MISTER BAILEYS AILING Mister Baileys

(Robellino), winner of last year's 2000 Guineas, appears to be suffering from the life-threatening ailment known as grass sickness. The colt, currently at Britain's National Stud in Newmarket and due to begin his career at stud, is showing signs of the illness, which affects a horse's nervous system and frequently proves fatal. Miles Littlewort, chief executive at the stud, said, "The vets are treating him...it is serious, but how serious we don't know. You can diagnose grass sickness only by post-mortem, but he is showing symptoms."

CHARLES TOWN HORSEMEN FORM

ASSOCIATION Horsemen at West Virginia's Charles Town Races vesterday announced the formation of a new association and called upon Charles Town officials and other members of the racing industry to meet with the group in order to formulate a "plan of action" for the troubled track. According to Jim Palmer, president of the new Charles Town Horsemen's Association, "We're ready to sit down with all interested parties to try to come up with some way to get this track open again." Track President D. Keith Wagner, Union of Service Employees President Joe Farrie and Jockeys' Guild representative Todd Dupuis have indicated their willingness to work with the new association. In response to a request from the horsemen, Wagner has agreed to open the track for training three afternoons per week for two weeks at no cost to the association as an "expression of support" for the group's efforts.

COOLMORE EXPANDS AUSTRALIAN

OPERATION Ireland's Coolmore Stud, which has been a force in the Australian breeding industry since 1989 when it entered an arrangement with the publicly quoted Arrowfield Group to jointly purchase stallions and to stand stallions on a dual hemisphere basis between Coolmore and Australia's Arrowfield Stud, will expand its interest in the Southern Hemisphere in 1996. Coolmore, now sole owner of Arrowfield Stud, will take complete charge of the New South Wales operation beginning next year; plans for the facility have not yet been announced. The Arrowfield Group will again stand Danehill and other Coolmore stallions during its '95 breeding season.

Dove Hunt (Danzig), winner of the GIII Pilgrim S, and GIII Laurel Futurity as a two-year-old, worked five furlongs in 1:01 at Gulfstream Monday, prepping for Saturday's feature event. "He had a dynamite last eighth and galloped out in 1:14 3/5," said trainer Neil Howard. The four-year-old, who took three of his six starts as a juvenile but ran only twice last year, was off the board for only the second time in his career last out, finishing ninth in the Woodchopper S. at the Fair Grounds in his second start off a year layoff. "He had a rough trip...I don't feel he got a shot to run his race," said Howard. Also pointing for the Appleton is Presently (Affirmed), two-time Eclipse winner Flawlessly's full brother. The four-year-old, twice graded stakes-placed, was on the board in 11 of his 16 starts last year. "Everyone thinks he should be doing better than he is," said his Hall of Fame conditioner, Allen Jerkens, "but I think he's doing all right. He can't help it if his sister was a champion." Trainer Burt Kessinger will likely send out Lotus Pool (Spectacular Bid) for the race. The eight-year-old, a threetime stakes winner in '92 but with just 10 starts and two wins since, has earned \$614,231 while racing in Europe and the U.S. "Lotus Pool is doing very well, and he likes the turf course down here," said Kessinger. "We'll work him (today) and if he works well, he'll run in the Appleton."
