





FASIG FLORIDA SALE TODAY

The juvenile sales season makes its third stop of the year today in Williston with the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale. After a two-year sojourn at Palm Meadows Training Center, the auction



will be held for the first time at Frank Stronach's Adena Springs South.

"We're optimistic," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "You always worry. If you don't have pre-game Fasig-Tipton Photo jitters before a horse

sale, vou shouldn't be

in the horse sale business. But we're enthusiastic. We couldn't have asked to have the table set any better than it is right now."

The Florida sale comes in the wake of a strong renewal of the Barretts March sale and a recordbreaking OBS March sale. Barretts registered a 23.5% increase in average, while the median was up 12.5% and the sale produced its first million-dollar horse in seven years. The OBS sale produced three seven-figure juveniles, while the average was up 22.7% to a record \$190,997 and the median rose 10% to another record, \$137,500.

During last year's Florida sale, 136 juveniles were catalogued, while 78 horses were offered and 46 sold for \$17,725,000. The average of \$385,326 was up 20.3% from 2012, while the median was up 31.9% to \$300,000.

This year's catalogue is slightly larger than the 2013 version. From a catalogue of 157 head, 40 had been withdrawn by Sunday afternoon.

"We've gotten a little feedback from some of our customers," explained Browning. "They hoped to have a little bit more variety and a few more choices, so we are happy to have 20 additional offerings--about a 15% larger catalogue."

Despite the increase, consignors acknowledged the boutique sales attract a smaller buying bench. Cont. p3

BAFFERT EXACTA AT SUNLAND

Hall of Famer Bob Baffert took home his secondconsecutive GIII Sunland Derby trophy Sunday and swept the exacta for good measure. Tanma Corporation's Chitu (Henny Hughes) was knocked down

to slight 9-5 favoritism over 2-1 stablemate Midnight Hawk (Midnight Hawk), and the public had it exactly right as the former clawed back the advantage from his familiar foe in the stretch to post a 2 1/4-length tally. Florida invader Commissioner (A.P. Indy) completed the trifecta while well back of the top two. Avoiding some bumping

among the middle gate starters, Team Baffert took up stalking spots early with Chitu pressing from second and Midnight Hawk not far behind while three deep. The pair asserted for command midway on the turn, with the keen Midnight Hawk putting his head in front at the guarter pole. Martin Garcia upshifted on Chitu with the use of some hard left-handers, and received the response he was looking for. The two colts appeared to brush several times in the stretch, but Chitu leveled off well and galloped out clear of his stablemate. "Right from the beginning I was happy with how they handled the paddock," said Baffert's assistant trainer Jim Barnes. "They went through the post parade well, and the break went well. It went just how I planned it... and it was just a matter of whether they'd get the distance or not. They certainly did." Cont. p6

"I think there's a lot of interest in guality stock," said consignor Niall Brennan. "I still don't think we've got a huge depth of buyers in these select sales--we don't have the depth of buyers to move all the horses. We'll see that change at the OBS April sale, I hope. Last year there were a tremendous amount of people--that's where they all came to one-stop shop for every budget and they could find what they wanted. That's what moves horses and makes a great sale. These select sales are still very much top-ended looking for quality stock and that's the mindset the buyers have, so anything less than that gets pushed to the side."

Still, with two sales already in the record books, consignors have noticed a vigorous demand for horses.

"We've gone through two sales and both sales have been great," reported Dean De Renzo. "We've sold the majority of our horses. We've only bought back one horse and we've offered 15 for sale."

De Renzo was also a fan of sale's expected one-year stopover at the idyllic Adena Springs facility.

"We knew that Mr. Stronach puts an amazing amount of effort into building his racetracks, so we were pretty confident in the track and that's what is really important to us. We have a good surface to be able to show our horses over and when they leave here they are as good as when we started."

Activity at the sales barn this weekend has been steady, if not overwhelming.

"It was quite busy yesterday," Brennan said. "It seemed quiet this morning, but that wouldn't be a surprise. I think it's an easy set-up to get around here and it's very nice and relaxing for everybody."

Consignor Eddie Woods said, "The traffic has been reasonably good without being outrageous. You always like to see a bit more, but it's been steady and we've got another day to go."

Bidding at the Florida sale begins Monday at noon.



He has all the things that you'd want in a horse to stay sound. Pedigree-wise, he's everything you would ever need. We're very lucky to have him. We've been waiting for this day--to be able to show a horse like him--because he's been amazing since we started putting tack on him."

"He is the kind of horse you get excited about all winter watching him train," Al Pike offered. "He's such a beautiful mover and just loves to do his job. We think he's special. I was excited that a horse who looks like he could run all day could be that quick with that turn of foot. We're very exited about him. He's been very popular."

This bay colt shared the :9 4/5 bullet on Friday. A half-brother to Canadian champions Biofuel (Stormin Fever) and Tu Endie Wei (Johar), he was purchased by Shane Ryan's Castleton Lyons for \$285,000 as Keeneland September last year. "This is a horse that, from the moment we saw him in September, we absolutely loved him," said consignor Ciaran Dunne. "He's out of an Indian Charlie mare and he looks like the good Indian Charlies look. Obviously, the mare produces wonderful stock. He's by a first-season sire who was really really fast, but this horse has a license to go two turns when you look at him physically. For a horse as big as he is, he stands 16.2, to have performed like he did on the racetrack is fairly remarkable. He's a very sound horse. He's a joy to be around. I would have to think he's as close to being the complete package as you would want."

Chitu earned a solid 92 Beyer Speed Figure when breaking his maiden first up sprinting over the Hollywood synthetic Dec. 7, and paired up that number 20 days later going the same distance at Santa Anita. He was coming off a second-place effort in the GII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 8, where he finished one spot ahead of Midnight Hawk. Midnight Hawk, a "TDN Rising Star" , took the GIII Sham S. in January and was a distant second to California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) last time in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 8.

The winner's dam won her lone career start over 1 1/4 miles in Britain, and is out of Ocean Queen, winner of the GIII Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup Derby going nine furlongs on the lawn. Chitu is also related to MGSW Dance Parade (Gone West), responsible for last year's G1 St Leger S. winner Leading Light (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Tanma Corporation is the nom de course of Susan Chu, whose colors were carried to victory by Bob Baffert trainee Super Ninety Nine (Pulpit) in last year's GIII Southwest S.

Trainer Bob Baffert continued his complete domination of this event, winning his sixth renewal in the past eight runnings with streaking **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** Awesome Baby. A sharp debut winner at Del Mar in August, Awesome Baby failed to land a blow in either the GI Del Mar

Debutante S. or GI Chandelier S. at Santa Anita before hitting the bench. She returned successfully in the 6 1/2-panel GII Santa Ysabel S. in Arcadia Jan. 4, and proved she could carry her speed going 8 1/2 panels over that venue's wet/fast surface in the GII Santa Ysabel S. Mar. 1. Straight to the front here as an overwhelming choice, the dark bay was never seriously threatened as she upped her win streak to three. "She kind of scrambled just a bit leaving there--we

got ping-ponged in between just for a jump or two," noted pilot Mike Smith. "But she went on to the lead, got into a high cruising speed like she does--that's her game--and from there we had them at bay."

Baffert's past winners here have gone on to significant success at the highest level. Last year's track record-breaking victoress Midnight Lucky (Midnight Lute) annexed the GI Acorn S. two starts later, while 2011 winner Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro) went on to take the GI Kentucky Oaks after a 25-length romp at Sunland. Both Gabby's Golden Gal (Medaglia d'Oro) (2009) and Tough Tiz's Sis (Tiznow) (2007) later became multiple Grade I winners.

THE COOTIE FACTOR

Over the past few seasons, as racing has contracted, much discussion has taken place among the game's stakeholders as to which of these entities is most necessary for survival of the sport.

Horseplayers think that without them the game cannot exist.

Racetracks say that without a playing field there can be no contest.

Owners are convinced that without horses, there can be no races.

Horses themselves, for reasons obvious even to those groups mentioned above, have not been asked for their opinion. But I suspect that if they had been and were able to answer, they would tell all of the groups cited to go to hell and let the animals conduct their own impromptu contests in a field away from the madding crowds, bright lights, unnatural noises and nasty smells. **Cont. p12**

But, for racing to exist, the owner is the key. Hold your horses cowpokes! I am not saying that racing does not need gamblers and racetracks to provide a viable sport. It does. But, without horses provided by owners, there can be no sport.

Somebody once told me that Will Farish and Dinny Phipps didn't give a hoot about the game's health (which, by the way, is totally preposterous) and that they would just as soon conduct match races in a field on one of their vast estates.

The point was that these two gentlemen cared only about was finding out which one of their steeds was faster than the other guy's horse.

Although the comment was made to belittle Farish and Phipps, it did in fact serve to point out something that should be obvious to everyone connected with racing, which is that the essence of our enterprise is simply to find out which man or woman's horse can beat the other person's horse.

And in this regard, horse racing on one level or another can only take place if owners have an interest in finding out which horse is fastest and are willing to pit their horses against each other in a contest of speed.

Where this contest takes place and who, other than the owners, decides to gamble on the outcome is of no relevance to these chaps.

The point of this excessive wordage is that owners are the only essential element in providing a contest because they own the horse. Irrespective of the level at which contests of sport are held, it should be fairly obvious to all of the stakeholders that unless owners are on board, the sport suffers greatly.

The game needs owners.

Much effort over the past decade or so has been devoted to identifying, prospecting, developing and nurturing new owners and providing them with reasons to participate in the sport.

The advent last week of PETA's report on the operation of Steve Asmussen has our game in peril because for the first time there is video evidence for all to see of how sordid, uncaring, unethical and illegal the caretakers of our horses can be.

It is one thing to hear gossip, read articles and op-ed pieces, hear chit-chat; but it is entirely another matter when one is confronted so rudely with the evidence in moving film. If a picture is worth a thousand words, a video must be worth billions of them.

When all is said and done, I fear the aftermath of the PETA video presentation will be the most severe removal of a layer of the once prestigious patina under which our sport thrived for so many years.

Owners that are interested in playing the game on a high level do so for several reasons, but the underlying commonality is a desire for competition in an arena witnessed by fans and peers alike that offers the owners a considerable amount of prestige.

Once a game is found to be covered in scuzz instead of quality, the desire for further participation by owners is going to evaporate. **Cont. p13**

Racetracks and racing commissions need to immediately institute a racetrack pharmacy that allows control over every drug given to every horse.

The group pushing for medication reform needs to include Lasix among the drugs banned on race day and stop pandering to horsemen and racetracks just for the sake of passing a watered down plan that does not fully address the issue. Stop patting yourself on the back and be real.

Racetracks need to get serious about catering to horsemen they know damn well are taking an edge.

Unless racing's institutions put these plans into action instead of jawboning about them, horseplayers will go elsewhere and owners interested in the sporting aspects of the game will leave it behind.

The HPBA and the AAEP are the ones that need to lead this charge. The HPBA can condemn what needs to be condemned and individual horsemen can then join them in support of cleaning up their act. The vets need to put the horse first and their pocket books second.

OWNER, BREEDER, FORMER TRAINER JOHN LIVIAKIS:

To My Dearest friends at PETA and in the Racing World, If I may presumptuously say so, I feel particularly qualified to offer my perspective on the recent

qualified to offer my perspective on the recent Investigative/undercover discoveries making the headlines. I've been a PETA and PCRM member for several decades as well as a vegan for 40 years. I'd like to consider myself a close friend to the equine species. My respect, love, and connection with these sensitive, dignified, and magnificent beings couldn't be any higher. I have also passionately been part of the human/horse competition/sports world for 37 years. Philosophically, the purist in me struggles with the idea of human meddling with any species (horses, dogs, etc.). Should the modern human life be separated from horses, dogs, etc., who would exist in their natural environment without human interaction/meddling? I doubt PETA or any loving dog owners would recommend shipping off all dogs into the prairies, away from their adopted human buddy/caretaker.

Humans have always been excited by competing in a race against each other or in tandem with horses. It's presumptuous to assume the horse doesn't also find racing against each other exciting. In fact, riders know very well the competitive juices of the equine. I find it quite stimulating to prepare the professional athlete (equine or human), including the science of anaerobic and aerobic conditioning, lameness diagnostics and therapeutics, ergogenics, nutrition and mental preparations; also, scouting for young star prospects by analyzing genetics, conformation, gate, etc.; finally, managing the athlete's career in making decisions on racing classification and timing between races, and who to keep or to move on or retire. The full package at its worst can be like your investigation discovery (human error in judgment and foolishness) and at its best can be glorious.

Actually, it can potentially reach the height of most anything I've experienced in my life. Perspectives from both sides are skewed with myopic bias. I invite PETA friends of mine (Ingrid Newkirk, etc.) to come meet trainer Melody Conlon and see our team of humans and equines.

Nevertheless, even with that, PETA executives and employees will never feel the amazing elements that only lifelong horse people truly know. Nor can they feel financial pressure on owners and trainers to have to care for these beings. It is so expensive and often "breaks" people.

Yet, PETA offers a profound "checks and balances" to keep humans in line and make sure we evolve to the "high road" in our thoughts and actions. PETA is the voice for the various beings that can't speak for themselves.

Yet, I have slowed down on my once heavy donations to PETA because in my view they need to focus their work on by far the most important of causes: the meat industry. The ripple effects of meat eating (human health, climate change, and other environmental impacts, world starvation, and of course barbaric cruelty) dwarf the nitpicking on Thoroughbred care. As an "insider" for much of my life, I would rank the human in its care of the equine a B- overall--some aspects an F (like the horse slaughter fools), and some aspects an A + . The majority of people in the equine related businesses really truly love the horse and treat them as royalty. Let's continue to evolve the sport to the highest levels but not misrepresent the whole picture.

FRANK E. MACAULEY, WTL EQUINE INTERNATIONAL:

Recognizing, that in my life time, the Thoroughbred Industry has done a very poor job of regulating itself, I find Mr. Weisbord's suggestion for a new racing association provided with the enforcement "teeth" necessary for proper regulation to be a well thought out, comprehensive and a viable solution.

I, for one, don't believe that Federal Regulation will provide the oversight that is required because, as history has taught us, the Federal Government does not have an admirable record of enforcement.

STEPHANIE PRESTON:

I applaud the letter published by Mr. Weisbord and his stance on issues facing American racing. Every point he makes is right on target. I am enthusiastic to share with your audience that we have just returned from our second trip to Hong Kong for the purpose of collaborating with the Hong Kong Jockey Club to publish scientific studies on racing soundness. We have observed every aspect of controlled veterinary care and treatment of their horses, most of which make at least 18 lifetime starts and never train or race on Lasix (unpublished data presently under peer review for publication). In Hong Kong, if a trainer requests a joint injection it must be approved by one of six veterinarians employed by the HKJC. If the veterinarian determines the request does not meet the strict guidelines established, the horse will not be injected. Records of every detail of training, racing, and veterinary treatment is not only maintained by the Department of Veterinary Clinical Services, but is also provided to bettors. On Mar. 16, 2014 we attended the Hong Kong Derby at Sha Tin Racecourse where the handle for the day exceeded \$HK 1 billion (approx. US\$129 million). Clearly, this system is good for racing.

ROB WHITELEY:

Words from beyond the veil... It's now or never. Forget the horseshit. Clean up your own shit. The Feds are coming.



LINDA BERD:

I am and have been 'mad as hell' and disappointed as hell. I worked in the Thoroughbred industry for almost 30 years because I love and admire horses, racing and Thoroughbreds in particular. I've worked at racetracks and (more often) Thoroughbred sales, as well as foaling on farms. This article says it all. It's out there, simply put, clear and makes total sense.

This is exactly what needs to be done here in the U.S. No halfway measures... an all-encompassing, national rewriting and restructuring of the racing industry in all its aspects (particularly medication) modeled on Hong Kong racing. I especially agree that the industry needs to take responsibility for the welfare and after-racing well being/care of these horses, without whom there is no racing industry.

That makes it simple and readily able to be fairly quickly adopted. All we need are people in all the industry to understand the magnitude of the problem and that now is the time.

MICHAEL POHLMAN:

I couldn't agree more with your publisher.

I am a player and have been for years. I have considered investing in a Thoroughbred or two, but in watching the trends of the sport over the years, would not begin to get more involved. The risk is too high and the reputation I would get would carry nothing but repudiation. I'm not that aware of the conditions for those working in the sport, but since it is all about money, I'll trust the conditions are deplorable for the same reason the horses are nothing more than a depreciable asset that once a return is extracted is scrapped by most owners. Trainers are paid to win at any cost, so what can be expected other than the current situation?

As just a player, when betting, I have no idea what the true condition of a horse is. I don't trust the system. At the same time, there are too many tracks, running too many races such that most races are diluted and all you can do is decide which 3-5, 9-5 or 2-1 (three legitimate horses a race) is going to win out of the six or seven running. Every card is full of maiden claimers and non-winners of two lifetime after running 15-20 races. The enjoyment of handicapping with a reasonable chance of getting a 6-1 or better to win is limited to two or three opportunities per day. The rest of the day is boring and if I wasn't a longtime fan I would drop this and stop wasting my time. I can't get anyone else I know interested in participating either.

I consider myself part of the game. As in all sports, no one makes money without the fans, and without fans who wager, no one will invest unless looking for a write off (not a bright future). Fair treatment of the horse, the employees, etc. will keep people feeling ok about being involved. I think this is critical and your are spot on.

But make sure the remedy includes making a fundamental part of the sport, wagering, an exciting thing in order to keep people involved once they get involved. (P.S. More gimmick bets won't work.)

The Cape Thoroughbred Sales March Yearling Sale concluded in Cape Town yesterday. The topper came late in the session as lot 278 Span Die Seile (Captain Al {Saf}) sold to Mayfair Speculators for R1,500,000 (US\$137,696.82). The bay miss was consigned by Klawervlei Stud (agent). Altogether, the two-day sale grossed R38,545,000 (US\$3,536,798.87), with an average of R144,906 (US\$13,296.21). Klawervlei Stud was the leading consignor with R6,960,000 (US\$638,631.77) for 33 lots. Mayfair Speculators took the top spot for buyers, spending R8,040,000 (US\$737,732.48) for 23 individuals. 


