



TORONADO TO NATIONAL STUD IN '15

Sheikh Joaan Bin Hamad Al Thani's multiple Group 1 winner Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}--Wana Doo, by Grand Slam) will begin his stud career next season at the English National Stud. The 4-year-old captured last season's G1 Sussex S. and added this term's G1 Queen Anne S. He was second in last year's G1 St James's Palace S. and this year's Sussex and G1 Prix du Moulin.

"Myself and the senior steward, Roger Weatherby are thrilled that such a high-class horse will be retiring for the 2015 season to the National Stud and are most grateful to His Excellency Sheikh Joaan for his wonderful gesture to support the British breeding industry," said Ben Sangster, chairman of the National Stud. "This is such a tremendous opportunity for breeders, who I'm sure, will be keen to send high-quality mares to this very special horse."

John Warren will be managing Toronado on Sheikh Joaan's behalf and his son Jake will be in charge of sales of nominations.

"Looking closely at both Toronado's pedigree and conformation, he is hugely exciting," Warren said. "Being by the international leading sire High Chaparral out of a mare from the Gone West line, he looks perfect for a wide range of mares, including those that descend from the Danzig line. Having the powerful build of a very fast horse and being a group-winning unbeaten 2-year-old, Toronado will really appeal to the commercial market. As a European champion miler, he will also be important to owner/breeders who are aiming to breed a Classic prospect."

Toronado is expected to make his next start in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot next month.

KINGMAN RETIRED TO BANSTEAD MANOR

Juddmonte homebred G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}--Zenda {GB}, by Zamindar) has been retired to Banstead Manor Stud after being treated for a throat infection which ruled him out of autumn targets. A winner of the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-Le Buffard-Jacques Le Marois at Deauville Aug. 17 in his last racecourse appearance, the John Gosden trainee also scored in the G1 QIPCO Sussex S. at Goodwood against his elders July 30 and the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. A close second in the G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas May 3 was the only blemish on his record. The talented bay and "TDN Rising Star" also lifted the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury in April and captured last year's G3 Solario S. at Sandown. Cont. p3



Kingman is out of the G1 Poule D'Essai Des Pouliches heroine Zenda--a half-sister to prominent sire Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert)--and is a half-brother to G3 Tercentenary S. winner Remote (GB) (Dansili {GB}). The sophomore had been pointing for the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. and retires with a mark of 8-7-1-0 and \$1,607,201 in earnings.

"Kingman is to be retired to Banstead Manor Stud for the 2015 stud season," said Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to owner Khalid Abdullah. "The throat infection will still need on going treatment which will rule out the Queen Elizabeth II S. and also the Breeders' Cup. The stud fee of the horse that has electrified European racing in 2014 will be announced by the stud when appropriate."

Added trainer John Gosden, "The Queen Elizabeth II S. was probably going to be his final race, but it's a shame he's missing it. He's a fabulous-looking horse with a great mind on him and he had this ability to change six gears at once. He had a turbo charge that no other horse I've trained has possessed. It's a very rare thing to see in a horse. It's hard to nominate his best performance, but I suppose it's the Sussex because it was the weirdest race I've ever seen. He's certainly the best colt I've ever trained."

BARRETTS TO MOVE SELECT 2YO SALE

Barretts announced that its 2-year-old in training sale will be conducted Monday, Feb. 23 at Fairplex in Pomona, California. Conducted in early March in recent years, the sale will host its training preview day Friday, Feb. 20. Nominations close Friday, Oct. 24.

"We'll kick off the 2-year-old sales season in the West again this year," said Barretts General manager Kim Lloyd. "Being first up the past three years, we've had huge gains, and the highest select sale average increase of 2014."

The Jan. 26 Mixed Sale and 2-year-old Select Sale will be the final Barretts auctions conducted at the Fairplex facility, with the balance of the 2015 sales calendar to be held at Del Mar. The Barretts May Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training is scheduled for May 27 (with a May 25 preview), while The Paddock Sale will be held July 19. Rounding out the Barretts season are the Select Yearling Sale Aug. 12 and the Fall Sale of Yearlings and Horses of Racing Age, which will be held Nov. 4, following the Breeders' Cup.



OBITUARIES

AARON JONES DIES

Longtime horse owner and breeder Aaron Jones died Monday of heart failure at his home in Eugene, Oregon. He was 92. In tandem with his wife of 43 years, Marie,

Jones campaigned or bred a bevy of top notch horses, chief among them was the Jones-bred, champion 3-year-old Filly and Older Mare Ashado (Saint Ballado), winner of seven Grade 1s, including the GI Spinaway, GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Campaigned by Starlight Stables and trained by Todd Pletcher, Ashado was inducted into the Racing Hall of Fame last month.

Also among the notable horses bred, sold or campaigned by the Joneses;

GI King's Bishop S. scorer Forestry (Storm Cat), a \$1.5-million Keeneland July purchase; 2000 Champion Older Mare Riboletta (Brz) (Roi Normand); and Jones-bred Drosselmeyer, who went on to win the 2010 GI Belmont S. and the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Jones also bred 2004 sprint champion Speightstown (Gone West), who was campaigned by Eugene Melnyk and trained by Pletcher. The striking chestnut earned his most notable victory in the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint before embarking on a successful career at stud.

"We have been friends and partners with him for 40 years," said Frank Taylor, Vice President of Boarding Operations at Taylor Made. "It's tough to lose him."

Pletcher, who was granted the task of preparing many of the Joneses top racehorses since the beginning of the century, was responsible for a long list of stakes winners for the couple, including Forest Danger

(Forestry), a \$900,000 FTFEB 2-year-old purchase who went on to win the GI Carter H.; Jones homebred Sunriver (Saint Ballado), winner of the GI Hollywood Turf Cup; multiple-graded stakes victor Master Command (A.P. Indy); Grade II winner Shaniko (A.P. Indy); and stakes winner Value Plus (Unbridled's Song), runner-up in the 2004 GI Florida Derby.

Aaron Jones Dies...cont.

Jones got his first taste of the Thoroughbred business in 1971, when he bought five broodmares, eight weanlings for a total of \$113,000 at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale. Among his earliest stakes winners were 1974 Beverly Hills H. heroine La Zanzara and Miss Musket, winner of the 1974 Santa Anita Oaks and Fantasy S. Both fillies were trained by the legendary 'Bald Eagle,' Charlie Whittingham. The following decade, a pair of Laz Barerra-trained horses earned championships for Jones; 1982 Champion Older Horse Lemi Gold (*Vaguely Noble) and 1986 Champion 3-year-old Filly Tiffany Lass (Bold Forbes).

A health scare caused Jones to disperse much of his stock in 1990, but the philanthropist returned to the game in 1996, and later campaigned 2000 Champion Older Female Riboletta, the winner of five Grade I's, including the GI Beldame S. and GI Ruffian H. The Joneses had cut down their racing team significantly over the past five years, however, Marie Jones continued to manage the couple's equine holdings.

"Marie has taken over in the last five years and has focused more on the commercial market," said Taylor.

A native of Texas, Jones amassed his fortune in the lumber industry in Oregon. He established his own firm, Seneca Sawmill Company, in 1954 and that expanded to the Seneca Family of Companies, which now employs about 400 people.

It is one of the largest -producing, single-location timber and sawmill companies in the U.S., managing over 165,000 acres of Oregon forest land and producing 485-million feet of lumber per year.

Jones served in the Pacific as an officer during World War II. After the war, he returned to Eugene, Oregon, and in 1947, graduated from the University of Oregon with a degree in physical education. He subsequently launched his lumber company.

40 Years in the Making...

The relationship between Aaron Jones and the Taylor family spans four decades, back to a time when both Jones and the Taylors were just getting their feet wet in the sport.

"When I was 16 or 17 years old, I went up to him at Keeneland and introduced myself," recalled Frank Taylor. "I told him we would love to board some horses for him, since we were just starting Taylor Made at the time. He called us about a year later and said he wanted to move 40 head over to the farm. That's where it started, and we've been together ever since."

Among Jones's diverse holdings in the industry, he was also involved in the stallion market, having stood leading sire Saint Ballado (Halo) in conjunction with Taylor Made. The partnership reportedly secured the stallion for stud duty for about \$6-million.

"We handled stallions, mares, racehorses, pretty much handled everything for him," said Taylor. "He was a great businessman and a very good horseman. He really understood horses, conformation and pedigrees."

In addition to a business relationship, however, Taylor also forged a personal relationship with Jones.

"He was basically and second dad to me," said Taylor. "Not only was he a great customer, but he was also a very good mentor. He advised us on business and, when we were very young and growing, he was our biggest supporter. Any time we had a big decision to make, we'd call him for his opinion. He was a great friend, mentor and partner. We'll miss him."--CBoss

JC Gold Cup Contenders Work

A pair of Grade I-winning sophomores--including GI Belmont S. hero **Tonalist** (Tapit)--turned in five-furlong breezes on the Belmont training track Monday morning. Sent out at approximately 9:40 a.m., GI Travers S. winner **V. E. Day** (English Channel) covered the distance in 1:00.69, while Tonalist completed the task in 1:00.09. Both are expected to contest Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. The training track was labeled 'good.' V. E. Day, who is trained by Jimmy Jerkens for Magalen Bryant, went alone under exercise rider Kelvin Pahal. "It wasn't an ideal track, but it was good enough," said Jerkens. "I wanted to give him a work on the main track, but [breezing on the training track] was a no-brainer. I thought his breeze was good. I watched it from the eighth pole, but it looked like he was nice and steady the whole way." Tonalist, accompanied by jockey Joel Rosario, worked in company with stablemate Bluegrass Flash (Bluegrass Cat). It was the first workout over the training track for Tonalist, who is trained by Christophe Clement for Robert Evans. Following the June 7 Belmont S., Tonalist finished second in the GII Jim Dandy S. and third in the Aug. 23 Travers. "We had to reschedule the work twice, unfortunately, because of the weather," said Clement. "The main track was not suitable yesterday or this morning. So we went to the training track, which was a first for him. It was a little bit difficult for me to assess the work, because I've had nothing to compare it with."

WORLD'S BEST JOCKS TO BE HONORED IN HK

Longines, the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) and the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities (IFHA) will honor the inaugural world's best jockey at the Longines Hong Kong International Races gala dinner at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Center Dec. 12. Jockeys earn points by performing in the world's 100 highest-rated Group 1 or Grade I races according to the Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings Committee from Dec. 1 of last year until Nov. 30 of this year. A win is worth 12 points, six points for second and four points for third. Jockeys Joseph O'Brien of Ireland and Belgian jockey Christophe Soumillon are tied for the lead with 72 points and English reinsman Ryan Moore tracks them with 70 points. "It is entirely appropriate that the accomplishments of the world's best jockeys are recognized internationally," commented IFHA Chairman Louis Romanet. "Jockeys are incredible athletes and their amazing feats of skill and daring bring millions of fans to the sport around the world. The Longines World's Best Jockey award is a proud joint initiative of the IFHA and LONGINES, and we are very thankful to the Hong Kong Jockey Club for hosting the award ceremony."

Godolphin trainer Charlie Appleby saddled the winners of six races--all juveniles--in England Monday, taking five races at Kempton and one at Leicester. The feat equaled the Godolphin record of wins in a day. In 2009, trainer Saeed bin Suroor twice won six races in a day for the operation.

"It has been a good, productive day," Appleby said. "All the winners are 2-year-olds and have their futures ahead of them. I was hopeful of decent performances today from a strong team of horses and it is great that six got the job done. We will savor today and then get on with the job of producing more winners."

The win streak was started with **Game Show (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire})'s victory in the first race at Kempton and was followed by Kempton winners **Strong Chemistry** (Oasis Dream {GB}), **Mulzamm (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), **Forest Maiden (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and **Comedy Queen** (Distorted Humor). **Charming Thought (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) won at Leicester.

"I hope Strong Chemistry, Forest Maiden and Charming Thought have bright futures," Appleby said. "I like Strong Chemistry and was happy with his second first time up and he triumphed impressively in a good time today. I have thought a lot of Forest Maiden for a long time and hope she will make natural progression, while Charming Thought is going forward the right way."

Kingston Hill (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) didn't join the exercise party, but he proved a huge draw for Roger Varian's Kremlin House Stables where he was paraded in front of a large crowd wearing his winner's sheet from the previous weekend's G1 St Leger.

On any day of the week it's possible for members of the public to park at the epicenter of Newmarket's 2,500-acre training grounds and observe the comings and goings of leading trainers and the town's equine inhabitants, a four-legged population which grows to around 3,000 at the height of the Flat season. It's a scene which never fails to inspire even those who are not diehard racing fans, but only the most eagle-eyed of regular work-watchers would know which horses they are looking at as string upon string of elegant bluebloods float by. The formal staging of Newmarket's equivalent of 'Breakfast with the Stars'-- from numbered saddle-cloths on each horse to interviews with trainers as their charges ascended Warren Hill's polytrack canter in front of the gathered masses--is an excellent way to give race fans extra insight into a horse's daily routine and what goes into getting them to the track in tiptop condition.

Newmarket is of course not just famed for its racing yards but also as a breeding center, with a number of major studs surrounding the town. Though he is not trained in England, this season's dual Derby winner Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) started life just outside Newmarket at Lord Derby's Stanley House Stud and while he has gained a deserved following in his own right, he is still outshone by his famous dam, Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}). The seven-time G1 winner--whose big-race successes include the English and Irish Oaks and two Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf wins--returned to the place of her birth upon retirement from racing in 2006 and now lives alongside her daughter and Australia's full-sister Filia Regina (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Both mother and daughter were paraded for visitors to the stud throughout the morning.

"Ouija Board is the most terrible show-off so she loved every minute of the open day," said Peter Stanley, who manages Stanley House Stud for his brother Lord Derby. "She felt right at home and was in her element--it was like the Breeders' Cup all over again. Throughout the morning we didn't even get a chance to put her back in her stable--there was a constant stream of visitors right the way through and we were delighted so many people came to see her and Filia Regina."

Added Stanley, "It's a great tribute to everyone who worked so hard to get the open day off the ground. I had plenty of positive feedback from people who came along and it's important for our industry to stage days like this and to help members of the public connect with racing."

Once the racing yards had closed their doors at 12:30, events continued at related organizations throughout the town. The British Racing School held schooling displays with former Group 1-winning steeplechaser Our Vic (Ire) (Old Vic {GB}) which were overseen by Great Britain's eventing team coach Yogi Breisner, while a number of jockeys, including Ryan Moore, showed off sporting skills of a different kind on the temporary football pitch at Newmarket's Rowley Mile racecourse.

With Tattersalls about to burst into life for its two-week October Sale, plenty of budding bloodstock enthusiasts took the opportunity of listening in to a talk in the sales-ring on conformation given by leading trainer John Gosden and bloodstock agent Tom Goff. The pair have teamed up in a number of top-class horses, including G1 St Leger winner Arctic Cosmos (North Light {Ire}), who was bought by Goff's Blandford Bloodstock for 47,000gns at Book 2 of Tattersalls' October Sale, and Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality), a \$70,000 Keeneland September purchase. They used another of their combined purchases, the multiple Group winner Gregorian (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}), as a live model for the presentation to 400 people.

With the number of visitors to the open day this year increasing to around 5,000 and all money raised split between four racing-related charities, it's an event which is now firmly rooted in the calendar.

"It always takes three to five years to establish events such as these, but what was great this year was that we'd sold so many tickets in advance," said Newmarket Open Day organizer Johnno Spence. "Lots of families came along and there was a great atmosphere--the important thing is that everyone has a good time and I think we achieved that."

SEPTEMBER SUMMARY

It could hardly have come out closer, could it? No, I'm not referring to the Scottish referendum (55-45 No to secession, I mean independence), but to the Keeneland September Sale, which finished its two-week run on Sunday. It was about as much like last year--which had seen a \$60-million (28%) rise from 2012--as it could have been. Specifically, the gross, after 13 days of selling, was just \$500,000 less than in 2013: \$279,960,500 this year, \$280,491,300 last year--a decline of 2/10ths of 1% (.2%). There were 273 more yearlings (7%) catalogued this year, though as we mentioned before the sale there were 13% fewer catalogued in Book 1, and 13% more catalogued in Week 2. In the event 2,819 yearlings sold (3% more than last year) for an average of \$99,312 (3% less than last year). The differences are explained by a 2.8% drop from last year's remarkable 70.2% sold from those catalogued, to 67.4% this year. All these single-digit movements really add up to the same thing, though: stable market. That's fine.

One observation we would make pertains to the point that the shrinking of the foal crop should lead, in theory, to stronger demand. In actual fact, supply and demand did not seem to differ markedly from last year. One explanation for that has to be that if the number of buyers is shrinking at roughly the same rate the foal crop is shrinking, it equals out.

It's testimony to the decisions North American breeders were making at the beginning of 2012 that all 15 of the sires with 10 or more yearlings sold so far this year ([click here--Instatistics--2014 Yearling Sales - NA only](#)) which have averaged \$175,000+ are proven sires; in fact, none of the 15 had their first foals later than 2008 (6-year-olds of 2014). Gainesway's Tapit, now over \$3.5-million clear of Kitten's Joy, Candy Ride, and Giant's Causeway on the 2014 North American TDN General Sire List ([click here--NA only](#)), has had 38 yearlings sell for an average of \$628,289. Claiborne's War Front has had 18 sell for an average of \$539,556, and remains comfortably in second spot. Darley's Bernardini (\$365,074), who had the great pedigrees, and Medaglia D'Oro (\$345,179 with 28 sold of 29 through the ring), come next. The top five is rounded out by WinStar's Distorted Humor (\$282,087). Moving into the top 15 are Ramsey Farm's Kitten's Joy (\$195,202, with 52 sold, off a \$50,000 fee in 2012) and the second-last crop by WinStar's (formerly Airdrie's) Harlan's Holiday, who has averaged \$177,873 with 55 sold, off a \$25,000 stud fee.





"The fact that Week 2 last year leapt by 46% in gross while selling an exemplary 72.5% of the catalogue was sensational news. It was tougher sledding this year: the clearance rate from the catalogue in Week 2 slipped by 4%. The gross did increase by 8% (\$10-million), but 13% more yearlings (386) were catalogued in Week 2 this year but just 7% more (148) sold. The Week 2 average was up by 1.6% to \$58,741. The overall sale -- virtually dead even -- is discussed in the column."

Claiborne's Trappe Shot, a good-looking Grade II-winning son of Tapit who is obviously siring same, is the upset leader among North American sires with their first yearlings this year ([click here--Instatistics--2014 Yearling Sales, First-Year Sires only, NA only](#)). No fluke about it: 53 have sold, of 67 offered, for an average of \$133,491--over 13 times his initial \$10,000 stud fee-- and a median of \$110,000, which is an astronomical 11 times his stud fee. As we said last week, if they run like they look, Tapit is a sire of sires. Ashford's Uncle Mo (\$120,183), with an amazing 82 sold from an equally amazing 102 offered, is second among first-year sires. Castleton Lyons' Gio Ponti (\$104,057 from 44 sold) is the only other first-year North American sire to break the six-figure average barrier. Spendthrift's Tizway (\$85,167), Coolmore Ashford's Cape Blanco (\$79,016); and the WinStar pair of Drosselmeyer (\$68,693) and Sidney's Candy (\$62,073) come next by average.

Now the yearling market shifts to Europe for the most part. Tattersalls Ireland sells at Fairyhouse this week, then the big guns roll out for Goffs the following week, then two weeks in Newmarket for Tattersalls' October Sale (3 books), with Book 1 this year scheduled for Oct. 7-9. Last year Goffs Orby, in its second year back in a two-day format, saw a 28% jump in gross (same as Keeneland September), from €27-million in 2012 to €34-million. Tattersalls' October 1 sale, which had seen a 1/3 rise in gross from 2011 (51-million gns) to 2012 (68-million gns), leveled off in 2013 at 70-million gns (one guinea, which is £1.05, is roughly equal to U.S. \$1.70-\$1.75). Last year's October 1 average was 207,501 gns, which is \$350,000, more or less. With Qatar's Al-Thani family now firmly entrenched alongside the Maktoums and Coolmore as buyers of top-tier yearlings, and with 84 yearlings (20 at Goffs and 64 at Tatts') by the half-brothers Galileo and Sea The Stars, it would not be a surprise to see the two sales gross over \$200-million this year. Last year Goffs grossed about \$45-million in U.S. money, Tatts October 1 about \$120-million, so those would be big gains.

THE LITTLE BROWN JUG - AN EXCURSION

Imagine the Kentucky Derby, but held at a fair. Not a state fair, the massive kind that attract acts like Aerosmith and Toby Keith. Not even the sort that draw Smash Mouth and Uncle Kracker. Think smaller. Think county fair, the kind with two dozen or so small rides--a pirate ship pendulum, a rickety Ferris wheel--and maybe the same number of food trucks and win-a-prize attractions.

Imagine a dilapidated grandstand, a well-kept but modest half-mile track, and a barn area where fans are not only allowed, but encouraged to enter the barns and get within a few feet of the equine athletes who will race later in the day. This is the Little Brown Jug, Harness racing's equivalent of the Derby.

Last week, Bill Finley, who runs the TDN's sister publication *Harness Racing Update*, asked if I was interested in covering this year's Jug. I grew up around Harness racing and had never been, so it was an easy decision. Following the conclusion of Book 4 last Tuesday at Keeneland, my girlfriend Ada and I packed up the car and headed 3 1/2 hours north to Delaware, Ohio, home of the Delaware County Fair and of the Little Brown Jug.

Some background. For 3-year-old pacers, the Jug, inaugurated in 1946, is held on the third Thursday after Labor Day. It's the second leg of the Pacing Triple Crown, falling between the Cane Pace at Tioga Downs and the Messenger Pace at Yonkers. Horses race in heats, a format that hasn't been used in Thoroughbred racing in well over a century. This year, there were two eliminations (sometimes there are three), each with eight horses. **Cont. p12**

The first four across the wire in each advance to the final, held three races after the end of the second heat. Purses currently are \$103,600 for each elim and \$310,800 for the final.

Pacing and galloping are apples and oranges, but still, that's a bit of a mind-blowing notion when in a day and age when Thoroughbreds returning off three weeks' rest are sometimes referred to be "wheeling back."

The winners, and the drivers who got them home, have their name painted on a massive, 3 1/2-foot tall jug. The original, made of clay and weighing a (not literal) ton, ran out of room in 2005. The next year, a new jug was pressed into service. Pragmatism won out over tradition: it was made out of plastic.

Oh, why Little Brown Jug? It's a little unclear, but a local newspaper contest was held to name the race, which most probably was named after a drinking [song](#) written in 1869 and popularized by Glenn Miller in the post-prohibition era.

Like the song, the race is all Americana, and while other Harness stakes have bigger purses, nothing, other than maybe the Hambletonian for 3-year-old trotters, carries the cachet of the Jug.

The 2014 edition was rich in storylines. Could trainer Casie Coleman, one of the sport's leading trainers at just 34 who recently dropped 75 pounds courtesy a rigorous exercise routine, capture an unprecedented third straight Jug with her 12-time-winning millionaire McWicked? Could local hero Dave Miller, a Buckeye through and through, steer home his fourth Jug winner?

Could the Cane Pace upsetter Lyonssomewhere, supplemented for \$45,000, give the 35-year-old driver Yannick Gingras his first winner? Or would Jimmy Takter--Harness's version of Bob Baffert--send out his second? Last Thursday, a crowd of 41,000 gathered at the fair grounds to see these questions answered.

There's a big catch, though. If one of the two elimination winners *doesn't* win the final, then there's yet *another* step, a race-off between the three winners, to be held three races later.

So the winner of the Jug can, in theory, race three times in about three hours. Not just in theory, of course. It isn't uncommon. It happened in both 1999 and 2000.

A few other notes about the fair grounds. There is no backstretch, really, or at least, there is no place where the public isn't. The barns on the backstretch sit next to corn dog ventures, which sit next to rows and rows of the aluminum folding chairs that the locals trudge in, along with coolers-full of Bud Light. Some of the chairs that line the fences, I was told, have been chained in place for decades. Sort of like putting a folded Form on your grandstand seat--to save it from others--but with greater permanence. "You'll see two old ladies that first met as young girls along the rail, and who still sit next to each other each year," one person explained.

Also, there are two big barns, one for fillies taking part in the Jugette, held a day before the Jug, and another for the Jug. Each barn is circular with a big, open-air space in the middle, and the public is invited in to see the horses up close and personal. On the morning of the Jug, He's Watching, one of the favorites, alternately ravaged his Jolly Ball and inquisitively poked his head out of the stall to see all the passers-by.

The fan interaction component of it reminded me of when John Shirreffs would generously let fans come up and pat Zenyatta on the nose when she was out grazing. Our equine stars aren't pets. But it does seem like the more we can encourage a closer interaction between the horses and the fans, the better it will be for our sport.

At around 4:45 p.m., pacers for the [first elimination](#) lined up behind the moving starting gate. The heavy favorite, Lyonssomewhere, flashed his trademark early speed and, despite leaving from post seven, easily cleared the field. He largely went unchallenged for the remainder of the mile. As the field turned for home, the race was essentially over. But then it wasn't. For no good reason, Lyonssomewhere jumped off stride (broke into a gallop), forcing Yannick Gingras to steer him off the track. He finished last and would not make the final. So much for the \$45,000 supplement fee.

“He was home free,” Gingras told me later. “I had never asked him at that point. I hadn't pulled the [ear] plugs yet, and I was loaded. I was trying to keep something for the second heat. Then he had an unfortunate break, which was devastating.”

Gingras, it seemed, would go another year without a Jug win on his resume.

The [second elimination](#) figured to boil down to Coleman's McWicked, with the Buckeye ace Miller in the bike, and He's Watching, the Jolly Ball brutalizer whose victory in the \$775,000 Meadowlands Pace in July stamped him as one of the best in the country.



Two races in 65 minutes? No problem for Jug winner Limelight Beach

McWicked's race to lose, but on the outside came flying the longshot Limelight Beach, who was still looking for his first victory in his 13th start of the year. Limelight Beach surged, and won the race by a length. The driver? Yannick Gingras. The Jug was still within his grasp.

If the crowd was slow to back Limelight Beach and Gingras in the second elimination, it didn't make that mistake again in the [final](#). Hammered down to even-money with that coveted rail draw, Limelight Beach, looking to improve to 2-for-2 on the afternoon after going 0-for-12 the rest of the year, led every step and cruised home a confident winner. Gingras had his Jug victory.

“It's unbelievable,” said Gingras, the sport's hottest driver right now. “It's one of those races you dream of winning. It feels awesome. The way [Limelight Beach] raced in the second division, I would have been shocked if he lost [the final].”

A few hours later, I was still churning out copy for *HRU*, the last person in the fair grounds press box that sits atop the old grandstand. It was dark and the track was barely visible, but you could still hear the sounds of the midway in the distance. I was thinking about what legendary track announcer Roger Huston, the voice of the Jug, had theatrically said just before the first elim: “We've been thinking about this moment since the 2013 Little Brown Jug was made official.” It was true, I guess. I'm already thinking about 2015. If you have a chance to go, you should think about it, too.

McWicked jumped out to lead early, and at 3-5, looked nearly unbeatable early, particularly as He's Watching, racing wide down the backside the second time, began to struggle. With 100 yards to go, it still looked like

Los Al Concludes Successful First Fall Meet: Edited Press Release

Los Alamitos ended a successful first Fall meet Sunday, averaging \$5,768,238 daily in total combined mutuel handle. The figure represented a 26.6% increase over the comparable days a year earlier for the Barretts Race meet at Fairplex Park. The average total combined mutuel handle for the 13-day season in 2013 was \$4,568,811.

"We're happy," said Brad McKinzie, vice president and general manager of the Los Alamitos Racing Association. "I would have to say this meet probably surpassed our expectations. We thought we'd do well, but we did better than we thought we would, especially with the racing product. All in all, it's a second step to where we want to go. This meet was a success any way you want to cut it."

The average field size increased from 6.99 starters per race during the Summer Thoroughbred Festival in July to 7.73 for the fall season.

Apprentice jockey Drayden Van Dyke made it back-to-back riding titles at Los Alamitos, wrapping up the inaugural fall season with a Sunday double to give him the championship over runner-up Fernando Perez. The Kentucky-born and Arkansas-raised Van Dyke, who turned 20 earlier in the month, completed the meet with 11 victories, one more than Perez. Van Dyke, who won Sunday with Valdirone (Bertrando) in the second race and Sandy's Song (First Samurai) in the fourth, led the Summer Thoroughbred Festival in July with 12 wins, finishing four in front of his closest pursuer, Joe Talamo.

"It's an honor to win the title here not just once, but twice," said Van Dyke. "You don't see a lot of apprentices winning titles. I want to thank my agent Sarah [Wolfe] and the owners and trainers who have put me on so many nice horses."

Doug O'Neill and Mike Puype shared the training title with six victories each. Hall of Famer Bob Baffert was one back with five.

Thoroughbred racing will return to Los Alamitos in December. The 12-day season, which will begin Dec. 4 and continue through Dec. 21, will run Thursday through Sunday.
