





#### **SEA THE MOON RETIRES**

TDN Rising Star" Sea the Moon (Ger) (Sea the Stars {Ire}--Sanwa {Ger}, by Monsun {Ger}), winner of the G1 Geutsches Derby, has been retired due to a recurring leg injury. Niko Lafrentz, husband of the owner Heike Bischoff of Gestut Gorlsdorf, told the Racing Post: "He is injured and we have taken the decision to retire him and will start looking for a suitable home for him as a stallion. He is in Newmarket's Equine Hospital and my wife is over there with him. We won't have a complete diagnosis for a while, but it is clear that he will not be able to run again."

The Markus Klug trainee boats a lifetime record of 5-4-1-0 with \$710,142 in career earnings. The 3-year-old's career was highlighted by a win in the G2 Oppenheim-Union Rennen June 15 and an 11-length victory in the Deutsches Derby in July. He was recently runner-up in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden Sept. 7. However, Sea the Moon sustained a leg injury following his German Derby victory and, although his connections originally believed the colt's injury wouldn't be career-threatening, its recent recurrence has forced his early retirement. Sea the Moon was originally the early favorite for the upcoming G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, before it was announced he would skip that event last week.

From the second crop of Sea the Stars, Sea the Moon hails from a deep German family. Unraced dam Sanwa is a full-sibling to German heighweight and MG1SW Schiaparelli (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and German heightweight and G1SW Samum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). Bred by Gestut Gorlsdorf, he RNA'd for 230,000 GNS at the Tattersalls October Sale in 2012 and was campaigned by them.

#### POSITIVE NUMBERS CONTINUE AT KEESEP

The double digit gains seen in the first session of Book 3 Monday continued yesterday with improved total sales, average and median. This made Tuesday's

session the third consecutive session with increases in all three categories.

Day 8 saw 298 yearlings sell for a total of \$18,562,000, which is a 13.3% increase over last year. The average of \$62,289 marked a 15.2% increase, while the \$50,000 median accounted for an 11% increase from 2013.


Ben Glass was the leading buyer yesterday, acquiring

three of the four highest priced yearlings for a total of \$765,000. Bidding for Gary and Mary West, he scooped up a full brother to GI Del Mar Debutante S. heroine Sunset Glow (Exchange Rate), <a href="https://hip.2052">hip.2052</a>, for a session-topping \$280,000. Glass also signed the tickets on hip <a href="2250">2250</a>, a \$260,000 Super Saver colt consigned by Millenium Farms, and <a href="https://hip.2338">hip.2338</a>, a \$225,000 Mineshaft colt consigned by Hermitage Farm.

Tuesday's leading consignor was Taylor Made Sales Agency, which sold 41 horses for a total of \$2,366,000.

#### Big Update Propels Session Topper...

When Keeneland sent the finalized version of its September catalog, the 2-year-old filly **Sunset Glow**

(Exchange Rate) was a sharp maiden winner at Belmont who had shipped to Royal Ascot and run second in the 21-strong G3 Albany S. Not bad, for sure. Since then, however, the Ten Broeck Farm-owned, Wesley Ward-trained filly has become arguably the leading juvenile filly in the nation, with consecutive

wins in the GII Sorrento S. and GI Del Mar Debutante to her credit.

With a divisional championship a possibility, Sunset Glow provided the sort of update breeders and consignors dream of, and yesterday, her yearling full-brother brought a session-topping \$280,000 at September. Gary and Mary West's racing manager Ben Glass signed for the dark bay, a son of the stakesplaced Perfectforthepart (Dynaformer). Four Star Sales consigned him as hip 2052 on behalf of breeder Gayla Rankin/GLR Ranch.

"Gayla's a client of Three Chimneys Farm, who decided they were going to use a number of different consignors rather than consigning themselves," said

Four Star's Kerry Cauthen. "When I saw this colt for the first time back in May, he was a nice type of horse, but he wasn't overly big. He's a late-ish foal-May 10--and so that wasn't a surprise. I saw him a few more times, and he just kept coming and coming, and then of course there's

nothing like a pedigree improvement like the one Sunset Glow gave us. We thought that was a great price for the horse, and he went to a great horseman and a great operation."

Cauthen said big updates like this deep into the catalog is part of the allure of September. "When you're putting these things together back in late May, early June, and at that point Sunset Glow was just starting to come on," he said. "She hadn't won her two graded stakes, and that changed a lot. That's the beauty of this sale. If something pops up,

He said he was never concerned the colt's value would be compromised by his placement in the catalog.

they're going to find you."

"The guys that are looking for these types are aware of these updates, and they realize that, three months ago, [Book 3] was the right place for this horse," Cauthen explained. "Today, he

probably should have been up a book, at least. Physically, this colt has come a tremendous way, and I think he's only going to keep on improving."

The transaction was a nice score for breeder Gayla Rankin. She purchased the Dynaformer filly Perfectforthepart for just \$30,000 as a weanling at the 2004 Keeneland November Sale. Perfectforthepart was put back through the ring the next year at September, but was bought back for \$80,000. She was a solid runner, winning a maiden special on debut and earning black-type in a Fair Grounds stakes, and was retired to Rankin's broodmare band. Her first foal, by Yes It's True, sold for \$25,000 as a weanling; Sunset Glow, her second foal, made \$60,000 as a KEENOV weanling before selling to Ben McElroy for \$140,000 as a yearling here last year. Sunset Glow's updates ensured that this would be the mare's biggest sales success to date.

"The breeder was tickled, and tickled he's going to the Wests," said Cauthen. "[Three Chimneys'] Case Clay managed all this, and he did a great job."

Glass also signed for the second and fourthest highest priced yearlings of the session. Hip 2250, a Super Saver colt consigned by Millenium Farms, brought \$260,000; and hip 2338, a Mineshaft colt consigned by Hermitage Farm sold for \$225,000. - LM LIF CLICK HERE TO SHARE THIS STORY

#### Keeneland Revamps Buyers Portfolio...

Just in time for its September Yearling Sale, Keeneland has launched a new, improved version of its Buyers Portfolio, which is accessible through www.keeneland.com. A browser-based service (that is, it's accessible through the internet), the new portfolio

works on iPads, Androids and wide range of other systems.

"It's available, it's free, and we feel like it's a good way for us to communicate with buyers, and with buvers to communicate with us," said Keeneland's Chief Information Officer Brad Lovell.

In conjuction with Keeneland's interactive catalog, the portfolio

allows buyers to build a short list of prospects for any given sale, and saves all short lists for future reference. The strength of the software lies in its research capabilities. Through the use of filters, shoppers can easily whittle down a catalog by any number of criteria. Want to search for all New York-bred, chestnut Malibu Moon fillies in Book 2, session one, out of stakesproducing mares who are Breeders' Cup eligible? No problem.


There are plenty of other features, too. Clicking a dam's name reveals her sales produce record at Keeneland. Click on a sire's name and every horse of his in the sale will be listed. Meanwhile, buyers can personalize short lists by assigning vet grades or by adding comments.

Keeneland has enhanced many other features to speed the interaction process between itself and customers. Buyers can put in for credit, track purchases, order catalogs, and even request sales pavilion seating through a click of a button.

Another interesting component of the system is email alerts. From the horses on your short list, you can be alerted if a horse is scratched, of catalog updates,

when the horse is just about to enter the ring, of the hammer price and, finally, of summary info. Van releases can even be alerted.

Signing up is easy. It took this reporter :49.14 seconds to fill out the form on Keeneland's site. and another 3:24 for Keeneland to send a confirmation email. That's it.



"We feel like we have all the envisioned functionality that we need here," added Lovell.

So what's the next step for this technology? Lovell said he envisions a process in which buyers, instead of signing a carbon copies in triplicate, register with Keeneland and are provided a card. Winning bidders would simply swipe his or her card, enter a pin number, verify the sale information, and hit an "I agree" button. The buyer would then be provided with a receipt, and would have all the relevant sales information emailed to him or her.

"Results would be nearly instantaneous, because we wouldn't have to read the chicken scratch on the bills and things like that," said Lovell. "It will be a little bit of effort on the customer side of things before the sale, but functionality is simplistic and pretty straight forward."

There's no current timetable for such a process, and in the meantime, Keeneland is encouraging customers to learn and take advantage of its latest technological rollout. Big Weekend on 'Tap' for Winchell...

Owner/breeder Ron Winchell will be well-represented by a pair of 3-year-old homebreds by Tapit in Saturday's GI Cotillion S. and GII Pennsylvania Derby at Parx. The red-hot Gainesway stallion, of course, was campaigned by the Winchell family, which retained a 50-percent stake in the nation's leading stallion. Tapit has continued to flex his muscle in the sales ring as well, led by the current co-topping \$2.2-million colt at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"It's like catching lightning in a bottle," Winchell said of the 2004 GI Wood Memorial hero's success at stud.

Untapable, a runaway heroine of this term's GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Mother Goose S., looks to get back on track in the Cotillion after a disappointing off-the-board finish as the 7-5 chalk against the boys in the GI William Hill Haskell Invitational S. July 27. She is the 7-5 morning-line favorite in the Cotillion.

"She's done phenomenal since [finishing fifth, beaten nine lengths in the Haskell]," Winchell commented on Tuesday's NTRA National Media Teleconference.

"That race turned out to be a little tough--she got away from the gate a little slow, had to go wide, and there was a speed bias of some sort as well. We've given her some time and she's done fantastic."

Winchell continued, "Obviously hindsight is 20/20. If

we could go back in time we'd probably take a different route just because of how it turned out. At the time, it seemed to be the right decision to step her up against boys. She was defeating the fillies so easily, and she seemed

to be in a prime position coming off her win at Belmont [in the Mother Goose]."

Winchell concluded, "But we can't go back in time." The streaking **Tapiture**, meanwhile, will meet dual Classic winner California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) in the Pennsylvania Derby. A well-beaten 15th after tossing a shoe on the first turn in the Gl Kentucky Derby, Tapiture has really started to come into his own since. *Cont. p7*

#### Big Weekend On 'Tap' For Winchell cont.

Freshened following a decisive win in the GIII Matt Winn S. at Churchill Downs June 14, the chestnut overcame a world of trouble before getting up for a dramatic nose victory in the GII West Virginia Derby last time Aug. 2.

"Obviously that stretch run was eye-popping," Winchell said of the West Virginia Derby. "I didn't think he was going to get there and somehow he did and pulled off the victory."

Is Winchell looking forward to a rematch with the comebacking California Chrome?

"I don't know if I'm looking forward to a rematch-obviously California Chrome is an exceptional horse,"
Winchell replied. "One thing that we have discovered
with Tapiture is that time between his races seems to
be the key. I think he's sitting on a really big effort, so
I'm pretty excited to see what happens Saturday."

Winchell continued, "We're sitting in a prime position now, making our third start since the Derby. California Chrome coming back [off a layoff] has to go 1 1/8 miles against horses in top form and that does leave him a little vulnerable in my book. That probably wouldn't have been my choice if I was his owner. It's definitely a good time to face him."

Clearly locked and loaded for the big races on the horizon this fall, Winchell is also looking ahead to the future for his operation.

"The problem we're having right now is the popularity of Tapit," Winchell explained. "It used to be that we bred most of [our 25] mares to him. Now, he's such a fantastic sire, that he's outclassing some of them. You need to have a top-quality mare and there are only so many that we have. We're probably going to look for a few more mares to purchase and breed to him. Hopefully, Tapit has many more years to come."


Sounds like a pretty good problem to have.

#### 'Chrome' Back in Action ...

After taking the racing world by storm this spring, GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) makes his much-anticipated return in Saturday's GII Pennsylvania Derby.

The flashy chestnut returned to the worktab in early August at Los Alamitos after receiving some down time at Harris Farms in California. He emerged from his dead-heat for fourth in the Gl Belmont S. with a minor injury to his right front hoof.

Trainer Art Sherman was as


enthusiastic as ever while taking a break from the Keeneland September Yearling Sale after purchasing "another California Chrome" to join the NTRA National Media Teleconference Tuesday.

"He spent five weeks at Harris Farm and received a lot of R&R," Sherman said after signing the slip on a \$160,000 son of Macho Uno on behalf of Edward Allred. *Cont. p8*

"We were happy about that. He had a great time, got to unwind and got his foot heeled up. That was my main concern, to make sure that he'd be 100%. They did a great job with him."

California Chrome has posted six workouts since, headed by a four-furlong bullet in :47 2/5 Aug. 22 and a six-furlong bullet in 1:10 1/5 Sept. 6.

"His last two or three have been awesome," Sherman said. "He's picking his head up now and reaching his peak. [Jockey] Victor [Espinoza] was all gung-ho about his last work [six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 at Los Alamitos Sept. 13]. We're in good shape, ready for Saturday. We didn't draw the best position [post one] in the world, but we'll see how

the race unfolds."

As for choosing this spot and shipping back to the East Coast instead of staying home for a showdown with unbeaten champion Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg}) and older horses in Santa Anita's GI Awesome Again S. Sept. 27, Sherman added, "I really think the Awesome Again is going to come up a lot tougher than this race. That's my personal opinion. I'm looking forward to the competition--straight 3-year-olds. Why do I have to hook the older horses before the Breeders' Cup? For a million dollars versus \$300,000, you have to take a shot here."

Sherman remains confident that California Chrome is as popular as ever despite his loss in the Belmont with the Triple Crown on the line and co-owner/breeder Steve Coburn's well-documented controversially remarks afterward.

"It's been a great ride and I'm sure if he had the chance to do it again that he'd never do it," Sherman said of Coburn. "You ought to see the crowd out there when I worked California Chrome between races at Los Alamitos. He's the people's horse."

Sherman concluded, "When he runs, I have a lot of confidence in him. I'm not worried that he could get outrun. If he gets outrun, he gets outrun. But they're gonna have to have their running shoes on."



#### DR. SIMON IP NEW HKJC CHAIRMAN

Dr. Simon Ip was elected the new chairman of the Hong Kong Jockey Club for 2014-2015 after the annual general meeting of The Hong Kong Jockey Club Sept. 11. He replaced Brian Stevenson, who retired after 15 years as a club steward and four years as chairman. Ip became a member of The Hong Kong Jockey Club in 1973 and became a voting member in 1992. He was first elected to the Board of Stewards in 1999, and is also a racehorse owner and President of the Hong Kong Equestrian Federation. He retired in 2004 from a career as a solicitor and notary public, he retired in 2004. The new deputy chairman is Anthony Chow. Margaret Leung was elected to the Board of Stewards to fill the vacancy left by Stevenson, and is currently serving as the deputy chairman and managing director of Chong Hing Bank. Three other stewards were reelected, Ip, Lester Kwok and Dr. Eric Cheung. The stewards will serve a three-year term until the next annual meeting in 2017.

"Brian Stevenson has overseen a period of tremendous growth and development for the Jockey Club on both the sporting and charitable fronts," commented Ip. "Our returns to the public purse through duties and tax have increased by more than 43% since 2010 and our charitable donations by a remarkable 137%. It is going to be a very exciting year for the Club as we celebrate our 130th Anniversary of serving the Hong Kong community."

And for anyone that doesn't have a law degree and an inside knowledge of New Jersey politics, it's still virtually impossible to understand to how we got here, here being a decision earlier this week by New Jersey Governor Chris Christie that essentially paved the way for sports betting in the state. But somehow we did, and Dennis Drazin is a very happy man.

Drazin, along with his right-hand man, Monmouth

Park President Bob Kulina, has worked tirelessly to keep one of the sport's most special racetracks afloat. It hasn't been easy. Monmouth is surrounded by states that allow casino gaming at the racetracks, which has given the competitors a huge advantage in inflated purses. With Christie and other key New Jersey politicians thus far refusing to allow casinos in New Jersey outside of Atlantic City, Monmouth has been fighting for survival. According to Drazin, the track loses about \$4.5 million a year.

While it's still not crystal clear that sports betting in New Jersey is legal, it's not necessarily illegal. Drazin grew tired of waiting for Atlantic City to collapse, which is happening right before our eyes, and looked for anything he could find to bring in the type of revenue Monmouth so desperately needs to become profitable and to have the sort of purses that will allow it to compete with the tracks in New York and Pennsylvania.

More so than anyone else he has fought for legalized sports betting at New Jersey racetracks and casinos, making the logical argument that the federal government has no right to bar it in 46 states but allow it in four others (Nevada, Delaware, Oregon, Montana). While it's still not crystal clear that sports betting in New Jersey is legal, it's not necessarily illegal. Christie said that any racetrack or casino in the state that accepts sports bets will not be prosecuted. Don't ask. Don't tell.

Drazin wanted to start accepting sports bets right

away but all sides involved agreed to a 45-day moratorium to let the dust settle. That was fine with Drazin who said he needed the time to get Monmouth ready for the new venture.



"We really weren't set up to launch properly," he said. "We already spent \$1 million on our William Hill sports book. We have the room ready to go but technically we need phone lines, Internet lines and we need to hire 111 people to help operate the book. You don't want to launch something as important as sports betting without doing it right."

Drazin, who is an attorney, understands that it's unlikely that the anti-sports betting side will go away that easily. He says he doesn't expect any problems from the federal government but anticipates that the sports leagues will continue to battle. But he also doesn't think they'll have the ability, at least in the short-term, to shut the Monmouth sports book down once it is up and running.

The other tracks in the state and the casinos are taking a more cautious approach. They're letting Monmouth be the test case and will jump on board when and if it is certain that the last legal roadblock is out of the way.

Drazin is happy to lead the way. He has always been bold and innovative and is committed to securing a future for Monmouth Park. If sports betting is what it takes sports betting is what it will be.

His partner is William Hill, one of the largest bookmaking firms in the world. They have estimated that Monmouth will take in as much as \$1 billion a year in sports bets with the "win" equaling out to about \$75 million annually. Once the pie is cut up Drazin anticipates that \$20 million will go toward purses. *Cont. p12*

What I would like to do is have a repeat of the 'Elite Meet' like we had in 2010 when purses averaged \$1 million a day," Drazin said.

Casinos and racetracks outside of New Jersey will also be watching closely. If Monmouth makes this work and ends the prohibition on legal sports betting in this country then it might just be only a matter of time before you can go to one place to legally bet the ninth race exacta and the over/under on the Steelers game.

For now, though, it's all about Monmouth Park. One of the sport's great racetracks, it needs help and it looks like help is on the way.


