MEADOWLANDS MANAGEMENT, TRAINING CENTERS AGREE TO ALLOW BARN

INSPECTIONS by Bill Finley

Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural and two private training centers have come to an agreement that will allow a track investigator to conduct barn searches and drug test horses based at Showplace Farms in New Jersey and Golden Shoe Training Center in New York.

Gural has made the integrity of the racing product at the Meadowlands and two other tracks he owns, Vernon Downs and Tioga Downs, a central issue and has banned several individuals from competing at his tracks. The list includes Lou Pena, a former leading trainer at the Meadowlands.

Gural went an additional step this year when he said he would not allow any trainer to race at his tracks unless they signed an agreement allowing his investigator to inspect their barn at any time and without notice. The Meadowlands investigations are headed by Brice Cote, a former New Jersey State Trooper with a background in racing.

There is no stabling at the Meadowlands.

The vast majority of trainers agreed and most training centers did not voice any objections to the plan, but two training centers raised concerns about the agreement and did not feel it was in their best interest to allow Gural's investigator unrestricted access to their facilities. The dispute threatened to blow up into a crisis after Gural said he would ban all trainers at any training center that would not allow his investigator access. Cont. p3

Shuruq caught a tartar when running third to subsequent G1 Fillies' Mile victress Certify (Elusive Quality) at Newmarket on debut July 12, but broke through next up by making all in an Oct. 17 Kempton maiden. Runner-up to Music Chart in the UAE 1000 Guineas Trial at this track in her third start Jan. 17, she

was undone by a messy pace when occupying the same berth behind Lovely Pass in the main test Feb. 7, but gained her revenge on both rivals with a decisive score this time. The homebred bay was steadied in sixth through the early fractions and easily

improved two spots, racing hard on the bit, going down the backstretch. Making further headway on the turn, Shurug seized control at the top of the lane and powered clear thereafter to register a career high in impressive fashion. As for what might be night for the winner, conditioner Saeed bin Suroor said, "My initial thought is that we are likely to take her back to England, but we will all have to sit down and talk about it. These conditions clearly suit her, so the [Mar. 30 G2] UAE Derby is at least a consideration." Shuruq is the first foal from Miss Lucifer, a winner of the 2007 G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket for these connections. Miss Lucifer has both a 2-year-old and yearling sons by

Gural met with management of the training centers and their attorneys Wednesday and reached a compromise.

"The meeting went well and there are still some small details that need to be worked out, but everybody involved wants to work together to ensure that we have access to investigate the people at Showplace who are racing at the Meadowlands," Gural said. "Everyone was on the same page."

The new agreement calls for:

- Showplace and Cote will compare notes. Cote will be given a list of trainers at Showplace and Showplace will be given a list of trainers that have agreed to let Gural's team investigate their barns. Showplace trainers that have not given Gural permission will be off limits.
- Should Cote launch an investigation after 5 p.m. and before 9 a.m. he must notify Showplace management by text when he arrives and leaves.
- The Meadowlands has agreed to sign a hold harmless contract and an indemnification contract in case Cote gets hurt while he's at the farm.

Attorney Jeff Pocaro represents both Showplace and Golden Shoe and said the agreement will apply to both training centers.

"This was what I call an 'AA' meeting--absolutely amicable--and everybody is happy with the outcome," Pocaro said.





Her vital signs are normal and she is slowly regaining her fighting spirit. 

BRADLEY HOPING FOR MORE OF THE SAME

Pete Bradley faces a daunting task in the coming weeks. As the bloodstock agent journeys cross-country to hit the four major 2-year-old sales in the coming month, he will be looking to duplicate the outstanding success his yearly pinhooking venture enjoyed last year with a new group of 19 juveniles. The trek gets underway next Monday when Bradley and partners

send two horses through the sales ring at the Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in Pomona, California.

"It was a career year," Bradley admitted of 2012. "We had some exceptional horses, but it is very difficult to do that year in and year out. If that was not a once in a lifetime, it is at least a highwater mark that we have to try to beat once again."

Bradley's big spring began in Pomona a year ago, when he and consignor Eddie Woods sold a son of Indygo Shiner, purchased for \$37,000 the previous July at Fasig-Tipton, for \$330,000. That same night, they sold a colt by Lawyer Ron, also a \$37,000 FTKJUL yearling, for \$175,000.

The headlines kept coming at OBS March, when Bradley and company

sold a Leroidesanimaux (Brz) colt, a \$70,000 FTKOCT yearling purchase, for \$490,000. A pair of high-priced youngsters cemented the career year at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale, with a Hard Spun colt, acquired for \$200,000 at Fasig-Tipton in October, fetching \$870,000; and a Street Boss colt, bought for \$77,000 in July, selling for \$825,000.

Asked if he expects to surpass last year's accomplishment this season, Bradley chuckled, "Heck, no."

The success did not change how Bradley and Woods approached last summer's yearling sale.

"We did have a bit more money to spend, so we bought a couple more high-end horses, but for the most part we stuck with those kind of horses in the \$50,000-\$100,000 range, that was what we were shooting for," Bradley explained.

Still, facing a competitive yearling market, it was tough to buy the right horses and Bradley admitted he came away with money left in his pockets.

"It is always tough to buy nice horses, but we were not able to spend the money that we had available for horses," the bloodstock agent said. "It is better to not buy a horse than to buy the wrong horse, that's for sure."

The partnership's most expensive yearling purchase last year was the \$280,000 it paid for a son of Tapit

out of Muir Station (Street Cry {Ire}) at Fasig-Tipton in July. The yearling was the complete package, making him worth the extra gamble, according to Bradley.

"Really pinhooking is all about margins," Bradley explained. "You have to buy the horses right. That horse, in particular, while he was high-priced, is by a sire who was very hot and has gotten hotter, out of a good female family--that is a stallion's pedigree. Those kind, you know that, if he does everything right, there is upside to a horse like that. So again we still think we have a horse that, if he does what he is supposed to do, there will be a margin in buying him at that price. You couldn't buy a horse for that price who is a physical, but not the pedigree or the stallion power, and expect the margin to be there even if he goes down there in :10 flat, if he is by a

moderate kind of sire."

Bradley's first Barretts offering next Monday will be a colt by Any Given Saturday (hip 90). Out of Rahy Connection (Rahy), a half-sister to Grade I winner Link River (Gone West), the juvenile was purchased for \$32,000 at the Keeneland September sale.

"He is a very nice horse," Bradley said of the chestnut. "He's matured quite a bit. I think Any Given Saturday is a bit underrated; he gets plenty of racehorses out there. This colt is athletic. He's got speed and a good mind."

Next up will be a Harlan's Holiday filly (hip 111) out of stakes winner Sophie's Trophy (Valid Wager). The bay was a \$52,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling purchase. Cont. p7

"She is a very uncomplicated filly," Bradley said. "She has good substance and balance to her and a good stride. She is just a very solid, nice kind of filly."

Asked what type of 2-year-olds he ships to California for the Barretts sale, Bradley laughed, "The ones Eddie

tells me to send out there." He added, "Being the first sale of the year, we certainly want them to be mature, somewhat precocious types. And I think, again, you kind of look for sire lines that work in certain areas. And I think both of those horses have had obviously enough runners by both of those sires, that they are horses that the California buyers will take a look at. It is, at this point in time, not a sale that we take our most expensive horses to. That's not to say you can't sell a horse for a lot of money out there, but we take horses out there that we

think are in the \$100,000-\$200,000 range and we think those kind sell very well in that market."

Bradley has been putting together pinhooking ventures for the past 20 years. He currently has about 12 investors and, for the most part, he has a regular cast of characters.

"There is probably a core group of five to seven people who have invested almost throughout the whole time and then there is a group of people who have been doing it with me for the past two or three years. It is a pretty stable group. We do get in some new people from time to time, but over the last four years, it has been a pretty stable group."

While he might not think another year like 2012 is in the offing, Bradley is optimistic going into the 2013 juvenile sales season.

"The first and foremost thing we look to do is to sell all our horses every year," he explained. "And historically, we've done that. I think that we've got a bunch of saleable horses this year. We've got 10 horses we think are superior kinds of horses and, the good news is, we don't have a lot in the group that are throwaways either. I think the most important thing to know is that we've got horses who are very sellable and usable. And then the market will take care of what it thinks they are worth."

Re: Horse Slaughter for Human Consumption


Dear Governor Fallin:

While I am not a resident of Oklahoma, I am a businessman and a second generation thoroughbred horse owner and have been around horses all my life. It has come to my attention that the state of Oklahoma is considering a bill to legalize horse slaughter in your great state.

You will no doubt hear from many about your consideration of legalizing horse slaughter for human consumption. However, you probably have no firsthand knowledge of the horse slaughter industry. I would like to tell you the truth about this cruel, inhumane and unnecessary industry.

As you may or may not know, we were successful in closing the two horse slaughter plants here in Texas. There were many reasons why Texans decided that they did not want the horse slaughter industry in our great state. Some of these reasons are listed here for your consideration:

♦ Watch Out for "TDN Rising Stars" ♦Stars of tomorrow grabbing the spotlight today...



- 1. The horse slaughter industry is a cruel and inhumane industry. Horse slaughter is not euthanasia. The transport to slaughter and the slaughter process are violent and inexplicably tortuous with some horses being processed while they are still alive. Pregnant mares have given birth to their foals in the kill chute. The slaughter process continues with the mares being processed, and the foals taken to the back of the facility and clubbed to death. These accounts have been well documented by eye witnesses, USDA officials and on tape. The atrocities at these horse slaughter plants are inconceivable to any lover of animals, especially horses. This cruel treatment of horses has no place in our society.
- 2. These two horse slaughter plants had a negative economic and environmental impact on the surrounding areas. The city leaders were unable to attract any new companies/commerce due to the horse slaughter plants located there. The horse slaughter plants polluted the air, water and sewers in and around these facilities. They violated and ignored all laws/ordinances/citations, and continued to dump carcasses, blood and other waste with no regard for the environment or the surrounding communities. 3. American horses are not safe to eat. Horses are administered numerous drugs on a regular basis throughout their lifetime that are prohibited for animals intended for human consumption. Because Americans do not raise horses as a food animal, the horses are regularly given medications such as painkillers, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers, dewormers, just to name a few. All of these medications have been proven to cause blood disorders and cancer in humans. Animals that are raised specifically for their meat are held to strict standards as to which medications can be administered to them so the meat is not tainted with these carcinogens. Horses in the U.S.A. are held to no such standards because no horse owner ever considers the possibility that their horse may one day end up on someone's dinner plate. No one has ever come up with a way of converting a riding horse that received routine health care into a safe, healthy food because it cannot be done. Even if someone is in favor of horse slaughter, surely they cannot be in favor of selling tainted meat.

These are just a few of the many reasons why horse slaughter for human consumption should be abolished. I am asking that you use all of your power as Governor of Oklahoma to defeat this legislation to legalize horse slaughter for human consumption and prevent the construction of a horse slaughter plant in Oklahoma.

NO RESOLUTION ON FLORIDA DATES CONFLICT

The Thursday afternoon deadline for Florida tracks to submit dates requests for the 12-month period beginning July 1, 2013, saw officials from Gulfstream Park and Calder Race Course both applying for year-round dates, setting up the potential for the tracks, just miles apart, to race concurrently beginning this summer. Though deregulation of dates in the state of Florida ended in the 1980s, the two tracks have never gone head-to-head, and instead operated on something of a handshake agreement that Gulfstream would run the winter dates and Calder the late spring, summer and fall.

In 2011, Gulfstream changed the landscape and applied for year-round dates, and, in 2011, ran December dates for the first time. Until that time, Gulfstream opened their meet just after the first of the year. Ever since owner Frank Stronach razed the original Gulfstream Park in 2004, replacing it with a broader entertainment complex and later a casino, the track has been committed to lengthening its racing season in an attempt to generate greater revenue.

The track released a statement Friday afternoon, which stated, "It is with regret that Gulfstream Park was unable to agree on a racing calendar with Calder that we believe would have been in the best interests of the Florida Thoroughbred community. Gulfstream Park has already invested more than \$750 million into its facilities in Florida and intends to expend significant additional amounts to ensure that it is one of the world's premier Thoroughbred racetracks and destination centers.

"Gulfstream Park's primary focus is Thoroughbred racing, and we believe by offering year-round racing that this will substantially build revenue for the Florida Thoroughbred industry. We look forward to working with all participants and continuing to make Florida one of the premier racing states in the world."

HALL OF FAME ANNOUNCES FINALISTS

Five jockeys, four Thoroughbreds and one trainer comprise the list of finalists on the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame ballot for 2013, as selected by the Hall of Fame nominating committee. The jockeys are: the late Chris Antley, Calvin Borel, Garrett Gomez, Craig Perret and Alex Solis. The equines include Ashado, Housebuster, Invasor (Arg) and Lure and Gary Jones was the lone finalist among trainers.

The finalists were selected by the Hall of Fame's 16-member Nominating Committee from a total of 86 candidates suggested throughout the year by turf journalists, Thoroughbred industry participants, and racing fans. To be eligible, trainers must have been active for 25 years, and jockeys must have been active for 20 years. Thoroughbreds must have been retired for five years. All candidates must have been active within the past 25 years. The 20- and 25-year requirements for jockeys and trainers, respectively, may be waived, but a five-year waiting period is then observed before they become eligible.



St Liams Halo Running For Vets in Tom Fool:

One year ago, Thoroughbred owner Chip McEwen
was on a flight on which one of the passengers was a
veteran with post-traumatic stress disorder.

"He had his mental faculties but no longer had the necessary motor skills as the result of an [improvised explosive device]," recalled McEwen. "His dad helped him walk off the plane. His wife was also there, and she was in her 20s, and so were his children, who were about 2 and 4 years old. I realized we need to do more for these individuals, but we also need to remember [PTSD] affects their whole family."

Witnessing the veteran and his family cope with the effects of combat motivated McEwen to rename his racing operation Wounded Warrior Stables and donate 10% of his horses' purse earnings to the Wounded Warrior Project and other organizations that assist veterans and their families.

The Wounded Warrior Project serves veterans and service members who incurred a physical or mental injury, illness, or wound, co-incident to their military service on or after Sept. 11, 2001 and their families.

"I thought this might help keep their process in the forefront," said McEwen, a 50-year-old pharmaceutical distributor from Fort Myers, Fla who has been involved in horse racing for approximately 15 years. Cont. p3

"It's one small way for me to give back," McEwen added.

Through Wednesday, Wounded Warrior Stables horses have posted a record of 4-5-4 in 34 starts and earned \$143,056. St Liams Halo (Saint Liam), claimed for \$50,000 by trainer Gary Contessa for Wounded Warrior Stables in his most recent start, will attempt to give the operation its first graded stakes victory when he steps up in class for the GIII Tom Fool H. Saturday at Aqueduct.

"We're hoping for a miracle," said McEwen, with St Liams Halo 30-1 on the morning line for the Tom Fool.

In addition to the Wounded Warrior Project, Wounded Warrior Stables also supports Retrieving Freedom, which trains and places service dogs with veterans and autistic children, and The Navy SEAL Foundation, which assists Navy SEALs and their families.

McEwen said he owns 33 horses, including broodmares. He has become increasingly involved at yearling and 2-year-old sales in recent years and hopes his expanded operation helps bring additional publicity to the Wounded Warrior Project.

"Nobody is in this game who's not an optimist," said McEwen. "Maybe the next one is a great one, or so we all hope."

Pollard's Vision Relocates to Waldorf Farm:

Pollard's Vision (Carson City--Etats Unis, by Dixieland Band), the sire of 2010 champion 3-year-old filly Blind Luck from his first crop to race, is being relocated to Dr. Jerry Bilinski's Waldorf Farm in North Chatham, New York, for the 2013 breeding season. He will stand


for a fee of \$5,000. A four-time graded-stakes and twice Grade I-placed winner of over \$1.4 million, Pollard's Vision returned to his birthplace at Wintergreen Stallion Station to take up stud duties in 2006. He was the third leading first-crop sire of 2009, with 23 winners and four stakes


