DAY 1 IN TOKYO: RAIN DELAY


I was thinking about titling this blog "Americans are barbarians for not embracing the bidet." But really, what else is there to say other than that?

Taris Targeting La Brea cont. from p1

Taris' class was on full display in Keeneland's GII Raven Run S. Oct. 18, where the filly demolished the competition in a runaway nine-length score. The race was her fifth and final start for trainer Todd Beattie and owner Commonwealth New Era Racing.

According to Callaghan, the 3-year-old was purchased on behalf of Coolmore and is being pointed to the GI La Brea S. at seven furlongs Dec. 26, opening day of the Santa Anita meet. "At the moment, we're targeting the La Brea with her. It's a logical race, but we'll take it one step at a time."

An important step in that process came this past Saturday at Santa Anita, when Taris registered her first workout since arriving, a four-furlong move that pleased Callaghan.

"We did our first bit of work on Saturday and it was just an easy piece in :49 for the half-mile and that was what we wanted," the trainer offered. "She looked fantastic, moved over the track well and it was really smooth."

While immediate plans call for Taris to continue competing around one turn, Callaghan believes she may have a future in route races.

"Physically looking at her, her pedigree, and the way she relaxes in her training, she's going to have every chance of stretching out," he explained. "For the first part of [2015] we'll keep her around seven-eighths where she's obviously been doing very well, but I kind of have a feeling that she's a filly that will stretch out well."

Bred by Claiborne Farm, Taris is out of the Theatrical (Ire) mare Comedy, and her second dam is GIII Distaff Turf Mile S. winner Don't Be Silly (Lord at War {Arg}). She sold for \$90,000 to her previous owners as a Keeneland September yearling. Under the care of Beattie, Taris won four of her five career starts and amassed \$275,700 in earnings.

In addition to filing race reports, I'll also be doing a blog on my impressions of Tokyo, the people, the food, the sights, etc. It probably won't be for everybody, but for those of you who haven't been to this part of the world, hopefully it will offer some color commentary. Mostly it will just be stories about what I've been up to.

Things all started well enough Monday morning. A 6 a.m. flight from Lexington to O'Hare, then a 13-hour flight to Tokyo. I got to sit next to an offbeat but terrific septuagenarian named Geneva (first name) who had some interesting ideas on everything from global politics to those wooden spoons that used to come with single-serve ice cream tubs. I was taking it easy on the complimentary wine since I'd already popped, to no effect, a couple Tylenol PM. But Geneva was picking up the slack. She was heading to Burma for a river cruise of the Irrawaddy. "I've been to 69 countries," she said.

Later, as we began our descent, she lifted the window shade and, seeing nothing but a cumulus field below, exclaimed, "Look how fluffy Japan is!" I had been in and out of consciousness, as about halfway through the flight the sleep aids hit at once, but I was able to give her a thumbs-up. I was plenty spacey. Remember that scene in *Trainspotting* where Mark Renton sinks down into the floor and views everything with a weird earthly tunnel vision? Just like that.

We landed at Narita International around 3:30 p.m. The airport is 35 miles east of Tokyo, but a reasonably priced ticket on the Narita Express--about \$12 for those with a foreign passport--gets you to Tokyo Station in under an hour.

Tokyo sits a little bit south of Lexington--it's on the same parallel as Raleigh, North Carolina--so I was surprised when we emerged from the train tunnel and it

was already completely dark at 4:30 p.m.--a half-hour before the sun sets in Raleigh. Axial tilt? Don't know.


Unfortunately, the weather in Tokyo was exactly the same as the weather I'd left in Chicago: cold and rainy. I was hoping for

a let-up overnight, but I woke up early Wednesday morning to rain pelting my hotel window. The press isn't invited to Tokyo Racecourse until Thursday, so I had a day to burn. I drew up an itinerary over coffee: the Meiji Shrine in Shibuya, the nearby Ota and Nezu museums, both the namesakes of private art collectors, and something called the Parasite Museum, which claimed to feature a 29-ft tapeworm removed from a 40-year-old man. Culture!

Sadly, I only made it as far as the Meiji Shrine. But that still was an experience. The site, in a 175-acre park made up mostly of evergreens, is dedicated to Emperor Meiji and his wife, Empress Shoken. Cont. p5

In the late 19th century and early 20th, Meiji turned Japan from an isolated feudal state into an

big, sweeping,
curved roofs
typical of Shinto

architecture (a style called nagare-zukuri, says Google). They overlook a large stone square that on this day was decidedly uncrowded. Only a tour of Japanese tourists and a few stragglers like myself were around.

Before you enter, it's a sign of respect to perform *Temizu*, a Shinto hand-washing ceremony. At a stone water basin, you take a long-handled dipper with your

right hand, and pour some water into your left. Then you switch hands and pour a little into your right hand. *Then*, pouring more water into your cupped left hand, you take some into your

mouth, swish it around, and quietly spit it back into your left hand, before completing the ceremony but lifting the dipper vertically and letting water wash down the handle. I was in the process of getting this wrong when a sweet elderly Japanese lady showed me how it was done. Tree-line pebble paths bring to and from the shrine, and even in the rain, the birds stirred up an impressive cacophony.

By this time I was soaked to the bone, so when, after warming up a bit with a steaming bowl of wantanmen,

I found that the Ota Museum closed for renovations, I decided to head back to the hotel. (This by a somewhat harrowing cab ride that seemed to find the driver more confused by the left-handed driving than I was.)

A good day, but tons more to do and see. Tomorrow we head out to Tokyo Racecourse for the first time, and with a forecast of clear skies and temperatures in the 60s, I should have lots of photos and some video, too.

Sophia Seeks Redemption in Falls City cont. from p1 Bill Cubbedge's Molly Morgan (Ghostzapper) displayed her class and talent with wins in the trackand-trip GII Fleur de Lis H. and Ellis Park's one-mile GIII Gardenia S. earlier this year. The Dale Romans trainee has proven to be no match for this race's morning-line favorite however, finishing second to Don't Tell Sophia in the Locust Grove and third in the Spinster. The bay was victorious in this venue's GII Chilukki S. last time Nov. 1 and will benefit from her obvious affinity for this track. Third in last year's renewal of this test, Preston Stables' Flashy American (Flashy Bull) captured Hawthorne's GIII Sixty Sails H. at this distance Apr. 19 and was second in the Fleur Dis Lis. Third behind the streaking Belle Gallantey (After Market) and MGISW Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) in the GI Delaware H. July 12, the Ken McPeek pupil was bumped at the start of the GIII Shuvee H. July 27 and never really recovered, finishing a flat fifth as the favorite, and was fourth when last seen in Indiana's Mari Hulman George S. Oct. 4. Todd Pletcher sends out **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** Teen Pauline (Tapit), who captured three of her four starts this season. Cont. p6

Victorious in Aqueduct's Affectionately S. Jan. 1, Ladies H. Jan. 25 and Gll Top Flight H. Mar. 1, the Stonestreet Stables homebred spent just short of eight months on the shelf and returned with a sixth last time behind the undefeated Dame Dorothy (Bernardini) in Belmont's Glll Turnback the Alarm H. Oct. 26. One of just two sophomores in this 10-horse affair is James Tafel's rapidly improving **Tiz Windy** (Tiznow). The Carl Nafzger trainee boasts four victories from eight starts this term, most recently capturing a Churchill optional claimer Sept. 13 and the Gll Indiana Oaks Oct. 4--both at 1 1/16 miles.



RICE LOOKS FOR FALL HIGHWEIGHT REPEAT

Linda Rice captured last term's GIII Fall Highweight H. at Aqueduct with Palace (City Zip), who went on to score victories in the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. and GI Forego S. at Saratoga this year. The conditioner looks to repeat in this year's renewal of the six-furlong test with the speedy filly **La Verdad** (Yes It's True). The

Lady Sheila Stable colorbearer is an Aqueduct specialist, boasting six wins from seven starts over this strip, with her lone loss being her debut effort last March. A consistent performer with 10 wins from 15 lifetime starts, the GII Distaff H. heroine was fifth behind the

streaking Artemis Agrotera (Roman Ruler) three back in the Spa's GI Ballerina H. Aug. 23 and missed by just a head to that foe next out in Belmont's GII Gallant Bloom H. Sept. 20. The bay returned to her winning ways last time in that venue's state-bred Iroquois S. Oct. 18 and was scratched from Laurel's Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash Nov. 8. The main question about La Verdad in this test is how she will match up in her first start against the boys. "It's a tough spot--there's a lot of speed in the race--but she's done very well since the Iroquois and it was a choice between that and the Garland of Roses [Dec. 6]," said Rice. The morning-line favorites here are the coupled David Jacobson entry of Strapping Groom (Johannesburg) and Salutos Amigos (Salute the Sarge). Owned by Jacobson and Drawing Away Stable, Strapping Groom was second in last year's Fall Highweight and won the Gravesend H. over the inner track here next out Dec. 21. Last year's GI Forego S. hero kicked off this term with a victory in this venue's GIII Tom Fool H. Mar. 1 and was last seen finishing fifth in the GI Carter H. Jacobson and Southern Equine Stables' Salutos Amigos finished fourth just two lengths behind winner Private Zone (Macho Uno) in Belmont's GI Vosburgh Invitational S. Sept. 27 and returned to win that venue's seven-panel GIII Bold Ruler H. Oct. 25.

That win earned him a guick turnaround in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Seventh last time in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint where he was seventh last time out Nov. 1. The bay will be poised to pick up the pieces if the speed horses burn themselves out early. "Strapping Groom is doing well," said Jacobson. "We've had some trouble with his feet, quarter cracks, but we've got him good now and we think he's going to run a bang-up race. Both he and Salutos Amigos are spectacular horses that we've done very well with and I expect both of them to bring their "A" game." Chad Brown saddles one of those speedsters in **O** "TDN **Rising Star" Bakken** (Distorted Humor). Owned by Mr. and Mrs. William Warren Jr., the lightly raced bay made his belated seasonal bow in Belmont's GII True North S. where he finishing a close second to Palace June 6. Given a brief freshening, he captured a 6 1/2-panel Belmont optional claimer next out Oct. 2 and eighth last time after a troubled trip in the Breeders' Cup Sprint. Barry Schwartz's 3-year-old Captain Serious (Successful Appeal) may be the youngest horse in the field, but he is no less talented than his older opponents. Opening his account with three consecutive victories this spring, two of which were over this strip, the Mike Hushion pupil was a close second in Belmont's GIII Dwyer S. July 5 and was third in Saratoga's July 26 GII Amsterdam S. after a bad break and wide trip. Fourth in that venue's state-bred 1 1/8-mile Albany S. Aug. 24, the bay gelding was third to Bakken in the Oct. 2 Belmont test and finished fourth after another wide trip last time in Belmont's state-bred Hudson S. Oct. 18. Captain Serious adds blinkers for this one and enters off a best-of-70 half-mile over the Belmont training track in :47 2/5 Nov. 21. Also worth a look, especially at his morning-line quote of 15-1, is Mr Amore Stable's Tightend Touchdown (Pure Precision). A dead-heat second in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, the Jason Servis trainee successfully defended his title in the turfy Pennsylvania Governor's Cup S. May 31 and missed by just a nose to veteran Ben's Cat (Parker's Storm Cat) in the grassy GIII Parx Dash H. July 12. Third in that venue's GIII Turf Monster H. Sept. 1, the chestnut did not disgrace himself when sixth by just 1 1/2 lengths last time in this year's Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint Nov. 1. Field p8

Good Friends Stable's two-time GI Vosburgh S. winner Private Zone (Macho Uno) drew the rail and will be piloted by Martin Pedroza. Runner-up in last year's Cigar Mile and third last time in the BC Sprint, the Alfredo Velasquez trainee was quoted at 3-1 on the morning line. Rounding out the BC Sprint trio is Bourbon Lane Stable's fourth-place finisher Bourbon Courage (Lion Heart). Trained by Kellyn Gorder, the 12-1 shot on the morning-line will exit post nine with Jose Lezcano aboard. "One turn is the key," said Gorder. 



trade was underlined by a 32% rise in the median price to 9,250gns. The average of 12,275gns was an increase of 11%, and the aggregate was boosted to 2,504,100gns--another rise, this time by 17%. The clearance rate was also strong, up four points at 79%.

Bred and consigned by Kelly Thomas of Maywood Stud, the striking session-topping black colt is a half-brother to winning Medicean (GB) filly Movementneverlies (GB) and from the family of G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest winner May Ball (GB). He will be reoffered as a yearling.

"I hoped he would fly as the feedback was really positive all the way through," said Thomas, who keeps five mares at her Welsh farm. "It's a real family effortmy husband, children and parents all help out, so this is wonderful."


Maywood Stud sold all three foals offered, including a first-crop son of Sayif (<u>lot 356</u>) out of Cherrego (Borrego) for 15,000gns.

Thomas added: "He's the first foal out of the mare which is terrific. I'm delighted with that."

Putting on a Show...

James and Amelia Gray have been operating as Elusive Bloodstock for three years from their family farm in Lincolnshire and offered a draft of three weanlings on the first day of the December Foal Sale. Top among them was a 55,000gns daughter of Showcasing (GB) (lot 320) bred from a mare James Gray bought from a field when the couple first started their new enterprise.

"I put a lot of research into buying the mare, so this is a really satisfying result for us," he said with a broad grin. "I never believed she'd sell that well--I'd have been happy enough with 20,000gns. It's the best sales result we've had by far."





The first foal of the unraced Azita (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), a half-sister to the talented group performer Danadana (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), was bought by pinhooker Michael Carty of Kilmoney Cottage Stud.

"We've been so lucky with the mare--her pedigree continues to improve almost week by week--Dandana has been a star and [his half-brother] Semeen is pretty decent, too," Gray added, and his luck extended to buying Azita back for 9,000gns at last year's December Mares' Sale when offered carrying this filly.

While Gray was hands-on with the foal consignment, Amelia was kept fully busy in her second job as a runner at Tattersalls. As well as welcoming their first child just a few months ago, the Grays have also just taken on their first stallion and will be standing George Washington's half-brother Sun Central (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in 2015.

"We've had a decent level of interest in him--breeders who have come to see him really like him," said Gray, whose experience on other stallion farms includes stints at Whitsbury Manor and Cheveley Park Studs in Britain, Haunui Stud in New Zealand and Klawervlei Stud in South Africa.

The couple have also enjoyed success with Showcasing--in whom they own a breeding right--on the racecourse and celebrated their first homebred winner by the stallion when Studio Star (GB) won at Newcastle in August.

On a good day for Showcasing--who has enjoyed a terrific year on the track with 25 first-crop winners, including the group winners Toocoolforschool (Ire) and Cappella Sansevero (GB)--a Keith Harte-consigned colt also fetched 55,000gns. The son of the Selkirk mare Largo (Ire) will be joining the Baroda & Colbinstown Stud draft of pinhooks for next year after being knocked down to Philip Myerscough.

The former Tattersalls auctioneer's son David said: "He was just a lovely horse and a really easy mover. It's hard to get a mare into Showcasing, so we've had to buy a foal by him instead. He's a very exciting stallion."

Catching a Dragon...

Late in the session, another first-crop foal, this time a son of the Irish National Stud's Dragon Pulse (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}) (lot 533), fetched a bid of 50,000gns from pinhooker Jamie Railton.

"He was just a stand-out individual," said Railton of the April-born colt offered by Peter Nolan. "It's plenty of

money, but good horses cost plenty of money and he was a fabulous mover."

The chesnut's dam Belle Watling (Ire) (Street Cry {Ire}) has already produced a 2-year-old winner in Paddy Again (Ire) (Moss Vale {Ire}) from her first foal and first runner. Her dam Sassy Bird (Storm Bird {Can}) is a sister to French champion miler Mukaddamah.

The Dragon Pulse foals were well received last week at the Goffs November Sale and there are two left to sell, lot 731 and lot 945, at Tattersalls.

One lot earlier, yet another freshman was represented by a good return when Prospect Stables' Requinto (Ire) colt out of the winning Mujahid mare Island Music (Ire) (lot 532) was knocked down to Mags O'Toole for 43,000gns.

Whitsbury Manor Stud's Good Day Continues...

Julian and Anne Wilson's Grove Farm Stud achieved a decent result for a colt by Showcasing's Whitsbury Manor Stud mate Foxwedge (Aus) (lot 294) who was bought for 40,000gns by a team with strong connections to the Southern Hemisphere--Hubie de Burgh and James Harron.

De Burgh commented: "He's been bought to race. We were looking for a nice type, and this colt was going through early, so we thought we'd get involved now before it gets too mad. This is a very nice type and I've liked the foals by the sire that I've seen--they are strong horses who look as though they will be fast.

"My client watched Foxwedge race in Australia and saw how fast and talented he was as a racehorse. This horse has a strong back pedigree--it is all U.S. speed."

Out of the Empire Maker mare Celestial Empire, the colt's third dam Mine Only boasts a terrific breeding record in the States, with her stakes horses including GII Manhattan H. winner Academy Award and Grade III winners Statuette and Good Mood.

De Burgh later went to 33,000gns for another Foxwedge colt (lot 461) out of Regal Curtsy (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) from Whitsbury Manor Stud, which ended the day as leading vendor with seven foals sold for 134,200gns

As ever with foal sales, there's plenty of debate and interest surrounding stallions with their first-crop weanlings in the ring. Sire of the day's top lot, Bated Breath, has taken an early lead with eight sold for an average of 25,125gns. Overbury Stud's Delegator (GB) (Dansili {GB})--another freshman to make his way into the day's top 10--with a 38,000gns colt out of Markova's Dance (GB) (lot 457)--had 21 foals sell during the first session at an average price of 11,000gns, while Tweenhills resident Harbour Watch (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) set an average of 19,389gns for nine sold, led by a 36,000gns colt (lot 298) bought by Tally-Ho Stud.

Our Queen Of Kings, a half-sister to GI Hollywood Derby winner Labeeb (GB) (Lear Fan), produced the topper of this session last year, a Sea the Stars (Ire) filly that made 320,000gns to the bid of Charlie Gordon-Watson and was pinhooked for 600,000gns at Tattersalls October.



THE WORLD TO DESCEND ON SHA TIN

A total of 25 overseas horses and 22 International Group 1 winners have been invited to compete in the Longines Hong Kong International Races to be held Sunday, Dec. 14 at Sha Tin Racecourse. Names most recognizable to the racing public include **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), who will be making his fifth appearance at the International Races and comes off his

best effort at the meeting having finished 1 1/2 lengths adrift of the victorious and now-retired Akeed Mofeed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in last year's G1 Hong Kong Cup. The 8-year-old has had another successful

season in 2014, with a pair of Group 1 successes and a runner-up effort G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. He'll face a stiff challenge in the 2000-meter affair, primarily from the locals, including Hong Kong Horses of the Year Designs on Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}), and Blazing Speed (GB) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), who caused a mild upset in the G2 Jockey Club Cup this past weekend.

Flintshire (GB) (Dansili {GB}) is the marquee name for the G1 Hong Kong Vase and should be the race favorite on the heels of back-to-back runner-up efforts in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. He will square off with the two most recent winners of the 2400-meter test--last year's upsetter Dominant (Ire) (Cacique {Ire}) and the globetrotting fan favorite Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). Just the Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) will stretch back out to the metric mile and a half off a victory in the GI E.P. Taylor S. and third-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf, both at 10 furlongs. Dominant's victory in last year's Vase snapped an 11-race winning streak for the European raiders.

Hong Kong horses have maintained a stranglehold on the G1 Hong Kong Mile, and the imposing Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) will look to make it nine straight for the home team, which also includes the defending race champion Glorious Days (Aus) (Hussonet), top local miler Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie dei Colori {GB}) and the evergreen Ambitious Dragon (NZ) (Pins {Aus}), the 2012 Mile hero. The foreign contingent is something less than incapable, and is led by Trade Storm (GB) (Trade Fair {GB}), the GI Woodbine Mile hero who was most recently third in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Japan has a record 10 horses headed to the HKIR, including Fiero (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who came within a nose of winning last weekend's G1 Mile Championship at Kyoto.

"We have a slew of proven elite level horses coming to Sha Tin for world racing's great end-of-year occasion, making up a total of 22 individual winners of 43 Group 1 races," commented Bill Nader, executive director of racing for the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "This is always a great showcase of international racing at the highest level with top horses such as Flintshire and Cirrus Des Aigles heading the overseas line-up against the best of Hong Kong."

This year's four races offer record total purse money of HK\$82 million (US\$10.6 million).

CHUCKAS RESIGNS MJC POST

"Racing in Maryland is positioning itself for tremendous growth opportunities and I hope for nothing but success in the years to come." Frank Stronach, founder of The Stronach Group added, "Tom has been a valuable part of our team over the past six years as the company has worked towards developing a strong foundation to restore Maryland's racing industry. We very much appreciate his contributions and wish him the best in the next phase of his career."

It was previously announced by The Stronach Group that Sal Sinatra, previously director of racing with Parx Racing, would be vice president and general manager of the Maryland Jockey Club, effective Dec. 1.

"I am very glad to welcome Sal to our company," said Tim Ritvo, chief operating officer of The Stronach Group. "His knowledge and expertise in racing operations will be a great benefit to both Laurel Park and Pimlico Race Course going forward."

Ritvo Looks Ahead in Maryland

Tim Ritvo, chief operating officer of The Stronach Group, addressed the media during a teleconference Wednesday morning to reiterate the company's commitment to racing and to provide an update on its plans for racing in Maryland. Ritvo said preliminary talks were underway with neighboring racing states to potentially come up with a cooperative racing circuit.

"We think Gulfstream and Santa Anita have made great strides in moving forward and Maryland is our next big project," Ritvo explained.

He continued, "We would like to see Maryland become as big a force as we think it can be within the Thoroughbred industry. We think that, within the Mid-Atlantic region, there is an appetite for some of these facilities with an expanded race schedule, but a cooperative one. We are looking to talk with Delaware or Virginia and maybe Philadelphia to see what a cooperative schedule would look like, talk about how we can increase field size and stop banging heads against each other. As the foal crop shrinks, what is the right schedule and what are the shared services that we can offer? We are a company that wants to say, 'We have these services in place. How can we better leverage them as an industry to move ahead?'"

As an example, Ritvo pointed to The Stronach Group's recent lease of the former Calder Racecourse in Florida and its rebranding as Gulfstream Park West. *Cont. p16*

"We're out there saying to racinos, 'Are you willing to work with us in a cooperative race schedule where we can condense racing staff and racing management teams?" Ritvo said. "We are looking for a win-win. We think some of the success in Florida was a win-win. That we were able to consolidate the racing team, we were able to consolidate the racing dates, so that it is better for everybody. Anything is on the table."

Ritvo said long-term plans for the improvement of the MJC's facilities were being discussed and, in the short-time, there will be a ground-breaking on the building of new barns at Laurel this week. The additional stalls could lead to the closure of Pimlico or Bowie during off seasons.

"We're going to try to condense our services as far as asking, is it the right model to have three racetracks open at the same time," Ritvo said. "Obviously, anyone who runs a business and looks at the expenses would say that it is not. So by building the additional stalls at Laurel that will keep us healthy on horse population and allow us to look at the options of closing down either Bowie or Pimlico in the off season."

Of the departure of MJC's President and Chief Operating Officer Tom Chuckas, Ritvo said, "We're very appreciative of Tom and all the groundwork he has done in Maryland. We are still negotiating with him to do some political work for us."

THE EXISTING BETTING CUSTOMER IS RACING'S BEST HOPE

When compared to ease-of-use and churn focused fantasy sports start-ups like Fan Duel and Draft Kings, racing is simply not built for the newbie skill game gambling market.

Fantasy sports--drafting, fielding and managing a team made up of players in all major sports--has been on a tear. Back in 1988, according to the Fantasy Sports Trade Association, approximately 500,000 people were playing games in some form. In 2003, with the help of the internet and a growing set of dedicated websites, magazines and software, that number grew to 15.2 million. In 2014, it is estimated that over 40 million people will be fielding NFL teams this Sunday as the NFL Fantasy playoffs approach. This market will spend upwards of \$1.7 billion this year on the craft.

The Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act of 2006 (UIGEA) provided a carve-out for horse racing, as we all know. But there was one more carve out in the UIGEA: fantasy games.

Being a game of skill, based on statistics, etc., fantasy sports met the smell test for regulators (although it's probably naive to think that was the only reason; the sports leagues themselves love fantasy sports) and their grey area in terms of gambling was something that smart companies chose to exploit. Only two years ago, two new start-ups--FanDuel and Draft Kings--entered the fantasy market with weekly or daily "cash games," where a team is chosen and fielded and money is wagered (don't let them tell you it's not wagering because it is). Draft Kings sponsored a Breeders' Cup race last month.

These new entrants have a business model that is almost no different than a Vegas casino offering NFL parlay cards, player prop bets or a punt on a Super Bowl coin flip. It's about enticing people to gamble on sports, and they've been getting that done. It is estimated that FanDuel will pay out over \$1 billion next year, with Draft Kings not too far behind. Investors in FanDuel, for example, which include Shamrock Capital Advisors, NBC Sports Ventures, KKR, Bullpen Capital, Comcast Ventures, Pentech Ventures, Piton Capital, Scottish Enterprise and Richard Koch, look to be pretty shrewd.

How have these company's been growing? How have they attracted users with an average age of 34, 78% of whom have college degrees, who spend upwards of 10 hours per week just consuming fantasy sports? What's the secret, if any?

They have brought in a demographic who were playing a game with their friends, in a basement or on a computer that lasts a season long, and made it a weekly, or nightly, pastime. This shift has not occurred by accident. Both FanDuel and Draft Kings are funded and their burn rate is high, mainly with marketing spend; you can't turn on a football show on NFL Network or CBS and not see an ad.

Marketing spend is a very small part of it, however. Converting marketing spend--turning a tire kicker into a car purchaser--is the key goal. They've achieved that in a number of ways.

- 1. They created a very good user experience and user interface. The money behind the sites is formidable, you can get every stat imaginable, and they are easy to use. Playing a game and watching the stats roll in real time makes it exciting. This is further enhanced by the fantasy sports ecosystem. There are hundreds of sites in cyberspace with player simulators, API's (application programming interface), value based line up generators and similar.
- 2. They have not been handcuffed with too many cooks in the kitchen, or bogged down with state or country rules, or myriad other barriers to entry. And they have taken advantage of it. A 33-year-old plumber from Dawson City in the Yukon in Canada can play a 70-year-old retiree from the Villages in Florida. *Cont. p17*

3. Their payouts are priced close to optimal. 28% of people in a most recent association survey said that pricing is the main factor in their decision to play cash games. FanDuel and Draft Kings takeout rates range from 6% to 10%. They often trumpet what is paid out as a marketing tool and your bankroll can last at these sites; even if you aren't a winner you can feel like one often enough.

FanDuel and Draft King's marketing funnel reads like a how-to guide on growing a business. They bring new players in via marketing and a newbie feels right at home. For as little as 25 cents, one can get off and running and play in an afternoon game. In "50/50" games, half the field gets paid near double what they wager, adding to the churn, and making people happy (winning cash and having your opinion verified) is the crux of all gambling. That sounds like a recipe for success.

Meanwhile in horse racing--which would kill for the fantasy gambling demographic--things are not as easy, or rosy. Racing has not done what fantasy has done with their UIGEA carve-out. They have not streamlined use, cannot accept people from everywhere via ADW's, do not have little infighting, do not pay prizes out at a low takeout, do not have free statistics, do not spend marketing at burn rates to get people to gamble. There's a good chance none of that may happen anytime soon, either.

For racing, those who do get placed into the top of the sales funnel as a newbie (see racing on TV, go out with their friend's to the track for the first time, see an ABR Live bus or go to the Kentucky Derby infield, etc) are then struck with having to excel in a game that is not built for them.

To land these new potential customers, racing tries to convert them via a red herring. "They need quick action" or "they need simple bets" are two famous horse racing funnel laments; like somehow if the sport runs races every five minutes and allow for an easy to understand spread bet, things will improve. Both are far too simplistic and in my view are wishful thinking. Racing already has guick action; with 40 tracks running on a Saturday, users can bet every two or three minutes if they want to. This is not even mentioning the obvious: skill games by definition are not quick action; in fantasy, the user would not be spending 10 hours a week to play a fantasy football cash game that lasts upwards of 48 hours (Sunday and Monday games) at FanDuel if that was important. As far as newbie bets go, it's clear simple bets work well at Draft Kings and are a huge part of converting in their funnel (the 25) cent games I mentioned), but that's a whole different ball of wax. In racing, a new bet is a Grand Slam, or a once-or-twice-tried odd even, or jockey bet. They're already there, have been tried, and few players bet them.

When something new does come along in horse racing that may attract this demographic, or this type user, it then seems to spiral into the horse racing abyss where it goes to die.

Exchange wagering is a good example. That medium was and is a hit with younger users because as a conduit it allows them to do what they crave (and coincidentally is also good for horse racing): It's win betting so churn is higher, the takeout is lower, it's fairly fun and exciting and an easy way to ease users into a sport. You'd think racing would want that. However, when it is broached, horsemen groups and tracks tell us the takeout needs to be higher so the exchange "pays their fair share." Despite the fact that nobody knows what a fair share is, the takeout being double or triple kills the main marketing driver of the exchange. That certainly defeats the purpose, doesn't it?

When we look at racing's structure, in terms of attracting newbies and converting them into long-term players, it's a formidable hill to climb. Regardless, marketing money is happily spent on billboards, or on food trucks, or getting people to watch horse racing on TV. I believe that focus makes us feel good, but it does little more than that. It simply does not work. If it did, it would have worked already.

I believe that horse racing, unlike Draft Kings or FanDuel, needs to focus on the existing fan and betting base to achieve one main goal: Get the once or twice a month player to become a weekend warrior, get the weekend warrior to play during the week, get the fellow or gal betting \$50,000 a year to bet \$500,000, get the bettor betting \$500,000 per annum to bet \$5 million.

To achieve that it will take a 180 to the way horse racing usually thinks. Racing must be priced better so these people can stretch bankrolls and some of them can win, or perceive they can win. The conduit needs improvement so players can sign up everywhere to online betting and all tracks need to be offered at all ADW's. Don't stifle competition, foster it. An environment needs to be created where new mediums like a betting exchange do not end up on the cutting room floor. The culture must be changed by benchmarking, for example, a \$20-billion handle at 10% of the boat is better than a \$10-billion handle at 20%, because as pool size goes up, bet size goes up and with more money in the pools, and racing offering a better gamble, it can attract other gamblers.

FanDuel and Draft Kings have created a system that depends on newbies. These companies need to ensure they come back; to play this new game long term. Almost everything they do is focused on that goal, and thus far it has worked. Racing cannot beat fantasy sites at their own game, and newbies will not lead it to the promised land. Racing must leverage the existing fan base, long-time bettors, those who have left racing and are willing to give it another shot to come back, and others who gamble. To do that it doesn't need to spend money on T.V. or billboards, food trucks or bands. Racing needs to create, foster and promote a new gambling environment that focuses on their needs, caters to them, and entices them to bet more money.

USTA Column First Nominee for 2015 Bergstein Award:

An article on the United States Trotting Association's website about deterring cheating in horse racing is the first nominee for the 2015 Stan Bergstein Writing Award presented by Team Valor International. The piece, entitled "Watching the Cheaters Cheat," was written by Chris Wittstruck, an attorney and director for the Standardbred Owners Association of New York.

"Catching a drug perpetrator in the act red handed is more significant than finding a bad substance in a sample," Wittstruck wrote. "We don't convict test tubes; we convict people. A positive sample occasions a rule violation. Tying administration to the affirmative act of a specific person via eyewitness observation could lead to a criminal conviction. Soliciting tips, developing leads, conducting professional surveillance, obtaining warrants--hard, old fashioned legwork--is what's needed."

Team Valor CEO Barry Irwin said, "This is a Stan Bergstein kind of column with an important focus on human surveillance and observation to catch and deter drug cheats."

Lucas Marquardt of the *Thoroughbred Daily News* won this year's Bergstein award for his story on synthetic racetracks.




