Strong Mandate

D. Wayne Lukas added Saratoga's closing day feature for 2-year-olds, the GI Hopeful S. with Robert Baker and William Mack's Strong Mandate (Tiznow). The Hall of Famer, who was also celebrating his 78th birthday yesterday, was collecting his first win in the sevenfurlong test since Dublin (Afleet Alex),

who annexed the race in 2009 and his seventh victory in the race overall.

"I thought he'd run huge; I really did," said Lukas. "I was a little concerned about the surface; you always are. He had a really good prep race, and he hadn't done anything [wrong] since then. I thought we'd get a good one, but you never expect to waltz home like that, though. Ever."

Sent off at respectable odds of 7-1 in this wide open affair, Strong Mandate came out running and was eased back to a close-up third as the undefeated winner of the GII Saratoga Special S., Corfu (Malibu Moon), rushed up from the inside and was closely shadowed by GII Sanford S. hero Wired Bryan (Stormy Atlantic) through a brisk opening quarter in :22.47. With the leader still in front after a demanding half in :45.15, Strong Mandate reached even terms with the tiring 7-2 chance at the quarter pole, dispensed of that rival with ease at the head of the lane and drew clear under his own steam, bounding home a much-the-best 9 3/4-length winner. Longshot Casiguapo (Sightseeing) came on for second, while Lunarwarfare (War Pass) rounded out the trifecta. Favored Corfu faded to ninth.

"He's a big, strong, powerful horse, but he's got a little bit of kick to him," said Lukas. "I told [jockey] Jose [Ortiz], 'Don't be so surprised if you're laying right there. Just be a little careful with the fractions.' He was comfortable. I told him to come right up the four hole coming home, and it looks like he did."

Ortiz, who was collecting his first Grade I victory, added, "I asked him a little bit, because I knew [Corfu] is a tough horse. I cracked him one time on the shoulder and he put me right beside him, so I knew I had a lot of horse. At the eighth pole I looked back, and nobody was coming. I'm very happy, very excited."

EGG DROP EARNS HER YELLOW RIBBON

Little Red Feather Racing's **Egg Drop** (Alphabet Soup) marked her debut over Del Mar's Jimmy Durante turf course with a hard-fought victory over Appealing (Ire) (Bertolini) in Monday's GII Yellow Ribbon H. Eagerly up to press A Jealous Woman (Mugtarib) through an opening quarter in :23.35, Egg Drop continued to keep the leader in her sights through a half in :46.76. Reaching her rival's throat latch at the quarter pole, the grey inched clear entering the lane and held off Appealing by a head at the wire. The inquiry sign soon went up to review if the winner had impeded thirdplace finisher My Gi Gi (E Dubai), but after several moments, the stewards decided to let the final order stand. "I let her run free early; she was going so good," said winning rider Martin Garcia. "I had a lot of horse turning for home and she ran well. I didn't think I did anything [concerning a stewards' inquiry]... I think the stewards made a good decision." Egg Drop was a debut winner over Del Mar's Polytrack at two, but didn't visit the winner's circle in four subsequent starts, including a close-up second-place effort going 6 1/2 panels over Santa Anita's main track Feb. 23. Sent to the front and making all in a \$40,000 optional claimer at 8 1/2 furlongs at the Arcadia oval Mar. 28, Egg Drop was given the chance to double up in the restricted Santa Lucia S. Apr. 14, but tired late to be fifth. Back in the winner's circle while making her turf bow going six panels in a Betfair Hollywood Park allowance May 24, the grey was handed a 1/2-length defeat by Shiaparelli (Ghostzapper) in her latest start in the July 6 Royal Heroine Mile S. 

"Second out, you'll see all my horses come with blinkers and usually improve, if they've got some ability. This is a pretty good horse." Lukas, who collected his most recent Hopeful victory with William Mack and Robert Baker, was generous in his praise for his two longtime clients. "These guys, Bill Mack and Bob Baker, have been with me 25 years," Lukas said. "We've gone through a lot. We only buy two or three a year; most years two; this year we got three. They've stayed with us. We [had] some nice horses, but I don't know if we've [had] one this good."

Top Mandate...

Clear Mandate, the dam of Strong Mandate, won or placed in 20 of 31 lifetime starts, including the GI Three Chimneys Spinster S., GI John A. Morris H. and GI Shuvee H. Retired with \$1.85 million in earnings, the mare instantly hit paydirt as a broodmare when her first foal--Full Mandate (A.P. Indy)--brought \$3.2 million at Keeneland September before going on to become a stakes winner. Her second foal, Newfoundland (Storm Cat), realized \$3.3 million at Keeneland September and was good enough to win a pair of Grade III events and place in a pair of Grade Is. Her third offspring, The Mighty Tiger (Storm Cat), was Group 2 placed in England and Ireland after bringing \$2.5 million at Keeneland's yearling sale in 2002. At the age of 19, Clear Mandate was euthanized because of foaling complications stemming from producing her final foal, Strong Mandate.


Spa Wrap-Up

SPA TITLES The 150th Saratoga anniversary meet concluded Monday with owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey setting a new record for victories by an owner at Saratoga Race Course. The Ramseys concluded the meet with 22 wins, including a victory in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational with Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy), shoring up their third Saratoga owner's title. Trainer Todd Pletcher won his fourth consecutive--and 10th total--training title with 36 wins. Pletcher currently holds the Saratoga meet record with 38 victories. Jockey Javier Castellano, gaining his first championship at the meet, registered 66 victories to win the Angel Cordero, Jr. riding title.



Edge of Reality, a debut winner going six panels over this track last January, failed to fire against \$75,000 optional claiming company while stretching to 8 1/2 furlongs in the Gulfstream slop Feb. 16 and had to settle for seventh. Dropped back to a sprint for his return to the Philly oval, the dark bay was a much improved second while taking on allowance rivals Apr. 8 and followed that with a win over that track and a muddy strip May 11. Eldaafer earned his first graded win at four when taking the 2009 GII Brooklyn H. The following season turned out to be his best to date when he took down two more graded events--the GIII Turfway Park Fall Championship over the Polytrack before rounding out the year with a score in the GIII Breeders' Cup Marathon at Churchill Downs. In recent times it's been leaner pickings for the gelding, who ran on 17 occasions at six and seven, and winning three times, the best of which was a three-length score in the Carl Hanford Memorial S. This season, Eldaafer kicked off his campaign with a third in a \$100,000 optional claimer going a mile in the Gulfstream slop Feb. 15 before tiring to fifth at the Hallandale oval's 1 3/16-mile GIII Skip Away S. Mar. 30. An uninspired 10th in the 8 1/2-panel Memorial H. May 25, the 8-year-old was given a short respite before returning with a muchimproved second, beaten 1 1/4 lengths, by Ponzi Scheme (Sunday Break {Jpn}) in the July 11 Stymie S. at a mile and a sixteenth. Sky Venture (Sky Mesa) jumped out to take an early advantage and led the way through opening splits of :24.31 and :49.86 as Eldaafer was content to stalk in fifth. Closing on the front rank along the inside, the Diane Alvarado trained colt hit the front approaching the quarter pole and had to dig deep to fend off Indian Jones by a nose at the wire.



While most patrons on Saratoga's closing day were likely disappointed that heavy rains forced all races off the turf, the connections of Lady Cohiba were happy to break out their umbrellas as their "main track only" entrant drew in and looked tough.



A sloppy stakes winner as a juvenile, the chestnut took the track-and-trip Summer Guest S. here last meet, but was seeking her first victory since. She most recently set the pace before settling for third over another wet track in the Aug. 9 Alada S. Able to make the lead and tuck in around the first turn, Lady Cohiba

doled out splits of:23.75, :47.73 and 1:12.27 while facing only token pressure. She built on her advantage slightly turning for home, and was always doing enough to hold off a late bid from White Rose, "I told Junior [Alvarado] to be on the

BADEN BADEN: EUROPE'S BEST KEPT SECRET Story and Photos by Liesl King

Trust me, if you have typed Baden-Baden as many times as I have in the past couple of days, you may also start to wonder why they couldn't just have called this spa town Baden? Well, actually, they did. The word 'spa' is an abbreviation of the Latin 'Sanus per aquam', meaning 'health through water'. Having found this great place with lovely hot springs, the Romans named the town 'Aqua'. Fast forward a couple hundred years and the town is renamed Baden, after the bathing that took place in its thermal waters. Then Germany was chopped up into a series of States, one of which was named Baden. Oh dear, now we had a town called Baden in the state called Baden. No problem, decided the forefathers--we will simply call it Baden-Baden.

Baden-Baden is a very unique place; it is small, so much so that you can pretty much walk everywhere,

and it is situated in the middle of nowhere, yet despite these obvious drawbacks, it is known as Europe's Summer Capital. Confused, I decided to take a closer look. First stop is the Casino, around which the entire town seems to revolve. When gambling was outlawed in France in 1837, a simple solution was found by one Jacques Benazet: He opened a Casino in neighboring Baden-Baden. A couple years later his son, Edouard, decided an upgrade was well overdue, and decorated its rooms

along the lines of the French palaces.

What he achieved it is quite extraordinary. Wandering into the Florentine room, I am immediately transported back to the opulence of Versailles. A multitude of chandeliers light up the room, while every wall is adorned with paintings; even the ceiling has not escaped. Life size statues grace the corners, and there is enough gold plating to finance a small country. My favorite, the Red room, is based on La Salle Rouge in the Palace of Versailles. It sports an entire wall of mirrors and gold that blend seamlessly with the opulent red.

Reluctantly I drag myself away, as there is so much more to explore. Conveniently situated right next door is the Trinkhalle, or Drinking Room. The Romans may have enjoyed their spa baths, but during the 19th century, bathing was not in fashion. So what to do when you are surrounded by all this healthy water? Why, you drink it, of course. After a heavy session at the Casino, the rich and famous simply wandered over to the Drinking Hall to partake in some restorative water.

A covered walkway protected the drinkers from rain and sun, while a number of giant frescoes entertained them during their thirst-quenching mission. Of course, there is one with a horse in it. Legend has it that the Count of Eberstein leapt over the castle walls on his trusty steed, trying to escape his enemies. The drop

was over 400 meters into the valley of Murg, but the Count, being a fine rider, managed to navigate the steep valley walls before jumping into the river itself and cantering off into the sunset.

On the other side of the Casino resides the Theatre, and it is here that my next adventure is due to begin; a carriage ride down the famous Lichtentaler Allee, returning through the town itself. Artur Roth and his beautiful Polish coldbloods, Silbersee and Kristal are patiently waiting. It takes but a couple minutes and I am well and

truly hooked. Everything happens at a leisurely pace, allowing one to fully enjoy the experience and your surroundings. The Lichtentaler Allee was originally an oak lined road linking the Lichtentaler monastery with the town. Then along comes that Frenchman Benazet, and he transforms it into the beautiful park it is today, with gardens and bridges lining the route.

I could easily have traveled its entire length, but Roth assures me there is much more to see. After all, what tourist does not want to arrive at the Brenners Park Hotel in a carriage? I am reliably informed that the five star Hotel is the favorite accommodation of many a head of state, and even George Clooney recently checked in.

While I could linger longer, hoping to see Clooney of course, Zilbersee is starting to get impatient, and it's time to move on. Next, we pass the Golden Lion restaurant with the most beautiful balcony flowers,

before maneuvering down the main shopping avenue of Baden-Baden. It is a tight squeeze, but these horses know their job, and we pop out safely on the other side. All too soon, an hour has passed, and we are back at the Theatre. A last pat and I reluctantly wave goodbye to Roth and his trusty steeds. I enquire about taking the beautiful Kristal home with me, but Roth utters an immediate Nein! At least he smiles while he turns me down.

Baden-Baden is an extraordinary town steeped in history, with surprises around every corner. Whether you enjoy it on foot or behind the sizeable rumps of Artur Roth's steeds, be warned, it is addictive. You may lose your shirt like Dostoevsky, who wrote The Gambler after a visit to the Casino or you may simply fall in love with Europe's best-kept secret, its Summer Capital of old.

CHAMPION FIELD TAKES SHAPE

Saturday's G1 Red Mills Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown yesterday attracted 13 possibles at the six-day forfeit stage, but the current firm ground conditions and little prospect of rain could lead to a depleted field. Both Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) will sidestep the

10-furlong feature if the ground stays in its current state, with the former set to run in the following Sunday's G2 Prix Foy instead. Trainer Roger Charlton said of the triple Group 1-winning 5-year-old, "Al Kazeem worked well at the weekend and he will be left in the Irish

Champion S. at Leopardstown on Saturday. James Doyle walked the course before his second Group 1 winner at the Curragh and described the ground as being very quick. So unless there is a change in the weather forecast before the weekend, Al Kazeem is looking a doubtful starter. A decision will be taken nearer the time." Cirrus des Aigles' trainer Corine Barande-Barbe told PA Sport, "The owner wants to wait and see whether there is going to be any rain in Ireland, so we have left him in the race once more. If there is plenty of rain then he will run, but if there is no rain he will not. If he does not run on Saturday, he will run in the [Oct. 5] G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp, and then the [Oct. 19] G1 Champion S. at Ascot." One who is likely to line up with top-of-the-ground credentials is Lord Lloyd-Webber's G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}), and the owner's Racing and Bloodstock Manager Simon Marsh said, "John [Gosden] is not here at the moment, but we will talk about things in the next couple of days. Looking at the weather forecast, there is not a lot of rain around at the moment and she has got her preferred ground, so we might let her take her chance. There has been no decision about Saturday, but she would be a definite possible." Aidan O'Brien has a sextet engaged, including Group 1 winners Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), Declaration of War (War Front), Kingsbarns (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Magician (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Ruler of the World (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), and he said, "It's a very special race on usually lovely ground, and the horses are ready to start their autumn campaigns after mid-summer breaks. They are all being aimed at it at the moment and we'll decide in the middle of the week. We are very happy with them all and are ready to run." Jim Bolger is set to run his homebred G1 Irish Derby hero and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and G1 Juddmonte International S. runner-up Trading Leather (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), while Dermot Weld has left in Moyglare Stud's G2 Ribblesdale S. scorer Princess Highway (Street Cry {Ire}).

SOUMILLON REGAINS AGA KHAN RETAINER

Christophe Soumillon will be retained once again by His Highness The Aga Khan in 2014, having lost the job four years ago. Originally the number one for the

operation between 2002 and 2009, during which time he partnered the likes of Dalakhani (Ire) and Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar), the Belgian-born rider will take over from Christophe-Patrice Lemaire from next season in the latest rejigging of training and riding arrangements. Declaring the move, the operation's French Racing Manager Georges Rimaud told PA Sport, "From 2014, Christophe Soumillon will become the retained jockey for the Aga Khan's horses in France

for two years. We have had a good relationship with Christophe Lemaire, who has ridden multiple Group 1 winners, but his contract was coming to an end and we have made the decision to change." The reappointment of Soumillon, whose initial contract with the famed owner-breeder was not renewed due to problems in "human relations", follows the recent decision that there would be no retainer for The Aga Khan's Irish representatives, bringing to an end the brief connection with Declan McDonogh.

Society Rock Out of Cup...

Simon Gibson's Society Rock (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) has been ruled out of the defence of his G1 Haydock Sprint Cup crown after sustaining an injury at home. Trainer James Fanshawe revealed that the 6-year-old is under veterinary care after falling and suffering concussion. "Society Rock had a fall yesterday afternoon and suffered a bang to his head," he explained. "He has some concussion and is receiving medical treatment from the vets at Newmarket Equine Hospital. He remains at Pegasus Stables, is bright, standing up and eating. He will continue to receive medical treatment and will require careful management over the next few days." His absence leaves 18 possibles for Saturday's six-furlong contest headed by Alan Craddock's G1 Diamond Jubilee S. and G1 July Cup hero Lethal Force (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) and his stable companion, last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. winner Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate).

Longchamp Target for Kingman...

Trainer John Gosden is looking at the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere for TDN Rising Star" Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) following the Juddmonte homebred's success in Saturday's G3 Solario S. Extending his unbeaten record in that seven-furlong Sandown contest, the colt is likely to take part in the Arc card at Longchamp instead of the G1 Dewhurst S. six days later at Newmarket. "The Lagardere is the next logical step," Gosden told The Daily Telegraph. "I know that race and the Dewhurst are much closer these days, but it would still be a big gap if we waited for the Dewhurst. I was very satisfied with his run. At home, he is not the type we are sending clear in his work. It was another stepping stone."

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

The saying that fortune favors the bold (or the brave) apparently dates back to the second century B.C., but it could have been coined especially for veteran English trainer Clive Brittain. It was Brittain, you may recall, who sent the outstanding filly Pebbles to Aqueduct in 1985 to defeat Strawberry Road in the second running of the Breeders' Cup Turf. Encouraged by that triumph, Brittain sent Bold Arrangement to Churchill Downs the following May to take second place in the GI Kentucky Derby. Brittain's boldness was also evident when he saddled the 500-1 runner-up in the 1989 Epsom Derby.

Nearly 30 years after Pebbles' success and now aged 79, Brittain may well be back at this year's Breeders' Cup with another high-class filly, Rizeena.


This filly will need to be very tough if she is to make it to Santa Anita. She was having her seventh race, in her third different country, when she won Saturday's G1 Moyglare Stud S. (a race largely spoiled by the meanderings of the favorite, Kiyoshi).

Rizeena's trainer also mentioned the Cheveley Park S. or the Prix Marcel Boussac as other possible Group 1 targets for his daughter of Iffraaj. It could be worth pointing out that Sayyedati, Brittain's previous Moyglare winner, went on to win the Cheveley Park S. and the 1000 Guineas. In taking the Guineas, Sayyedati gave Brittain one of six Classic successes in England, where he is missing only the Derby from his collection.

Coincidentally, Rizeena provides a link to another bold veteran who is still a force at Grade I level in 2013. I'm referring, of course, to D. Wayne Lukas, who enjoyed tremendous success with Serena's Song, a sister to Rizeena's third dam, the aptly named Serena's Sister.

Serena's Song raced from 1994 through 1996--years when American horses averaged 7.84, 7.73 and 7.59 starts per year. Serena's Song, on the other hand, was tough enough to make 10 starts as a juvenile, 13 as a sophomore and 15 as a 4-year-old, for a total of 38 career starts. Her career was made all the more demanding by the fact that she raced fairly constantly at the highest level, but she proved more than equal to the task, finishing first or second in 29 of her starts.

Serena's Song's last three starts as a juvenile saw her win the GI Oak Leaf S, finish a head second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and finally win the GI Hollywood Starlet S.





She wasn't given much of a break, though, and was back in action at the end of January, starting a campaign which was to pit her against the males in the Kentucky Derby and Haskell Invitational. Although she faded badly in the Derby, she held on to take the Haskell, which was the seventh of her nine graded stakes victories as a 3-year-old. She added another three Grade I victories at four.

Serena's Song went on to a broodmare career which surely scotched any theories that a hard time on the track can be seriously harmful to a filly's prospects as a producer. She started by producing nine consecutive foals and a total of 12 foals in her first 13 years. Five of her foals became stakes winners.

It is relevant to Rizeena's story that Storm Cat sired three of Serena's Song's four graded/group winners and Unbridled the other. Serena's Song's first group winner was Storm Cat's daughter Sophisticat. This \$3.4-million dollar yearling justified her price with a string of smart juvenile performances in 2001 which earned her a return to the U.S. for a shot at the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Good as she was, Sophisticat wasn't as good a 2-year-old as Rizeena. She finished second in the Queen Mary S., a race won this year by Rizeena, and third in the Moyglare Stud S., a race also won by Rizeena. Sophisticat followed Serena's Song's example by being even better at three, when she finished third to Zenda in the G1 French 1,000 Guineas before narrowly gaining her revenge on Zenda in the G1 Coronation S. (Zenda was also in the news last weekend, as the dam of the exciting Kingman).

A second visit to Storm Cat resulted in Grand Reward, who became a Grade II winner in the Oaklawn H., and Serena's Song's visit to Unbridled resulted in Harlington, winner of the GII Gulfstream Park H. Her first foal, the speedy Mr. Prospector mare Serena's Tune, produced the stakes-winning Serena's Cat to Storm Cat and Serena's Cat in turn has visited Unbridled's Song to produce Noble Tune, runner-up in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. Serena's Cat is also the dam of A.P. Indy's highly regarded son Honor Code, who attained TIDN Rising Star" status with his impressive debut win at Saratoga three days ago.

Rizeena's third dam Serena's Sister unfortunately showed neither the talent nor the toughness which made her sister famous. She ran just twice and didn't earn a single dollar, but that hasn't stopped her becoming the dam of the smart American turf colt Doubles Partner (Rock Hard Ten). Serena's Sister also visited Unbridled's Song. Though the resultant filly, Princess Serena, was bred along similar lines to Harlington and Noble Tune, she initially proved disappointing. After being RNA'd at \$190,000 as a yearling, she raced five times in Britain and was dismissed by Timeform as a "poor maiden" with the lowly rating of 48. Returned to the U.S., Princess Serena did manage to win over a mile at four, when she was also sold, covered by Thunder Gulch, for \$150,000.

Her buyer, Round Hill Stud, promptly returned her to Ireland. Understandably, in view of the family's record with Storm Cat, Princess Serena's new owners were eager to send her to a member of the Storm Cat male line. However, the options in 2004 effectively amounted to only one stallion--Storm Cat's G2 Coventry S. winner Statue of Liberty. This mating produced Rizeena's dam, the 2-year-old seven-furlong winner Serena's Storm.

By 2007, the Storm Cat male line had a new representative in Ireland in the shape of Giant's Causeway's top-class son Shamardal. His appeal as a mate for Princess Serena was surely increased by the fact that he produced 4x3 inbreeding to Rahy through his daughters Mariah's Storm and Serena's Sister.

The mating produced a colt, Puissance de Lune, which was sent to Australia after being sold at Arqana's 2011 Arc Sale. The son of Shamardal has proved highly effective in his new home, showing remarkable versatility in the process. His last three appearances have seen him win the G3 Queen Elizabeth S. over 1 5/8 miles, the G2 Blamey S. over a mile and the G2 P. B. Lawrence S. over seven furlongs. Puissance de Lune's younger brother Majesty is a winner over seven furlongs in Britain this year, so it will be interesting to see how Puissance de Lune copes with two miles in the Melbourne Cup, for which he is ante-post favorite.

Rizeena so far has not had the chance to display much stamina, but she was fast enough to win three of her four starts over five furlongs. Her sire Iffraaj never tackled more than seven furlongs during a 13-race career and once failed by only a head to take the G1 July Cup over six.

Iffraaj made a fine start to his stallion career in 2010, siring endless first-crop juvenile winners headed by the Group 1 winner Wootton Bassett. Those early achievements earned him plenty of support in 2011, so it is fair to assume that his 2012 crop will shine both in the sales ring and on the track, especially now that Rizeena has refocused attention on him. His Deauville yearlings--sired at an increased fee of $\[\in \]$ 15,000--achieved such prices as $\[\in \]$ 340,000, $\[\in \]$ 300,000 and $\[\in \]$ 220,000 and there is every chance of further substantial prices at Goffs and Tattersalls.






