Steve Mooney's **Ball Dancing** (Exchange Rate) put together an impressive streak of five races while trained in France by Pia Brandt for MD Bloodstock Limited, winning two of those while never competing at a distance shorter than 9 1/2 furlongs. Winner of the Listed Prix de la Seine at Longchamp in May, the \$55,000 Keeneland January bargain was runner-up in the G3 Prix du Royaumont at Chantilly June 1 and gave an outstanding account of herself when fifth, beaten under two lengths, by theretofore unbeaten Avenir Certain (Fr) (Le Havre {Fr}). **Cont. p3**

SEVEN 'SUPER SALE' SIRES


As things turned out, the difference between Tuesday's opening session of this week's Tattersalls October 1 yearling sale and the subsequent two sessions could be summarized by the following statistic: Galileo (Ire) and Dubawi (Ire), between them,

had 42 yearlings catalogued to the sale. On Tuesday, only six of those 42 were catalogued; the remaining 36 were catalogued on Wednesday and Thursday. Darley's Dubawi, who had 10 sell of his 13 catalogued throughout the whole sale, actually returned a higher average than Galileo, who had 22 sell of 29 catalogued. Dubawi

averaged 654,500gns (about \$1.1-million); Galileo averaged 577,727gns (about \$977,000). Very significantly, all 10 Dubawis were bought by Maktoum entities: John Ferguson signed for six, Rabbah for three, Shadwell for one. That's a statement. Cont. p8

Acquired privately following that test, Ball Dancing was an overlaid 5-1 chance in her U.S. debut in the GII Sands Point S. at Belmont Sept. 13, behind favored GI Belmont Oaks runner-up Sea Queen (Lemon Drop Kid), Xcellence (Fr) (Champs Elysees {GB})--whom she finished a half-length behind in the Diane--and Daring Dancer (Empire Maker). Held up near the tail while covering Xcellence, she got first run on that one and looked like the winner at the eighth pole. Her stablemate poked her head in front, but Ball Dancing dug in and prevailed. Brown, who won this event in 2012 with recent GI First Lady S. victress Dayatthespa (City Zip), also has Belmont Oaks winner Minorette (Smart Strike), a maiden winner and stakes-placed in four Irish appearances for Aidan O'Brien. The 3/4-sister to Master of Hounds (Kingmambo) was most recently an excuse-free last of four behind "TDN Rising" Star" © Crown Queen (Smart Strike) in the GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga Aug. 16. "They both look terrific," the former Bobby Frankel assistant commented. "They've been training well at Belmont. "They shipped in great, and we're looking forward to running both of them in this race." Crown Queen, a half-sister to fellow Rising Star and three-time Eclipse Award winner Royal Delta (Empire Maker), is perfect in three tries this term, having posted an impressive four-length allowance score at the Spa July 20 ahead of her half-length tally in the Lake Placid.



The two sisters have some things in common, according to Bill Mott's assistant trainer Rodolphe Brisset. "Physically, totally different," said Brisset, who was also Royal Delta's exercise rider. "But I get a lot of similarities when galloping [Crown Queen]; covering a lot of ground, long stride. Crown Queen is more like [her dam] Delta Princess (A.P. Indy). Her mother was not easy to be around." Cont. p4

She exits a third in the Lake Placid, while Daring Dancer, whose trainer Graham Motion sent out Film Maker (Dynaformer) to score in the 2003 QE II, was game in taking the GII Lake George S. July 23 at Saratoga, but was a well-beaten sixth in the Sands Point last time out. The Sagamore runner annexed this track's GIII Appalachian S. earlier this spring.

PESLIER ENDS ASSOCIATION WITH THE WERTHEIMERS

Leading French jockey Olivier Peslier and prominent owners the Wertheimer brothers have brought their

association to an amicable end after over a decade of success. Peslier has ridden as retained rider for the Wertheimers for 12 years, with the exploits of the wonder mare Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) the undoubted highlight of the partnership. Peslier was in the saddle during each of Goldikova's 27 races, guiding her to a staggering 14 Group 1 and Grade I victories, including her hat-trick of successes in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Other notable successes between the partnership include, Solemia (Ire) (Poliglote {GB})'s

shock triumph in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in 2012 and Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire})'s G1 Prix du Jockey Club victory last year.

Pierre-Yves Bureau, racing manager for the Wertheimers said, "We have decided to end the collaboration with Olivier after 12 years, but it is ending on very good terms, which is very important. It is the end of the cycle. Twelve years is a very long time and we all have great memories of horses like Goldikova, the Arc victory of Solemia and Intello's fantastic season last year. We have had many good moments and it has been a great collaboration."

Asked about a potential successor to Peslier, Bureau added, "Nothing is decided at this moment. We are working on it and we will make an announcement when the news is finalized."

APPROVAL ON TRIAL FOR BC MILE

Defending champion Za Approval (Ghostzapper) returned to his winning ways in his most recent appearance in Belmont's Real Courage S. Sept. 7 and looks for a repeat performance in today's GIII Knickerbocker S. In his case, something of a "run well and you're in" trial for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. The popular gray defeated the re-opposing Plainview (Street Cry {Ire}) here last year before cutting back in distance and rallying in the lane to be runner-up to Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the main event at Santa Anita. He was bankrupt in his first four appearances this term as well, including a lackluster fifth behind Up With the Birds (Stormy Atlantic) when favored at 3-2 in the GII Nijinsky S. at Woodbine July 19, but he recorded his first victory of the season in the Real Courage S., somewhat surprisingly dictating a soft pace before kicking home as the clear class of that seven-furlong affair. "I just think he's a better horse in the fall than in the summer; he's doing well," said trainer Christophe Clement. "We used [the Knickerbocker] as a way to the Breeders' Cup last year, and we'll try to do the same [this year]." Up With the Birds snuck across the border around this time last year to best his peers in the GI Jamaica S. and was very impressive in the Nijinsky, kicking hard to score by four lengths. With an option to stay home for the GII Sky Classic S., the Sam-Son runner instead tried the GI Arlington Million and came from last behind a moderate pace to split that septet in fourth.



"I was a little bit disappointed [with his performance in the Arlington Million], but it was a tough race," said trainer Malcolm Pierce. "We picked [the Knickerbocker] because of the timing and distance; I think it suits him perfectly, and he ran so well in the Jamaica last year." After experimenting with slightly longer trips, Winning Cause (Giant's Causeway) returned to nine furlongs to upset Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy) in the GIII Cliff Hanger S. at Monmouth Aug. 24. His last-out third at 2-5 in the PTHA President's Cup at Parx Sept. 13 may be excusable, but he'd be an iffy proposition here if the ground is too easy, as it was in Philadelphia last month.



IFHA CONFERENCE VIDEO AVAILABLE

Video and power point presentations of the 48th International Federation of Horseracing Authorities (IFHA) Conference held in Paris at the France Galop Offices Oct. 6 are now available at ifhaonline.org. Keynote speaker Ogden Mills "Dinny" Phipps, chairman of The Jockey Club, shared his experiences in horseracing as well as restating The Jockey Club's call for medication reform in North America. The IFHA conference also offered an update on the 2015 Pan-American Conference in New York, a summary of the recent International Conference of Racing Analysts and Veterinarians (ICRAV), the IFHA's ongoing collaboration with the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) to ease horse movement and presentations focusing on racing in Scandinavia and Korea.

"Lady O'Reilly continues to have horses in training in Ireland, England, France and elsewhere, and her broodmare band is not affected," the spokesman said.

Three months prior, Allied Irish Bank entered a judgment against Sir Anthony and two of his investment firms in Commercial Court for more than €45 million. His total debt at the time was €195 million.

MUKHADRAM'S STUD FEE ANNOUNCED

Shadwell's **Mukhadram (GB)** (Shamardal--Magic Tree {UAE}, by Timber Country) will stand for £7,000 with special live foal terms for the 2015 breeding season. The William Haggas trainee scooped up wins in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown July 5 as well as the G2 York S. in July 2013 in addition to a score in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. that May. He also finished second in this year's G1 Dubai World Cup behind African Story (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). The bay's record currently stands at 16-5-3-2 with earnings of \$3,251,510.

"When we announced that Mukhadram was to retire to Shadwell at the end of the year, we promised breeders that he would stand at a competitive fee, and that is exactly what we have done," said Richard Lancaster, Shadwell's Stud Director. "Mukhadram's sire Shamardal has enjoyed a great year with his offspring on the track, with 20 stakes winners in 2014. He is currently second Leading Flat Racing Sire in the UK/Ire and at the end of Wednesday's session at Tattersalls Yearling Sales, Shamardal was the sire of the sales topper. He is also responsible for first season sire Lope De Vega (Ire) who has had 18 first crop winners, including Group 3 winner Burnt Sugar (Ire)."


Bred by Wardall Bloodstock, Mukhadram was acquired by Shadwell as a weanling at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale for 190,000gns and will be available for inspection at Beech House Stud in Newmarket during the Tattersalls Breeding Stock Sales Nov. 27-Dec. 3.

"To be able to offer breeders in the UK an option to tap in to this extremely successful sire line for just £7,000 is an opportunity that we feel, is second to none," added Lancaster.

For the entire three-day sale, 336 yearlings sold for 79,274,000gns, and averaged 235,935gns. The gross was up by 13% from last year's sale, the average up by 14%. There were 336 yearlings sold this year, from 472 catalogued (71.2% of those catalogued); last year 339 sold, of 513 catalogued, for a clearance rate from the catalogue of 66.1%. So the number catalogued dropped by 8% but the number sold by just 1%, due to a 5% improvement in the clearance rate from the catalogue.

When we convert the October 1 figures to dollars, we can make a couple of telling comparisons to Keeneland September Book 1. At Keeneland last month, 473 yearlings sold over four days, for a gross of \$142,153,000, and an average of \$300,535. This week in Newmarket, 336 yearlings sold for a converted gross of around \$134,154,200, and an average of roughly \$399,368. To put that in perspective, the top European sale had 71% of the number of horses sold as in the top American sale, for 94% of the money, and a one-third higher average. Essentially, at Keeneland, 118 yearlings a day sold for an average of \$300,000 for four days; at Tattersalls, 112 yearlings a day sold for an average of \$400,000 over three days.

There were 23 individual stallions which had five or more yearlings sell in October Book 1. Seven of these compiled averages of 280,000gns (roughly \$473,000) or higher; not coincidentally, these seven are among the 10 North American or European sires to have averaged \$400,000 or more so far in the yearling sales season. (Click here to see the Instatistics list of the Top 10 NA/EU sires by yearling average through the end of Book 1 on Thursday). You'll note that eight of the top 10 are European sires; only Tapit (\$628,289) and War Front (\$591,353) make the list of Top 10 NA/EU commercial sires from North America. What else do you need to know about the stature of North American breeding in the international market these days?


Of the eight European sires to have averaged \$400,000+ in this sales season, only Monsun (Ger) did not have five or more sell in October Book 1. These are the last crops of Monsun and Montjeu (Ire), who had five sell this week for an average of 427,000gns. Of all 10 \$400,000+ sires so far (the European ones may have more to sell in October 2 and 3 next week, and Arqana October the following week, so their averages could fall), only Sea The Stars (Ire) (first foals 2011, first 3-year-olds 2014) has oldest foals younger than 6-year-olds this year. The emphasis following the 2008 world economic crash has been on proven sires, but will now shift back a little bit towards unprovenespecially as Frankel (GB)'s first foals will be yearlings next year.

The seven European sires which dominated October 1 represent four different farms. Upset leader Dubawi and #4 ranked **Shamardal** are from Darley, Dubawi standing at Dalham Hall in Newmarket, Shamardal at Kildangan in Ireland. Coolmore is represented, of course, by Galileo and Montjeu, who finished second and third respectively on average in Book 1. **Cont. p9**


"The gross was up by 13% and the average by 14% in Tattersalls' October Book 1 this week, but what also seems significant is that the number of horses sold for 500,000 gns (roughly \$850,000) or more increased by 73%, from 22 to 38. With 100% backing from the Maktoum family, Dubawi tops the sire averages, a mild upset over Galileo. Overall, so far this sales season the gross at the European yearling sales is up 18% - nearly €35-million".

Juddmonte stands, at Banstead Manor, #5 **Oasis Dream (GB)**, the first-day leader who ended up with 30 yearlings averaging 305,500gns (about \$517,000), and #7 **Dansili (GB)** (as well as Frankel and, for 2015,

Kingman (GB). Sea The Stars, by some margin the youngest on the list, stands at Gilltown Stud in Ireland; his 24 October 1 yearlings to sell averaged 296,875gns (about \$502,000).

Four stallions represented by their first crops had five or more sell this week, but Coolmore's **Zoffany (Ire)**, a son of Dansili whose best race was probably when he nearly caught the seriously idling Frankel in the 2011 G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, did

have three sell for an average of 336,667gns, which raised his overall average for the sales season (69 sold so far) to \$82,396. The new leading first-year sire by yearling average is Darley's **Poet's Voice (GB)**, a son of man-of-the-moment Dubawi who nosed out Rip Van Winkle in the 2010 G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at a mile at Ascot at the end of his 3-year-old campaign.

Strongly supported both by Sheikh Mohammed and even more so by Qatari Sheikh Joaan's Al Shaqab racing, which bought a colt and a filly by Poet's Voice for 475,000gns and 700,000gns respectively toward the end of Thursday's session, Poet's Voice finished up

with seven selling in October Book 1 for an average of 257,143gns, which propelled him into the top spot among NA/EU sires with his first yearlings selling; according to Instatistics (click here---Freshman Sires only), he's now had 23 yearlings sell this season, for an average just a hair under \$200,000.

At least, for the young (F2013) stallions whose first foals arrived in 2013 and are yearlings this year, the top-10 ratio between Europe and North America is not so lopsided as with the top proven sires. Though Europe

has three of the top four, North America does have five of the top 10: Claiborne's **Trappe Shot** (\$133,727); Ashford's **Uncle Mo** (\$119,250, with 84 sold!) and **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (\$87,324); Castleton Lyons' **Gio Ponti** (\$99,755); and Spendthrift's **Tizway** (\$83,585).

Europe has: Darley's Poet's Voice (\$199,342); Ballylinch's **Dream Ahead** (\$137,210), and a trio of Coolmore stallions--**Pour Moi** (\$132,379); **Canford Cliffs** (**Ire**) (\$95,047); and Zoffany (\$82,396).

Finally, relating to October 1, a note about shopping. You know, some people like shopping in department stores. Some people like shopping for antiques. Fortunately for the horse business, Sheikh Mohammed clearly loves shopping for horses. Newmarket is easy and convenient, on his doorstep, so to speak, and Tattersalls October 1 is now the single best yearling sale in the world. John Ferguson signed for 38 yearlings this week for Sheikh Mohammed, and friends and family (Rabbah and Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell, which is admittedly active at roughly the same level at all the major yearling sales) bought another 47. Total: 85 yearlings signed for by John Ferguson, Rabbah, or Shadwell. Total spend: 24,957,000gns--31% of the sale's gross. I'm going to make a guess that Qatari interests accounted for about half the Maktoum total. Sheikh Joaan was at the sale Thursday, when three were knocked down to Al Shaqab, but throughout the week a pretty good proportion of the buys made by at least three agents/teams--Peter and Ross Doyle, Charlie Gordon-Watson, and John Warren--were almost certainly made on behalf of Al Shagab.

When you add in other Al-Thani family purchases (Bernard le Metayer and David Redvers), my guess is that Qatar bought around 43 yearlings for around 12.6-million guineas. I emphasize that's a guess, but if roughly in the ballpark it would mean that Maktoum plus Al-Thani purchases would account for about 38% of the purchases and 47% of the money. That's all good news for October Books 2 (Mon-Wed) and 3 (Thu-Fri) next week

CHRB'S O'NEILL RULING A FARCE cont.

This is such a muddled mess that trying to explain is almost beyond my literary capabilities, but here goes:

In 2012, O'Neill got a 180-day suspension for a TCO2 violation, with 135 of the days stayed. It was ruled that if O'Neill had any other Class 1, 2 or 3 drug violations within an 18-month period, he would have to serve the additional days.

Lo and behold, before the 18 months was over, O'Neill got nailed again, this time by New York Gaming Commission officials who recorded a positive for a benzodiazepine drug in a June 2, 2013 race at Belmont. The CHRB classifies the drug as a Class 2 violation.

So...O'Neill would have to serve the additional 135 days? Oh, don't be silly.

While the race in question at Belmont occurred before his 18-month probationary period was up, the New York regulators didn't get around to filing the proper paperwork until after the 18 months. The CHRB somehow decided that the date of the offense was not what was relevant, but when the New York bureaucrats got around to addressing the matter. For that reason, they didn't stick him with the additional 90 days.

(So, if you rob a bank on a Thursday, but don't get arrested until the following Tuesday, did you really rob the bank? Maybe the CHRB wants to weigh in on this perplexing question).

But it gets even weirder.

Even though the CHRB decided that the New York drug offense happened outside the 18-month window they still gave him another 45 days for his New York transgressions. So the New York drug positive matters, but doesn't really matter that much. The timing of the New York ruling is a big deal, but not a big deal. Or something like that.

Not content with the mockery they had already created, the CHRB found another area where they could make a really dumb decision. Hey, they were on a roll.

There was still that pesky 45-day suspension O'Neill was handed by New York authorities for the benzodiazepine drug. That meant that O'Neill would have to serve two concurrent suspensions, the 45 days from California and then 45 days from New York?

Not so fast. In what very well could be a horse racing first, the CHRB ruled that O'Neill could serve both at once. That way, one of the penalties is not a penalty at all. They might have been better off telling him to write on a chalkboard 1,000 times "I promise I will be a good boy."

Then again, what does it matter? While he is serving his penalty the O'Neill stable will be run by his assistant Leandro Mora, who happened to win a couple of races yesterday at Santa Anita. The only thing that has changed is the name on the program. Mora is O'Neill. O'Neill is Mora. And as for the owners who employ Mora/O'Neill, their horses will never miss a beat.

O'Neill can't attend the races while he is under suspension, but there's nothing to stop him from heading off to Tahiti, cell phone by his side and calling all the shots for Mr. Mora. Isn't that way it's always done?

There was a brief time when it looked like O'Neill was actually in hot water. The Breeders' Cup announced that he had violated its regulations regarding drug positives and would not be able to pre-enter horses in the Breeders' Cup. On the face of things that would be a big blow for him and his owners. But they're not going to stop Mora from running the horses in his name, and that makes the O'Neill Breeders' Cup suspension as worthless as a \$2 win ticket on Ricks Natural Star. If the Breeders' Cup really wants to get serious about cracking down on cheaters, then the rule has to be that any horse in the barn of a rule-breaker will not be allowed to run.

It's easy to figure out what happened here. The CHRB is calling the O'Neill ruling a "stipulated agreement," essentially a plea bargain. No doubt O'Neill hired some very good lawyers who went into the CHRB and said that if they didn't reduce O'Neill's penalties they were going to make life a living hell for them. Cont. p12

And instead of doing the right thing, they rolled over. Bureaucrats who may or may not be qualified for the job, they didn't have the stomach for a fight.

Not that any of this should come as a surprise. The O'Neill verdict was a matter of business as usual, albeit a high-profile one, for a sport that just doesn't have the guts to do the right thing when it comes to people who refuse to play by the rules. BILL OPPENHEIM:

I have been applauding the work of WHOA from the sidelines, but now I would like to add my voice to those who are advocating the banning of race-day medication in North American racing. I must leave the scientific debate to the scientists, but as a lay person it seems to me the science is pretty straightforward. There is no doubt in my mind that Lasix, for example, is a performance-enhancing drug. In fact, I am not in favor of dumping more and more money into researching what we already know.

However, my advocacy of no race-day medication is really because North American breeders and sellers of horses are suffering in international markets. International buyers already have plenty of reasons to stay at home to spend their money: Galileo, Dubawi, Dansili, Oasis Dream, and Sea The Stars, to name just a few. North American policies on race-day medication just exacerbate the problem by giving international buyers another reason not to come. I am continually surprised that American breeders have not risen up to demand an end to race-day medication for this reason alone: it's costing them a lot of money. Not just potential yearling buyers, either: places like Hong Kong, I am told by their representatives, won't even consider buying horses of racing age in North America because of our permissive drug policies. I estimate that the value of North American horses would rise by as much as a third if race-day medication was banned. All the other arguments aside, are we so dependent on race-day medication that we are willing to continue to forfeit this vital outside investment?

He was the secondleading first-crop sire of 2010, ahead of the likes of Bernardini and War Front, and was represented that season by the graded stakes winners Kathmanblu and Sabercat. Currently, Bluegrass Cat is the sire of five black-type winners in 2014 with progeny earnings of \$4.4 million, including W.L. Proctor Memorial S. winner Story To Tell. The 11-year-old stallion is out of She's A Winner, a full-sister to Supercharger, the dam of 2014 freshman sire sensation Super Saver, as well as GSW & GISP Accelerator. A half-brother to MGSW Lord of the Game, Bluegrass Cat also hails from the female family of Grade I winners Imagining (Giant's Causeway) and Girolamo (A.P. Indy).

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

October 12, 1920...In the final race of his career, three-year-old Man o'War defeated 1919 Triple Crown winner Sir Barton in a match race at Kenilworth Park. Sent off at odds of 1-20, Man o'War won by seven lengths for his 14th consecutive victory.

October 12, 1966...Damascus, owned by Edith Bancroft, broke his maiden at Aqueduct Racetrack, winning by eight lengths.

October 12, 1990...Great Normand paid \$354.80 for a \$2 win wager when he upset the GI Meadowlands Cup.

October 13, 1927...Arlington Park opened. The track, built by H. D. Brown, had a steeplechase course and a polo field and was adjacent to tennis courts, a golf course and a one-mile training track.

October 13, 1956...At age four, 1955 Horse of the Year Nashua won his last race, the Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park.

October 13, 1984...At age nine, odds-on favorite John Henry won his last race, the Ballantine's Scotch Classic at the Meadowlands. He earned a \$500,000 bonus for winning both the Scotch Classic and the Turf Classic at Belmont Park September 22. He retired with then-record earnings of \$6,597,947.
