MARYLAND'S INTERNATIONAL TURF FESTIVAL CANCELLED IN 1995 The Maryland Jockey Club management and the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association Inc. yesterday announced a new agreement regarding the 1995 Maryland stakes schedule. The agreement provides that open and overnight stakes will be capped at 18.5 percent of total purse monies if management and the MTHA agree on the stakes schedule, and 17 percent if they do not. Most significantly, the agreement provides that the International Turf Festival will be cancelled for 1995, and that the monies previously contributed by the purse account toward the International Turf Festival will be put into overnight purses. "The MTHA has long felt that the International Turf Festival was an extremely expensive undertaking and resulted in a substantial amount of Maryland purse money going to people from out-of-state," said MTHA President Richard Hoffberger. "Last year the purse account was charged almost \$900,000 for the Turf Festival. Putting this money into overnight purses will add almost three percent to the total funds available for overnights." Joe De Francis, President of the Maryland Jockey Club, added, "We are willing to try this on a one-year experimental basis. We feel that the long-range future of the event lies in Virginia, and therefore will use this opportunity to plan and strategize how we can best utilize this group of races in Virginia."

CHEROKEE RUN WORKS TOWARD RETURN

Cherokee Run (Runaway Groom), last year's Eclipse Award-winning sprinter, is rounding back into form. The five-year-old covered a half-mile in :50 yesterday morning at Calder, and is expected to make his 1995 debut in the \$100,000 Gulfstream Park Sprint Championship at seven furlongs March 10. "He just went an easy half-mile," said his trainer Frank Alexander. "When he is not doing anything, he gets to feeling good. He has a lot of class." Cherokee Run has not been to the races since winning the Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs November 5. "He won the Breeders' Cup after a layoff," said Alexander. "And he won his first race last year after the layoff. So he runs good fresh."

Saturday, Gulfstream Park: HUTCHESON S.-GII, \$75,000, 3vo, 7f Trainer Michael A. Mollica purchased \$95,000 salestopper Valid Wager (Valid Appeal) for owners Beverly and Robert B. Lewis at the OBS Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training last March. "He had faultless conformation," recalled Mollica. Three-year-old Valid Wager lasted by a head for his first stakes victory in the onemile GIII California Juvenile at Bay Meadows Dec. 26. "He's a good middle-distance horse," said Mollica. "from seven furlongs to a mile. His class will carry him 1 1/16-miles in the Fountain of Youth, depending on who shows up. He can eyeball a horse and keep him at bay." Valid Wager's greatest challenge is expected to come from Mr. Greeley (Gone West), 6 1/4length winner of the GIII Spectacular Bid S. at six furlongs on Gulfstream's opening day, January 4. Western Echo (Eastern Echo) is "fit and ready" to run this Saturday, according to trainer Bud Delp, but the GIII Laurel Futurity winner could be temporarily sidelined. "He has some crud down in his lungs," Delp explained yesterday. "There is no temperature, but there is a slight infection. I've talked to several

Delp. "We'll scope the horse after his work Wednesday and see how he is doing," Delp said. "If it is not any better, we won't enter." Trainer Milton Wolfson confirmed yesterday that he plans on starting **Bet Your Bucks** (Buckaroo) in the Hutcheson. In his most recent start Jan. 9 at Gulfstream, Bet Your Bucks finished third in a seven-furlong allowance. "He ran a big race," said Wolfson. "He was blocked in on the rail and he had some difficulty in the stretch. Once he got loose, he came running. He impressed me enough to give him a chance this Saturday." Earlie Fires will return to the irons.

Saturday, Santa Anita:

PALOS VERDES H.-GIII, \$150,000a, 4vo/up, 6f Trainer Derek Meredith is considering the Palos Verdes for his Breeders' Cup champion Cardmania (Cox's Ridge). "We'll see what the next few days bring," said Meredith. If Cardmania runs, Eddie Delahoussaye will have the mount. Cardmania finished fourth behind Palos Verdes hopeful Softshoe Sure Shot (Bolger) in the GII San Carlos H. Jan. 14. Both horses are nine years old. Subtle Trouble (Native Prospector), third in the San Carlos after setting the pace into the stretch, worked a half-mile in a bullet :46 2/5 Sat, morning over Santa Anita's fast main track. "We're pointing to the race," said trainer Mel Stute. "His work was very good, and we know he can handle an off track." Regular rider Paul Atkinson will be in the irons. Isitingood (Crusader Sword) drilled five furlongs at Santa Anita Sunday in 1:00 handily, while Demaloot Demashoot (Bold Ruckus) covered the same distance at Hollywood Park in :59 3/5. Trainer Ron McAnally said the participation of D'hallevant (Ogygian) depends on the weather. Trainer Rodney Rash stated Saturday that Malibu winner Powis Castle (Rare Brick) is "50-50" for the race. Other probable starters include multiple stakes-winners Concept Win (Manila), Stevens; Gundaghia (Ole Bob Bowers), Flores; Rotsaluck (Rajab), Gary Baze.
