiation. Sellers have been at a distinct disadvantage, because this process limits competitive bidding. We are looking to change that." The sale will harness numerous technological advances. The printed catalogue will be available only on the sales grounds just prior to the sale, allowing entries to be accepted up to around a week before the sale. A highly interactive catalogue will be available on the Fasig-Tipton website, including entries, pedigrees, race records, race videos, and workout information. E-mail alerts will be used to provide updates to potential buyers, and current digital radiographs will be provided for all entries. "For a horse coming off a good race or showing good form, the mid-summer timing of the sale is ideal," Browning added. "We're confident that a broader buying base, especially encouraging trainers to come to Lexington, will have a positive impact on both the yearling and the racehorse sale. We are excited to bring the auction process to this active segment of the market. We will be looking for horses with meaningful racing potential and will offer potential buyers the comfort level and safeguards provided by a public auction."





ARQANA ALTERS SCHEDULE, ADDS SALE

Arqana announced Thursday that it will be altering the format of its summer yearling sales. The auction house's flagship August sale at Deauville, traditionally held over four days, will now be cut down to three days with a maximum of 400 yearlings. It will be held Aug. 17-19 over the G1 Prix Morny weekend.

Arqana also revealed the creation of the new "V2" sale, which will be held Aug. 21 and will feature approximately 100-120 yearling selected for their precocity. To promote this new venture, Arqana will offer the V2 Challenge, a points-based competition that will see a prize go to the owner of the 2-year-old that wins the most during its juvenile year.

"After several months of reflection, analysis and consultation with buyers and vendors concerning the yearling sales, we decided that by making these changes it will enable us to further advance our development in this area," said Eric Hoyeau, president of Arqana. "The innovations that we are putting in place in 2013 are the result of the evolution of the yearling market in recent seasons, and the anticipation of the market in years to come. The length of the sale (three days) and the number of yearlings catalogued (a maximum of 400) correspond better with the reality of the market and the further concentration of quality should give us a new dynamic.

"Concerning the creation of the new V2 Sale, we wanted to give investors an opportunity to buy yearlings in relation to their budget and demand," he added. "This is why we have decided to offer horses that have been selected to be able to perform early on as 2-year-olds at accessible prices for a large range of professionals and French owners."

Hunter's Light has been a steady improver in the Godolphin blue, building on a pair of listed wins at three with successes in the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. over 10 furlongs at Haydock in August and the Anatolia Trophy at Veliefendi in September last term. After finding Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) far too strong when nine-lengths second to that star performer in the G2 Prix Dollar over an extended nine-furlong trip in October, he scooped a first top-level success despite running errantly in the G1 Premio Roma back over 10 furlongs the following month. Positioned near the front end early by Silvestre de Sousa in this warm-up for the Dubai World Cup, the chestnut swooped on Surfer with 300 meters remaining and stretched away to stamp his authority on the contest. "[Trainer] Saeed [bin Suroor] brought him here in great form and he's getting better and better," jockey Silvestre de Sousa commented. "He had a blow there, so should improve again."

"We have one of the safest racing surfaces in America and there are no immediate plans to change it. Keeneland draws the top horses and horsemen in the country and our races are among the highest quality offered anywhere. We have among the largest field size in the country, our handle has increased, and our attendance is up.

"Polytrack is the most prevalent of the all-weather surfaces available and remains a

viable, reliable surface as evidenced by the fact that other venues continue to use it, including Lingfield—who was the first to adopt the surface and recently elected to re-install it, as well as Caulfield Racecourse in Australia.

"We've always said that our efforts to improve racing are a journey not a destination. We are committed to having a surface that provides the best safety possible for horses and riders, while also attracting the sport's top horses and trainers to compete at this place that showcases the best of Thoroughbred racing.

'COMMAND' READY FOR SHOWDOWN

Unbridled Command (Master Command), last seen annexing the GI Hollywood Derby Nov. 25, makes his 4-year-old debut against a stellar cast in Saturday's

GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. The New York-bred made his first start against open company a winning one, capturing Saratoga's GIII Saranac S., then beat up on Empire bred in the Mohawk S. at Belmont Oct. 20. "He took baby steps and we picked our spots carefully and had a

good year because of it," trainer Tom Bush said. "This race is a whole other level. He's got to run against older horses for the first time, and unfortunately he's got to run against two of the best [Animal Kingdom and Point of Entry]. I'm pretty concerned about that." The Lewis Lakin colorbearer has been working bullets for his seasonal debut, including a best-of-16 five-furlong move in :59 over the Palm Meadows turf Jan. 24. "I always had a lot of hope for the colt," Bush commented. "I always liked him. He was very immature early in his 2-year-old year. He was second at Saratoga on the grass. Back then, he was a horse that didn't learn how to relax. He hadn't filled out. He wasn't muscled like I knew he could possibly get. He just matured slowly."

QUIET AMERICAN PENSIONED

Quiet American (Fappiano--Demure, by Dr. Fager), a Grade I-winning miler who became a successful stallion, was pensioned from stud duties yesterday. The 27-year-old will enjoy his retirement at Darley at Jonabell Farm.

Bred in Florida by Tartan Farm--and inbred 3x2 to the brilliant Dr. Fager--the dark bay sold for \$300,000 as a yearling at Fasig-Tipton in 1987 as part of the Tartan/John Nerud dispersal. He began his career in Britain, but came into his own for Sheikh Mohammed when he returned to the U.S. After winning the GII San Diego H. at Del Mar as a 4-year-old, Quiet

American ran second in the GI Woodward H. at Belmont, and was infamously not selected to the 1990 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. He instead romped by 4 3/4 lengths in the GI NYRA Mile, covering the distance in 1:32 4/5 ([video](#)). Quiet American entered stud in 1992 with a record of 12-4-3-1 and earnings of \$754,419.

"His retirement marks the end of an era," said Charlie Boden, Darley's head of sales. "He has been a special horse from the beginning and has done it all, siring champions and Derby winners, and has emerged as one of the most sought after broodmare sires of his generation. He is as healthy as a 27-year-old can be, and is an easy keeper who has earned his time off and certainly will be in good company with the likes of Cherokee Run and Holy Bull."

His first crop included champion older female Hidden Lake, who collected the GI Beldame H., GI Hempstead H. and GI Go for Wand H. in 1997; and Cara Rafaela, heroine of the 1995 GI Hollywood Starlet S., but better known now as the dam of champion and leading sire Bernardini (A.P. Indy).

Quiet American's most accomplished runner emerged from his third crop in the form of Real Quiet. The son of the Believe It mare Really Blue won the GI Hollywood Futurity at two before doubling up in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. the following spring, and lost by a whisker in the GI Belmont S. The bay also captured the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and GI Pimlico Special at four while earning over \$3.2 million. Real Quiet has sired champion sprint Midnight Lute, who has himself made a promising with his first 3-year-olds.

More recently, Quiet American has been represented by Grade I-winning fillies Seattle Smooth and Switch. Switch sold to Moyglare Stud Farm for \$4.3 million last November at FTKNOV. He has sired at least 51 black-type winners to date, and his offspring have earned over \$55,654,441, according to *brisnet.com*.

His daughters have produced over 51 stakes winners today, according to *ecompusire.com*. In addition to Bernardini, they include 2005 Horse of the Year Saint Liam (Saint Ballado), as well as Grade I winners Cherry Mix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) and Whywhywhy (Mr. Greeley).

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Amazombie Gearing Up...

2011 champion sprinter **Amazombie** (Northern Afleet) worked yesterday morning at Santa Anita for the first time since a disappointing eighth-place effort as the 7-2 favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 3. He covered three panels in :38.80. "He worked too fast," said trainer and co-owner Bill Spawr. "I wanted him to go :40. He worked a quarter mile about four days ago, but those short works aren't published. It's just like an open gallop. The track has been playing fine recently for Amazombie's style. We'll see how long it lasts. We'd love to run here [in the GII Potrero Grande Apr. 6]. We'll look at that."

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

HARD TASK FOR C.F. ORR RIVALS

Saturday's G1 C.F. Orr S. at Caulfield near Melbourne, Victoria marks the first Group 1 race of the year in Australia, and Vinery Stud Syndicate's **All Too Hard (Aus)** (Casino Prince {Aus}) looms large in the 1400-meter weight-for-age event. The half-brother to Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) makes his first start since being purchased privately by Vinery from Nathan Tinkler's Patinack Farm, whose silks he carried to victory in the G1 Caulfield Guineas last term over the previously undefeated 2-year-old champion Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}). All Too Hard returned two weeks after that effort to run a game second, beaten a nose, to Ocean Park (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}) in the G1 Cox Plate, Australia's greatest weight-for-age race, Oct. 27. As the lone 3-year-old here, All Too Hard will shoulder the lightest load at 112 pounds. His greatest opposition is likely to come from **King Mufhasa (NZ)** (Pentire {GB}), an 11-time Group 1 winner in Australia and his native New Zealand. The 8-year-old gelding has done much of his best running over this distance, and he won the G1 Futurity S. over this track and trip last February. He has the advantage of a more recent run than All Too Hard--a victory in the G3 Challenge S. at Awapuni Dec. 22. King Mufhasa must shoulder eight pounds more than his younger rival, but looks to take advantage of a short trip up the rail. Darley's **Pinwheel (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}) has been a consistent performer over the last three years, and recorded perhaps his best season last term, scooping the G3 Missile S. and the G2 Warwick S. The 7-year-old comes here off a second-place effort in the G2 Australia S. at Moonee Valley Jan. 25, his first race of this prep, and he has been known to run well second up. He has done his best running over slightly shorter than this, but he owns two victories over this distance. He looks for his first Group 1 victory here. Caulfield-based conditioner Mick Price will saddle the unbeaten **Callanish (NZ)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), who was last seen winning the Listed Seymour Cup Oct. 21. The 4-year-old gelding, who takes a big jump in class for his first start in group company, prepared for this event with a victory in a Werribee trial Feb. 4.

ANOTHER DIAMOND FOR DARLEY?

Darley recorded its first victory in the G1 Blue Diamond S. with subsequent 2-year-old champion Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality) in 2011, and Sheikh Mohammed's stable looks to get back to the Feb. 23 race with **Kuroshio (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), the highest-rated runner in this field at 74. The Peter Snowden charge opened his account with a victory going 1000 meters in the Listed Superracing S. at Flemington Oct. 6, and returned 11 days later to finish third in the Debutants S. over this strip. Turned out for a spell after that effort, Kuroshio tuned up with a second-place finish in the Blue Diamond Preview S. Jan. 26. The winner that day was the Peter Moody-trained firster **Dissident (Aus)** (Sebring {Aus}), who persisted for a gritty victory after traffic trouble throughout. **Direct Charge (Aus)** (Charge Forward {Aus}) goes postward as the most experienced and most accomplished runner in the field. The Robbie Laing trainee broke his maiden in his third start in the G3 Maribyrnong S. at Flemington Nov. 10. He finished sixth in a plate race at Warwick Farm Jan. 5, and was most recently third in the Inglis Classic S. at Rosehill Jan. 19. The winner that day was first time starter **Marseille Roulette (Aus)** (Zizou {Aus}), who returns for his second outing here. **Cont. p8**

"I've been really pleased with how she has done since she got here, and it's going to be interesting to see how the Sydney form holds up here," he said.

It is worth noting that in her lone trial prior to that start at Cranbourne Sept. 24, Quest For Peace bested Darley's highly regarded listed stakes winner Metastasio (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}).



WHAT A SHOW IT WOULD BE

Little Mike (Spanish Steps) posted his second five-furlong workout Thursday and **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry)'s return to serious training probably isn't too far behind. Both are tremendous horses. But who's better? Hopefully, racing will get lucky enough to have that question answered on the racetrack in 2013.

There's nothing more exciting in this sport than rivalries, where great horses meet and superiority is settled. But they don't exist anymore. Top horses don't run enough and when they do their owners and trainers

often have their eye on the easiest spot possible. Case in point: Zenyatta and Rachel Alexandra never met, and that's something that could only happen in the most dysfunctional of sports.

Wise Dan versus Little Mike may not be Zenyatta and Rachel Alexandra, but a showdown between the two turf stalwarts would be great theater, likely the race of the year.

And this time, it could actually happen.

Both are older, male grass horses. And while Wise Dan won the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and Little Mike won the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at a mile-and-a-half, Wise Dan can go longer and Little Mike can go shorter.

If healthy, both are likely to make a lot of money in 2013. If that's all that matters, they'll avoid one another, pile up victories versus inferior competition and then go their separate ways in the Breeders' Cup.

Perhaps, though, these owners will try to balance sportsmanship with the bottom line. Don't they want to find out who is truly the better horse, Wise Dan or Little Mike? Why wouldn't they welcome a challenge? Being 1-5 in a five-horse field only proves so much.

I would think that Little Mike's owners, Priscilla and Carlo Vacarezza, would be particularly eager to face Wise Dan. Little Mike is one of the best horses never to win an Eclipse Award and the reason is that he happened to show up in the same year that Wise Dan, also a grass horse, put together an outstanding season. **Writer's Up cont. p2**

If the Little Mike camp wants to prove they have the better horse and were robbed at the Eclipse Awards then they should be up for a challenge. Go wherever Wise Dan goes.

The right spot for the two to meet is the Woodford Reserve Turf Classic on Kentucky Derby Day at Churchill Downs. It's a rich race (\$500,000), a Grade I, takes place on a huge stage and the distance (1 1/8 miles) suits both. Little Mike will be stabled at Churchill Downs and Wise Dan will be just down the road at Keeneland.

Who would win? I honestly don't know. But I sure would like to find out.

CHRISTIE VETOES ONLINE GAMING BILL

New Jersey Governor Chris Christie yesterday conditionally vetoed a bill permitting online gaming, but after the governor's outright veto of a similar bill in 2011, this conditional veto has supporters of the legislation confident that it will soon be passed. The bill would allow casinos in Atlantic City to legally offer Internet wagering to gaming consumers throughout the state.

"Governor Christie concludes that now is the right time for the state to move forward and again lead the nation by becoming one of the first states to permit Internet gaming, but only with the right limitations and protections," a statement from the governor's office read.

Christie's proposed changes to the legislation include an increased tax rate, with additional revenue earmarked for compulsive gambling treatment programs and additional financing for "other beneficial purposes for which casino gaming was originally authorized." The tax rate would rise from 10% to 15%. The governor also calls for safeguards to corruption and improper influence, as well as a 10-year trial period with annual reviews.

In the statement, Christie said, "This bill represents an important policy decision for the residents of New Jersey, and a historic opportunity to continue the state's leadership as a premiere destination for tourism and entertainment. Such a significant step must be carefully considered, balancing the benefits of job creation, economic development, and the continued revitalization of Atlantic City against the risks of addiction, corruption and improper influence. It is my duty as governor to make these determinations, always mindful of my duty to guarantee the continued welfare of our families, our neighbors, and the future generations who will call our state home."

State Senators Raymond Lesniak and Jim Whelan, primary sponsors of the bill, are optimistic about the legislation's future. **Cont. p3**

“The Governor’s recommendations to the Internet gaming legislation are simple changes that can be made to tighten up the bill, while ensuring that we move forward with what will be a boon for the economy of Atlantic City,” said Whelan. “For a community that has been struggling in recent years as a result of out-of-state gaming competition, opening New Jersey gaming up to Internet wagering will be the life raft that Atlantic City needs. The revenue raised through Internet wagering will have had a real impact on the economy of Atlantic City--not only helping to keep struggling casinos afloat, but also ensuring the continuous employment of thousands of residents. As one of the first states to adopt Internet gaming, New Jersey and Atlantic City could become a hub for a high-tech industry with thousands of jobs and billions of dollars in revenue. I am happy that the governor has agreed in concept and that we as a state will be able to be a part of the future of gaming rather than mired in status quo that is struggling to keep up.

“I’m a little disappointed that it’s taken so long to get here, but happy that the finish line is in sight,” Whelan continued. “However, the fight to strengthen our casino industry is not yet over. From sports wagering to online gaming and many other innovative practices, we need to keep all options on the table to ensure that a major economic engine for New Jersey and Atlantic City is not only sustained, but encouraged to grow.”

Lesniak added, “This is good news and a big win for Atlantic City and for New Jersey. It will send a huge lifeline to the casinos by producing more jobs and additional revenue. It will help them recover from the gaming losses that have plagued the casinos in recent years. It could even save some casinos from closing their doors. At the same time, it will contribute to the state’s economic recovery and generate more revenue for state programs for seniors and the disabled.”

He continued, “This is the future of gaming. It will give the Atlantic City casinos the opportunity to be the ‘Silicon Valley of internet gaming’ by positioning them to be the hub of future expansion into other states. I will work to make the recommended changes to the legislation and get it returned to the Governor for enactment.”

The State Assembly will take up the legislation later this month, while the State Senate reconvenes Mar. 18.

Delaware and Nevada are currently the only states with legalized online gaming.

CONTESSA SADDLES 2,000TH WINNER

Trainer Gary Contessa won his 2,000th race when he saddled Al's Rosie (Harlan's Holiday) to victory in the seventh race at Aqueduct Thursday. With jockey Eddie Castro aboard, Al's Rosie closed along the inside to win the \$35,000 maiden claiming race by a half-length.

"I thought the gods of racing were going to torture me for a couple of weeks before I won this one, so I'm glad I got it behind me," Contessa commented. "It's great. Honestly, I can't believe I won 2,000 races, looking back it's unbelievable to me. Rick Lang called me one day and said, 'You know you have 1900 and

whatever races' and I said, 'You're kidding! When did I win 1,000?' I'm very pleased. It's a great milestone and I'm honored and humbled to win 2,000 races."

Contessa, 55, said it's appropriate the milestone came at Aqueduct, where he has won 12 meet titles. He has garnered 16 total NYRA meet titles and four year-end training titles on the circuit.

"Most of my wins came in the winter at Aqueduct," Contessa said.

Contessa was born in Merrick, N.Y. and first gained experience with horses by working with standardbreds at Roosevelt Raceway during his childhood and adolescence. He switched to Thoroughbreds in 1980.

"My biggest mentor was [Hall of Fame trainer] Frank Martin," said Contessa, who assisted Martin in the 1980s. "I came up under Stanley Hough and all the Harbor View Farm trainers and Jimmy Picou and Dave Sazer, who brought me to this place. But Frank Martin beat the daylights out of me and made me a horse trainer. [It's apt] that I'm in his [old] barn, his office and his world. We sat here many days in the freezing cold at Aqueduct, winning two or three races in a day, so it's great."

In 1985, Contessa took out his trainer's license, winning his first race on June 25, 1985 with *Legendary Wealth* at Monmouth Park.

Contessa continued, "When I first went out on my own, Johnny Campo said, 'Let me tell you something, Contessa. Whatever you do, you make sure the first horse you run, wins. I don't care if it takes three months of being on your own, do not run a horse until it's going to win because then they will remember you.' I remember I went to Monmouth Park and the first horse I won with in my career, *Legendary Wealth*. Owner, John Campo. It really worked out well and I thank John, who was a big supporter when I first started out."

Contessa's first Grade I victory came in 1991 when *Do It With Style* captured the *Ashland S.* at Keeneland.

Whitney and Hendrickson also founded the almost-7-week long, popular backstretch banquet and entertainment program at Saratoga, with their personal funds in 2007. The program feeds and entertains backstretch workers each night, with more than 1,000 meals on Sundays. The philanthropic couple said that they feel that a highly visible promotion of this type will garner widespread exposure for the excellent caliber of racing and the element of philanthropic and social intrigue that is uniquely found at Saratoga.



Wrote's breeder Rob Speers to attain the 6-year-old dual winner. Her dam Desert Classic (GB) (Green Desert) sold for 875,000gns at Tattersalls December.

"It's a nice family and it's all happening," said Lane. "She's not the biggest, but she's nice enough and obviously the High Chaparral cover is a bonus."

Diara Angel, who was campaigned in Germany and offered by Voute Sales on behalf of Sean Conway, will join Deer's 25-strong broodmare band in Chepstow. The team at Oak Grove Stud has also recently welcomed back homebred stallion Avonbridge (GB), the winner of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye in 2005. The son of Averti (Ire) (Warning {GB}), another Deer homebred, started his career at Whitsbury Manor Stud and is the sire of Group 2 winners Blaine and Temple Meads.

Steady Trade...

While the average increased only fractionally on last year--from 9,168gns to 9,198gns--the median rose by 43% to 5,000gns (from 3,500gns). Of the 244 horses on offer, 190 were sold (78%) for a total of 1,747,600gns, an increase of 6% from 2012 when the same number of lots passed through the ring.

"The February Sale may be a relatively new addition to the Tattersalls sales calendar, but it has always attracted plenty of buyers and this year's renewal has been no exception," said Chairman Edmond Mahony. "Buyers from every continent in the world have been active at today's sale, all contributing to figures which have surpassed or matched last year's in all the key indicators of aggregate, average, median and clearance rate.

"The common theme running through all Tattersalls sales is the enduring global demand for quality and this has been very evident today, but it is equally crucial at mixed sales of this nature to attract buyers at all levels of the market," Mahony concluded.

Well-Connected Prospects...

Broodmares and broodmare prospects filled much of the top-end of the market at the mixed sale, and Lavington Stud's Caphene (GB) (Sakhee) led the early trade when selling for 70,000gns to Ed Sackville on behalf of an unnamed client. Unplaced in five starts for John Dunlop, the 4-year-old is out of G2 Premio Lydia Tesio winner Claxon (GB), whose other runners include Lingfield Oaks Trial winner Cassydora (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), who added the GIII Hillsborough S. to her CV when transferred from Britain to race in America, and listed winner Classic Remark (GB) (Dr Fong).

Consecutive lots from the Juddmonte draft drew decent offers, with the unraced 3-year-old Considerate (GB) (Dansili {GB}), a daughter of listed-winning Sadler's Wells mare Concentric fetching a bid of 62,000gns from Laurent Benoit's French-based Broadhurst Agency. She was followed into the ring by Bit By Bit (GB) (Rail Link {GB}), a dual winner who was also listed-placed in France and hails from the family of Beat Hollow (GB), Martaline (GB) and Oasis Dream (GB).

Colin and Melba Bryce of Laundry Cottage Stud, who had earlier sold Astronomer Royal's half-sister A P Easy (A.P. Indy) for 45,000gns, went to 50,000gns for the Juddmonte 4-year-old, bidding through Eamonn Reilly of BBA Ireland.

"We're shuffling the pack and investing in some younger mares," explained Colin Bryce, who indicated that Bit By Bit is to visit Ballylinch Stud resident Lawman (Fr).

Matt Coleman of Anthony Stroud Bloodstock went to 42,000gns to secure listed winner Don't Dili Dali (GB) (Dansili {GB}), the only mare in the catalogue sold carrying to Paco Boy (Ire). Her yearling colt by the same sire fetched 40,000gns when sold as a foal in December.

"She's been bought by an Indian client of Anthony's and will be going out to India," confirmed Coleman. "Her foal last year was really nice and she's back in foal to Paco Boy, plus she was a really tough race mare herself with a lovely pedigree."

Across the Universe...

Top of the horses in training was Cut Across (Ire), a 5-year-old son of Cape Cross (Ire) who is set to continue his racing career in Saudi Arabia after being knocked down to Oliver St Lawrence for 40,000gns on behalf of Saudi agent Khalid Alsyari. Rated 87, the gelding has won three times for Newmarket trainer Nick Littmoden and is a half-brother to listed-winning sprinter My Propeller (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}).

Major British-based syndicate Middleham Park Racing stepped in to buy another Cape Cross gelding, the good-looking Stand My Ground (Ire), who had previously been trained in France for Pia Brandt, for whom he won four races and was twice listed placed. Out of G3 Prix Penelope winner Perfect Hedge (GB) (Unfuwain), Stand My Ground, now six, is to join the increasingly successful stable of young jockey-turned-trainer David O'Meara, whose record for Middleham Park Racing includes winning both the G2 Bet365 Mile and G2 Joel S. with Penitent (GB) last season.

Referring to the lucrative French owners' premium system, Nick Bradley of Middleham Park Racing said, "We might campaign him in France. He qualifies for French premiums and if he wins a race, we'll have a free horse." **Cont. p11**

John Manley, his wife Jean and daughter Laura made the trip to see Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan), who won five group races in their colours before being sold to stand at The National Stud. "We go to the stud to see him quite regularly and still feel like we own part of him, really," said Jean. "We're really excited about his first foals. Hopefully, we can race one of them ourselves one day." The Manleys have enjoyed great success with sons of Arakan and have kept in training the 4-year-old triple group winner Trumpet Major (Ire).
