'COMMAND' LEADS O'BRIEN CHARGE



Rested since his six-length success in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 18, Joseph Allen and Coolmore's unbeaten colt pleased Aidan O'Brien in a spin yesterday. "War Command worked well this morning and will definitely take his place in the Phoenix," he said. "There's also the possibility that we'll run Fountain of Youth (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Wilshire Boulevard (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor (Ire))." Connections of Prince Faisal's Ambiance (Ire) (Camacho {GB}), who was third in Tuesday's G3 Molecomb S. at Goodwood, have committed to sending over the Mick Channon-trained colt, and Johnny Murtagh has been booked for the ride. Ted Voute, racing and bloodstock manager the owner, told PA Sport, "Martin [Harley] is busy at Windsor so we've got Johnny Murtagh on board, which is never a bad thing--especially on home turf."



FARISH ELECTED BREEDERS' CUP CHAIR

During a meeting Wednesday in Saratoga Springs, New York, the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors voted William S. (Bill) Farish of Lane's End Farm as Board Chairman. He succeeds Tom Ludt, who served as Chairman for the past two years, but accepted a position as a senior vice president for The Stronach Group this past April and agreed not to run for reelection as chairman. He does remain a Director for Breeders' Cup. Farish previously served as Board Chairman from 2006 to 2011 and will serve a two-year term. Gainesway Farm's Antony Beck was elected to a two-year term as Vice Chairman. "I am honored with the privilege to serve our nominators and our participating horsemen again as Breeders' Cup Chairman," said Farish. "I look forward to working with our Members and Directors to strengthen our organization and to continue our mission of growth and enhancement of the Breeders' Cup World Championships as the leading international Thoroughbred racing event year after year." Added Ludt, "I have enjoyed my term as Chairman overseeing the continued growth and popularity of the Breeders' Cup program on a worldwide scale. It has been an honor to serve our nominators, whose continued funding and support have been invaluable to our organization and our industry."


BHA ANNOUNCES NO CHARGES IN "SUNGATE" INVESTIGATION

Edited Press Release

The British Horseracing Authority has concluded its investigation into the use of Sungate, an Italian veterinary product which contains the prohibited anabolic steroid stanozolol, and all relevant trainers interviewed as part of the investigation have been informed that no charges under the Rules of Racing will be issued against them.

The charges already brought against trainer Gerard Butler will be heard in due course. The BHA became aware of the nature of Sungate and its use on horses in training following a February visit to Butler's [Newmarket] yard, as part of its testing in training sampling program, from which nine horses produced positive tests for stanozolol. It became apparent that a veterinary practice, which had legally imported Sungate under licence into the UK, was prescribing this product and had recommended its initial administration to horses in training. The BHA subsequently met with representatives of the veterinary practice in question. As a result of that meeting the BHA became aware that Butler was not the only trainer to whom it was recommended that Sungate be administered to horses in the trainer's care. Cont. p4



Upon becoming aware of the nature and use of the product on horses in training, the BHA notified the National Trainers' Federation of the product's name and that it contained a prohibited substance. In order to establish the extent of the use of the product, the BHA identified and met with 38 trainers who were known to use the same veterinary practice. The investigation identified that 43 horses from nine trainers had been treated with Sungate by veterinary surgeons and on veterinary advice since early 2010. These administrations were recorded in the medication records required to be kept by trainers in accordance with the Rules, and in the clinical histories of the horses which were obtained, with the trainers' consent, from the veterinary practice. Based on the information gathered during the investigation the BHA concluded that there are no grounds for charges to be brought.

"Having carefully considered our options under the Rules, including taking legal advice and reviewing previous cases, we have concluded that there would no reasonable prospect of a Disciplinary Panel finding that these trainers have breached the Rules of Racing," commented BHA director Adam Brickell. "Under the current Rules of Racing, in the absence of any positive samples, charges could only be brought in cases such as this if there is evidence that the trainer concerned has acted in a manner prejudicial to the integrity, proper conduct, or good reputation of the sport. In these cases there was no such evidence. This is because the nine trainers in question only allowed their horses to be administered with the product on the advice of, and by, veterinary surgeons to treat orthopedic conditions."

He continued, "Following the completion of this investigation, and the ongoing disciplinary proceedings involving Gerard Butler, consideration will be given as to whether the current Rules provide sufficient and appropriate protection against the type of scenario highlighted in this case. In addition, while acknowledging that veterinary surgeons are not currently accountable to the BHA, we will consider how we can reduce the risk of incidents such as this happening again. The charges brought against Gerard Butler are based on a different set of facts and circumstances to those which were identified during this investigation. A date for this hearing will be announced in due course."

Brickell added, "Meanwhile, all licensed trainers are reminded that if a prohibited substance is found to be present in the system of any horse under their care or control, that would constitute a breach of the Rules of Racing. They are also reminded that it is their responsibility as licensed trainers to be familiar with the Rules that govern which substances can and cannot be given to horses under their care and control. Due to the number of individuals and horses involved, and the volume of records reviewed, the process to ascertain the extent to which this product has been used has necessarily been a lengthy one. However we acknowledge that the cooperation of the trainers in this investigation has made the process less difficult than it might have been."

BHA Interim Chief Veterinary Officer Jenny Hall added, "When a veterinary product has been used to treat an orthopaedic condition there is a recovery period associated with the treatment before a horse can return to the racecourse. The clinical histories of the horses in question confirmed that in each case where Sungate had been administered by veterinary surgeons it had indeed been done so to treat an orthopaedic condition. However, it remains a matter of serious concern that a veterinary practice recommended and administered a product containing anabolic steroids, which are prohibited substances under the Rules of Racing, to these horses."



Pletcher's Newest Grade I Hopefuls...

Current meet-leading trainer Todd Pletcher raised his Spa win tally to 16 on Monday with impressive debut winner **King Cyrus** (Bellamy Road) and Shine Again S. heroine **Holiday Soiree** (Harlan's Holiday).

WinStar Farm colorbearer King Cyrus romped home to an 11-length score over seven panels in 1:24.68, earning the **③ "TDN Rising Star" ⑤** distinction.

"We felt like he was a horse who would appreciate the seven-furlong distance," said Pletcher. "He's certainly bred like, and ran like, he wants to go further. We're pleased that he did everything right. We did not anticipate he was going to blow the field away like that. I would think a stake would be in order; I don't know for sure if it would be the [GI] Hopeful [S., Sept. 2], but it might be."

The Shine Again was Holiday Soiree's first start for Pletcher and her next target may be the GI Ballerina S. Aug. 23.


"We'll keep an eye on the Ballerina, but I'm not sure if we'll have enough time; if not, then we'll look at the [GII] Gallant Bloom [H., Sept. 21] at Belmont," said Pletcher. "I'm very pleased with the way she ran; she got herself in good position and finished up well. We're just trying to get to know her a little bit. Once we breezed her, she told us she was ready."

Guillot Represented in Travers and King's Bishop...

Conditioner Eric Guillot will drill GII Dwyer S. hero **Moreno** (Ghostzapper) six furlongs on the main track Saturday in preparation for a run in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24. The gelding set the pace in the GII Jim Dandy S. July 27, before being overtaken by Palace Malice (Curlin) and settling for third.

"He's good. He's better than he was before," Guillot said of Moreno. "He's going to have to be, right?"

Guillot is hoping for an easier pace in the Travers than the one Moreno set in the Jim Dandy.

"I think they're going to go 48 and change versus a 23-second second quarter; we're going to get 24 and change, so we're going to have a little something left in the tank," he said. "A mile and a quarter versus a mile and an eighth. Inner fractions make the race, as we all know if we know anything about horse racing. Every horse has a spleen.

Every horse has 'X' amount of hemoglobin and oxygen. It's like anything else. If you had a pellet gun as a kid with a CO2 cartridge, or a tire with so much air-anything that pertains to running out of oxygen or fuel-it's the same thing."

Guillot will also work **Salutos Amigos** (Salute the Sarge) Saturday in preparation for the GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 24. Salutos Amigos most recently finished third in the GII Amsterdam S. July 28 to garner his first graded stakes placing.

"I've got a shot with Salutos Amigos in the King's Bishop; it's loaded with speed," Guillot, ever the optimist, said. "I got his feet right, and he's going in the right direction. He galloped out past Forty Tales the other day and got beat a jump and a half. The kid [jockey Jose Ortiz] kind of shoved him in there then realized they were going real fast and took back out and came on again. And he needed a race, too."

McLaughlin Looks to Hold 'Court' in the Alabama...

Carnival Court (Street Sense), a half-sister to champion Royal Delta (Empire Maker) is being pointed at the GI Alabama S. Aug. 17, according to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. The 10-furlong event would mark the first stakes attempt for the TDN Rising Star" .

"Carnival Court for the Alabama is likely," McLaughlin said. "We hate to say we're running for third, but we would be tickled to death to be third. She's had three races and won her last two. The distance we know she would like, a mile and a quarter. She's doing very well."

HANDICAPPING A DAY AT SARATOGA, WITH TIMEFORMUS By Bill Finley

Marc Attenberg believes that the way the sport of racing presents data and past performance information is a bad fit for the modern era. He says the 21st century consumer wants information that is compatible with their iPads and other cutting-edge devices, and that what the sport gives them is from a bygone era.

"If you want to make new customers, have them like racing, have racing be more exciting, then handing them something like the typical racetrack past performance program is a problem," he said. "We are giving them something that doesn't look like the rest of their digital experience. It looks like something from 1982. The point is, we show people new to racing information in a format that is a turnoff. We need to give them something that looks like the rest of their digital experience. Also, there is a segment of people who are current customers of racing wondering why there is no great iPad experience for racing. Even with on-line past performances, you get a PDF or websites that are not optimized for the iPad experience or intended for the iPad experience."

Attenberg is betting that the racing consumer wants his or her data delivered in a more modern format, which is why he has started TimeformUS. TimeformUS is affiliated with Timeform, best known for its figures and data on European racing, but it's a very different product. It has lots of bells and whistles, ratings and numbers, but its primary objective is to present its data in something a little more alive than the numbers-on-a-white-page format.

Everything is color-coded. Past performances for dirt races are outlined in brown. Past performances for turf races are outlined in green. With each race there is a diagram that shows the expected pace scenario, with figures of the horses spread across the track in the early position that is predicted for them. You can scroll here, click there, tap here and find all sorts of information.

For those who don't want to think too hard, they can peruse the 1-2-3 selections made for each race or bet on the highest rated horse in the "spotlight speed figures" that appear on the preview page for each race.

Attenberg, who formerly worked for the *Daily Racing Form* and is now the CEO of TimeformUS, is also hoping the more sophisticated players will appreciate what he believes is superior data to that being offered by anyone else. The speed figures or Timeform figures take not just final time, but also pace, into account. Attenberg says the pace projectors are not only accurate, but can save the player from spending hours on each card trying to figure out who's going to the lead, whether or not the race will set up for a closer, etc. When it comes to trainer records, they give you more than just percentages. A trainer is given a rating in every relevant category that takes winning percentage, ROI and in-the-money percentage into account.

"Where are we going to be in three years, five years?" he said. "Three or four years ago walking into Saratoga, if you were new to racing and bought a track program, that felt a certain way," he said. "How is that going to feel three, four years from now? To me, the ship is sailing away from that. People don't walk into track with that kind of mentality anymore."


I tested TimeformUS out on yesterday's card at Saratoga. Here are some observations:

- (*) The top picks enjoyed a good afternoon. They went 4 for 9 on the card for an ROI of \$3.31. However, when I tried to use TimeformUS to make my own picks I only once came up with the same horse that it picked on the top, the very obvious West Hills Giant (\$3.20) in the fifth. They're picks were good, but I didn't understand why they picked the horses they picked. It could be that I just wasn't very good at using the info.
- (*) The pace predictors were definitely helpful. To see the early part of the race laid out in front of you with every horse placed in a running position gave you a clear idea of how the race was going to unfold. And they were right more often than not. They also predicted whether or not the pace would be hot and conducive to closers or soft and favorable to front-runners.
- (*) The past performances did not include sales prices for the horses, a big detriment when trying to handicap the first race, made up entirely of first-time-starters. Attenberg said that data will be added shortly.
- (*) Call me old fashioned, but when I look at a race, I like having the pps of every horse in the field in front of me. Having one horse appear at a time on the screen made getting an overall feel for the race a bit difficult.
- (*) Attenberg is pitching this as something that fans will want to use to replace the *Racing Form* or the Equibase PPs. That may work for some, but I believe most of his eventual customers will want to use TimeformUS to supplement the information they are already getting in the more traditional formats. There's nothing wrong with more information, particularly when it is good information, and TimeformUS definitely has some useful data and ratings that you can't find elsewhere.
- (*) Though I focused solely on the Saratoga card, had I wanted to wander around to other tracks I would have been well taken care of by TimeformUS. My single favorite aspect of their website is a filter you can use to select the simulcast races that best fit your strengths. Suppose you only want to bet grass races with fields of 10 or more, with an easy click or tap or two TimeformUS can give you a directory spelling out every race on the day that fits that criterion. Use that and you'll never bet a six-horse field of maiden claimers again.

TimeformUS was launched July 17 and a single card costs \$1.50. There are various package deals available, all of which are reasonably priced.

Look for the throughout the TDN graded stakes entries, denoting Keeneland sales graduates.





The presentation of the data is definitely appealing to the eye and more conducive to what the tech-savvy, iPad-loving consumer wants. Though I would have to do a much more involved test drive of the website before drawing firm conclusions, at first glance, the information seems solid and useful.

The biggest challenge for TimeformUS will be gaining consumer acceptance in an industry where the customer has always been rooted to traditional ways of showcasing PPs and seemingly afraid to try something different. There have been a number of very good past performance and handicapping products out there that never quite caught on because the player wasn't looking for anything new. That's why the *Racing Form* has been around forever.

In the meantime, TimeformUS is the new kid on the block, has the backing of a very respected brand in Timeform and is hoping that the horseplayer isn't as set in his or her ways as I think they are.

"Kiyoshi has done exceptionally well since Royal Ascot and is looking like a 3-year-old colt," the operation's Racing Manager David Redvers commented. "It's quite a wait between that race and the Moyglare, but we wanted a Group 1 race over seven furlongs and against fillies. There were options such as the Group 2 Debutante S. this coming Sunday, the Group 3 Prix du Calvados at Deauville, or we could have taken on colts in the Group 2 Futurity S., but we believe she is a Group 1 filly and rather than jeopardise our chances in the Moyglare, we have decided to wait for that race."

APPROACH, CLOUD TO CLASH AT DEAUVILLE **③** "TDN Rising Star" **③** Dawn Approach (Ire)

(New Approach (Ire)) will run in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville, Godolphin confirmed yesterday. With Richard Hannon opting to scratch his G1 Sussex S. conqueror Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) at yesterday's forfeit stage, the four-time Group 1 winner will face a maximum of 15 rivals in the mile contest. "Jim [Bolger] is very pleased with how Dawn Approach came out of the QIPCO Sussex S. at Goodwood," Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford said. "If all goes well with him between now and Sunday, he is an intended runner in France. Dawn Approach had an easy blowout this morning and we are Cloud (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) was yesterday confirmed an intended runner in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville after coming out of her latest race in top order. Trainer Freddy Head had waited for George Strawbridge's 5-year-old to show the right signals following her third straight win in the track's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest on Sunday and she booked her place in the line-up against Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) and Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) in the mile contest. "She's come out of the race very well, she looks beautiful," her trainer told sportinglife.com. "It's so far, so good with her as far as her campaign goes and she will definitely run in the Marois now." The Marois is a "Win and You're In" Challenge race for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile.





YOUNG APEX STARS

The year when sires have their first 4-year-olds racing (they are referred to as 'third-crop' sires, meaning their third crop of 2-year-olds has reached racing age) is a critical one: with more horses racing, we have a chance to see whether the sires who made such a fast start look like they're progressing, or look like 'one-hit wonders'; and, crucially, sometimes those which have made a slow start have had a chance to recover. For example, sires with no good 3-year-olds in their first crop, but good 3-year-olds in their second crop, would fall into the latter category.

In this issue, we're looking at third- (first foals 2009) and second-crop (first foals 2010) sires, a little more than halfway through the year. Let's begin with the third-crop sires, those with their first 4-year-olds racing this year. A few of these were included for consideration in the overall leaders' lists we ran in last week's column, but only those with 200 or more year-starters (reminder: a horse is counted as a 'year-starter' each year it races, so a runner by an F2009 sire which has raced at two, three, and four would be counted as three year-starters; mind you, if it was an A Runner in each of those years, for these purposes it would be counted as three A Runners, too).

Naturally, too, sires with good success from fewer runners tend to score higher on the index tables. It's not that common, for example, for the leaders on a table ranked by progeny earnings to also lead the table by A Runner Index (very big statement when it does happen, such as Galileo leading North American and European sires both by A Runner Index and by number of A Runners). Among the F2009 sire crop, the leaders by progeny earnings are Darley sires Teofilo, Street Sense and Hard Spun but, with 306, 289, and 366 year-starters, respectively, the three actually rank between sixth and 16th on the F2009 list by A Runner Index. The only F2009 sire with 200+ year-starters among the top five in this group by A Runner Index is Morristown Lattin Stud's Dark Angel (3.02), whose first 4-year-olds this year have really carried him forward, perhaps a little surprising for a horse who was retired on purpose after his 2-year-old season and from a sire line which specializes in 2-year-olds above all else. But the numbers look totally reliable, and Dark Angel looks to be a horse breeders should now take very seriously.

The leading North American and European F2009 sire is a complete revelation: the French sire **Kendargent** (5.83), who is by a very good sire in Kendor, but who failed to win a black-type race himself. The number of non black-type winning horses who go on to top sire lists is miniscule, and I'm sure it's completely safe to say no one outside of the Kendargent family could have predicted anything like this. But, although he has only 60 year-starters, it is very much for real, as evidenced by the fact his age indices are actually over 3.00 at two, three, and four. He may have begun his career in total obscurity, but now we know, so, for anybody breeding in France, he needs to be on your list.

Lawyer Ron (3.67), a near-champion who stood at the new-defunct Stonewell Farm in Kentucky and the best horse sired by Danzig's son Langfuhr, died after siring only two crops, but ranks second among F2009 sires by A Runner Index. He was clearly going to be a good sire, but it's a moot point now, as the younger of his two crops are now 3-year-olds. Besides Dark Angel, discussed above, the two other sires among the top five F2009 sires by A Runner Index stand in New Mexico, which is definitely looking like the new Ontario. These are Atilla's Storm (3.57), who was actually a pretty useful racehorse by Forest Wildcat (he ran third in the 2006 GI Vosburgh S., behind Henny Hughes and a certain War Front); and Weather Warning (3.01), a minor stakes winner by Storm Cat. The German sire Soldier Hollow (2.50) has had just 100 year-starters, but these include the 2012 G1 German Derby winner and 2013 French Group 1 winner Pastorius. Soldier Hollow ranks seventh by A Runner Index among F2009 sires, with Hard Spun (2.73), with a massive 366 year-starters, one place above him in sixth.

Ten F2009 stallions have sired eight or more A Runners (remember, a horse can count as an A Runner more than once, if it reaches the respective earnings thresholds in more than one year--when we move them to the file where they are counted just once no matter how many times they qualified as an A Runner, we refer to them as 'individual', or 'Unique' [abbreviated Uniql A Runners). All 10 of these bar Lawyer Ron have had 200 + year-starters. Hard Spun tops the list with 20, followed by Dark Angel with 15; Lawyer Ron and Darley's Street Sense (stood at Darley Japan this year) have 13, followed by Coolmore/Ashford's Scat Daddy (12). Lane's End's English Channel, England's Cheveley Park Stud's **Dutch Art**, and Darley Ireland's Kildangan Stud's Teofilo, currently the leading third-crop sire by progeny earnings, have 11 A Runners each. Darley Kentucky's Discreet Cat (10) and Any Given Saturday (8) round out the top 10 F2009 sires by number of A Runners. (see table p13)

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.





Most of these sires also figure in the top 10 F2009 lists by ABC Runner index and number of ABC Runners (reminder: these are top 8% of earners). Third by ABC Runner Index is **Teuflesberg** (1.88), like Scat Daddy, by surprise sire of sires Johannesburg. Teuflesberg sired last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Trinniberg, and moved from Florida to Mew York's McMahon's of Saratoga Farm as a result. Also cracking the F2009 top five by ABC Index is Adena Springs' Silent Name (1.86), a son of Sunday Silence raced by the Wertheimers. He began at stud in Ontario, spent two seasons in New York, and is now back in Ontario, where he ranks as one of their leading sires by progeny earnings in 2013. Looking at the top 10 F2009 sires by number of ABC Runners, the only new name to mention is Coolmore's Dylan Thomas, who ranks ninth among F2009 sires, with 29. Hard Spun tops this list, with 63 (he is proving a prolific sire of useful-plus horses), followed by fellow Darley sires Teofilo (43), Street Sense (42), Discreet Cat (40); Coolmore's Scat Daddy, with 39; and Cheveley Park's Dutch Art, with 38.

Into Mischief, Frost Giant Top F2010 Sires...

There can be no more dramatic illustration of the shrinking of the market than to compare the number of sires with 10 or more 3-year-olds in 2013 (the requirement for being assigned APEX ratings) with first foals 2009 (retired 2008) against those with first foals 2010 (retired 2009): 120 F2009 sires were assigned midyear 2013 APEX ratings, versus just 80 F2010 sires--a drop of one-third. This is our first opportunity to look at the F2010 group by anything other than progeny earnings, and one comment we can definitely make is that it looks a pretty interesting group, even if there are fewer of them.

Two F2010 sires--admittedly neither with a huge number of runners--score 5.00 or higher by A Runner Index, which means 10% or more of their year-starters have become A Runners. Spendthrift's Into Mischief (5.45), by Harlan's Holiday and sire of Goldencents and Vyjack; and Frost Giant (5.00), who stands at New York's Keane Stud, and who also boasts an astronomical 4.06 ABC Runner Index--that's over 32% of starters, versus the normal 8%. Undoubtedly Frost Giant is helped by the NY-bred program, but, however we qualify it, both these sires are off to very impressive starts Darley's New Approach (3.68), in Europe, and Hill 'n' Dale's Midnight Lute (3.67), in America, are the standouts when you look at those sires with 100 or so year-starters, 'mas o menos.' WinStar's Spring At Last (3.33), Three Chimney's Big Brown (3.25), and Lane's End's deceased War Pass (3.06) are the other F2010 sires with two or more A Runners and A Runner indices above 3.00.

Five of these are among the six F2010 sires with five or more A Runners to date. Midnight Lute (8), New Approach (7), and Into Mischief (6) are the top three, while Spring At Last and Big Brown are tied, with five each, along with Coolmore's **Henrythenavigator**, who moved from Ashford in Kentucky back to Coolmore this year. Frost Giant's gaudy 4.06 ABC rating clobbers the opposition in that department; besides War Pass (2.55) and Big Brown (2.44) again, the top five F2010 sires by ABC Index also include second-ranked **J Be K** (2.68), a son of Silver Deputy who is now at stud in Argentina; and the French sire **Sageburg** (2.34), yet another by that underground sire of sires, Johannesburg.

A total of 12 F2010 sires have 10 or more ABC Runners to date, headed by Coolmore sires Henrythenavigator (19) and Majestic Warrior (18), who is second on the F2010 'money' list (ranked by progeny earnings). The group's original top commercial prospects, Big Brown and Lane's End's Curlin (sire of GI Belmont S. and GII Jim Dandy winner Palace Malice) are among four sires tied with 15 ABC Runners, along with current F2010 money leader Midnight Lute and Darley's Street Boss. Frost Giant comes next with 13, followed by Coolmore's Duke of Marmalade, with 12.

The arrival of VLTs at Aqueduct two years ago



translated into a major influx of cash to the New York racing program and sent the state's purses and breeding incentives through the roof. The New York breeding industry has responded with increases from the breeding shed to the sales ring. The *TDN* sat down with New York Thoroughbred Breeders executive director Jeff Cannizzo ahead of the Aug. 10-11 Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearling Sale to discuss the growth of the state's breeding program.

Jeff Cannizzo

TDN: How has the New York breeding industry grown in the last 1 1/2 years?

JC: In the last year and a half, New York has seen quite a bit of change. The breeding landscape has certainly turned around. In 2012, we had roughly a 13% increase in the number of mares that were bred here in New York state. There were about 2,400 mares bred here in New York last year. Sixty-eight percent of those were bred to New York sires and 32% were by out-of-state sires.

There were more mares covered by New York sires last year than by out-of-state sires--based on my estimates, it was roughly a 10% increase in New York-sired versus out-of-state sired.

Last year, we had an influx of 800+ mares from out of state that came into the program. Mares came here in foal, dropped their foals, they weren't resident mares so they needed to breed back to New York stallions which increased our New York-sired population to about 68%, when it typically hovers around 55%.

TDN: How does this growth compare to other states: JC: In 2012, The Jockey Club reported that New York was essentially the only state with a double-digit increase in our number of mares covered by our in-state stallions. So our New York stallions covered 43% more mares than they did the year before, which is astronomical. We went from 64 stallions to 76. Mares have transitioned here. We're the one state that has seen a positive growth in terms of our mare population and our breeding trend.

There was a 13% increase in mares bred last year. Why was that? It is absolutely because of what has happened to the value of a New York-bred and it is all derived from the racetrack.

TDN: Obviously, the earnings potential of a New Yorkbred has skyrocketed in the last couple of years.

JC: The purse structure for New York-breds has become by far the most promising that it has ever been. There is roughly a \$10,000 gap between a New York-bred restricted race and an open race here in New York, which has been unheard of. So you have New York-bred maidens running for \$70,000 and up this summer at Saratoga. All of the value that comes alongside buying a New York-bred is the potential of what they can do on the racetrack and what they can earn. And when you have a horse that can run through its restricted conditions with an earning potential in those restricted conditions worth over \$200,000, and then come back with that same horse and those same set of conditions in open company that he can run in and earn double that amount, the earnings potential is through the roof. In addition to \$4-million plus worth of restricted stakes that are run in New York, there are over 50 New York-bred stakes races across the state.

TDN: How does the New York model differ from other regional programs?

JC: The value of the horse is on the racetrack and that is what is driving this model. That's really what separates New York from some of the other regional programs. Our racing environment is supporting and is the driver to our bloodstock market. It is not the breeding end and awards that are driving people to be involved here. It's the actual fact that, if you own a New York-bred, you're essentially granted the opportunity to generate a lot of revenue from that horse. That's the difference between us and some of the other states.

TDN: How has the increased value of New York-breds been reflected in the sales ring?

JC: From 2010 to today, we've seen a 24% increase in the average sales price for New York-bred 2-year-olds; the average was \$38,500 in 2010 and has gone up to \$48,000. Total sales were around \$5 million. As of last year, the total sales for New York-bred 2-year-olds was \$9.2 million. The median increased from \$20,000 to \$25,000. In 2010, there were 12 six figure 2-year-olds sold and in 2012 there were 30.

In the yearling sales, we went from total sales in 2010 of \$9.9 million up to \$15.3 million. The average in 2010 was \$26,000. Last year it was \$42,000. The median was \$12,000 in 2010 to last year, \$25,000. There were 19 six-figure yearling in 2010 and last year there were 36.

For weanlings, in 2010, the total sales were \$1.3 million, last year \$3 million. The median went from \$9,500 to \$15,000.



TDN: In addition to the New York-bred catalogue, there are several state-bred yearlings in the Select catalogue this year.

JC: There are 11 New York-breds in the select sale and that is close to the highest number we've had. What that says is that set of horses were obviously good enough to be in that catalogue and have an extremely boutique appeal to them, which goes to show you the type of breeding that is happening in New York. That's really the major difference with what we're doing here regionally in New York versus what is perhaps the perception about regional breeding. The horses that are being bred here are commercially viable. Their pedigrees stand next to any other horse in the country. And their performances on the racetrack go hand and hand with that. New York has proven the whole stigma that regional breeding isn't necessarily of quality is wrong.

TDN: Have you been surprised by the industry's growth?

JC: It was expected. We were expecting to grow given the landscape here. It is so promising. When you have a New York-bred that has become more valuable because its value on the racetrack has increased by 30 or 40% because of the purse increases here in New York, the demand for that horse has gone up alongside of it. The racetrack drives this entire industry via purses, the breeding end of it follows suit with the sales market. As horses become more valuable on the racetrack, demand in the sales market is increased, which at the end of the day creates more people who want to breed New York-breds. It's all logical and it's going to plan.

TDN: Are there any concerns that the slots revenue will be reallocated away from the racing industry at some point in the future?

JC: This past year's gaming act that our governor has now signed contains guarantees for the racing industry. The reality is that purses in our breeding fund are going to continue to receive what they were slated to receive originally for years to come. The belief that New York would follow suit along with some of the other states that have seen changes to their program has not come to fruition.

We are actively involved with our legislature so that they understand the importance of this industry, both in terms of what it does for the economy and tourism in the state. I'd like to believe our legislature actually gets why we're important and gets why it's vital that we maintain what we're supposed to maintain.

We've been protected going forward and we'll continue to fight to prove our worth for years to come.

TDN: And how abou the overall trends at the track?

JC: Our New York model is showing results. As purses and the breeding fund has been supported by gaming, we're also showing the results of that support with what it is doing to parimutuel wagering here in New York. NYRA's product and model is actually growing. It's unheard of these days. But our parimutuel handle has increased in the last year and a half and the business itself is becoming better because our product is getting better.

TDN: Have there been any new developments on the legislative front in the last year?

JC: The most important thing we have accomplished, besides continuing a law that allows breeders to get 65% of all the breeding funds money, is, starting in January of next year, the breeding fund will now receive a percentage of all ADW wagering that is taken in from New York state residents. This is a significant accomplishment that has been in the works for several years. ADW wagering is the only growth segment of our parimutuel wagering. In many states breeding funds do not receive ADW handle. New York was one of those and again we just essentially changed the law to get breeders included in this revenue and this will mean a new \$1 million and up for the breeding fund from the beginning of next year. So it is a significant accomplishment which is only going to help the breeding industry here in New York.

TDN: What type of growth do you see going forward for the state's breeding industry?

JC: I think the reality is that the growth here in New York will be steady and consistent. I'm not expecting numbers to fly through the roof, because I think people are smarter today in terms of making calculating choices. This goes hand in hand with our economy and the national state of the industry. Nationally, foal production is down a third, so when there are 10,000 fewer mares that are being bred in the last handful of years, you can't expect New York to just skyrocket, while everyone else is plummeting. I think what you can expect is slow, steady growth in terms of people dabbling into the New York market. And that is what has happened. People have taken tiny steps into our environment and the people who have done that have seen promise and they've seen results. The results they've seen are in the sales market, because New York-breds are selling at a premium today. And the people that are involved as end-users, as owners, the purse structure has never been better. When you see results, you'll see people continually trying to get involved. It's going to happen slow and steady over the course over the next several years.

MCGAUGHEY HONORED BY TCA

Thoroughbred Club of America include a number of training legends such as Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons, Horatio Luro, Woody Stephens, Charlie Whittingham, Mack Miller and D. Wayne Lukas," TCA president Happy Broadbent said. "Shug McGaughey is one of the greatest trainers of our time, and he deserves to join the distinguished group of horsemen selected for this honor."

McGaughey started his training career at Keeneland in 1979 and in 1985 was named

trainer for the New York-based Phipps Stable. He won the Eclipse Award for Outstanding Trainer three years later and was inducted into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame in 2004. He has saddled many champions, including four Hall of Famers: Personal Ensign, Easy Goer, Inside Information and Lure. McGaughey has won nine Breeders' Cup races, tying for second on the all-time win list. The Kentucky native captured his most coveted prize this year with Orb's (Malibu Moon) win in the GI Kentucky Derby for the Phipps Stable and Stuart S. Janney III. Currently, McGaughey ranks as the 10th all-time leading trainer with nearly \$120 million in earnings.

West Hills Giant donned cap and gown second out here last September before turning back and switching to dirt to annex the lucrative New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes later that month. Finishing up the year with a poor showing in the GIII Pilgrim S. over the Belmont lawn in October, the chestnut was put on the Derby Trail, and defied 33-1 odds when finishing second to Vyjack (Into Mischief) in Aqueduct's GIII Gotham S. Mar. 2. He failed to land a blow in Keeneland's GI Blue Grass S. in April, however, and returned to the softer New York-bred ranks. Fifth in the Mike Lee S. in Elmont June 1, West Hills Giant relished being back on the sod when soundly defeating Captain Gaughen in the seven-furlong New York Stallion Series Spectacular Bid S. June 30. He was a distant third to Mike Lee winner Amberjack (Indygo Shiner) in the New York Derby back at Finger Lakes July 20, but loomed large in this return to the lawn. Hard held from the pocket as Orino showed the way. West Hills Giant appeared locked and loaded at the top of the lane and pilot Edgar Prado tried to slip up the inside past Orino. Orino reacted to right-handed whips in midstretch, however, and knocked the favorite into the rail, ultimately warranting a disqualification by the stewards. "It was pretty tight for him down there," said West Hills Giant's trainer John Terranova of the stretch incident. "He doesn't care for the inside on top of that; he's always tried to make that wide move. He's reluctant down in there. I was afraid that might happen today, too, but I didn't see a spot where he could have gotten out. He's a big horse and he can get a little intimidated down in there. We're lucky today.
