So I've got to tell you, I'm mad as hell. And I'm not going to take this any more.

This isn't the time for a measured response. This isn't the time for model rules. This isn't the time to shoot the messenger, and it's not a time for band-aids.

This is a time for a radical change of the way we do business. We cannot come at this with a pop bottle rocket. This is the time for shock and awe.

I have heard a lot of discussion over the past few days about the proper course of action. A lot of well-reasoned and well-intentioned people have talked about incremental change, and withdrawal times and best practices.

And while I think they all mean well, I also respectfully submit that they're falling short of what is needed. Way short.

These are baby steps. What is required right now is for tracks and owners to sit down and write our Declaration of Independence. We declare that we are going to start to conduct our business in a radically different way so that the issues raised in the PETA investigation are no longer on the table in American horse racing: the issues of people abusing their animals and their workers.

Racing cannot continue to simply react to another New York *Times* article every six months. Rather than continue to stick our finger in the dike one more time, we need a framework to build a business. We need to throw our bad practices in the trash and institute a system that will be the envy of the racing world. Nothing short of that will save the sport. In fact, anything short of it will doom it.

So today, I am proposing the following:

1. A new racing association is created, modeled after the world leader in racing integrity, Hong Kong. It also happens to be the world's most successful. As the old saying goes, you don't have to be the smartest kid in the class if you sit behind him. Conducting your business at this association is a privilege and not a right. Its principles tenets are as follows.

A. The association has the singular right to create, employ, enforce and adjudicate the best practices, just like Hong Kong, and just as the NFL, MLB and the NBA do in America. Chief among these best practices is the well-being of both the horses and the people caring for them. The employees make a living wage and are offered decent, acceptable housing. The horses are taken care of before, during and after their racing careers.

B. Let's end the discussion about 'therapeutic' medications to allow horses to race. All horses must compete free of medication on race day, as they do in most major racing jurisdictions in the world. Medication at other times, when needed, is administered in a controlled and sensible manner by track-employed veterinarians who have their best interests at heart. **Cont. p4**

C. The racing association owns the pharmacy, and all medications and procedures administered to horses are approved by the track and come only from this pharmacy.

D. Racing will be conducted on a limited, non-yearround basis. Less racing and more high-guality racing will be the principle.

E. Because racing here is a privilege, the association has the right to ban anyone they deem to be a detriment to the sport. We call this the Jeff Gural rule. If people don't do right on the association's grounds, they are no longer welcome there. If a trainer doesn't take care of his horses, or pay his employees fairly, he can go race somewhere else.

2. This new association should be NYRA's next chapter, or a visionary like Frank Stronach could go forward with it at Santa Anita and Gulfstream. New York is one logical starting place, and the money exists to do it right. While others may be invited to join in this new theory and to adopt the same standards and practices, this is not going to be a solution for all of American racing. Others may prefer to continue along the path they're on. We think the free market will prove we're right--that we have made a product that is defendable and sellable.

The racetracks that implement this model will prosper. This model will offer the American public what they have told us time and time again what they want: racing with integrity, without drugs, that you can believe in, and that you feel comfortable betting on. It will give those who participate a sport they can stand behind and be proud of.

For too long, American racing has been the have-nots in the worldwide discussion. People don't want to come race here, and increasingly, they don't want to come buy our bloodstock. And our response has been a pitiful under-reaction of hand-wringing.

We have a chance to vault to the top of the totem pole because we will organize ourselves better than anyone else.



Can't 'Miss' Proposition...

A maiden winner at second asking over the Saratoga turf Aug. 11, We Miss Artie was a disappointing sixth as the favorite in the GIII With Anticipation S. Aug. 29, but overcame a tough journey and a high draw to upset Keeneland's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity Oct. 5. Despite his early success on the grass, connections opted for a shot at the dirt in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 2, and he did not disgrace himself in seventh before getting a bit of a breather. We Miss Artie made his seasonal debut in the Gulfstream stakes named in honor of the Ramseys' champion and successful sire Kitten's Joy, going down by a head to Storming Inti (Stormy Atlantic) Jan. 19 and he was exiting a non-factor eighth behind Wildcat Red (D'wildcat) in the GII Fountain of Youth S. back on the main track Feb. 22.

Off to a bit of a hesitating start, We Miss Artie recovered to race in midpack as Battaglia Memorial S. winner Solitary Ranger (U S Ranger), Almost Famous (Unbridled's Song) and Harry's Holiday disputed things on the front end. A bit headstrong around that first turn, We Miss Artie was eased out into the clear by Velazquez and began to pick things up leaving the fiveeighths marker and was committed to a four-wide run around the second bend. As Almost Famous retreated, Coastline joined in three abreast and We Miss Artie rallied outside that one. Harry's Holiday and Coastline raced jointly into the final furlong with very little between them, but We Miss Artie kept plugging away and got his nose down on the wire.

Heart Steeler bounced back from a dull effort on seasonal debut in the local GIII Hurricane Bertie S. Feb. 9 to return to her solid late-2013 form and cap a Marty Wolfson exacta. Transferred from Bob Baffert to Wolfson last fall, the chestnut romped by 10 1/2 lengths in her first try for the new barn in a local optional claimer Oct. 6. She was second in Calder's Bold World H. Nov. 2, and finished off the season with a narrow victory in the GIII Sugar Swirl S. going a furlong shorter here Dec. 14. Hard held to stalk from third while out in the clear, the chestnut asserted three deep at the quarter pole and bounded clear from there to win by daylight. Favored Centrique (Malibu Moon), also representing Wolfson, could not overcome a tardy start and settled for fifth. **Cont. p6**

"I had a perfect trip," winning pilot Joel Rosario commented. "It went exactly like Marty said. I was going to be laying probably third behind the speed and she did everything right. They were going good up front. I don't know how fast they were going, but my horse was always there for me and I'm glad we got the money."

Wolfson added, "I really like this filly," Wolfson said. "I think she just wasn't right in her last race. Since that race, she's been like she was before the Sugar Swirl. I really thought she would beat Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band) that day--that's how good I thought she was. She just wasn't herself. Joel gave her a perfect ride. I told him to just throw out her last race, because she's the best of all the fillies I have. Her last race baffled me. My Pal Chrisy finished up really well, too."

Fire With Fire and stablemate Lucayan raced in tandem every step of the way and crossed the wire in that order to complete a Neil Drysdale-trained exacta in a race marred by a catastrophic injury suffered by oddson Vagabond Shoes (Ire) (Beat Hollow {GB}). A twotime winner on the turf when trained by Bill Mott for WinStar Farm early in his career, the bay failed to hit the winner's circle in his first 14 tries for this barn, but was able to snap that skid when wiring the field in the grassy Joseph T. Grace H. at the Sonoma County Fair last August. Runner-up to Blueskiesnrainbows (English Channel) in the Hinds H. at the Fairplex Sept. 22, he was put up to the win in Fresno's Bull Dog H. to continue his run of good luck on the fair circuit Oct. 13. Third to Summer Hit in the GIII Berkeley H. over the Golden Gate Tapeta Nov. 29, he was fifth against much tougher locals in this track's GII San Gabriel S. Jan. 4, but was back in the win column off a narrow victory in the Cotton Fitzsimmons H. at Turf Paradise Jan. 18. It was back to front-winning ways for Fire With Fire, third in this event last year, and he set an even pace while kept company by Lucayan, a last-out third to Vagabond Shoes in the GII San Marcos S. Feb. 8. Temeraine settled midfield ahead of Niagara Falls (Giant's Causeway) with Vagabond Shoes bringing up the rear. There was no significant change in the proceedings until the race favorite was pulled up out of the race by Victor Espinoza midway up the backstretch. But up front, Fire With Fire was popped the question turning for home and refused to allow Lucayan by in the run to the wire. "We were expecting him to be on the lead today," admitted Drysdale, winning this for the sixth time. "We know he has a short run so I asked Tyler to leave it as long as possible [before making his move in the stretch] which he did. I want to take it step by step and we'll wait to see where we go next with him."

Vagabond Shoes Euthanized...

Hronis Racing's Vagabond Shoes took an apparent bad step on the backstretch of the San Luis Rey and was subsequently euthanized. The chestnut amassed an eclectic race record, winning three times in Spain before becoming a multiple Group 3 winner in France. He also raced at the international meeting in Istanbul in 2011 and participated in the 2012 Dubai International Racing Carnival. He joined the Sadler barn a little over a year ago, winning the GII Del Mar H. last August between runner-up efforts in the GI Eddie Read S. and the GII John Henry Turf Championship. A good fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, Vagabond Shoes annexed the GII San Marcos S. in his lone prior start in 2014. He won eight of 29 starts overall for \$665,497.

When asked if the win was particularly sweet because it came over his brother, Jose Ortiz replied, "No. He's another jockey. It was special I won the stakes." Irad quipped, "One day I beat him; the next day he beats me. I hope he pays for dinner."





"This is right up there with my biggest thrills in racing," trainer Roger James told AAP. "Look at the past winners of this race, look at the field she's struck today. It's been billed as the race to determine the best horse in Australia." Silent Achiever will try to go one better in the BMW in two weeks before the G1 QE II or the G1 Sydney Cup, both contested Apr. 19.

WINCHELL HORSES TO REMAIN W/ ASMUSSEN

Winchell Thoroughbreds will be keeping their entire string of horses, including Tapit-sired 3-year-old stars Tapiture and Untapable with trainer Steve Asmussen, Winchell Thoroughbreds Racing Manager David Fiske, confirmed Saturday. "We didn't think it was in our best interest to take the Oaks favorite and the second choice [co-second at the Wynn] for the Derby out of an environment in which they have thrived for the past year, five weeks before the most important races of their lives," Fiske commented. "Our biggest concern at the moment is the horses going to the Oaks and the Derby." Tapiture finished second when last seen in a roughly run GII Rebel S. Mar. 15 and sits seventh on the Kentucky Derby points leaderboard with 42 points. He posted back to back wins in the GIII Southwest S. and the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Untapable stands atop the GI Kentucky Oaks leaderboard tied at 60 points with Kaleem Shah's Awesome Baby (Awesome Again). She was victorious most recently in the GIII Rachel Alexandra S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 22. The bay also collected a victory in Churchill's GII Pocahontas S. last September. Fiske concluded that long-term plans for Winchell Thoroughbred's string have not yet been discussed. "No, there are a lot of moving parts going on, so we will wait and see what happens," he stated.

Cairo Prince (Pioneerof the Nile), likely favorite in the Mar. 29 GI Florida Derby, breezed a half-mile in :50.90 at Palm Meadows yesterday. "He went great," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin commented. "I got him galloping out [five furlongs] in 1:00 2/5," Sherman said. "He was not wearing blinkers, because I didn't want him to work too fast, but he'll wear them in the Santa Anita Derby. He'll have one more half-mile work Saturday and ship to Santa Anita five daysbefore the race."

GII Robert B. Lewis S. hero Candy Boy worked six furlongs in company at Santa Anita in 1:12.80. Gary Stevens, who will be looking to add to his record nine Santa Anita Derby wins with Candy Boy, piloted the colt through the workout. Stevens called the work "solid."

"He'll have one more work before the Santa Anita" Derby and we're ready to go," trainer John Sadler said. CLICK HERE TO SHARE THIS STORY

GRAND OAKS LOOKS TO DOUBLE UP

Brad Grady's Grand Oaks, with the help of horse flesh expert Bobby Dodd, enter into Monday's Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale with a full head of steam, after a successful OBS March Sale.

Grady is relatively new to the racing game. The Grandview, Texas businessman is a partner in Grady Reynolds, LLC, which leases equipment to gas and oil fields. He's recently turned his interest to horse racing and purchased Grand Oaks in December 2012. The 415-acre farm in Northwest Marion County boasts a seven-furlong training track, 128 stalls and a swimming facility.

Consigner Bobby Dodd adds the equine experience to the outfit. Dodd, who had been partners with Tony Bowling for almost three decades, has worked with Grady on picking young horses.

"We're not really doing anything different, it's all basically the same," Dodd said of his purchasing approach. "Since I've been involved with Brad Grady we've just been buying a little bit better horses, which make them a little more expensive yearlings. We just buy horses that are big, strong athletic-looking horses who are structurally sound and as much fashionable pediaree as we can afford."

Dodd explained that the interests of Grand Oaks lie in both re-selling yearlings and 2-year-olds, as well as in racing.

"We're going to buy some yearlings and pinhook some horses and Brad is going to do some racing-that's pretty much our goals--just to pinhook and make some money and race some horses, " Dodd said. "We bought a few weanlings and we're either going to offer them as yearlings or keep them and train them and sell them as 2-year-olds."

Dodd is understandably optimistic about the Fasig Florida Sale. Grand Oaks sold three horses at the OBS March Sale, including a Malibu Moon colt, which they purchased for \$200,000 as a yearling at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga and resold to Coolmore for \$1.3 million, the third highest price at OBSMAR.

A Majestic Warrior filly, who they purchased for \$80,000 at Keeneland September will sell as hip 10. She breezed a furlong in :10 2/5 Friday.

Hip 52, a son of leading sire Tapit, is the second foal out of Wild Chant (War Chant), who is out of graded stakes winner Fun House (Prized) and is a half-sibling to Grade I winning millionaire Paddy O'Prado (El Prado {Ire}) and GI Kentucky Oaks hopeful and multiple graded stakes winner Untapable (Tapit). The \$270,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga RNA worked in :10 2/5 as well. Cont. p17

<u>Hip 88</u>, a Speightstown colt they picked up for \$120,000 at Keeneland September, has received a major catalogue update since the last time he went through the ring. The third foal out of dam Dynamite Eyes (Dynaformer) is a half-sibling to General A Rod (Roman Ruler), who won the Gulfstream Park Derby at the beginning of the year and stamped himself as a serious GI Kentucky Derby contender when he finished a game second in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 22. Hip 88 covered a furlong in :10 flat.

"We've got three really nice horses, and we feel confident that we'll get them sold for a fair price," Dodd explained. "I don't know that I have a million-dollar horse, but I've got three really nice horses, so I feel pretty confident that it will go well."



CARRIE BROGDEN. MACHMER HALL:

Why, in my personal opinion, we need a Federal racing commission appointed: If I had not had the past year I have had with the success of the racehorses on the track and in the sales ring off Machmer Hall to give me a voice. If I had not sat through countless Vision 20/20 group meetings to understand the terrible structure/regulation of 30 + state jurisdictions and why nothing ever gets changed in horse racing. If I had not married a man from Australia, where racing is beloved and a culture of drugs is not rampant, and where most of the top horses take the Summer off. If I had not owned and raced a filly in Ireland that needed her stifle injected and had a 10 minute chat with the trainer about her being unable to race for six weeks by the rules of racing there. If I had not sat here watching Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and Louisiana all in the process of chopping purses and breeders' awards via the legislature without any reaction from a united racing body. If I was not watching the battles of Calder and Gulfstream along with reading articles on racetracks being run into the ground by companies that are only in it for shareholder profits. If I had not seen fillies I have claimed off the track barely able to hobble off the van two days after racing. If I had not been raised by two veterinarians. If I did not love horses with every ounce of my body and being, I may not have come to this conclusion. We need to have a commission with teeth and power that can supercede the all the red tape and inefficiencies of US racing being run like 30 + different states with no unified voice. Horse racing can return to its past glory and go mainstream again like it is in so many other countries around the world.

It can be done with competent leadership at a Federal level that has the ability to actually make and enforce changes, not talk. In the end, our sport has the most powerful, beloved draw of all: the HORSE.

SANDRA K. SNIDER:

While there is no doubt that the recent accusations by PETA have given racing an unwelcome black eye, I am even more distressed by the number of people who seem to have already convicted trainer Steve Asmussen. It looks like the lynch ropes have been taken off the closet shelf and uncoiled, ready to be settled around his neck. But hold on a minute. In this country, isn't the accused still entitled to the presumption of innocence?

As for the purported proof, this is PETA we're talking about, people! It would hardly be the first time that PETA has invented or exaggerated charges of animal cruelty. I can remember when PETA attacked the treatment of rodeo bucking horses and put forth a particularly ludicrous claim which only the most credulous person could entertain for more than a moment.

Let's hope that a good forensics scientist will have an opportunity to examine PETA's tapes. Personally, I'm willing to bet dollars to donuts (I'll take chocolate, please) that the tapes can be proven to have been doctored. But even if the case against Steve Asmussen ultimately collapses, that outcome could not possibly undo the damage already done to his reputation. His name has been removed from this year's ballot for the Hall of Fame, and there is an imminent danger of defection by some of his major clients. Considering the momentous consequences of such premature reactions, it seems to me that the very least we all should do is to postpone the pronouncement of a negative verdict until after both sides have been heard.

I am "just a fan"--as detestable as I find that phrase--who cannot present the credentials of, say, a Bill Casner, for whom I have the utmost respect. But I am a die-hard, and thanks to StableAlert, I have noticed more than once that Steve Asmussen usually has enough space in his barn for at least one older gelding whose best days are clearly behind him. I have also seen Asmussen lose one of these warriors in a low-level claiming race and turn right around and claim the horse back in its next start. I can't read the man's mind, of course, and I might be mistaken, but I deliberately choose to believe that his motives have nothing to do with greed but everything to do with affection and respect.

Is this a trainer who would fail to treat a GOOD horse properly? I think not. Necktie party? No thank you.

Time will tell whether my judgment is correct or not, but, in the meantime, I am firmly determined to afford Mr. Asmussen every benefit of the doubt. I fervently hope that I do not stand alone in this resolve.

Kind of scary that I'm still somehow showing a slight loss in this thing after picking three winners, and having another three hit the board, but still enjoying bragging rights over the stretch-running DiDonato for now.

GIII Sunland Derby - I really saw a ton of potential in Garen following his fourth-place finish going 5 1/2 furlongs at second asking at Santa Anita Jan. 18 (TDN Stable Mail Blog). After outdueling the very promising Pimpernel (Elusive Quality-Xtra Heat) through scorching early fractions that day, he had the lead in the stretch before getting late to finish a close fourth. Finally stretched to a route in his third attempt, the half-brother to Horse of the Year Invasor (Arg) was allowed an easy early lead in a five-horse field and graduated for fun Feb. 17. Trained by the always dangerous Peter Miller, the \$235k BARMAY graduate will have to deal with plenty of early pressure here--including Chitu & Tanzanite Cat--but the price should make it worth the while to see if he can work out the proper trip while negotiating an extra sixteenth of a mile. Jockey Victor Espinoza was able to slow him down through a half mile in :48 3/5 last time, so it's not completely crazy to think that he can be rated and allow some of the others do the heavy lifting despite being drawn along the inside. The Rockingham Ranch colorbearer continues to work well at Miller's San Luis Rey base, most recently completing four furlongs in a bullet :47 4/5 Mar. 18. He can really make some noise in this wide-open affair with another leap forward. Selection: #2 Garen (10-1).

BRIAN DIDONATO: *GIII Spiral S. -* Big Bazinga wasn't the worst fifth ever at 18-1 with a weird trip. I'm pretty certain we didn't see the Derby winner there.

GIII Sunland Derby - There sure is plenty of speed signed on here-maybe we'll see something like that ridiculous speed duel two years ago. At least one of the two Bafferts has to be up close, along with Tanzanite Cat, Global Strike and Garen. Commissioner is the obvious off-the-pace choice--his victory over Top Billing stacks up well, and he did get stuck trying to close over the biased Gulfstream surface last time in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Still, he probably should have done better than sixth, and there's another solid closer who will be a much bigger price. I toyed with taking **Bourbonize** last time in the GIII Southwest S., and he didn't run all that badly considering. Marooned out in the 12 hole, the dark bay gave the rest of his competition a head start early as his rider focused more on guiding him to the rail first time past the stands. Bourbonize saved plenty of ground thereafter, but it feels like he was just left with too much to do in the lane. Winner Tapiture had already blown the race apart when Bourbonize was asked for his run, and he was really the only closer making any headway late. He finished sixth, beaten 11 3/4 lengths, but was only about 1 1/2 lengths behind Ride On Curlin, who returned in last week's GII Rebel S. to finish much closer to Tapiture while improving on his speed figure significantly. Bourbonize was two-for-two prior to that, with a solid Churchill maiden score Nov. 30 before a one-mile Oaklawn allowance victory in the slop Jan. 10. Just one race before the Southwest, Bourbonize was flattered when the runner-up from his allowance Sheltowee's Boy returned to win before running a far-fromdisgraced fifth in the Rebel. Bourbonize also appears to be training very well leading up to this--he has picked up the pace in his last two drills and enters off a Mar. 16 four-furlong bullet in 1:01.60 in Hot Springs. I'm not entirely sold on his pedigree for nine panels or more (his dam did win twice going 5 1/2 furlongs at Sunland though!), but Bourbonize is definitely worth the gamble here.
