ZETCHER COLT FIRES IN SUNLAND DERBY

There were no surprises in the GIII Sunland Derby, as the 1-5 favorite **Firing Line** (Line of David) hit the wire first, but his eye-catching margin of victory and track record setting performance still turned plenty of heads. The Arnold Zetcher colorbearer, who has yet to finish

out of the exacta in his five career starts with a second-place debut at Santa Anita Oct. 25 and a graduation at Del Mar Nov. 30, entered this affair off runner-up efforts to 'TDN Rising Star' and early GI Kentucky Derby favorite Dortmund (Big Brown) in the Dec. 20 GI Los Alamitos Futurity and in the GIII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 7. Away well from the inside, Firing

Line sat about a head behind pacesetter **Why Two** (Bob and John) through opening splits of :22.33 and :45.39. The bay moved up to take control on the turn and easily kicked away down the stretch under a motionless Gary Stevens to win by 14 lengths. **Where's the Moon** (Malibu Moon) was second and **Pain and Misery** (Bob and John) completed the trifecta.

"It looked a lot simpler than it was out there," said Stevens. "I didn't like it when we drew the one hole inside of the other pace, but this colt probably handled things a lot better than I did out there. He makes easy work of it. The best thing he's got going for him is his mind, he's way beyond his five-race career, mentally. He was battle-tested in his last race against Dortmund, so it was nice to get an easy one into him today. There's never an easy one for \$800,000, but I think [trainer] Simon [Callaghan] picked the right race for him today. We've got an extra week for him now going into the Kentucky Derby. This was not a tough race on him today, so all signs are good.

"He dealt with some adversity in his last race at Santa Anita, when he stumbled leaving the gate," the jockey continued. "So it was a whole different style than what we saw today being pinned down on the inside and having to do all the dirty work early on then drawing away with authority at the end."

As for how the jockey feels with the Kentucky Derby on the horizon, Stevens said, "I'm in a great spot." cont. p3

Trainer Bob Baffert tallied his fifth consecutive win in the Sunland Park Oaks Sunday, but the horse who entered the winner's circle wasn't the Baffert-trainee the betting public expected. **Maybellene** (Lookin at Lucky), who last hit the wire in front back in October, was put up for the win after stablemate and prohibitive



favorite Callback (Street Sense) was disqualified. The 7-2 choice was away well and stalked the pace from off the rail in third down the backstretch as Fancy and Flashy (Zensational) clicked off an opening half in :45.83 and Callback rated in second.

Maybellene moved into striking position on the turn as that duo battled up front. Callback inched free by midstretch, but after having some difficulty changing leads, bore in, cutting off Fancy and Flashy. Maybellene continued her rally down the lane to catch her stablemate in the final furlong, but Callback gamely dug in to hit the wire a neck in front. cont. p4





After a jockey's objection from Noberto Arroyo, Jr. aboard Fancy and Flashy, Callback was disqualified and placed fourth for interference in the stretch. Scat Means Go was awarded second and Fancy and Flashy was promoted to third. Maybellene became the fifth first-crop stakes winner for her sire Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike).

"Maybellene ran very well and with Callback, it was unfortunate she ducked in," said Baffert assistant Jimmy Barnes. "Maybellene ran the race that she ran at Los Alamitos [when a good third in the GI Starlet S.], so we were glad to see her show up today."

As for Callback, Barnes offered, "She settled in nice and sat behind a horse and when [jockey Martin Garcia] called on her, she responded. It took her a little while to get going, but she did finally respond. We'll go back to California and see where we're at."

Maybellene, who graduated in her third start at Del Mar at the end of August, was 11th in the GI Chandelier S. at Santa Anita in September, but returned to win an optional claimer there next out Oct. 23. Second in the Desi Arnaz S. Nov. 16, she then finished third by just 3/4 of a length behind Take Charge Brandi (Giant's Causeway) in the GI Starlet S. at Los Alamitos Dec. 13. She weakened to eighth to kick off her sophomore campaign in the GI Las Virgines S. Jan. 31 and faltered to finish fourth trying the turf in Santa Anita's China Doll S. Mar. 7. cont. p5

MR. Z TO SHED BLINKERS IN LOUISIANA DERBY

Zayat Stable's **Mr. Z** (Malibu Moon), recent third-place finisher in the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 22, will not wear blinkers in Saturday's GIII Louisiana Derby. "I think he'll be more relaxed this time," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "I took the blinkers off for this one and he's been training without them and that's helped. He will probably still be forwardly placed."

"We're coming in on Wednesday and that'll give him a couple days to school in the paddock and the usual," Lukas continued. "We're looking forward to being there. We're going to work him on Tuesday before we leave Oaklawn. Just a little maintenance work."



TORONADO TO SHUTTLE TO AUSTRALIA

Al Shaqab Racing's **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), who is currently standing his first season at the

National Stud in Newmarket, will shuttle to Swettenham Stud in Victoria, Australia for the Southern Hemisphere breeding season later this year.

The announcement comes a week after Al Shaqab revealed its four-time Group 1 winner Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus})

would shuttle to Arrowfield Stud in New South Wales. Toronado is a two-time Group 1-winning miler, having taken the 2013 G1 Sussex S. and last year's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot.

"To be standing Toronado, who champion jockey Richard Hughes regarded as 'the best he'd ever ridden,' is fantastic and Swettenham are immensely proud to be entrusted with him," said Swettenham's Adam Sangster. "This is a great opportunity for Victorian breeders to use the fastest son of the brilliant High Chaparral, who is emerging as a major influence. One of the biggest attractions for breeders is his compatibility with Danzig-line mares that are so well represented in Australia."

Al Shaqab advisor John Warren added, "Toronado is a magnificent, correct individual with tremendous muscle definition, which is why he was such a fast horse. He looks the perfect horse for Australia with the combination of his pedigree, powerful physique and high-class performances. I know the breeders will be very impressed when inspecting him when he arrives in Australia, as he has been hugely popular here in the UK."

Toronado will stand for A\$22,000.

'BEAU' TO STICK WITH ASCOT ASSIGNMENT

Australian sprinter **Brazen Beau (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}) will continue on his original path and skip the Apr. 4 G1 TJ Smith S. at The Championships in favor of a trip to England for Royal Ascot in June, according to *Racing and Sports*.

A Group 2-winning 2-year-old, Brazen Beau added last season's G2 Roman Consul S. and G1 Coolmore Stud S. before Darley sealed a stud deal on the colt. He

finished second to Lankan Rupee (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) first-up in the G1 Lightning S. Feb. 21, and bested a field of highly rated older sprinters in the G1 Newmarket H. Mar. 14.

"The TJ Smith was certainly tempting after the way he won the Newmarket," Grant Morgan of Ontrack Thoroughbreds, which

campaigns Brazen Beau in partnership, said. "But we had set out a plan even before Darley became involved, which was two autumn starts and then Royal Ascot in June. The program was mapped out for straight racing, at which he excels. He hasn't been around a turn this preparation and the straight sprints in England appeal. We also had to think about the possibility of a wet track in the TJ Smith, which he doesn't like."

Morgan said it had not been decided whether Brazen Beau would target the 1000-meter G1 King's Stand S. or the 1200-meter G1 Diamond Jubilee S., but it wouldn't be both. He said Joao Moreira, who was aboard in the Coolmore and Newmarket, would partner the Chris Waller-trained colt in England.

High-class Japanese galloper Gold Ship returned to his winning ways and defended his title when taking Sunday's Hanshin Daishoten. Winner of three Group 1s, including two Classics, as a sophomore three years ago, Gold Ship has scored at the highest level each year since. He took the G1 Takarazuka Kinen the last two

years, but had failed to find the winner's circle in four outings since that score last June. He ventured outside Japan for the first time when 14th in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe last October, and was third in the G1 Arima Kinen Dec. 28 to close out

his campaign. He warmed up for this with a seventh in the G2 American Jockey Club S. Jan. 25. Traveling near the rear of a strung-out field yesterday, Gold Ship began to swiftly pick off rivals on the outside the second time down the backstretch and was perched third and three wide at the top of the lane. The grey spurted clear down the stretch and held off a stubborn Denim and Ruby to win comfortably.

Trainer Will VanMeter and his father Tom were treated to quite the thrill in the Saturday nightcap at Oaklawn Park when their sophomore filly Remember Lucy stormed past eight rivals to post a 4 1/4-length debut victory [video].

Surely, the dynamics of the six-furlong event added to the excitement: the chestnut spotted the field roughly 10 lengths at the start before launching a sustained, wide rally from last to first. But on a more personal level, Remember Lucy's namesake holds a special place in the hearts of the father-son duo.

Will VanMeter said the filly was named in honor of his late aunt, Lucy VanMeter, who passed away from a brain aneurysm in 2010 at the age of 49.

"Lucy was a wonderful lady and a very good person who was active in the community," said VanMeter. "We were

bouncing around names. My girlfriend and I came up with that name and it stuck."

The VanMeters first became involved with the filly at the 2012 Keeneland November Sale, where Will and father Tom--long-time Kentucky horseman and owner of VanMeter Sales--purchased her for \$23,000.

"My dad and I bought her," the trainer noted. "We spotted her in the back ring and I think I had looked at her once before. I remember they said she was a big, strong filly."

As the big, strong filly continued to develop, the father-son team had hopes that she would attract increased attention in the sales ring during the 2013 season.

"The original plan was to pinhook her, and we took her over to the yearling sales thinking that we were going to look pretty smart with her," explained VanMeter. "But nobody else really ended up liking her, so we bought her back for about what we had in her. So then we kicked around the idea of taking her to the 2-year-old sales, but we decided to give her a shot and try to get her to the races."

Remember Lucy was broken by Will's girlfriend--and assistant trainer--Kristin Fischer, before arriving in the conditioner's care in Kentucky. Brought to Oaklawn Park as part of a 10-horse string on hand for the winter meet, VanMeter said the filly made a favorable impression in the mornings.

"You obviously get high on horses and hope that they're going to do something good, but you never get too confident," noted VanMeter. "She had been working well with some other really nice horses we had down

[at Oaklawn]. She was kind of a green maiden and you could tell she was doing it all off talent."

Despite his tempered enthusiasm, VanMeter said he gained further confidence that the filly would run well after her workmate, Radiant Ruby (Tale of the Cat), graduated first-time out in a Jan. 30 Oaklawn maiden event. The trainer noted that, although he liked what he saw from both fillies in their training, Remember Lucy often appeared slightly stronger when the two worked in tandem.

But when Remember Lucy drew the rail post for her debut, VanMeter admitted that he thought it would be too much for her to overcome. Those suspicions seemed to be confirmed when she hesitated and broke multiple steps slow.

"Whenever a horse breaks like that, you kind of throw your hat on the ground," VanMeter quipped. "But once she got her feet up under her, I could see she was kind of running like she was for us in the mornings. I thought she had a shot, and when they went :22 and change [for the quarter-mile], I thought that falling out of the gate was almost a blessing in disguise."

Blessing or not, VanMeter said that Remember Lucy's victory ensured an enjoyable day at the track with family and friends. The 31-year-old, a former assistant to Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas, began training on his own in the autumn of 2013. He saddled his first starter in the spring of 2014.

While VanMeter said his family is a close group, he acknowledged that owning Remember Lucy in partnership with his father is more circumstantial than planned.

"It's not something that we're actively trying to do, but he's my dad, and it's fun to own horses with him," remarked VanMeter. "He's had a lot of good luck and knows what he's doing. He helps me out and steers me in the right direction with some horses. I'm sure she'll be the first of a few more somewhere down the line." --Ben Massam




