GARY STEVENS TO RIDE IN HONG KONG

Southern California-based jockey Gary Stevens has accepted an offer to become the contract rider for trainer Stephen Leung in Hong Kong and will depart for that city Wednesday. Stevens' contract in Hong Kong begins Feb. 6 and continues through June 11, at which point he will have an option to renew the contract for the following season, beginning in October 1995. In any event, Stevens, 31, said he plans to return to the United States for the Del Mar meeting from July through mid-September. "I'm excited about going to Hong Kong," said Stevens. "It's a new adventure for me and I think it could open up some new avenues for me as far as international racing goes." Aside from providing Stevens with a guaranteed salary, the contract includes several perks such as a house, maid, car and all expenses. Racing in Hong Kong is conducted just twice weekly, with six races Wednesdays and eight Sundays. "That will be one of my toughest adjustments," Stevens said. "It's going to take some getting used to. I plan to play a lot of golf, lift a lot of weights and do some travelling." The contract also allows Stevens the option to return to the U.S. for major races such as the Kentucky Derby and the Santa Anita Handicap. "I'm going there with an open mind," he said. "If I enjoy it, I'll go back. If I don't. I won't."

INDIANA'S FIRST SATELLITE WAGERING FACILITY OPENS The first satellite wagering facility in Indiana history began operations Wed. as the Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum opened in Merrillville, attracting 792 patrons and a first-day handle of \$111,701. Licensed to Hoosier Park, LP, which is owned and operated by Churchill Downs, the Sports Spectrum will whole-card simulcast from harness and Thoroughbred tracks around the country. "It's very exciting to be a part of history," noted Hoosier Park Executive VP and General Manager Rick Moore. "The people of Merrillville and Northwest Indiana have welcomed us very graciously. We're confident that we will provide the type of operation that they can be proud of." Additional Sports Spectrums are scheduled to open in Ft. Wayne May 1, Indianapolis August 1, and Jeffersonville.

Saturday, Aqueduct: AFFECTIONATELY H.-GIII, \$75,000a, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/16m

"The thing that worries me about Saturday's race is if there will be a soft pace," said Buzzy Tenney, assistant to trainer Shug McGaughey. "If there is, and the track is speed-favoring like it is a lot of the time, then it'll be hard for these two fillies to catch up." The two late-running fillies he is referring to are Emory Hamilton's Tara Roma (Lyphard) and Heidi Doubleday's Sterling Pound (Seeking the Gold). In her most recent effort Dec. 17, Tara Roma stormed from next-to-last in a field of 10 to win the GII Ladies H. at Aqueduct by 3 1/2-lengths. It was her fourth victory from her last six starts. "In the Ladies, the distance (1 1/4-miles) suited her very well," said Tenney. "Given that she comes from way back, she needs some help up front, and she got that. And, the track had a little moisture in it, and she loves that. She caught everything her own way." Four-year-old Sterling Pound also started in the Ladies, right after taking her stakes debut in the GIII Honey Bee H. at The Meadowlands. In the Ladies she was an uncharacteristically dull eighth, but rebounded with a fast-closing third against some of the same horses she'll face Saturday in the Woodhaven H. January 7. "In the Woodhaven, she was into the race much earlier and then fell back down the backstretch," Tenney said. "But, she finished like a crazy horse, even into a slow pace.' STRUB STAKES TAKING SHAPE Strodes Creek (Halo), fourth as the 7-5 favorite in the San Fernando S. Jan. 14, worked six furlongs over a muddy Santa Anita track in 1:17.11 prior to Thursday's first race. Regular rider Eddie Delahoussaye was up. Trainer Charlie Whittingham said the big colt hasn't been able to get in all of his work, but added it shouldn't hamper his preparation for the \$500,000 Strub Stakes Feb. 5. "(Because of the weather) we haven't been able to job and gallop him every day, but he should be fit enough," said Whittingham. The 1 1/4-mile Strub S. is expected to attract the first four finishers from the San Fernando. In addition to Strodes Creek, first, second and third-place finishers Wekiva Springs (Runaway Groom), Dramatic Gold (Slew o' Gold) and Dare and Go (Alydar) are all on course for a rematch. The Strub S. will be televised nationally by ESPN.

ESPN EXTENDS "RACING TO THE BREEDERS' CUP" AGREEMENT ESPN announced Wednesday that it will continue to televise the "Racing to the Breeders' Cup" series under the terms of a new multi-year agreement. The series, sponsored by Breeders' Cup Ltd., debuted on ESPN in 1992 and showcases the world's best Thoroughbreds competing in 17 major stakes races leading to the Breeders' Cup. The new agreement begins with this year's series of nine telecasts, which will feature 13 Grade I events including three \$1 million races: the Pacific Classic from Del Mar, the Arlington Million from Arlington International Racecourse and, for the first time, the Molson Export Million from Woodbine. "We are excited to continue our relationship with Breeders' Cup Limited," said John Wildhack, ESPN senior vice president of programming. "Thoroughbred racing plays an im-

portant role in our overall ESPN programming phi-

Beach added that his client is expected to be released from Mills, where he has been since the accident, in a week.
