



CLOUD MEETS SKY AT SHA TIN

Two of the top females in Europe--one perhaps bidding farewell to the races and the other in the process of cementing her reputation--will meet for the first and maybe only time in a captivating renewal of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin Racecourse. George Strawbridge's **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) will in all likelihood be making the final start of her storied career and will look to close out a perfect 5-year-old campaign as the likely favorite with the betting public. Conservatively managed this term, the homebred took out the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot on seasonal debut July 6 before posting a third consecutive win in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest Aug. 4. If that weren't enough, she was brought back on a week's rest for Deauville's one-mile G1 Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 11, and she was just able to hold off a late challenge from the good 3-year-old mile Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}). Her most recent run was the stuff of legends, as she seemed to have plenty to do in the final 400 meters of the G1 Prix de la Foret on Arc day Oct. 6, but produced an impossible turn of foot over testing ground to streak home a three-length winner from **Gordon Lord Byron (Ire)** (Byron {GB}). **Cont. p3**

DARYSINA TOPS ARQANA OPENER

Dr. Philip Brown, the founder of the biomedical and healthcare publishing company PJB publications, has been dabbling in racing and breeding stock since buying his first racehorse in 2006, but with admittedly little luck. After making the decision to redevelop his action plan, Brown and agent Johnny McKeever have returned to the breeding stock sales scene this fall with an eye to buying quality mares to fuel a commercial operation. Brown found just the mare to fit that profile in The Aga Khan's **Darysina** (Smart Strike) [lot 137](#), and after a fierce bidding battle, he secured her for €800,000 to top the first session of the Arqana December Breeding Stock Sale. The blue-blooded mare helped to fuel a strong day of trade in Deauville, which saw the average rise 24% from this session last year to €114,796, and the aggregate increase 31% to €18,202,500. The median climbed from €42,000 to €50,000. The day saw 80.2% of horses through the ring find new homes, which was up from 76% sold last year. Fifty-five horses sold for €100,000 or more, compared to 37 this session 12 months ago. "The first day followed the market trend," said Eric Hoyeau, Chief Executive Officer of Arqana. "There was a lot of depth to this session, which proves when people bring a good mare to Deauville, there are buyers here, and the market responds. The day was very international, with buyers from Europe, the U.S., Australia and Japan." **Cont. p12**

ANOTHER STAR FOR THE BAFFERT BARN

Hill 'n' Dale Equine and Edward McGhee's **Streaming** (Smart Strike)--a granddaughter of Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister)--went from maiden winner to Grade I winner after posting an upset victory in yesterday's Hollywood Starlet S. A debut victress at 1-2 over nine rivals going six furlongs Nov. 15, she was given a 10-1 chance to handle her first test at two turns and at the highest level. Glued to the flank of **"TDN Rising Star"** **Taste Like Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) through fractions of :23.83 and :47.85 after taking a sound bump at the start, Streaming poked a head in front at the top of the stretch, gained command shortly thereafter, and had 1 1/2 lengths over her pacesetting rival on the wire. "We've really been high on this filly," Hall of Famer Bob Baffert revealed. "It was too late to get a race into her to run in the Breeders' Cup. I wasn't sure if I was going to run her in here because I didn't nominate her. When I saw her up there at 14-1 [in the early wagering], I told [owner] John [Sikura] that when you supplement [\$10,000 plus an additional \$10,000 to start], you're supposed to be 8-5. She's really special. I think we saw something special today." **Cont. p12**

"She's in very good shape after settling in beautifully," he commented. "She's done all that we wanted of her on the track here. She goes to the Mile, but that's fine for her now, I think. In the early days she raced too keenly, but now she settles well in her races." Head was also quick and clear in identifying the chief protagonist this afternoon. "The trip won't be a problem, but **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}) might be," he acknowledged. "I think she's the one to beat, but I'm very happy with my filly. She's kept improving all the time."

A disappointing eighth in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita 13 months ago, the likeable gray filly has totally turned it around in 2013, with wins in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot and the

G1 Sun Chariot S. back at headquarters. The barn reported she was a touch on the quiet side, but perked up within a few days of her arrival and appears to be sitting on go. The Hannon-trained Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) trailed as the 2-1 favorite in the 2010 Mile.

Gibson Gelding In For the 'Fun' of It...

The home team has been successful in the last seven runnings of the Mile dating back to Hat Trick (Jpn) (Sunday Silence)'s win in 2005, and it will fall largely on the shoulders of **Gold-Fun (Ire)** (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) to keep the trophy around for another year. A

respectable third to his higher-profile stablemate Akeed Mofeed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the Hong Kong Derby last March, the chestnut has stamped himself as a serious miler this season and exits a smart

success over Helene Spirit (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) in the G2 Jockey Club Mile Nov. 17. "Gold-Fun has been exceptional all year and he doesn't need much to get ready," trainer Richard Gibson, who saddled Doctor Dino (Fr) (Muhtathir) to win back-to-back runnings of the G1 Hong Kong Vase in 2007 and 2008, told South China *Morning Post*. "He's won three from three this season in all the lead-up races and the trick has not been to make him better, but keep him in the same condition."



MOFEED WOULD LIKE SPEED IN CUP

Akeed Mofeed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) was purchased by Hong Kong businessman Pan Sutong for a reported \$2 million and

brought to Hong Kong with an eye on the 2013 Derby, a race restricted to 4-year-olds in this part of the world. It wasn't always easy, but the plan came to fruition with a defeat of **Endowing (Ire)** (Danehill

Dancer {Ire}) and the aforementioned Gold-Fun this past March. His first local try against open Group 1 competition resulted in a fifth to **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup over this track and distance Apr. 28, but he appears ready to turn the tables on that rival and a smattering of invaders in today's G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup. A heavy and sometimes headstrong horse who needs his racing to gain fitness, the athletic bay came running to miss by a head to Endowing in the G2 Jockey Club Cup Nov. 17 and has trained brilliantly since. "He's had two turf gallops since his second in the Jockey Club Cup, and I'm delighted with his well-being," trainer Richard Gibson told *SCMP*. "The last workout was particularly impressive." Gibson uses blinkers in the colt's morning work, but not on raceday. "The blinkers give him more focus and he puts more into it," he told the paper. Military Attack displaced the injured Ambitious Dragon (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) as Horse of the Year with a win over stablemate Dan Excel (Ire) (Shamardal) in the G1 SAI Cup at Kranji May 19. He raced reasonably handy to the pace in the Jockey Club Cup last time and was a useful third in his second start this preparation.

Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) has made a trip to Hong Kong something of a tradition and is here for the fifth-straight season. One of a couple of popular old geldings who will race today, the 7-year-old, who was scratched on the eve of last year's Cup with an injury,

was slow to come to hand this year, but won the G3 Prix La Coupe Sept. 20 and the G2 Prix Dollar Oct. 5 before a tough second in the G1 QIPCO Champion S. Oct. 19. He's probably a touch better on ground softer than he'll encounter today, but is definitely classy enough

to get home first. "He will run his race this year, I'm sure of that," trainer Corine Barande-Barbe offered. "The signs have been good with him on the track and I think now that we understand everything that is required here, maybe this will help him win. He's really very well. I want this. I want him to show here in Hong Kong what he can really do." **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) will try to become the first American to take out one of the Internationals since Val's Prince in 1997, and while the trip suits, the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero will have to be at his very best to hold off some talented closers.

ONLY HIGH GATE CAN DERAILED KANALOA

Since the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint was lengthened to six furlongs from five in 2006, no horse has managed to overcome a post position higher than nine, and some good ones have tried.

Among those to fail are the outstanding Australian duo of Apache Cat (Aus) and Miss Andretti (Aus), Singaporean sensation Rocket Man (Aus) and even **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who could do no better than fifth from the

12 hole in defense of his title last season. That is precisely the berth from which Japan's **Lord Kanaloa (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) will try to follow in the hoofprints of the legendary Silent Witness (Aus) and Falvelon (Aus) and put together back-to-back victories in the six-furlong event. Classy enough to see out the one-mile distance of Japan's top mile test, the G1 Yasuda Kinen, the 5-year-old was probably in need of the run when second in the G2 Centaur S. Sept. 8. He clocked 1:07.20 in winning the G1 Sprinters' S. Sept. 29, his local trackwork has been brilliant and he looms the strongest favorite on the program. He makes his final career appearance this afternoon. "I understand the quality of the sprint race and the sprinters here in Hong Kong, and it is not easy to win a race like this," said Shogo Yasuda, son of and assistant to his father Takayuki Yasuda. "But the owner told us, after the Sprinters S., that he would like to target Hong Kong as Lord Kanaloa's final run and he is here in good shape."

Lucky Nine, a puzzling sixth as the 2-1 favorite in the G1 VRC Sprint Classic at Flemington Nov. 9, got the better of the draw for a change, and jockey Brett Prebble sees that as a major advantage. "That opens things up a bit and definitely means my bloke gets his chance now," said Prebble. "It's a big improvement on last year and I'm really excited now." **Cerise Cherry (SAf)** (Goldkeeper) was a good second in last year's Sprint, and has charted a similar course into this running. He exits a fourth to **Charles the Great (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and **Sterling City (Aus)** (Nadeem {Aus}) in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint. European short-trackers have not tasted success in this race, and **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) will probably need to do even better than his victory in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 18 to have any sort of place chance.

THE FUGUE LOOKS TO CREATE 'MEMORIES'

Lord Lloyd-Webber's **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) figures a strong favorite to provide European-based horses with a 12th consecutive victory in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase, the longest event of the International races at 2400 meters. A troubled third in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf in 2012, she improved one spot to validate favoritism in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks Aug. 22, then defeated a

hardy performer in Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) to win the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 7. She took on the boys again in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Nov. 2 and was asked early by William Buick, but could not fight off a late rally from Magician (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and settled for second as the 3-2 chalk. The filly's chances were done no harm by drawing post position three at Thursday's barrier draw, but with about five-sixteenths of a mile to the first corner, post positions at this elongated trip are somewhat irrelevant. **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {Fr}) was not originally intended for the Vase, but the combination of a solid fifth in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 24 and the withdrawal of local runner Autumn Gold (Ger) (Ransom o'War) left an opening and the 7-year-old's connections accepted the invite.

Despite an arduous season full of travel, Dunaden has made a favorable impression in the morning and looks to add to his victory in this in 2011. **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Geneux {GB}) has also been all over the globe this season, having hit the board in the G1 Dubai World Cup, the G1 Tenno Sho (Spring) and, for the second time, the G1 Melbourne Cup. Owned by former Hong Kong Jockey Club executive Ron Arculli, Red Cadeaux passed on a trip to Tokyo for the Japan Cup in favor of training up to a title defense in this.

INTERNATIONAL DAY HAS ARRIVED

Well, we've finally arrived at International Day at Sha Tin, though by the time many of you read this, the races will have already been run. So I won't talk too much about the races themselves, though I did want to

relate a great story Carlo Vaccarezza told me the other day. I interviewed Vaccarezza on Thursday at Sha Tin. He's the breeder of the four-time Grade I winner his wife Priscilla owns, **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps). By chance, I wound up sitting next to him on the shuttle bus ride back to the hotel, and we got to chatting. Sharp guy, a total no-nonsense sort. I

asked about Hay Jude (Wavering Monarch), Little Mike's dam, as I had remembered that she was put through the ring at Fasig-Tipton November (he RNA'd the mare, in foal to Distorted Humor, for \$235,000.)

I didn't know the story behind her and Little Mike, so I asked Vaccarezza. In case you don't know yourself, here it is. Vaccarezza, a Florida-based restaurateur, was asked by his friend Pat Greco for advice. Greco had begun a breeding operation in Illinois. Unfortunately, he was breeding mares that, in Vaccarezza's estimation, didn't necessarily warrant it, given their pedigrees and race records. Ten horses had quickly become 30 before Greco knew it. He wanted to unload. Vaccarezza agreed to help find homes for the mares, as many would likely have lost the friend money if they had been entered at auction. One day, Vaccarezza was out assessing the mares, and one kept following him around. It was Hay Jude--an Ill-bred miss whose last win came against \$6,000 claimers.

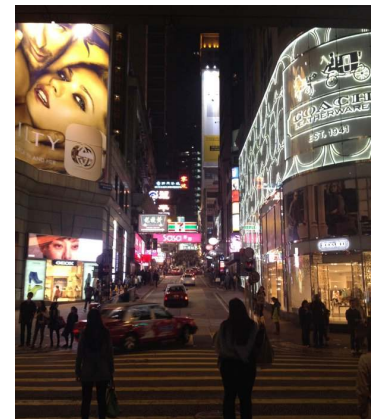
"She loves you," Greco laughed. Vaccarezza wasn't impressed. He visited another time, and again the mare followed him. Six weeks went by, and Vaccarezza got a call in Florida saying that a van was coming down from Illinois. If he wanted, Hay Jude could be on it, and it wouldn't cost him a dime. Vaccarezza finally agreed to take her. The first foal he bred from the mare was a horse named Little Nick (Tiger Ridge), who won three stakes and earned \$469,713. The second, on a stud fee he obtained for just \$500, was Little Mike.


Asked about the choice in stallion, Vaccarezza said, "I was at a farm in Ocala one day, and they were leading a horse out to the paddock. It was the the most beautiful horse you ever saw. I asked who it was, and they said Spanish Steps. He was a full-brother to Unbridled's Song. He had never raced--I think he bowed a tendon--but he was gorgeous. I told the guy I'd breed to him for \$500. That's how I chose the stallion."

Vaccarezza appreciates the unlikelihood of getting a near \$3.5 million earner from the mating. "People spend millions trying to buy champions," he said. "You can't do it."

The View from Hong Kong Island...

So we made the move midweek from Kowloon, across the harbor, to Hong Kong Island, and for the first time Saturday I got a chance to explore the area a little bit on foot. I spent a good five hours tracking around Central Saturday night, Hong Kong's most recognizable district. There's an entirely different feel here than in Kowloon. Much more cosmopolitan, much more modern, with more tourists and international businessmen and women. There are parts that are nearly indistinguishable from Fifth Avenue. Chanel, Dior, Louis Vuitton--virtually no high-end designer isn't represented by a boutique on the ritzy Queen's Rd. There are several massive malls in the area, too--The Landmark, in Central, and Pacific Place in nearby Admiralty, are popular destinations. Attempting a short-cut through the latter at one point, I found myself hopelessly lost, unknowingly down two floors from street level. Predictably, the malls have a sterile feel to them, though, and it's better to be out on Queen's Rd, at least if you're not the claustrophobic sort. **Cont. p10**

Hong Kong Island is formed primarily of volcanic rock and rises abruptly from Victoria Harbour. Victoria Peak, or just 'The Peak' to locals, registers the island's highest elevation at 1,811 feet, yet sits probably less than a mile inland from the harbor. This gives you a feel of Hong Kong's topography as you walk around, even if it's hidden by concrete, mortar and steel. Sidewalks include levels of stairs mid-avenue (this would be an absolute nightmare for the legal departments in most U.S. cities); some streets veer sharply upward as you head south.



D'aguilar Street, just off Queen's Rd, is a good example. It angles up and then, at its top, veers dramatically eastward. This portion is closed to vehicle traffic, and patrons from raucous bars spill out into the street, drinks in hand. There are tattoo shops nearby for those who want a permanent souvenir. Street performers play Beatles songs.

Altogether the place was a little too touristy for my liking, though I did find a great little place to grab a drink. Called Sugardolls and yet not a gentlemen's club, it was the size of a small one-car garage and had five barstools, plus two small tables up front. An untalkative Filipino tended the bar. It was a good spot to get away from the scrum for a second.

When you travel around Hong Kong by foot, you realize the city has a sound. It isn't a good one, necessarily, really: it's the constant beeping at the crosswalks. When the little man is red, quarter notes let you know it is not safe to go. When he's green, rapid-fire sixteenth notes urge you to scramble to the other side of the street. If you are prone to sensory overload, this could be a problem.



Maybe the most fascinating aspect of the city is just how vertical it is. I looked it up once I got back to my hotel and, sure enough, Hong Kong has more skyscrapers than anywhere in the world--a whopping 293 buildings that reach at least 150 meters. New York, by contrast, has 230. Dubai has 203. Moreover, they're tightly packed primarily in this and the immediately surrounding areas of Hong Kong Island. Lit up at night, and combined with some truly stunning architecture, this urban canopy makes for a pretty spectacular show.

HKIS 'EXCEEDS' EXPECTATIONS

The Hong Kong Jockey Club conducted the first of two installments of its Hong Kong International Sale on the eve of Sunday's International Races, turning the Sha Tin parade ring into a hub of activity for about 90 minutes Saturday morning. The Club offered a total of 16 ready-to-race 2- and 3-year-olds acquired at various auction houses from around the world. Horses by Danehill and now by the deceased dual-hemisphere stallion's sons have always been the rage in Hong Kong, and it was a gelded son of the outstanding Exceed and Excel (Aus) who led the way on a final bid of HK\$7.5 million (US\$967,243) from Kwok Fai Tse. Tse is chief executive officer of EPI Holdings Limited, an investment holding company, which engages in the exploration and production of petroleum. Offered as lot 7, the chestnut is a son of multiple Australian Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed Galapagos Girl (Aus) (Dehere) and was purchased by the HKJC for A\$220,000 at Inglis's Easter Yearling Sale in 2012. **Cont. p11**

The sire of such international luminaries as Excelebration (Ire), Guelph (Aus) and Overreach (Aus), Exceed and Excel is represented in Hong Kong by the up-and-coming young sprinter Amber Sky (Aus).

Another paternal grandson of Danehill lit up the tote to close out the proceedings when lot 19, a son of Atlantic Jewel (Aus)'s sire Fastnet Rock (Aus), was hammered down for HK\$6.7 million (US\$864,070). A Nov. 10 produce, the chestnut's dan Permissive (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}) was a listed winner in Australia and has produced two winners from as many foals to race. The winning bidder was Howard Liang, whose California Memory (Highest Honor {Fr}) won the last two runnings of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup, but was forced to miss this year's race via injury. Lot 19 was a A\$350,000 purchase from the 2012 Easter sale.

The 16 horses, offered without reserve, grossed HK\$64.7 million (US\$8,344,080) for an average of HK\$4,043,750 (US\$521,505) and a median price of HK\$3,850,000 (US\$496,518).

"It's safe to say the sale exceeded expectations, averaging over HK\$4 million per lot," said Bill Nader, the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing. "We offered a group of nice individuals and it seemed like there was satisfaction among buyers at the way the horses presented themselves today. If you look at tomorrow's International race day, there are three International Sale Graduates running that are rated over 100, including Liberator (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase. Those are the kind of horses we hope that these sales produce. Time will tell, but we are optimistic that the buyers got good value for money, and they certainly showed their confidence in the Club by bidding to the levels that they did today."

Former graduates of the HKIS include 2006 G1 Hong Kong Mile winner The Duke (Aus) (Danehill) and Good Ba Ba (Lear Fan), who won that same event three years running from 2007-2009.

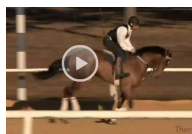

She was very impressive." Rosalind (Broken Vow), favored at 8-5 following a rallying third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Nov. 2, reported home a non-threatening fourth. The 12-year-old mare Teeming (Storm Cat), a \$1.5-million KEENOV weanling purchase, won three of four career starts for John Sikura and Edward McGhee. The session-topping Darysina is a daughter of G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille winner Daryaba (Ire) (Night Shift), who is already well on her way to creating her own dynasty, with G1 Hong Kong Vase winner Daryakana (Fr) and G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris winner Daramsar (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) to her credit. The family also includes Classic winners Darsi (Fr) and Darjina (Fr) under the third dam.

Brown, standing alongside McKeever after securing his gem, was understandably delighted. "This is what we really wanted, so we can breed some really nice horses," he said. "We want to get into these families."

Brown explained that a mate would be decided for Darysina by using the tools of Thoroughbred Genetics, which uses DNA-based measurements to identify suitable matings.

Brown currently has six mares, and said he would like to keep his band to around eight.

"We'll sell most of the foals and keep a few of them to race," he explained. "I want to run a commercial operation, so I have to do the breeding and the sales. We had bought some mares before, just not commercial ones, so we decided to re-group."

Darysina was Brown's second purchase of the session after he went to €290,000 for Zibeling (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) ([lot 90](#)) earlier in the day. The 7-year-old is out of the Group 3 winner Zelding, and is a half-sister to multiple group winner Beauty is Truth (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), as well as listed winner and multiple Group 1-placed Glorious Sight. She is in foal to Fastnet Rock (Aus).

"She's a super mare," said Brown. "We'll be keeping her as a foundation mare. We're really happy."

Brown, who has a handful of horses in training with Andrew Balding, said both mares will likely reside at Watership Down Stud.

The ever-popular Aga Khan draft celebrated another high price when Group 1 winner **Vadawina (Ire)** (Unfuwain) ([lot 187](#)) was knocked down to Robert Nataf, on behalf of David Nagle's Barronstown Stud, for €600,000. The 11-year-old is the dam of Group 2 winner Vadamar (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), and was offered carrying to the first Northern Hemisphere crop of Australian champion sire Redoute's Choice (Aus).

agent for Bobby Flay for 550,000gns] in Newmarket last week. This one will be a good addition to the operation. It was the price you have to pay to get a sister to a Group 1 winner."

Merville became the fifth member of her immediate family to bring a six-figure price at public auction in the last three weeks, after a trio of sisters to Merville's dam sold for €420,000, €400,000 and €250,000 at Goffs, while another sister brought 190,000gns last week at Tattersalls.

Americans To The Fore...

American agents enjoyed success at the top of the market yesterday, with Steve Young and Justin Casse both signing tickets. Young, who was underbidder on the session topper, led the way late in the session when snapping up **Where (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) ([lot 193](#)) for €600,000 for an undisclosed established client. A daughter of G1 1000 Guineas winner Virginia Waters (Kingmambo), Where was offered carrying her first foal, by Galileo (Ire).

"She'll go to America," he confirmed. "I'm not sure yet who she'll be bred to."

Young said the appeal for his lone purchase at the sale was obvious.

"She's in foal to arguably the best stallion in the world, and she's out of a Classic winner, but she stands on her own merits," he said. "She's a very good-looking mare. The price was what you'd expect to pay for a horse with that type of resume."

Justin Casse got into the fray earlier in the session, paying €355,000 for Group 3 winner Lacarolina (Fr) (Charge d'Affaires {GB}) ([lot 150](#)), who will cross the Atlantic and stay in training.

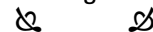

"She'll go to the States, but the location is yet to be decided," Casse explained. "Her race record speaks for itself; she was the class of the sale as far as racehorses go. I think she will adapt to America well. The new owner had thought about keeping her here, but I thought it would be better to go to the States. The horses from over here do so well there. What paid about what we thought we'd have to spend for her."

Casse paid €180,000 for [lot 40](#), Queen's Daughter (Fr) (American Post {GB}), a listed winner at Fontainebleau since the catalogue.

Building An Empire...

A burgeoning stallion roster requires quality mares to support it, and yesterday Nicolas de Watrigant and the Al Shaqab Racing team were out shopping at Arqana for mares to support Sheikh Joaan's team of young sires. Their most expensive purchase came late in the session when they went to €600,000 for Plumba (GB) (Anabaa) ([lot 159](#)), a winning full-sister to G1 Gran Prix de Saint Cloud winner Plumania (GB), and a half to Group 2 winner

Balladeuse (Fr) (Singspiel {Ire}).

"She's a lovely mare from a very good family," said Al Shaqab's Benoit Jeffroy. "She'll stay in France for breeding. A stallion hasn't been decided yet, but it could be Al Kazeem or Planteur."

Sheikh Joaan is a shareholder in this year's triple Group 1 winner Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), who begins his stud career next year at The Royal Studs in England. Group 1 winner Planteur (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), will stand his first season next year alongside fellow Sheikh Joaan-owned freshman Style Vendome (Fr) (Anabaa), winner of this year's G1 French 2000 Guineas. The pair will stand at Haras de Bouquetot in Normandy, which was purchased by Sheikh Joaan last year to be the base of his growing breeding operation.

Al Shaqab went to €280,000 earlier in the session to secure a future mate for Style Vendome in **Nuit d'Amour (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}) ([lot 107](#)). A debut winner at Chantilly last year at two, Nuit d'Amour has been twice listed-placed since.

"She was a good 2-year-old, and we have to support our stallion," said Al Shaqab's Nicolas de Watrigant. "She'll visit Style Vendome. She probably made a bit more [than we thought] because she could have been a candidate for someone to buy and race on, but she'll go straight to stud next year."

Philippe Jousset of France Turf International was outbid on Plumba, but he returned a few lots later to secure [lot 164](#), Petite Noblesse (Fr) (Galileo {Ire}), a 4-year-old member of the immediate family of Classic winner and young sire Lope de Vega (Fr), in foal to Oasis Dream (GB). Jousset was acting on behalf of Stud RDI, which has farms in Argentina, Brazil and the U.S., and recently purchased an operation in France.

Priceless Indeed...

Getting into the best families in the breed requires pocket power, and that was exactly the case with **Purely Priceless (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) ([lot 170b](#)), who cost Meridian International €550,000. The 3-year-old, twice a winner, is a daughter of champion and four-time Group 1 winner Peeping Fawn (Danehill), herself a daughter of Group 1 winner Maryinsky (Sadler's Wells) and a descendant of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Blush With Pride (Blushing Groom {Fr}), who has founded a dynasty most notable through her daughter Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister), who is responsible for GI Belmont S. winners Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) and Jazil (Seeking the Gold), and is the granddam of yesterday's GI Hollywood Starlet S. heroine Streaming (Smart Strike). Peeping Fawn, a full-sister to Group 1 winner and young sire Thewayyouare, has already produced the multiple group placed Sir John Hawkins (Henrythenavigator), a 2-year-old of this year.

"It's the best family that exists," said Ghislan Bozo, who signed on behalf of Meridian International. "She's for an existing client, and will stay in training for the meantime and then be bred."

Good Day Mates...

Australians were active throughout the session, with Eliza Park International making the biggest splash. The Victoria-based operation, which signed for six mares at Tattersalls last week, has carried the momentum over to France, picking up eight mares yesterday for €1,458,000, headed by listed winner **Festoso (Ire)** (Diesis) ([lot 180b](#)), a half-sister to Group 1 winner Olden Times (GB) (Darshaan {GB}) in foal to Galileo, for €420,000. Philip Marshall of Eliza Park explained that all the farm's purchases would foal out in Europe before relocating to Australia.

"We haven't decided yet where they'll stay," he explained.

"The market here has been very, very strong," he continued. "We got a few earlier in the day, and then we found it a bit tough."

Eliza Park International, purchased by the Hong Kong-based company Sun International in the summer, has been focused on spending to convert the operation from a commercial venture to one that breeds its own horses.

Australian Damon Gabbedy of Belmont Bloodstock Agency was

also busy, signing for four horses through the session totaling €665,000. The most expensive was [lot 51](#), the 6-year-old **Monblue (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}), in foal to Soldier Hollow (GB), for €400,000. Gabbedy noted that the mare, a listed winner in Italy, was purchased for John and Fumay Hutchins, who raced the late Australian Horse of the Year Typhoon Tracy (Aus) (Red Ransom).

The Hutchins' own about 20 broodmares in Queensland, and were looking to replace a Monsun mare they purchased at this venue three years ago.

"The new owners bought a Monsun here three years ago, and unfortunately she died," Gabbedy explained.

Monblue has already experienced success when bred to Soldier Hollow, and her current 4-year-old by that sire, Salon Soldier (Ger), provided a significant update when collecting the Listed Visit Victoria Plate on the Melbourne Cup undercard Nov. 5.

"The trainer thinks he's Group 1 quality, so she's a very attractive prospect for Australia," Gabbedy explained. "She'll foal here before coming over."

In addition to Salon Solider, Monblue is the dam of Sommernachtstraum (Ger) (Shirocco {Ger}), listed-placed in his native country.

The Monsun line was also in the spotlight later in the session, when Charles-Henri de Moussac of Haras du Mezeray went to €300,000 for **Elle Same (GB)** ([lot 120](#)), the first of the wildcards through the ring. The 3-year-old filly is a daughter of the Monsun stallion Samum (Ger), who stands at Gestut Karlshof in Germany, and de Moussac noted that the Monsun influence was a big draw. A winner and listed placed in Germany this year, Elle Same is out of the dual G1 Premio Roma and G1 Bayerisches-Zuchtrennen winner Elle Danzig (Ger) (Roi Danzig), who is responsible for nine winners from 10 foals of racing age, including multiple group winners and multiple Group 1-placed Elle Shadow (Ire) (Shamardal), and listed winners El Comodin (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) and Elle Gala (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

"She comes from a very strong German line," de Moussac said. "She's for a new client, and we don't know yet whether she'll race on next year or be bred. We'll have to discuss it, but she has very strong form."

Americana to Japan...

Japanese interests also entered the fray yesterday, with Shadai Farm signing for a pair of six-figure mares, headed by [lot 202](#), **Tres Rapide (Fr)** (Anabaa Blue {Fr}), for €420,000. The 8-year-old is a full-sister to the dual group winner and Group 1 Deutsches Derby-placed Tres Blue, as well as multiple group winner and Group 1-placed Tres Rock Danon (Fr) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). Tres Rapide is carrying to exciting young sire Rip Van Winkle (Ire). The operation also went to €300,000 for **Ana Americana (Fr)** (American Post) ([lot 97](#)), a listed-winning and group-placed daughter of the dual group winner and Group 1-placed Ana Marie (Fr) (Anabaa). The 7-year-old mare is carrying her fourth foal, by the first-season sire and G1 July Cup winner Mayson (GB).

"She has a good pedigree and race record, and we liked her conformation very much," said Naohiro Hosoda of lot 97, Racing Manager to Yoshida, who also added that a future mate had not yet been selected for the mare.

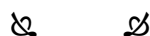

Foals to the Fore...

German sire Monsun (Ger) has been well-missed since his death last September, and his influence on the breed globally has been reinforced this year through Group 1 winners Novellist (Ire), Maxios (GB), Silasol (Ire), Estimate (Ire) and Fiorente (Ire), responsible for eight Group 1 wins between them. This year's foals represent his final crop, and there was fierce competition for the first of two catalogued for Arqana yesterday, including [lot 32](#), consigned by Ecurie des Monceaux. Out of German Group 3 winner Peaceful Love (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}) and a half-sister to Group 3-placed winner Fort Hastings (Ire) (Aragorn {Ire}), the filly was secured by Broadhurst Agency's Benoit Laurent for €185,000 to be the most expensive weanling through the ring during the first session. A March-born colt by Monsun from the draft of Haras de Grandcamp is set to go through the ring tomorrow as [lot 393](#).

The second-highest price for a youngster came midway through the session when Jamie Railton went to €170,000 for [lot 94](#), a filly by Sea the Stars (Ire) out of the Group 2-placed Alix Road (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), as a potential pinhooking prospect.

"She was a nice filly," said Railton of the March-born miss. "That would have been £140,000, so in keeping with what he expected to pay. It's a family on the move. She'll stay in France, and maybe come back here in August."

It was another daughter of Sea the Stars who lit up the board late in the session to become the third-highest priced foal of the day. [Lot 197](#)'s second dam is multiple Group 2 winner Zelding, the dam of lot 90, purchased earlier in the day by Philip Brown for €280,000. It is also the family of multiple group winners Beauty is Truth (Ire), Fire Lily (Ire) and The United States (Ire), and goes back to the prolific producer Mill Princess (Ire). Mandore International went to €160,000 to secure the January-born foal from the Coulonces Consignment.

"She's for a Chinese investor," confirmed Mandore's Meryl de Watrigant. "She's out of a good dam, and the 2-year-old out of the mare recently won for Marco Botti, and he thinks it's highly promising."

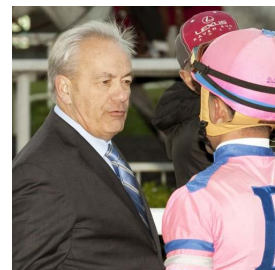

Broken Sword disappeared following a visually impressive debut victory in the Juan Gonzalez Memorial S. at Pleasanton last summer. She resurfaced with a close third in an optional claimer at Golden Gate Apr. 28, then was a bit of a disappointment in her next four when switched to turf, including a fifth-place finish in an \$80,000 optional tagger at Del Mar Aug. 21. Third in a grassy allowance at Golden Gate Oct. 26, she returned to the San Francisco synthetic with a sharp wire-to-wire tally in a \$25,000 optional tagger Nov. 10. Ridden aggressively by jockey Joel Rosario here, Broken Sword set an uncontested pace through fractions of :23.33 and :46.53, and was never threatened by the unlucky runner-up. "I didn't think we'd be out there on an easy lead like that," Hall of Famer Jerry Hollendorfer said. "I think [Fiftyshadesofhay] had some trouble at the break. That may have contributed to our win. When this filly broke her maiden, we thought she could be any kind of horse, then she didn't do what we wanted her to do right away. Now she is. Sometimes they just turn around."

A first-out winner over this strip in March, the gelding next found the winner's circle in a Belmont Park nursery June 8 before following up at the handicap level two weeks later. Spelled for the Australian winter, Ihtsahymn returned in the Oct. 19 Listed Belgravia S. at Ascot, but could manage only seventh, and he checked in only one position better in the Listed Fairetha S. there Nov. 9. What appeared in the G2 Western Australia Guineas Nov. 23 was a different horse, as Ihtsahymn came storming down the lane to win by a length and earned his first black-type score. Trainer Fred Kersey indicated after that effort that it was the added distance that helped his charge, and his theory appeared validated with yesterday's victory. Settling in fourth early under jockey Steve Parnham, Ihtsahymn hit the lead with 300 meters remaining and managed to hold off a late charge from defending race winner Luckygray, who did not find luck on his side yesterday, and was shuffled back to the rear of the field early. **Cont. p20**



It was the third victory in this race for Parnham. Kersely, who said he could take his charge to Melbourne next year, told Racenet.com.au: "I have got to say I was a little apprehensive about it, because it was a huge rise in class. I guess, at the end of the day, the weight made the difference [in the decision to run Ihtsahymn]. At the end of the day, [Luckygray] is a great horse and to head him off--even with a pull in the weights--is a great thrill."

Ihtsahymn is the second Group 1 winner for his sire, Ihtiram, best known as the sire of six-time Group 1 winner Miss Andretti (Aus).
