BIG GAINS AT AQUEDUCT WITH NEW

SIMULCAST FORMAT Total handle showed increases of almost a half-million dollars on the opening day of Gulfstream simulcasting at Aqueduct yesterday, with the gains, which came strictly on the live product, attributed to a revamped presentation of the combined program. While last year's seven live and five simulcast races were presented as one blended product, the 1995 version offers nine live races, the simulcast picture of Gulfstream races three through nine, and betting with no picture on races 1, 2, 10 and 11. The signal no longer switches from track to track; monitors stay tuned to either Aqueduct or Gulfstream for the duration of the card. While the handle on the Gulfstream portion of the program was off slightly, to \$524,659 from \$579,522 last year, on-track handle on the live card jumped from \$984,544 to \$1,523,728.85. On-track attendance climbed from 5,791 to 6,368, while total systemwide handle for the combined card was \$5,863,509.36, up from \$4,246,698 in '94. "We're delighted with the overall figures--to be up 10% in attendance and 50% in handle on the Aqueduct races," said Steven Crist, NYRA's Director of Communications and Development. "I think that what went wrong last year was that the presentation of a single product which switched back and forth managed to annoy both the people who wanted to play Aqueduct and Gulfstream. The idea this year was to separate the two products and to let the people who want to concentrate on Florida do that, but to devote the majority of the space to the live product. The word of mouth I heard just walking around today was that people really preferred it."

GULFSTREAM SENDS ITS SIGNAL TO

CANADA The Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association has agreed to allow Gulfstream Park to simulcast its signal into Canada. Originally, the horsemen refused permission for Canada to take the races unless Gulfstream made the money earmarked for purses available for two-year-old racing during the Hialeah and Calder meets. Under the new agreement, the horsemen and Gulfstream will split the revenue from Canadian simulcasting. FHBPA Vice President Scott Savin said, "We expect to increase purses by \$200,000 over the Gulfstream meeting."

Mr. Greeley, coming off a layoff of nearly 2 months, was victorious in a 6 furlong Aqueduct allowance in his last trip to the post. Stepping up against graded stakes company here, he bobbled slightly at the start, then was rushed to the front and went wire-to-wire for a 6 1/4-length triumph as the 3-5 favorite. "He got off slowly because they tailed him in the gate and he doesn't like it," said winning jockey Julie Krone. "Once he got out and started to run he really rolled. He's a free runner. Nick (trainer Zito) told me when he starts to run just let him go and that's what I did." Zito said the colt will start next in the 7-furlong January 28 Hutcheson. Make Me, the longest shot in the 7horse field at 40-1, was 2nd, while Sea Emperor, winner of 2 of the 3 divisions of the Florida Stallion Stakes, stepped off the turf to take 3rd. The winner is 1/2 to Majestic Legend (SW, \$200,853, by His Majesty) and Talltalelady (MGSP, \$208,968, by Naskra).

RETAMA PARK KIOSK A SUCCESS Retama Park's first marketing venture, a kiosk at Rolling Oaks Mall in San Antonio, Texas, closed Dec. 31, 1994 with sales totaling over \$40,000. The mall kiosk served as the official merchandise and information outlet for Retama Park, the \$79 million racetrack under construction in northeast San Antonio. The kiosk, which opened November 15, featured a variety of Retama Park logo wearables and racing information. The most popular wearables were logo caps and T-shirts. Over 675 caps and 500 T-shirts were sold. However, the "numberone" item purchased by shoppers was "Track Packs," a booklet of five admission tickets for the price of four. A total of 1,095 packs were sold. bringing admission sales to 5,470 well prior to the April 7, 1995 opening date. "The kiosk was much more successful than we imagined it would be," said Joe Straus III, Retama Park marketing director. "It's astonishing that we have sold almost 5,500 admission tickets already and we're still three months from opening our doors. This is a good indication that the people of South Texas are excited about racing coming back to this area."

SEA CADET TO PAYSON STUD Hall of Fame trainer Ron McAnally confirmed yesterday that Verne Winchell's Sea Cadet (Bolger) has run his last race and will leave Southern California Friday for Lexington, Kentucky to begin his career as a stallion at Payson Stud. The reported stud fee will be \$3,500. A winner of 10 of 29 career starts for earnings of \$1,769,650, the seven-year-old Sea Cadet recorded Grade I victories in the 1992 Donn H., Meadowlands Cup and Gulfstream Park H.

Last year's Eclipse Award-winning Champion Older
Male Bertrando (Skywalker), sixth and last in
Monday's \$107,900 San Gabriel H. at Santa Anita,
might race one more time, owner/breeder Ed

run in one more race, but there's nothing firm yet,"
Nahem said. "The only thing for sure is that he has
to be at River Edge (in Solvang, California) by Feb.
1 for the start of the breeding season."

PLANTAGENET TO STUD DUTY IN GREECE Mike Akers, president of the Lexington, Kentucky-based Dapple Bloodstock, announced yesterday the sale of Plantagenet (Forty Niner) for stud duty in Greece. The five-year-old stallion, who is out of the Grade I-winning Danzig mare Contredance, arrived in Greece December 20. Plantagenet, a four-time allowance winner of \$89,070 at Belmont and Gulfstream Park, finished out of the money only once in 11 career starts.
