**ECLIPSE AWARDS ANNOUNCED** The Eclipse Award winners for 1994 were announced during a press conference yesterday, and there were no real surprises among the 15 categories listed. The equine winners are: **Flanders** (Seeking the Gold), Two-year-old Filly; **Timber Country** (Woodman), Two-year-old Colt; **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold), Three-year-old Filly; **Holy Bull** (Great Above), Three-year-old Colt; **Sky Beauty** (Blushing Groom {Fr}), Older Mare; **The Wicked North** (Far North), Older Horse; **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {Fr}), Turf Horse; **Hatoof** (Irish River {Fr}), Turf Mare; **Cherokee Run** (Runaway Groom), Sprinter; and **Warm Spell** (Northern Baby), Steeple-chaser. Flanders was the only unanimous choice among the 247 voters from the Thoroughbred Racing Associations, *Daily Racing Form* and National Turf Writers' Association; Holy Bull was named on top on 240 of the 247 ballots. The closest race was that for Champion Older Horse; while The Wicked North was the choice of the *Daily Racing Form*, the TRA placed him in a tie for second behind Colonial Affair and the NTWA had The Wicked North in front of Colonial Affair by only two votes. The 1994 Horse of the Year will be announced at the Eclipse Awards dinner in Washington D.C. Jan. 27, which will be televised live on ESPN. The finalists for the award are Paradise Creek, Flanders, Heavenly Prize and the expected winner, Holy Bull. Also recognized with Eclipse Awards for their achievements last year were: **W.T. Young**, breeder; **John Franks**, owner; **D. Wayne Lukas**, trainer; **Mike Smith**, jockey; and **Dale Beckner**, apprentice jockey. Franks and Lukas were each being honored for the fourth time; Franks and Smith, who broke his own record for most stakes wins by a jockey with 67 last year, were repeat winners from 1993. Said Lukas, who also was named champion trainer in 1985, '86 and '87, "This was a rollercoaster year. Back in January, you couldn't have predicted that things would come together like they did. I'm very, very happy for our entire organization, and I'm extremely happy that Mr. Young was recognized as the top breeder. That was the highlight for me." Young, the breeder of '93 GI winners Flanders, Harlan, Sardula and Tabasco Cat, said, "This year has been one climax after another, starting with the Preakness."

### Monday, Aqueduct:

**AQUEDUCT H.-GIII, \$75,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/16m**  
Trainer Mike Hushion will send out a pair of his top contenders, **Boom Towner** (Obligato) and **Unreal Mot** (Unreal Zeal). "Boom Towner worked three-quarters this morning and went in about 1:16 (NYRA clockers caught him in 1:15.83, breezing)," Hushion said Wednesday. "Unreal Mot just ran so he doesn't need any works before the race. Both of them are doing just fine. Unreal Mot will probably be on the lead and Boom Towner will lay close to the pace. We hope they both run their races, but we always have high expectations with Boom Towner." Owner/trainer Murray Garren will also send out his dynamic duo, **Federal Funds** (Settlement Day) and **Jacksonport** (Vigors). "Both horses will run Monday and they are doing fine," said Garren. "I plan on working them three-eighths Saturday." Another scheduled competitor is Jose Martin-trainee **Key Contender** (Fit to Fight). "He breezed five-eighths (Tuesday) and went in 1:00 1/5," Martin said. "He came out of the work just fine and we're looking for a big effort from him Monday." Other possible starters include **Won Song** (Air Forbes One), **Country Sky** (Country Pine), **Danzig's Dance** (Hold Your Peace), **Golden Larch** (Slew o' Gold), **More to Tell** (Moro) and **Serious Spender** (Seattle Slew).

### Sunday, Santa Anita:

**EL ENCINO S.-GII, \$100,000a, 4yo, f, 1 1/16m**  
Bill Thomas's **Klassy Kim** (Silent Screen), runner-up in the GII La Brea S. in her last outing Dec. 28, worked a half-mile in :50 4/5 Thursday around the dogs on a sloppy Santa Anita track. Other confirmed starters for the El Encino include **Diane's Halo** (Sunny's Halo), Solis and **Twice The Vice** (Vice Regent), Delahoussaye. Considered possible for the race are **Tricky Code** (Lost Code) and **Phone Chatter** (Phone Trick).

Reporting on the progress of the newly crowned two-year-old filly champ Flanders, Young added, "I think the odds are that she won't run again, but we'll wait and see what she looks like this summer. We wouldn't want to race her again if she couldn't come back with a full head of steam, but at this time I'm not ready to say she is retired."

**KEENELAND WRAP-UP** Keeneland's January Horses of All Ages Sale ended Thursday with gross sales up 29 percent and the average up six percent from last year. Keeneland sold 1,032 horses during the four-day sale for \$19,383,600, an average of \$18,783. Last year, 849 horses brought a total of \$15,027,900. The average was \$17,701. Top price during Thursday's final session was \$70,000 for multiple stakes-winner **Strong and Steady**, a five-year-old broodmare prospect by Steady Growth--Apalachian Affair (Apalachee). Glenn Sikura was listed as the buyer of the mare, who was consigned by Hill 'N' Dale Sales Agency. Keeneland sold 234 horses Thursday for a gross of \$1,898,700 and an average of \$8,114.

### EUROPEAN BREEDERS' CUP PROPOSED A

European Breeders' Cup race meeting, based on the format which has proved so successful in America, may be up and running by next summer. The fixture, which would be rotated among the major European racing nations, could feature as many as five Group One events and have a prize-money fund of around £2 million. Such a plan was given the go-ahead Wed. by the European Pattern Committee. But leading officials stressed that much work still needs to be done, especially on the score of funding, if the idea was to take shape in time for 1996. Rhydian Morgan-Jones, chairman of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association which has been approached about the possibility of raising £500,000 among its members, said, "If a properly conceived plan were presented to us, our breeders might well be receptive to the idea of a levy on foals, but we need to see a proposal first." A formal discussion document, believed to suggest Germany as the first country to stage the fixture, will be presented to a meeting of European racing authorities and EBF representatives at the end of February.

### HOLY BULL BOOSTS OLYMPIC HANDICAP PURSE

The Olympic H., to be run Sunday, Jan. 22 at Gulfstream Park, will have a value of \$100,000 guaranteed if **Holy Bull** (Great Above) is a starter, as expected. The announcement was made Thursday by Director of Racing Robert D. Umphrey. The seven-furlong Olympic will remain at \$50,000 guaranteed if Holy Bull is not a starter. Umphrey listed such noted speedsters as **Patton** (Lord at War {ARG}), **Birdonthewire** (Proud Birdie), **Sweet Beast** (D.J. Trump), **Evil Bear** (Medieval Man), **Virginia Rapids**

(Riverman), **Wallenda** (Gulch), **Exclusive Praline** (Ecliptical) and **Golden Pro** (Distinctive Pro) among the likely opponents to Holy Bull in the Olympic.

### GARDEN STATE PARK OPENS TONIGHT

Live Thoroughbred racing returns to New Jersey tonight with the kickoff of a 76-night meet at Garden State Park. The \$25,000 Alma North H. will serve as the feature on the opening night program. Post time for the first race will be 7:35 p.m. Garden State will operate three nights a week, Thursdays through Saturdays, in January and then switch to four nights a week, Wednesdays through Saturdays, in February. "We're hoping for good things this year and that starts with catching a major break in the weather," said General Manager Richard E. Orbann, after recalling that 16 racing dates had to be cancelled last season because of ice, cold, snow, rain and slick traveling conditions. The Garden State meet ends the night of May 27 with the running of the \$150,000 Jersey Derby.
