#### **OVER THE MOON**

Randy Patterson's Moonshine Mullin (Albert the Great)--haltered for \$40,000 off Maggi Moss and Steve Asmussen at Remington Park last November (Featured in Friday's TDN)--continued his winning ways with a 10-1 upset in the GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs Saturday night. With regular pilot Calvin Borel in the irons, the GII Alysheba S. hero sat a stalking trip while perched on the outside in second. He took over on the far turn, but was immediately confronted by Departing (War Front). Still with plenty left in the tank, Moonshine Mullin turned back that rival in the stretch and held off the long-striding champion Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) by 1 3/4 lengths. "If he never wins another race, it's been a great ride," trainer Randy Morse said after winning his first Grade I. "But as good as he's doing, who knows? You never know, that's one thing about this sport, they come from everywhere. I'm very happy with him, though." Cont. p5

#### ALL IOTAPA IN VANITY

Hronis Racing's **lotapa** (Afleet Alex)--a wire-to-wire heroine of the GII Santa Maria S. Feb. 15--dominated five rivals to register a career high in the GI Vanity S. at Santa Anita. With jockey Joe Talamo going for a Grade I double, lotapa was sent to the front from her rail draw, rattled off fractions of :22.76 and :46.56 and dropped the hammer in the stretch to score by an eyecatching 10 1/4 lengths. **Grace Hall** (Empire Maker) was second. "The fractions weren't too fast for her so she was able to gain a breather at one point and it was amazing the way she kicked away like she did," Talamo said. **Cont. p7**

Andre Fabre yesterday gave the green light for Ballymore Thoroughbred's May 4 G1 1000 Guineas winner **Miss France (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) to line up, with the warm spell drying the ground sufficiently. "The ground will be perfect and, although there are some



light showers forecast, it won't change," Fabre told Racing Post. "Unless there is unforeseen torrential rainfall, she will run." Miss France is not the sole Classic winner in the line-up, with Antonio Caro and Gerard Augustin-Normand's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Avenir **Certain (Fr)** (Le Havre {Ire}) bidding to follow in the steps of the recent Diane scorers **Divine Proportions** (Kingmambo), Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) and Golden Lilac

Martin Schwartz Horsephotos (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) by

completing the Longchamp-Chantilly double. There was no disputing her superiority in the May 11 feature, where the re-opposing Xcellence (Fr) (Champs Elysees {GB}) and Bawina (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) were third and fourth, respectively. The former steps up beyond a mile for the first time and on pedigree, Martin Schwartz's recent purchase is likely to appreciate the extra distance as well as the drying conditions. "The ground....in the Guineas....was too soft for what she wants," trainer Francois Doumen told *PA Sport.* "Her finest quality is her turn of foot--she has the most wonderful acceleration--which she showed [when first] in the G3 Prix Imprudence [at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 3] and [when second in] the G3 Prix Miesque [at Maisons-Laffitte in November]. The question you have is, will she stay? Looking at her pedigree, she should stay, but if you look at her races, you have a doubt. But she's a month older and that will maybe help her stay a little further. She was being considered for the [G1 June 21] Coronation S. but was been bought by Martin Schwartz to run in the Prix de Diane. It's a very high-class race with three or four fillies at a very high level, which is quite unusual." Bawina can be excused for her latest reversal in the Pouliches, as trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias has long been convinced that the Wertheimer homebred needs more than a mile to be at her best. Impressive when successful by five lengths on her prior start at Saint-Cloud Mar. 30, the bay gives the impression she is up to this standard and her lack of black-type is a temporary situation. Most of the remainder appear to have limitations, with the two unexposed types Local Hero (Fr) (Zamindar) and Jon and Julia Aisbitt's Lavender Lane (Ire) (Shamardal) needing to find huge improvement to be in the shake-up.

# Why would you encourage current and potential owners to attend this conference?



Borel has been aboard for Moonshine Mullin's last three starts. "Randy [Morse] has

been doing so well with him," Borel said. "The first morning I was out on him working after the Alysheba, he didn't really work like I thought he should have. But boy, it's funny, when a horse peaks, they peak. When I came back and worked him again about five days ago, he was a totally different horse, like he had gotten his seat back under him. I rode him with a lot of confidence today. We were stepping up, I know we beat some of these same horses a few weeks back, and early on I was afraid it may have taken too much out of him, but as we got closer, Randy had him ready to go. He's a nice, nice horse."

Owner Randy Patterson, a cattle buyer from Kansas, was on hand for the victory. "It was awesome, absolutely awesome," he said. "This was my first Grade I win, the Alysheba was my first Grade II win and coming down that stretch today I was just like, 'This is not supposed to happen with a claiming horse.' But he'll stay right here, I don't have any idea what will be next for him."

A game third behind Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita, Obviously put together a three-race winning streak last year, including the Shoemaker and GII Del Mar Mile H. Aug. 25. Fourth as the 1-2 chalk in Santa Anita's GII City of Hope Mile S. Oct. 5, he tired to finish fifth behind Wise Dan in the Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 2, his final start for the now retired Mitchell. Transferred to his longtime assistant, Obviously blew the doors off in his 6-year-old debut with a 5 1/2-length win in the GIII American S. at Santa Anita May 17. Regular pilot Joe Talamo was aboard yesterday.

"He's all class," Talamo said. "He was going fast, but he was doing it fairly easily. With him, you don't have a choice though. His thing is going to the front. If I would have taken him back, we wouldn't have won. You give him his head and let him do it. He is one of the best l've ever sat on. I just waited as long as I could to make my move because I knew we had closers coming after us. It's amazing he could still accelerate after running as fast as he did."

Co-owner Anthony Fanticola said, "He obviously doesn't like horses in front of him! Obviously likes to be in front."

Co-owner Joseph Scardino added, "This means a lot to me 'cause at my age [82], you gotta savor these. I realize how difficult it is to win one of these. You appreciate it more as you get older."

It certainly appeared on paper that the Matt Winn went through Tapiture, and so it proved, as the chestnut ran out an easy winner to get the second half of the season off on a high note. It should be a great spectacle, I'm not saying only four horses can win it, but with War Command (War Front), us, and Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and Night Of Thunder, it's a race to really look forward to on the first day of Royal Ascot."

#### ESTIMATE SHINES IN NEWMARKET WORK

Hopes of a G1 Gold Cup repeat for Estimate (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) at Royal Ascot rose markedly after the Queen's mare shone in a piece of work in Newmarket Saturday morning. The 5-year-old has only been seen once since her famous triumph 12 months ago, when she became the first horse running in the colours of a reigning monarch to lift the historic staying championship. Trainer Sir Michael Stoute admitted earlier this week that a setback in her preparation had hindered her progress but that he was expecting a bold defense of her crown. Estimate and Ryan Moore worked with Hillstar (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) on the Al Bahathri Polytrack, coming out on top. Speaking at Sandown, the Queen's Racing Manager John Warren said, "She's not as tuned as last year with the [G3] Sagaro [S.] run, but then she's with a master trainer. Sir Michael rang me this morning to say she had done a really nice piece of work. She did a serious piece about 10 days ago and needed a couple of pieces of fine-tuning, but he said 'we're where I need to be.'"

The 5-year-old clinched the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and the G1 Irish Champion S. last season before narrow defeats in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and in the G1 Hong Kong Vase. She disappointed on her first start of 2014 when 11th of 13 behind Just a Way (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in the Dubai Duty Free at Meydan, but pleased connections in a workout on Saturday morning and is on course for a second tilt at the 10-furlong feature, having finished third behind AI Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Mukhadram (GB) (Shamardal) 12 months ago. Simon Marsh, racing manager to Lord and Lady Lloyd-Webber, said, "She worked [Saturday] morning, she worked well and everyone was very happy. All being well she'll run on Wednesday. It looks as though she'll get her ground and it's her optimum trip, so we'll see how we get on. Its a very tough ask with the brilliant Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) in the field, but we'll give it our best."

#### **CONDITIONS EASE AT ASCOT**

Ascot's clerk of the course Chris Stickels remains "delighted" with track conditions despite significant rainfall in Berkshire overnight ahead of next week's Royal meeting. Course officials watered the course on both Wednesday and Friday of this week, with very little rain forecast ahead of the biggest five days in the Flat racing calendar. However, Stickels was surprised to discover 15 millimetres of rain fell from Friday evening up until 8 a.m. on Saturday and has changed the official going description to good-to-soft, good in places. Stickels insists the unexpected rainfall is no cause for alarm and he expects conditions to dry out between now and the start of Royal Ascot on Tuesday. Stickels said: "There is the possibility of a residual shower later this morning, but then it is forecast to be dry until at least Wednesday. It's not as though we're racing today. We don't race until Tuesday, so we're quite happy the rain has come. We had discussed watering on Sunday, but we shouldn't need to do that now and hopefully we won't have to water between now and racing. Hopefully we'll end up with perfect ground."

Uncle Sigh looks poised to finally capture that elusive first graded stakes win here, but will have to fight off two very strong competitors to do it. Albano was last seen finishing fifth in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 29, but was promoted to fourth through disqualification. St. Elias Stables and West Point Thoroughbreds' Ring Weekend (Tapit) returns to his preferred distance of 1 1/16 miles in this test. Earning his diploma over that distance at Gulfstream Feb. 8, the chestnut won the GII Tampa Bay Derby--also at 1 1/16 miles--next out Mar. 8. Second as the heavy favorite in the Calder Derby Apr. 5, the Graham Motion trainee was fifth last time in the GI Preakness S. May 17. "It looks like there is plenty of pace in the race," Motion said. "I think my horse is pretty adaptable, so I'm not overly concerned about it. He ended up getting shuffled back probably a little further than we would have liked in the Preakness, but if he had a better trip I think he could have finished a little closer. I don't think being off the pace affected him too much. He's a horse that you can kind of put where you like."

#### *Wildcat Red Works Towards Comebacker...* Wildcat Red (D'wildcat), this year's GIII Hutcheson S. and GII Besilu Fountain of Youth S. winner, drilled three

furlongs Saturday morning in :36 4/5 as he prepares to kick off the second half of his sophomore season in the \$75,000 Quality Road S. at Gulfstream Park June 28. "I didn't do a lot with him. I didn't want to breeze him five-eighths because the 'dogs' were up," trainer Jose Garoffalo explained. "He galloped and we let him

stretch his legs the last three-eighths." Runner-up to Constitution (Tapit) in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 29, Wildcat Red was most recently 18th in the GI Kentucky Derby May 3. He is slated to have his final pre-race breeze next weekend for the Quality Road, a 1 1/16-mile event restricted to 3-year-olds. "It doesn't take much to get him fit," said Garoffalo. "He'll breeze five-eighths next week and he'll be ready for the 28th."



#### **BENJAMIN NADOLA**:

Randy Moss's Op/ed (<u>TDN, June, 12</u>) identified the Triple Crown as having "problems that are getting worse." After reading his various opinions, I am a bit astounded that he did not give consideration to the probable and obvious correlation between the use of Lasix and other raceday meds and recent Triple Crown failures (as well as a dramatic reduction in lifetime starts).

Mr. Moss did touch on several issues which caused me to share some of my own observations as someone who has followed horseracing for over 50 years.

**Modern Thoroughbred Fragility**: I have read numerous articles in the TDN and the BloodHorse over the years in which individuals with valid scientific credentials clearly state that the basic physiological and genetic composition of today's Thoroughbred is not significantly different than the Thoroughbred of 30 or 50 years ago. To claim that today's Thoroughbreds are more fragile is in my opinion simply another myth created by trainers as a convenient excuse for fewer starts. Fewer lifetime starts and the myth of increased fragility are often a function of asking 2-year-olds for too much speed too early in their lives (as exhibited in preparation for and conduct of 2-year-old in training sales), repetitive training methods with little downtime at the farm, the excessive use and abuse of drugs as a quick-fix substitute for true horsemanship, trainers' efforts to protect their win percentages, and early retirement because of the huge cost of training fees and vet expenses.

**Importance of a Comprehensive Plan**: Any tinkering with the Triple Crown must be examined in terms of the impact on racing and the industry down the line. Mr. Moss made no mention of how the other downstream Grade 1 events for 3-year-old colts and fillies might be affected by changes in the dates. The fields for the Haskell, Travers, and the numerous 3/up Grade 1s could be altered significantly, as could the Super Derby, the PA Derby, West Virginia Derby, and other numerous quality Grade 2 races.

Some suggestions for promoting a competitive and meaningful Triple Crown that can also lead to the development and retention of fan interest and enthusiasm:

#### A. For the horses:

 1) Initiate immediate elimination of all raceday meds.
 2) Ensure proper funding for improved and comprehensive drug testing to stay ahead of the "illegal

pharmaceutical curve." 3) Establish a veterinary intern program in coordination with vet schools to place interns at the tracks to effectively monitor all stabled horses, using appropriate reporting protocols.

4) Relocate Churchill Downs' patron seating at the starting gate of the KY Derby to allow the gates to be positioned at a 90 degree angle to the track, permitting a clear straightaway at the start of the race. (Or, simply reduce the maximum field size to less than 20.)

#### B. For the owners, trainers & jockeys:

1) Offer participants in the Triple Crown the opportunity to earn generous bonuses for racing in all three events. Establish a \$3 million owners' bonus for the highest number of points earned via finish position in all three races, with 60% to the highest point earner, 20% to the next, etc.

2) Re-establish the \$5 million bonus for the winner of the Triple Crown.

3) Tie-in another \$5 million bonus if the Triple Crown winner takes the BC Classic in the same year.

#### C. For the fans:

1) Leave the current racing dates of the Triple Crown as they currently exist.

2) Ask NBC (alone or in conjunction with advertisers and participating tracks) to sponsor and promote a \$10 million Guaranteed \$.10 Superfecta (or similar exotic fractional wager) for each Triple Crown race. (I am confident that each ADW site would contribute to this promo.)

3) Beyond the Triple Crown, bundle large guaranteed wagering pool opportunities for other Grade 1 races leading up to the Breeders' Cup. Also create similar racing bonus structures to attract the top runners and maintain fan interest.
