HOLY BULL NAMED HORSE OF THE YEAR

As expected, **Holy Bull** (Great Above) was the unanimous choice as 1994 Horse of the Year, it was announced last night by the Thoroughbred Racing Associations at the 24th Eclipse Awards dinner in Washington D.C. An emotional owner/trainer Jimmy Croll said: "This is truly a great honor. Never in my wildest dreams did I think I would own and train a Horse of the Year. I'm extremely grateful and want to thank all those who made this great occasion possible." The vote reflects a sweep of the three voting entities--Daily Racing Form, the TRA and the National Turf Writers' Association. Holy Bull was named on 241 of the 246 ballots cast and while he was the unanimous TRA choice, one DRF voter chose **Flanders** (Seeking the Gold), three NTWA voters chose **Paradise Creek** (Irish River-Fr) and one, **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold). Holy Bull earned \$2,095,000 in winning eight of 10 starts in '94, all of them stakes. Five of them were Grade 1s: the Travers, Florida Derby, Metropolitan H., Haskell H. and the Woodward, which wrapped up his year.

BRIS Analysis of the Hutcheson S.:

Gold Miner (Gold Crest) is an early-speed type who moves up in the mud. He has finished out of the money just once in eight previous starts and is coming off a career-best 98 BRIS Speed Rating in his last, a second-place finish in the GIII What a Pleasure S. at Calder. **Western Echo** (Eastern Echo) has won more money than any other starter in this field, but race-track rust may be his undoing on Saturday. It has been more than 60 days since his second-place finish in the Remsen S. (G2) and the colt missed some valuable training time this week due to a mile lung infection. **Valid Wager** (Valid Appeal) came to life for trainer Michael Mollica last September. The colt has good early speed and is a proven competitor in graded stakes company. **Mr. Greeley** (Gone West) has done everything right since his disheartening 11th-place finish in the GI Champagne S. Since that race, trainer Nick Zito has kept him sprinting and the colt has looked like a world-beater with back-to-back 103 and 101 Speed Ratings. His early Pace Ratings and six-length romp in the GIII Spectacular Bid Breeders' Cup on Gulfstream's opening day point to a wire-to-wire victory here.

**News Cont.****CLIFF GOODRICH ELECTED TRA PRESIDENT**

Clifford C. Goodrich, the President and C.E.O. of the Los Angeles Turf Club, which conducts the Santa Anita race meeting, was elected Friday to a two-year term as President of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations by the TRA board at their annual meeting Friday in Washington, D.C. He succeeds David M. Vance in the position. Goodrich, who becomes the TRA's 27th president, has been an executive at Santa Anita since being named Assistant General Manager in 1980. He was appointed to his current position in 1989. Elected as Vice Presidents by the TRA board were: Charles Bidwill Jr., President of Sportsman's Park; Hal Handel, Executive Vice President of Racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority; and Stella Thayer, President of Tampa Bay Downs. Re-elected officers were Brian McGrath as Commissioner, Chris Scherf as Executive Vice President, Bob Bork as Secretary, and Charles Colgan as Treasurer. The meeting included a presentation by Ken Dunn of Calder which proposed possible changes, enhancements and improvements to the National Best Seven wager. Dunn said that plans were being made to consult with racing commissions and horsemen's groups before any final action is taken.

LAKOW NAMED NYRA ACTING RACING SECRETARY

NYRA Assistant Racing Secretary Mike Lakow has been named Acting Racing Secretary for the NYRA tracks, effective immediately. Bruce Lombardi, who recently accepted an early retirement offer from the association, will stay on until mid-February to help in the transition. "We thought Mike deserved a chance at the job," said NYRA Director of Racing Terry Meyocks. "Mike has done an excellent job as stakes coordinator as an assistant under Bruce Lombardi and we believe he will continue that success in his new position." Said Lakow: "I'm grateful for the opportunity. New York has traditionally had the greatest racing in the country, and I hope to maintain and hopefully improve that reputation." Lakow joined NYRA in April, 1991 as stakes coordinator.

ELTISH TO RUN FOR THE ROSES Henry Cecil has confirmed that Eltish (Cox's Ridge), runner-up to Timber Country in the 1994 Breeders' Cup Juvenile, will return to Churchill Downs for a shot at the 121st Kentucky Derby May 6. Cecil plans to give the colt just one prep before the Derby, probably in Newmarket's nine-furlong Feilden S., a mid-April listed event which Cecil has won the past three years.

COLONEL COLLINS POSSIBLE FOR STRUB

Colonel Collins (El Gran Senor), who finished eighth in the Arlington Million as the favorite in his lone U.S. start, may make his first career dirt start in the Feb. 5 \$500,000 Strub S. at Santa Anita, according to trainer Rodney Rash. Trained by Peter Chapple-Hyam in

Europe, Colonel Collins was second in both the Irish and Epsom Derbies. "We have the Strub S. under consideration," said Rash. "It will come down to whether he's ready to run. We had him ready, but then the rains came and we missed some time with him." The four-year-old Kentucky-bred worked seven furlongs Friday on a yielding turf course in 1:32 4/5 around the dogs at Santa Anita. He will breeze again next weekend before Rash makes a decision, and will run in the Feb. 12 San Antonio if Rash feels he is not ready for the Strub. Owner Gary Tanaka purchased the colt from former owner Robert Sangster last summer. Sangster retains a portion of the colt. Others expected for the Strub: **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom), **Dare And Go** (Alydar), **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold), **Strodes Creek** (Halo) and **College Town** (Snow Chief.)

TRISHYDE RETIRED

Trishyde (Nureyev) has been retired from racing, according to her trainer, George Vogel. "Her splints are starting to bother her again, and to give her the amount of time she needs...and then there's always the chance that they would start to bother her again when we brought her back," said Vogel. "It just makes the most sense to retire her." Trishyde is booked on a Friday morning flight to Kentucky, where her connections hope to breed her to Seattle Slew. "Seattle Slew's book is full, but my contact back there said he'd try everything possible to get her on the schedule," said Vogel. Trishyde finished with six wins, including the GI Santa Barbara in 1993, in 16 starts, and \$476,396 in earnings.
