At the Belmont Stakes...

CALM BEFORE THE CHROME

With six potential GI Belmont S. starters taking it easy a day after breezing, it was a fairly quiet morning six days out from **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit)'s date with destiny in Elmont, N.Y.

On an absolutely spectacular morning with temperatures in the 60s and cloudless skies above, the GI Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. victor made his way from Barn 26 through the scenic Belmont backstretch with assistant trainer Alan Sherman--sporting a Los Alamitos cap--on the shank shortly after 6 a.m.

A surprisingly small group of media representatives (there may have been more security personnel in pursuit), as well as **Ride on Curlin** (Curlin)'s trainer Billy Gowan made the walk over to Big Sandy as the sun continued to rise by the clubhouse turn.

There were plenty of photographers, however, awaiting California Chrome's arrival near the gap, and just as he's done during his previous victorious stops in Louisville and Baltimore, the flashy chestnut paused a couple of times and ate up every second of the attention.

After receiving his daily dose of love from exercise rider Willie Delgado, the Coburn and Martin homebred returned to the track for the first time since Saturday's sharp four-furlong breeze in :47.61, just as impressive GI Peter Pan S. winner **Tonalist** (Tapit) was completing his routine gallop at around 6:20 a.m.

With Sherman watching from the clocker stand alongside current barnmate Kelly Breen--trainer of 2011 Belmont S. upsetter Ruler On Ice (Roman Ruler)--California Chrome began to jog the wrong way along the outer rail. He quickly disappeared while making his way around the massive 1 1/2-mile oval as conditioner Barclay Tagg chatted with assistant Robin Smullen aboard a pair of stable ponies (has it really been 11 years since Funny Cide's Triple Crown bid?). **cont. p3**



PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

The last couple of weeks have been fairly momentous for Coolmore's stallion team. At the age of 16, the astonishing Galileo reached the extraordinary landmark of 100 worldwide group/graded winners when his daughter Marvellous lived up to her name in the Irish G1 1000 Guineas. Then, seven days later, Mastercraftsman became a Classic sire with his first crop when his very likeable son The Grey Gatsby dominated Sunday's Prix du Jockey-Club.

Mastercraftsman had himself been a very decisive winner of the 2009 Irish 2000 Guineas and he could have a further chance of Classic glory at Epsom later this week. His Group 3-winning daughter Amazing Maria is a contender for the Oaks, though she hasn't raced since her impressive victories last August, and his Group 1-winning son Kingston Hill appears to have a good chance of reaching the first three in the Derby a day later. 

Immediately met on the track by Sherman following his light piece of exercise approximately 10 minutes later, about 15 photographers voyaged back to California Chrome's current digs (also the home of the aforementioned Preakness runner-up) and lined up behind a white fence to get a shot of the big horse's bath session while Sherman remained on the shank.

Meanwhile, **Social Inclusion** (Pioneerof the Nile)--still currently under consideration for either the final leg of the Triple Crown or the seven-furlong Gil Woody Stephens S. on the undercard--quietly made his way to the track just before 7 a.m. Trainer Manny Azpurua couldn't have been pleased while watching from the clocker stand as the Preakness third-place finisher was on his worst behavior during a gate schooling session (he's been asked to return later this week), further casting doubt on his Belmont S. participation.

While that may've concluded the limited morning activity of Belmont S. contenders yesterday, there was still some serious star power on display during the training hours to come.


Goldencents (Into Mischief), an impressive victor of last term's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Santa Anita, looked plenty fit during a strong 7:40 a.m. gallop in preparation for what promises to be a loaded renewal of the GI Metropolitan H. The handsome blaze-faced bay has been off since a disappointing seventh as the 3-1 favorite in the GI Cigar Mile H. at the Big A Nov. 30.

Gary Stevens, who has experienced both sides with Triple Crowns on the line (think Victory Gallop and Silver Charm), briefly checked in on the action with riding crop in hand from behind the rail at the clubhouse turn gap. The Hall of Fame rider chatted with several in attendance, including trainer Bobby Barbara and Social Inclusion's owner Ron Sanchez. Currently left without a mount for the big one, Stevens explained to Barbara his disappointment upon learning of the career-ending injury to Intense Holiday (Harlan's Holiday) via a "TDN Alert" following a recent workout. After receiving a heads-up that two-time champion and GI Ogden Phipps S.-bound **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) would be schooling in the paddock and breezing following the break (much-appreciated, Gary), the stage was set for a fantastic preview of things to come this weekend.

Close Hatches (First Defence)--a distant second behind Beholder in last November's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and unbeaten in a pair of subsequent attempts at four--took care of business first, hammering a bullet four furlongs in :47 1/5 (1/37). *cont. p4*

With Richard Mandella keeping a close eye on Beholder's every move while she was glued to the pony in the paddock, the Spendthrift colorbearer seemed much more at ease once her Hall of Fame trainer grabbed a hold of the reins as it was time to get down to business and head through the tunnel. For Beholder, it was much more of a maintenance work (four furlongs in an easy :49 3/5) as her major preparation was completed in Southern California prior to her Big Apple arrival.

With a slew of Belmont S. contenders scheduled to train and an afternoon luncheon featuring the connections of California Chrome in Manhattan, things promise to be in full swing Tuesday.

PLETCHER TWOSOME READY FOR BELMONT

The Todd-Pletcher duo of **Matterhorn** (Tapit) and **Commissioner** (A.P. Indy) are confirmed for a start in Saturday's GI Belmont S. The former was most recently fourth in the GII Peter Pan S. May 10, while his stablemate was the runner-up. "The distance is the biggest [factor]," Pletcher said of Matterhorn. "I thought he ran okay in the Peter Pan and made a pretty good middle move. I was encouraged by the way he galloped out afterward that a mile and a half would be in his wheelhouse." Joe Bravo gets the ride. As for WinStar's homebred Commissioner, the conditioner explained, "I thought his Peter Pan was an encouraging effort. The main thing is, we've always felt like the mile and a half was kind of what he was looking for."

Tonalist Ready for Classic Test

GII Peter Pan S. winner **Tonalist** (Tapit) exited his work Sunday in fine form, according to trainer Christophe Clement. "He went a mile and a quarter today and trained well," said Clement. "Everything is good; we'll plan on the same tomorrow. He schooled yesterday at lunch time and might school once more, either Wednesday or Thursday." The colt, who took the Peter Pan in pillar-to-post fashion, sat off the pace in his other three starts. As to his positioning Saturday, Clement said it would be up to pilot Joel Rosario. "I've got a pretty good idea who's running, but I'm going to leave that up to [Rosario]," said Clement. "I train and the jockey rides, and he's very good at what he does. My deal is to bring him there as fit as possible and feeling as good as possible and perfectly sound, and [Rosario] will have to worry about the race."

Wicked Strong Exits Work Well

GI Kentucky Derby hard-luck fourth-place finisher **Wicked Strong** (Hard Spun) was in good order following his breeze Sunday morning. He walked the shedrow Monday. "We just wanted a decent work, and we got it," commented trainer Jimmy Jerkens. "He's doing good." Jerkens is confident coming into the weekend's Classic. "Unless you thought your horse had a real good excuse, which I guess we did, we just thought it would have been better to skip the Preakness," he said. "We thought we had the best shot in the Belmont out of all of them, even before we went to Kentucky. There's nothing like the Derby, but we thought the Belmont fit the horse a little better."

Ride On Curlin Shedrows

GI Preakness S. runner-up **Ride On Curlin** (Curlin) walked the shedrow Monday after working seven furlongs in 1:28.03 Sunday. "He's perfect," said conditioner Billy Gowan. "I couldn't hold him on the ground," Gowan said. "He was like that the day after the Derby, too. He's just a tough horse; you can't knock him out. I worked him seven-eighths [Sunday] and he was bucking and playing this morning. I had to walk him with the lip chain. It's pretty amazing really. You don't find horses like that every day."



Still Undecided on Social Inclusion

A decision has yet to be made whether **Social Inclusion** (Pioneerof the Nile) will run in Saturday's GI Belmont S. or in the GI Woody Stephens on the undercard. The colt, who finished third in the GI Preakness S., had some difficulty schooling at the gate yesterday, and owner Ron Sanchez said Social Inclusion was "70-30" to run in the Woody Stephens. "This morning we schooled him and he was acting up a little bit," Sanchez explained. "He started getting a little bit nervous and sweating, and we have to work on that. He was kind of nervous before he went to the gate the first time, but he was calm. When he went back again, he was acting up. We have to do it again on Wednesday and then we'll see. If the entries were taken today, we would not run [in the Belmont]. It wouldn't make any sense."

ONE SUCCESS, SEVERAL PLAYERS...

Sylvain Vidal tells us the story of The Grey Gatsby following his win in the Prix du Jockey Club (Gr.1) at Chantilly on Sunday.

British bloodstock agent, Stephen Hillen works for his own since 2003 after a wealthy experience in training for Paul Cole during 10 years and Barry Hills. He is the buyer of The Grey Gatsby as a yearling and a two year-old. Explanations...



What was your first reaction when The Grey Gatsby passed the post in front?

I watched the race with trainer Kevin Ryan, in the owners lounge "Salon des Propriétaires". This is the best place to see the race on TV. I was overjoyed when the horse landed the Prix du Jockey Club in style. It must have been one of the few Gr.1 races where the jockey (Ryan Moore) did not have to hit the horse once with his whip to win. We were delighted with the way the colt succeeded in this French classic.

You purchased The Grey Gatsby as a yearling, what were his assets?

I saw him a few times before the Arqana October Yearling Sale. When I watched him walking around the ring outside, he really stood out. There were maybe a dozen of yearlings in the ring but this great walker really caught my eyes. He was a strong and powerful individual. I was

very surprised to get him so cheap for €24,000!

Why did you chose to sell him and purchase him again at the Arqana Breeze Up Sale for another client?

Originally, I had a client for the horse so I purchased The Grey Gatsby as a yearling. It appeared that later on, this client decided not to buy the colt anymore so I sent the colt to Grove Stud to be prepared for the Breeze Up Sale. The owner of the stud farm Brendan Holland always liked him. He was doing great during the sales preparation. I found a new potential client for the colt on Brendan Holland's recommendations.

What did the trainer thought of The Grey Gatsby as a juvenile?

Kevin Ryan thought a lot of the horse from day one. His daughter Amy, a jockey, is a great judge and she always believed in the horse. He

was showing a lot at home. He is bred to go 1m2f (2000m) and at the Breeze Up Sale, he faced 5f or 6f horses. He was still able to breeze in a very good time. He already showed he was special.

What were your best horses purchased at Arqana?

I did not buy many there but my first purchase was the 12yo mare Pax Bella, dam of Kendargent. I paid €25,000 for her from Haras des Granges. She was a very nice looking mare, had a good pedigree, was sister to many black type horses and produced a Gr.1 placed sire. I bought her for a new client of mine: James Rowsell of Ashbrittle Stud. The Grey Gatsby is another exciting purchase from Arqana Sales. Breeze Up Sales have already been very lucky for me.

Do you count on Mastercraftsman?

I really like the sire. I bought two yearlings by Mastercraftsman. I picked The Grey Gatsby as an individual initially. I really liked him, the horse comes first. Looks and physique are the first and main assets for me. Two former purchases Astaire (Middle Park Stakes Gr.1) and Blaine (Gimerack Stakes Gr.2) show that physique really counts for me.

This early evidence suggests that Mastercraftsman has the talent to step into the shoes of his sire Danehill Dancer, whose retirement at the age of 21 was announced recently. This is no small compliment. Despite starting out at a very modest fee, Danehill Dancer rose to become champion sire in Britain and Ireland in 2009, having finished runner-up to his sire Danehill in 2006 and to Galileo in 2008. Danehill Dancer also landed the title of champion sire of 2-year-olds on three occasions (2006, 2008 and 2009).

Mastercraftsman will have his work cut out to match Danehill Dancer's worldwide total of more than 80 group winners, but he already has five from his first crop, so the task may not be beyond him. He faces the usual handicap of having a second crop smaller than his first and a third crop smaller than his second. **cont. p6**

However, some good first-crop yearling prices, coupled with a reduction in his fee to €12,500, fully restored his popularity last year in his fourth season. Then his 2013 success with the likes of Kingston Hill and Amazing Maria boosted his 2014 fee to €35,000 and he is no doubt again much in demand.

Mastercraftsman isn't the only son of Danehill Dancer with a Group 1 winner to his credit this year, as Choisir is the sire of the impressive Lockinge S. winner Olympic Glory. Coincidentally, Choisir and Mastercraftsman share the highest *Racing Post* rating--127--of all of Danehill Dancer's progeny. Next come three more sons with ratings of 124. One of them is Fast Company, whose first yearlings created quite a stir in the sales ring last year. He has already been represented by four winners, including the high-priced yearling Baitha Alga. Another of the trio rated 124 is Al Shaqab's Planteur, a winner of the G1 Prix Ganay who is standing his first season in France this year. He should prove an asset to the French industry, and The Grey Gatsby's Jockey-Club victory won't have done Planteur any harm.

The Grey Gatsby was sold for only €24,000 as a yearling, but he was clearly much more impressive when he reappeared at Arqana's Breeze Up Sale at Saint-Cloud in May last year. This time he made €120,000, which now looks small fry in comparison to the €857,100 he collected at Chantilly. His consignors at Saint-Cloud--Grove Stud--clearly did a good job, as The Grey Gatsby was ready to make a winning debut just two months after the sale.

The colt's classic victory came over 1 5/16 miles, which is very close to the longest distance Mastercraftsman was ever asked to tackle. Although there is no shortage of speed in the bottom half of the colt's pedigree, I wouldn't be surprised were he to stay a mile and a half.

One aspect of The Grey Gatsby's pedigree which will interest American readers is the presence as his third dam of Maximova. This top-class daughter of Green Dancer has made a sizeable impact on American racing as the second dam of Malibu Moon.

Although this winner of a maiden special weight race at Hollywood Park doesn't receive a mention in The Grey Gatsby's [brisnet.com catalogue-style pedigree](http://brisnet.com/catalogue-style/pedigree), he has, of course, developed into one of America's best stallions, with a Kentucky Derby winner among his total of more than 30 graded winners.

Maximova is also the third dam of Dynaformer's smart son Temple City, whose first 2-year-olds have sold for up to \$230,000.

Another of Maximova's claims to fame is her Group 1-winning son Septieme Ciel, who sired the dam of the phenomenal Cirrus des Aigles. Maximova herself enjoyed Group 1 success in the Prix de la Salamandre--a win which extended her unbeaten record to five. Although that unbeaten record was lost on her final juvenile start, Maximova proved just as effective as a sophomore. There were some doubts about her stamina, though, as she reverted successfully to sprinting after taking third place in the French 1000 Guineas and second in the Irish equivalent.

Maximova appeared to have everything required to develop into a very successful broodmare. In addition to her impressive achievements on the track, she was described by Timeform as a big, attractive, imposing filly and she also had the attraction of coming from the same family as the 2000 Guineas winner Nonoalco and the high-class Stradavinsky. She didn't disappoint. No doubt helped considerably by visiting a virtual who's who of America's best stallions, she produced two stakes winners to Blushing Groom, plus others by Seattle Slew, Nureyev and Mr. Prospector (Malibu Moon's Group 1-winning dam Macoumba).

The Grey Gatsby's branch of the family hadn't been a major contributor to the family fortunes until the son of Mastercraftsman came along. His second dam, Maximova's Kingmambo filly Metisse, was a minor winner in France. Metisse has produced a few above-average performers, such as her useful Dansili colt Saint Thomas and The Grey Gatsby's dam Marie Vison. This daughter of the 2000 Guineas winner Entrepreneur went in search of black-type after her win over Deauville's all-weather track and succeeded when a close second in the Prix Solitude over a mile.

The disappointing Entrepreneur was one of the sons which, for a while, raised nagging doubts about Sadler's Wells's ability as a sire of sires. However, he sired a Classic winner in Vintage Tipple (Irish Oaks) and now he is the broodmare sire of another Classic winner.

Revamped Breeders' Cup Challenge Series Looks to Grow Racing

The Breeders' Cup 2014 Challenge Series could not ask for a better launching pad than the undercard of this Saturday's GI Belmont S. With millions of casual and potential fans tuning in to watch California Chrome's Triple Crown bid, the Breeders' Cup will have a direct line to its target audience.

"As soon as NBC comes on the air, the first race they are going to show is the GI Metropolitan H., which will introduce and explain the Challenge series," Peter Rotondo, the Breeders' Cup Vice President of Media and Entertainment, said. "So I think we'll get a nice buzz to kick the series off."

This year, the Challenge series will be presented as the result of a partnership between the Breeders' Cup and NBC. The series will feature 18 "Win and You're In" qualifying races for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic over 11 telecasts. While the races leading up to the Breeders' Cup Classic have been televised in the past, the programming was purchased and promoted solely by the Breeders' Cup. By partnering with NBC, the Breeders' Cup will benefit from a wider and more robust marketing campaign.

"In the past we've put races on TV, but we haven't really spent behind them to promote and drive them," Breeders' Cup Vice President of Marketing Justin McDonald said. "We're rolling a new [multi-platform] campaign that will look to go after channels and publications where we think we have a strong crossover in audiences."

Rotondo added that he thinks the series will be successful because it is offering a more compelling slate of races.

"Last time we had a series of races on TV, it was more quantity than quality," Rotondo said. "[This will be] the best racing schedule that has ever been put on television."

NBC analyst Randy Moss will contribute a weekly ranking of the horses contending for a spot in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

"Randy, I think, is really the key here," Rotondo said. "The idea is that he'll have rankings each week to try and tell the story of these Classic horses all year long."

In order to reach beyond NBC's audience, the campaign has also made media buys to sponsor content in *Sports Illustrated* and *People.com* that will profile owners and "celebrity ambassadors" and their relationship with racing.

"The idea is to get people into the story, so it's not just a straight advertisement," McDonald said.

"So you might see a sponsored story in *Sports Illustrated* about Joe Torre and why he loves racing. And that story will be wrapped around the Breeders' Cup Challenge."

The Challenge will also feature a "micro-site" that will be activated with race-specific content the day of major telecasts.

"Our site will be full of content from video, to stuff about fashion--'What should I wear to these races?'-- and we'll have content for the newbies as well," Rotondo said.

One of the focuses of the peripheral content will be to introduce new fans to handicapping and betting.

"People are going to be interested in how they can make some money on this," Rotondo said. "So we're going to have the Horseplayers from the *Esquire Network* giving handicapping tips, and feature horseplayers from the National Handicapping Championship (NHC) Tour who have made lots of money betting the races."

The partnership will also promote a Million Dollar Finish game alongside the Challenge series that will offer viewers a low-risk entry into wagering. Fans will have the opportunity to win \$15,000 for 11 of the Challenge races by predicting the top 10 finishers in the correct order. Even if fans do not predict the exact order, they can earn points for partially correct cards--for instance, correctly predicting the first-place finisher of a race will be worth 100 points, with descending point values down to 10th place. The person with the most cumulative points at the end of the 11 Challenge races will win a VIP trip to the Breeders' Cup Championships. Fans will also be given the opportunity to predict the exact order of the Classic, where a winning card will be worth \$1 million.

"It's kind of like a bracketology contest," McDonald said. "It's easy to sign up and easy to play. It just gives people a chance to engage further with the broadcast and gives them added incentive to watch the race."

NBC broadcasts, and the content that will be featured alongside them, will include instructions and links to direct interested fans to sites where they can open a betting account.

"Obviously, we're in the gambling business," Rotondo said. "In the past, people have been skittish about promoting gambling directly--even though we're showing the odds and payouts--but this year we are going to have a direct call to action to open an account."

The hope is that the sum of these efforts will lead to a larger, year-round audience for televised racing.

"We're not just putting races on TV, we've really tried to build a multi-channel platform," McDonald said. "We hope this will give the challenge its best opportunity to grow and attract fans into the sport."
