DERBY LUCK TURNS FOR ZAYAT

Ahmed Zayat's Zayat Stables, a three-time runner-up in the GI Kentucky Derby, finally broke through in the "Run for the Roses" Saturday with homebred **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile), a son of Zayat's 2009 Derby runner-up. **Firing Line** (Line of David) completed

the exacta over pacesetting 'TDN Rising Star' Dortmund (Big Brown), who gave Hall of Famer Bob Baffert a one-three finish with his two superstars.

Supported as the 5-2 favorite coming off an eightlength romp last out in the GI Arkansas Derby, last year's champion juvenile broke sharply from the 16 post as Dortmund went right for the lead. Hung

three or four wide outside of the pressing Firing Line into the first turn, the bay settled into a comfortable rhythm out in the clear as his hulking stablemate clicked off a half in :47.34 and six furlongs in 1:11.29. Asked for more from Victor Espinoza along the home bend as Firing Line ratcheted up the pressure on Dortmund, American Pharoah spun wide into the lane as Firing Line wrestled the lead away from the pacesetter. Firing Line--who had previously lost two close calls at the hooves of Dortmund--gave American Pharoah all he could handle to the sixteenth pole, but the chalk tapped his reserves to edge clear late and prevail by a length in front of a record crowd of 170,513. Godolphin's **Frosted** (Tapit) came flying late to fill out the superfecta.

"I feel like the luckiest Mexican on Earth," said Espinoza, a 2015 Hall of Fame nominee who piloted California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) to a victory here 12 months ago and also rode 2002 Derby winner War Emblem for Baffert. "He has been a special horse since the first time I rode him. He has a lot of talent and is an unbelievable horse. Turning for home, I started riding a little harder. At the eighth pole, I just couldn't put that other horse [Firing Line] away, but he got it done." Cont. p3

NO SWEAT

Hot in the paddock and drifting to 4-1 as a result despite maintaining his long-held favoritism for Newmarket's G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas, Ballydoyle's star colt Gleneagles (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) cast aside all doubts to provide Aidan O'Brien with a record-equaling seventh renewal and a first for Ryan Moore. Tracking the early pace in fifth among the stand's-side group, which

always dominated in yet another field split, last year's G1 National S. winner delivered the kind of surge that had prompted an ante-post gamble in March to stride easily to the front approaching the furlong pole. After quickly settling the issue, the bay

needed only to be persuaded not to idle as he had at two and he responded by keeping up the momentum to score by 2 1/4 lengths from **Territories (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). "He's a strong traveler and when he gets there, he doesn't do much," his trainer commented. "His form is top-class and he's a very strong and consistent horse at the top level. We always thought he was a miler, as he always had real pace and could have gone over six." **Cont. p17**



Fifth on debut as the 7-5 favorite last August in a 6 1/2-panel Del Mar maiden that produced GIII Sham S. winner Calculator (In Summation); GI Santa Anita Derby runner-up One Lucky Dane (Lookin At Lucky); stakes winner and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf runner-up Daddy D T (Scat Daddy); and GISP Iron Fist (Tapit), American Pharoah bypassed the maiden ranks thereafter to run away with the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 3 over the aforementioned Calculator and Iron Fist. He was equally impressive when defeating Calculator and next-out GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Texas Red (Afleet Alex) in Santa's 1 1/16-mile GI FrontRunner S. Sept. 27, but failed to make the year-end championship himself after having to be withdrawn the week of the race with a foot bruise.

Still having done enough to take home champion juvenile honors, American Pharoah resurfaced in the Oaklawn slop Mar. 14, and picked up right where he left off with a devastating box-to-wire tally in the GII Rebel S. It was more of the same in the Apr. 11 Arkansas Derby--won in 2012 by Zayat and Baffert's brilliant Derby runner-up Bodemeister (Empire Maker)--as American Pharoah justified 1-9 odds with an eightlength drubbing that earned him a 105 Beyer Speed Figure.

If his resume wasn't enough to merit plenty of hype, sparkling drills at Santa Anita (Apr. 5, 6f in 1:11.60 {1/25}) and under the Twin Spires (Apr. 26, 5f in :58.40 {1/33}) helped the \$300,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga grad hog the majority of the pre-race spotlight despite a particularly well-credentialed Derby field.

"We were ready to rumble," added Baffert, referring to his formidable one-two punch. "Since their last works I was hearing how good they were and I was hoping it would come true. I felt very confident going in."

Baffert moved into a three-way tie for second with four Derby wins along with fellow Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas and "Derby" Dick Thompson. Ben Jones holds the record with five. Cont. p5

"Those names are legends," said Baffert. "And to be in this position, you know, I never think about stuff like that... Victor and I, we have a lot of history going back. And he won that Derby. And to win this Derby, this is for the Zayats who have suffered so much running these seconds, since Bodemeister and Pioneerof the

Nile. So we know what it is to just get completely punched right in the face."

Cairo, Egypt-born Ahmed Zayat, whose business success came predominantly in the beverage industry, has become a major player in the racing game over the past decade, but a Classic victory eluded the New Jersev resident until Saturday. In addition to close calls with Pioneerof the Nile and Bodemeister, Zavat's ill-fated Nehro (Mineshaft) finished second to Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) here in 2011. Bodemeister

was second in the 2012 Preakness after nearly running away with the Derby two weeks earlier, and Zayat's Paynter (Awesome Again) came up just 1/4 length short in the GI Belmont S. three weeks after that.

"I was looking at my wife [Joanne]," Zayat said as he rewatched American Pharoah's stretch run during the post-race press conference. "And I was looking at this particular picture. Pharoah is a freak of nature. And, for the first time, I'm seeing him right now working, working hard. And I knew that, if he had the lead, nobody would catch him. He has such a brilliant speed.

I start getting really, really nervous. And my wife started crying. Like, literally, in seconds, that emotion went from somebody who is crying out of fear that they're going to take it again from us to actually having done it. Tears of joy. It was like a euphoria of emotions. I still cannot believe it. I don't even know who finished second or third. I was so -- I am asking him who got second? Who got third? So that's my feelings."

Pioneerof the Nile, also bred by Zayat, took the 2008 GI CashCall Futurity, and capped a three-race win streak in the following season's GI Santa Anita Derby before checking in a well-beaten second behind Mine That Bird (Birdstone) in the Derby. He was off the board in the Preakness, and retired to Vinery in Kentucky in 2010, where he stood for a fee of \$17,500 in his first season. He produced two-time Grade II-winning Cairo Prince and the Zayat co-owned, Baffert-trained 2014 GII Summer Oaks S. winner Jojo Warrior in his first crop. American Pharoah hails from the now 9-year-old's second crop. Pioneerof the Nile was relocated to WinStar Farm in 2013, and currently commands a fee of \$60,000.

Littleprincessemma, a \$250,000 KEESEP yearling who was winless in two starts for Zayat and Steve Asmussen, sold for \$2.1 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton November Sale carrying a full brother to the Derby winner. The half sister to graded stakes winners Storm Wolf (Stormin Fever) and Misty Rosette (Stormin Fever) produced a Pioneerof the Nile filly in 2014.

Say What?

"It is disappointing, for sure. But on the other hand I'm very proud of how well my horse ran. Gary [Stevens] rode a great race, he had him in the right spot. We just got beat. I didn't expect him to be as close as he was, but I knew Gary had him right. We tried all the way. Tough beat."-Simon Callaghan, trainer of Firing Line (2nd)

"He's a really good horse and he ran like it today. He always comes to run; that's the kind of horse he is. He got beat today by really good horses. That can happen." -Martin Garcia, jockey of Dortmund (3rd)

"He ran very well. He had a good trip. We finished fourth. He may have been a little far back. It's hard to say, but we didn't have a rough trip. He was just a little wide on the turn." -Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin on Frosted (4th)

"I tell you [jockey] Julien [Leparoux] rode him great, he put him in position to win. He just wasn't good enough today, but I'm still very proud of him." -Mark Casse, trainer of Danzig Moon (Malibu Moon) (5th)

"He ran very well. He missed the break as he stumbled a little bit, pulled his shoe off and I thought he closed pretty well despite that." -Todd Pletcher on Materiality (Afleet Alex) (6th)

"He got a good trip, but he may not have handled the track as he came off the bridle at the half mile pole and couldn't make much of an excuse for him." -Todd Pletcher on Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway) (10th)

"It's one of those runs that's not good and it's not bad. Those were some bloody good horses ahead of him. He seemed to make a little forward move in the straight in the last bit but not enough. Listen, for all the traveling he's done in the last month--he's done a massive amount of work--maybe he'd be better off forward. I suppose one's really got to dive back and look at the replay, he may be not good enough, I don't know. But I think he'd be better off forward with less horses, less kickback maybe. We didn't start that well and we basically didn't have the speed to get to them. He stayed on and ran an honest race." -Mike de Kock, trainer of Mubtaahij (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire})

"It was bad day to have a closer. The jockeys were OK with letting the top three go in a merry go round around the racetrack. We'll live to fight another day and congratulations to the winner." -Ron Moquet, trainer of Far Right (Notional) (15th)

"He seems fine. There is certainly obviously nothing wrong with him. We scoped him and, other than a lot of dirt in his trachea, he seems fine. He was hardly blowing. I don't have any answers yet." -Rick Violette, trainer of Upstart (Flatter) (18th)

"The state vet got there this morning to check him out and did not like the way he jogged down the shedrow," Ken Ramsey told Churchill's media department Saturday morning. "Our blacksmith took the left-front shoe off and there was definitely some heat on the inside quarter of the left-front foot. Something's brewing in there, probably an abscess. There's nothing major wrong with the horse whatsoever. We think we'll probably have him ready to come back for the Preakness but time will tell. It's a devastating blow to come this far. I thought I had a decent shot at winning the race. But it happened to A.P. Indy and a lot of other horses before. It's bad news for the owners and the family that pinned so many hopes on finally getting to the other side of the racetrack [to the infield Kentucky Derby winner's circle]."

On the withdrawal of Stephanie's Kitten and Coalport from the Woodford Reserve, Ramsey added, "That's an issue between me and [trainer] Chad Brown. I won't get into that in the press but none of the three in the Woodford Reserve will be running in our colors today."

Woodford Reserve Turf Classic cont.

Finnegans Wake continued his upward progression since being transferred to the Peter Miller barn to register a career high here. The 6-year-old was allowed to settle in last of nine through opening fractions of :24.44 and :47.85. With Victor Espinoza in the saddle, he still had plenty to do entering the far turn. Finnegans Wake began to wind up once getting wheeled out to the extreme outside on the turn for home and came

charging down the center of the course to win in a blanket photo. The second-place finisher across the line Sky Captain (Sky Mesa) was disqualified from second and placed fourth for drifting out in deep stretch and impeding the path of Seek Again.

"I got there just in

time," said winning pilot Victor Espinoza, whose big day was just getting started. "Turning for home I thought I would catch him, but then I said, 'Uh-oh, this is going to be tough.' I started working on him. He's old. He wants to do whatever he wants. He wanted to take his time, so I let him do whatever he wants and enjoy himself in the beginning. Then after a half-mile I said, 'You know what, we better start moving.' I started working on him. I wanted to save ground at the end, but any little stop would have cost him the race. To swing to the outside was the best thing for him."

Finnegans Wake--second in the 2012 GI Secretariat S.--posted his first stakes win in the GIII Arlington H. last July, then concluded his tenure for Dale Romans with a fifth-place finish in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 16. Finnegans Wake began his West Coast campaign for Miller with a second-place finish in the GII John Henry Turf Championship Sept. 28. Never involved when 10th in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Nov. 1, Finnegans Wake posted three straight wins since--the GII Hollywood Turf Cup S. Nov. 27, the GII San Gabriel S. Jan. 3 and the GII San Marcos S. Feb. 7. He entered this off a runner-up finish in the GII San Luis Rey S. Mar. 21.

A last-to-first winner going this trip at Aqueduct in November of 2013, the bay became a 'Rising Star' when she aired by 12 lengths in a rained-off Gulfstream Park route last Jan. 31. She went missing thereafter, but picked up where she left off to annex Presque Isle's Malvern Rose S. for Pennsylvania-breds in August, and increased

her value with a victory against older females in Belmont's GIII Turnback the Alarm H. Oct. 26. Third in Aqueduct's GIII Comely S. Nov. 29, she made her 4-year-old debut a winning one with a comfortable score over subsequent GII Royal Delta S. romper and GI La Troienne S. runner-up Sheer Drama (Burning Roma) in the Florida Sunshine Millions Distaff back at seven eights Jan. 17. Sent out to Santa Anita last time for the Mar. 14 GI Santa Margarita S., Dame Dorothy seemed to come under an early ride, but stayed on to finish a distant second.

Brushed a bit out of the gate when Sweet Reason (Street Sense) came out on Thank You Marylou (Birdstone), the Bobby Flay colorbearer settled into fourth while well off the rail as Judy the Beauty pressed longshot Moonlit Stroll. Asked for more by Javier Castellano around the bend, she was on more or less even terms with the Eclipse winner at the head of the lane as Moonlit Stroll braced for challenges from the favorites. That trio traveled in concert into the final sixteenth, but Dame Dorothy had the most to give and got her neck in front in the shadow of the wire.

"You've got to use this filly away from there; she's not the quickest out of the gate," noted Castellano. "So I got after her and she responded. When we got position, I felt very good. Every time I asked her, she gave it to me. Coming down the stretch I knew it was going to be close. I knew Judy the Beauty was going to be tough. But my filly kept responding and she gave me so much confidence I felt I could celebrate a little before the wire." Cont. p10

Transferred from Doug O'Neill to relative unknown Alfredo Velazquez last fall, the speedster defended his GI Vosburgh Invitational S. title at Belmont Sept. 27, and checked in a solid third despite failing to make the early lead in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 1. Over an Aqueduct surface Nov. 29 that was playing to his strengths, the bay went right to the front and never looked back to crush Secret Circle (Eddington) by five lengths in the GI Cigar Mile H. before joining the high-percentage Jorge Navarro barn. Private Zone set another quick pace last time in the GII Gulfstream Park H. over an additional furlong Mar. 7, and settled for

second to Honor Code (A.P. Indy), who failed to land a blow in Friday's GII Alysheba S. at a short price.

Sent right to the front as expected, Private Zone doled out fractions of :22.38 and :44.64 while kept off the rail a bit. It was clear that the chalk was coming up empty in the pocket by the quarter pole, but the threat of an even bigger upset was very real as Nate's Mineshaft sidled up to

the leader and looked to be going better. Private Zone, however, never one to blink in a dog fight, stiff-armed that stubborn foe and spurted clear again in the final sixteenth to win easily.

"This is my first stakes win on Derby Day; my first stakes win at Churchill," noted California-based rider Martin Pedroza, who had piloted Private Zone in his previous 13 efforts before Carlos Marquez, Jr. took over last time. "I am so happy to win this race for my good friend [and paralyzed former jockey] Renee Douglas, [stable manager for Good Friends Stable]. I am blessed that I am healthy and doing well and I can win a race like this for him. I'm 48, but I feel like I'm 21. This is some horse. He is so good. When [Nate's Mineshaft] went by me, I didn't get nervous. I just let my horse do what he does, and I knew he'd be game. Then I hit him left handed and it was all over. He's just so tough."

Navarro offered, "He's been training really well coming into this race. I knew when the other horse came he would dig in. He's a fighter. I just let Martin ride his race."

In addition to Douglas, Good Friends Stable is comprised of Hilton Gordon, Joe Casciato, NHL Hall of Famer Denis Savard, Dave Flanbaum and Larry Slavin.

Of the beaten favorite, rider Martin Garcia said, "He felt really good, he broke really sharp. He didn't have the kick that he usually does. He was done at the half mile. He didn't handle the track at all, he didn't like it."

Bayern's only previous race at Churchill came in last year's GIII Derby Trial S., in which he crossed the wire first, but was disqualified and placed second.

She earned her diploma second out over the former Polytrack at Keeneland during her 2-year-old season.

The winner's dam Life Happened--an unraced half-sister to multiple graded winner Disco Rico (Citidancer)-has an unraced 3-year-old filly by More Than Ready; a 2-year-old colt by Gio Ponti; and a yearling colt by Harlan's Holiday. Machmer Hall purchased Life Happened for \$4,500 at the 2008 KEENOV sale and later re-sold her for \$750,000 while in foal to Harlan's Holiday at the 2014 KEEJAN sale.

Divisidero utilized an explosive turn of foot to capture the GIII American Turf S. by 3/4 of a length over A Lot Saturday afternoon at Churchill Downs. Conditioned by William 'Buff' Bradley, the bay notched his first graded stakes triumph and his second win from three career starts.

Away in good order from post 11, Divisidero angled in soon after the start and raced two wide off the pace as longshot Tuba (Magna Graduate) cut out fractions of :24.03 and :48.69. Spun five wide turning for home

through six furlongs in 1:12.49, the colt burst into the fray in the center of the course and set sail for A Lot, who had built a three-length advantage by midstretch. Divisidero sailed past that rival in the final yards and won going away. "We worried a little

bit yesterday because it looked like the turf course favored speed, but I told [winning rider Rafael Hernandez], 'Don't take him out of his game and let him run his race," commented Bradley. "He's an awesome horse. He's professional already, and it's just his third race. It's unbelievable."

A first-out winner to belie odds of 25-1 at this same trip over the lawn at Gulfstream Feb. 7, the bay followed with a troubled third-place finish in that venue's GIII Palm Beach S. Mar. 7. While he was unable to find adequate running room late in that contest, it was smooth sailing over the Churchill turf.

"The race set up perfect for us, and the first turn I lost a little ground because I was pushed a little bit out, so my horse stayed there," said Hernandez. "He never took himself back or anything. At the three-eighths, I started asking, he started picking it up and just saving more ground. Turning for home, we got him to the lead and he did the rest."

'TDN Rising Star' Competitive Edge kicked off the graded-stakes portion of the Kentucky Derby card in style, remaining perfect in four starts with a facile success in the GIII Pat Day Mile at Churchill Downs.

Sent off right at his morning line of 6-5, the \$750,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida 2-year-old purchase was away well from the six hole for John Velazquez and was content to rate off the early fractions set by Northern Spur S. runner-up Hillbilly Royalty (Langfuhr) from second. The latter took them into the turn, but the Pletcher trainee always looked to have his measure and claimed that one easily while traveling supremely well leaving the quarter pole. Pain and Misery, most recently the distant third-place finisher to Firing Line (Line of David) in the GIII Sunland Derby Mar. 22, covered ground throughout and tried the eventual winner at the furlong grounds, but Competitive Edge had another couple of gears and leveled out beautifully to hit the line a much-the-best winner in stakes-record time. Gimme da Lute (Midnight Lute), in traffic leaving the chute, could not match strides with Competitive Edge and finished a well-backed third.

"I thought that was very impressive, especially for his first time going a straight mile," winning trainer Todd Pletcher commented. "[Jockey] Johnny [Velazquez]) said it was pretty straight forward. The scary thing is that as impressive as that was, I think there is more in the tank."

A smashing 10 1/4-length winner of his July 26 debut at Saratoga, Competitive Edge made it two

straight with a 5 3/4-length success in that track's GI Hopeful S. Sept. 1 after a share in the colt was sold to Michael Tabor. Connections called it a season thereafter, bypassing the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and Competitive Edge made light work of

his seasonal debut in the Tamarac S. at Gulfstream, besting fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Mr. Jordan (Kantharos) by 8 1/4 lengths.



Rosalind began her career for Landaluce Educe Stables and trainer Ken McPeek, for whom she took the GI Ashland S. last year and finished fourth in the GI Kentucky Oaks. She unseated her rider at the start of the G1 Coronation S. in her international bow and didn't factor in the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational in July and the GIII Valley View S. in October. She went through the Fasig-Tipton November ring where she went to SF Bloodstock for a cool \$1 million. Rosalind was transferred to Chad Brown for her current owners and finished second in the GIII Suwannee River S. at Gulfstream Feb. 7 and fifth in the GII Santa Ana S. out at Santa Anita Mar. 15. The big chestnut rated two deep in third down the backstretch. She ranged up three wide to challenge for the lead at the top of the stretch, battled on to gain command by midstretch and held off Maximova and Selenite, who was rallying up the rail.

"I'm so proud of the horse, she did all the work," Brown explained. "We've run her three times since she's come in the barn; she had two really good starts. She didn't really handle the trip to California last time. The report from the jockey was just that she was very quiet in the post parade. As you can see she had some pre-race antics in the paddock, she's really a little difficult in the paddock and high strung and for her to be that guiet in California it must have been the ship. I'm not sure where we'll go from here, but I'll speak to the ownership group about it and we'll plan something."



Dual Grade I winner Big Blue Kitten came charging up the fence in the final sixteenth to capture his seasonal bow in style. Caboosing the field early through an opening quarter in :24.52, the bay continued to scrape the paint as longshot Howe Great posted a half in :48.96. Sitting pretty just off the leader in the stretch, Big Blue Kitten appeared beat as Howe Great began to skip away. The Ramsey homebred suddenly found another gear in the final strides, however, and surged past that rival to earn a decisive victory. Big Blue Kitten captured back-to-back victories in Monmouth Park's GI United Nations and Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer S. in the summer of 2013, and missed by just a nose to GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Little Mike (Spanish Steps) in that year's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational. Eighth in the 2013 BC Turf, he kicked off last term with a victory in Saratoga's Lure S. Aug. 2 before finishing second in Monmouth's GIII Cliff Hanger S. Aug. 24. Fourth as the favorite to dual Eclipse winner Main Sequence (Aldebaran) in the Turf Classic Sept. 27, the bay closed out last term with runner-up finishes in both Woodbine's GI Canadian International S. Oct. 19 and Aqueduct's GIII Red Smith H. Nov. 15. "I'm happy to reunite him with Joe [Bravo], who rides him with so much confidence," winning trainer Chad Brown. "He took his chances inside again and this horse likes to be ridden that way, in cover, and if he finds a seam inside he's willing to go through it. I'm so proud of this horse, at his age, how consistent he's been for our barn. Kudos to Mr. and Mrs. Ramsey for keeping him in training this year. He had a couple of stud offers here and there. But they love this horse and believe in him and [believe] that he could make more on track than as a stallion. Once again, Mr. Ramsey made the right decision. I'll discuss it with him, but the [Knob Creek] Manhattan [June 6] has been the plan."

Paul J. Rigali Jr.'s homebred Texas Air provided an evening firework show at Lone Star Park Saturday night, lighting up the tote board with a 24-1 upset score in the GIII Texas Mile S. Overlooked in a field that included heavily favored Sunshine Millions Classic winner Sr. Quisqueyano (Exclusive Quality), the consistent Texas-bred made amends for an eighth-place finish in this same event in 2014.

Away to a sharp beginning, the gelding raced in the two path around the opening bend and settled off the pace as Rise Up (Rockport Harbor) dictated fractions of :23.16 and :46.36. Picking up the chase on the far turn, he came five wide into the lane and reached even terms with Sr. Quisqueyano, who began to tire along the inside after a stalking trip through six furlongs in 1:10.88. Asked for his all to eat into a four-length advantage held by Rise Up in mid-stretch, Texas Air continued to grind and caught that rival to win going away by 3/4 of a length. Hip Four Sixtynine tagged Rise Up on the wire to secure place honors.

"The race was really put together for me, and all I did was point him in the right direction," said winning rider Quincy Hamilton. "We got clear at the top of the stretch, and I knew I was really well mounted at the top and just ran it on home. I couldn't have been more confident in him tonight, for sure."

Second in the restricted Star of Texas S. over this same trip at Sam Houston Jan. 17, the dark bay followed that effort with a pair of fourth-place finishes when entered for allowance conditions at Oaklawn Feb. 12 and Mar. 1. The latter race, where he was beaten six lengths by 'TDN Rising Star' and GISW The Big Beast (Yes It's True) over six furlongs, served as a springboard to a victory in a recent one-mile allowance contest there Mar. 26.

"He just gets better with age," said Milligan of his 7-year-old charge. "The older he gets, the better he gets. Quincy rode him perfect. He did everything exactly like I asked him to do it. It was perfect."

Sr. Quisqueyano, who was coming off a runner-up finish to Commissioner (A.P. Indy) in the GIII Skip Away S. at Gulfstream Park Mar. 28, faded to finish sixth.

The 5-year-old waited for running room along the rail on the far turn, split horses turning for home and opened up in mid-stretch. Kept to his task after a patient tride from Flavien Prat, Catch a Flight maintained a safe margin over the runner-up, who followed his rally up the rail.

"We thought there was too much speed so [Prat] settled him back and got between horses, and he did it like a pro," commented winning trainer Richard Mandella, who earned his 2,000th career victory. "Flavien roder him like the champ that he is, so it was really great."

Winner of six of his 10 starts in Brazil for trainer R. Morgado Neto, the Argentine-bred was transferred to the care of Mandella after a 10th-place finish in the G1 Brasil S. over the turf at Gavea in June of last term. Third in a one-mile optional claimer in Arcadia Jan. 19-his North American debut--he followed with a gritty neck victory over Sammy Mandeville when extended to nine furlongs over the same surface Feb. 13. Catch a Flight raced evenly to be third, beaten just a head for place honors by subsequent GII Charles Town Classic winner Moreno (Ghostzapper), in the 'Big Cap' Mar. 7 and was given a brief freshening prior to Saturday's appearance.

"The GI Gold Cup [June 27] is the big target, maybe using the GII Californian [May 30] as a stepping stone," said Mandella when asked about future plans.

"We started loading up the van about 9 o'clock and left about 9:30," three-time Kentucky Oaks-winning trainer Larry Jones said. "They made the trip over no problem. They ate all their feed and they acted like they'd done something to get hungry. Everything's apparently

And we will try to take advantage of that, because there are some very good races left this year. The [GII] Black-Eyed Susan [May 15] is too quick back for her off of such a big race."

Only campaigned over seven furlongs at two, Gleneagles did not immediately appear to be one of the stable's leading lights when fourth on debut at Leopardstown in early June, but clues that he was held in high esteem came on his next start later that month. Asked to represent the yard in the Curragh maiden in which Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) was second and the likes of Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) and Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Danehill) had all captured, he justified the honor with a smooth success there before following up in a three-runner G3 Tyros S. back at Leopardstown in July. Showing sharp acceleration before easing up late to add the G2 Futurity S. to his tally returning to the Kildare venue in August, he was not seriously tested in the G1 National S. also at The Curragh the following month. Taking in Longchamp's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere on Arc day, Gleneagles finished first after producing his customary killer turn of foot only to lose the race in the stewards' room as he had veered right when in command to interfere with Full Mast (Mizzen Mast) and Territories. Occupying a leading position in the winter betting for this Classic alongside some companions from Ballydoyle, Gleneagles had obviously put clear distance between himself and the others as a significant plunge took place.

Despite giving off potentially negative signals in the preliminaries, he had calmed by the time he reached the start and Ryan Moore was always happy receiving the ideal lead from the European Free H. winner Home of the Brave (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) and a trio of chasers. With the rail-runners ahead of those who opted to race up the middle of the Rowley Mile, Gleneagles had a perfect script and, as the leader began to come to the end of his tether inside the last quarter mile, it was time to commit. Producing the decisive acceleration his rivals lacked to seize the advantage on the approach to the furlong pole, he was always in total control as Territories stayed on in the manner of a colt who would relish further and Ivawood fared best of the center pack.

"He traveled really smoothly, but unfortunately nothing was able to lead me in the last quarter mile," the winning rider said. "I was never going to get beaten and he looks a miler." With that in mind, the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 23 and G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 16 are the targets for the winner, which may also be the races for Ivawood.

"The winner is obviously a very good horse and we have no excuses, but it is a little disappointing that they raced in two groups," trainer Richard Hannon said. "The false rail obviously does nothing and the stand's side were a little bit in front. Ivawood gets a mile, so it's the end of the discussion on that front. We'll either go to Ireland or Royal Ascot now."

Of Territories, John Ferguson said, "Andre [Fabre] was very keen that he relaxed and come into the race late and that's exactly what he did. This is another step forward and he looks to be one of leading milers in Europe." Cont. p18

Gleneagles's pedigree certainly suggests he would excel over this trip. A full-brother himself to last year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Marvellous (Ire), his dam, You'resothrilling (Storm Cat), is a full-sister to Giant's Causeway, who won the G1 St James's Palace S. over a mile during a storied career on the racetrack.









THRILLING START TO CLASSIC SEASON

You'resothrilling (Storm Cat) was bred to be good, named to be good and was in fact pretty good in her racing days for Michael Tabor and Sue Magnier, winning at Group 2 and 3 level in just seven starts. But anything she achieved on the track has been surpassed, almost in the blink of an eye, in her still-fledgling broodmare career.

The sister to Giant's Causeway has been aided in her success by repeat visits to the champion sire Galileo

(Ire), but to have produced two Guineas winners from her first two foals propels her straight into blue-hen territory. Gleneagles (Ire), born a year and three days after his Irish 1000 Guineas-winning sister Marvellous (Ire), laid waste to a bumper field of 18 runners for the G1

QIPCO 2000 Guineas, his turbo-charged thrust two furlongs from home leaving some well-credentialed challengers toiling in his wake. Godolphin's French-trained raider **Territories (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) ran home strongly to be best of the rest, but proved no match for the killer turn of foot exhibited by Ryan Moore's mount.

Much has been made of Moore's signing to Ballydoyle this spring, and though he doesn't show it he will undoubtedly have been delighted to record his first major victory for his new bosses in the Classic run not much more than a stone's throw from his front door. Though he won the G1 1000 Guineas for Aidan O'Brien back in 2012 aboard Homecoming Queen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), this was the first 2000 Guineas success for Moore. For O'Brien, however, Gleneagles was merely extending a line of dominance in the race that started with King Of Kings in 1998 and continued though Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire) (2002),

Footstepsinthesand (Ire) (2005), George Washington (Ire) (2006), Henrythenavigator (2008) and Camelot (Ire) (2012). Not since 1862 has any trainer been so successful in the opening Classic of the British turf season, when John Scott saddled his seventh 2000 Guineas winner, The Marquis, having landed his first victory 20 years earlier with Meteor.

The comparison extends to the fact that two of Scott's winners were ridden by his son, Bill. O'Brien's son Joseph missed out on his second victory in the race by being partnered with the stable's other challenger, Ol' Man River (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who finished a disappointing last. As much a part of the team as his father, Joseph nevertheless played a significant role in helping Gleneagles to earn his Classic laurels.

"Joseph rides him every day and he was really happy with him coming here," explained O'Brien. "Joseph and Ryan had discussed the race beforehand and Joseph said that [Gleneagles] doesn't do too much when he hits the front, but when Ryan came in today he just said that he had to commit him that early because he traveled so well and nothing could lead him. He's a

great traveler and he has a lot of speed--five, six or seven furlongs would have been no problem with him as a 2-year-old."

Anyone who has listened to post-Classic interviews with O'Brien will know it is now a customary part of his acceptance speech to deflect attention from himself and praise the team at home, but no matter how many times he says it, his appreciation for the back-room boys and

girls at Ballydoyle and Coolmore never sounds trite.

On Saturday afternoon, he reiterated this stance, saying modestly: "I'm a very small part of a very big team of people and that's the reality. It's a privilege to be in the position we're in at Ballydoyle with these horses but there's a lot of people putting in a lot of hard work even before these horses are born."

And that, of course, is the crux of the extraordinary success of an extraordinary empire. No bloodstock operation in the world could be better orchestrated-through the creation of home-grown sires and selection of first-class breeding stock--than Coolmore, whose stallions were responsible for a third of the runners in this year's 2000 Guineas. From a quiet corner of rural Ireland, its power is felt throughout the racing world.

Though Moore has ridden for Ballydoyle on many big occasions in the past, it's a break with tradition to have an Englishman charged with the Irish stable's main riding duties. He's earned his place by proving time and again that he's a jockey who can mix it with the very best in any jurisdiction internationally. Frustratingly for a quote-hungry press pack, Moore is a man of few words, but there's no doubting his sense of purpose in his new role. Cont. p19

"These races are important and we'll try to win as many as we can," he said after accepting his prize for Gleneagles's victory. It will be no surprise if that statement is borne out as soon as Sunday afternoon, when he will be back in Michael Tabor's blue-and-orange silks aboard recent listed victrix Legatissimo (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Qipco 1000 Guineas.

For the many who expected 'TDN Rising Star' Telescope to just go down and come back here, there was a shock in store as Second Step swooped late to

deny last year's G2 Hardwicke S. winner in a pulsating finish fought out by two members of the town's major training establishments. Whereas Telescope started out with a lofty reputation, Second Step was nurtured along in

the minor leagues by the ever-patient Luca Cumani and was second on his belated juvenile debut at Yarmouth a month after the much-vaunted Stoute runner had already won his first pattern race in York's G2 Great Voltigeur.

Returning in 2014 to break his maiden over 10 furlongs at Newbury in May, Second Step was up to this trip thereafter and added a handicap at the latter venue before running third in a more competitive version at the Glorious Goodwood meeting at which his trainer had carved his early reputation. Drawn badly and subsequently left with too much to do when only seventh in a heritage handicap at Ascot in September, the bay delivered a late surge to fully justify the decision to step up to black-type company when winning the Listed Finale S. at The Curragh in October. Clear bottom of this quartet on ratings nonetheless, Second Step was aided by a truly run race with Odeon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) taking up the mantle in his familiar honest style. Settled into a comfortable rhythm in last with Andrea Atzeni in no hurry, he looked booked for a respectable second as Ryan Moore let the free-running Telescope cut loose approaching the quarter pole. Determined in pursuit as the favorite continued to pour it on, he responded to mainly hand riding to get to that rival in the shade of the post as the pair drew 18 lengths clear of Pether's Moon.

Atzeni was impressed. "He's a lovely, laid-back horse and although I thought Telescope had put the race to bed, I think my fella outstayed him in the end," he explained. "He'll probably go on any ground and is a typical Luca Cumani horse--they always improve with age." That trainer added, "He's done nothing but improve all his life and was very weak as a 2-year-old and early on as a 3-year-old. Gradually, strength has started to come into him and over the winter he made further improvement, so he is now a genuine group horse. I tend to let horses speak to me and I watch them and let them mature, so that when they are ready I push them a little bit more and slowly but surely, sometimes we get there."

Cumani added, "At the time he went clear, I thought Telescope was the winner and it was only when they started coming out of the dip that I thought my horse had a chance as Telescope had been keen early on. I think he prefers a little bit of cut in the ground, but he got away with it today. We'll look at Royal Ascot and see if the [June 20] G2 Hardwicke S. fits in, but long-term he could be one for the Melbourne Cup."

Telescope's conditioner, Sir Michael Stoute, is sticking to the plan of attempting to win back-to-back editions of the Hardwicke and told *PA Sport*, "It would have been nice if he'd have won, but he never runs a bad race. We'll take it step by step and I think we'll go back to Royal Ascot for the Hardwicke."

Formerly with Luca Cumani, Goldream was first tried in black-type company by his now-trainer Robert Cowell in the Listed Prix de Bonneval over 5 1/2 furlongs at Chantilly in October 2013 and flopped when ninth before reverting to handicaps. Winning over six furlongs on his 5-year-old bow at this meeting last May, the dark bay went on to take the five-furlong Shergar Cup Dash at Ascot before finishing fourth in Doncaster's prestigious Portland H. and second in another competitive affair at Haydock over that trip in September. Always close to the early pace racing hard against the fence, he was sent to the lead before the last quarter mile and was soon clear and out of danger.

"He's a grinder who went through the handicap system and is a good horse, but he has had to learn to properly sprint," Cowell commented. "The key to him is not to let him switch off at the back and get him on the bridle. In these sprints, you've got to be somewhere near the front." Connections are looking at the G2 Temple S. at Haydock May 23 and the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 16.

FONT OF WISDOM

Jim Bolger knows all there is to know about producing a Classic contender at a peak, and the master of Coolcullen is back at Newmarket on Sunday with a live hope for the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas in Godolphin's Lucida (Ire) (Shamardal). Runner-up to Cursory Glance (Distorted Humor) in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. over seven furlongs at The Curragh in mid-September, the bay was here 12 days later to

outbattle Fadhayyil (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}) in the G2 Rockwell S. over that trip. Only fifth when encountering rain-softened ground in the G1 Fillies' Mile over this course and distance in October, she is certain to appreciate the return to this lively surface.

"The Fillies' Mile was her only disappointing

run last season," jockey Kevin Manning told *PA Sport*. "You'd have to put it down to the ground; we did anyway. She was very impressive in beating Fadhayyil before that in the Rockfel. That day she was going away at the line and it looked like a mile would suit her, and she had no problems with the track. On that performance I wouldn't be worried about her over a mile. She's been working very well at home, we've been very pleased with her, and didn't feel that she needed to run in a trial. Jim tends to send one straight there if he thinks they are good enough."

Not Over For Hills...

Barry Hills staged a return to training in the sad circumstances of the death of his son, John, and a win for Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Fadhayyil would provoke an emotional outpouring for one of racing's most famous families. Still raw when second in the Rockwell, she has been at Newmarket for a racecourse gallop as Hills' 2009 winner Ghanaati (Giant's Causeway) did.

"Her form is there for all to see and we thought at the time she probably should have won the Rockfel," Angus Gold, the owner's racing manager, told *PA Sport*. "We felt she probably just pulled herself up in front through inexperience and Lucida, who has more experience and is a good filly, came and beat her. She had a gallop the other day and I know everyone in Lambourn is very pleased with her. Hopefully she's improved and we'll see what we can do."

has a speedier proposition than the norm for the stable. Coming off a Kempton maiden win in November to outpoint **Jellicle Ball (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury Apr. 18, the bay has one of the most progressive and unexposed profiles in an open-looking assembly for the 202nd renewal of this Classic. Another who

fits that bill is Rick Barnes' unbeaten Irish Rookie (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), who was two-for-two last term when scoring at 50-1 on debut and taking the Listed Montrose S. over this trip at the start of November. Trainer Martyn Meade is understandably wearing an air of confidence.

"She is in very good form and I'm pleased with the way she is shaping up," he explained. "She took quite a long time to come to herself early on last year and it wasn't until August that she started to shine a little bit. She was a leggy filly and that was the reason we left her until October, and although I thought initially about putting her away when she won first time out, she actually blossomed for that. She coped with the track really well and traveled well in the Montrose and although good-to-soft ground was perfect for her on that occasion, I think she'll cope with the faster ground and I don't have a worry about that. She is really looking more and more like a proper racehorse and she's done nothing wrong. I have to be pretty optimistic, even though it's a huge ask."

Two More For Coolmore...

In the absence of a leading contender from Ballydoyle, David Wachman is double-handed

representing Coolmore with Legatissimo (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Queen Nefertiti (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). The former sprang to prominence when winning Sunday's Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial S. over an extended nine furlongs at Gowran Park and will be staying on when the sprinting types flounder. 'TDN Rising Star' Queen Nefertiti has improvement to find on the form of her return third in a mile conditions event on Dundalk's Polytrack Apr. 24, but she showed striking class

when successful on debut over seven furlongs at Leopardstown last June and demands respect.

"Legatissimo won well last week. She's come out of the race fine and seems in good form so we'll give it a go," Wachman told *PA Sport*. "Queen Nefertiti ran just a few days before; she'd just started back, really, but she ran a nice little race and should come on for it."

LOOK WHO'S BACK

Surprising all when ending the unbeaten record of Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) in Longchamp's G1 Prix Ganay 12 months ago, Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) stages his comeback for the race on Sunday as the seemingly endless saga continues. Last seen finishing fourth in the Dec. 14 G1 Hong Kong Cup over 10 furlongs at Sha Tin, the 9-year-old must be losing some of his old luster, but he has become a law unto

himself since arriving center stage when taking the inaugural running of the G1 Champion S. at Ascot in October 2011. Facing France's most popular equine celebrity, who was also successful in this in April 2012,

is another veteran who has shown remarkable consistency. Having taken several months to bloom back on the track after his unsuccessful spell at stud, Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi Ire}) regained his old verve when second in the latest edition of the Champion S. as Cirrus des Aigles trailed in fifth. John Deer's triple Group 1-winning 7-year-old showed his class when annexing the 10-furlong G2 Prix d'Harcourt here despite reportedly being short of peak fitness Apr. 6. "He did very well to win first time out, as I thought he'd need the run and the ground was soft enough for him," trainer Roger Charlton told PA Sport. "It will be soft again, too. He showed all his old enthusiasm and ended up winning very nicely. That race is the natural trial for the Ganay and I would hope he improves for the run; I would expect him to actually, and he will even come on again for this, not fitness-wise but just because he is a horse who takes his racing very well." Freddy Head is looking to George Strawbridge's 4-year-old filly We Are (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) to upset the old brigade and it is intriguing that last year's G1 Prix d l'Opera heroine has been kept in training. "She seems in very good form," her trainer told PA Sport. "It's great that Mr Strawbridge likes to keep his older mares in training; in America it is common for them to race on at four and five and that is how he likes it."

Head recalled his charge's unfortunate luck last season: "She was very unlucky last year," he said. "She had the problem with her ovaries and it meant she missed three or four months right in the middle of the season. After that it was amazing that she could come back and win a Group 1. I'd like to take her to Royal Ascot for the [G1] Prince of Wales's S. and then we'll see."

and has wintered really well. Andre Fabre is confident that she will stay a mile and a quarter in the future, so nine furlongs should be no problem for her. It is a starting point for her campaign and will help us see where to go with her afterwards."

Sir Michael Stoute has saddled five winners of this race since 2007 and has

opted to send Khalid Abdullah's **Bragging** (Exchange Rate) up the road to represent Freemason Lodge this time. Upped from handicaps to take part in Doncaster's G3 Sceptre S. in September, the 4-year-old was second on that occasion and tackles an extra quarter mile on this comeback.

"Bragging improved through the ranks last year, winning a nice handicap at York before running really well in the Sceptre S.," the owner-breeder's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "She has done everything in a straightforward manner coming into the race. She was already quite a big scopey filly and she gave us the impression last year that a mile and a quarter would be in reach." **Cont. p23**

Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Coronation S. winner Rizeena (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) has never been entirely happy on this terrain, and it was on this card 12 months ago that she ran a career low when seventh in the G1 1000 Guineas. Last seen finishing runner-up in the G1 Matron S. over a mile at Leopardstown in September, she will strip fitter for the outing, according to trainer Clive Brittain.

"I am happy the owners have decided to go here, as she is in good form," he told *PA Sport*. "We made the mistake last year of not giving her a race before the Guineas. She was fit, but a bit flat. She then proved at Ascot that she could have won the Guineas. Her main target is to try and win at Royal Ascot for a third year and I am taking no chances with her--from past experience she has shown she will be better for having a race."

#### FRIEND GETS NEW FOE

After beating up on the best local milers since November, Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) faces a fresh challenge--on paper, at a minimum--in the form of Hong Kong Derby hero Luger (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}) in Sunday's G1 Champions Mile at Sha Tin.

Able Friend, runner-up in the 2014 Derby, has since

cut back in distance to become the world's joint-highest rated horse. The strapping chestnut, a doppelganger for Dortmund in terms of his physical stature, ran away from the competition in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile in December and was equally condescending in

adding the G1 Stewards' Cup the following month. Closest on that occasion was Beauty Flame (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) and it was that rival who again filled the runner-up spot behind Able Friend in the G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup over 1400 meters Mar. 15 and again when in receipt of five pounds from the champ in the Chairman's Trophy back at Sunday's distance. Able Friend was slightly disappointing when second to South Africa's Variety Club (SAf) (Var) in this event last year, but connections are expecting no such result this time around while prepping for the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot.

"We can't be happier--he's going into the race absolutely primed for the occasion," trainer John Moore commented. "Joao's smile [Thursday] morning is never-ending--it stretches from here to Beijing and back. We're going in to the race with high hopes of him repeating what he's already done in the past."

Luger has won seven of his 10 career appearances and overcame a brutal trip before coming away to a 3/4-length victory in the Derby Mar. 15. He defeated Class 2 rivals at this trip two starts back and took a pass on the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup in favor of engaging Able Friend here.

Victorious in the 2013 Champions Mile and third in defense of that title 12 months ago, **Dan Excel (Ire)** (Shamardal) proceeded to add the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup two weeks later and is set to top off his preparations for that race Sunday. He exits a decent fourth behind Able Friend in the Chairman's Trophy and has definite place claims here while still an unlikely winner.

Paul Snowden paid credit to Stonestreet, and Miracles of Life herself, in the aftermath of the win.

"For her to come back here and do what she did is fantastic," he said. "It's testament to her character, the way she found the line today. Full credit to the owners; they basically said do what you want. If she wants to be there, all good and well, if not she can go to stud."



Turf Writer Dan Farley Passes Away:

Dan Farley, an award-winning turf writer and longtime member and former president of the National Turf Writers Association, passed away Friday, in Mechanicsville, VA. He was 72.

Farley, a native of Princeton, IN and a graduate of Indiana State University, started his career with The Blood-Horse in 1971 and then served as a staff writer, managing editor and editor of The Thoroughbred Record. He covered American racing for Pacemaker International for three years in the early 1980s and then worked for the International Racing Bureau.

He served as president of the National Turf Writers Association from 1982 to 1986 and he became the American correspondent for the *Racing Post* when it began publication in 1986.

Farley received the Walter Haight Award for career excellence in turf writing from the NTWA in 2009.

He retired in 2013, although he still contributed blogs and columns to the Racing Post. Farley was an avid racing fan and covered hundreds of Triple Crown and Breeders' Cup races as well as numerous other major stakes in this country and abroad, many of them while requiring a wheelchair for mobility as a result of Muscular Dystrophy.

"This was his favorite time of year and he was really excited about this year's Kentucky Derby," his wife Betsy said Friday night.

Farley is survived by his wife of 49 years, Betsy; his daughters Alison and Carrie; and his grandson Noah.

A memorial service will be held at a future date in Lexington. In lieu of flowers, the family requests that donations be made to the FSH Society (Fascioscapulohumeral Muscular Dystrophy), 450 Bedford Street, Lexington, MA 02420 or through www.fshsociety.org.
