INTENSE HOLIDAY RETIRED

Starlight Racing's **Intense Holiday** (Harlan's Holiday--Intensify, by Unbridled's Song) suffered a condylar fracture in a workout at Belmont Park May 25 and underwent successful surgery to repair the injury, but will not return to the races, the outfit said in a release Tuesday morning.

"You never get used to this stuff," said Starlight Racing's Jack Wolf, who was on hand when the injury occurred. "It's disappointing, but the horse did not seem to be in much distress right after the injury and we're happy that they were able to repair the injury to the extent that they could. He's a good horse--a talented horse--who has provided us with some thrilling finishes. But whether they're worth \$5,000 or \$5 million, this is always a bitter pill to swallow."

Bred in Kentucky by Machmer Hall and Haymarket Farm and by the late sire that gave Starlight many of its early successes in the business, Intense Holiday fetched a hefty \$380,000 as a Keeneland September yearling and graduated in his first start going two turns at Monmouth Park last August. A rallying fourth behind **"TDN Rising Star"** Honor Code (A.P. Indy) and Cairo Prince (Pioneerof the Nile) in a paceless renewal of the GII Remsen S. in November, the dark bay overcame a high draw to post a strong third-place effort to Cairo Prince in the GIII Holy Bull S. in his sophomore debut Jan. 25, then came from the latter half of the field to post a game success in the GII Risen Star S. at the Fair Grounds Feb. 22. Favored for the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 29, he was bumped nearing the far turn, but stayed on gamely in the stretch to finish a clear runner-up. He was most recently unplaced in the GI Kentucky Derby May 3, but was doing exceptionally well by all reports in the weeks leading up to an intended start in the GI Belmont S.

"Intense Holiday seemed to come out of the Kentucky Derby as well as he had any of his prior races and he was training remarkably well at Belmont Park when the injury occurred," trainer Todd Pletcher commented. "It's an unfortunate thing. He was a solid Grade II winner, showed up every time, ran against the best of his generation and I believe that as the season went on he would've had an excellent chance to be a Grade I winner. These types of blows are never easy to take but this one was particularly confounding."

Intense Holiday retires with two wins from nine starts and earnings of \$551,900. Stud plans are still being formulated.

THE RICH GET RICHER

It's interesting to look at the *TDN* Year-to-Date General Sire List ([click here](#)) just now. Four NA/EU sires have 2014 progeny earnings over \$5 million. Of course one's immediate thought is what impact the three races on Dubai World Cup night might have had: the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup, with \$6 million to the winner and even \$2 million to the second; the G1 Duty Free and G1 Sheema Classic, each with \$3 million to the winner. As it happens, both the latter two races this year were won by Japanese-breds, the Duty Free won by Just A Way (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), the Sheema Classic by Gentildonna (Deep Impact {Jpn}). Incidentally, you may wonder, as I did, why Deep Impact is then included on the *TDN* YTD GSL (#16, \$3,000,000 exactly) and Heart's Cry isn't. There is an answer, which is that Deep Impact is counted because he has runners in 2014 in North America or Europe, while Heart's Cry doesn't.

The Dubai World Cup, though, has impacted the list. Cheveley Park Stud's British-based Pivotal is the #1 sire because of African Story's \$6-million payday; take that one race out and Pivotal is down around 60th. Don't worry, I'm not knocking Pivotal, who's a very good sire; nor am I knocking how the list is compiled. I'm simply pointing out 77% of his 2014 progeny earnings have come in one race. **cont. p3**

Another British-based sire, Darley's Dubawi, ranks second with the earners of over \$6 million this year, including three Group 1 winners. One of those, the 3-year-old Night of Thunder, dropped a 40-1 bombshell to win the G1 English 2000 Guineas, but the other two did come in Dubai and Hong Kong. Nonetheless, I would wholeheartedly agree with the general consensus that Dubawi is the number two sire in Europe right now, behind only Galileo: Juddmonte's Dansili, incidentally, remains the consensus number three.

But we'll come back to them. Number three on the

TDN YTD GSL is Gainesway's Tapit, the leading sire in North America for 2014, with progeny earnings of over \$5.7 million, over \$1.8 million more than NA number two, Darley's Street Cry. Right now probably the most telling statistics on the whole table are the number of 2014 graded/group stakes

winners (GSW), and number of 2014 graded/group stakes horses (GSH); leaving Deep Impact aside, Coolmore's World Number One, Galileo, has nine 2014 GSW and 18 GSH to date. Tapit has eight GSW, 15 GSH. Next best are five GSW and 11 GSH respectively.

The fourth NA/EU sire with over \$5 million in 2014 progeny earnings is Darley's Shamardal. He did benefit to the tune of \$2 million when Mukhdaram ran second in the Dubai World Cup, and it's true that his only Group 1 winner so far this year has been Dan Excel, in Singapore. Nonetheless, he is having a massive year, with 10 black type winners (BTW), ranking him second only to Galileo (15) in number of 2014 BTW; five of those are GSW, ranking him equal third in that category, along with the likes of Medaglia D'Oro, Candy Ride, Smart Strike, and Dansili.

The next ten places are occupied by North American sires with earnings between \$3 and \$4 million: Street Cry; California Chrome's sire, Lucky Pulpit; Speightstown; Giant's Causeway; Medaglia D'Oro; Candy Ride; Unbridled's Song; Bernardini; Smart Strike; and Tiznow. At #15 now, and number four in Europe, is Coolmore's Galileo. On Sunday, at The Curragh on pretty heavy ground, there were three group races for 3-year-olds and up, therefore six horses were going to run one-two. Five of them were by Galileo, in spite of the general view that they're not crazy about soft ground. Frankel's brother Noble Mission led all the way to win the G1 Tattersalls' Gold Cup over last year's G1 Breeders' Cup Turf and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner, Magician: Galileo one-two. In the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, the outsider Marvellous roared to victory as the Coolmore second string under Ryan Moore to knock off G1 English 1000 Guineas second Lightning Thunder (Dutch Art).

Marvellous isn't just by Galileo; she's also out of You'resothrilling, winner of the six-furlong G2 Cherry Hinton at Newmarket as a 2-year-old, and a full sister to Giant's Causeway. Pow. For good measure Galileo also had the one-two in the G3 Gallinule S., taking his black-type totals for 2014 to 15 black-type winners; an amazing 33 black-type horses; nine GSW, and 18 GSH. He is again the leading NA/EU sire in all four categories.

Number five in Europe (#20 overall) is Dansili, sire of G1 English 1000 Guineas winner Miss France, and, also trained in France, We Are, winner of last Sunday's G1 Prix Saint-Alary. Coolmore's Holy Roman Emperor is number six in Europe (#25 overall; he's killing them in Hong Kong). Europe #7 is Juddmonte's Oasis Dream (#32 overall), who has a couple of pretty good middle-distance 3-year-olds this year and could take another jump up the list

after the next round of Derbies--not what you'd necessarily expect. The Irish National Stud's flag bearer Invincible Spirit moved up to eighth in Europe (#38 overall) with Kingman's easy win last Saturday in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, ahead of Darley's Exceed And Excel and Coolmore's late lamented Montjeu (whose Geoffrey Chaucer is now clear second favorite to give his sire his fifth Epsom Derby winner in 10 crops of 3-year-olds).

Europe's #11 is Coolmore's Footstepsintheshand, just about the best €10,000 stallion in Europe. Moving up to 12th in Europe (#53 overall) is Dylan Thomas. He completed a sweep of the Italian Derby-Oaks double with Final Score's win in the G2 Oaks d'Italia last Sunday (the colt Dylan Mouth won the G2 Italian Derby the previous week), the same day his 5-year-old gelded son Blazing Speed won a Group 1 in Hong Kong, and the 5-year-old mare Tannery, a Grade I winner last year, opened her 2014 campaign with a stakes victory at Monmouth. The 5-year-olds are from his first crop. Ifraaj, who stands at Darley's Irish arm, Kildangan, hasn't cracked the TDN GSL Top 100 yet this year, but Hot Streak became the third G1-G2 winner from his current crop of 3-year-olds when he beat 'olders' in the five-furlong G2 Temple S. at Haydock last Saturday. This crop also includes the late lamented Chriselliam, who won the G1 Fillies' Mile and G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, and was Champion 2-Year-Old Filly in Europe last year, but sadly died over the winter; and Rizeena, winner of the G1 Moyglare and second to Chriselliam in the Fillies' Mile last year.

She was only seventh to Miss France in the G1 English 1000 Guineas and would have been favorite or second favorite in last weekend's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, but was ruled out of the race after a minor bleeding incident after working. She should reappear as a live longshot for Royal Ascot's G1 Coronation S. Royal Ascot (June 17-21): best week of racing in the world.





COUNTDOWN TO THE CROWN

THE BELMONT STAKES ~ June 7th

TRIPLE CROWN WINNERS SUPPORT 'CHROME'

The 1970s was arguably one of the greatest decades in horse racing with three Triple Crown winners in a five-year span. The great Secretariat ended a 25-year Triple Crown drought when he swept the series in 1973 after a 31-length romp in the GI Belmont S. Two more superstars emerged just a few years later in the form of Seattle Slew and Affirmed. Seattle Slew kept his perfect record intact while winning the Crown in 1977 and Affirmed battled it out with his famed rival Alydar to capture all three races in 1978.

In the 36 years since, a dozen horses have swept both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S., but none have been able to capture the elusive 1 1/2-mile Belmont, known as "The Test of Champions." This year's Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) hopes to break that streak and the connections of the 1970's Triple Crown winners believe he can do it.

"He has that wonderful quality of versatility," Patrice Wolfson, owner of Affirmed, said during an NTRA teleconference yesterday. "He is easy to rate, easy to ride, responds well and has wonderful acceleration. Now it is just going to be a question if he can handle the mile and a half distance and little bit of traveling he has done."

Wolfson added, "I think I am about ready to give up being the last Triple Crown winner. Sometimes I think that is my name. You just like to see a great horse win it and he seems like he has the potential to be a great horse, so we will be rooting for him."

Seattle Slew's trainer Billy Turner is the only living Triple Crown winning conditioner and still keeps a string of horses at Belmont. He has had the opportunity to watch California Chrome in the mornings and likes what he sees.

"He is such a nice horse," Turner remarked. "He just goes out there and does whatever they want him to do. Nothing excites him. He won't get caught up in a speed duel. They won't be able to send a rabbit after him in the first part to get him going and things like that just won't make a difference. What it boils down to is being a rider's race. He has proven already that he is the dominant horse in the 3-year-old ranks today and regardless of how he runs the Belmont, the thing is he would be unlucky not to win."

Affirmed's jockey Steve Cauthen, who was the youngest rider to win the Triple Crown at the age of 18, expressed similar sentiments on the flashy chestnut.

"To me he looks like a freak that could really do things beyond his breeding," Cauthen commented.

"I am looking for him to pull it off and I really like the way Art Sherman is training him. [Trainer Lazaro Barrera] didn't do a lot with Affirmed between the

Preakness and Belmont and I think that is what Art is going to do with California Chrome and that will be important."

Ron Turcotte, the pilot of Secretariat, said, "I'd love to see the horse win. I really love the horse. I love the way he is training and I really think he is going to win the Triple Crown."

However, unlike many others Turcotte does not believe that the 1 1/2-mile distance is so difficult for horses to withstand.

"I am in disagreement with a lot of people about the mile and a half," he said. "I think all horses can go a mile and a half if they are handled right, if they are trained for the mile and a half and if they are ridden for a mile and a half."

The owners of the 1970's Triple Crown winners all felt that one of the reasons it has been so long since the feat has been accomplished is that horses today are just not made or trained like they used to be.

"We don't breed horses for stamina so much these days and we don't train horses to run so frequently," Penny Chenery, owner of Secretariat said.

"Today's horse maybe will run six times a year. We are asking these horses to run three times under tough competition in only five weeks."

Wolfson agreed, stating, "It's a very difficult task. In our case we had to run against Alydar, who was just a little superstar of his own, and that was a big challenge. I think horses years ago were tougher. They campaigned harder and usually relished racing. They loved to run, all these Triple Crown winners of the 1970's particularly."

There has been a lot of talk and press in recent weeks about putting more space between the Triple Crown races, so that they would run the first weekend of May, June and July. Despite the difficulty of capturing the Crown and the fact today's horses are not handled or bred quite the same, all of the Triple Crown winning connections were adamant that the spacing of the races should not be changed.

"It is not fine for me," Chenery stated. "I think it would invalidate all the records and make it an entirely different event. I know its hard to win. I think this horse has a very good chance."

"It would just be awful [if they changed the spacing]," Wolfson remarked. "It's a wonderful, unique set of races. If they changed it, it would just invalidate it. It just would not work. It's such a special group of races and the timing is perfect and a horse just has to be up to it. It's super the way it is and nobody should think of changing it under any circumstances."

Seattle Slew's owner Dr. Jim Hill agreed with Chenery and Wolfson. "It is a special thing and racing needs something that is really special," he said. "We are trying to make super horses and I think it takes not only an exceptional horse to win all three races, but it takes great training and management and good luck. I think all those things should go together and I don't think the task should be lessened at all."

Turner agreed that changing the spacing would lessen the quality of the winner. "The whole idea of the Triple Crown is that you have to breed a horse that will perform with both speed and stamina and have a mind set to withstand the campaign. You change the timing and you give a lesser horse the chance to compete and that is not what it is all about."

Turcotte added another interesting point, "I don't think changing the dates will help any and people will get disinterested in it. If you go three months, we won't have the same interest."

The three owners were also in agreement on the fact that despite the financial pressures to retire a Triple Crown winner to stud immediately, owners owe it to the sport and the fans to continue racing the horse if he is sound.

"I absolutely think there is a responsibility to race him, but also to the horse," Chenery remarked. "We had to retire Secretariat because my father died and we had to settle the will. I was all for seeing what he could do as a 4-year-old. I think this one and done phenomenon in sports is terribly destructive. People like to get to know a horse and then continue to root for him. I think the owners have a great understanding of their responsibility to racing and I bet they will keep going."

Wolfson said, "My husband Lou Wolfson definitely felt that he owed it to racing to race Affirmed as a 4-year-old. It turns out he was probably a better 4-year-old than a 3-year-old. I think it is something they should do if the horse is sound. They love to run. They want to run. I think that racing needs to see another big champion out there."

Seattle Slew took longer than the other two to make his return to the races as a 4-year-old, but was extremely successful once he did.

"We had some very hard luck with him," Dr. Hill said. "We had to take a lot of time getting him back, but he came back and ran extremely well in the fall of his 4-year-old year. I think owners do owe it to racing when they have a great horse to of course take care of their horse and allow the fans to enjoy the horse as much as they can."

Turcotte, Cauthen, and Seattle Slew's pilot Jean Cruguet will all be on hand on Belmont day signing autographs for the fans. Dr. Jim Hill hopes to make it to Belmont to watch California Chrome as well and Billy Turner will be trackside as is his daily routine. Penny Chenery and Patrice Wolfson will also be at Belmont cheering California Chrome on in hopes that he will follow in the footsteps of their famed chestnuts and break the Triple Crown drought.

MEDAL COUNT POINTS TO BELMONT

Spendthrift Farm's **Medal Count** (Dynaformer) will make his next start in the GI Belmont S. June 7, it was announced yesterday. Winner of the turf GIII Transylvania S. Apr. 4, he was second over synthetic in the Apr. 12 GI Toyota Bluegrass S. before finishing eighth in the GI Kentucky Derby last time for trainer Dale Romans. Spendthrift's Ned Toffey said the decision came after watching how well the colt has trained since exiting the Derby.

"The horse is just doing great," Toffey explained. "Ultimately, this was Dale's decision. We've been back and forth whether we'd switch him over to the turf and we were eyeing the [GI] Belmont Derby there July 5 as a possibility for this horse. He came out of the Derby so well and just seems to be thriving. He had a great five-eighth work on Saturday and he looked great doing it. We felt like it was worth it to take a shot. It's a very tough group--we know we're jumping in deep--but he's a nice horse. We felt like he was more than competitive in the Derby--he was cut off badly deep in the stretch and without that happening I think he had a very good shot of finishing third. We feel like he very much showed that he belongs with this kind. A mile and a half--as a Dynaformer--ought to be up his alley. I'm not 100% sure if he likes dirt or turf better, but he certainly showed he's a good horse on dirt. 

LOCHSONG DIES

Lochsong (GB) (Song {GB}–Peckitts Well {GB}), by Lochnager {GB}), one of the most popular European sprinters of the last quarter-century, has died at the age of 26, *Racing Post* reports. She was put down after suffering a bout of colic at owner Jeff Smith's Littleton Stud.

"Sadly we have had Lochsong put down after she suffered from colic, but she was in great health up until today," stud manager David Bowe told the publication. "She was a great servant and lived to a good old age--she had a good innings. She was a fantastic racemare, and a serious character right up until the end."

Also bred by Smith and trained by Ian Balding, Lochsong was consistent--if not spectacular--at three and four, winning handicaps at Goodwood, Doncaster and York in which she defeated respective fields of 30, 22 and 28 horses in 1992. After failing to win in her first four outings at five in 1993, she went on to annex three of her next four, including the G1 Nunthorpe S. and the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp by a remarkable six lengths in bottomless ground.

Her efforts earned her honors as European Horse of the Year and

champion European sprinter. Lochsong ran her streak to seven scores from eight tries into her 6-year-old season, including Ascot's then G2 King's Stand S. before successfully defending in the

G3 King George S. at Goodwood and in the Abbaye, which she took by five lengths. She capped her racing career with a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill in 1994, but could never land a blow behind Cherokee Run at odds of 5-1. cont. p10

She repeated as highweight sprinter in England and France and was retired to the breeding shed with 15 wins from 27 starts and earnings of £600,888.

As a broodmare, Lochsong produced eight foals of racing age, five of which were winners, including SW & MGSP Lochridge (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and SW Loch Verdi (GB) (Green Desert). 
