CHRB CONCLUDES SCOPOLAMINE HEARINGS

The California Horse Racing Board yesterday issued a ruling on the final hearing for the Scopolamine positives from last spring, fining trainer Bill Shoemaker \$500 and disqualifying his horse, Forum Club, from purse monies earned when he finished fourth in the fifth race at Santa Anita April 7. Stewards Ingrid Fermin, Darrel McHargue and David Samuel also issued a statement on the Scopolamine cases which read, in part, "All of the defendants argued that jimson weed was the source of the Scopolamine. Testimony also revealed, however, that there were other possible sources for the drug--i.e., pharmaceuticals. Expert testimony substantiated that the laboratories could not differentiate between pharmaceutical Scopolamine and that which came from jimson weed. Scopolamine is a central nervous system depressant that...could alter the performance of a horse. If in the opinion of the stewards the cases were the result of a licensee attempting to intentionally alter the outcome of a race by the administration of Scopolamine, this Board's penalties would have consisted of suspensions and substantial fines. By establishing the argument that jimson weed was a possible source for the positive findings, the trainers avoided suspension and were levied 'lighter' fines."

KRONE ON THE MEND--AGAIN Jockey Julie Krone, injured in a spill at Gulfstream Park Friday, underwent a successful operation yesterday at Hollywood Memorial Hospital to repair a broken bone in the area of the pinky finger of her left hand. Because there was also minor ligament damage in the hand, Krone was placed in a cast extending to her elbow; the latest estimate is that she will be out about six weeks. "She has a broken hand with multiple fractures in one bone," said Dr. Marc Hammerman. "It looks fine. There are ligament injuries in the wrist in two different places, but they should heal fine with treatment. The cast will stay on about three to six weeks, depending on how it heals." Though bedeviled by bad luck in recent years, Krone was upbeat yesterday and refused to be frustrated by this latest setback. "For some reason, this didn't do anything to me," she said. "I still love horses, and I love being in the winner's circle."

TEXAS FAMILY BACKS LONE STAR The Trammell Crow family, already the largest investor in the Lone Star Jockey Club, reaffirmed their commitment to Texas racing Friday by proposing to be responsible for the restructuring and securing of all finances for the Grand Prairie racetrack. The Crow family would infuse \$10 million into the Class 1 project, half of which would be placed in escrow. The proposal, which would in effect give the Crows control of the project, must be approved by the limited partners in Lone Star. An intricate outline of the proposal has been sent to the partners, and a February 1 response is requested. Representatives of the Crow family stress that the offer is simply a measure to advance the cause of first-class racing in Texas and to move the Lone Star project forward. The proposal comes as a needed boost to the Lone Star organization, which recently lost the support, due to poor health, of partner Clarence Scharbauer. Scharbauer had intended to invest \$5 million into the north Texas track.

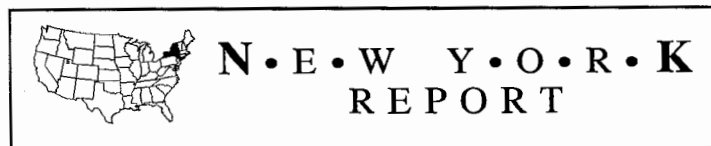
