**PLETCHER DUO EXITS FL DERBY WELL**

**Materiality** (Afleet Alex) exited his victory in the GI Besilu Stables Florida Derby in fine fettle, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. "He pulled up well and is just coming back from Gulfstream now," Pletcher said from his base at Palm Beach Downs Sunday morning. "It was a very determined effort. He showed his tenacity. It was a long drive from a half-mile out over a very demanding surface and against a very good horse. I thought it was very impressive for him

to be able to do that in his third start. I think he's certainly earned his way [to the Kentucky Derby]. Five weeks should be beneficial since we ran back in 22 days [in the Florida Derby], but it's also a long time, so hopefully he continues to do well." **cont. p3**

**DAREDEVIL, FROSTED WORK FOR WOOD**

**Daredevil** (More Than Ready) and **Frosted** (Tapit), two hopeful's for Saturday's GI Twinspires.com Wood Memorial, worked Sunday in preparation for that upcoming affair.

Daredevil, the GI Champagne S. winner, who recently finished second in the GII Fasig-Tipton Swale S. in his sophomore debut Feb. 7, covered a half-mile in :48.85 in company over the Belmont training track Sunday.

"I thought he did it very well," Byron Hughes, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher said of Daredevil. "He looked good doing it, went very easily, and galloped out strong. We're definitely happy with the work. It didn't start out as planned [with Daredevil breaking a few lengths in front of his workmate], but the rider adapted and had a good hold of him." **cont. p3**

**CHROME HEADED TO ROYAL ASCOT**

Less than 24 hours after his second-place finish in the G1 Dubai World Cup, connections of Horse of the Year **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) confirmed the 4-year-old would now prepare for a tilt at Royal Ascot in June.

California Chrome will ship to the UK directly from Dubai as early as next week, and will be based in the Newmarket yard of trainer Rae Guest, with whom his trainer, Art Sherman, already has connections. Sherman will travel periodically to England to oversee California

Chrome's preparations. The G1 Prince of Wales's S. over 1 1/4 miles on the turf on the second day of Royal Ascot June 17 could be the target for California Chrome, and he could warm up with a start in the G1 Lockinge S. over a mile on the

lawn at Newbury May 16.

"We are grateful for the opportunity to race at Royal Ascot and hopeful that California Chrome can put up a good show," said Perry Martin, who bred and owns the chestnut colt in partnership with Steve Coburn. "We are looking forward to the experience." **cont. p5**

The track was very tiring for the Fountain of Youth and was again yesterday [for the Florida Derby], so we're happy with our decision [to go to New York for the Wood]."

**Commissioner Eyes Brooklyn**

"That was him doing what he does best, which is kind of getting into that cruising speed and just keep going and going. I think he has enough speed in those situations that he can put himself into a good spot, and he's able to continue doing that for a while, and I think that's why he's been successful at some of those longer distances."

"I don't necessarily have a plan for his next start," Pletcher continued, "but considering how well he ran [when second] in the Belmont [S.], the Brooklyn would be a definite objective, but it's possible we could run somewhere before that."

## FLORIDA DERBY DAY SETS RECORDS

Gulfstream Park's 14-race Florida Derby day card set records for both total handle and on-track handle, according to figures released by the track. Total handle for the day was \$27.255 million, topping the previous mark of \$26.820 million, which was set during last year's 14-race Florida Derby card. Outside of Breeders' Cup days, Saturday's total handle was the largest in Gulfstream history. Saturday's on-track handle of \$3.302 million was a new standard in Gulfstream's new building, topping the previous on-track record set in 2013 of \$3.196 million.

## PEACE AND WAR RETURNS IN ASHLAND

Qatar Racing's **Peace and War** (War Front), last seen winning the Oct. 3 GI Darley Alcibiades S., will return to action in Saturday's GI Central Bank Ashland S. at Keeneland. The bay filly missed an expected start in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies after sustaining a slight tear of the tiny XYZ ligament at the base of a fetlock, but trainer Olly Stevens is happy with her progress so far. She shipped in from Europe Sunday and is in quarantine at Keeneland.

"Now we wait a long 48 hours," Stevens said. "She will be in quarantine for two days and come out for a jog late Tuesday morning. She will gallop Wednesday and then blow out an eighth of a mile Thursday."

Of his filly's preparation for her sophomore debut, Stevens added, "She has been breezing with stakes horses and handling them pretty easily. We have done a lot more work with her this time than last fall and I am very happy with her."

Stevens is looking ahead to a start at Churchill Downs. "Hopefully, we can get in the [May 1 GI Kentucky] Oaks," Stevens said. "We are 22nd in points now. Under the old graded stakes earnings system, we would be in. If we don't get in the Oaks, we may run against the boys on Derby Day [in the GII American Turf] or the Eight Belles [May 1 for fillies on dirt]. There are a lot of races for her and the plan is to put her on turf this summer at Ascot."

"We're obviously thrilled that this is coming to fruition," said Nick Smith, head of communications and international racing at Ascot. "I first met Art at the Breeders' Cup last year and then again at Los Alamitos in February and it was a great pleasure to meet the owners Perry Martin and Steve Coburn in Dubai to discuss details. Amongst those details are that he might have a prep in the Lockinge at Newbury. We have been working with Andy Clifton of Newbury on a joint promotion for some weeks. He will be entered for that race tomorrow."

Smith added, "To have another Kentucky Derby winner at Royal Ascot is exciting and he could spearhead a strong international presence for the week."

The 2011 GI Kentucky Derby winner Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) contested the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot after winning the Dubai World Cup in 2013, finishing 11th.

Sherman appeared less enthusiastic about the prospect of California Chrome racing in England, telling the Roger Stein radio show Sunday, "[Martin] thinks the horse will do good because he's won on the grass [last year's GI Hollywood Derby], but it was a different grass. They don't realize the horses that are going to be involved, they go counterclockwise, he's got to learn to go the opposite way, and everything. It's going to be rough on him, I think.

"I would have never done it myself," Sherman added. "I would have gave the horse more time to kind of unwind. He's going to be a tired horse after this trip."

Nick Smith said he expects the top three of Saturday's G1 Al Quoz Sprint--**Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}), **Peniaphobia (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) and Wesley Ward's **Green Mask** (Mizzen Mast)--to re-oppose in the G1 King's Stand S. on the opening day of Royal Ascot. Hong Kong superstar **Able Friend (Aus)** (Shamardal) could ship for the Queen Anne, while Japan could be represented by **Spielberg (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the Prince of Wales's.

Slow to mature, the imposing Ramone first offered a glimpse of what was to come when second in a course-and-distance handicap in September and followed that with a fifth in the Listed Garnet S. over this trip the next month. Entering this test with a latest piece of form being a 12th of 13 in Leopardstown's Listed Knockaire S. dropping back a furlong also in October, the bay stepped out of the shadows in the Kildare gloom to capture a surprise first black-type success in this seemingly competitive affair. After breaking with more elan than in the past, Ramone raced freely throughout the early stages stranded in open space as she took along the main group. With only the freewheeling Amulet ahead, she had a target to aim at and her momentum carried her past that rival with a furlong remaining and on to the line in a slow-motion finish in the conditions. Ramone, who was the first 100-1 winner in the country in 12 years, is one of six horses in training with Bill Farrell and he told *irishracing.com*, "That's the first time she's got her ground. She's a big, strong yoke and the ground will control everything as to where she will run."

"We will now target the top middle-distance races later in the season with all roads leading back to Longchamp in October for another crack at the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe."

Kingston Hill has been in a Group 1 winner in each of his two seasons on the racetrack. He took the G1 Racing Post Trophy as a 2-year-old and won last year's G1 St Leger in addition to finishing second in the G1 Epsom Derby.

"[Trainer] Sir Michael [Stoute] has mentioned the possibility of starting him off in the [G2] Jockey Club S. at Newmarket [May 2] and that could be a good place for him to begin his season," Herbert said. "We will obviously take it one step at a time, as we always do with Sir Michael. He could go for the Coronation Cup or follow a similar route to last year and go for the Hardwicke before the King George. The aim this year is to grab that elusive Group 1 win."

Hong Kong may have had a frustrating day at Saturday's Dubai World Cup meeting, registering three placings--including a pair of runner-up finishes--in Group 1 events, but Aerovelocity surely provided some consolidation with a hard-fought score in Japan's Takamatsunomiya Kinen, the third leg of the Global Sprint Challenge.

The 7-year-old gelding, who landed in Hong Kong two years ago, has been on an upward trajectory as of late. He embarked on a five-race win streak of races over 1200 meters in November 2013, and his streak was only snapped when he stepped up to 1400 meters for a local Group 3 contest last June, finishing second. Aerovelocity got back to his winning ways in the HKG2 Premier Bowl Oct. 26, besting yesterday's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen runner-up Super Jockey (NZ) (Sandtrap) with superstar miler Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) back in fourth. He was a troubled last of 14 behind yesterday's G1 Al Quoz Sprint second Peniaphobia (Ire) (Dandy Man {Ire}) in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint Nov. 23, but turned the tables on that rival in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 14. Aerovelocity warmed up for this with a second to Group 1 winner Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) in the HKG1 Chairman's Sprint Prize Feb. 15, and was off to a good beginning under regular rider Zac Purton Sunday. Dropping back shortly after the break to stalk the pace just off the fence in the rainy conditions, Aerovelocity--along with much of the field--swung wide off the turn and set his sights on the front-running Hakusan Moon with Mikki Isle racing alongside him. Aerovelocity quickened between rivals in the closing stages to nail Hakusan Moon on the line.

"Obviously I was a bit concerned about the rain, but the track was not that bad," said Purton after recording his first Group 1 victory in Japan. "It was a new experience for him. As we entered the home straight, he appeared to have lost his footing, lost a bit of his momentum. I thought the race was all over. I continued to ride and he started to regain his balance. The gallop was a little bit better. We moved to the better part of the track and he was comfortable with it again, and able to bounce back."

Trainer Paul O'Sullivan said there is a chance his charge could aim for the Global Sprint Challenge's \$1 million bonus, which is awarded to any horse that wins three legs in three different countries in the same year.

"I haven't really made a plan beyond today," O'Sullivan said. "I thought if he ran well we will be going to Singapore [for the G1 KrisFlyer Sprint in May]. But we've now got to start to look at the international series. We will be trying to win another race as there will be a million-dollar bonus if he wins three. We will sit down and discuss and see what looks best to his form."

Donald Adam wasn't in New Orleans to see his homebred Guapo Man (Street Cry {Ire})'s romping 17-length maiden victory at Fair Grounds Sunday, but he did get to watch the race remotely and he was impressed with what he saw.

"I wasn't at the track, I was traveling," Adam said Sunday afternoon. "I was on the plane, but I saw it on the plane and it was a very, very impressive day for Guapo Man." *Cont. p4*

Sunday's breakthrough effort came after two off-the-board finishes and Adam admitted, "Frankly, we've been disappointed. We sprinted him twice and he stopped both times. I think he's figured it out now and I credit [trainer] David Carroll with that. We always thought he had a lot of ability."

Carroll, who trains eight horses for Adam's Courtlandt Farm, agreed with his owner's assessment of Guapo Man.

"We're very happy with him," Carroll said from Fair Grounds Sunday. "He's a horse that has always trained beautifully. We were certainly disappointed with his first two races. He's a big, heavy horse and we felt like it would take him a couple of races to get him fit. In his first race, it was a nice run, he just got tired at the end. And his second race, he broke so sharp and went a little bit too fast and it really wasn't what we were looking for. So we changed his training schedule a little bit and stretched him out to two turns, which is what he is bred to do, and he ran the way he trained. I'm not sure what he beat, but it was certainly a very promising performance today. It was something we can build on."

Of Guapo Man's front-running style of victory, Carroll added, "Today there wasn't a lot of pace on paper, so we just let him break and he got an easy lead and it was kind of easy for him today. It was nice to see him do what he has been showing us in the mornings."

Adam also campaigned Guapo Man's dam, Indescribable (Pleasant Tap), winner of the 2008 Gill Arlington Matron H., Gill Cardinal H. and 2009 Gill Doubledogdare S. The Texan, who also campaigned Grade I winners Film Maker (Dynaformer) and Sweet Talker (Stormin Fever), sees similarities between mother and son.

"Without a doubt there are similarities," Adam said. "She's a big mare and a multiple graded stakes winner and very talented. When she first began, she didn't kick in until three or four races and then following that she was a very formidable mare at that time. He has a lot of her traits. He is a very big horse, but I think he has far more speed than his mother ever thought about. I think it's going to make him push button."

Adam said his long association with the family makes Guapo Man's success even more special.

"We raised her and now to have her offspring that has such ability, it's going to give me enormous pleasure," he said. "And I think we're going to have a lot of fun with him."

Adam's broodmare band numbers about 20 head and, while he does sell some of the horses he breeds, he knew he was going to keep Guapo Man.

"We sell some, but I chose not to sell Guapo Man mainly because I felt he was going to be a little slow developing," Adam explained. "And a lot of people don't want to be patient. But I decided that he might be pretty special and he was a big, growthy type, a Pleasant Colony-type--but he is a better-looking horse than what Pleasant Colony typically produced. He's a very handsome horse. Guapo is handsome in Spanish, that's how he got the name--he was a handsome man."

Sunday was closing day at Fair Grounds and Guapo Man will head north with the rest of Carroll's horses. He could get his next start in Louisville at the end of April.

"We'll put him on a van in the morning and get him back to Kentucky," Carroll said. "We'll see how he comes out of the race. He's a big horse, he's had three races here over the winter. Hopefully he'll show up around Derby week in an allowance race, if everything goes well. We'll let him tell us what he can and can't do, we're not going to get ahead of ourselves. He's got a beautiful pedigree and he's owned by a great man, and hopefully, there are better things down the road for him."

Guapo Man is one of eight horses Carroll trains for Adam and the Irishman hopes Sunday's victory will provide momentum for the rest of 2015.

"We have a nice filly for him called Sumlin (Eskendereya), who won [a maiden race] on Mar. 20 and she is very nice," Carroll said. "We have Strike Charmer (Smart Strike), who won the [GIII] Cardinal last fall for him. And we have a couple who haven't run yet that we quite like. Hopefully we can build on this and have a good year." *-Jessica Martini*


