While it has been generally assumed that the William Reid would be Black Caviar's final start in Melbourne before similar farewell stops in Sydney and Brisbane, co-owner Gary Wilkie would not rule out further runs for the 6-year-old. "We haven't got that far at all," Wilkie told the Herald Sun. "It's one day at a time. We haven't even got to Friday yet. We'll see how she pulls up and go from there."



SPIRAL LIKELY TO BE OVERSUBSCRIBED

Turfway Park revealed Monday that the current list of hopefuls for its \$550,000 GIII Horseshoe Casino Cincinnati Spiral S. Saturday was at 16. The field will be limited to 12 starters, determined by graded stakes earnings, then stakes earnings and career earnings. The expected entrants who would make it into the field at this point are: Uncaptured (Lion Heart), Balance the Books (Lemon Drop Kid), Mac the Man (El Corredor), General Election (Harlan's Holiday), Capo Bastone (Street Boss), Fear the Kitten (Kitten's Joy), Channel Isle (English Channel), My Name is Michael (Macho Uno), Black Onyx (Rock Hard Ten), Giant Finish (Frost Giant), Taken by the Storm (Stormy Atlantic) and For Greater Glory (Afleet Alex). Cerro (Ire) (Mr. Greeley), Red Wings (English Channel), Divine Ambition (Divine Park) and Crop Report (Medaglia d'Oro) would need defections to make it into the starting gate. Entries for the Spiral, which is worth a total of 85 points in the Road to the Kentucky Derby points system, will be taken Wednesday.

The 3-year-old colt was purchased privately from breeders Ken and Sarah Ramsey and had previously been trained by Gianluca Bietolini. "He's a lovely compact individual with a great temperament," said OTI Racing and Bloodstock's Terry Henderson, who brokered the deal along with agent Andy Smith. "He's not a big horse, but he's very athletic and strong. We can imagine him joining Luca's contingent on a future trip to Australia."





ELIGIBLE FOR KY BREEDERS' INCENTIVE FUND AWARDS UP TO \$5,000

Some 10 years ago, I pointed out in this column that Unbridled's Song's career had mirrored that of his sire Unbridled in several ways.


Both father and son won the Florida Derby and both landed one of the highly coveted prizes on Breeders' Cup Day. The similarities extended to the early stages of their stallion careers. Both made a spectacular start, with a pair of Grade I winners, including a Breeders' Cup winner, in their first crop.


Ultimately Unbridled's death at the age of 14 in 2001 makes it harder to compare his record with that of his son, who is 20 this year. Suffice it to say that he left 12 Grade I winners and sired 8% black-type winners, while Unbridled's Song has so far sired 15 Grade I winners and has a similar percentage of black-type winners. Unbridled gave us three Breeders' Cup Grade I winners and so has Unbridled's Song, thanks to Unbridled Elaine, Unrivaled Belle and Midshipman.

One big difference, though, has been the respective records of father and son where the Triple Crown is concerned. Unbridled's Song started favorite to emulate Unbridled's victory in the Kentucky Derby, but weakened from second to fifth in the stretch. One theory attributed his performance to his having done too much in his work three days before the Derby, when he covered a half-mile in :46.

Whatever the cause, Unbridled's Song was never again asked to tackle more than a mile and an eighth during a career which ended with a victory in the Olympic H. over seven furlongs.

Unbridled's Breeders' Cup win came in the Classic over a mile and a quarter, and he subsequently had a profound impact on the Triple Crown races. Thanks to Grindstone, Red Bullet and Empire Maker, he sired winners of each of the three legs, with Grindstone going on to sire Birdstone, a Belmont S. winner who in turn has sired winners of the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont. Although Unbridled's Song's daughter Eight Belles ran a great race to be second to Big Brown in 2008, none of Unbridled's Song's sons have so far managed to finish in the top three in the Kentucky Derby.

This is rather surprising. Despite his size, Unbridled's Song matured quickly enough to win the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the Florida Derby and the Wood Memorial. Plenty of his best winners have also landed graded stakes at two or in the run-up to the Triple Crown, with Midshipman, Old Fashioned, Rockport Harbor, Winslow Homer, Buddha, Eurosilver, Mission Impazible, Songandaprayer and Domestic Dispute among them.

Soundness, or lack of it, was an issue with some of these, but this doesn't appear to be an issue with Will Take Charge, the latest Unbridled's Song to set out on

the long and hazardous road to the Kentucky Derby. The colt's hard-fought victory over stablemate Oxbow in the GII Rebel S. came on his seventh start (which makes him a veritable novice compared to his trainer's last Kentucky Derby winner,


Charismatic, who was racing for the 15th time).

Soundness aside, we still have to establish whether Will Take Charge has the necessary stamina and class to win a mile-and-a-quarter Classic. Of Unbridled's Song's Grade I winners, Unbridled Elaine, Unrivaled Belle, Buddha, Magnificent Song, Thorn Song, Splended Blended and Graydar all won prestigious races over a mile and an eighth. The same applies to plenty of their fellow graded winners. As so often happens in American racing, it is a somewhat different story over the extended distance of a mile and a quarter. However, Political Force (GI Suburban H.), Octave (GI CCA Oaks) and Rare Gift (GIII Ladies H.) all showed that the occasional Unbridled's Song can last the Derby distance. Cont. p7

Will Take Charge follows Graydar as the second graded stakes winner of the year to represent the Unbridled's Song/Dehere cross--a cross which has only seven representatives of racing age. Owners of mares by Dehere were no doubt encouraged by Unbridled's Song's solid results with mares by Dehere's sire Deputy Minister. By the end of 2006, Unbridled's Song was credited with 11% stakes winners among his first 19 foals out of Deputy Minister mares, including the Grade II winner Last Song. This cross has maintained its success pretty well, adding the Grade III winner Keep Up to its tally, and there are now four stakes winners among the cross's 44 foals, which is 9%.

The Dehere mares are completely overshadowing those figures. Six of their seven foals by Unbridled's Song have won and they also feature Strike It Rich, winner of the GIII Boiling Springs S. over 1 1/16 miles on Monmouth's turf track in 2010. Graydar, of course, won the GI Donn H. over a mile and an eighth in February, with the late-foaled 4-year-old (born May 16) showing plenty of potential. Interestingly, Graydar and Strike It Rich are both inbred to Mr. Prospector, the inbreeding being 4x4 and 4x3, respectively, whereas Will Take Charge is Unbridled's Song's first stakes winner inbred to Mr. Prospector's sizeable son Fappiano, the inbreeding being 3x4.

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

Three graded stakes winners from only seven foals is a very striking achievement on Unbridled's Song's part and more daughters of Dehere are clearly called for, especially ones with a line of Mr. Prospector. I should add that it would do no harm if the daughter of Dehere was also well above average on the track, as Strike It Rich's dam Belle of Perintown was a Grade II winner and Will Take Charge's dam is none other than the redoubtable Take Charge Lady. This popular filly's career figures stood at 11 victories and seven seconds from 22 starts.

This consistency was reflected in Take Charge Lady's official ratings. Victory in three of her five juvenile starts earned her an Experimental Free Handicap ranking of 115, then the 3-year-old Take Charge Lady achieved a figure of 116 on the 2002 International Classifications, followed by 115 in 2003. She twice won the GI Spinster S. over a mile and an eighth and she was second in the GII Delaware H. over a mile and a quarter. Caulfield cont. p8

Take Charge Lady originally cost \$175,000 as a yearling, but she proved so successful that her price soared to \$4.2 million as a 5-year-old in 2004, when she was sold in foal to Seeking The Gold. The Seeking The Gold filly she was carrying repaid \$3.2 million towards her purchase price when sold as a yearling. Two years later, her yearling filly by Storm Cat made \$800,000. Bearing in mind that the Seeking The Gold filly won only once and the daughter of Storm Cat failed to win, it is hardly surprising that buyers failed to maintain such enthusiasm for Take Charge Lady's yearlings. Her A.P. Indy colt RNA'd at \$80,000 in 2010 and then her Unbridled's Song colt made \$425,000 in 2011, a year when two other Unbridled's Song yearlings achieved seven-figure sums.

Fortunately, these two colts have revived Take Charge Lady's broodmare career. The A.P. Indy colt is her GI Florida Derby winner Take Charge Indy and, obviously, the Unbridled's Song colt is Will Take Charge. The mare also has a 2012 filly by Indian Charlie.

Will Take Charge's broodmare sire Dehere was injured before he had the chance of tackling the Kentucky Derby, but he had defeated Go For Gin, Ride The Rails and Holy Bull in the GII Fountain of Youth S. over 1 1/16 miles. His pedigree, which features Deputy Minister, Secretariat and Damascus, suggests he would have stayed further.

Dehere's nomadic career as a stallion means he has broodmare daughters on several continents and they have enjoyed Group 1 success in Australia (where they range from the sprinter-miler Forensics to the dual Derby winner Rebel Raider) and the U.S. (where Graydar and Will Take Charge were preceded by the champion sprinter Midnight Lute and the smart 2012 juvenile So Many Ways).

Will Take Charge's second dam Felicita is an unraced daughter of the champion sprinter Rubiano, who was a Grade I winner at up to a mile. Felicita's stakes winners Eventail (by Lear Fan) and Commendation (by Capote) both had good form over a mile and an eighth. Eventail is now the dam of Straight Story, a Grade II-winning son of Giant's Causeway who ran well at up to 1 3/8 miles.



Woodbine Entertainment Group yesterday released the stakes schedule for the first part of its 2013 Woodbine Thoroughbred meet. The schedule, which begins Opening Day, Apr. 20, and goes through Queen's Plate day July 7, features 37 added-money races.

"We release this 12-week calendar with guaranteed purses to provide confidence for horsemen as they plan their racing season," said WEG Vice-President of Thoroughbred Racing Steve Koch. "We will release a full year stakes schedule after the industry has finalized funding projections."

Purse distribution for racing in Ontario has been up in the air since the Slots at Racetracks program, which provided some \$345 million annually to purses for races run in the province in exchange for the use of racetracks for racino facilities, was cancelled a year ago. The Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation is expected to announce a new, but less lucrative agreement with tracks soon to replace the current agreement, which expires Mar. 31.

Headlining Woodbine's early stakes schedule is the 1 1/4-mile \$1-million Queen's Plate S. to be run for 3-year-olds on a card that will also feature four other stakes: the \$200,000 GII Highlander S., \$150,000 GIII Singspiel S., \$150,000 Clarendon S. and \$200,000 GII Dance Smartly S. MAGIC MILLIONS QTIS SALE WRAPS UP

Monday's second session of the Magic Millions QTIS Yearling sale was topped by Lot 367, a colt by Sequalo (Aus) who fetched A\$80,000 from Toowoomba-based horseman Tony Sears. The colt, out of Count the Silver (Aus) (Canadian Silver), was bred and consigned by Lyndhurst Stud. Lot 258, was the top filly purchase on the day. The daughter of Our Fiction (Aus) went to John Morrisey for \$60,000. The yearling is out of the Galileo (Ire) mare Tequilakoko (Aus) and was bred and sold by Adour Stud and Stables.

During this year's two-session edition of the sale, 293 horses sold for an average of A\$21,193, down 4.29% from last year. The clearance rate was 71%.

"It's remarkable to finish the sale with a clearance of 71%, although that is still unsatisfactory," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox remarked. "All the traditional buyers participated and there was some new blood from interstate and overseas. The results tell us that there is a lack of confidence in the local industry. I commend the vendors that met the market today. I'm sure some of the prices weren't palatable. The Queensland industry has some soul searching ahead, however, the good thing is that Queensland Racing are putting the fundamentals together to get racing heading in the right direction."


