RAMON DOMINGUEZ RETIRES

Three-time Eclipse Award-winning rider Ramon Dominguez, sidelined since a spill at Aqueduct this past January, yesterday announced his retirement from the saddle.

"Riding Thoroughbreds has always been my passion and my calling," Dominguez said in a statement. "When I was 13 and watched my first horse race in Venezuela, I knew that I would become a jockey, and my riding career has brought happiness and success beyond what I ever expected. Thus, it is extremely difficult for me to announce that, due to the severity of the injuries I sustained in an accident at Aqueduct Racetrack on Jan. 18, 2013, my professional riding career has come to an end. While I hoped, and even expected, to be able to return to the saddle, as a result of my injuries and, upon the advice of my treating physicians, it has been determined that I will no longer be able to pursue my career as a jockey. I want to personally thank my

family, fans, and fellow riders for overwhelming support in the months since my accident."

The 36-year-old Dominguez suffered a fractured skull when his mount, Convocation, clipped heels and he was thrown to the ground. The spill occurred on

the eve of Dominguez earning his third straight Eclipse Award as the nation's leading rider.

During the 2012 season, Dominguez rode the winners of \$25,634,852, a single-season record, as well as 10 Grade I races. Among his major victories last season was a dead-heat victory aboard Alpha in the GI Travers S. He also captured the GI Breeders' Cup Turf aboard the popular Little Mike. He was honored with the George Woolf Award, recognizing a rider whose career and personal character earn esteem for the Thoroughbred industry. **Cont. p3**

PAYNTER COMES FULL CIRCLE

Zayat Stables's Paynter (Awesome Again), who overcame a pair of life-threatening illnesses following his victory in last year's GI Haskell Invitational S., makes a much-anticipated return to the races in a seven-furlong allowance test today at Betfair Hollywood Park ([Brisnet.com PPs](#)). For owner Ahmed Zayat, today's race marks the end of one long road and the beginning of another. "Right now, I am extremely excited and I cannot wait to see the champ," Zayat said Thursday by phone. "To be quite honest with you, if you had asked me then 'what would be your dream?' it would be that my horse would survive this incredible ordeal. Horse like Secretariat, Barbaro and Seattle Slew have not been able to survive all their serious diseases." For Paynter to make it back to the races is icing on the cake. "My prayers and objective was just for him to have a life and have the gift of life," he commented. "For me to see him fit, ready and eager to go back to doing what he loves--which is running--is truly a blessing. I am so gratified and I am so happy and so excited and I can't wait to see him [today]." Zayat and his family will fly in for the race Friday and are expected to depart immediately afterward. "I wouldn't miss it for my life," he declared.

Dominguez retires having ridden the winners of 4,985 races and the earners of \$191,615,698.

In addition to his Breeders' Cup win last year aboard Little Mike, the Venezuelan also rode 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Better Talk Now and 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Hansen. He was the regular rider of Horse of the Year Havre de Grace.

A native of Caracas, Venezuela, Dominguez began riding in the U.S. in 1996. He was leading rider at Pimlico and Laurel five times in 2000 and 2001 and he led the riders' standings at Delaware Park from 2004-2007. He moved his tack full-time to New York in 2008 and almost immediately became a dominant force on the circuit. In 2009, his first full season in the state, Dominguez swept every meet title. The following season, he won five of six meet titles. He was NYRA's leading rider from 2009 to 2012. His 376 New York wins in 2009 were the most on the circuit since Steve Cauthen won 422 in 1977.

"All of us at NYRA are saddened to learn that Ramon Dominguez has been forced to end his riding career," NYRA Vice President and Director of Racing P.J. Campo expressed in a statement. "Ramon distinguished himself immediately upon moving his tack to New York

in 2009. Already a wintertime regular at Aqueduct, Ramon made a seamless transition to riding full-time on the NYRA circuit. He won numerous meet riding titles and many of our top races en route to becoming New York's leading rider for each of the past four years.

"Ramon's accomplishments--including the last three Eclipse Awards as North America's top

jockey--only tell part of the story, though. He has epitomized class, both on and off the racetrack. Universally respected by his fellow riders and beloved by fans, Ramon has built a towering and well-deserved reputation that serves as a standard for all future jockeys. It has been a true privilege to have him in the NYRA riding colony and we wish him and his family the very best in this new chapter of their lives."

Added Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, added, "Ramon Dominguez leaves an indelible mark on Thoroughbred racing and his profession. His many victories and achievements earned him three consecutive Eclipse Awards as the nation's leading jockey in 2010, 2011 and 2012. Above all, he epitomizes sportsmanship and professionalism as demonstrated by the respect he earned from his fellow jockeys. He is destined for Thoroughbred racing's Hall of Fame."

Dominguez was also recognized by his peers and was presented with the George Woolf Award at Santa Anita in 2012. "Ramon Dominguez is one of the classiest jockeys to have ever won the Woolf Award," said Santa Anita President George Haines. "While we know this decision was difficult and very disappointing to Ramon on both a personal and professional level, we congratulate him on a career that will no doubt result in his induction into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame in the near future. Ramon's retirement underscores the dangers of his profession and we know he will continue to be an invaluable member of the racing community in whatever role he chooses for himself and his family. It was a distinct honor to have Ramon and his agent, Steve Rushing, with us to accept the Woolf Award last year and we want to wish them both all the best."

Velazquez, Meyocks Speak on Behalf of Guild...

Along with his fellow jockey Javier Castellano, Hall of Fame rider John Velazquez accepted Dominguez's 2012 Eclipse Award at ceremonies held the day after the incident at Aqueduct and gave a heartfelt speech about his colleague. Velazquez, who serves as the president of the Jockeys' Guild, issued a statement yesterday, saying, "Ramon Dominguez is one of the greatest riders of all time. His fellow riders and his fans have had the pleasure of seeing his passion for the sport and his drive for perfection in all he has done. I strongly believe that because of his accomplishments on and off the track, he belongs in the Racing Hall of Fame. He is one of the best advocates for racing that this sport has ever had. We will miss his contributions on track but hope he will remain actively involved in the racing industry. This can happen to any jockey, and we all know the risks. However, with Ramon's injury, and now his retirement, I will continue to focus my efforts to make this sport safer for every rider at every track and to ensure riders and their families have adequate safety nets to cover catastrophes. He is blessed to have a wonderful wife, Sharon, and a terrific family, and I am honored to have him as one of my closest friends." Terry Meyocks, the national manager for the Guild, added, "Ramon's performance over the years has shown his passion, determination and drive. In all my years in the sport, Ramon remains one of the best riders I have ever had the pleasure to work with."

"He has been a tireless advocate for improving safety at racetracks, and while the owners, trainers, fans and the sport will miss seeing him ride, I am hopeful Ramon will continue to be actively involved in racing. The Guild values his contributions as a current board member, and we look forward to his involvement in racing in the future, in whatever capacity that may be. I personally want to wish Ramon, Sharon and their sons, Alex and Matthew, all the best."

Trainers Reflect on Dominguez's Retirement...

In the wake of jockey Ramon Dominguez's retirement announcement, several trainers offered their reflections on a championship career

Some of Dominguez's biggest wins last year came aboard Little Mike (Spanish Steps), who won the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and GI Arlington Million.

"He was a big part of some of the biggest events in my career, for sure, with Little Mike and I'm not sure we could have done it without him," said trainer Dale Romans. "I mean, he was a horse nobody believed could go a mile and a quarter or a mile and a half, and for some reason, he and Ramon got along. He got him to go the distance and relax and do the right thing. I'm just very thankful to have had Ramon for those races. I wish I had him on him this year."

"I hate that he has to leave under these circumstances," added Romans. "But, he surely doesn't have anything left to prove and without a doubt he is going to be successful in whatever he chooses to do."

Another horse that made a mark on Dominguez's record-breaking 2012 season was Alpha (Bernardini), who he rode to an exciting dead-heat victory in last year's GI Travers S.

"He fit Alpha very well," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "He is a great rider and he rode him well. I give him a lot of credit for staying after him in the last furlong. I thought we were beat at the eighth pole and he stayed after him and kept riding hard to get there for the dead heat. It was my biggest win as a trainer and I was happy he was part of it. He is just a wonderful person."

"It's a big loss for Thoroughbred racing across the world really, that he is having to call it quits," McLaughlin continued. "He is a great rider, a great person, and a great ambassador to our sport. Hopefully he will carry on in some capacity in our industry. It would be great to see him be able to carry on in our industry because he is such a great person and a great family guy. No one ever says anything negative about him."

New York Thoroughbred Horseman's Association President and trainer Rick Violette Jr. said Dominguez's retirement will leave a void in New York racing.

"It was a shock to hear the announcement today that Ramon was retiring," Violette said. "He has always showcased the very best that New York racing has to offer, not only through his ability as a rider, but also as one of the classiest people in the sport. That he will be sorely missed can't be overstated, but we wish him much good luck in the future, and sincerely hope that his future includes continued involvement in horse racing. Racing will always need role models like Ramon."



Dogwood Stable's colorful President W. Cothran "Cot" Campbell sat down with the TDN to answer a few questions following Palace Malice's GI Belmont S. victory.

How did you celebrate after the Belmont?

CC: We went back into the city and went to The Post House steakhouse with my granddaughter, son-in-law and Anne and I ate lobster. By about 10:30 we were

like balloons that had a pin stuck in them. We sort of collapsed and flew back to Aiken (South Carolina) the next morning.

How does this win compare to Summer Squall's 1990 GI Preakness S. win?

CC: Well, it's pretty hard to look back 23 years and say this was different than that. They were both fabulous. I would say that the response

from the public has been overwhelming this time. I've never heard from this many people in my life. I didn't think I was unpopular, but I didn't know I was this popular. I'd say the response has been greater, but I can't compare the actual feelings of the day. They were both wonderful, and when you win a race like that it's like throwing a stone into a pool. The ripples just keep going out and out and out and out.

After Summer Squall's Preakness win, did you ever think you'd find yourself in the winner's circle after another Classic?

CC: Yes, I sure did. In fact, in 1996 I tried to bet \$100,000 in Las Vegas that Dogwood would win a Classic before the year 2000. They wouldn't take the bet, but that shows a certain amount of hope that I'd win one.

You had previously announced that you were going to scale back your racing operation. Does this win change anything?

CC: I don't think it does. I'm doing about what I want to do, and I love what I'm doing and would never want to be without it, but we once carried 65 horses and now we're down to about 30. I like that level and it may drop down some more.

You once worked as a sportswriter. Did you ever think that one day you'd be the one getting interviewed?

CC: No, I don't think I did. I was strictly a minor league sportswriter and gravitated into other things. It never crossed my mind. Like much of life you sort of ease from one thing to another and doors open and opportunities are there.

"It is no secret that Royal Ascot was his favorite meeting of the year and we felt it was fitting to honor his achievements here next week, and remember the passing of one the greatest figures that the world of sport has ever seen. Our thoughts are with Sir Henry's family and I am delighted that Lady Jane will be accompanying the Countess of Wessex for the trophy presentation following the Queen's Vase."

TRACKSIDE... with Liesl King

A JOURNEY DOWN PALACE HOUSE LANE

What better place to find oneself on the eve of Royal Ascot than in the birthplace and home of horse racing: Newmarket, England. In a town where the 3,000 horses, residing in 75 training yards, have right of way, it is almost impossible to move without coming across a horse. Even knowing that most of the 16,000 inhabitants are in some way related to the horse industry does not prepare one for the sight of horses popping out of gateways or strolling past the shops on their way to the gallops. Yet, venturing slightly off the beaten track, I discover a place where only their ghosts reside.

It is in a little street innocuously called Palace House Lane that I find myself staring at an official looking yellow paper. Stuck onto solidly padlocked white gates, which give no indication of what lies beyond, is a notice proclaiming something about an Application for Building work on a Listed building. I happen to be standing in front of the gates of what was once the most famous yard in Newmarket--the Palace House stables. Nowadays, few know of its existence, but mere meters off the High Street, tucked away behind these unimposing gates, is arguably the most extraordinary piece of history.

Picture the scene; it's 1605 and King James I is traveling between his hunting lodges in Royston and Thetford, when a fog descends, forcing him to overnight in the town of Newmarket. After a good night's rest, he awakens in the morning to the sight of the rolling grasslands of the

Newmarket Heath and its surrounding forests. He realizes he has just discovered the perfect place to go hawking and hunting. So, what does any good king do when he discovers a perfect spot for his favorite sport? He builds a Royal Palace, of course. Sadly, the English Civil War intervened, and down came the Palace. War over and with Charles II on the throne, the lure of Newmarket is simply too much, and a new Royal Palace is built further down along what is now Palace House Lane together with the obligatory Royal Stables.

It all went swimmingly as racing thrived in Newmarket, but as with all good horse stories, there has to be some scandal. In 1791, we have the Escape affair. At a time when horse racing was run as a series of heats, George IV, the Prince of Wales, instructed his jockey to prevent Escape from winning his first heat. Escape then duly ran away with the second heat and the Prince collected handsomely. However, secrets are never safe for long and the Prince was rumbled. The Jockey Club had no choice and found him guilty. The Prince promptly sold off all his racing interests and left Newmarket. The town went into a steady decline and by the early 19th Century Palace House and its stables fell into disrepair and were sold off.

Yet as in all good stories, along came a knight on a white charger, with Baron Myer de Rothschild purchasing and restoring Palace House and its stables in 1857. Occupying the stables is Jem Godding, who promptly trains Macaroni to win the 1864 Derby, thus restoring Newmarket's reputation as a training center.

Today, behind the white gates stands the original trainer's house surrounded by boxes on three sides. An archway leads one into the "new yard" built by Leopold de Rothschild in 1903, complete with an ornate stone fountain in the center. The Palace House stable complex, while sturdy, has clearly seen better days. The grass almost obscures the fountain and the doors are all boarded up, yet in the stables themselves, one can still catch a glimpse of a glorious era long gone by. Solid troughs with beautiful green tiled surfaces above them are positioned in two corners of the roomy stalls, a cornice runs around the ceiling and a single high set window provides light. As I wander through the stables, the peeling paint and cobwebs forgotten, I can almost hear the stamp of hooves, the swish of a tail and a suspicious snort from the occupants of so long ago. It seems as if time stands still here in the Palace House Stables, and it is in the tack room at the end of the corridor that I am most reminded that this was once a working yard. A large wooden saddle rack fills the room, while ornate bridle hooks grace the walls and beneath them, dented and rusted, hang two hoof oil pots.

There is a palpable sadness in the air, as I look out at what arguably was one of the "first" training yards in Newmarket. However, there is an ambitious project underfoot to restore the Stables to their former glory. The buildings will be used to house a new National Horseracing Museum, a new National Gallery of British Sporting Art and the Edwardian Inner Yard, built by Leopold de Rothschild, will be adapted to house popular retired equine heroes.

So when you next visit Newmarket, be sure to wander off the beaten track, down Palace House Lane to the Palace House Stables. The cobwebs and the peeling paint will be gone, but if you close your eyes and listen carefully, you might just hear the call to hunt as James I rides out with his falcon or the sounds of Macaroni crunching his oats as he lazily flicks a fly with his tail.

Connections could easily have sent him off to stud, but decided on another year at the races, and the decision looks to be paying dividends. "Elliott Walden and WinStar deserve the credit because they could have taken him to the breeding shed Dec. 1," Byrne continued. "After some careful consideration and input from Mr. Sandford, they decided to let the horse stay in training as long as he was running well. Hats off to WinStar for giving us the opportunity to let this horse be all he can be." Byrne won back-to-back runnings of the Stephen Foster in 1997-98 with City By Night and Awesome Again.

ORFEVRE ARC RETURN IN DOUBT

Sunday Racing's **Orfevre** (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) may have his return bid in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe derailed after it was reported that he had bled after routine exercise. Last year's runner-up in that Longchamp feature had been working towards the G1 Takarazuka Kinen at Hanshin next Sunday, but plans are on hold now. "This morning Orfevre worked ahead of the Takarazuka Kinen, but afterwards was short of breath and also coughed," trainer Yasutoshi Ikee told the *Racing Post*. "The vet diagnosed Exercise-Induced Pulmonary Haemorrhage and so I have decided he will not run. It isn't serious, he didn't bleed from the nose and the blood vessels should heal in two weeks. We'll look towards the autumn. In a few days he will go to the farm for a break. The future is not certain, including the trip to France. As to his next race I'll have to discuss that with the owners."

DOUBLE FOR LADY CECIL

Warren Place sent out two winners from five runners as the stable operated for the first time under Lady Cecil yesterday, with **Morpheus (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) providing a poignant first since the death of Sir Henry Cecil. Khalid Abdullah's half-brother to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) recorded an impressive success in the extended-mile maiden and was followed just 10 minutes later by a similarly striking performance by Sir Robert Ogden's **Songbird (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in a fillies' handicap at Yarmouth. "Henry put everything into place and did all the entries," assistant trainer Mike Marshall said at the latter venue. "He got his Ascot team together and we just hope for a bit of luck. To get a couple of winners on the board for Lady Cecil and the team was lovely today. Henry was about keeping things going. There is obviously a somber mood, but the most important thing is people remembering Henry for the happy times. He was a character who stood out and a great man."

HK POSITIVES DUE TO FEED CONTAMINATION

Officials at the Hong Kong Jockey Club announced yesterday that a second registered feed product for racehorses was suspected as having been contaminated by Zilpaterol, a banned substance. Samples of this particular product were forwarded to the Club's Racing Laboratory for analysis and by Thursday afternoon, the presence of Zilpaterol was confirmed. The news comes just days after the same banned substance was discovered in as many as 18 horses that raced at Happy Valley and Sha Tin June 2 and 5. It was later determined that the proximal cause for the drug positives was feed contamination. Trainers in Hong Kong have been advised that alternate feeds had been sourced and would be immediately introduced into the stables. Some 80 horses that have been exposed to either of the two contaminated products were to be subjected to urine sampling ahead of this Sunday's live program at Sha Tin. The contaminated feed is believed to have been imported from California, though officials at the HKJC would not specify the name of the product.

TWO LABS RECEIVE RMTC ACCREDITATION

The University of California-Davis Kenneth L. Maddy Laboratory and HFL Sport Science Inc. in Lexington have become the first drug-testing laboratories to receive full accreditation from the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, according to a release from RMTC.

“The accreditation of these two laboratories marks the culmination of many months of effort by each of these laboratories to demonstrate that they meet the strict standards of expertise and proficiency required by the program,” said Dr. Robert Lewis, chairperson of the RMTC board. “The accreditation process is an important step forward in protecting the welfare of our equine and human athletes, as well as the integrity of horse racing.”

In addition, the Ohio Department of Agriculture has received interim accreditation ahead of an on-site inspection by the RMTC. Five other labs have applied for accreditation: Truesdail Laboratory (Tustin, California); Dalare Associates (Philadelphia, Pennsylvania); New York Drug Testing and Research Program (Morrisville, New York); Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory (West Chester, Pennsylvania); and Industrial Laboratories (Wheat Ridge, Colorado).

“The goal is to have 100% of the laboratories testing horse racing samples RMTC accredited,” said Dr. Dionne Benson, Executive Director and COO of the RMTC. “We encourage these laboratories and all horse racing testing laboratories to continue to pursue RMTC accreditation. The purpose of the RMTC accreditation process and Quality Assurance Program is to ensure that all laboratories are operating at the same high level of proficiency.”

To be considered for accreditation, drug-testing labs must first be ISO 17025 certified, recognizing general requirements for competence of testing and calibration labs and then undergo a multi-faceted assessment by the RMTC.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

As a result of the recent outbreak of Equine Herpesvirus (EHV-1) at Woodbine Racetrack outside of Toronto, officials at Park Stud in the province of Ontario have decided to close the breeding shed ahead of schedule and conclude the 2013 breeding season for its stallions. There has been no sign of the virus at the stud. "It was a difficult decision, as we have always tried to accommodate our clients in any way we can," said Park Stud's Warren Byrne. "While the EHV-1 virus has not been detected at Park Stud, the mere threat of the virus miles away at Woodbine, and the fact that it is so easily transmittable, poses too much risk to the stallions, the horses residing on the farm, and our clients' mares. We would like to thank all of the breeders who bred with us in 2013. We had a truly amazing season and will look forward to 2014." Santa Anita will be closed for training during Del Mar's upcoming meet July 17 to Sept. 4 due to renovations of the stable area and grandstand. Horses that were scheduled to stable and train at Santa Anita this summer will go to Betfair Hollywood Park instead. "Live racing will return to Santa Anita in late September and we have some ongoing renovations that we need to undertake and complete as soon as possible," said Santa Anita President George Haines. "We're excited to be able to embark upon these upgrades and we'd like to thank the folks at Betfair Hollywood Park for allowing us to do this at this time, during the seven-week Del Mar meeting. Our fans and horsemen are a huge priority to us and these projects will benefit us all." Santa Anita will reopen at the start of its fall meet Sept. 27, with the highlight being the Breeders' Cup World Championships Nov. 2 - 3.

Ross Brinson Passes Away:

Ross Brinson, the trainer of 1947 Hollywood Gold Cup winner Cover Up and the father of Hollywood Park starter Gary Brinson, died Thursday morning at the age of 101. "He was proud of winning the Gold Cup in track-record time, but even more so of winning the Sunset H. with the same horse just five days later," said Gary Brinson. A native of Dardanelle, Arkansas, Ross Brinson was raised in Arizona and rode quarter horses in match races as a young man. He began his training career in 1932 and saddled a total of 352 winners. He was also the trainer of the popular Billy Ball, named in honor of the feisty baseball manager Billy Martin, who won his first four starts by a combined 22 lengths. Brinson's other son Clay trains at Canterbury Park. Along with his sons, Brinson is survived by three grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
