





WHO WILL THE SLIPPER FIT?

Rosehill Gardens in Sydney, Australia tomorrow hosts the 31st running of the A\$3.5-million (US\$3,245,900) G1 Golden Slipper, the world's richest juvenile race and one of the most important contests on the Australian calendar. While it is the G1 Melbourne Cup that draws the eyes and captures the imagination of the world, it is

the Golden Slipper that has defined breeding excellence in the country, its roll of honor including such influential sires as Flying Spur (Aus), Canny Lad (Aus), Stratum (Aus), Marauding (NZ) and Rory's Jester (Aus). More recent winners include promising young sire Sebring (Aus),

world champion sophomore sprinter Sepoy (Aus), and 2-year-old Triple Crown champion Pierro (Aus).

Fillies have won the race 13 times, including two of the last four runnings, and Darley homebred Earthquake (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) is the heavy favorite to add her name to that list. The unbeaten winner of the G1 Blue Diamond S. Feb. 22, Earthquake overcame a seemingly impossible post 15 of 16 to take Victoria's most important juvenile race, and she will have to display similar heroics if she is to emulate the accomplishments of Darley's Sepoy, who took both races in 2011. Earthquake drew post 13 of 17 for this assignment, but will likely move into 12 should the also eligible Scratch Me Lucky (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) be forced to withdraw. Earthquake warmed up for the Slipper with another effortless, wire-to-wire score in the G2 Reisling S. Mar. 22. The imposing bay may have given her connections a few grey hairs when running a slight temperature earlier in the week, but after a postponed gallop Wednesday, jockey Kerrin McEvoy expressed confidence in his charge's fitness: "She worked over 800 meters sprinting up the last 400 and she was nice and sharp," McEvoy told Racenet.com.au. "She worked with a mate and I was really happy." A second Golden Slipper victory for Earthquake's trainer Peter Snowden would provide a storybook ending to the conditioner's six-year run as head trainer for Darley Australia. Snowden and his son Paul will wrap up their tenure with Sheikh Mohammed's operation and start their own public training operation at the end of the month. Golden Slipper Preview cont. p3

SKY MESA COLT SETS NEW MARK AT KEEAPR

Aided by early morning rains that tightened the Polytrack and by a considerable tailwind, the under-tack show for Monday's Keeneland 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale vielded fast times vesterday in Lexington. In total, a dozen horses came in under the :10 mark, including a New York-bred Sky Mesa colt from the consignment of Sequel Bloodstock who earned the bullet for a one-

eighth breeze with an eyecatching :9 2/5 work-believed to be the fastest-ever work at an under-tack preview. The colt, out of MGSP Alfonsina (Grand Slam), hails from the family of Spain (Thunder Gulch) and is cataloged as Hip 69. Several clockers caught the sleek bay gallop out a quarter mile in

under :20. "He's an interesting story, in that I trained his mother a long time ago at OBS, before it went to synthetic," said consignor Becky Thomas, who operates Sequel Bloodstock. "She was a :10 flat horse, which at OBS then was very fast. But she was very crooked and we couldn't get her sold for her owner/breeder, my friend Michael Mandara. She was multiple graded placed at the track, and he wound up keeping her as a broodmare. We tried to sell this colt, too, as a yearling [RNA'd for \$57,000 at FTNAUG and for \$35,000 at FTKOCT], but he went through a weird phase where he was just too thick and heavy--he looked like a Quarter Horse. But he lengthened and grew, and today looks great." Cont. p6





Aussie Jockey Nathan Berry Dies

Jockey Nathan Berry, who took ill while riding in Singapore last month, passed away Thursday morning in Sydney at the age of 23. Berry, the twin brother of top rider Tommy Berry, was originally diagnosed with encephalitis and later with Norse Syndrome. He was placed in a medical coma and was returned to Sydney via a special medical aircraft, but died in Sydney a few hours after being admitted into the hospital. Berry married Whitney Schofield, the daughter of fellow jockey Glyn Schofield, just this past February.

Snowden and Darley have three chances in the race, as they also send out Ghibellines (Aus) (Shamardal) and Memorial (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}). Saturday could prove to be a day for the ladies, as Mossfun (Aus) (Mossman {Aus}), a clear-cut second choice in the betting, is also a filly. An apparent bargain buy for A\$85,000 by Emirates Park at Inglis Easter last year, Mossfun won




the G3 Widden S. over this strip Feb. 15, and two weeks later added the G2 Silver Slipper S. by four lengths. The only hiccup on her resume came when chasing Earthquake home in the Reisling, where she finished second after traveling wide throughout.

Ghibellines

Mossfun will also have to overcome a wide barrier when she breaks from gate 11. Ghibellines, a halfbrother to Darley's four-time Group 1 winner Guelph (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), thrust himself into Golden Slipper contention with an upset maidenbreaking victory in the G2 Todman S. here Mar. 22. Behind the bay that day were Magic Millions 2YO Classic winner Unencumbered (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}), who has lost both starts since that landmark victory, and **Cornrow (Aus)** (Duporth {Aus}), making his first start since finishing an unlucky third in the Blue Diamond. Bring Me The Maid (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) is well fancied after a course and distance win in the G2 Magic Night S. Mar. 29, and trainer Peter Moody has expressed confidence. "The gap [between Bring Me The Maid and Earthquake] mightn't be as big as people suggest," Moody told Racenet.com.au. "She's proven on any ground and can take a sit or race on the pace. It was always the plan to be here if she was going to be good enough."

AUSTRALIAN JOCKEY NATHAN BERRY DIES

Australian-based jockey Nathan Berry died yesterday in a Sydney hospital less than two weeks after being diagnosed with Norse Syndrome. He was 23.

Berry and his twin brother Tommy began their riding careers as apprentices to their father Kevin, a trainer at Warwick Farm, and both

quickly rose to the top of the riding ranks. Berry recorded 351 wins in his career, his most important victory coming aboard Unencumbered (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}) in the A\$2-million Magic Million 2YO Classic in January. Unencumbered runs in

Berry had recently begun a four-month riding contract in Singapore when he collapsed at trackwork at Kranji Racecourse Mar. 18. He was later diagnosed with Norse Syndrome, an acute form of epilepsy. He suffered several seizures before being placed in an induced coma last week in a Singapore hospital. He was flown to Sydney yesterday morning.

"The entire racing industry is extremely distraught with the news of Nathan's passing," said Peter V'landys, Racing New South Wales' Chief Executive. "Sadness is not a sufficient word to describe this tragedy. We are all very distressed and could not imagine the grief the family must be going through. This was a young man who had the world at his feet. He won the Magic Millions in January and rose to the top of the ranks so quickly that he was offered a contract to ride in Singapore. You would not meet a family more grounded and genuine than the Berry family. They are the most diligent and hard-working people I know. Our sincere condolences go out to the Berry and Schofield families and Nathan's wife, Whitney."

Australian Racing Board Chairman John Messara added: "A great sense of loss has overtaken Australian racing with the passing of Nathan Berry. It is an unspeakable sadness for his wife Whitney, twin brother Tommy, loving parents and family. "We know there are no words which can ease their pain, other than hope that they can draw comfort from knowing that so many others share in their grief. Nathan Berry was a respected and talented rider who had earned his success through dedication and hard work; he was an outstanding talent. Nathan was a decent and principled young man respected by all. The Australian Racing Board, on behalf of the entire Australian racing industry, extends it sincerest condolences to the Berry family on the loss of Nathan."

Yu Pang Fey, President and Chief Executive of the Singapore Turf Club, said: "On behalf of the Singapore Turf Club, I wish to extend our deepest sympathy and condolences to the Berry family as well as the Schofield family on their loss." As a mark of respect for Berry, all jockeys riding at Kranji today will wear black armbands.

"We were very fortunate we got the breeze show in before the weather came, and with the rain we got this morning and the strong tailwind, the horses were able to perform very well over the track," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It was very wellattended and with a good cross-section of buyers. We hope they like what they see and bid accordingly."

One horse that didn't put his best foot forward yesterday was Hip 97, a colt by Flatter from Niall

Brennan's consignment who, mid-breeze, bounced noticeably off the rail.

"It's disappointing, only because he's such a lovely, big colt, and he saw something and lost focus for a second, and he hit the rail," said Brennan. "He had been

cruising, and it probably cost him a second. But it is what it is, and he was still able to go in :21 4/5." Brennan gave credit to Keeneland track maintenance crew. "The track was in excellent condition," he said.

"Thankfully, our horses got over it very well and it was a very safe track. And the conditions were good. We had that rain this morning, and the temperatures were mild, and obviously the tailwind helped."

What They're Sayingat the Sales

On Wednesday, Keeneland announced it will replace its currently synthetic Polytrack surface with a conventional dirt track. We asked buyers and sellers at yesterday's Keeneland April breeze-up show their thoughts.

Consignor Niall Brennan:

"Keeneland puts a lot of thought and research into the decisions it makes, and they've obviously done so in this case. I don't know that it will change the landscape of the 2-year-old sale, but it could be a good thing. These select sales have gotten so small. And while I don't think that has anything to do with the synthetic track here, it might help entice people to come to the sale, if only because it's a change."

Chris Brothers, Xavier Bloodstock:

"I think it's great. I think it will open the door to more trainers and horses. With the Polytrack, I think people were hesitant to prep here, especially for the big 3-yearold races."

How has buying at April changed in the Polytrack era?

"The Poly tends to hide their action a little; it's a little easier on them, but for the most part they move the way they move. But I think it will be nice to go back to have a 2-year-old sale on the dirt here again, because I do feel the Poly can hide their action."

Consignor Becky Thomas:

"The one thing I do know is that they'll do a lot of research on this surface, and they'll make sure it will drain well, as there's a lot of rain in Kentucky this time of year. I'm very excited about it. I'm a dirt person. But I know we need one that's safe, and one that drains."

Trainer Mark Casse:

"If I had one word to describe it? Disappointed. I like synthetics. I just watched the first race from Aqueduct on dirt--it was a five-horse field. There you go. If you like four-, five-horse fields, it's perfect. I hope the change back to dirt will be better for Keeneland than it has been for Santa Anita.

Why do you think synthetics haven't been embraced more?

"I think one of the main reasons is that New York never went to it, so it made it difficult for trainers to get a really good handle on it. But about two months ago, I heard a conversation from an assistant to a pretty prominent trainer. And he said, 'We like the synthetic, but we don't run at Keeneland, because if they like the synthetic, we'll lose horses.' And that was a good point. Because I get a lot of horses that have shown good form on synthetic.

"But I understand Keeneland's reasoning. They feel they haven't been getting the tip-top horses. But I can tell you, [Saturday's] GI Ashland S. has 13 horses, and you won't see any more 13-horse fields in the Ashland. Maybe they aren't getting the marquee horse or two, but then you look at the race in New Orleans [last weekend's GII Fair Grounds Oaks], which had five horses. I have a tough time understanding it. Unfortunately, I think it's a lot of politics.

"I read the other day that The Jockey Club wants to step in and help racing, and then read two days ago that a five-year study proved that synthetics are safer, and we've decided that doesn't matter.

"I also read somewhere that going back to dirt might make this sale [KEEAPR] more popular, but if what just happened at the Florida sales over the last month is any indication, I would say no. I can tell you that the rate of injury at the Fasig-Tipton [Florida] sale versus the OBS [March] sale, post-breeze, was no comparison. And I was pretty involved in both of them. We looked at 18 horses at OBS after the breeze show, and all of them vetted clean. We short-listed 17 at Fasig-tipton at Adena Springs, and we took four or five horse off the list before looking at them because we were told they had chips. We did our own vet work on the rest, and we got down to three horses. *Three* of 17 didn't have something. If I was a consignor, I'd be a little concerned. **Cont. p8**

What They're Saying cont.

"When we were having the pouring rain this morning and last night here in Kentucky, I thought, 'If this track was dirt, it might be a little tricky.' The best way I can describe dirt and synthetic: it's like being on an airplane. In normal weather, a weekend pilot is fine flying. But when the weather gets bad, you want to be with the veteran. On a good day, dirt and synthetic are probably pretty equal. On a bad day, the synthetic is superior.

"With the Asmussen deal a few weeks ago and with this, I feel beat up. I do. And if anyone shouldn't feel beat up, it's me. I am very fortunate and train for some wonderful people that stand behind me. But I don't really worry for me; I worry for my son Norman, who has devoted his life to this. And I just don't know where this industry is going."

In today: <u>Handicapping the Transylvania</u>, by Brian DiDonato

Transylvania S. cont.

On the first Friday of the 2006 Keeneland spring meeting, trainer Neil Pessin sent out Chin High (Smart Strike) to a \$139 upset in the GIII Transylvania S., and-weather permitting--he'll look to repeat the feat this afternoon with Lothenbach Stables' Ry's the Man. It will be the homebred's second visit to the races at the historic Lexington oval, having finished third in a \$50,000 maiden claimer over the Polytrack last October. The bay graduated in his turf debut going 5 1/2 furlongs at the Fair Grounds Jan. 19 and was a respectable third to the well-regarded The Trunk Monkey (Old Fashioned) over the main track Feb. 28. Ry the Man is exiting a fast-finishing victory going the one-mile distance of the Transylvania back on the lawn Mar. 21, and Pessin knows the gelding has a preference for that surface. "He is not real flashy when he is working, but he is a different horse on turf," Pessin said. "He likes turf better than dirt or Polytrack. His feet are kind of small and he would not mind a vielding course. Is he a Grade III horse or not? We are going to find out in the Transylvania." That Ry's the Man would take to the grass is no real surprise. His unraced dam Jr. Clare (Yankee Gentleman) is a half-sister to former Lothenbach star Vacare (Lear Fan), winner of the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland, as well as GSWs Single Solution (Flatter) (Keeneland's GIII Valley View S.), and Abtaal (Rock Hard Ten).

Charm Spirit flashed his talent with an all-the-way conditions score over this trip at Longchamp in September and as a result connections chanced their arm in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere back over the same course and distance on Arc day. Belying inexperience to be third in that highlight, the bay returned with a narrow win in this tight contest to book a ticket to Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas May 3. Settled in behind the leaders early, he was delivered wide with his challenge as the favorite Kiram emerged on the stand's side either side of Imperiator and Bookrunner (Tiznow). In front inside the final 50 meters, he clung on gamely in a four-way go. "He's a horse who likes a fight and he ought to improve a lot for that," trainer Freddy Head explained. "My first idea was always to go to the G1 2000 Guineas with him, as if there is a chance he will stay a mile--and I'm not sure he will--it will be easier at Newmarket than at Longchamp." Kiram's trainer Jean-Claude Rouget said of the runner-up, "He has run a good race and definitely needed it. Christophe Soumillon said he blew at the wrong moment when they kicked. Last seen finishing runner-up in the G3 Prix Miesque over six furlongs here in November, Xcellence sprang a shock as the much-vaunted Miss France (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) failed to fire. Ironically fourth behind that rival and the subsequent G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Indonesienne (Ire) (Muhtathir {GB}) in a mile conditions event at Chantilly in October, the bay showed what strides she had made in the interim period to advertise her Classic credentials. Buried in mid-division early against the rail, the blaze-faced bay was sent through to tackle Vorda approaching the furlong pole and as that duo drew clear it was the outsider who stayed best in the final 50 meters. Miss France, sent off the 8-5 pick, never threatened to get involved off the slow pace and finished sixth. Winning trainer Francois Doumen said, "She showed quite a bit of quality at two and had had a good winter and improved a lot. She's won guite comfortably and looks as if she will definitely stay further. She will go straight to the nitely run back in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches [at Longchamp] May 11]." Vorda's conditioner Philippe Sogorb added, "It may have looked like she had a good run, but it was not ideal for her as she hit the front much too soon. RECOVERY MISSION

Last year's G1 Melbourne Cup hero Fiorente (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) had a three-race win streak snapped when a surprise seventh in the G1 Ranvet S. here two weeks ago and the 6-year-old is on a recovery mission in today's G1 The BMW, one of Australia's most important staying contests. A resounding first-up winner of the G2 Peter Young S. at Caulfield Feb. 22, Fiorente was a dominant winner of the G1 Australian Cup Mar. 8, but failed to fire in the lane after traveling wide throughout in the Ranvet, won by Silent Achiever (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}). Fiorente was given a vote of confidence by his connections after a strong piece of work Tuesday and maintains favoritism. Also disappointing in the Ranvet was last year's four-time Group 1 winner It's A Dundeel (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}). The 4-year-old has now lost both starts back this year, although he was staying on at the end of the Ranvet. Fellow Kiwi import Silent Achiever, a two-time Group 1 winner in her native country, won the 2012 G2 Crystal Mile at Moonee Valley, but had failed in seven previous attempts at the highest level in Australia. The 5-year-old mare was brave in the Ranvet, running on late to pip determined frontrunner Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}), and she will look to go one better after finishing second by a head in this race last year. Like Silent Achiever, last year's G1 Irish St. Leger heroine Voleuse de Coeurs (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) will enjoy a weight break of at least four pounds from the males. The 5-year-old, purchased by Eliza Park International following the Irish Leger, finished a respectable eighth in the Melbourne Cup in her first outing on Australian soil, and was a staying-on fifth in the Australian Cup behind Fiorente.

ZANBAGH TO RISE TO THE OCCASION

The Tait family's Zanbagh (Aus) (Bernardini) has been regarded as a filly on the rise since finishing a flashy second in the 2500-meter G1 Crown Oaks in her first stakes test last season and the homebred will look to record her first victory at the highest level and stamp herself a G1 Australian Oaks contender in the G1 Vinery Stud S. at Rosehill. Off the board in a pair of stakes attempts at six and seven furlongs to kick off her autumn campaign, the Guy Walter trainee notched her first stakes victory when stretched to a mile for the G3 Keith F Nolan Classic at Kembla Grange Mar. 23. Her connections have expressed high confidence in their charge with the added distance, however, Zanbagh will have to overcome gate 19. Drawn much more favorably in seven is Solicit (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}), who finished third in the Crown Oaks before notching back-to-back victories in the G3 Vanity S. and G2 Kewney S.-both over 1400 meters-to kick off her campaign. Solicit finished fourth most recently after finding some trouble in running in the one mile Listed Alexandra S. at Moonee Valley Mar. 21. The winner that day was Marianne (NZ) (Darci Brahma {NZ}), who has finished worse than second just once in her eightrace career and appeared to relish the added distance of the Alexandra. Similarly consistent is fellow Kiwi **Rising** Romance (NZ) (Ekraar), who won the G2 Royal S. in her native country Jan. 1 before finishing second to the highly regarded Puccini (NZ) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) in the G2 Avondale Guineas and G1 New Zealand Derby.

California Chrome Arrives at Santa Anita...

California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit), the 6-5 morning-line favorite for Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby, arrived at Santa Anita Wednesday afternoon, Alan Sherman, the son of trainer Art Sherman, said Thursday.

"He came in great and he galloped this morning," Sherman said.

The colt, who has won handily in his last three starts, drew post five of eight for the nine-furlong race. Victor Espinoza, who rode California Chrome in his last three starts, said he was happy with the draw.

"I like my post," Espinoza said. "Number five is great. There aren't many horses in the race. I know it's a tough race, but he's ready to go. I have a few options. He can go either way. That's what I like about him. He can rate or he can go to the front."

Espinoza added that he has been encouraged by California Chrome's workouts leading up to the Santa Anita Derby.

"He's been working pretty good, so I'm really looking forward to Saturday," Espinoza said. "He went nice and easy in :46 2/5 [in his final major drill at Los Alamitos last Saturday]. I wanted to go in 47, but he was doing it so easy, I let him stretch his legs around the racetrack. For him, it was an easy work. I feel confident about him. I think he's going to run big."

Conquest Titan On Target for Arkansas Derby...

Conquest Titan (Birdstone) remains a probable starter for the GI Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn April 12, after a promising workout Mar. 29 when he breezed through five furlongs in 1:00.70 at Palm Meadows. It was the second fastest of 20 working that distance.

"He worked really well the other day at Palm Meadows," trainer Mark Casse said. "We moved him to Churchill Downs with the rest of the gang and the plan is to breeze him a little there this weekend, and if all goes well, we're going to Hot Springs."

Conquest Titan is in 35th place in the GI Kentucky Derby points standings, but has the potential to vault into the top 20 with a strong showing at the Arkansas Derby. The race will award a total of 170 qualifying points, with 100-40-20-10 points awarded for finishing first through fourth.

"You not only have to get the points, you need to run well enough to show that you belong," Casse said. "He's got to step up his game. If he's good enough he will, and if not, we'll have to go to a Plan B."

The colt was last seen finishing fourth in the GII Tampa Bay Derby March 8. He came in second behind Cairo Prince (Pioneerof the Nile) in the GII Holy Bull S. Jan. 25. Conquest Titan was piloted by Shaun Bridgmohan in each of those races, but Hall of Famer Calvin Borel will take the reins for the Arkansas Derby. "There wasn't really any big reason for the switch," Casse said. "Calvin is already there and he seems to be what I thought was a good fit for this horse. He wants to come from way out of it, and Calvin's pretty good at that. He knows the track like the back of his hand."

There are currently six other probable entries for the Arkansas Derby. The other probable starters are: **Tapiture** (Tapit), **Strong Mandate** (Tiznow), **Ride On Curlin** (Curlin), **Bayern** (Offlee Wild), **Commissioner** (A.P. Indy) and **Danza** (Street Boss).

KEENELAND ANNOUNCES BLUE GRASS

PROTOCOLS Officials at Keeneland have announced enhanced security measures for horses competing in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 12. The rules stipulate that all participants will be required to be on the grounds as of 8 a.m. Thursday, Apr. 10, and will be subject to 24-hour surveillance through 5:45 p.m. on raceday. Out-of-competition testing will be conducted by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission and trainers of Blue Grass starters will be required to provide to stewards a list of treating veterinarians. A full daily veterinarian's record of all medications and treatments given to horses from 8 a.m. Thursday, Apr. 10, until after the running of the race shall be provided to the KHRC Chief Veterinarian located in the detention barn and entry-exit logs will be maintained by security personnel. All persons--including grooms, veterinarians, trainers, assistant trainers, farriers, owners or other connections--on entering the stall, or engaging in contact with the horse or performing any service for the horse, must have a valid KHRC license on their person. Such persons will be logged in by security personnel with the reason for their visit. On raceday, horses will be required to be in the assembly barn 45 minutes to an hour before post time for TC02 testing. "These protocols, similar to those followed by the New York Racing Association and other major racing venues, ensure that the Toyota Blue Grass will be run with the utmost integrity," said Keeneland Vice President of Racing W.B. Rogers Beasley. "They will provide enhanced protection for the participants and our fans, and guarantee a level and safe playing field for all."

\$300,000 GI Maker's 46 Mile Keeneland, April 11 Possible Starters

DUBAI HORSEMEN WEIGH IN ON CHENGDU

Dubai-based trainer Doug Watson and jockey Royston Ffrench have arrived at Jinma Racecourse in Chengdu, China ahead of Sunday's inaugural Chengdu Dubai International Cup Raceday, and both spoke favorably of their first impressions of the facilities.

Watson has eight runners in the five races. "This is my first visit to the track and although I knew the facilities such as the stables and the racecourse would be good, they have surpassed my expectations,"

Watson said. "The organizers have done a great job, especially with the stable block, which is on two levels. All the horses seem to have settled in well and are in good health. It was amazing to see them looking out from the top windows, as if they didn't have a care in the world."

Ffrench, who has rides in all five races including four aboard horses trained by Dubai's Ali Rashid Al Raihe, added: "I have been here for a few days and the facilities are fantastic. The horses arrived fit and have been training well, and I am really looking forward to the races on Sunday. I have ridden around the world for 17 years and the facilities here compare very favorably with anything I've seen."

The Chengdu Dubai International Cup raceday represents a partnership between the Meydan Group and the Chengdu Municipal Government, the Chengdu Sports Bureau, the Wenjiang District Government and China Guangsha Group. The meeting will consist of five turf races for horses prepared by Dubai Racing Club trainers and ridden by UAE jockeys, the highlights being the Chengdu Dubai International Cup over 2200 meters and the 1600-meter Wenjiang Meydan Classic, both presented by Longines. The other races will be the Wenjiang Sprint (1200 meters), the Guangsha H. (1400 meters) and the Meydan Mile. The meeting has been organized by the Meydan Group and will be conducted under Emirates Racing Authority Rules. Purses will be announced Friday.

THE PRICE OF RELEVANCE

Reading that Keeneland had again expressed interest in hosting the Breeders' Cup, the idea for a column was born. The angle would be that Keeneland could host the Breeders' Cup--if the track tore out its Polytrack surface.

Before the column could even be penned came the announcement Keeneland was indeed replacing its synthetic surface with a return to dirt by the time of the fall meet.

And though track officials claim it is not being done solely in an attempt to lure the Breeders' Cup, it certainly appears to have been a factor in their thinking.

More to the point of why Keeneland would replace the surface--tearing out a product it once felt so strongly about it invested in the company that manufactured it--is relevance. Keeneland no longer feels as relevant as it once did.

Its three-week meets are perfectly placed for horse to prep for the Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby in the spring and Breeders' Cup races in the fall.

But that is not happening.

Many trainers are avoiding Keeneland's races, not wanting to prep for a race on dirt with a start on a synthetic surface.

The track's marquee race for 3-year-old colts, the Blue Grass S., was once one of the most important final preps for the Derby. That is no longer the case.

No winner of the Blue Grass has won the Derby since Strike the Gold in 1991, though Street Sense ran second in 2007--the first spring meeting with a Polytrack surface--before winning the Derby three weeks later.

In the years since the track converted to Polytrack, two horses who ran in the Blue Grass have run third in the Derby, Paddy O'Prado in 2010 and Dullahan in 2012.

When Keeneland installed Polytrack, first on its training track, then on its main track, it was done for one reason and one reason only--safety.

Now, though Polytrack has proven to reduce fatal injuries to horses, Keeneland has made the decision to return to a dirt surface.

The same month Keeneland began racing on Polytrack (October 2006), the Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit was held.

Held at Keeneland, by the way.

From that meeting, The Jockey Club underwrote the costs of developing the Equine Injury Database, which from 2008-2012 analyzed 1,532,418 starts from about 90 racetracks in North America. The rate of fatal injuries, from 1,000 starts, was 2.00 for 2009, 1.88 for 2010, 1.88 for 2011 and 1.92 for 2012.

Just Monday the latest statistics were released, showing a rate of 1.90 for 2013. Keeneland's rate last year was 0.33.

Not exactly great timing for Keeneland officials to announce they are returning to dirt.

Keeneland officials, of course, are still interested in track safety and proclaim they will do everything they can to make the new dirt track as safe as it can be.

Those are nice sentiments, but time will tell if relevance is more important than safety. Hopefully more horses will not be lost to fatal injuries to again reach that relevant status.

A half-mile split of anything over :47 will make him ultra-tough. Very few holes in



this guy. Next start: GI SA Derby Apr. 5 · Previous rank · #2

2) **TAPITURE** (c, <u>Tapit</u>--Free Spin, by Olympio), runner-up in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Mar. 15 after a rough stretch drive, got back on the worktab with a bullet 1:00 4/5 breeze in Hot Springs Mar. 31. There will be plenty of eyes on him next week due to his embattled human connections (namely trainer Steve Asmussen), but from a pure racing standpoint, I'm most intrigued to see how he handles that final furlong in the Arkansas Derby. Still think he might be a miler at heart, but then again I'm not sure we've seen his best. *Next start: GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 12 - Previous rank - #3*

3) <u>CANDY BOY</u> (c, 3, <u>Candy Ride {Arg}</u>--She's An Eleven, by In Excess {Ire}) was flattered some when Chitu (Henny Hughes), the horse he beat in the GII Bob Lewis S. at Santa Anita Feb. 8, came back to take the GIII Sunland Derby. This guy's pace lines and speed figures don't dazzle, but it's important to keep in mind that he's making just his second start of the year in Saturday's SA Derby, and so improvement can be expected (or hoped for, at least) as he matures. Of all the horses on this list--save Social Inclusion--he might have the biggest upside. Which I guess means he could have the biggest downside, too. Saturday will tell us a lot. *Next start: Santa Anita Derby - Previous rank - #4*

4) <u>SAMRAAT</u> (c, 3, Noble Causeway--Little Indian Girl, by Indian Charlie) was sent out to some stamina-building one-mile works at Palm Meadows Mar. 22 (1:45) and Mar. 28 (1:44), and while trainer Rick Violette Jr. said the horse could well be in front on Saturday, I kind of hope they take him back a little farther than he's been in his previous starts and then make a big run in the lane. *Next start: GI Wood Memorial Apr. 5* -*Previous rank - #5* 5) <u>UNCLE SIGH</u> (c, 3, Indian Charlie--Cradlesong, by Pine Bluff) is my play in the Wood, based on what I'm expecting to be a price of 9-2 or so. After running a big 107 late-pace fig in his maiden win, he was pressured into fast mid-pace figs (108, 101) in his last two, and still finished OK. Think there's improvement in this guy, and there's plenty of stamina influences in his pedigree. *Next start: Wood Memorial - Previous rank - #10*

6) **CONSTITUTION** (c, 3, <u>Tapit</u>--Baffled, by Distorted Humor), a maiden and allowance winner entering last weekend's GI Florida Derby, came through with a big effort to stamp his ticket to the Derby. The race set up perfectly for him, but he did show nice professionalism to come through along rail in upper stretch. Late-pace fig of 103 was very nice. Seasoning obviously will be the question on Derby day, but a talented animal for sure. *Next start: Kentucky Derby - Previous Rank - unranked*

7) <u>VICAR'S IN TROUBLE</u> (c, 3, <u>Into Mischief</u>--Vibrant, by Vicar) set legitimate fractions when winning the Louisiana Derby and still kicked away from GII Risen Star winner Intense Holiday. Reportedly small, but has tons of heart, and already my Derby pick if track comes up wet. *Next start: Kentucky Derby - Previous rank - unranked* Get Andrew Caulfield's Take.

8) <u>HOPPERTUNITY</u> (c, 3, Any Given Saturday--Refugee, by Unaccounted For) is still learning the game, it seems, and gets another valuable tutorial in tomorrow's SA Derby, a race that Baffert's already won six times. *Next start: SA Derby - Previous rank - #7*

9) <u>CAIRO PRINCE</u> (c, 3, <u>Pioneerof the Nile-Holy Bubbette</u>, by Holy Bull) just a week ago was on top of several Derby rankings, but now looks unlikely to make the starting gate. He currently is in 16th on the points list with 24 points, but there's a lot of racing in the next two weeks. In any case, and maybe it's just Monday morning quarterbacking, but Cairo Prince just looked like a short horse in the Florida Derby, when he ranged up for wide and then flattened. It was his first start since the GII Holy Bull S. Jan. 25, and his worktab between the two races wasn't all that inspiring. Still among the most talented members of his generation; unfortunately, he may not be able to show it until the Preakness. *Next start: Kentucky Derby? - Previous rank - #1* <u>Get Andrew Caulfield's Take</u>.

10) <u>INTENSE HOLIDAY</u> (c, 3, Harlan's Holiday--Intensify, by Unbridled's Song) just maintains a spot here. He got shuffled back a bit on turn in Louisiana Derby, made a bold move, then seemed to lose focus in the stretch. The type that fills the tri in the Derby. *Next start: Kentucky Derby -Previous rank - #8*

AT THE THRESHOLD: Social Inclusion (Pioneerof the Nile) could well be on this list, but with zero Derby points, I had a hard time putting him over proven graded performs. Could just be a freak, though. Wildcat Red (D'wildcat) should probably be on here, too, but still can't convince myself that his is a pedigree that can shine on Derby day.

Texas Yearling Sale Pushed Back:

The Fasig-Tipton Texas Yearling Sale, originally scheduled to take place Aug. 25, has been rescheduled for Monday, Oct. 13. After integrating feedback from consignors and members of the Texas Thoroughbred Association, the TTA, Fasig-Tipton and Lone Star Park came to a mutual agreement and worked together to find a spot on the calendar a handful of weeks later. "There are several benefits to moving the sale to this new date," said Mary Ruyle, executive director of the TTA. The temperatures should be cooler in early fall, and the later date allows for the addition of a mixed sale session that should attract more buyers and consignors. This has long been the leading yearling auction in the region and we think these changes will help it grow in the future."



Old Friends, New Vocations Enter Partnership: *Edited Press Release*

Old Friends and New Vocations have entered into an agreement to benefit Thoroughbreds in their post-racing and post-breeding careers. The two organizations each fulfill a different aftercare need. New Vocations places off-the-track Thoroughbreds with new owners in new careers, while Old Friends is primarily a home for those who, due to old age or physical issues, require permanent retirement. But with time and care, some horses needs change.

That happened for Gameday News, owned and trained by D. Wayne Lukas. The son of Corinthian broke his maiden in March 2012 at Oaklawn Park. Following a few allowance starts, he injured his ankle, and, with the help of Old Friends Board member Cathy Riccio, he was retired to Old Friends. After nearly two years of care and paddock rest, Gameday News received clearance from Dr. Steve Allday, who x-rayed the site of his healed injury and pronounced the 5-year-old fit and ready to enter a new career. Gameday News will always have a home available at Old Friends when his second career ends.

"It's a clear case of doing what's best for the athlete," said Old Friends president Michael Blowen. "He's a beautiful, energetic, kind horse who is adored by the staff and visitors. But he's too young and healthy to be retired. We're very grateful that New Vocations has accepted him into their program. It's an example of groups working together, with the help of the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance, to do what's best for the horse."

Added New Vocations' Program Director Anna Ford, "We are extremely thrilled to be partnering with Old Friends. Being able to capitalize on each program's strengths will make it possible for us to help more horses."

New Vocations focuses on rehabbing, retraining, and rehoming retired racehorses. Gameday News entered the retraining stage of the program in late March and has already been started back under saddle. Tax Depreciation for Horses Moves Out of Committee: *Edited Press Release*

The United States Senate Finance Committee reported Thursday legislation that would extend expired or expiring tax provisions for racehorses, including a provision to extend the three-year recovery period. This provision--originally passed by Congress and enacted into law in 2008--accelerates, simplifies and makes uniform the depreciation period for racehorses. The provision expired at the end of 2013 along with several other tax provisions. The proposed version of the provision that moved out of committee today more accurately reflects current-day investments in race horses and helps to spur continued investments in the racing industry. "I applaud the Committee for moving this bill and for including this important provision in the legislation," said Alex Waldrop, NTRA President and CEO. "I especially appreciate that the Committee understands the continued importance of our industry and the contribution of the equine economy to job creation and added investment."

The three-year recovery provision was a top priority for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) in 2008 and has been a top legislative priority again this year.

"Our legislative team has once again helped forward our agenda in Washington by educating elected officials about the importance of our industry and we will continue to push this important issue before the full Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives," Waldrop said.

The Committee also extended for two years increased expensing limitations under Section 179 and bonus depreciation, both of which also help investments in racehorses. Bonus depreciation is set at 50% in the legislation and may be used by business owners who purchase and place in service qualified new property. An example of new property in horse racing is a yearling who begins a racehorse training program. The Section 179 expense allowance is set at \$500,000 with a \$2 million threshold for qualified new or used property that is purchased and placed in service by small business owners in many industries. In the horse racing industry, a broodmare who previously raced is an example of used property that may be eligible.
