





Three-time GI Kentucky Derby-winning rider Calvin Borel, contemporary racehorses Lure, Invasor (Arg) and Housebuster and steelplechase legends Tuscalee and McDynamo were announced yesterday as the newest inductees to the National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame. The electees will be inducted to the Hall of Fame



in ceremonies to be held Friday, Aug. 9 at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, NY.

Borel, 46, rode his 5000th winner at Oaklawn Park Mar. 7, the latest landmark of a career which has taken off in the last several years. He won the first of his three Derbies in 2007, riding Street Sense for his longtime client Carl Nafzger and followed up with longshot Mine That Bird (2009) and Super Saver (2010). Only one of two jockeys with over 1000 victories at Churchill Downs,

Borel was the regular rider for 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra and was named by his peers as the winner of the George Woolf Award in 2010.

Racing in the famed colors of Claiborne Farm, Lure, a son of Danzig, was the pre-eminent miler of his time, winning 14 of his 25 career starts, including back-toback runnings of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile in 1992/93. Trained by Shug McGaughey, Lure set track records at five furlongs in addition to his specialist distance.

Invasor (Candy Stripes) was Uruguay's Triple Crown winner in 2005 before being acquired by Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Farm. After suffering his lone career defeat in the G2 UAE Derby, Invasor won the GI Whitney H. and GI Breeders' Cup Classic in 2006, then added a remarkable win in the 2007 GI Donn H. and G1 Dubai World Cup. He was conditioned in the American portion of his career by Kiaran McLaughlin.

Housebuster (Mt. Livermore) was the Eclipse Awardwinning sprinter in 1990 and 1991. Racing in the colors of Robert Levy and trained by the legendary Jimmy Croll, Housebuster won eight of his 10 starts at three and won eight straight races at one point in his career. He was equally effective at four, winning the GI Carter H., GI Forego H. and GI Vosburgh S.

McDynamo (Dynaformer) won half of his 34 career starts, taking the Breeders' Cup Grand National five years in a row--the last at age 10--and establishing course records the first two years. He was a three-time Eclipse Award winner. Tuscalee (Tuscany) remains steeplechasing's winningest horse of all time with 37 while racing from 1963 to 1972.

The Museum will announce as many as two inductees as inaugural selections to the Pillars of the Turf category for the Hall of Fame in May, a new designation to honor esteemed individuals who have made valuable contributions to the sport of Thoroughbred racing.

PIERRO TO COOLMORE AUSTRALIA

Five-time Group 1 winner Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}--Miss Right Note {Ire}, by Daylami {Ire})) will head to

stud at Coolmore Australia to stand the 2013 breeding season, according to a press release from Coolmore. Industry sources in Australia suggested the recently retired 3-yearold's purchase price was around A\$40 million.

closely ever since he made his debut and we're thrilled that he is joining what is already an exceptional line up of stallions here at Coolmore Australia," said Coolmore's Michael Kirwan.

"He was a truly brilliant 2-year-old--equally effective at all distances from 1000 to 1600 meters. No other horse since 1970 has managed to secure the 2-year-old Triple Crown while remaining undefeated through his first season and I understand that he's the only Triple Crown winner to go on to win two Group 1 races at weight-for-age as a 3-year-old.

A horse like Pierro is fundamental to the continued development of our operation in Australia and in both he and So You Think, Coolmore is now home to the two most desirable young stallions in the Southern Hemisphere that are free of Danehill blood." Cont. p3

Greg Kolivos, whose colors Pierro carried with such distinction throughout his racing career, said he was happy to see Pierro become part of the stud operation.

"On the racetrack, Pierro provided me, my wife Donna and son Alex, with many wonderful days," said Kolivos. "He is a champion in every sense of the word and we are now very much looking forward to a new, exciting chapter in his career."

Regarded by champion trainer Gai Waterhouse as the best she has ever trained, Pierro retires with 11 wins from 14 starts, including 5 at Group 1 level for earnings of \$4,536,630. No stud fee has been announced.

BHA TESTING BEGINS AT MOULTON PADDOCKS

The British Horseracing Authority have announced that they will be undertaking a rigorous testing regime of all the horses housed in Mahmood Al Zarooni's Moulton Paddocks stable in Newmarket. Following the disqualification of Godolphin's conditioner for eight years on Thursday and the imposition of a six-month ban on the 15 horses at the centre of the steroid controversy, Britain's ruling body will begin the investigation Monday. Chief Executive Paul Bittar told *rsn.net.au*, "We are working with Godolphin in a pretty tight time frame of something like five to 10 days, to ensure that the stable remains licensed, although there won't be a licensed trainer. There are two assistant trainers, but neither of them are fully licensed. It's likely that [Saeed] bin Suroor will have oversight for a lot of the horses, or Godolphin may choose to decide that Moulton Paddocks will not be used at all during the course of the British summer. We are giving them every opportunity to ensure that decision over the next five to 10 days. Godolphin and Sheikh Mohammed have given use a commitment that they will cooperate fully with all of our requirements in terms of investigations. Our team will be at Al Zarooni's stable tomorrow to scan all the horses and do an inventory. We will be testing them from Monday, in which we will cover every horse in the stable that we have not yet tested. We will also be doing a review of their procedures in that stable and then providing them with a report of what needs to be done to get it up to speed." Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford reiterated the operation's desire to make amends. "It will take a long time [for us to recover], but we will get there because Sheikh Mohammed passionately loves racing and he will make sure that everything will be done to make the stable clean," he told Channel Four Racing.

Ken and Sarah Ramsey, Mike Maker and Joel Rosario had been close to unbeatable at the Keeneland meet, so it should have come as no surprise that they would find their way into the winner's circle for the closing day feature. Claimed for \$50,000 from trainer Ken McPeek and Joseph Engelhart, Magdalena Racing and Robert Trussell when fourth over the Polytrack here exactly a year ago, Dark Cove resurfaced at Fair Grounds Jan. 5 to finish fourth in an off-the-turfer. He beat \$40,000 claimers on the Gulfstream sod under Rosario Feb. 10, and had last been seen finishing second for a \$50,000 tag in Hallandale Beach Mar. 7. Maker has had incredible success in graded stakes with horses he has claimed--including Ramsey colorbearers Furthest Land (Smart Strike), Accredit (E Dubai), Headache (Tapit), Kindergarden Kid (Dynaformer) and Lonesome Street (Broken Vow)--and the step up in class for Dark Cove proved no problem. Well-held by Rosario to stalk from close range while kept out wide, he asserted late on the final bend and kicked home for a decisive victory. "I can't believe we've doubled the old record of 12 wins [in a single Keeneland meet]," said an emotional Ramsey, who was presented with a gold tray for winning eight graded stakes at the Lexington oval. "To win 24 is unbelievable. The low point about today is my wife [Sarah] had to be taken to the hospital yesterday. She's not doing that well, but nothing life-threatening. That's the only sad part, that she's not able to be here with me. But this is almost like heaven." For good measure, Maker and the Ramseys also took the last race of the day and meet at Keeneland.

Generally a force in pattern-race company without being a top-notcher, Trumpet Major followed a success in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster in September 2011 with an impressive win in a weak renewal of the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket last April. Fourth in the G1 2000 Guineas back there the next month, inconsistency crept in and he was last on three of his next four starts with a share of the spoils in the G3 Thoroughbred S. at Goodwood in August the exception. Settled in third early, he reeled in Highland Knight inside the final 100 yards and drew away for an ultimately comfortable score. "We were worried when it rained and it was closer to soft than good," jockey Richard Hughes said. "He's a good horse, he won the Craven and finished fourth the Guineas when I made the running on him, so this could be his year."

Having cut his teeth in tough company in his native Ireland before emerging as a serious black-type performer, Sugar Boy showed the strength in his country's sophomore division by leading home two compatriots in this once-important Derby trial. Having beaten the subsequent G1 National S. runner-up Designs On Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) in a 7 1/2-furlong nursery at Tipperary in August, the bay dominated the Listed Eyrefield S. over nine furlongs at Leopardstown in November and ran with credit when runner-up to Ballydoyle's leading Derby prospect Battle of Marengo (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G3 Ballysax S. over this trip back at the latter venue last time Apr. 14. Sent straight to the lead by Chris Hayes, he traveled comfortably until tackled and passed by Eye of the Storm approaching the quarter pole. Rallying gamely against the fence, he was back in front with 100 yards remaining and dug in to score by a head, with fellow Irish raider Galileo Rock staying on in eye-catching fashion to fill the trifecta clear of the home-trained contingent. "He's very straightforward to ride and likes to do things his own way," rider Chris Hayes said. "The stiff track suited him and I probably wasn't positive enough on him." Trainer Patrick Prendergast told PA Sport, "He'll go for the G1 Irish Derby [at The Curragh June 29] and he could go straight there. If he needed another run, his only option is the [June 7] Listed Nijinsky S. at Leopardstown. Hopefully, later on, he could come back over here for the G1 St Leger [at Doncaster Sept. 14]."

LAST CHANCE FOR POINTS IN DERBY TRIAL

Nine sophomores are set to square off under the lights and Twin Spires in tonight's GIII Derby Trial S. at Churchill Downs. The one-mile heat offers

20 qualifying points to the winner for the GI Kentucky Derby, which would place that runner at no worse than 21st on the list for next Saturday's Classic. Twenty will make it into the gate for the "Run for the Roses," so the



Derby Trial winner would likely need one defection should his connections opt to wheel back on short rest. The Derby Trial last produced a Kentucky Derby starter in 2005.

Todd Pletcher already has six horses who qualify for the Derby (and five confirmed runners), and saddles two competitors here. One of his representatives, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' **Capo Bastone** (Street Boss), already has four Derby points thanks to a third-place finish in last year's

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and would knock stablemate Winning Cause (Giant's Causeway) out of the 20th spot with a win. His connections, however, are banking on a cut back in distance helping the chestnut return to his best, and may not be keen to stretch back out to 10 panels in a week should their runner score. He was ninth last time in the nine-furlong GIII Spiral S. at Turfway Mar. 23. Cont. p7

"After the Spiral it was absolutely necessary for us to take a deep breath and regroup," said Eclipse President Aron Wellman. "Sure, we could have pressed the envelope and tried to force Capo into another Derby prep race, but that wouldn't have been in his best interest and it could have compromised him for the future. We have been curious to try him on turf, as his turn of foot suggests he'd really relish the green, but after seeing him breeze twice over the Churchill dirt, it made sense to try him on this strip." He added, "The biggest question surrounding Capo all along was whether his incredible acceleration would be as potent around two turns as it is around one, so the one-turn mile distance of the Trial should be smack-dab in his wheelhouse."

Pletcher's second representative is Perretti Racing Stable's **Forty Tales** (Tale of the Cat), who kicked off his career with two wins before a fast-closing second in Gulfstream's seven-furlong GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 2. Backed down to even-money in the GIII Swale S. over the same trip a month later, the bay could only muster a fifth-place run after a wide journey.


Fleet-footed **Zee Bros** (Brother Derek) figures to be flying early and will hope to hang on late. Representing the same Zayat/Bob Baffert connection that was second in this race last year with Paynter (Awesome Again), the probable favorite earned a 102 Beyer Speed Figure for breaking his maiden by 2 1/2 lengths second out going a furlong shorter Mar. 23.

One horse who reportedly would go for the Derby should he get in is **Titletown Five** (Tiznow). Second between eventual Grade I winners Violence (Medaglia d'Oro) and Orb (Malibu Moon) in a Saratoga maiden last August, the dark bay romped by nine lengths and earned a 98 Beyer Speed Figure when donning cap and gown here Oct. 28. He tired to second in Oaklawn's six-furlong Gazebo S. Mar. 20, and faded to ninth after dueling through hot splits in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 30. "We've been trying all winter to give this colt a shot at making the Derby," Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas, who already has Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) and Oxbow (Awesome Again) for the Derby, told *Daily Racing Form.* "This is his one chance. We'd love to see him make the most of it."

Vyjack Pleases Rodriguez...

Pick Six Racing's **Vyjack** (Into Mischief) turned in a five furlong work in 1:00.40 at Churchill Downs yesterday that left trainer Rudy Rodriguez "very, very pleased."

"He did everything I asked for," said Rodriguez, who was aboard the colt for the work. "I'm happy with the way he breezed and everything is 100% right."

The bay gelding was timed in splits of :12.20, :24.20, :36 and :48.20, and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14. His five-furlong time was the third fastest of 32 at the distance.

"I wanted a nice, decent work, not slow and not fast," Rodriguez said. "I wanted to blow him out a little bit and I think I accomplished that. It

looked like he came back good. We scoped him and everything looks very, very good. I could not be more happy."

Vyjack went unbeaten through his first four starts, including the GII Jerome S. and GIII Gotham S., before finishing third, a length behind Verrazano (More Than Ready) and Normandy Invasion (Tapit) in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 6. He exited that race with mucus from a slight lung infection and spent some time at Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland before shipping to Churchill Downs. Rodriguez noted that Vyjack, who will be ridden for the first time by Garrett Gomez next Saturday, may have another short work next week.

"I want to see how he will react in the next couple of days," he said. "I might come back and do it again. We'll let him tell me what's going on, but I got a very

> good work out of him today and I think we're ready." David Wilkenfeld, the man behind Pick Six Racing, was on hand to watch his only horse work. The New Yorkbased entrepreneur said he didn't want to miss a moment of being apart of the Kentucky Derby.

"Just being here is a wonderful experience," he said. "I wanted to get down here early. This is, for me, probably a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. It could happen again, but right now I only have one horse, so I'm going to enjoy every moment

With exercise rider Cassie Garcea in the irons, Falling Sky was clocked through fractions of :12.40, :23.80, :35.40, and :47.20. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:13. "He worked the way we wanted him to. We're just trying to keep him

happy," Reynaldo Abreu, assistant trainer to John Terranova said. "We just wanted him to settle a bit and he showed he can. He settled and did his thing at the eighth-pole. We weren't looking for him to

Rose to Gold Blossoming...

Kathleen Amaya and Raffaele Centrofanti's **Rose to Gold** (Friends Lake), a contender for next Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks, worked four furlongs in :47.80 under the twin spires yesterday. She was ridden by jockey Calvin Borel, and posted the second-fastest of 51 moves at the distance. She was caught in splits of :24 and :35.60, and

galloped out five furlongs in 1:00 and six furlongs in 1:13.20.

"She is awesome," said Borel. "She worked very good, better than last week. This is a filly that is getting better all the time."

Borel has been aboard Rose to Gold for her last two starts--victories in the GIII Honeybee and GII

Emollient Works at Keeneland...

Juddmonte homebred **Emollient** (Empire Maker) posted her first work yesterday since her front-running nine length victory in the GI Ashland S. Apr. 6, breezing four furlongs in :48.80 at Keeneland. Clockers caught the 3-year-old in fractions of :24.40 and :48.80, galloping out in 1:02.40. "For her first breeze back, we didn't want anything crazy," said Rodolphe Brisset, assistant trainer to Bill Mott, who rode Emollient in the work. "It was a normal breeze for the Mott team. Now we have to make sure she comes out in good order tomorrow morning. She will ship to New York tomorrow afternoon. I'm going with her." Brisset noted that no plans have been made regarding Emollient's next race.

<u>GIII Derby Trial S.</u> - Became an instant fan of Capo Bastone following his visually impressive **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** performance at first asking at Del Mar last August and have been tracking his career

intently since. Ran well in defeat throughout the remainder of his juvenile campaign with plenty of trips and excuses, including a solid third after a very wide and troubled voyage in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Switched to the Pletcher barn and treated once again with Lasix after a well-documented bleeding episode in the Juvenile, he had to work harder than expected (a bit out

of his comfort zone sitting closer to the pace that day) when annexing a two-turn \$75k optional tagger over a tiring sloppy surface at Gulfstream Feb. 16. Put a line through his GIII Spiral effort courtesy the dramatic stumble at the start, and he should really be sitting on go here. Capo Bastone figures to relish the cut back in distance to a one-turn mile, and with **Zee Bros** and several other speedy others signed on, the Eclipse colorbearer should receive the dream set-up that he's been waiting for. Added bonus: gets re-united with Garrett Gomez, who was aboard in his aforementioned debut last summer. Think (more like hoping) he'll go off higher than his morning-line odds. **Selection: #6 Capo Bastone (5-1)**

BRIAN DIDONATO:

Last Week - Well, there you have it folks. With one very nice pick by Mr. Sherack, my long-time lead is long gone and it doesn't look like I have much hope of battling back. Wings of Fortune was an even sixth in the Lexington, but my turf/synthetic angle came through with a \$15.60 winner and \$393.40 exacta. Didn't like the winner at all, but felt a little better about myself after seeing that **Sunbean** (fifth) went off the 5-2 favorite with only dirt races to go on. Would need my pick this week to return three or four times what he figures to pay to show to rally late, but would be more than happy just to show a profit in another one of these contests--it's a whole lot harder than it looks. Check tomorrow's paper for the final contest tally, and thanks for following along.

GIII Derby Trial S. - One-turn mile races are always interesting because they're not quite sprints, but not quite routes either. You can never go wrong with a turnback, and that's where I landed. Likely favorite Zee **Bros** will take some beating, but he's a very quick horse who now must stretch his speed over an additional furlong--he seems very talented, but vulnerable here. Titletown Five broke through by nine lengths going seven panels over this strip last October. He earned a 103 BRIS Speed Rating, second-fastest in the field only to Zee Bros' last. He'd most likely take this if he duplicated that effort. Titletown Five's race before graduating looks awfully good now, too. He was second, beaten a neck, in a Saratoga maiden last August. The winner was none other than subsequent GII Nashua S. winner and GI CashCall Futurity hero Violence. And who was third? Some horse called Orb, who beat Violence in the GII Fountain of Youth S. before a decisive victory in the GI Florida Derby. Titletown Five's belated sophomore bow came in Oaklawn's six-furlong Gazebo S., where he attended a slow-to-average pace and opened up at the top of the lane like he was going to win for fun, only to grow leg weary and have to settle for second. I'm going to chalk that up to simply needing the race. The dark bay was then asked to stretch out to nine furlongs in the GII Louisiana Derby, and hooked up with a 99-1 shot through impossible early spits before fading to ninth. Hopefully he'll have gotten some added fitness from that effort and be poised to return to his best third off the lay-off. A mile figures to suit him well, and he should get first run on the closers. Selection: #9 Titletown Five (5-1)

Flat Out (Flatter) has amassed just about half of his \$2.5-million bankroll at Belmont Park and returns to his favorite venue for today's GIII Westchester H., a course-and-distance test for the GI Metropolitan Mile H. on Memorial Day. The 7-year-old has posted an average Beyer Speed Figure of just shy of 110 in winning the 2011 GII Suburban H. and the last two runnings of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup for half of his six career victories, but has been below his best this season, finishing fourth to Graydar (Unbridled's Song) in the GI Donn H. Feb. 9 and fifth to that rival last time out in the GII New Orleans H. Mar. 30. Today's race has also attracted some new shooters. Gold Mark Farm LLC's Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song), who became a **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** when besting Wickersheim (Unbridled's Song) by 1 3/4 lengths in a 6 1/2-furlong Gulfstream maiden Jan. 24. The form was validated when that Silverton Hill runner destroyed a field by 11 lengths in his next appearance and has subsequently registered a triple-digit speed figure. Cross Traffic made it two straight with a 7 1/2-length thrashing of GISP Fast Falcon (Awesome Again) over Gulfstream's oneturn mile Mar. 10 and figures here despite the class hike. Dogwood Stable's Big Screen (Speightstown) was runner-up to recent GSW Cigar Street (Street Sense) in a Feb. 17 Gulfstream allowance, but Beyered 110 in winning a two-turn mile over the Aqueduct inner Mar. 23. Norman Asbjornson (Real Quiet) took advantage of a very fast pace ahead of him to win the H. E. Johnson Memorial S. at Laurel Mar. 16, and while the waters are clearly significantly deeper here, should be flying late.

Smith S., half-brother All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}) flies the flag for the family in Saturday's G1 All Aged S. at Royal Randwick. The bay, who defeated the nowretired Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) in the G1 Caulfield Guineas and finished ahead of that one when runner-up in the G1 Cox Plate last spring, dominated the competition in the G1 C. F. Orr S. and G1 Futurity S. in February, but makes his first start in nine weeks against top competition. "His fitness will have to be right there, it's not like he's going in first-up against second-rate Group 1 horses," jockey Dwayne Dunn told AAP. "He needs to stamp his authority on it--and I think he can." Today's race is likely to be his last in Australia, with a possible trip to Royal Ascot hinging on today's run. A year ago on this day, More Joyous (NZ) (More Than Ready) was busy wiring the field in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. over 2000 meters, defeating Manighar (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), but remains at this shorter trip this time around. She couldn't quite get to stablemate Pierro, settling for second in the G1 Canterbury S. at Rosehill Mar. 23, and exits a troubled fifth in defense of her title in the G1 Queen of the Turf S. Apr. 6. Epaulette (Aus) (Commands {Aus}) was third in the Caulfield Guineas and returned from a six-month hiatus to make history-of sorts--last time, finishing runner-up to Black Caviar in what would become her career sign-off.

Last year's runner-up **Manighar (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}) seems to be rounding back into top form and was a solid fourth to Pierro, beaten a length and a quarter, in the G1 George Main S. over an insufficient 1500 meters Apr. 6. Reliable Man (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) ran with credit in Europe last year for Alain de Royer-Dupre, with a fourth to So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot before filling the same spot behind Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. in July. He was sixth in the Ryder, 1 1/2 lengths adrift of Pierro, and will clearly be suited by this added real estate.

Winner of the fillies' division of the G3 Blue Diamond Prelude S. Feb. 9, she was only ninth when well-backed in the G1 Blue Diamond S, two weeks later. A decent fourth to Overreach (Aus), another Exceed and Excel filly, in the G1 Golden Slipper S. Apr. 6, she backed up a week later and rolled home to best Scandiva (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) by 3/4 of a length in the G1 Sires' Produce S. Scandiva defeated Shahad (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the G2 Magic Night S. Mar. 30 and enhanced her value with her strong performance in the Sires'. Her dam Scandinavia (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}) is a half-sister to Helsinge (Aus) (Desert Sun {GB}), dam of Black Caviar. Criterion (NZ) (Sebring {Aus}) accounted for Fast 'N' Rocking (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the G2 Todman S. Mar. 23 ahead of a troubled sixth in the Slipper. He bypassed the Sires' and is a fresh horse for today's test. "I don't think he was really a Slipper horse but the owner wanted to run him," trainer David Payne told AAP. "Still, I think he should have been in the money if [jockey] Hughie [Bowman] hadn't gone around the field. If he stays inside I think he runs a place."

Velazquez to Ride Animal Kingdom at Royal Ascot...

Jockey John Velazquez, who rode Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) to victory in the 2011 GI Kentucky Derby, will be aboard the colt when he makes his career finale at Royal Ascot in June, Team Valor International has announced.

Velazguez has a history of success at Royal Ascot, having ridden at the meeting in 2000, 2009, and 2011,

and recording victories aboard the Wesley Ward-trained duo of Jealous Again and Strike the Tiger in 2009. Velazquez has not been aboard Animal Kingdom since an allowance victory at Gulfstream Park in February 2012, but will fly to England to breeze the colt prior to his intended start, which could come in the G1 Queen Anne S. going a mile June 18, or the

G1 Prince of Wales's S. over 1 1/4 miles the following day. Animal Kingdom was last seen winning the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 30 under jockey Joel Rosario.

"Johnny knows the horse better than any other rider and he has had success at Royal Ascot," trainer Graham Motion said. "He won on a straightaway at Royal Ascot and if we decide to go in the Queen Anne S. on opening day up the straight, that experience figures to come in handy."

Barry Irwin, president and CEO of Team Valor International, added: "No American jockey is riding better than Joel [Rosario] right now. We thought he gave a peerless performance in the [Dubai] World Cup. But we don't think it would be fair for the jockey to ride him on a straightaway when neither jockey nor horse had done it before. Dropping from a mile and a quarter around turns on a synthetic track to running uphill on a straight course on grass is quite a transition for any horse, especially at this level. So the decision to go with a jockey that knows the horse and the course made the job easier. It was a difficult decision."

DYNASTY RULES ON DAY ONE

The confidence in the Thoroughbred market has been on the increase worldwide, and the figures of the first day of the Emperors Palace 2013 Yearling Sale certainly



mirror that trend with the aggregate up 25% to R65.1 million, the average up 39% to R321,000, and the median up 47% to R220,000. Despite labeling it

a tough sale, Bloodstock South Africa CEO Tom Callaghan was pleased with the increases, and was optimistic that day two would show a similar improvement.

"Quality begets quality," Callaghan said. "We were very well-supported at the top end of the market with strong competition for the quality horses on offer. Despite the aggregate being up it, there was definitely shrinkage of the middle market, hence it was a very tough for sale for some breeders. Overall though, the results are indicative of the success of our new and innovative marketing strategy, such as the added value stakes incentive program, which has in turn attracted new buyers to the sale. We could, however, expand our customer base much further, and will be looking at ways to achieve this in future."

The sale started slowly with several lots selling between R100,000 and R500,000, but nothing excited the buyers until Lot 37 entered the ring. Produced by



Prairie, the full brother to the dual Group 1 winner Jackson (SAf) (Dynasty {SAf}) from the female family of Canadian champions Sky Classic, Classy 'n Smart, Regal Classic and Dance Smartly, was never going to be a cheap purchase.

the Cozzene mare Moonlit

Lot 37 Liesl King Despite the pedigree appeal, visiting Kiwi auctioneer Steve Davis had to work hard to get that first bid on the board. Once

he had fired up the bidders though, the price quickly soared. With Jackson's owner Jack Mitchell in the auditorium, there was little doubt as to who would win the bidding war. In the end, Mitchell had to go to R2.2 million to secure the handsome colt, with Justin Snaith the lucky trainer.

"He is the image of his father," Mitchell said. "I look for a horse with a good head and a good eye and he has both--I had to have him."

Snaith was delighted to have been allocated the handsome bay to train, commenting that he is a stunning horse with an amazing temperament. Mike Sharkey, manager of vendor Highlands Stud, agreed, adding that the colt was one of the nicest horses in their draft. Barely 30 lots later, Mitchell teamed up with Nick Johnson to add Lot 65, another Dynasty colt, out of the National Emblem (SAf) mare Parfait (SAf), to the collection for a more modest R400,000.

Markus Jooste's Mayfair Speculators had been very quiet during the early part of the day, but when Lot <u>179</u> Stormy Eclipse (SAf) walked into the ring, it was game, set and match for Jooste. Despite Mike Bass providing serious competition, Jooste was determined to take the well-conformed colt home and the hammer finally came down at R2 million. The outstanding colt by Dynasty, out of the Kilconnel mare Stormy Appeal (SAf), was consigned by Dr. Ashley Parker's Ascot Stud. Derek Brugman, Jooste's racing manager, explained that Stormy Eclipse would be going to Charles Laird and that the well-balanced colt had impressed them with his good walk. Laird was particularly pleased to have acquired the colt.

"This is the horse--this is the one I wanted. He is a very special horse," enthused a smiling Laird.

Jooste added a bit of South American blood to his racing stable when he went to R900,000 for Lot 218, a chestnut filly by Easing Along out of the imported Argentinean mare Tough City (Arg) (City West {Arg}) from the female family of Equus Champion Female Stayer Candy Critic (Arg) (Candy Stripes).

"Pedigree, pedigree, pedigree," said Brugman. "She is a good breeding prospect and technically a very correct filly."

Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell South Africa provided some fireworks when Form

Bloodstock signed for Lot 233, a beautiful bay colt by Jet Master (SAf) out of the Group 1 winning Fort Wood mare Urabamba (SAf). The bidding climbed in leaps and bounds as the colt calmly strolled around the ring, and it soon became clear that a new sales topper was about to be crowned, with the hammer falling at R3.4 million.

Shadwell South Africa purchased six yearlings earlier in the year and Angus Gold commented that they were very happy to be buying in South Africa as the yearlings were very good value by international standards. He added that they got lucky with Soft Falling Rain (SAf) (National Assembly), winner of the G2 Godolphin Mile on World Cup night, and that from Sheikh Hamdan's viewpoint, South Africa is a good value market.

Dynasty is certainly the stallion of the moment and the mantel of sales topper changed hands again before finally coming to rest on Lot 263, as Jooste forked out R3.6 million for the Dynasty colt Trees of Green (SAf) out of the Complete Warrior mare Wonderful World (SAf). He is a half brother to the talented Chave de Oura (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}), winner of the Group 3 Cape Classic. Brugman labeled the colt "the absolute perfect specimen of a racehorse." He added, "He is well topped with a great shoulder and a beautiful head, but his greatest attribute is his fantastic walk." Brugman confirmed that Mike de Kock will be in charge of the colt's career. **Cont. p15**

Time Odyssey (SAf) (Lot 202), the beautifully named half brother to Saturday's Group 1 SA Derby favourite Tellina (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}), had attracted attention in the lead up to the sale and the colt certainly did not disappoint. Consigned by Maine Chance Farms, the bay colt from the last crop of multiple champion sire Jet



Master out of the Spectrum (Ire) mare Tachina (Ire) was knocked down to Pat Shaw for R1.6 million. Shaw was delighted to acquire the colt for owners Mark and Emily Yong.

Lot 202 Liesl King "He is a beautiful specimen from a great family and will eventually be joining my string in Singapore," he said. Marsh Shirtliff, owner of the 2012 Equus Sprint

Champion What A Winter (SAf) (Western Winter) who is retiring to stud at the end of the year, was clearly on the lookout for a replacement. When Lot 258, the beautiful Western Winter out of the Argosy mare Wise Dame (SAf) aptly named Q School (SAf) entered the ring, he was straight into the fray, with the hammer finally coming down at R1.2 million. Q School is a full brother to the talented My Kazzie (SAf), who finished second in the Group 1 Golden Slipper.

Gavin Van Zyl, seemingly on a shopping spree, started buying early on, when he signed for Lot 8, a Fort Wood half-sister to his star colt Slumdogmillionaire (SAf) (Strike Smartly), with the hammer falling at R700,000.

"She is a very athletic filly with a lovely eye," Van Zyl said. "I just hope she takes that athleticism to the racetrack."

Before long Van Zyl, who has had great success with Silvano (Ger) offspring, forked out R800,000 for Lot <u>127</u>, a huge bay colt by Silvano out of the Model Man (SAf) mare Romantic Drama (SAf), then added Lot <u>195</u> for good measure, a Kahal (GB) filly out of the Elliodor (Fr) mare Surfers Eye (SAf).

He may not have been one of the sales toppers, but there was certainly an air of excitement when Lot 74 entered the ring. Named Gran Blanco (SAf), the colt is the first white horse registered in the South African Studbook. By Kahal (GB) out of the Rakeen mare Perakeen (SAf) from the family of Perfick (NZ), the colt created a stir when he was born, with breeder Mike McHardy convinced that the wrong sire must have covered his mare. Tests however revealed that not only was the paternity of the colt correct, but he was also officially a white medicine hat.

With Champions Day taking place at Turffontein Racecourse today, the sale continues Sunday with another 256 yearlings will come under the hammer.

Uneasy Co-Existence...

The most intriguing aspect of the South African bloodstock scene over the last three years has been the uneasy co-existence of Johannesburg's National Yearling Sale and the new auction on the block, the Cape Thoroughbred Sale held at Cape Town in January and introduced in 2011. The two sales could not be more different in both style and setting.

The National Yearling Sale, staged by the country's Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, has long been regarded as South Africa's premier auction. It sits incongruously in the middle of an industrial storage area that has swamped the location of the old Gosforth Park racecourse. Away from the concrete surroundings, the actual complex is fresh, sunny, traditional and laid back. The Cape Sale, on the other hand, takes place inside a monstrous convention centre, where the horses are kept under roof in a temporary stabling structure. It is a novel, brash affair and because of its timing, caters increasingly for early types of horses.

While there has been inevitable friction between South Africa's TBA and the board that runs the Cape Sale, leading South African breeder Andreas Jacobs of Maine Chance Farms believes the two sales can thrive together. Among his first-day National Sale draft was Lot 202, a colt from the final crop of Jet Master (SAf), who made R1.6 million.

"I think the Cape Sale has become a great addition to the South African sales circuit," Jacobs said. "It attracts international buyers and it is a popular location that people enjoy. It is very efficient as a place to look at yearlings and fits in well with Cape Town's social elements. It has attracted new buyers, and people talk about it internationally.

He continued, "As a breeder, I know I can send different types of horses to each sale, which works very well. Cape Town is a very early sale and it is much harder to sell a late maturing type than it is here."

At the inaugural Cape Town auction Jacobs failed to sell today's Saturday's G1 South African Derby favourite Tellina (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}), a half-brother to the R1.6 million yearling.

"So I took him here and sold him, which worked better because he had three more months to develop," Jacobs said. "Vendors have worked out now which horses to send to which sale." **Cont. p16**

Jacobs is keen to explore ways in which the two sales could come under the same management, but accepts wounds need to heal.

"Competition is healthy," he said. "We have a good relationship with the TBA. But at the same time, we have taken horses away from their sale."

The existence of two major sales catering for different types of yearlings has been well-received by leading buyers such as Derek Brugman, manager for one of South African racing's most influential figures, Markus Jooste.

"The Cape Sale is where you tend to get the early types, but at the same time you do get plenty of Classic types," Brugman said. "[Godolphin Mile winner] Soft Falling Rain is a very good example. Both sales have different markets, but work well together. If you have a late maturing type then you know you can come to this sale and get more money than if you sold it in January. The Cape Sale works for breeders because you get a return on your investment earlier. And it is a less expensive sale for many breeders as they don't have to travel as far and deal with the costs of keeping a yearling [in Johannesburg] for 10 days or so."

Cape-bred yearlings that are sold at the National undergo 18 hours in transit. However, the quarantine restrictions that haunt South African racing and breeding means that Brugman buys regularly at a major level for Jooste at Australian sales.

"We cannot shuttle stallions to South Africa so we buy in Australia more out of necessity than choice," Brugman said. "We would always buy in Australia, but not as much as we do at the moment because we need to bring new sire lines in." *-Richard Griffiths*

Stud Grooms Get Their Due...

Easily the most deserved, yet least expected breeders on the stage for an awards ceremony for South African producers of Group 1 winners were stud grooms Karel Frederiks and John Sakati.

Both men joined more established names at the Emperors Palace complex for an event organised by the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Thursday night. In all, the breeders of 28 native Group 1 winners were recognised. Of that illustrious group, 75% were out of South African mares.

Frederiks and Sakati are among the 50-something staff members of the Wilgerbosdrift Stud who formed a syndicate to breed from the mare Cosima Liszt (Chi) (Rich Man's Gold)--an incentive given to the team by the stud's owner, Mary Slack. The stud team kept it local by sending Cosima Liszt to resident stallion Tiger Ridge. It was a wise move as the resultant foal was Wagner (SAf), winner of the Group 1 Summer Cup at Turffontein last year, the sire's first top-level strike in South Africa.

The thrill of breeding a Group 1 winner is beyond the dreams of many stud workers, but there has also been a financial gain for the team--they sold Wagner as a yearling for R200,000. And his half-brother by Lundy's Liability (Brz) made R160,000 in Cape Town this January.

What's more, 19 of the stud grooms re-invested their Wagner money last year in a R7,000 foal by Rebel King (SAf), who made R160,000 at the same Cape auction. Frederiks, busy overseeing the Wilgerbosdrift draft on the opening day of the National Yearling Sale, said, "To breed a Group 1 winner has been an incredible experience; we are all so happy that Mary gave us this mare to breed from." --*Richard Griffiths*

CHICAGO QUARANTINE OPEN FOR BUSINESS After nearly 10 years of work, Chicago has been

officially approved as a quarantine station for importing horses into the U.S.

Until recently, horses entering the U.S. had to arrive via New York, Miami, or Los Angeles, according to United States Department of Agriculture regulations. Simon Glennie and Matt Haug of International Racehorse Transport set out to change that rule, however, under the banner of Chicago Import Quarantine.

"To get that changed was going to take a fairly substantial effort," Glennie explained. "But we're in Chicago, and we're in the transport business. We had to set this up as a separate commodity, but we feel we know the market well, and we feel there is a market for horses to come into Chicago."

In 2010, Glennie and Haug were granted a license by the USDA, at which point they struck a deal with Arlington Park to renovate its guarantine facilities.

"We've been renovating their existing import quarantine barn that they use for the Arlington Million runners, and have now made what was a two-barn quarantine into a four-barn quarantine that is fully certified, fully approved by the USDA, and a year-round quarantine site," Glennie said.

Glennie pointed out that Chicago provides a much more seamless option for horses shipping to Kentucky. While horses flying into New York at John F. Kennedy Airport are forced to van three hours upstate for quarantine before enduring a 15-hour van ride to Kentucky, horses arriving in Chicago need only travel 20 minutes from O'Hare Airport to Arlington Park, followed by a six-hour van ride to Kentucky.

O'Hare welcomed its first shipment of horses from England this weekend, which are competing in this week's Rolex Kentucky Three-Day Event. Glennie noted that a shipment of Darley runners from Dubai also arrived on the weekend.

"We've been working for the last six or seven years to get Chicago approved as an import for horses," Glennie said. "We hope it's going to help the industry."



Record-Breaking Keeneland Spring Meet Concludes: *Edited Press Release*

Keeneland concluded its 2013 spring race meeting Friday with a number of records, including all-sources handle, as well as most wins by an owner, trainer and jockey.

All-sources wagering on Keeneland's 16-day meeting was a record \$158,640,589, with a daily average of \$9,915,037, compared to the previous record of \$158,368,309 set during the 15-day 2007 spring meeting that averaged \$10,557,887 per day.

The construction along US 60/Versailles Road, the main corridor into Keeneland, did not deter fans as the spring meeting also set an attendance record of 278,415 over 16 days, for an average 17,401 per day.

This figure bests the previous record of 269,292 set at the 15-day 2012 spring meeting, as well as the previous record for a 16-day spring meeting of 243,606 set in 2008.

"This was an amazing meet from so many aspects-wagering, attendance and quality of racing," Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason said. "Our horses, horsemen and jockeys remain second to none, as do our fans.

Owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey, trainer Mike Maker and jockey Joel Rosario joined forces to set records and earn spring meet titles as owner, trainer and jockey, respectively.

The Ramseys' 25 wins during the spring meet shattered the previous record of 12 wins by an owner during a single race meeting. The Ramseys won a total of 12 races last fall, which tied Calumet Farm, which achieved that mark in the spring of 1941, and Mr. and Mrs. Robert F. Roberts, who won 12 races during the 1968 fall race meeting.

Winners of the Eclipse Award as leading owner in 2011, the Ramseys have earned 12 titles as Keeneland's leading owner, including a sweep of last year's spring and fall race meets. They currently rank second behind T.A. Grissom, who leads all owners with 14 meet titles.

Leading trainer honors went to Maker, who won 25 races this meet, the most by a trainer in a single Keeneland race meet. The previous record of 22 was set by D. Wayne Lukas in the fall of 1989. It is the second Keeneland training title for Maker, who topped the rankings in the fall of 2008.

Rosario captured the leading rider title during his first full meet at Keeneland, compiling 38 victories to set a record for most wins by a jockey in a spring meet. The previous record of 32 wins was set by Randy Romero in the spring of 1990. Pat Day holds the overall record of 45 wins set during the fall of 1991.
