





DONCASTER PREPARES FOR SNOW

With the doubts about the effectiveness of favored Kingston Hill (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire})--who was midday yesterday confirmed a definite runner by trainer Roger Varian--in today's G1 Ladbrokes St Leger due to Doncaster's guickening ground, the way could be open to one of the steady risers and Snow Sky (GB) (Nayef)

fits that bill. Since his disappointing effort when eighth behind Kinaston Hill in the G1 Racing Post Trophy here in October, Khalid Abdullah's homebred has crept up the ranks with the kind of stealthy momentum that has marked the records

of most of this Classic's recent winners. Beating Hartnell (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) in the May 10 Listed Lingfield Derby Trial, he was forced to miss the Derby due to a setback, and after a respectable comeback fourth in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 20 captured the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 30. In that established prep, he had Windshear (GB) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) and Somewhat (Dynaformer) back in second and third before meeting his match when second to Postponed (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in York's G2 Great Voltigeur S. last time Aug. 20. CROSS TRAFFIC RETIRED TO SPENDTHRIFT

Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song--Stop Traffic, by Cure the Blues), who defeated a pair of GI Breeders' Cup Classic winners in the 2013 GI Whitney H. in just his fifth career trip to the post, has been retired from racing and will enter stud at B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, KY. The gray colt will be offered as part of the farm's "Share the Upside" program on a limited basis for \$17,500. THE MAIN PLAYER

It may be Irish Champions weekend, but all the focus is on Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), as the proclaimed best to have graced Ballydoyle's second empire takes center stage in today's G1 QIPCO Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Teo Ah Khing's chestnut was bred to be an elite performer and races like one, with one defeat this

season coming when third racing on the wrong side in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3. Since that fully excusable eclipse, the son of Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire})--who was runner-up in this eight years ago--has not had to be fully extended to win both the G1 English and Irish Derbies and G1 Juddmonte International. In that extended 10-furlong York feature last time Aug. 20, he was reportedly short of peak fitness when comfortably accounting for the June 1 G1 Prix du Jockey Club

winner The Grey Gatsby (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), and it is difficult to see how his rivals can upset him here. "We were delighted he ran in York and got through it and look forward to Leopardstown with him," trainer Aidan O'Brien, who is seeking an eighth renewal since 2000, told PA Sport. "He'd had a good break and done very well. He was only ready for a good racecourse gallop. That was the state he was at and obviously we were a bit worried going into a big race like that, but he came out of it well and we were delighted with the performance on the day. We'll take one race at a time. That's what we've always done with every race so far." Irish Champion S. cont. p6



"I was really pleased with him at York and thought he ran a fine race and looked like he'd appreciate a step up in trip," jockey James Doyle commented. "He was a bit late-maturing mentally--he took his time to really get focused, but I feel everything has clicked into place now. I couldn't fault him at York, he traveled into the race well and we were probably beaten by a good horse in Postponed on the day." In a renewal lacking a contender with a convincing profile and the usual strong Ballydoyle presence, some imagination is needed, and one who does not require a great deal in that department is Princess Haya of Jordan's Epsom Derby third Romsdal (GB) (Halling). Second after a strong finish in the May 8 G3 Chester Vase, he was 3 1/4 lengths behind Kingston Hill in the June 7 Epsom Classic before finishing a well-beaten seventh in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot when last seen July 26. "I'll always have a soft spot for the Ladbrokes St Leger because it was the race in which I rode my first British Group 1--and Classic--with Arctic Cosmos back in 2010," commented jockey William Buick. "I won it again in 2011 with Masked Marvel and after shuffling the cards for 2014, I've decided that if I'm going to get a third on Saturday then it's going to be with Romsdal. I've made my decision--I think it's the right one so here's hoping."

Trainer Mark Johnston is still chasing his first renewal, and Hartnell holds strong claims taking the same route via the Listed Queen's Vase used by last



year's winner Leading Light (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's homebred went from annexing that two-mile Royal Ascot contest June 20 to besting Windshear and the subsequent Listed March S. winner Forever Now (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in Newmarket's G3 Bahrain Trophy over 13 furlongs

July 10. Only sixth in the Voltigeur, he has to rebound, but his trainer's runners on the Knavesmire have an inexplicably poor record in recent times.



Windshear looked to have improved from the Bahrain Trophy to the Gordon, where he was caught behind horses and found full stride too late to gather in Snow Sky, and connections are hopeful this extra distance can bring about a reversal of that form. "Windshear has improved as the season has progressed and he was arguably unlucky not to win the Gordon S. at Goodwood last time, a race that has always proved a reliable St Leger trial," said trainer Richard Hannon. "It looked at Goodwood as if Windshear wanted these extra two and a half furlongs, but, whereas Snow Sky went to York for the Great Voltigeur, our fellow has thrived for what was his first break of the season. He has put on weight and looks great, and--though we have had offers from Australia--we don't want to lose him as we feel that he is a horse for next year."

One of the darker types is Snow Sky's stable companion Kings Fete (GB) (King's Best), who was too keen when third in the March behind Forever Now and Alex My Boy (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), and Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe believes he has the right to be in the line-up. "Kings Fete played himself onto the team when doing a good piece of work last Saturday, which encouraged Sir Michael [Stoute] to have a go," he said. "He's always rated him very highly, and although he has more to prove on the track and needs to settle, if he does he's going to be competitive."

Five years ago, Kite Wood (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was narrowly denied here, and his full-brother **Odeon (GB)** bids to make amends. On the face of it, Alex Owen's free-running type has much improvement to find to figure, but his latest third in the Voltigeur gives him minor claims. "If he behaves himself and doesn't waste all that energy beforehand, I'm sure he can find quite a number of lengths and he's already beaten quite a few horses much shorter in the betting," his owner said. "He's progressing well and we're hopeful he can come good and I really hope he does, for the sake of the yard and all the good people there."





Irish Champion S. WIN AND YOU'RE IN

While Australia's saunter around The Curragh was met with much publicity afterwards regarding the state of the opposition, there can be no such claims this time, with a clutch of top-level performers set to test him. One is Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Mukhadram (GB)** (Shamardal), who captured the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 5 before finishing third to Taghrooda (GB) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) in the G1 King

George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. over 12 furlongs five weeks later. On that occasion, last year's G1 Irish Derby scorer Trading Leather (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) was 7 3/4 lengths behind Mukhadram in fifth prior to the Shadwell stalwart's fourth in the Juddmonte International. "He's had a long, relatively hard, season," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Angus Gold told PA Sport. "At the moment, he's

not showing any sign of the effects. He's a big, tough horse. He's a horse that likes to get on with it and do his own thing. We probably disappointed him at York. Sheikh Hamdan told Paul [Hanagan] to make sure he got a lead. The horse fought him for two furlongs and that was it. The horse got fed up with it."

Second to The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}) 12 months ago, John Deer's 2013 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Eclipse S. hero Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) has it to do to shake up Ballydoyle's supremo, but he showed when winning the G3 Winter Hill S. at Windsor last time Aug. 23 that he is on the way back. "It's going to be a tough one, and I don't really know where he is compared to where he was last year, but we'll find out on Saturday," his owner-breeder told PA Sport. "He's been doing some nice work on the gallops, apparently, and I hope he might be back to somewhere near where he was this time last year. It looks like there should be plenty of pace in the race. It looks as though Mukhadram has a pacemaker in the race and Australia will have a pacemaker as well. The one small concern I have is that the ground might be a little bit on the fast side for him. He's an older horse now and pretty strong, so hopefully he'll do all right. At the end of the day, he doesn't owe us anything and I just hope he doesn't get thrashed." for today's G1 Coolmore Fastnet Rock Matron S. staged over a mile at Leopardstown. While that represented a career-high following her previous second in the July 19 G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh, today's test demands more speed and less stealth from Susan Magnier's colorbearer. Previously, she had been sixth over this trip in a slowly run edition of the G1 Coronation S. at Royal

Ascot June 20 and did not look short of pace when winning the G2 Debutante S. at The Curragh as a juvenile. "Tapestry won very well at York, but she's coming back considerably in trip to a mile," trainer Aidan O'Brien commented. "It's not ideal, but we're hoping she'll run a big race."

Successful in the Coronation was Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's Rizeena (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}), who had already plundered the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh and the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot at two and was the chief beneficiary of her rivals' reluctance to make that race a proper test. Subsequently second in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket July 11 and fourth in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 17, she is partnered by Ryan Moore, who was so effective in the Coronation. "She's in great form. Ryan Moore has been doing all the work on her, as usual," the owner's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond told PA Sport. "She ran a great race last time, she is maybe a bit fresher now and we know she's a very good miler. It's a race I think she should win and I would certainly be disappointed if she's not in the first three."

One who does not need to improve a great deal to figure is Flaxman Stables' Fiesolana (Ire) (Aussie Rules), and she may not have been at her best when fifth in this last year. This term, she has been second when failing by a half-length to give the re-opposing Purr Along (GB) (Mount Nelson {GB}) five pounds in The Curragh's G3 Lanwades Stud S. over this trip on testing ground May 24 before finishing fourth in the G2 Duke of Cambridge S. at Royal Ascot June 18 and third in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest dropped to 6 1/2 furlongs at Deauville Aug. 10.

THE CHAMPAGNE LIFESTYLE

Today's G2 At The Races Champagne S. at Doncaster offers an ideal opportunity for next year's budding Classic prospects to enter the limelight, and it could be argued that Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Estidhkaar (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) is already there after a scintillating display at Newmarket's July meeting. Second on debut to O "TDN Rising Star" Portamento (Ire) (Shamardal) on debut over six furlongs at Goodwood May 22, the bay accounted for the subsequent winner Mustadeem (Ire) (Arcano {Ire}) over 6 1/2 furlongs at Newbury June 12 before spreadeagling the field in the G2 Superlative S. over this trip at Newmarket a month later. Putting 4 1/2 lengths between him and the subsequent G3 Solario S. scorer Aktabantay (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the latter contest, he carries maximum stable confidence. "Estidhkaar has a great temperament and his work is so impressive in the mornings," Richard Hannon said. "He points his toe and really stretches up the gallop and he seems to be able to cope with any ground, so he is a very exciting prospect. If all goes well here, we would then look at the Dewhurst." He meets a serious opponent in Prince Faisal's Belardo (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), who was a respectable fourth in a hot renewal of the G2 July S. over six furlongs at Newmarket July 10 before winning the Listed Washington Singer S. over this trip at Newbury Aug. 16. Receiving three pounds from Estidhkaar, he is sure to provide a stern test. "Belardo is a colt we have always thought plenty of and he was impressive at Newbury," conditioner Roger Varian commented. "The track and trip should suit and I am confident that he is capable of holding his own in this grade."

Beaten just over a length when fourth in the G2 Gimcrack S. over six furlongs at York Aug. 23, Glenalmond (Ire) (Iffraaj (GB)) looked to need an extra panel on that occasion and is poised to benefit if the main protagonists fail to shine. Field p8

"Sea Queen had a little bit of a disappointment in the Del Mar Oaks," said Christophe Lorieul, assistant to Clement. "She was beaten a neck and a nose for second. She ran good, but she was used a bit too early in the race. She comes back in good form and had a very good work on the turf [four furlongs on the turf in 49.21 seconds Tuesday], and we're back at Belmont Park. We'll try again." Clement's other entry, Highland Yard LLC's lightly raced Walk Close (Tapit), also loves the Belmont turf course. A debut winner here last September, the bay captured an allowance here May 18 and scored again over this course in the Wild Applause S. June 21. Bumped hard at the break, she finished fourth to Miss Frost (Curlin)--who went on to capture the Riskaverse S.--last time in Saratoga's one-mile Tenski S. Aug. 11. "She's 3-for-3 at Belmont," noted Lorieul. "I think she might have had a bit too much to do [in the Tenski], but she's training well back at Belmont. She was shuffled back, and I'm not sure if Saratoga is one of her better tracks. Natalma Stakes WIN AND YOU'RE IN®

LOCALS LOOK TO CONTINUE STRANGLEHOLD

The GI Northern Dancer S. takes place Sunday, but the race named for his dam, the GII Natalma S., goes this afternoon and offers the winner a fees-paid trip to California for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Locally based runners have annexed each of the last nine runnings this test, but a handful of shippers from south of the border will look to snap that streak this afternoon. Isabella Sings (Eskendereya) will try to give trainer Todd Pletcher a second Natalma success, some 16 years after Pico Teneriffe (Red Ransom) scored in the 1998 renewal. The homebred, a half-sister to the good turf SW & GSP Alaura Michele (Arch), got her career off on a high note, wiring a field of Belmont maidens by a length going six furlongs July 10. The chestnut never made the trip up to Saratoga, instead remaining on Long Island and has trained very well for this first attempt at stakes level. Don't Leave Me (Lemon Drop Kid), a daughter of GISW See How She Runs (Maria's Mon), looks to take her career mark to three wins from as many appearances. A debut winner of a rained-off maiden Aug. 2, she produced a wicked turn of foot to annex a seven-furlong allowance prep for this Aug. 22. New York-based trainer Rick Violette Jr. has accounted for two Natalma winners and Skinner Box (Freud) could be a surprise package here. Patsy Symon's runner wired a field of state-breds by a halflength going 5 1/2 furlongs at Saratoga Aug. 11, but should appreciate this added real estate. She is the second foal out of Talkin Indian (Indian Charlie), a halfsister to MGISW marathoner Better Talk Now (Talkin Man). Trainer Mark Casse has won the Natalma four times since 2006 and is represented by John Oxley's Ontario Debutante S. winner Dixie Twist (Indian Charlie) and Conquest Stables' recent maiden winner Conquest Harlanate (Harlan's Holiday). acquisition by Paul Bulmahn's GoldMark Farm, Cross Traffic validated 7-10 favoritism to score at first asking in January 2013, then was accorded **②** "TDN Rising Star" **②** status with a 7 1/2-length success going Gulfstream's one-turn mile Mar. 10. Stepped up immediately into gradedstakes company, the Todd Pletcher trainee suffered two of the most excruciating beats of the year, dropping a head decision to grizzled veteran Flat Out (Flatter) after setting a strong pace in the GIII Westchester

S. in April (116 Beyer) and established even sharper fractions in the GI Met Mile H., only to drop a nose decision to Sahara Sky (Pleasant Tap) (110 Beyer). Cross Traffic was trying two turns for the first time in last year's Whitney H., but faced a tall task on paper against the likes of reigning Breeders' Cup Classic hero Fort Larned (E Dubai) and subsequent Classic winner Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno).

But he was able to control things on the front end and came home 3/4 of a length better than Successful Dan (Successful Appeal), with Mucho Macho Man another 1 1/2 lengths adrift in third. Cross Traffic retires with a record of 6-3-2-0 and earnings of \$687,967.

"Cross Traffic had as much brilliance as you'll find in

a horse," said Pletcher, "It takes a special talent to do some of the things he did so early in a horse's racing career. It's very uncommon to see a horse run a 116 Beyer in his third start, and then turn around and run the way he did in a race like the Met Mile. I think his Whitney performance gives you some perspective of how good he was. Cross Traffic defeated a few of the very best older horses in the country that day, and did it in just his fifth start."

Added Spendthrift General Manager Ned Toffey, "When you

couple Cross Traffic's devastating speed and his ability to carry it around two turns, with his pedigree and conformation, you've got the complete package," said Ned Toffey, Spendthrift general manager. "We couldn't be happier to offer him to our breeders through the Share The Upside program."







staying test June 19. Making an instant impression when successful by 3 3/4 lengths over seven furlongs at Fairyhouse July 2, Agnes Stewart chased home Jack Naylor (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}) when second in Leopardstown's G3 Silver Flash S. over that trip last time July 24 and continued on an upward trend on this first overseas foray. Anchored towards the rear early by Billy Lee tracking the crowd's choice Muraaqaba, the grey swamped that rival with a spell of acceleration with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and only needed to be kept focused late on to register a convincing score. "She's a big baby, but a very good filly," trainer Eddie Lynam said after overseeing another high-profile success in Britain this season. "Me and the owner Steve [Parkin] got a very big offer for her, but we decided not to take it as we are fans. She'll either go to Newmarket for the [Oct. 17] G1 Fillies' Mile or Paris for the Group 1 [Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp Oct. 5]. She'll be a lovely middle-distance filly for next year and is more of an Oaks filly than a Guineas filly." Her rider added, "She traveled well the whole way. I was just getting there a bit earlier than I liked and I was trying to hold on to her. I knew that she would stay and I went for her and she kept galloping all the way to the line. She will hopefully improve away over the winter and come forward. She will get a bit further, but I think she still has plenty of pace for a mile next year."

Deirdre Johnston, wife of trainer Mark Johnston, was far from downcast after the eclipse of Muraaqaba. "She's still finished second in a Group 2--one of the best races for fillies this season--and we're happy with her," she said. "Although she's in the Fillies' Mile later on this year, we'll have to think about that now. I think she'll make an even nicer horse next season."



Cotai Glory's trainer Charlie Hills commented, "The horse is absolutely fine, but I am obviously a bit distraught that George didn't stay on--if he had managed another four strides, he would have been all right. The horse is very quick and you can't take anything away from him. He has got his quirks, but it's a hard pill to swallow. He wasn't doing a lot in front there, lost his concentration and ducked to the right. It was nothing to do with the saddle." ENHANCED SECURITY FOR JCGC

Edited Press Release

Officials at the New York State Gaming Commission and the New York Racing Association have announced enhanced security protocols for the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 27. All participants will be subject to out-of-competition testing and must be on the Belmont grounds no later than Sept. 24. Trainers are required to produce veterinary records for the three days leading up to the race and horses will be monitored at all times during the 72 hours prior to race time. Cont. p21



Among the other measures taken:

- Entry-exit logs will be maintained by additional security from NYRA and the Commission. All persons including veterinarians, trainers, assistant trainers, farriers, owners or other connections on entering the stall, or engaging in contact with the horse or performing any service for the horse, must have a valid Commission license on their person. Such persons will be logged in by security personnel with the reason for their visit. Routine stall and horse maintenance by identified grooms and staff will be monitored but will be exempt from logging.
- Lasix administration will take place in the horses' own stalls by a NYRA veterinarian. Syringes will be preserved by the Commission for possible testing.
- On the day of the Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational, no treatment will be permitted (beyond Lasix for specifically designated horses) unless it is for an emergency or as approved by the Stewards.
- On race day, horses participating in the Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational will be required to be in the Assembly barn between 45 minutes to 1 hour before post time for TC02 sampling. They will then be escorted with security to the paddock.

"These measures underscore New York's ongoing commitment to the safety and welfare of the race horse," said New York Equine Medical Director Dr. Scott E. Palmer. "We will continue to advocate for these animals and implement measures and best practices that create a safe environment for equine athletes."

Speaking on behalf of NYRA, its CEO and President Christopher Kay said, "The New York Racing Association takes the health and safety of our equine athletes and their jockeys very seriously. In concert with the State of New York and over the course of the past two years, we have collectively implemented nationally-recognized reforms which are further preserving the integrity of our racing operations. The sensible steps announced today continue this important progress."

The effort also has the full support of The Jockey Club and the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association.

"The New York State Gaming Commission and the New York Racing Association, Inc. continue to set a high standard in the area of security protocols," said James L. Gagliano, president and chief operating officer of The Jockey Club. "We commend both organizations for their commitment and we strongly encourage other jurisdictions and racetrack operators to implement similar integrity safeguards."

Added NYTHA President Rick Violette Jr., "New York's horsemen continue to offer their support and cooperation with the enhanced security measures to ensure a level playing field at the NYRA tracks and to boost the public's confidence in the integrity of racing in New York."

BOOK 1. WEEK 2

Book 1 is 'in the books', as they say, with mixed reviews--primarily logistic: should 760 horses be spread over four days, or would it work more efficiently over three? Should Book 1 in fact go back to two days? These are questions Keeneland will be considering when all the dust settles, and it is certainly the case that sales companies are the quickest to adapt format changes, so I'm sure nothing is ruled in or out. Consignors and buyers alike have plenty of input into the process, and there are logistical limitations to do with the number of barns and movement of horses in and out. So those issues can be deferred while we get on with the rest of the sale, or, as some like to call it the 'real' sale.

That implies there was something unreal about Book 1/Week 1, but all they really mean is that prices begin to fall more towards the "workingman's" level. There were 13% fewer catalogued to Book 1 this year, and 13% fewer sold, so the clearance rate from the catalogue was essentially the same, around 62-63%, in other words, five out of eight. Last year an astronomical 72.5% of the Week 2 horses catalogued were listed as sold; there are over 300 more horses catalogued in the 'back books' this year, and one more day (nine vs. eight), so we will have to see whether such a phenomenal clearance rate can be maintained. Last year's Week 2 gross leapt by 46% from the previous year, and the average rose by 24%, so the bar is set pretty high for the next few days; sustaining 2013's gains would probably be just fine.

With 13% fewer yearlings catalogued and sold in Book 1 compared to last year--the first with the four-day Book 1 format--the Book 1 gross dipped 7%, from \$153-million to \$142-million, while the average rose 7%, to \$300,535--very tempting to say the a Book 1 horse is a \$300,000 yearling, isn't it? As you can see from the accompanying table, 21 sires had a total of eight or more yearlings sell this week. This is an important group, because they accounted for 73% of the horses catalogued in Book 1; 76% of the horses sold; and 81% of the money spent (about \$115-million of the \$142-million total).


Gainesway's **Tapit**, now the number one sales sire in North America as well as number one on the General Sire List, was the leading sire by gross sales--by a mile: his 32 yearlings grossed \$20,890,000, nearly 15% of the Book 1 gross--as well as by average. His 32 averaged \$652,812 for the week. At one point I was standing talking to somebody and it seemed like every time you looked up it was Tapit 700, Tapit 700, Tapit 725, Tapit 700. Rat-a-tat-Tapit. There's just nothing you'd rather have right now than a Tapit.

Claiborne's **War Front** rallied Thursday, headed by a co-sales-topping \$2.2-million colt consigned by Claiborne to finish second, with a \$545,000 average for 14 sold. Darley's **Bernardini** ran third with a \$432,631 average for 19 sold, thanks to some spectacular pedigrees resulting from his hot start with his 2011 three-year-olds; and WinStar's **Tiznow** had two \$1-million yearlings on Thursday to grab fourth spot on average among the 21 sires, finishing Book 1 with 15 yearlings sold for an average of \$387,667. Seven other sires averaged between \$278,000-

\$332,000, of which we would particularly note Darley's Medaglia d'Oro, fifth on average (\$332,619) but more notably had 21 sell of 24 catalogued (87.5%); and Lane's End's Candy Ride, who really arrived commercially last week, with 18 yearlings averaging \$278,055 but an even higher \$300,000 median as 10 of his 18 sold brought \$300,000 or more. Last week also marked the commercial arrival of Ramsey Farm's 2013 champion sire Kitten's Joy, whose 19 yearlings sold averaged \$243,421, off his 2012 stud fee of \$50,000.

"It's deja vu all over again after Keeneland Book 1: the percentage of withdrawals, sold/ring, and sold/catalogue were almost identical to last year, except there were 13% fewer catalogued and sold, so the gross was down 7% while the average was up 7% from last year. Similar story in all NA/EU yearling sales to date: gross up \$5-million at this point from 2013 after a \$40-million gain from 2012, average virtually the same. Week 2 gross was up 46% last year, though." – Bill Oppenheim

Whereas Book 1 was very much a catalogue for proven sires, beginning with Book 2 today we will see a lot more by unproven stallions and younger sires. There are 27 sires with 40 or more yearlings catalogued from here on out; 14 of these are sires with their first 4-year-olds or younger 2014, and 13 of the 27 are sires with first 5-year-olds and up this year. Eight of the 14 younger sires have their first yearlings, headed by Ashford's Uncle Mo, with 75 catalogued in Books 2-6. Ashford compatriot Cape Blanco has 61 over the next nine days. Spendthrift's Archarcharch has 57, while WinStar's Sidney's Candy has 56 catalogued, along with his barn mate Drosselmeyer, who has 42. Claiborne's Trappe Shot has 49 in the 'back books', Castleton Lyons' Gio Ponti has 47, and Airdrie's Haynesfield has 44 catalogued. So if you've been wondering where are all the yearlings by the new sires, the answer is 'here'.

Three sires with their first 2-year-olds have 40 + catalogued in Week 2, headed by WinStar's leading freshman sire sensation **Super Saver**, with 51 catalogued. Taylor Made's **Eskendereya** has 41, Ashford's Lookin' At Lucky has 40. WinStar's **Colonel John**, who has 63 catalogued this week, is the only sire with first 3-year-olds on this list. With their first 4-year-olds are Ashford's Majestic Warrior, with 51, and Spendthrift's Tiz Wonderful, who currently stands second on the 2014 *TDN* YTD North American third-crop sire list (click), with 43 yearlings. The leading third-crop sire, incidentally, Lane's End's Curlin, has 34 yearlings catalogued this week.

SCOTTISH INDEPENDENCE REFERENDUM: is next Thursday, Sept. 18. There was seemingly a surge for Yes (secession from the United Kingdom) late last week, but the betting on Betfair suggests No (stay in the U.K.) is again a firm favorite. At one point last week Yes had shortened to almost 2-1 against, but now it is back out to 7-2. On Betfair yesterday, No was 4-1 on, meaning you bet a dollar (if you could bet on this in the U.S.) to win 25c and get back \$1.25. My guess is it will be 55-45 No.

UNABASHED ENDORSEMENT: It's hard to find many administrators that people actually like, but we have nothing but praise for Patrick Thompson, the Lexington-based Administrator of the National Racing Compact, and his team. I needed to go and re-up my credentials, and Patrick and his office could not have been more helpful. If you remember the tortuous process of getting credentialed in the old days you'll appreciate, as I did, the friendly, efficient process we and our credit cards enjoy now.



COLUMBIANA FAMILIES BUZZING

by Jessica Martini

Bob Ochocki's Columbiana Farm, which sold Big Trouble (Tiz Wonderful) at last year's Keeneland September sale, will offer six yearlings, including a halfsister to this year's GIII Sanford S. winner, during this

weekend's Book 2 of the September auction.



Ochocki, a Southern California pharmacist, currently has a broodmare band of 13 head.

"[Ochocki] is a commercial

breeder and he has a number of farm clients year round," the farm's bloodstock agent Kathy Berkey explained. "We don't have any in training right now. We prefer to sell everything that we bring to the sales. Most years, we'll sell 100%. We try to keep our buyback rate really low. But every once in a while, especially if it's a filly from one of our better families, he'll race one."

Coming into the 2013 September sale, Berkey knew Columbiana had something special with its Tiz Wonderful colt.

"I just loved him," Berkey recalled. "He was one of those very easy horses that--I guess not everybody loved him because everyone has different types--but he was just a big, strong, scopey, balanced, correct beautiful horse who came out here and showed right every time and had a great mind on him. The kind you love to have. He just had so much class."

Out of Silver Lullaby (Najran), the yearling sold for \$230,000 to the bid of Team D. Named Big Trouble, he is now two-for-two after a determined victory in the Sanford in July.

Columbiana purchased Silver Lullaby for \$52,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale. Her second foal, Silver Lining John (Tiz Wonderful), was a \$140,000 September yearling in 2011 and was stakes placed on the racetrack.

Columbiana will offer the mare's fourth foal, a filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Sidney's Candy, as hip 910 during Saturday's session of the September sale. Cont. p25



"She is a totally different physical type," Berkey commented when asked to compare the two siblings. "Once you've had a mare for a while, you learn how to breed them. And we found with this mare that she tends to throw the stallion, so Big Trouble looked a lot like a Tiz Wonderful, Tiznow, big and scopey. We bred her to Sidney's Candy and the filly looks a lot like Sidney's Candy. She is a very nice walker, a very balanced filly, but she's a lot smaller than Big Trouble was because Sidney's Candy is a smaller horse. And the mare is a medium-sized horse."

Silver Lullaby produced a colt by Cape Blanco (Ire) this spring. Berkey said breeding to young stallions can be just what the market wants.

"From a commercial standpoint, we've found over the years that the market almost forces you to breed to unproven stallions because there are people who are very interested in unproven stallions," she said. "You have to balance what the market wants and what potentially you are doing to your broodmare's production record. I know over the years, you see mares that are failed producers--when you look at their produce records--but when you look at it you go failure, failure, failure stallion wise. If you're breeding to an unproven stallion every year and the stallion fails--and we know most stallions do fail--then it's not necessarily her fault. It's hard to know. Personally, I like to start our young mares out the first year or two, if I can, with a proven stallion, but we like to balance out proven with a few unproven and hope for the best.

Sometimes you guess right and sometimes you guess wrong--like anything in this business."

Big Trouble was just one stakes winner in a busy summer for Columbiana-breds at the track. Lockout (Limehouse) was recently second in the GII Play the King S. and half-sister A Wild Notion (Notional) was runner-up in the Prairie Gold Lassie S. at Prairie Meadows in July. A half-sister by Macho Uno sells Saturday as hip 815.

Hip 1142 could get an update of her own just prior to going through the sales ring at Keeneland Saturday when her half-sister Appeal to the Win (Successful Appeal) goes postward in Woodbine's GII Natalma S. The filly is by Scat Daddy and, out of Grand Breeze (Grand Slam), she is already a half to stakes winner Cool Cowboy (Kodiak Kowboy).

Columbiana purchased Per Se (Deputy Commander) for \$65,000 at the 2011 Keeneland November sale. The mare's 3-year-old filly Oasis at Midnight (Midnight Lute) was recently second in the Lady's Secret S. at Monmouth Park and her half-sister by Scat Daddy sells as hip 837.

"There is just a lot of activity going on in our families, which you love to see," Berkey confirmed.

Berkey is hoping the strength of Book 1 carries into Book 2.

"You always want to see Book 1 being strong because people aren't able to buy what they want and they have to keep looking," Berkey said.

The Columbiana consignment has been bustling the past two days, according to Berkey.

"We have been very busy [Friday morning] and we were very busy Thursday--we had over 300 shows for six horses," she commented. "So you have to feel very positive and hope the sales continues to be strong."

The Keeneland September sale resumes Saturday morning at 10 a.m. and continues daily through Sept. 21.

eNicks app Now Available in the iTunes Store...

eNicks has released an app which is available for free download in the iTunes store. The app, designed for iPhone and iPad, allows you to view the Werk Nick Ratings (eNicks) of individual hip numbers at major Thoroughbred auctions from your iOS device. Auction eNicks are free for progeny of stallions enrolled in the eNicks stallion program. Users can unlock eNicks for those hip numbers that are sired by stallions not enrolled in the eNicks program through in-app purchase. In-app purchases may unlock single hip numbers or entire sales.

The app allows users to sort by hip numbers, Werk Nick Rating, or sire, and search by hips, sires, and dams. Users are able to immediately view WTC's five-generation Pedigree Profile that includes the Werk Nick Rating, inbreeding and dosage, and to save, print, or share the sheet via email or social media with your contacts.

The app may also be used to access WTC's MareMatch utility, which lists and ranks enrolled stallions by the best Werk Nick Ratings for a users' mares.

The app also offers access to *TDN* sire data, and the latest news from the *TDN*. The eNicks app also features a news page that links to the *Thoroughbred Daily News* (*TDN*) home page and to WTC's blog posts and includes the company's MareMatch facility for prospective matings. "Only stallions enrolled in eNicks are included in MareMatch, and they can be filtered by geographic location and stud fee," said Sid Fernando, president of WTC. "Plus you can view sire data on each stallion through TDN and contact the farm directly by phone or email through the app."

LE HAVRE FILLY IN OSARUS LANDMARK By Emma Berry

As the sun began its lazy descent after another beautiful day in La Teste de Buch, the Osarus Yearling Sale scored a landmark result with its first six-figure sales-topper when Divona (Fr) (lot 262), a daughter of breakthrough French stallion Le Havre (Ire), sold for €130,000. Marc-Antoine Berghracht made the decisive

bid for the half-sister to five winners out of the listed-placed Nostalchia (Fr) (Genereux Genie {Fr}), seeing off underbidder Nicolas de Watrigant to secure the filly for Pandora Racing.

Describing the top lot as the stand-out of the sale, Berghracht added, "She was magnificent, an extraordinary filly. I've had luck buying at this sale in the past and I always like to come here." As if to underline his point, the head of MAB Agency signed for 12 yearlings across the two days to be the leading buyer.

Sylvain Vidal, who stands Le

Havre at his Haras de la Cauvinere, bought several of the stallion's offspring on Thursday, but this time around his name is on the page as the filly's breeder. Divona was consigned though La Motteraye, an increasingly successful outfit run by Gwen Monneraye and Lucie Lamotte and based close to La Cauviniere in Normandy.

A delighted Lucie Lamotte said as she and her partner led their team into the bar to celebrate, "This is wonderful. It's great to top the sale and to have the

first six-figure yearling here. But what is extra special for us is that we consigned her for Sylvain, who is a great friend and has supported us by sending us horses from when we first started out. We're so pleased for him."

Her price tag helped to boost the sale's aggregate to €3,597,000, up from €2,982,500 last year, albeit from 37 more horses sold. The 195 yearlings to change hands this time around set a clearance rate of 81%, with the average again being fractionally down on 2013 at €17,406 (from €18,437), while the median also dropped from €15,000 to €13,000.

"I'm pleased that the average was only slightly down, as we sold 30% more horses this year, and I was afraid it would drop quite a bit," said Osarus director Emmanuel Viaud. "It was a really big thing for us to have a top price in excess of €100,000, especially for me personally.

I've been an auctioneer here since the beginning and I remember in the first year we had an average of just €7,000. I always hoped we would one day be selling a horse at that sort of price and now we've done it."

A Champs Elysees (GB) filly from the immediate family of Frankel (GB) had earlier equaled the previous record price of the sale when knocked down for €85,000. George Mullins signed the docket, but was unable to divulge the new owner of lot 232, other than to confirm she will be trained in Ireland for a Dubaian client.

"She's a great walker with a fantastic pedigree, but I didn't think I'd have to go quite that far for her," admitted Mullins. "Hopefully she'll be worth plenty of money when she's finished racing."

The chestnut daughter of the Desert Prince mare Marella--a half-sister to Kind (Ire), the dam of stakes winners Frankel (GB), Noble Mission (GB), Bullet Train (GB) and Joyeuse (GB)--was the leading light of Eric Lhermite's Haras de Grandcamp draft, which, with 23 yearlings in the catalogue, represented the biggest consignment at the sale.

Agent Tina Rau was delighted to sign for <u>lot 205</u>, a son of Linngari (Ire) who was the most expensive colt in the sale at \in 62,000, and topped trade for much of

the day. The half-brother to G3 Prix Thomas Bryon runner-up Stillman (Fr) (Vespone) will be trained in Chantilly by Nicolas Clement.

"I love the sire, I think he's really underrated and produces good runners," said Rau. "This colt is probably a little more scopey than many Linngaris, and he's a great walker with a fabulous attitude."

Out of the Daliapour (Ire) mare Kikinda (Fr), the colt was bred by Patrick Chedeville at Haras du Petit Tellier in Normandy, which has also

been home to Linngari for the last four years. Chedeville said, "I'm absolutely delighted. You always come to the sales hoping to sell an expensive horse, but not necessarily expecting to. It's wonderful to be at the top of the sale--for the moment, anyway." Cont. p28

There's no keeping Kendargent (Fr) out of the limelight, especially not in his native France, and the Haras de Colleville resident was responsible for another two of the more expensive offerings during the second day of the sale, both of which were bought by Marseille-based handler Frederic Rossi, who trains for owner/breeder Jean-Claude Seroul. First through the ring and knocked down for €60,000 was lot 170, a colt by the name of War Reporter (Fr) whose family already has a proven track record with the stallion, his half-sister Damdam Freeze (Indian Rocket) being the dam of stakes-winning siblings Kendam (Fr) and Kenfreeze (Fr).

"He walks well and he looks pretty precocious," said Rossi, who five lots later gave €47,000 for Joiedargent (Fr) from the Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu consignment.

France's champion trainer-elect, Jean-Claude Rouget, was busy throughout the sale, signing for a total of eight yearlings to the tune of €206,000, including a post-ring private transaction for lot 182, a Namid (GB) filly by the name of Goona Chope (Fr) who sold for €50,000 from Alain Chopard's Haras des Faunes. It's another family which has been well represented of late, notably through the filly's half-sister, Gooseley Chope (Fr) (Indian Rocket), whose son Goken (Fr) (Kendargent) won the G3 Prix du Bois in June and was fourth behind The Wow Signal (Ire) in the G1 Prix Morny.

Alastair Donald of SackvilleDonald was making his second trip to the sale and bought yearlings for UK-based trainers Ed Dunlop, Ed Walker and Harry Dunlop, while Ilke Gansera Leveque, buying with the Lamont Racing team, is taking three yearlings back to her Newmarket stable. Also represented among British trainers was Karl Burke, who bought four yearlings, Simon Crisford, William Jarvis and John Berry. Donald said, "We bought a Le Havre filly here last year and she's held in high regard. It's an enjoyable trip so we're hoping we can hit on another good one to warrant coming back. They're solid horses making pretty much how you value them, and many English trainers are becoming aware of the hordes of French prizemoney on offer for horses with premiums."

The Leopardstown winner's enclosure will come alive prior to racing, however, with the inaugural Goffs Champions Sale. This boutique sale will offer just 11 select lots, including G1 Irish Derby fourth Ponfeigh (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) (lot 10); 2-year-old listed winner Accepted (Ire) (Approve {Ire}) (lot 2), who finished third in yesterday's G2 Flying Childers S. at Doncaster and will be offered in absentia; group-performing 2-year-old Itorio (Ire) (Oratorio (Ire)) (lot 4) and a handful of smart staying prospects. For those looking for a very immediate return on investment, Italian stakes winner Maremmadiavola (Ire) (Kheleyf) (lot 9) will be offered just hours before she is declared to run in a handicap on the Leopardstown card. Horse Racing Ireland has facilitated a special arrangement to allow Maremmadiavola to run in her new owner's silks in the 7:20 p.m. race.

Already the sponsor of tomorrow's G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. at The Curragh, Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby noted that the auction house wanted to throw their full support behind the Champions Weekend concept, and that's how the idea for the Champions Sale was born.

"We're very enthusiastic supporters of the concept of Irish Champions Weekend," Beeby said. "We wanted to support the weekend as much as possible."

Beeby noted that the Champions Sale was modeled after the inaugural--and highly successful--edition of the Goffs London Sale in June.

"The sale in London worked very well, so we decided we'd try to replicate it to an extent," he explained. "It will be a small, short, sharp, and hopefully high-quality event."

Beeby noted that a maximum of 20 entries were permitted for the Champions Sale, and the Goffs team were very selective about the catalogue.

"It's just ensuring we start the sale in the right tone with quality horses," he noted. "We have a horses-intraining sale at the end of October that has a good base to it, but this is about offering something that's unique on that particular weekend, and bringing the bloodstock auction process to a slightly different audience as well. It becomes part of the entertainment of the weekend. People might come to the racing early and see a live auction. To the average racegoer, it will be something that's a bit different. Hopefully people will like it."

Childs Charitable Foundation and Mary Elizabeth Pearce Foundation Sept. 9.

"The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation's Second Chances at the Plymouth County Correctional Farm is an extraordinary program for both inmates and horses and its mission is consistent with these foundations' commitment to conservation and preservation of open space in the area," commented Nathan Withington, who manages the foundations. "These gifts will help with additional capital investment in the stabling facilities and potential expansion of the program."

The inmates are responsible for the racehorses' care and develop career and transition skills in the process. Some retired racehorses have been successful adopted since Second Chances began at the Sheriff's facility in 2009.

"Second Chances continues to be a vital facet of our rehabilitation programs," said Plymouth County Sheriff Joseph D. McDonald, Jr. "We are proud to have been the first correctional agency in Massachusetts to participate in this program."

The Arkansas Racing Commission yesterday became the most recent commission to adopt the Controlled Therapeutic List and the Multiple Medication Violation portions of the National Uniform Medication Program recommended by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC). In addition to the adoption of these two portions, Arkansas currently works with Truesdail Laboratories--an RMTC Accredited Laboratory--for its testing. Arkansas commission officials are confident that third-party administration of furosemide will be in effect by the start of the 2015 Oaklawn Park race meet Jan. 9.

The four-pronged program has been endorsed by over 60 industry stakeholders. Once fully adopted, Arkansas will join Delaware, Indiana, Massachusetts, North Dakota and Virginia as the sixth state to fully implement the program with many other states in process.

"The Arkansas Racing Commission is pleased to join the growing number of states adopting the Model Rules on uniform medications and multiple violation penalties," said its Commissioner and chairman-elect of Racing Commissioners International Mark Lamberth.

"We applaud the Arkansas State Racing Commission for adopting the national uniform medication reforms," added RMTC Chairman Alex Waldrop. "These important reforms address an array of safety and integrity issues in horse racing and have the support of virtually every major industry organization. I urge all racing jurisdictions in the United States to follow the lead of Arkansas and others and uniformly adopt these reforms."

The development and advancement of scientifically-based uniform medication rules, an effective multiple violator penalty system, and the industry's only laboratory accreditation/external quality assurance program has been a top priority of the RMTC over the last year.

"These reforms are in the best interest of the health and welfare of the horse and the safety of all participants," said RMTC Executive Director and COO Dr. Dionne Benson. "The Arkansas Commission led by Chairman Cecil Alexander has made great strides in ensuring the integrity of the sport and the health and welfare of horses racing in Arkansas in 2015."

Oxley at Keeneland September in 2011 for \$290,000. The dark bay debuted a winner at Woodbine May 13, 2012, then rattled off three more wins at that track in the Clarendon S., the Vandal S. and the Swynford S. A fifth in the GIII Grey S. was

the only interruption during his 2-year-old season as he proceeded to take the stateside GIII Iroquois S. and GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. both at Churchill Downs en route to his Sovereign Award titles. Uncaptured was runner-up in his sophomore bow in the GIII Spiral S. and added a Classic to his resume with a tally in the restricted Prince of Wales S. in July of 2013 as well as three additional stakes placings in the Wando S., GIII Matt Winn S. and GIII Smarty Jones S. The 4-year-old was last seen finishing third in the GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 8 and retires with a record of 18-7-3-3 and earnings of \$1,065,147.

"He has a mind of steel," Casse said. "Uncaptured is one of the classiest and talented horses I've ever trained."

Uncaptured is a half to the MSW Dancing Raven (Tomahawk) and his dam is a half to stakes winner Gold Star Deputy (Silver Deputy). Stud plans will be announced later.

The National Turf Writers and Broadcasters (NTWAB) will honor Art Sherman, who saddled California Chrome to become the oldest trainer to win the Kentucky Derby; innovative owner Cot Campbell; trail-blazing broadcaster Charlsie Cantey; and accomplished sportswriter Tom LaMarra at its 55th annual awards dinner on Oct. 29 in Arcadia, CA.

Sherman will receive the Mr. Fitz Award, named for the legendary trainer "Sunny" Jim Fitzsimmons.

Sherman first experienced the Kentucky Derby when he shared a boxcar with Swaps, the 1955 winner, from Los Angeles to Louisville. He returned to Churchill Downs this year--at age 77--to win the Derby and the Preakness. Sherman handled a

pressure-packed situation with class and grace during a Triple Crown bid that fell short when California Chrome dead-heated for fourth in the GI Belmont S.

Campbell will be presented with the Joe Palmer Award for meritorious service to racing. Campbell was at the forefront in introducing racehorse partnerships when he founded Dogwood Stable in 1973 and made the normally high cost of ownership accessible to many more fans. He was recognized for a lifetime of special achievement with an Eclipse Award of Merit in 2013.

The second annual Jim McKay Award, for broadcasting excellence, goes to Cantey. The former exercise rider for Ruffian ranks as one of the most influential racing broadcasters of all time, having worked for ABC (1986-2000), CBS (1977-86), ESPN (1985-2002) and NBC (2000-05), among other outlets. She was regularly credited for making the sport easily understood by fans at all levels of interest.

LaMarra, will accept the Walter Haight Award, named for the former Washington *Post* turf writer and columnist, for excellence in turf writing. LaMarra has been a turf writer since 1993, working for the *Daily Racing Form* and *Thoroughbred Times* before joining the *Blood-Horse* in 1998, where he is news editor. He is regarded as one of the sport's most knowledgeable writers.

Award winners were selected by members of the National Turf Writers and Broadcasters. The dinner will be held at The Derby Restaurant, near Santa Anita Park, site of the Breeders' Cup World Championships.
