





TATTS PREPARES FOR VINTAGE DEC. SALE By Kelsey Riley

In a little over a week's time, Tattersalls will bring down the curtain on its 2013 sales year with its December Sale of yearlings, foals and breeding stock. This year has been a monumental one for the world's oldest sales company, with some spectacular results at its Parks Paddock pavilion in Newmarket, England. Its

flagship October Yearling Sale Book 1 reflected the strength of the market and the sale itself by smashing a bevy of records set the previous year. With 64 fewer horses through the ring, Book 1 experienced increased growth (up nearly 2-million guineas to 70,343,000gns), average (up 24%) and median (up 30%). The Book 1 topper, a 5-million guineas full-sister to G1 Epsom Oaks winner Was (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), set not only a world record for a filly at public

auction, but also a record for a horse of any age at a European auction.

Tattersalls personnel and breeders and consignors alike will be hoping this momentum carries through the nine days of the December Sale, and a glance through the catalogues gives every indication that it will. The sale commences Nov. 25 with the one-day December Yearling Sale, featuring 226 lots including the progeny of such leading sires as Galileo, New Approach (Ire), Shamardal, Danehill Dancer (Ire), Invincible Spirit (Ire), Teofilo (Ire), Raven's Pass, Medaglia d'Oro and Iffraaj (GB). The action continues with the December Foal Sale Nov. 27-30, comprised of 1071 lots, including nearly 100 foals by the current top 10 sires in Britain and Ireland, as well as full- or half-siblings to 185 group or listed winners. The December Breeding Stock Sale will wrap up proceedings with 1115 lots from Dec. 2 to 5. This catalogue is headed by G1 Epsom Oaks winner Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)) carrying her first foal, by Frankel (GB), and dual Group 1-winner Immortal Verse (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) also carrying her first foal, by Dansili (GB). The breeding stock sale also carries the buzz created by a group of mares carrying to the first crop of Frankel, which numbers 10.

STEVENS WINS BIG SPORT OF TURFDOM AWARD

Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens was selected to receive the Big Sport of Turfdom Award, the Turf Publicists of America announced yesterday. This award

is reserved for a person or group who has enhanced coverage of Thoroughbred racing through cooperation with media and Thoroughbred racing publicists.

"This year has been crazy and keeps getting better," Stevens said. "I'm honored. Some of my idols and closest friends have received this award. It's humbling."

At 50-years-old, Stevens got back in the irons in January after a seven-year-retirement. He has racked up 17 graded stakes victories this year, including the

GI Preakness S., GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, and GI Breeders' Cup Classic. During his retirement, Stevens was a racing analyst for NBC Sports and HRTV.

"Gary has long been a favorite of racing media and publicists but perhaps never more so than this year, as his remarkable comeback amazed every one of us," said TPA President Mandy Minger. "Through it all he made himself consistently available with interviews that were both thoughtful and candid." Cont. p3



The Tattersalls December Breeding Stock Sale has also become a reliable source for race-fit fillies both inand out-of-training, and this year's draft, headed by lot

1803, the G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Rosdhu Queen (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), is especially strong. That 3-year-old is one of more than 30 group- or listed-winning fillies in- or out-of-training catalogued, and she is joined by the likes of Irishtrained Group 2 winners Belle de Crecy (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) (Iot 1826) and Fiesolana (Ire) (Aussie Rules) (lot 1543);

French Group 2 winners **Dream Peace (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) (lot 1853), **Laugh Out Loud (GB)** (Clodovil {Ire}) (lot 1856), **Peace Burg (Fr)** (Sageburg {Ire}) (lot 1855) and **Pollyana (Ire)** (Whipper) (lot 1748). German Group 2 winner **Ars Nova (Ger)** (Solider Hollow {GB}) (lot 1721) is also amongst the draft, as is five-time South African Group 1 winner **Dancewiththedevil (SAf)** (Modus Vivendi {GB}) (lot 1795). Added recently as wild card entries are lot 1570A, **Guinnevre (Ire)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}), winner of the Listed Coolmore Stud Baden-Baden Aug. 28, and lot 1857A, the Listed Prix Panacee winner **Pearls or Passion (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}).

That section of the sale alone indicates the global feel of the auction. Add in consignments from Germany, France and the U.S. as well as strong domestic participation, including the ever-popular drafts of local breeders Juddmonte and Shadwell, and you have one of the world's most international sales.

"It's an enormous tribute to the sale, the fact that it's regarded not just as the premier outlet for British and Irish breeders looking to sell their breeding stock--it also attracts consignments every year throughout Europe and very often also from America," George said. "Historically, year-after-year, breeders from every continent in the world descend on Tattersalls for the December Sale, looking for breeding stock of the highest quality, and every year they're rewarded. I think just a brief look at some of the top-class global performers of 2013 gives you an indication of why the success of this sale has been so consistent. It's a sale where breeders come every year knowing they will find stock to suit their requirements and their budget, regardless of what part of the world they will be taking these animals back to."

This year's breeding stock draft will look to build on a solid 2012 renewal when, despite an acknowledged lack of stars in the catalogue, the sale held relatively steady with 2011 figures. Although the average experienced an 18% dip to 57,654gns and the median a 10% drop to 19,000gns, the gross suffered only marginally, down to 43,932,200gns from 44,121,500gns. The highlight figure was the healthy buyback rate, which dropped more than 8% to 18.7%. With such a wide cast of stars on offer this year, the sale is sure to experience exponential growth.

The Foal Story...

A recurring theme of the December Foal Sale is strength across all levels of the market, and that trend was especially apparent last year when, despite 25 fewer lots being offered and fewer six-figure transactions than in 2011, the aggregate experienced a rise to 24,132,700gns. This marked the first time since 2007 that the sale had surpassed the 24-million guineas mark, and just the third time in the sale's history. Last year's foal topper, a 500,000gns full-brother to G1 Epsom Derby runner-up At First Sight (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), fueled a third session that set a record for turnover at a European foal session at 13,181,800gns. Despite slight dips in average price and median at the conclusion of last year's foal sale, the buyback rate was down almost 7% to 17%. George expressed confidence in the strength of this year's foal draft.

"I think it is a stronger catalogue than last year," he noted. "It looks to be a very class renewal, so they're following in the footsteps of every catalogue we've put together this year. There are nearly 100 foals by the current top 10 sires in Britain and Ireland, which is a pretty impressive tally in itself and gives an indication of the enormous depth in the catalogue."

Amongst the highlights on paper are lot 913, a half-sister to this year's G1 Prix Jean Prat winner Havana Gold (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) from the first crop of Dream Ahead; lot 978, an Aqlaam (GB) half-brother to dual Group 1-winning juvenile Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate); lot 1012, a Galileo half-sister to multiple Group 1-winning sprinter Society Rock (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), and lot 1005, a Fastnet Rock (Aus) half-brother to this year's G1 Epsom Oaks winner Talent (GB) (New Approach {Ire}). The catalogue also includes the progeny of leading sires Dansili, Dubawi (Ire), New Approach and Oasis Dream (GB).

The strength of the foal market is often dictated by the demand for yearlings earlier in the year, and as such George expressed confidence that the December Foal Sale will ride the momentum of the October Yearling Sale's strengths. Cont. p6





"The foal market is very much tied into the yearling market, so a strong yearling market tends to produce a robust and healthy demand for foals," George explained. "Obviously, the yearling sales this year produced some spectacular results, not only individual prices, but strength throughout the whole of the October Yearling Sale. It would be no surprise to see that sort of strength replicated at the December Foal Sale."

While the Tattersalls December Foal Sale long ago developed a reputation as a source of quality foals at the top of the market, it is also a sale where top-class runners can be sourced at bargain prices. Recent Grade /Group 1 graduates sold for 100,000gns or less include I'm A Dreamer (Ire) (Noverre), Presvis (GB) (Sakhee), Dubawi Heights (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), Bethrah (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Lillie Langtry (Ire) (Danehill Dancer

{Ire}). Other value purchases include Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who was bought for 190,000gns by Tim Hyde in 2006 and went on to win Royal Ascot's G1 Gold Cup and amass earnings of more than £2-million, and Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), the winner of the 2011

G1 Irish Derby and GI Secretariat S. who was purchased for 180,000gns in 2008 by Camas Park Stud and went on to earn more than £1.5-million. The likes of Lillie Langtry and Bethrah were also profitable pinhooks for their foal sale buyers, indicating the diversity of what buyers can find at the sale.

"I think that's the beauty of the Tattersalls December Foal Sale: there is something for everybody, pinhookers and end-users alike, at all levels of the market," George said. "That's a key element to the sale and what makes it a prime target for so many pinhookers."

In 2013, the foal sale has produced the winners of 12 Group 2 races, 17 Group 3 races and 26 listed races.

Value Abounds at Yearling Sale...

While the Northern Hemisphere's major yearling sales are already in the books, there is still value to be found at the Tattersalls December Yearling Sale. This sale has been responsible for a number of bargain buys, most notably Amaron (GB) (Shamardal), who was purchased by BBA Germany for 105,000gns in 2010 and went on to annex last year's G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua; Premio Loco (Prized), who cost just 19,000gns in 2005 and went on to win eight group races amass £775,976 in prizemoney, and Harbour Watch (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), unbeaten winner of the G2 Richmond S. and early G1 2000 Guineas favorite who cost Peter Doyle 58,000gns in 2010.

"The December Yearling Sale is traditionally a very popular fixture," George said. "It's a mixture of yearlings that either may have been regarded as perhaps a little too backwards to take up a slot in any of our October Yearling Sales, or some yearlings that for one reason or another may have been unable to take up their slot in the October Yearling Sale, having been catalogued. There are some real quality yearlings in the catalogue year-after-year, and equally it produces some very highclass performers year-after-year. It's basically the only established end-of-year yearling sale in Europe, and as such attracts a diverse international cast of buyers year-on-year. It's very important for breeders to have that outlet, and the December Yearling Sale is a wellestablished fixture where buyers feel confident they can come year-after-year and find quality yearlings at every level of the market." Amongst the standouts in this year's catalogue are lot 33, a Kodiac (GB) filly whose second-dam is American champion and stakes producer Eliza; lot 35, a Champs Elysees (GB) colt whose dam is a half-sister to European champion Harbinger (GB) (Dansili {GB}); lot 37, a Medicean (GB) colt from the family of Group 1 winners Elmaamul (Diesis), Reams of Verse (Nureyev) and Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}); lot 51, a full-sister to multiple group winner Trumpet Major (Ire) (Arakan); lot 89, a Medaglia d'Oro filly whose dam is a 3/4-sister to Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), and lot 198, a Makfi (GB) colt from the immediate family of this year's four-time Group 1-winning 3-year-old filly Sky Lantern.

DANCING RAIN A TATTERSALLS STANDOUT

When bloodstock agent Liam Norris, shopping with business partner William Huntingdon, saw **Dancing Rain** (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) at the 2009 Goffs Millions

Sale, he clocked her as the best physical on the grounds. And when he and Huntington were able to secure the filly for €200,000--a sensible sum helped by the fact that she sold early as Lot 4--he remembers thinking to himself, "I have never been so thrilled to spend so much money."

Fast forward four years, and Norris's optimism has been confirmed several times over. What's more, he is set

to witness what is believed to be the first G1 Epsom Oaks winner, carrying her first foal, offered at public auction in at least 50 years.

Dancing Rain, winner of the 2011 renewal of the Epsom centerpiece, has been catalogued at the Tattersalls December Sale as lot 1533. She's consigned by Clairemont Stud, the nom de course of the brothers Lee and Martin Taylor, who campaigned Dancing Rain with trainer William Haggas. In addition to the Oaks, Dancing Rain's wins included the G1 Preis der Diana and the G2 Champions Fillies and Mares S. She was the co-highweight 3-year-old filly in England at 9.5-11f and at 11-14f in 2011, and sells in foal carrying a member of the first crop of the brilliant European Horse of the Year Frankel (GB). Dancing Rain is one of 10 mares that Tattersalls has cataloged for December selling in foal to Juddmonte's unbeaten champion.

"It is a huge thrill to have such a wonderful mare at Clairemont, especially in foal to the greatest racehorse I will probably ever witness in my lifetime," Norris said on Thursday. He added that Dancing Rain's page holds as much appeal as her race record. "She has a thoroughly international pedigree; her second dam bred a Derby winner in Dr Devious (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}), a champion sprinter in Ireland in Archway (Ire) [Thatching {Ire}), and two more stakes winners, while one of her daughters produced the Japanese champion Susuka Phoenix (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). And her first foal will be closely related to Maybe (Ire), a Group 1-winning 2-year-old by Galileo (Ire). What more could you want?"

Patience is a Virtue...

For the connections of Dancing Rain, it's been a story of patience paying off. Despite being a standout yearling, she was a bit slow to come around at two. "Malcolm Bastard had her for a considerable period at two, and Malcolm does a great job and gave her time," said Norris. "That, I feel, was very critical to her future. Luckily, her owners listen and are patient."

Dancing Rain ran second in her lone start as a juvenile, but graduated in her 3-year-old debut in April of 2011 at Newbury. She was touched off by Izzi Top (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) in the Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' Trial Race next out, a race that would later gain substantial luster when Izzi Top won a pair of Group 1 races. Connections knew she'd be a longshot, but thought she stood a legitimate shot in the Oaks. "The Swettenham was only her third start, and she was clearly improving with every run," said Norris. "She was inexperienced, but we felt we were going there with nothing to lose and, hopefully, she would perform with great credit."

Perform with credit she did. Put right on the lead, she cut out sensible fractions under Johnny Murtagh, and when the real running began, she stretched her legs with zeal and comfortably held Wonder of Wonders (Kingmambo) safe by 3/4 lengths. Izzi Top was back in third, with the likes of Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) and Misty for Me (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in fourth and fifth, respectively. Her price? 21-1.

If anyone thought the race was a fluke, the notion was corrected two starts later at Dusseldorf, when Dancing Rain easily won the G1 Henkel-Preis der Diana. In her next, she returned to England to win the G2 Qipco British Champions Fillies' And Mares' S.

"We went to Germany full of confidence--she was at the top of her game," remembered Norris. "That race, and the Fillies and Mares at Ascot, cemented her as one of the top-class fillies of her generation. She was electric from the front, tough, genuine and very hard to chase down." Cont. p8





Norris, the farm manager at Highclere Stud from 1993 through 2004, was buying just his second horse for the Harris brothers when he and Huntingdon signed for Dancing Rain. Now, he and his wife Jenny are fully vested in the Taylors' operation. They live on the Clairemont property; Liam manages their equine interests, while Jenny manages Clairemont.

"I met Martin and Lee through a mutual friend in Ben Spears," Norris explained. "We clearly got on well and I am thrilled to have kept the association going. They are very realistic people and realize how lucky they have been. We are an enthusiastic team with family history in horse racing."

Norris actually helped find Clairemont for the Taylors. "I had been asked to look out for a property that could work for us all to keep our horses on, and after a five-year search, I came up with this 105-acre former poultry farm on fresh Hampshire ground in stunning countryside," Norris explained. "We have been here for 18 months, and things are gradually taking shape."

In 2012, Clairemont offered its first draft of yearlings at auction. "It's mostly my pinhooks, but we will gradually increase our broodmare band so that, in time, we can bring 10 top-class yearlings to the sales each year. We are trying to build a reputation for producing top-class racehorses."

With Dancing Rain, they've gave themselves a significant head start, and Norris said it will be an emotional farewell. "I'm very proud of her, and expect it to be a sad day when Jenny and I have to say goodbye."

TIMELY UPDATES FOR 'CHIMNEYS' DRAFT By Kelsey Riley

When Three Chimneys began consigning horses at the Tattersalls December Sale in 2010, the Midwaybased nursery made it a goal to produce quality, boutique consignments for the European market. That aim took on a whole new meaning in the past few

weeks, when a pair of winners at the Breeders' Cup and QIPCO British Champions Day provided the consignment with a few significant updates for its seven-horse draft.

The series of fortunate events kicked off at Ascot on British Champions Day Oct. 19, when Seal of Approval (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) ran away with the

G1 British Champions Fillies & Mare S. That victory provided an important boost to her half-sister **Instance** (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), whom Three Chimneys bought back for 38,000gns at this sale last year. She goes through the ring again Dec. 3 as <u>lot 1848</u>. The winner of three races herself and twice group-placed, the 5-year-old will be offered carrying her first foal, by Makfi (GB). Cont. p9

Two weeks later, the British-raider Chriselliam (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) scorched the Santa Anita turf with her victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, thus earning her second Group 1 of the season, enough to clinch the Cartier Award for champion 2-year-old filly in

Europe last week. This series of events represented a significant update for Three Chimney's Janicellaine (Ire) (Beat Hollow {GB}), a half-sister to Chriselliam who will go through the ring as lot 1851. Trained by Mike Maker, Janicellaine won Woodbine's Flaming Page S. The 5-year-old was also placed in Calder's GIII My Charmer H., and is offered as a horse-in-training.

"I think this is quite a strong group," commented Case Clay, President of Three Chimneys. "We started consigning in Tattersalls a few years ago, and each year our consignment has gotten stronger. This is a consignment where they're all black-type, and you really can't show one without the other, so that's what we plan on doing. We're very excited about this draft."

The decision to expand the sales arm of its operation into Europe came two years after Three Chimneys began its Three Chimneys Racing venture, which purses fillies from Europe to race on the turf in the U.S. This has proven to be a successful venture, with Group I winners Miss Keller (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Ave (GB)

Clay said the farm made the decision to start offering some of these mares back in Europe after it sold Grade II winner Diamond Diva (GB) (Dansili {GB})--purchased for 230,000gns as a listed-placed 3-year-old at this sale in 2007-to Japan's Katsumi Yoshida for \$400,000 at

Fasig-Tipton's November Sale in 2009.

"It all started with a filly called Diamond Diva, who we sold in America," he explained. "When she sold, we thought, 'she probably would have brought more in England.' We've had some Three Chimneys Racing fillies over the years that we've bought in Europe and raced in America, and sometimes they sell better in America, sometimes they sell better in England, but that's when we first thought of it. And it's good for the brand to get out there in an industry where the ocean seems to be getting bigger and bigger. It's good to reach out and develop and continue to nurture those relationship we have overseas, and it's worked well."

In addition to the aforementioned Instance and Janicellaine, Three Chimneys will offer the following mares: lot 1776, the 3-year-old Princess Patsky (Mr. Greeley), who failed to place in seven starts in Britain through August for trainer Michael Bell, but who hails from the family of Group 1 winners Fasliyev, Misty For Me (Ire), Desert Wine and Menifee; lot 1778, Up In Time (GB) (Noverre), winner of the GII San Clemente H. and GIII Harold C Ramser Sr. S. at Santa Anita in the Three Chimneys Racing silks. Up In Time was covered in April by Invincible Spirit and Teofilo, and is reportedly in foal. They also offer Iot1779, Saratoga stakes winner and multiple Grade/Group 1-placed Kissable (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)), who is still in training; Iot1849, the multiple stakes winner Making Eyes (Ire) (Dansili (GB)) who was covered by Nathaniel (Ire) but is offered not in foal, and Iot1850, the multiple stakes winner Reckoning who is offered still in training.

Clay noted that going forward, Three Chimneys will aim to keep its consignments small while continuing to increase the quality. While he expressed confidence in his draft, Clay acknowledged the realities of participating in a sale like Tattersalls December.

"We're quietly encouraged about the market, but trying to keep our expectations to reality," he explained. "I think one of the reasons why these sales have been going well both in America and in Europe is because there's a healthy balance between sellers and buyers. These fillies are there to sell, so while we're encouraged by the results, we're keeping our expectations at bay."

Bloom, Thomas Team Up for New York Mares...

One buying entity that kept showing up on the sales sheets in the second week at Keeneland November, which concluded its 10-day run Thursday in Lexingtonwas New York Breeding Venture. In total, the venture signed for 13 horses for \$680,000--an average of

\$52,000 per. Included was the \$92,000 Laughingly (Giant's Causeway)--a half sister to the European champion Lucayan Prince (Fast Play) and to the graded winners Silver Comic (Silver Hawk) and Comic Strip (Red Ransom) (hip 1559).

The purchases were made on behalf of a partnership between Becky Thomas, who operates Sequel Stallions in New York, and the California-based Jeffrey Bloom, who runs Bloom Thoroughbreds, a boutique

racing syndicate.

"It's a pretty straightforward partnership," said Bloom. "The plan is to take the mares into New York and stamp those foals as New York-bred horses, and then sell the babies. Then we'll get the mares back in foal to New York stallions."

Bloom said the strength of the New York breeders' award program was the driving factor behind the partnership...but not the only one.

"The New York incentive program is so lucrative and presents such a huge opportunity," he said. "But I also absolutely love working with Becky. She's the consummate professional, and any time I have an opportunity to partner up with her, it's a no-brainer."

Bloom said the partnership would ultimately acquire 20 to 25 mares. In addition to Laughingly, Thomas, who picked out all the mares, signed for the \$77,000 **Chive Blossom** (Unbridled's Song), produced by a full-sister to Malibu Moon and selling in foal to Haynesfield (hip 1838); and the \$75,000 **Exiled Princess** (Purge), a half to four stakes horses and in foal to Ghostzapper (hip 1887).

"The sale's been incredibly strong, and we've had to pay a little more than we thought we'd have to," said Bloom. "But we're looking for some mares with quality and who are put together the right way, and that have a history of producing good-looking horses or that have a legitimate pedigree."

Most of the mares will be sent to stallions at Sequel, including the newly retired **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song), the winner of the 2012 GI Forego S. at Saratoga.

Bloom has a long history in racing. He was a jockey for about nine years, then was tabbed to launch West Point Thoroughbreds' West Coast operation, which he managed for six years. In 2010, Bloom struck out on his own with Bloom Racing, which has campaigned, among others, the good California runner Majestic City (City Zip). Bloom lives in Oceanside, California, with his wife Susan and two daughters.

Recently, Bloom and his brother Bryan, a successful investor, launched Gimmel Investments, a private equity company that invests in opportunities related to the horse racing industry. "Gimmel's investments will be acquisitions, joint ventures and early stage venture capital," explained Bloom. "The first investment is the New York breeding venture with Becky, as well as Darley and Twin Creeks Farm [which both stand stallions at Sequel]. Future ventures will include pinhooking, breeding, racing and various businesses opportunities related to the horse racing industry."

Gimmel's investors/advisors includes Andrew Yaffe of Muskogee, Oklahoma. Bloom Racing's investors/advisors, meanwhile, include David Batchelder, chairman of the board for the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club. -L Marquardt

U.S. HOUSE HEARING ON DRUG TEST BILL

The U.S. House Committee on Energy and Commerce has scheduled a hearing Nov. 21 to discuss the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2013. If passed, this bill would give a single agency the power to enforce the sport's drug testing rules in all U.S. racing jurisdictions. The bill would give the committee the power to conduct drug tests on horses and would also prohibit the use of Lasix for any 2-year-old. Racetracks will have to have an agreement with the agency before bets will be accepted on their races. BRINGING 'SEXY' BACK IN MRS. REVERE

Hit The Board Stables's I'm Already Sexy (Ready's Image) squares off against 13 other sophomore filly turfers in this evening's wide-open GIII Mrs. Revere S.

The Wayne Catalano trainee reeled off back-to-back victories up at Arlington two and three back, annexing the much faster division of the Hatoof S. by daylight on GI Arlington Million Day Aug. 17 before taking the GIII Pucker Up S. by 3 3/4 lengths with a 95 Beyer Speed Figure Sept. 14.

She could do no better than sixth chasing a hot pace in Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Oct. 12, and figures to appreciate the slight cutback to 1 1/16 miles. Among I'm Already Sexy's front-end pursuers will be 7-2 morning-line favorite **Tapicat** (Tapit). The **TDN Rising Star"** is seeking her first victory since a three-race win streak down in Florida over the winer that culminated in a victory over eventual QE II winner Kitten's Dumplings (Kitten's Joy) in Tampa's GIII Florida Oaks back in February. The Besilu Stables/Bill Mott representative resurfaced to finish a good third in Saratoga's GII Lake George S. July 24, but could only manage a close-up fifth in the following month's GII Lake Placid S.

She comes in off a runner-up finish to Grade I winner Discreet Marg (Discreet Cat) in a salty renewal of the Pebbles S. at Belmont Oct. 14. Sycamore Racing's Nellie Cashman (Mineshaft) crossed the wire first in the Lake Placid at odds of 20-1, but was demoted to third for interference. A minor setback forced her to miss the QE II, but she showed up in Lexington a week later for the GIII Valley View S. Oct. 18, where she was second. "She's really doing well right now," trainer Francis Abbott III said. "You always want to see them come out of their races and bounce back. This is such a difficult time of year for fillies because when the cold weather comes in you have to look at them day-to-day and week-to-week to make sure their coats are coming in and showing you that they still want to be competitive. We picked this race out, but she really had to show us that she was going to bounce back [after the Valley View] and be her old self again." Of the competition his charge will face, Abbott offered, "It's a big and competitive field. There are some new fillies that we haven't run against and some fillies that we have run against. It's also a group of fillies that seem to have different sorts of running styles, so it'll be interesting to see how it sets up. I really think it could be won by any of the 14 fillies." One with a longshot look is Omega Racing Stable's Zero Game (Ire) (High Chaparral (Ire)). She failed to give any indication of graded stakes quality in 12 starts in Britain, but looked good rallying to annex a Laurel Park optional claimer Oct. 18 in her first start for Niall Saville.

Santulli's **Tannery (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) is among the major players as she takes on the boys for the first time since a good fourth in Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. Aug. 17. Second to stablemate **Laughing (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) in Belmont's GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. Sept. 28, the bay got a win at the highest level of her own in

Woodbine's Oct. 27 GI E.P. Taylor S. "She's a really good filly who hasn't done a whole lot wrong; she's fired every time," trainer Al Goldberg said of May's GII Sheepshead Bay S. heroine. "I think she could have been in the top three in the Sword Dancer with a little better trip. Both she and Laughing are talented, but while Laughing can be a bit worrisome and temperamental, this filly is much more laid back. You can put her on a van, race her, bring her home--she'll do anything." Another who enters off a performance on that Oct. 27 Woodbine card--for which the turf was rated yielding--is Ramsey homebred Hyper (Victory Gallop). The 5-2 morning-line favorite paired up victories in the July 31 John's Call S. at Saratoga and Sept. 7 GII Bowling Green H. in Elmont, and found only the Toronto-loving Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) better in the GI Canadian International. Phipps homebred Imagining (Giant's Causeway) has been an on-and-off sort over the course of his career, but must try to break that pattern to win here. A 5 1/4-length winner of Saratoga's Aug. 25 Idle Rich S., he was sixth in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic S. at Belmont Sept. 28 before besting Sky Blazer (Sky Mesa) and Exclusive Strike (Smart Strike) in that venue's Oct. 17 Bowl Game S.

A very evenly matched field of 13 3-year-olds will square off under the lights in Churchill's GIII Commonwealth Turf S. this evening. Among those set to compete are three formidable runners from Canada. Sam-Son Farm homebred Golden Sabre (Medaglia d'Oro) has crossed the wire first in all three of his turf starts to date. Resurfacing in a nine-furlong allowance Sept. 29, the Malcom Pierce-trained son of MGSW Strike Softly (Smart Strike) again showed off his good late kick to run down River Seven (Hard Spun) by a neck. That Tucci Stables colorbearer was coming off back-to-back Canadian Classic runner-ups in the July 30 Prince of Wales S. and Aug. 18 Breeders' S. After falling just short of Golden Sabre, the Nick Gonzales pupil returned to crush older foes by 10 lengths in the Oct. 19 Labeeb S. He earned a gaudy 105 Beyer Speed Figure for that performance, which may have been aided by yielding sod. Rounding out the North of the Border representatives is the Mark Cassetrained Kaigun (Northern Afleet). Unable to land a blow on the Polytrack in either the June 9 Plate Trial or July 7 Queen's Plate, the chestnut reemerged to take a one-mile grassy allowance Aug. 25 against his elders and hasn't been seen since. Magic City Thoroughbred Partners's Frac Daddy (Scat Daddy) didn't factor in this venue's GI Kentucky Derby or the GI Belmont S., but took to the turf to grab an Aug. 24 allowance at Saratoga. He faded to last in the GIII Saranac S. just a week later, but returned to take a main-track Keeneland allowance Oct. 17. "The colt's doing really well," trainer Ken McPeek said. "It'll be a little tricky from the outside [12 post], but I think he'll run really well."



Mark Antonini, Imagine That Racing:

I find it odd that when the percentage of horses that RNA at a sale decreases that we are to infer from that a "stronger" market. A low RNA rate could be a function of more horses going through without a reserve placed on them. It could also be a function of sellers having more realistic expectations in the sale of their product. Suffice it to say, I think referencing changes in RNA without supporting information is specious, at best. While I'm on this rather mundane topic, it is also interesting that we don't include RNA prices in the sales averages for sires. Just because the horse didn't change hands doesn't mean the market didn't determine its value. When I look at sire sales statistics, I include the RNA prices because they matter. It isn't relevant whether there are new owners or not. Statistics can be dangerous things, easily manipulated to say whatever we need.




