#### DEEP IMPACT IN DEMAND AT JRHA SALE



Session-topping Deep Impact--Shes All Eltish colt

While buyers and consignors sweltered in unusually hot Hokkaido weather, the Japan Racing Horse Association's elite select sale boiled Monday, fueled by unprecedented foreign investment and an enlivened domestic economy to reach record heights in the yearling session.

"Tremendous," declared a beaming Katsumi Yoshida, owner of perennial leading consignor Northern Farm, after the nine-hour session ended. "This was a big, strong sale."

Indeed, the JRHA record 226 yearlings sold at the Northern Horse Park from the record 257 offered generated an all-time high gross of ¥6,160,700,000, up 18.6% from last year's turnover, which had also set a record. The average price of ¥27.26 million (about US\$267,255) lagged behind the record of ¥31.32 million set in 2006, yet represented a slight increase of 0.99% from 2012, and the clearance rate was a stout 87.9%.

Eight yearlings made it to the magic finish line of \$100 million or more, although only five reached the equivalent of US\$1 million or more under the current exchange rate of \$102 per \$1 cited by the JRHA in official results.

While new buyers, including Qatar's Sheikh Fahad bin Abdullah Al Thani, plunged into the market known for its high prices, which are justified by the Japan Racing Association's lucrative purses, longtime buying stalwarts Riichi Kondo, Takaya Shimakawa, Hajime Satomi and the husband-wife team of Masahiro and Mizuki Noda dominated the top end.

Once again, the most precious commodity at the JRHA sale was almost anything sired by Deep Impact (Jpn).

He has assumed the legacy of his sire, 13-time Japanese leader Sunday Silence, as the king of Japan's sale rings and racetracks. Kondo, a construction and demolition magnate, prevailed in a duel with Shimakawa to acquire the day's highest-priced yearling, a robust Deep Impact colt out of 2008 Grade II Bonnie

Miss S. winner Shes All Eltish (Eltish), for ¥180 million (about US\$1,764,706) from the Northern Farm consignment.


"This one was my top selection of the day," said Kondo, who has campaigned the likes of 2007 Japanese Horse of the Year Admire Moon (Jpn) (End Sweep), as well as champions Admire Don (Jpn) (Timber Country) and Admire Groove (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). "I own his full-brother [multiple winner Admire Oja {Jpn}], but this individual is much better. The price was more than I thought it would be, but I really,

really wanted him, so I didn't want to stop bidding."

Higher than expected prices were cited by many buyers, but the heat of the market did not deter them. As they waved hand-held fans while seeking relief from the sultry air inside the sale pavilion and, as outside temperatures hovered around 90 degrees, buyers forged ahead in spending more yen. cont. p3



Shimakawa, who flew into Hokkaido the morning of the session from his base in Sendai, arrived just in time to halter <a href="Hip 50">Hip 50</a>, another son of Deep Impact and the first foal of GI Personal Ensign S. winner Persistently (Smoke Glacken). The affable natural foods entrepreneur walked into the sale pavilion as Hip 49 entered the ring and minutes later he had bought the Deep Impact colt for ¥170 million (about US\$1,666,667)--the second highest price of the session--after bidding opened at a breathtaking ¥80 million (about US\$784,314).

"I think I'm lucky to have made it," said Shimakawa, who owns about 200 horses in training and has as his main racing target the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby). "This is a Derby-type horse and I'm always dreaming of winning the Derby."

A racy specimen from Northern Farm, the colt boasts a sterling Phipps Stable pedigree, as his third dam is champion Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold), dam of Grade I winner Good Reward and sire Pure Prize, and full-sister to Grade I winner Oh What a Windfall.


Shimakawa also bought a filly by King Kamehameha (Jpn) who is a full-sister to multiple Group 2 winner To the Glory (Jpn) for ¥105 million (about US\$1,029,412) -- the only yearling to cross the \$1-million barrier who was not sired by Deep Impact.

"I thought this price was too expensive, but everyone recommended her, so I bought her," said a chuckling Shimakawa as he joked with the media. "What I am thinking about now is how I am going to pay for these horses."

Consigned by Northern Farm, the filly is out of Japanese champion To the Victory (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who is the only distaff runner to finish as high as second in the G1 Dubai World Cup, and her extended family includes GI Belmont S. winner Creme Fraiche.



Two other yearlings, both sons of Deep Impact, drew bids of ¥110 million (about US\$1,078,432). Billionaire gaming software executive Hajime Satomi acquired Hip 95, the first foal from multiple French Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed La Boum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), and cell phone technology patent owner Yoichi Aoyama purchased Hip 133, the first foal of GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. winner Ave (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

Both of those Deep Impact colts were consigned by Teruva Yoshida's Shadai Farm.

"When I inspected horses at Shadai, Teruya was in Europe for Royal Ascot," Aoyama said. "Usually, I buy the horses Teruya recommends, but this year there was no Teruya, so I picked this one, who was the best Deep Impact I have seen. When he came out of the barn, suddenly I recognized that he was the best horse. I fell in love. I heard other big players liked this colt, and I thought I had no chance. So, I am very happy to manage to buy him."

Satomi just as firmly believed the colt out of La Boum, recommended by Deep Impact's trainer Yasuo Ikee, was the best of Deep Impact's yearling offspring at Shadai Farm, although the final price was about 10% higher than Satomi expected to pay.

"But as I look at today's results overall, I think this is a good price," Satomi said. "I like the pedigree, as the dam is by Monsun and the second dam is by In the Wings (GB) (Sadler's Wells). This is a staying family, so I expect him to be a Derby horse."

Mizuki Noda joined the rush to obtain a yearling by Deep Impact, sire of the last two Japanese Derby winners in Deep Brillante (Jpn) and Kizuna (Jpn), as well as 2012 filly Triple Crown winner Gentildonna (Jpn), by buying a filly out of French Group 2 winner Musical Way (Fr) (Gold Away {Ire}) for ¥100 million (about US\$980,393) from the Northern Farm consignment.

"When I went to inspect the horses, I thought this was the very best filly," Noda said, adding that all four of her trainers gave their approval to the selection. "The price was a bit more than I thought it would be, but I didn't intend to stop bidding."

Noda also signed tickets in her own name for a colt by King Kamehameha out of Japanese Group 3 winner Zarema (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}) for ¥90 million (about US\$882,353) and a Harbinger (GB) filly for ¥22 million (US\$215,687).

In the name of their Danox Co. Ltd., known for its bestselling accounting software, Mizuki and Masahiro Noda bought nine other yearlings to rank as the session's top buyers. Those purchases included a colt by King Kamehameha out of a half-sister to Japanese champion dirt horse Vermilion (Jpn) (El Condor Pasa) for ¥74 million (about US\$725,491) and two fillies and another colt by Deep Impact.

Altogether, the Nodas' dozen yearling purchases added up to a total of ¥606 million (about US\$5,941,176). Shimakawa ranked as second leading buyer with five yearlings for ¥363 million, followed by Satomi with six for ¥356 million and Kondo with five for ¥287 million.

Buoyed by the strong results and an outstanding group of foals cataloged for today's session, the final one of the two-day sale, JRHA officials expect even more fireworks before bidding concludes.

#### Foreign Invasion...

The Japan Racing Horse Association will mark July 8, 2013, as a landmark day in the history of its select sale for a reason equally as important as the record turnover

of ¥6,160,700,000 achieved during the yearling session.

For the first time in the history of the sale inaugurated in 1998, several foreign-based buyers ranked among the top purchasers, ranging from Qatari Sheikh Fahad bin Abdullah Al Thani to Chinese businessman Yida Zhang.

Led by Australian Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds, at least four of the top 27 leading JRHA buyers for the session are based outside of Japan. Accompanied

by his American bloodstock advisor David Ingordo, Fudge bought three yearlings while Sheikh Fahad, advised by racing manager David Redvers, acquired a colt and a filly.

Both spoke highly of their experience in Japan and have committed to racing their purchases in the island nation.

"Without a doubt, this sale is of an international standard," said Fudge. "There are now people from all over the world coming here, when there weren't any three or four years ago when I started--it was pretty lonely then.

"The standards keep going up, and Japan will be of equal importance to me as my Australian racing interests," continued Fudge, who also has raced in Europe and the U.S. "It's all about standards, and we've got them here."

"This is as strong a sale as anywhere we've been," said Redvers. "The sale complex and the show they put on is better than anything we've seen anywhere else in the world-the service and hospitality is beyond anything else."

Sheikh Fahad hopes the colt he acquired from the Northern Farm consignment by King Kamehameha (Jpn) for ¥90 million (about US\$882,353), a full-brother to multiple Japanese stakes

winner Kahuna (Jpn), will be a classic horse two years from now.

"[Hip 76] is my Guineas horse," Sheikh Fahad said, referring to the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas). "This is my first time to make a purchase in Japan, so I know this is kind of a trial this year," Sheikh Fahad added. "I'd like to see how [the horses acquired] progress and then maybe I will come back next year with much bigger money."

Redvers, who signed the ticket for the colt, in addition to Hip 62, a lovely ¥13 million (about US\$127,451) filly by Neo Universe (Jpn) out of multiple American Grade I-placed Along the Sea (Anees), described the JRHA sale scene as "fascinating," adding that the prices for yearlings were steep but that he and Sheikh Fahad hoped to be more involved buying foals during the final sale session today.

"We've come here on our maiden voyage, so we're just putting our toe in the water," Redvers said. "The smart horses are as good as anywhere you would find in the world and they make the prices you might expect."

Two of Fudge's three purchases have pedigrees that have great appeal in the U.S. A Tapit colt that he acquired for ¥80 million (about US\$784,314) is out of Art Princess (Officer), an English Group 2-placed halfsister to multiple Grade I winner Zazu (Tapit) and to Grade II winner Flashback (Tapit). Ingordo noted that he had selected Zazu as a yearling for owners Ann and Jerry Moss, adding: "He reminds me a lot of Zazu. He's a smashing horse, a beautiful mover, and well prepared. He's got an international pedigree and he can run anywhere Mr. Fudge wants to take him."

Fudge also bought a stunning colt by Empire Maker (Unbridled) out of Ravi's Lovin (Giant's Causeway), a daughter of millionaire Lu Ravi (A.P. Indy) and from the family of champion Halfbridled (Unbridled) for ¥34 million (about US\$333,334) and Hip 51, a colt by Japanese champion sprinter and miler Kinshasa no Kiseki (Aus) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) for ¥29 million (US\$284,314). Those acquisitions were enough to rank Waratah as the 10th leading buyer of the yearling session.

With two yearlings for Sheikh Fahad, Redvers was the 16th leading buyer with ¥103 million spent. Zhang ranked as the 21st top buyer with colts by Neo Universe and Gold Allure (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) for a total of ¥75 million, and Australian Phil Sly ranked 27th with a pair of fillies, one by Admire Moon (Jpn) (End Sweep) and the other by Daiwa Major (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) for a combined ¥53 million.

While the dam of this bay colt was unraced, she is a daughter of the extremely popular 1997 Japanese champion mare and Horse of the Year Air Groove (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}) and her family has always sold well at the JRHA sale. Air Groove's progeny include her champion daughter Admire Groove (Jpn) (Sunday Silence); her international Group 1-winning son Rulership (Jpn), who like this colt is by King Kamehameha, and Group 2 winner and classic-placed Forgettable (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}).

#### 338 c Deep Impact (Jpn) Azeri

Consigned by Northern Farm

The rarest kind of offering, by a Japanese Horse of the Year and out of American Horse of the Year and three-time champion Azeri, this colt

is an eye-catcher physically as well as on paper. In 2012, his then yearling half brother by Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) sold for ¥80,000,000 (\$987,655) at this venue, and the pedigree has continued to improve as Azeri's American-bred offspring, led by Grade III winner Wine Princess (Ghostzapper), have distinguished themselves. "No doubt, this is the most outstanding individual out of Azeri," said

This is the first foal from a multiple Group 1 winner in Argentina who comes from a family chock-full of high-level South American performers. G1 Gran Premio Polla de Potrancas (Argentine 1000 Guineas) winner La Costa Azul (Arg) (Southern Halo), Group 1 winner Lac Azur (Mutakddim) and Group 2 winner Cagliari (Salt Marsh) feature in this pedigree. Foaled on January 30, this colt is already weaned and will enter the ring with a reserve price of ¥70 million (about \$693,550).

#### 410 c Deep Impact (Jpn) Lily of the Valley (Fr)

Consigned by Shadai Farm

The subject of much presale buzz, this flashy brown colt with four

white feet and a white stripe is the first foal of his dam, who won the 2010 G1 Prix de l'Opera over eventual American female turf champion Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}). Shadai Farm owner Teruya Yoshida said the colt sells himself to anyone who sees him. From the family of Italian champion Bold Apparel (Fr) (Bold Forbes), the colt will be offered with a reserve price of ¥100 million (about \$980,393).

#### 436 c Empire Maker Rosy Mist (Jpn)

Consigned by Kineusu Bokujo

From the second Japanese crop by GI Belmont S. winner and top sire Empire Maker (Unbridled), this bay is a half-brother to 2010 champion Japanese juvenile and multiple Group 1 winner Grand Prix Boss (Jpn) (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}). The family includes American stakes winners Fine Spirit (Secretariat), who was third in the inaugural GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

# 437 c Victoire Pisa (Jpn) May Kiersey (Ire) Consigned by Shadai Farm



# Comments on today's paper





#### FINDING OLD FRIENDS AT NORTHERN FARM

In June, I was honored with an invitation to be a guest of Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm in Hokkaido, Japan, to do a feature profile for the upcoming issue of North American Trainer, and I soon embarked on the 25-hour journey to meet with Yoshida's son Shunsuke; my hosts, veterinarian Dr. Hirofumi Kawasaki and yearling office staff member Noriko Takahashi; and Australian-based social media force Su-Ann Khaw, who arranged the visit.

Katsumi Yoshida's name is familiar in North American, European, and Australasian racing circles, most recently for purchasing Grade I winners Zazu (Tapit) for \$2.1 million, Tapitsfly (Tapit) (\$1.85 million), Musical Romance (Concorde's Tune) (\$1.6 million), and Hot Cha Cha (Cactus Ridge) (\$1 million) in November and for privately acquiring three Australian or New Zealand Cassic winners: Absolutely (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}); King's Rose (NZ) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}); Shamrocker (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}); and G1 Caulfield Cup winner Southern Speed (Aus) (Southern Image), in December, plus dual Classic winner Mosheen (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) (owned in partnership with Phil Sly) last February.

But U.S. racing fans will primarily associate Northern Farm with Horse of the Year Azeri, champion older female from 2002-2004. The daughter of Jade Hunter was sold to Katsumi Yoshida at Keeneland in November of 2009 for \$2.25 million, in foal to Distorted Humor. cont. p9

Azeri's 3-year-old daughter Amelie, that Distorted Humor foal, broke her maiden at Hanshin on June 23, a well-timed catalogue update ahead of the Japan Racing Horse Association (JRHA) Select Sale at Northern Horse

Park today, when Azeri's suckling Deep Impact colt will go under the hammer. On paper and physically, he figures to bring one of the top prices at the sale. Azeri is also dam of Grade III stakes winner Wine Princess (Ghostzapper), Grade II stakesplaced Arienza (Giant's Causeway), winner Take Control (A.P. Indy), and, in Japan, of Azerina Gakki, an unraced 2-year-old colt by Zenno Rob Roy (like Deep Impact, a son of Sunday Silence) who sold as a yearling at last year's JRHA auction for over \$1 million.

Azeri is back in foal to Northern Farm homebred, Triple Crown winner, and twotime Horse of the Year Deep Impact, who stands at nearby Shadai Stallion Station for ¥15 million (roughly \$150,000). The sire of four crops of racing age, Deep Impact led the sire listings in 2012 (when his Gentildonna won the Filly Triple Crown) and

heads it to date in 2013. Since his first 3-year-olds, he has sired the winners of every Oka Sho-G1 (Japanese

1000 Guineas): Marcellina, Gentildonna, and Ayusan; and of two runnings of the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby): Deep Brillante and Kizuna. He also has a Classic winner in France, G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Beauty Parlour.

Sunday Silence (who was imported by Yoshida's father Zenya) features in the coverings of many of the imported mares at Northern Farm. Tapit's Grade I-winning daughters Tapitsfly and Zazu are expecting their first foals, by Deep Impact, in 2014. Another Tapit mare, champion Stardom Bound, is in foal to Deep Impact. She didn't have a foal this year, but has a yearling filly by Northern Farm homebred and Kingmambo's champion son King

Kamehameha, leading sire in Japan in 2010 and 2011 and second behind Deep Impact in 2012 and 2013. The

sire of 2010 Filly Triple Crown winner Apapane (bred by Northern Farm) stands at Shadai Stallion Station for ¥7 million (\$70,000).

Storm Cat mare Loves Only Me, a half-sister to Irish champion Rumplestiltskin whose dam is a full sister to Kingmambo, has yearling and foal colts by Deep Impact, and is back in foal to him.

I was, as with everything else during my stay at Northern Farm, indulged in an emotional paddock visit with retired 24-year-old broodmare What Katy Did, a Grade I-producing daughter of my favorite sire, Nureyev.

It's no exaggeration to say that, from what I've seen, the horses at Northern Farm enjoy an idyllic existence and are looked after well by the farm's top-class staff, which includes full-time veterinarians and blacksmiths. We viewed nearly half of their foal and yearling sale consignment, additional mares, foals, yearlings, and racehorses, plus stallions at the Yoshida family's Shadai Stallion Station, and each one was presented immaculately, professionally, graciously, and with pride, in a setting so green and so magnificent that it defies imagination. But for me, nothing drove home the quality of life here more than when I happily stumbled across What Katy Did living out her days as a content and valued member of the team.

Among the most notable withdrawals yesterday was Qatar Racing's King's Stand third Pearl Secret (GB) (Compton Place {GB}), who is set to stick to five furlongs according to trainer David Barron.

"He is quite a free-going horse, so to test him on the July Course over six furlongs might have been something I didn't really relish and I think Jamie [Spencer] didn't relish it," he explained. "We'll hang back and he'll go to Goodwood."

# PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

It was another of those weeks when choosing a topic for this column was far from straightforward. Contenders from three different continents staked their claim by siring more than one notable performer.

In Europe we saw the Irish National Stud's Invincible Spirit achieve a stakes treble thanks to his daughters Tickled Pink (G3 Coral Charge Sprint S.), Moonlight Cloud (G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot) and Mayyadah.

The former German stallion Silvano also excelled,

achieving a Group 1 double which spanned both Northern and Southern Hemispheres. South Africa's champion sire was responsible for Heavy Metal, who follows Bold Silvano as the stallion's second winner of the Durban July, and his double was completed by Lucky Speed in the Deutsches Derby.

My curiosity was also stirred by the unfamiliar name of Judpot, another South African resident. He achieved Group 1 success with his son Forest Indigo on the same day that his daughter Along Came Polly was second in another Group 1.

Judpot never raced but this 8-year-old son of A.P. Indy has the distinction of being the last foal of the great Miesque. This makes him a brother to the Group 3 winner Mingun and a half-brother to the Classic winners Kingmambo and East of The Moon, as well as the Group 1 sire Miesque's Son. He stands at Varsfontein Stud.

The weekend's proceedings in the U.S. were dominated by Ghostzapper, with the 2004 Horse of the Year making his mark with a tremendous graded stakes treble.

Minutes after his very progressive son Moreno had run away with the GII Dwyer S., Ghostzapper struck again when his daughters Starship Truffles and Judy The Beauty filled first and second places in the GI Princess Rooney H.

Then, on the other side of the continent, his daughter Schiaparelli took the GII Royal Heroine Mile S. on the turf at Hollywood Park. VIDEO.

If Ghostzapper has a nickname, it should be something along the lines of Lazarus, as his stallion career has undergone a spectacular resurrection over the last few years. The son of Awesome Again appeared to be heading for rock bottom at the end of 2010, when his fee for 2011 was set at \$20,000--just a 10th of the \$200,000 fee at which he had started only five years earlier. Of course the economic downturn played its part in that rapid descent, but a bigger factor was the slow start made by Ghostzapper's first two crops. Only one of his progeny had succeeded in becoming a graded stakes winner up to that point. Consequently, Ghostzapper is credited with having only 43 named 2-year-olds this year, following a crop of 55 3-year-olds, conceived after his first juveniles had failed to shine in 2009.

That first graded stakes winner was Stately Victor, winner of the GI Blue Grass S. and the Ontario Derby on all-weather tracks in 2010.

When I reviewed this colt's pedigree following his shock victory in the Blue Grass, I asked "was it fair to expect Ghostzapper to be matching strides in the early

stages with some of his more precocious contemporaries?"

I concluded that it wasn't, citing the following evidence: "Even though he was pretty spectacular on his debut at Hollywood Park in the November of his juvenile season, Ghostzapper disappointed next time and wasn't asked to race again for another six months. Nor was he asked to tackle stakes company until the end of August. He finally became a stakes winner a month later, when he trounced the opposition in the GI Vosburgh S. Even that impressive victory wasn't enough to persuade Bobby

Frankel to subject him to the white-hot competition of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at that stage of his career.

"This patient approach paid off handsomely. Having received an International Classification of 116 for his 3-year-old efforts, Ghostzapper topped the following year's World Rankings with a figure of 130, earned with a perfect record of four wins from four starts. Even though we saw him only once at the age of five, his victory in the GI Metropolitan H. was good enough to secure him top weight of 128 among the older horses on the World Rankings. cont. 13





"At this point it is well worth adding that Ghostzapper's sire Awesome Again was another who got better and better as he matured. Assigned 117 on the International Classification as a 3-year-old, Awesome Again did so well at four that his rating rose to 130, just one pound below the formidable Skip Away. Awesome Again now has 38 stakes winners to his credit but only six of them achieved stakes-winner status at two.

"Ghostzapper's broodmare sire Relaunch was another who needed a little time, waiting until the Del Mar meet as a three-year-old to score his first stakes successes. Perhaps, in the circumstances, we shouldn't be too shocked that Ghostzapper has taken until now to come up with an important winner."

The subsequent three years have supported this theory. The Ghostzappers, generally, are a very different type from Ghostzapper's celebrated half-brother City Zip, who--with the benefit of having Carson City as his sire--was a quadruple stakes winner at two.

With the help of last week's trio, Ghostzapper's tally of graded/group winners from his first four crops has soared to a much more pleasing total of 17, from a total of 309 named foals in those four crops. That equates to 5.5%, which is the type of strike rate one would hope to see from a racehorse as brilliant as Ghostzapper. It is worth mentioning that his comparatively small crop of 3-year-olds has already produced a pair of Grade II winners in Hear The Ghost and Moreno, plus the speedy filly Elghayoor.

It is important not to forget that these four crops were all sired during the years when Ghostzapper commanded a six-figure fee. It is going to be interesting to see whether he can maintain his current momentum when his cheaper crops reach the track. His current crop of juveniles was sired at \$30,000 and his yearlings and foals were sired at \$20,000, before his resurgence boosted his price back up to \$40,000. I am hopeful that he will continue to succeed, as breeders and trainers now have a much clearer idea of what to expect from him.

For example, don't expect a high-grade two-year-old. He is still awaiting his first graded winner at two and quite a few of his 17 graded winners, such as Mystical Star, Arena Elvira, Pacific Ocean, Za Approval, Hunter's Bay, La Cloche, Schiaparelli and Starship Truffles, didn't gain their first graded win until they were four or five. Still, I'm sure many owners would prefer a horse capable of progressing with age, rather than one which burns bright but briefly at two.

Ghostzapper and his sire raced exclusively on dirt, but quite a few of his progeny, such as Better Lucky, Schiaparelli and Za Approval, have done well on turf, with others proving very much at home on synthetics. Here it seems that there isn't much difference between Ghostzapper and his half-brother City Zip, who ranks as one of America's most effective turf sires.

One of Ghostzapper's attractions as a stallion is that Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector appear no closer than the fifth generation of his progeny's pedigrees, which allows him plenty of options. Last week's treble suggests he is suited by mares from the Seattle Slew line, as both Schiaparelli and Moreno are out of granddaughters of the Triple Crown winner. In fact Moreno is his second graded winner from an A.P. Indy mare (from a sample of 27 foals). He also sired the Grade II winner Mystical Star from a Capote mare, plus a stakes winner from only three foals out of daughters of Seattle Slew.

Inevitably, plenty of his good winners, including all three of last week's graded scorers, have at least two lines of Mr. Prospector. Several others, including the Grade I winners Contested and Stately Victor, possess two lines of In Reality.
