THE ONE AT LAST

Trainer Kojiro Hashiguchi is no stranger to big race victories. His mantle is adorned with the trophies of such prestigious Group 1s as the Japan Cup, Arima Kinen, Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger) and Yasuda Kinen, and Hashiguchi even pulled off a Dubai-double in 2006, saddling Utopia (Jpn) (Forty Niner) to victory in

the G2 Godolphin Mile, and Heart's Cry (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) to win the G1 Sheema Classic. One race that eluded him, however, was the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby). Before yesterday, Hashiguchi had saddled 19 Derby contestants in 17 years, including four

runners up, one of those being Heart's Cry. It is fitting, then, that a son of Hashiguchi's mighty Heart's Cry would put an end to his frustrating run, and that is exactly what materialized yesterday when **One and Only (Jpn)** valiantly wrestled the lead from race favorite **Isla Bonita (Jpn)** (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) inside the final 100 meters in front of 140,000 fans at Tokyo Racecourse. "I am so overwhelmed with joy that I can't feel my feet on the ground," said Hashiguchi. "I didn't feel so happy when I won the Dubai Sheema Classic with Heart's Cry in 2006. 



Introduced over six furlongs at York in July, The Grey Gatsby made a successful start to his career before finishing runner-up in the G3 Acomb S. over an extra panel back at that venue the following month. No match for Outstrip (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) when three-lengths second to that rival in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster in September, he made little impact in the G1 Racing Post Trophy back there at the end of October before returning to be second to Toormore (Ire) (Arakan) in Newmarket's G3 Craven S. Apr. 17. Clearly in need of further after his subsequent 10th in the May 3 G1 2000 Guineas back over the same track and trip, he was sent to York, where punters expected him to run another honest race in defeat with all the focus on Godolphin's True Story (GB) (Manduro {Ger}). Tearing up the script when joined up with Ryan Moore for the first time, the grey readily upstaged that rival and had most to fear from the strong-finishing Arod (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) as he clung on by 3/4 of a length. Initially well positioned towards the front of the pack from his favorable draw in six, he was chopped and lost places, but gained the rail and was helped by the genuine pace set up ahead. Keeping to the inside as Moore looked for space, he ended up towards the rear with the 2-1 favorite Prince Gibraltar (Fr) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) at the tail behind him. After the home turn, his fence-hugging move had seen him move up to mid-division with Shamkiyr his target and Gonna Run (Fr) (Hurricane Cat) holding him in on his outer. While Gerald Mosse was finding all sorts of traffic on Prince Gibraltar a few lengths adrift, The Grey Gatsby had an ideal split and quickly joined The Aga Khan's eventual runner-up and Gonna Run making a line of three with a furlong to race and was soon beyond recall.

"The ground was drying out quickly and was a little bit too fast in the end," trainer Kevin Ryan said. "That's as quick as he'd want it and he handled it nicely. He needs to get into a rhythm in his races, so it helped that there was a good pace and it looks on that evidence that he'll stay a mile and a half. He is in the G1 Irish Derby [at The Curragh June 28], but he could get a break now and come back for the G1 Juddmonte International [at York Aug. 20] instead. We don't have to make a decision now, so we'll take time to decide. We always liked him and, as he qualifies for the Frenchbred premiums, this is a great day for everybody." Of runner-up Shamkiry, Georges Rimaud, His Highness The Aga Khan's racing manager, said, "He ran a very good race and ran on nicely." Jean-Claude Rouget, trainer of third-placed Prince Gibraltar, was philosophical about the market leader's unlucky passage through the Classic. "He has to be ridden held up like that, so he dictates the tactics and we can't do anything about it," he explained. "It was very difficult to come from behind today, as we saw in the earlier races on the card, so he ran a very good race and will definitely go for the G1 Grand Prix de Paris [at Longchamp July 13]." Of Gonna Run, who flattered to deceive in the closing stages, Rouget added, "He ran a good race, but I thought he looked a bit light beforehand and maybe didn't stay." Race chart p4



On a day when the ground that had looked potentially testing in mid-week dried out rapidly, the bias was with the front-runners, and Spiritjim took full advantage of that and an uncontested lead to extend his tally here.

Expensive as a yearling, the bay had fallen shy of the standard required of the Arc class of 3-yearolds, but ended 2013 with a win in the Listed Prix Vulcain over 1 9/16 miles at Deauville in October. Returning to add the 12furlong Listed Prix Lord Seymour to his resume at Longchamp Apr. 17, he was asked to make all by Christophe Soumillon when back over that track-and-trip in the G3 Prix d'Hedouville May 8. Ears pricked enjoying an easy time throughout, he had to graft when pressed late on by Now We Can,

but was always holding that rival to register a career high. "It is never easy to win over a mile and a half at Chantilly when making all, so it was a very good performance and shows how tough and courageous he is," trainer Pascal Bary commented. "He has gone from strength to strength this season and is getting better with age. We'll see how he comes out of this, but the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud is four weeks away instead of the usual three, which will help. If he is well, he will run there."

Busy at two, Rangali improved with experience and wound up with a second in the Listed Prix Zeddaan over six furlongs at Fontainebleau in November, and showed that he had not gone backwards over the winter break when returning there to win and finish second in 5 1/2-furlong conditions events in March. Fourth in the Apr. 16 Listed Prix Sigy over six here, the chestnut opened his account in that sphere in the Listed Prix Texanita back over 5 1/2 furlongs at Maisons-Laffitte last time May 12. Settled in the slipstream of the eventually unplaced British-trained trio intent on blazing the trail, he struck the front approaching the furlong pole and was quickly beyond the reach of the more confidently ridden Catcall. "I am very impressed with that, as it is difficult for the 3-yearolds against the older sprinters, especially when they are proven ones, but he proved me wrong in great style," his owner, trainer and part-breeder Henri-Alex Pantall said. "He is really a five-furlong horse and can't go further. He is not in the G1 King's Stand S. and has had five races already this year, so it may be best not to supplement him for that and instead give him a break and bring him back with the G1 Nunthorpe S. [at York Aug. 22] in mind."

Campaigning as a homebred for Koji Maeda's North Hills Co., One and Only kept the Japanese Derby trophy in the family after Maeda's younger brother, Shinji Maeda, saw his silks carried to victory last year by Kizuna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}). An unassuming 12th in his racetrack debut at Kokura last August, One and

Only stepped up to be second at Hanshin a month later before getting off the mark over that course Sept. 29. Second by a nose in his black-type debut in Kyoto's Hagi S. when

stretching out to 1 1/16 miles, One and Only checked in sixth, beaten 2 1/2 lengths, behind Isla Bonita in the G3 Tokyo Hai S. Nov. 16, and ended the season on a winning note when taking the G3 Radio Nikkei Hai Nisai S. at Hanshin Dec. 21. One and Only failed to win in his first two outings of 2014, but his efforts nonetheless suggested he would be a Derby threat.

The dark bay finished second, beaten a nose, in the G2 Hochi Hai Yayoi Sho, turning in the fastest final three furlongs of the race, and he repeated that feat when flying late to finish fourth behind Isla Bonita in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) Apr. 20, suggesting he would enjoy yesterday's added distance. Over-racing slightly heading into the first turn, One and Only was eventually settled into sixth on the rail by jockey Horihiro Yokoyama heading into the backstretch, while the front running Ekimae (Jpn) (Meisho Bowler {Jpn}) opened up a daylight lead and Isla Bonita sat an untroubled third. Ekimae suddenly pulled up rounding the turn, leaving Tosen Stardom (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) to take up the lead briefly before being swarmed by Isla Bonita and One and Only, who was tipped out by Yokoyama for his rally. One and Only drew even with Isla Bonita approaching the 200-meter mark, and the pair remained deadlocked for about 150 meters before One and Only overtook his rival in the final strides.

Yokoyama, also the regular rider of Heart's Cry, said: "The pace was too slow and the colt was a bit too keen during the race, but he stretched well. The trainer and his staff conditioned him perfectly for the Derby. He was unable to make a good start in the previous race, but he broke well today and I was able to race him in striking position. He is still immature compared to his sire, but he was able to win the Derby and I hope that he will continue to develop steadily."

One and Only becomes the third Group 1 winner for Heart's Cry, and his second Classic winner in the space of a week after Nuovo Record (Jpn) took last weekend's G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks). The other Group 1 winner is Just A Way (Jpn), winner of the G1 Tenno Sho Autumn and the G1 Dubai Duty Free, and currently the world's highest-rated horse based on the latter performance.

LILY CONNECTIONS LOOKING FOR RAIN



TRAINER JOHN HILLS DIES

Trainer John Hills, son of trainer Barry Hills and brother to retired jockeys Michael and Richard Hills, trainer Charlie Hills and bloodstock insurer George Hills, has passed away at the age of 53 after a brief battle with pancreatic cancer.

After a stint as an amateur jockey and time spent working under trainers Edward O'Grady, Harry Thompson-Jones, John Gosden and his father, Hills took out his training license in 1987 and saddled more than 500 winners throughout his career. He achieved his most notable success when Wind in Her Hair (Ire) (Alzao), second in the G1 Epsom Oaks, won Germany's G1 Aral Pokal S. Wind in Her Hair would go on to produce Japanese superstar Deep Impact (Jpn). His other success stories include Group 2 winners Docksider and Dark Islander (Ire). Hills was also responsible for the early education of Mount Athos (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Hong Kong standout Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}).

Hills had just last year moved to Kingwood House Stables in Lambourn as a trainer for Sheikh Hamdan with the assistance of his father.

"I couldn't have wished for a better older brother and I'll miss him immensely," Charlie Hills told *PA Sport*. "He was always so much fun to be around, extremely clever and witty. He had time for everyone and saw the best in everyone. He was a very talented trainer and we were all so proud of his achievements. [Daughters] Jessica, Olivia, Martha and Issie were a huge credit to him and [wife] Fiona, and I can't begin to explain how much we will miss him as a family."

"I really can't believe it," Michael Hills told *Racing Post*. "I can't believe the speed of the whole thing. I saw him during the Greenham meeting [in April] and you wouldn't have thought he had got a cold. It just grabbed him so quick. We are all so shocked."

Hills is survived by his wife, Fiona, and four daughters.


