PARISELLA FINED FOR TURN-DOWNS Trainer John Parisella was fined \$2,500 and placed on probation for the rest of the calendar year by the New York Racing Association for using turn-down shoes on Cocoa Lad, who finished first in the third race at Aqueduct Jan. 21. Cocoa Lad was disqualified from purse money. Parisella, who has admitted to the offense, said he would not appeal the ruling but declined to comment further yesterday. "If there are any more (incidents), it could mean further fines or suspensions," said NYRA Steward Dick Hamilton when asked to clarify the probationary aspect of the ruling. Turn-downs, the controversial shoes which had become popular with New York trainers for the better traction they offered, were banned in October, 1993 by NYRA, which cited the damage they caused to the racing surface and the potential harm to jockeys in the event of a spill.

BALANCHINE ASCOT BOUND Sheikh Mohammed's dual Classic winner **Balanchine** (Storm Bird), still enjoying the winter sun in Dubai, is scheduled to have her first race of 1995 in the Group 2 Prince of Wales S. at Royal Ascot in June. The four-year-old chestnut filly, officially Europe's leading three-year-old after successes in last year's G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Irish Derby, has now fully recovered from the attack of colic which curtailed her 1994 campaign. Kentucky-bred Balanchine spent the whole of last winter in the Middle East before returning to Britain in time to finish a close second in the 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, her only defeat of the year.

SAN ANTONIO NEXT FOR DEL MAR DENNIS Trudy McCaffery and John Toffan's **Del Mar Dennis** (Dixieland Band), wire-to-wire winner of Sunday's GII San Pasqual H., is likely to make his next start in the \$250,000 San Antonio H. Sunday, Feb. 12, trainer Paco Gonzalez said. If he runs in the 1 1/8-mile San Antonio, Del Mar Dennis will skip the \$1 million Santa Anita H. March 11. "The timing for the (Santa Anita H.) would be perfect," said Gonzalez. "He'd be fresh and fit. But the San Antonio looks like a much easier race. We'll wait until we see the nominations, of course, but it just looks like the better race for us."

Sunday, Santa Anita:

SANTA YNEZ BREEDERS' CUP S.-GII, \$100,000a, 3yo, f, 7f

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas categorized Robert and Beverly Lewis's **Serena's Song** (Rahy) as probable for the Santa Ynez. A winner of four of 10 starts and \$597,335, **Serena's Song** is a multiple Grade I winner with triumphs in the Oak Leaf S. and Hollywood Starlet to her credit. She also finished a game second to Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Flanders in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Lukas said he also plans to enter Overbrook Farm's MSW **Ocean Cat** (Storm Cat) in the race, but added that track conditions could change plans for both runners. The probable field also includes **Call Now** (Wild Again), Solis; **Cat's Cradle** (Flying Paster), Antley; **Denim Yenem** (Ogygian), Black; and **Texinadress** (Copelan), no rider.

AUTOTOTE WINS NEW CONTRACT IN DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Autotote Corporation announced yesterday it has been awarded a new contract in the Dominican Republic as well as a contract extension in Puerto Rico. Both contracts, under which Autotote will provide parimutuel wagering systems, facilities management and related services, are for 10 years and provide for payment to Autotote as a percentage of the wagers processed. In the Dominican Republic, Autotote will implement an on-track and off-track system for V. Centenario, a new racetrack facility set to open in April in Santo Domingo. In Puerto Rico, Autotote has received an extension for its parimutuel contract with El Comandante Racetrack, an Autotote customer since 1976. Gerald Lawrence, Vice President of Autotote, said, "These contracts strengthen Autotote's position in key foreign markets. The Caribbean, Central and South America have been strong markets for Autotote and we intend to vigorously pursue opportunities in these areas."

RUSSELL BAZE RECORDS HIS FIRST FIVE-WIN DAY OF 1995

Jockey Russell Baze, who won five races on a card three times during the 1994 Golden Gate Fields meeting, wasted little time accomplishing the feat at the 1995 stand. Last Sunday, the third day of the 1995 meeting, Baze swept the first four races en route to finishing the afternoon five-for-seven. The Golden Gate and Northern California record for most wins in a single program is seven, which Baze set April 16, 1992. Baze, who has led the nation in wins the past three years (totalling 415 in 1994, 410 in 1993 and 433 in 1992), is one of only two jockeys in Thoroughbred racing history to top the 400-win mark for three consecutive years.

RETAMA PARK NAMES ADDITIONAL STAFF

Retama Park, the \$79 million racetrack currently under construction in northeast San Antonio, Texas, announced yesterday the addition of several staff members. Tom Foose has been named the track's director of security, Doug Ousterman was appointed director of parking, Dale Ledgess was designated as stall superintendent and Kevin Quigley will be the backside maintenance superintendent. "The addition of these talented individuals to our team proves that we are committed to assembling the best management staff possible at Retama Park," said Retama Park President Bob Quigley. Retama Park will open for its inaugural Thoroughbred meeting April 7.

THE JOCKEY CLUB NOW MAILING 1995

LIVE FOAL REPORTS The Jockey Club is now mailing Live Foal/No Foal Reports for 1995 foals to the owners of mares that were reported bred in 1994. These reports should be completed and returned to The Jockey Club's Registration Services Department as soon as possible after the birth of a foal this year. This mailing is a few weeks later than usual to accommodate improvements being made to The Jockey Club's computer system. The Live Foal/No Foal Reports have been redesigned to take advantage of these improvements and make the reporting process even easier than before.

STEVE SHARP TO HEAD ADVERTISING FOR

VINERY Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery announced yesterday that Steve Sharp has been hired to be the Midway, Kentucky farm's Director of Advertising and Development. In his new position, Sharp will oversee the promotion of Vinery's stallion and commercial sales divisions. For the past 12 years, Sharp has been Vice President of Pope Advertising. Prior to that, he was Advertising Production Manager for The Blood-Horse magazine. "Steve's experience and expertise in the Thoroughbred industry, specifically advertising, makes him an important addition to our management team, and as such, his input will be consequential to all aspects of the operations at Vinery," said Ben Walden Jr.

BACHARACH IS TOBA OWNER OF THE

MONTH The final Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association Owner of the Month award for 1994 has been awarded to Burt Bacharach. A singer and songwriter, Bacharach has campaigned numerous stakes winners including No No, Heartlight No. One and Soul of the Matter. Bacharach relies almost entirely on homebreds for his racing stock, usually listing Blue Seas Music, his company, as breeder. During the month of December, horses owned by Bacharach made five starts and hit the board each time. The highlight came when his juvenile colt **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms) won the GI \$500,000 Hollywood Futurity Dec. 18 at Hollywood Park.

Racing just behind frontrunner Dixie Pearl through the first 1/4-mile, she then slipped through on the rail under Kent Desormeaux and remained in front the rest of the way. "I think she probably had a little too much class for these," said Desormeaux. "The good thing about her race was that she was just staying in front of the other horse (Dixie Pearl). She'd open up a half on the other one, then she'd slow down. The other one would try her again, but my filly wouldn't let her by. So she was just going as fast as she had to." Softshoe Sure Shot (Bolger), who would have become the only 9-year-old in Santa Anita Park history to win two stakes at his age, had he run and won Saturday's Palos Verdes H., will skip the race. Winner of the GII San Carlos H. Jan. 14 by a half-length in a hard drive, Softshoe Sure Shot will try to make history later in the meeting. "That race was real hard on him," said trainer Bruce Headley. "It took a lot out of him and this would be too close under present conditions. His best races are usually run about five weeks apart."

Trainer Richard Mandella said **Best Pal (*Habitory)** came out of his fourth-place finish in Sunday's GII San Pasqual H. none the worse for wear and still has the \$1 million Santa Anita H. on his schedule. "He came out fine," Mandella said of the all-time leading active money-earner with \$5,144,645. "He didn't run quite as well as I thought he would. The pace didn't help him. The Big 'Cap is still very much in the picture. We haven't decided yet whether we'd try the San Antonio (Feb. 12), but there's probably a good chance we'll just train him up to it (Big 'Cap)."
