Graham Motion, who annexed the 2011 renewal with State of Play (War Front), has two chances for a second trophy. Albert Frassetto's **Strong Coffee** (Warrior's Reward) leads Motion's two-pronged attack

off a good-looking three-length debut score at this distance Aug. 2. The \$120,000 OBSMAR graduate was further flattered when runner-up Face the Music (Stormy Atlantic) returned to take them gate to wire this past Saturday. "The thing about this horse that's so neat is

he just has this really remarkable attitude," offered Motion. "He's just a very kind of cool, laid-back horse and takes everything very well, so that helps him." Motion's less-fancied entrant will be Stonestreet homebred **Hot Tin Roof** (More Than Ready), who earned his diploma from off the pace going six panels on the Presque Isle synth July 30. While he may look in tough on paper, the bay is bred for early stakes success--he hails from the family of juvenile champions Minardi and Johannesburg. Todd Pletcher will seek back-to-back With Anticipation scores with sons of War Front. This year's Pletcher representative **Designed for War** dictated terms first out going this trip and never looked back Aug. 9. "He had a bit of a pace advantage that day and he was able to kind of get an easy lead, and was good enough to take advantage of it," Pletcher said of the Glencrest Farm and JSM Equine representative. "It was just a result of the way the race unfolded, but we were pretty happy with the way he did it." Klaravich Stables and Bill Lawrence's **Startup Nation** (Temple City) proved too good for New York-bred maidens Aug. 7. Ken and Sarah Ramsey colorbearer **International Star** (Fusaichi Pegasus) aired by 5 1/2 lengths in a June 21 turf sprint down state, but failed to reproduce that effort when a distant second in the July 13 Rockville Center S. on the Belmont main track.

CLIFFS FILLY TOPS STRONG PREMIER SESSION

By Emma Berry

While nothing could surpass the top price of £230,000 from Tuesday's opening session of the DBS Premier Yearling Sales, a £180,000 first-crop daughter of Canford Cliffs (Ire) led the second and final day's trade, which included 12 six-figure transactions.

The sustained demand for yearlings at this auction "built on the individual," according to DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby, and renowned for producing smart, sharp juveniles, the sale saw another high clearance rate--

87% for the day and 88% overall--with the total Premier Sales aggregate of £15,512,500 up by 17% on last year's tally. The average surged to £37,111, a rise of 14%, while the median also improved, by 8%, to £27,000.

The second session alone cleared £7,689,500 (+20%) for 210 horses from the 241 offered at an average of £36,617 (+10%) and median of £27,000 (+8%). **Cont. p3**

“With seven individual stakes winners from last year’s sale alone and a catalogue that we felt had taken another step up, the scene was set for the 2014 renewal of our flagship DBS sale to return some strong figures, and the two days have not disappointed,” said Beeby. “Every statistic has advanced over 2013, which returned figures that rose by a quarter on the previous edition. This was a sale of real strength and depth, a sentiment that is only reinforced by a very solid clearance rate of 88%.”

The team of Saleh Al Homaizi, Imad Al Sagar and Tony Nereses proclaimed their liking for the stock of first-crop sires on Tuesday when buying a son of Dream Ahead for £130,000, and during Wednesday’s session they added two yearlings by Coolmore freshman Canford Cliffs (Ire) to their list of purchases at £180,000 and £140,000, respectively. expensive of the two-- and the top filly of the sale--was [lot 334](#), a massive pinhooking triumph for Luke Barry of Ireland’s Manister House Stud, who bought her for 23,000gns at Tattersalls last December. The good-looking first foal of the dual-winning Danehill Dancer (Ire)

mare Decorative (Ire) also caught the attention of Amanda Skiffington, but she had to settle for second best as Al Homaizi placed the final bid from just outside the ring.

Roger Varian, who trains recent G1 Prix Jean Romanet runner-up Princess Loulou (Ire) (Pivtotal {GB}) for the partners, will also take charge of this newly acquired filly. Cont. p4

The team's second Canford Cliffs yearling was

lot 301, a half-brother to the GI San Capistrano H. and GI San Luis Rey S. winner Juniper Pass (Lemon Drop Kid), who provided a significant milestone for his breeder and vendor Biddestone Stud, which consigned eight yearlings at the sale.

Signal's Sister to Chasemore...

Just five lots from the end of play, a half-sister to this year's leading 2-year-old in Europe The Wow Signal (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), by popular freshman sire Zoffany (Ire), breathed life into the closing stages of the sale when bought for £150,000 by Paul Coombe of Chasemore Farm on behalf of his boss, the Betfair co-founder Andrew Black. The solid filly ([lot 497](#)), who is the second foal of her unraced dam Muravka (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), drew interest from Geoffrey Howson and under-bidder Joe Foley, but Coombe's sole bid was enough to seal the deal and bring the sale to a pleasing end for her vendor, The Premier Consignment.

The County Tipperary trio of Peter Collier, Jim Carey and Philip Blake are the men behind The Premier Consignment, which this year will offer 46 yearlings for sale. Coombe said, "To me she was a great specimen, good-bodied and a great mover, and of course she has a pedigree. Obviously, we hope to see The Wow Signal go on next year, but he's already done enough to become a stallion."

Shadwell Stocking Up...

Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum has enjoyed a terrific season on the track in Europe, headlined by G1 Investec Oaks and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. winner Taghrooda (Ire), and his bloodstock advisor Angus Gold was kept busy at Doncaster, signing for 17 lots across the two days for a total of £1,420,000. Top of the second-session purchases was a son of Big Bad Bob ([lot 326](#)) from the Hollyhill Stud draft, who was finally knocked down for £150,000.

While young stallions are a feature of this sale, so are young mares. This colt was just the second foal of Lady O'Reilly's winning Dansili (GB) mare Dance Hall Girl (Ire), whose Acclamation colt Kasbah (Ire) was a £160,000 purchase at DBS last year and has been placed in a maiden this season for trainer Johnny Murtagh. Plenty of good juveniles have emanated from the family, including dual Classic winner Bachir (Ire), who took the G2 Richmond S. at two, and his half-brother Elliots World (Ire). *Cont. p7*

It's no surprise that Fast Company, whose debutantes include the G2 Norfolk S. winner Baitha Alga (Ire), is increasingly popular in the sales ring, and Gold went to £140,000 for his chestnut first foal of the Pivotal (GB) mare Brigantia (GB) ([lot 278](#)), an unraced half-sister to the Group 3-placed dual winner Britannic (GB) (Rainbow Quest {GB}).

As usual at this particular auction, Peter and Ross Doyle were the busiest buyers with 28 yearlings secured for an array of clients. Sheikh Fahad Al Thani's buying team of David Redvers, Hannah Wall and Peter Molony also had plenty on their list and ended the sale with 13 yearlings for an outlay of £838,000 to add to the Qatar Racing ranks for next season. For the second year running, Tony O'Callaghan's Tally-Ho Stud topped the vendors' list with 20 yearlings sold for £874,000.

ZZ Tops for Skiffington...

Amanda Skiffington found herself outgunned on the day's top lot but struck for two of the more expensive offerings on Wednesday, including Weir View stud's Zebedee (Ire) colt out of Kiva (GB) (Indian Ridge {GB}) ([lot 439](#)) at £140,000.

Fiona Jennings is the new owner of another Skiffington purchase, a Zoffany colt ([lot 293](#)) out of Chameleon (GB) (Green Desert) who became his sire's top-selling yearling of the sale when exiting the ring to a bid of £120,000.

"I liked the Zoffany foals and this is a lovely colt," said the agent of the Pier House Stud consignee. "Twice I was at the opposite end of the yard from where he was and he kept catching my eye. He's such a lovely mover."

Lilbourne Lad (Ire) is yet another freshman sire to have been well received at Doncaster, with Ross Doyle having signed for his top-priced colt at £130,000. Pinhooked by Jimmy Murphy, who splashed out €55,000 for him as a foal, [lot 320](#) brought about a decent profit for the Redpender Stud operation and helped his sire's average for the sale to £38,219 for 16 sold.

OAKS WINNER TALENT RETIRED

Last year's G1 Investec Oaks heroine **Talent (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}--Prowess {Ire}, by Peintre Celebre) has been retired from racing and will return to her birthplace at Ashbrittle Stud to be bred next year.

Trained by Ralph Beckett, Talent won the Listed Pretty Polly S. three weeks before upsetting her favored stablemate Secret Gesture (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Oaks. That Classic marked Talent's third and final career victory, but she recorded placings in last year's G1 St Leger and

G1 Qipco British Champions Fillies & Mares S. She was last seen finishing fifth in the Aug. 21 G1 Yorkshire Oaks. She retires with earnings of £489,197.

"It has been decided to retire Talent," said Beckett. "She gave us the best day of our training career when winning the Oaks last year and she ran right up to her best when running second in the St Leger three months later. But it became obvious that she is not the same filly this year, and so it became clear that the best thing to do was to retire her. We will miss her, but with luck we can look forward to training her progeny."

LOS AL FUTURITY ADDED TO DERBY SERIES

The \$500,000 GI Los Alamitos Futurity has been added to the 2014-15 "Road to the Kentucky Derby" Series. The race, formerly run at Hollywood Park as the Hollywood Futurity (1981-2006) and CashCall Futurity (2007-2013), will be contested at the Cypress, CA oval for the first time Dec. 20. "The robust commitments by the team at Los Alamitos suggest a strong desire to be included in our series, and we're confident the race is likely to attract aspiring and compelling Derby prospects," said Churchill Downs Racetrack President Kevin Flanery. "We're delighted to welcome the Los Alamitos Futurity to the Kentucky Derby 'Prep Season.'" The Los Alamitos Futurity will offer a point structure of 10-4-2-1 for the top four finishers. MORPHINE POSITIVES FOR HILLS

Trainer Barry Hills, who in June was granted a temporary license after the death of his eldest son, John, has been named as the fifth trainer to have had horses in his care test positive for morphine this summer in Britain. Hills has two horses--Soul Intent (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Jolly Red Jeanz (Ire) (Intense Focus)--test positive in a saga that has been linked to a likely case of contaminated feed.

The British Horseracing Authority has scheduled a disciplinary hearing Sept. 25 for four of the five trainers involved. Trainer Eve Johnson-Houghton's case will be heard separately. A statement from the BHA read, "It will be BHA's position at this hearing that the source of the positive samples was a contaminated batch of feed and that the trainers took all reasonable precautions to avoid breaching the rules of racing. BHA will submit that no financial penalty should be imposed. However, according to the rules of racing, the horses involved should be disqualified from the relevant races."

LEVY UNDER SCRUTINY

The British betting levy will be the subject of a 10-week consultation to "determine how best to bring it up to date," according to Sports Minister Helen Grant.

The consultation will ask for views on two options--reforming the existing levy, or replacing it with a bespoke statutory framework.

"Horseracing and betting have grown together over the last 200 years, with each helping to shape the other," Grant said. "They have a unique and entirely interdependent relationship. The levy is a fine idea that helps maintain the health of the sport, but it is not working as well as it should. It urgently needs to reflect the modern reality of horse racing and betting."

The government has ruled out keeping the levy unchanged, and has stated it won't be scrapped without a replacement.

GOSDEN GUNNING FOR SIXTH LEGER

Trainer John Gosden is no stranger to success in the G1 St Leger, the world's oldest Classic, having bagged the 14-furlong marathon five times, and the Newmarket conditioner will rely on three sophomores--**Romsdal (GB)** (Halling), **Forever Now (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Marzocco** (Kitten's Joy)--to make it a half dozen Sept. 13.

"We've got three horses in the race who all belong in it," Gosden said. "The plan for the moment is those three horses will run. They all have legitimate claims."

Princess Haya's Romsdal, the 7-1 co-second choice, has just a maiden win to his credit, but he displayed his talent when finishing second in the G3 Chester Vase, followed by a third in the G1 Investec Derby.

He was most recently seventh in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. July 26.

"Romsdal ran a great race in the Derby and ran very well at Chester," Gosden noted. "He didn't run a good race in the King George. He got done on that looser ground and spun his wheels. He's a legitimate horse for the race and we've always had the Derby, the King George and then the Leger as his plan."

Forever Now and Marzocco are outside propositions at 16-1 and 33-1, respectively, but Gosden nonetheless expressed confidence.

"Forever Now won very well the other day in the [Listed] March S. [Aug. 23], which is a proper trial for the Leger. He stays well--the one mile, six [furlongs] and 132 yards will not bother him one bit and he's got a grand attitude."

Of Marzocco, a last-out fourth in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York Aug. 20, Gosden added, "Marzocco was staying on again in the Voltigeur. He's a very idle horse, very laid back and he doesn't seem to wake up until the race is virtually over."

"He's had a little setback," said Angus Gold, racing manager to Sheikh Hamdan. "We're going to struggle to get him back on the track this year."

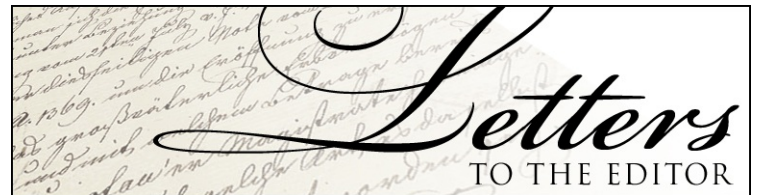
Faydhan was a six-length winner of his lone outing at Haydock July 3 for trainer John Gosden, and is the 12-1 third choice for next year's G1 2000 Guineas.

"Hopefully it's nothing major, just bad timing," Gold added. "We're trying to find out how serious it is. He's definitely had a setback and he won't run for a while. It's a leg injury, but hopefully nothing major. It's just going to hold him up for a while, quite possibly for the rest of the season."

Has come back with one company drill on Travers Day with a nice colt named Royal Squeeze (Wildcat Heir), and was slightly second best. Being by [Temple City](#), he is bred for a mile and a half. We will see if this colt is GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf material today.

Hot Tin Roof (More Than Ready) mowed down maidens at Presque Isle Downs July 30, and sports one work since at Fair Hill on the synthetic. Found it interesting that Stonestreet sent horses to Presque Isle and Del Mar, two of the synthetic courses left standing. 'Roof comes out of a slow race, needs to step it up, but is bred for turf up and down.

Designed for War (War Front)'s last work was in company on Travers morning (workmate was injured) in his only work since breaking maiden Aug. 9. Colt got an easy lead and cruised around the track finishing the last fraction in 28.3, which is equivalent to a 34.3 for last three furlongs. Can definitely improve here further second time around.

International Star (Fusaichi Pegasus)'s maiden win at Belmont June 21 was awesome. We loved him off morning works and he ran away from a field in stylish fashion. Rosie Napravnik rides for Maker, and her husband Joe Sharp is Maker's assistant, so she takes the call on this colt. He is the one to beat in my books.

Strong Coffee (Warrior's Reward) came off the pace to win here for Motion, his last work on the 24th at Saratoga on the turf was inside of the dogs in 51.4. Like many of the horses in this field who broke maiden here, he has only one work since. His maiden win was OK as he rolled four wide off modest fractions to win going away. Irad, who also rode international Star shows up here. His last fraction was modest in 30.2, equivalent to a 36.2. Designed for War was almost two seconds faster, albeit under slower pace conditions. A colt from the first crop of GSW & MGISP Trappe Shot (Tapit) realized a final bid of \$140,000 from noted reseller Ciaran Dunne, agent, to top the first of two open sessions of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's August Yearling Sale in Central Florida. Catalogued as hip [593](#), the May 14 foal, bred by Dapple Bloodstock,

is the most recent produce of Good Witch Glinda (Unbridled's Song), herself a \$510,000 FTSAUG yearling purchase back in 2004. The session topper was sold in utero for \$20,000 at Keeneland November in late 2012 and was offered Wednesday by Stuart Morris, agent.

Trappe Shot, winner of the GII True North S. and desperately unlucky to lose the GI A.G. Vanderbilt H., entered stud in 2012 at Claiborne Farm for an introductory fee of \$10,000. Another young sire was responsible for the day's next most-expensive lot, as a filly by Airdrie sire Haynesfield fetched \$80,000 from Aboritanza Racing LLC. The bay, consigned by Sue Vacek, agent, as hip [478](#), is out of Darjeeling (Cat Thief), a half-sister to SP Swing Boldly (Full Swing) and to the dams of MSW Pay Wright (French Envoy), SW Xunlei (D'wildcat) and GISW Too Late Now (Raj Waki). Darjeeling was offered carrying this foal in utero at Keeneland November in 2012 and was knocked down for \$15,500. The Mar. 17 foal is bred on the same Gone West/Storm Cat cross responsible for her grandsire Speightstown. Haynesfield, whose marquee victory came in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in 2010, commanded a first-season fee of \$10,000. A total of 258 horses were reported as sold for gross receipts of \$3,411,000. The average of \$13,221 was off by 23.3% versus 2013, while the median also took a significant drop, settling 41.7% off last year's mark. Buybacks were also high at 28.3%. The sale concludes today with a session beginning at 10:30 a.m. For full results, visit www.obssales.com.

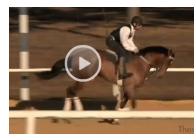
