The purse for the GI Kentucky Oaks has been increased by \$50,000, up to \$300,000-added. "The stakes sponsorship program is the strongest in track history, and offers valuable support from a number of national firms with Louisville connections. This is definitely the most comprehensive stakes program in Churchill Downs history," said Churchill Vice President, Racing, Don Richardson.

DON ORLANDO NAMED NYRA TRACK

SUPERINTENDENT Don Orlando, the assistant to recently retired New York Racing Association Track Superintendent Joe King and a member of the NYRA track maintenance team since 1962, has been promoted to the position of track superintendent for Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga, it was announced yesterday. Orlando, a native of New York, will be in charge of NYRA's four dirt tracks, two training tracks, six turf courses, two jogging tracks and one steeplechase training course.

MARYLAND HOME WAGERING TO BEGIN

BY MARCH 1 Officials of the Maryland Jockey Club and On Demand Services reported Friday that a Demonstration Suite for the interactive wagering system will be operational at Laurel Park by February 15, and in-home testing with 25 Baltimore County residents will begin by March 1. The Maryland Racing Commission unanimously approved the Phase I testing; the Maryland Jockey Club is currently finalizing the members of the test group.
